2009 SEASON OUTLOOK

CAL LOOKS TO CARRY MOMENTUM FROM 2008 INTO 2009

from a successful 2008 campaign, the California track and field team returns to action in 2009, looking to carry its momentum from last year into this season. Tony Sandoval, the longtime coach for the Golden Bears, begins his second year as Cal's Director of Track and Field after ending his initial season as head coach with the Cal women finishing 22nd at the NCAA Championships. He looks forward to what could be a tremendous year for Cal.

"The key for us is to stay healthy and not overextend ourselves," Sandoval said. "I think we have some depth and some quality that will allow us to be on the upper echelons of the regional indoor meet at the Mountain Pacific and at the same time be competitive in the Pac-10, regionals and nationals as well. I don't necessarily want to think that we're rebuilding, but I think we can be as good, if not better, than we were last year if we keep things together. "

Highlighting the 22nd-place finish for the Cal women was Katie Morgan's national championship in the pole vault. Martin Maric ended 2008 earning All-America honors in the discus and an NCAA West Regional title.

The 2009 squad will be armed with some superstar talent. Besides Morgan and Maric, among the other strong returners in 2009 is the 2008 100-meter hurdle champion Kimyon Broom, who was also an All-American last year as part of the 4x100-meter relay. All-American senior Ed Wright will compete in the indoor season only, as he takes one last crack at a national title.

MEN'S TRACK SPRINTS, HURDLES, RELAYS


Senior Jake Hanson will lead the sprinters and the hurdlers in '09, primarily running in the 400-meter hurdles in which he was a regional qualifier last year, advanced to the semifinals at the NCAA Outdoor Championships and qualified for the Olympic Trials. Also expected to perform well are fellow seniors Jordan Paul and Kellan Patterson.

Second-year assistant coach Mike Gipson has high hopes for Hanson as he looks for a strong senior campaign.

"My goals for Jake are to return to the NCAA Championships, and proceed further

in the NCAA Championships, as well as into postseason at the U.S. Nationals," Gipson said. "Jake ran 49.8 last year [in the 400 hurdles] and the goal this year is to go below 49 seconds."

Paul will specifically be picking up where Thomas Mack, a 2008 graduate, left off. Paul took third at the Pac-10 Championships and secured a personal-best, wind-aided time of 13.78. Gipson looks for Paul to qualify for the NCAA Outdoor Championships and take on a leadership role and mentor two incoming hurdles, Ryan Holmes and Aaron Burney, who both were medalists at the California state meet a year ago.

Patterson and sophomore Keagan Wethington are two returners who Gipson will look to for adding depth to the sprints and relays.

"Keagan progressed well through fall training," Gipson said. "He did get an opportunity to run at the Pac-10 Championships with the 4x400 relay, and I think the exposure he got during the postseason has been his motivator through the fall and the winter, and I expect a good indoor and outdoor 400 for him.

"Kellan was fifth at the Mountain Pacific Indoor Championships and we're looking at him to gain upon that experience. He's going to finish higher at this year's MPSFs. He ran a 6.9 last year, and his goal this year is to run under 6.80 and qualify for the NCAA Championships indoors and outdoors."

Along with Patterson, Shane Vereen, a running back from the Cal football team, is expected to join the team in the indoor and outdoor seasons and contribute to the relays.

MIDDLE DISTANCE AND DISTANCE

Despite losing David Torrence to graduation, according to Sandoval, the Bears are stacked at distance and middle distance in 2009 with seniors Mark Matusak, Sean Carey and Francis Gadayan, and junior Yosef Ghebray leading the way. Gadayan, who redshirted last season, was a distance medley relay All-American in 2007. Sandoval is looking for Gadayan to run like he did two years ago.

"I think we have our strength and numbers are in the middle distances," Sandoval said. "We have an All-American coming back in Francis Gadayan. He was redshirted last year. But he was on the DMR that was second at nationals indoors a couple of years ago."

Also in the mix is sophomore Michael Coe, who won claimed an MPSF title last season in the 3000. Cal's other distance run-

ners include Matusak, who competed in the NCAA West Regional in the 1500 as a junior, sophomore and as a freshman. Last season he advanced to the NCAA Championships in that event after clocking in at 3:43.37 at the regional last year."

Ghebray comes into the track season with some momentum after earning All-America honors last fall in cross country. Ghebray, who will most likely run the 5000 and the 10,000, regionally qualified last year in the

5000 after earning 14:10.11 at the Payton Jordan Cardinal Qualifier. Also returning is sophomore Kari Karlsson, who was a regional qualifier a year ago and set the freshman record in the 10,000 at 29:28.05.

"We do have Yosef Ghebray, who had a breakout season in cross country, and he's going to run the 5,000 and 10,000 and probably run a little bit of the 3,000 and 5,000 indoors. Of course there's Kari Karlsson, who was third last year at the Pac-10 Championships and had an NCAA qualifying mark in the 10,000. We expect him to run very well."

Steve Sodaro returns to run the steeplechase for the Bears this season. Matthew Kelley Miller was a regional qualifier in that event last year, but will redshirt this season.

Sandoval also has a few newcomers this season who he is very excited to see on the track

"We have a number of freshmen of note that I think we were really lucky to get," Sandoval said. "One was Sebastian Sam in the 800. He's possess more natual speed of any 800 runner I've coaches, so I expect big performances from him. We've also got Brad Surh and James Attarian both of who were miles in High School. Surh ran a 4:08 as a junior and a big upside for him. Attarian was a Foot Locker National qualifier in high school. He missed most of his outdoor season with a broken foot. We redshirted him so he would be fully healed for the 2009 outdoor season. This trio is the foundation for the future. Once again the middle distances and distances are going to be an area where we're going to shine as far as the Golden Bears are concerned."

VERTICAL AND HORIZONTAL JUMPS

Arguably one of the best high jumpers in the nation, All-American Ed Wright, returns for the indoor season in 2009. Wright, who finished last season ranked No. 5 in the nation, earned the third All-America honor in his collegiate career last season in the

indoor campaign, and Cal associate director Ed Miller says Wright could be in store for a special indoor season.

"He is in better shape mentally, physically and technically than ever before," Miller said. "He has had phenomenal practices. His goal is to get to NCAAs and get to that top step. The practices that we have had and the way he is jumping over the bar right now shows me that he is ready for some big things. Being that he only has an indoor season

and not an outdoor season, he is taking advantage of it to get everything out of it he possibly can."

Besides the accomplishment of an NCAA championship, Wright has his sights set on the record books, as well. He hopes to surpass his old high school coach, Jeff Rogers, on the Bears' all-time list for the high jump. Rogers, who was coached by Miller while a student-athlete at Cal, currently sits atop the Bears' leaderboard in the event with a mark of 7-5.75. Wright posted his lifetime-best mark of 7-3.25 at the NCAA West Regional last season, which tied him for seventh on the Bears' all-time chart.

Working with the Cal men's and women's pole vaulters this season is third-year assistant coach and former UCLA star Scott Slover.

Junior Ryan Shuler will lead the pole vaulters in 2009. Slover said Shuler is off to a great start thus far and he sees him improving on his fifth-place finish at the Pac-10 Championships and doing well at the NCAA Championships. Shuler, who became the first high school freshman to win the California state championship in 2003, was ranked No. 2 in California in the outdoor pole vault as a senior at Granite Bay High School.

One newcomer that Slover is excited about is Justin Miller from California High School. Miller jumped 17-0 last year when he was

one of the best high school vaulters in the nation. Slover expects him to compete at the NCAA-Championship level in the coming years.

Slover also has high expectations for redshirt freshman Cameron Kroll.

"We have a strong returning young vault crew," Slover said. "We expect Cameron, when healthy, to play a big roll even at the national level. He had hip surgery early this fall, however, is expected to be 100 percent

by the end of indoors. Cameron is extremely talented, and if all goes well, he could be a huge factor at the Pac-10 and NCAA Championships."

THROWS

Martin Maric headlines a strong group of throwers that accomplish a lot in 2009. Javelin, in particular, should feature good results with the trio of Maric, junior Ryan Young and sophomore Colin Kennedy leading the way.

Maric, a 2008 All-American in the discus, represented Croatia in the discus at the 2008 Olympic Games in Beijing, China, last summer. Maric claimed the 2008 NCAA West Regional title in the discus and was the runner-up at the Pac-10 Championships. He

also qualified for the outdoor national championships in the javelin.

"I expect that he will be one of the guys you look at to potentially win a national title," Miller said. "The experience alone from the Olympics makes him a more mature and seasoned thrower. He is already stronger. His abilities to communicate and listen are already at a very high level."

Young looks to have fully recovered from injuries from two years ago. According to Miller, Young is stronger and faster, and is already well ahead of where he was at this point last year. Young took second in both the NCAA West Regional and the Pac-10 Championships last year.

Cal lost Craig Kent, one of the Bears' top athletes in the shot put in 2008, to graduation, but sophomore Patrick Kowalsky looks to fill that void after having a strong freshman campaign. Miller said that Kowalsky will be facing some tough competition in the conference, but he thinks Kowalsky will do well.

"Pat has done a really good job," Miller said. "Training is going very well. He is much stronger. Technically he is way ahead of where he was last year. He will take over the shot put duties and I think he will represent himself very well as a youngster.

Along with Maric and Young, Cal should be strong on the men's side in the throws in 2008.

DECATHLON

Back in 2009 is sophomore Kyle Mills-Bunje, who had a good freshman season after coming back from redshirting in 2007 due to injury. Along with Mills-Bunje will be redshirt freshman Kevin Kuechler.

Mills-Bunje took seventh in the decathlon in the Pac-10 Championships last year, recording new personal bests in the 1500 meters and the javelin along the way. Miller expects Mills-Bunje to emerge onto the national scene in 2009.

"He has really focused on training this year," Miller said. "He is more committed to becoming a better decathlete this year. I think he will be one of the top kids in the Pac-10 this year and should make the national meet."

WOMEN'S TRACK SPRINTS, HURDLES, RELAYS

The Cal women had a lot of success in the sprints and relays a year ago, highlighted by the 4x100-meter relay recording the second-best time in school history at the 44.32. The All-America relay consisted of senior Kandi Bonty, juniors Kimyon Broom and Kristin Holmes, sophomore Cherrelle Garrett and sophomore Kayla Dixon as the alternate. Gipson is hoping to catapult off that success from last year for more good performances in 2009.

"We're very proud of that effort and that we were the only team west of El Paso, Texas, to make it to the finals," Gipson said. "The excitement throughout the department, with our alumni, with our current team, our incoming freshmen, and in recruiting is a big sell to keep riding into the future to build on.

With that team this year, with everyone coming back, we really are focused on No. 1 running under 44 seconds, setting the all-time mark here at Cal, and being back on the medal stand at the NCAA championships."


That wasn't the only success that Broom had last year, as she also claimed the Pac-10 title in the 100-meter hurdles in a school-record time of 13.17. Broom also ran at the U.S. Olympic Trials.

"We see Kimyon going to the NCAA Championships indoors and outdoors and potential becoming a championship finalist. Her goal, which she writes down every day, in chalk, on the track before we start any hurdle practice, is 12.86. That's the goal that we both agreed on."

Another record setter in 2008 was Garrett, who set the freshman record in the 100 at 11.41, which also ranks her as the second fastest Bear in school history. Garrett also currently ranks sixth on the school's all-time list in the 200 at 23.73. Gipson said Garrett's

goals for this season are to outright qualify for the NCAA Indoor National Championships win conference title and advance further into the outdoor national championships.

There are two key newcomers that Gipson is excited about, Emani Truluck and Robyn Hunte, a junior-college transfer from Laney College where she was part of the squad's state championship team as well as state champion in the 400 relay and state champion in the long jump.

"She's going to add depth, first off in the sprints and in the 400 relay," Gipson said. "Even though we have the four young ladies back for the year ago, Kayla (Dixon) and Robyn (Hunte) are viable substitutes for that relay team."

MIDDLE DISTANCE AND DISTANCE

The Bears will definitely miss Alysia Johnson, Cal's six-time All-American, but Sandoval said he has a good group of runners who he thinks can fill the void from the departed Johnson. Taking Johnson's place in the leadership role will be senior Mackenzie Pierce, a regional qualifier last year in the 800 and the 1500. Freshman Brazile Clark is an incoming runner that Sandoval is excited to see on the track and has high hopes for.

As a senior in high school, Clark was ranked No. 10 in that 800, with a time of 2:11.74.

Sophomore Chelsea Reilly and redshirt freshman Taylor Bryson are two runners Sandoval is familiar with on the cal cross country team, and he sees them making big contributions to this year's team.

"Chelsea was an outstanding high school miler coming out of Davis High School, and I think that she's got the ability to be a Pac-10 and beyond level athlete," Sandoval said.

Sophomore Alison Greggor is another returner who comes into the season after having a strong cross country season, and Sandoval hopes she can carry that success onto the track.

Junior Rowena Tam returns in the 3000meter steeplechase in which she was a regional qualifier as well (10:37.28).

Sandoval said he has a number of people in mind – possibly freshmen Deborah Maier and Keena Kohl – to run the 5,000 and above.

"I think Deborah Maier was our No. 1 runner in cross country, although she did run the mile in high school," Sandoval said. "She might be able to go back and forth between the mile and the 5000. But we also have Keena Kohl and Alison Greggor, who ran very well in cross country, and we're going to take a very hard look at their contributions in both indoor and outdoor."

VERTICAL AND HORIZONTAL JUMPS

You can't talk about Cal's jumpers without first mentioning the 2008 NCAA outdoor pole vault champion, Katie Morgan. Morgan had a remarkable 2008 season, as in addition to her national title, she set the school record five times. Her current personal best is 13-

"The pressure and expectations from the outside will follow her all season long regardless of how hard she tries to ignore it," said Slover. "I want Katie to embrace it,

welcome it and thrive on it. My expectations for Katie are simple: train smart, train hard

and go into every meet with a fiercely competitive attitude. As for the most

question, 'Can she defend her NCAA title?' My answer is, 'Yes, she can.' Katie is the best big-meet competitor I have ever coached."

Morgan isn't Cal's only strong pole vaulters as sophomore Allison Stokke returns after setting the freshman record at 13-5.75, set at the Pac-10 Championships. The coaches have been so impressed with Stokke Kristen Meister thus far that they believe

she has the capability to achieve the same goals that Morgan has set for herself.

"I expect a lot out of Allison this year," Slover said. "She is phenomenally talented and she is faster, stronger and more confident than ever before. One of the biggest factors contributing to Allison's success and her ability to go to the next level is her roommate and training partner Katie Morgan."

All-American senior Inika McPherson and iunior Kristen Meister, an All-American as a freshman at Davidson College, return for a strong one-two punch in the high jump. Both McPherson and Meister were regional qualifiers with the same mark of 1.78 meters.

"Inika has looked great in practice," assistant coach John Rembao said. "I could see her very easily making it to nationals. Kristen is looking really good. She worked through a lot of technical changes in the fall. She has looked fantastic in practice. Her strength levels are up. She is faster. She is doing a fantastic job working."

Another area where the Bears are strong is triple jump, the event in which they had four regional qualifiers last season. Senior Artensia Young and junior Mercedes March-

banks will lead the group this year. Rembao also sees incoming freshman Amanda Hunter playing an important role for the triple jumpers.

"They are both doing a really great job," Rembao said of Young and Marchbanks. "Artensia has had a couple of little injuries along the way. Mercedes did a fantastic job this fall. I see her making a huge breakthrough this year, in the triple jump in particular, but she is also looking good in the long jump as well. I see her and Artensia, as well as our freshman Amanda Hunter, leading our triple jump group."



Young will also be a valuable contributor for the long jump. Jacqulyn Lewis, a transfer from UC Riverside has been a pleasant surprise thus far for Rembao in the long jump.

THROWS

Cal will once again be young in throws this season, but should be more competitive than a year ago with sophomore Kiely Smith returning for her sophomore campaign. Smith will primarily compete in the hammer, but according to Miller, she will also throw discus in the outdoor season. Last year, Smith recorded a season-best hammer throw of 161-01 (49.09m) at the Stanford Invitational. Joining Smith is redshirt freshman Linda Oseso, who will compete in the hammer with Smith and will also participate in the shot put. Both Smith and Oseso are under the training of new volunteer assistant coach Zech Whittington.

"The are still absorbing what coach Whittington is teaching them," Miller said. "Again, they are both young but capable of competing at the Pac-10 level and being a factor."

The key newcomer will be freshman

Kendall Morris, who will sit out the indoor season and join the squad outdoors. Morris brings personal-best marks of 152-0 in the discus and 38-0 in the shot put to Cal. She also posted a 149-3.00 in the discus to take fifth place in the 2008 California State Track and Field Championships.

HEPTATHLON

Cal's veteran in the heptathlon, senior Tifani Grimes, is currently nursing an injury and hopes to join the team in the outdoor season, according to Rembao.

> Grimes was the Bears' top combined women's athlete last vear, as she scored an a total of 4,863 points at the Pac-10 Multi-Event Championships.

As a second option Rembao is looking to sophomore Veronica Stimson in the multis. Stimson primarily is a pole vaulter, so Rembao said the coaches are currently exploring the option.

Junior Kristin Holmes and sophomore Dantia Hudson also have some experience in the multis, as they represented the Bears in the Cal Multis last season

SCHEDULE

Cal has put together another competitive schedule this season, both indoors and outdoors, with an emphasis on displaying

not just the Bears' talented athletes in Berkeley, but also the nation's prominent athletes. Sandoval has taken Cal's big annual meet, the Brutus Hamilton Invitational, and turned it into a huge national meet, and not just at the collegiate level. Sandoval has escalated the meet to where collegiate and professional athletes will all come together and post strong performances towards qualifying for the NCAA Championships and the U.S. Track and Field Championships.


"The Brutus Hamilton meet has really evolved into being one of the elite meets in the United States," Sandoval said. "We're getting sponsorship and funding for that from a variety of sources, and it allows our people to run at home and also has a way of also promoting Bay Area track and field. I think its going to be a signature event for us and focal point for our program to have a great meet like the Brutus Hamilton Invitational."

The Bears will host two competitions this season, a quad meet including Stanford, UC Davis and Fresno State on March 7, and the Brutus Hamilton Invitational April 24-25. Cal will also renew its rivalry with Stanford in the Big Meet on Saturday, April 18, on the Farm.

Director of Track and Field /

Head Cross Country Coach

27th Year at California

Tony Sandoval, a familiar name in San Francisco Bay Area track and field circles, begins his 27th year of association with the California track and field program and his second as the Director of Track and Field, after serving numerous seasons as the associate director of track and field. Sandoval previously served 10 years as Cal's head women's coach prior to the merger of the men's and women's programs into a single entity.

Sandoval specializes in coaching men's and women's distance events, 800 meters and above, as well as cross country. His expertise extends to meet management also, as he has a wealth of experience conducting major cross country and indoor and outdoor track invitational. Sandoval was a member of the NCAA Track & Field Rules Committee (1981-88) that directs all three Division I championship meets.

Under his tutelage, members of the Cal women's team earned All-America honors on 26 different occasions. Sandoval added All-America honors outdoors (two) and indoors (one) in 2008, with Katie Morgan winning the pole vault and the women's 4x100-meter relay placing eighth at the NCAA Outdoor Championships. Bears star Alysia Johnson placed third in the 800 meters in last season's NCAA Indoor Championships. Johnson ended her Cal career with six such honors, garnering All-America status both indoors and outdoors in 2007 and 2006 and earning the honor once outdoors in 2005. Chloe Jarvis earned indoor All-American honors in the 800 meters in 2005. He also added Erin Belger to the list of All-Americans, as Belger finished third in the 800 at the 2002 NCAA Championships. In cross country, Bridget Duffy earned All-America honors under Sandoval in 2003.

The Bears finished in the top 20 three times between 1987 and 1990, in addition to taking fourth at the 1990 NCAA Indoor Championships. Cal scored a school-record 23 points

Other athletes Sandoval has coached include 2000 Olympian and All-American Bolota Asmerom; six-time All-American Richie Boulet; three-time middle distance All-American and AIAW 800m champion Louise Romo; Kirsten O'Hara, an All-American in cross country, 5000 and 10,000; Elissa Riedy a two-time All-American in the 1500 and once in cross country; Laura Baker, an All-American in the 800m; Sally Wood, All-American in the 5000; Sabrina Han, All-American in the 10,000; and Magdalena Lewy, an All-American in the 5000 and one of the United States' top long distance runners who competed in the 2008 Olympics in the marathon and placed fifth in the marathon at the 2005 U.S. Olympic trials; All-American Tenava Soderman in the 10.000: Susan Vigil, an 800-meter national champion at New Mexico.

Sandoval has coached cross country runners to All-America honors 10 times: Yosef Ghebray, Marilyn Davis, Riedy, O'Hara (three times), Duffy, Boulet, Wood and Han. In addition, Boulet earned indoor All-America honors in the 3000 three times and Lisa Lopez was an indoor All-American in the mile.

The 1986 NorPac Conference Track and Field Coach of the Year, Sandoval serves as Cal's head cross country coach, a role he also filled for the women's program before the merger. In 2007, Sandoval guided the men's cross country team to its first appearance as a team to the NCAA championships. In 1993, under Sandoval's guidance, Boulet became Cal's second All-American in men's cross-country. Sandoval guided the women's program to a pair of top 20 finishes in 1984 and 1988. In their first NCAA appearance in 1984, the Bears finished 15th nationally. Cal returned as a team in 1988 to take ninth place.

Sandoval has more than 30 years of coaching experience, having begun his career a year out of college by developing the Duke City Dashers track club in Albuquerque, N.M. DCD became a "super club" with numerous

at the 1990 outdoor meet to claim 11th place, tying the 1987 team for the program's highest finish ever.

national level and record-breaking boys and girls age-group athletes in cross country and track and field. Many of those age groupers developed into national level AAU and collegiate runners. In 1972, three DCD athletes coached by Sandoval were Olympic trial finalists. Under Sandoval, Lynn Bjorklund was DCD's most accomplished runner, winning three AAU cross country championships and two AAU two-mile championships. Bjorklund was world ranked in the two mile/3000 in 1974 and 1975 and remains the national high school record holder for the 3000.

Sandoval started his collegiate coaching career with New Mexico's women's team in 1975, serving as an assistant before taking over the head coaching duties. His UNM track team finished as high as ninth nationally. He also developed 10 All-Americans, including long distance and cross country runner Karen Crammond, middle distance runners Regina Draminga of Uganda and Tecla Chemabawi of Kenya, and 1979 800m national champion Vigil (a former DCD runner) during his eight years with the Lobos.

Active in all areas of amateur track and field. Sandoval served as the head coach for the 1995 U.S. Junior Pan American women's track and field team, which competed in Santiago. Chile. He also served as an assistant coach for the U.S. team at the 1991 Pan American Games in Cuba. Formerly the long distance coordinator for women for the Olympic Development subcommittee of the AAU, Sandoval has had four U.S. national team assignments, including the head coaching position for a U.S. junior team that competed in Cuba and Canada in 1987. In addition, Sandoval was the head coach for United States at the World Cross Country Championships in Glasgow, Scotland (1978), and Madrid, Spain (1981).


A 1968 graduate of New Mexico, Sandoval was a three-year letterwinner in cross country and track and field for a Lobo team that won two Western Athletic Conference titles in cross country and three conference championships in track and field. Sandoval competed in the mile, two mile and steeplechase events, and he was an all-time top 10 performer in both the mile and two mile.

Sandoval attended Albuquerque High School in New Mexico and won the 1962 state cross country title and captured the 1963 state 880 yard championship.

Sandoval received a double master's degree from UNM in exercise physiology and guidance and counseling in 1974. He taught in the undergraduate physical education department at UNM while working on a Ph.D. in sports psychology.

Sandoval and his wife, Barbara, reside in Pleasant Hill with their daughters, Lisa and Marcy. Lisa is a Cal graduate and a former Cal track athlete. Marcy currently attends Diablo Valley College.

ED MILLER Associate Director of Track and Field Field Events-Multi Events 26th Year at Cal

Ed Miller begins his 26th year as the Associate Head Coach at California. Throughout his storied career, Miller has earned both a national and international reputation for his success on the field. He is considered one

of the premier multi-event coaches in the world and has served United States Track & Field on four international trips, including the 2003 IAAF World Championships in Paris, France, as an assistant coach. As a member of USATF's Development Committees, Miller served as the National Coordinator for the long jump and also was the Regional Coordinator for the high jump.

A former NCAA decath-Ion champion and All-American for the Golden Bears. Miller assists in the administration of the program, in fundraising and in meet management.

Miller's latest honor was his 2006 induction into the Diablo Valley College athletic hall of fame as a member of its first class. In 2002. Miller received one of his greatest honors when he was inducted into Cal's Hall of Fame.

Miller has coached a

and a three-time All-American. McPherson, also a 2007 All-American, was at one time ranked fifth in the nation, came in fourth at the USA championships and took sixth at the 2007 NCAA Outdoor Championships. Miller has also coached South American recordholder Ramon Jimenez-Gaona (Paraguay, discus), 2008 Olympian and current Cal athlete Martin Maric (Croatia, discus) and Cal decathletes Bevan Hart (2000 NCAA champion and 1999-2000 Pac-10 champion) and Ross Bomben (1996 NCAA runner-up and 1998 Pac-10 champion). On the women's side, Miller coached a number of outstanding multi-eventers, including 1995 All-American Tiffany Janssen, 1995 Pac-10 champion Ifeoma Ozoeze, 2000 Pac-10 champion and All-American Missy Vanek, and heptathlete Brooke Meredith (indoor and outdoor All-American and MPSF indoor champion.)

In addition to Jimenez-Gaona, a three time NCAA runner-up and school-record


holder in the discus at 210-11, Miller has tutored Kari Nisula, the 1988 NCAA discus champion, the only three-time Pac-10 pole vault champion and a 1992 NCAA runnerup; All-American Brent Burns (holds Cal pole vault record of 18-8.25); All-American Clarence Phelps (2nd in the pole vault at the 1997 NCAA championships at 18-0.50); All-American Jeff Rogers (holds Cal high jump record of 7-5.75); Pac-10 high jump and triple jump champion Mike Harris (All-American in 1990); two-time Pac-10 high jump champion Kevin Keane; and high jumper Teak Wilburn (indoor and outdoor All-American and indoor conference and outdoor Pac-10 Champion). Miller's athletes have earned 24 All-America honors.

A native of nearby Pleasant Hill, Calif., Miller was a two-year letterman at California in 1975 and '76. As a senior, he captured the 1976 NCAA decathlon title in Philadelphia, Pa., scoring a then school-record 7,443 points. That score broke a 42-year-old record of Olympian Bob Clark and presently ranks sixth on the all-time list at Cal. Miller continued competing past college, including at the 1976 and '80 U.S. Olympic Trials.

Prior to returning to Cal as a coach, Miller taught, coached track and field and coached women's basketball at Los Medanos College in Pittsburg, Calif.



John Rembao was named Assistant Coach and Director of Operations for California Track & Field in September of 2007. After coaching at Cal Poly (San Luis Obispo), Arizona, Texas, SMU, and Stanford, Rembao brings a tremendous amount of experience and an extended list of track and field and cross country achievements to Cal. In addition to his 24 years of coaching experience, Rembao has served as the USA Track and Field Women's High Jump Development Coordinator for 10 years.

Rembao's diverse coaching skills have enabled him to coach athletes to high levels in the jumps, combined events and distances. He has coached four Olympians, five World Championship competitors, 15 NCAA individual champions, a collegiate record holder, and 90 All-Americans. In addition to his individual successes, he has helped his athletes garner 23 conference and 11 NCAA team championships. He is well known for his expertise in the high jump, where he has coached many male and female high jumpers to high heights: Einar Hjartason (7-3); Mustapha Raifak (7-5.5), a five-time French National Champion; Erin Aldrich (6-5.5); Sue McNeal-Rembao (6-5); Tanya Hughes (6-4); Gaelle Niare (6-4); and Nevena Lendel (6-3.25).

While at Stanford from 2005-2007, Rembao's primary responsibilities included coaching the high jump squad and operations management. He served as the director of the Stanford Track & Field and Cross Country Invitationals and the Payton Jordan Cardinal Invitational. Rembao also served as the technical director for the Pac-10 Track & Field and Cross Country Championships and NCAA West Region Cross Country Championships.

In his fours years at SMU, Rembao coached the jumpers, combined events and distance runners. He coached the women's cross country team to its highest national ranking in school history (11th) and was voted the NCAA South Central Region Cross Country Coach of the Year in 2004. In track and cross country, he coached 22 individual NCAA qualifiers in the heptathlon, long and triple jump, steeplechase, 5000m, and high jump. Seven of these athletes were All-Americans, and one athlete, Nevena Lendel, was an NCAA indoor high jump champion.


While at the University of Texas, Rembao coached Erin Aldrich, a seven-time all-American high jumper, to an indoor collegiate record (6-5.5) and three NCAA individual titles. Under Rembao's tutelage, Aldrich made two World Championship and Olympic teams. His

accomplishments at Texas earned him a spot on the coaching staff for Team USA at the 2001 IAAF World Championship Games in Edmonton, Ontario, Canada, While at Texas, Rembao also coached 10 All-Americans — including six-time Big XII Champion in the middle distances, Liz Diaz — and helped the Longhorns to four straight NCAA Women's Track and Field Championships (1998 Indoor and Outdoor, 1999 Indoor and Outdoor). Rembao also helped UT's cross country program by leading it to a top 25 finish and two straight appearances at the NCAA Championships after a 10-year absence from the meet.

In his 11 years at Cal Poly, Rembao coached 76 All-Americans and 13 NCAA individual champions that helped their teams achieve seven NCAA team championships and 16 conference team championships. He also worked in Athletic Development at Cal Poly, eventually becoming the Assistant Athletic Director of Business Operations.

Rembao and his wife, Sue, a 1992 Olympian and three-time All-American high jumper, have one son, Jared Asher.





Recruiting Coordinator Sprints, Hurdles and Relays 2nd Year at Cal

Mike Gipson begins his second year as the sprints, hurdles and relays coach. He also serves as the Recruiting Coordinator.

Some of Gipson's accomplishments from last season include the Pac-10-champion-ship winning performance of Kimyon Broom in the 100-meter hurdles and an All-American women's 4x100-meter relay team that ran the

second-best time in school history.

Gipson came to Cal after spending eight years at Sacramento State, where he coached the Hornets sprints, hurdles, relays and horizontal jumps, and also served as the recruiting coordinator. More than 30 of the athletes/relays Gipson has coached still stand in the school's all-time top five marks. He also had over 50 All-Big Sky Conference selections.

Gipson came to Sacramento State after 15 years as the track and field head coach and assistant football coach at Highlands High School in Sacramento. The Scots captured two Sac-Joaquin Section Titles and two Section Runner-Ups in his final three seasons before taking his coaching expertise to the collegiate ranks.

In his coaching career, he has coached champions and nationally-ranked athletes from Youth/Age-Group, High School, Collegiate, US National, Foreign National, Masters and Senior levels.

Among notable Gipson coached athletes are Brian Lewis, a 1995 Olympic Festival and World University Games Medalist, as well as a member of the 1997 and 1999 World Championship Relays. Lewis was also a

member of the gold medal U.S. 400-meter Relay Team at the 2000 Olympic Games in Sydney, Australia. Gipson also coached Yvonne Kanazawa-Scott, who set the Japanese record for the 100-meter hurdles and was a semifinalist for the event at the 2000 Olympics. Eugene Swift, the sixth-place finisher in the 110-meter hurdles at the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta, Ga., and the 1997 Pan-Am Games champion, also spent time under Gipson's guidance.

He holds U.S. Track and Field Level 1 coaching certification, was the Assistant Director of Operations for the 2000 U.S. Olympic Trials and Assistant Director of Events for the 2003 NCAA Outdoor Championships.

Gipson sat on the Big Sky Conference Committee for the development of Women's Track and Field. He also has been a speaker at the Northern California All-Sports clinics.

Out of Highlands High School, Gipson attended the United States Air Force Academy. He received his bachelor's degree in business administration with a concentration in marketing from Sacramento State in 1983. Gipson and his wife, Brenda, have two children, 17-year-old Kristara and 15-year-old Karlaina.





MAGDALENA LEWY

Middle Distance/Distance

8th Year at Cal

Magdalena Lewy, a former Cal track and field All-American and a 2008 Olympian, originally returned to her alma mater in 2003 as a coach for the Golden Bear cross country program. Lewy begins her eighth non-consecutive season at Cal. She was the research director for Sports Street Marketing, which manufacturers GU, an energy and electrolyte gel supplement, from 2000-07.

Still an avid runner, Lewy made the U.S. Olympic team in the marathon after taking second at the 2008 U.S. Olympic Trials and competed in this past summer's Olympic Games in Beijing, China. She just missed out on the 2004 Olympics, placing fifth (2 hours, 30 minutes) in the marathon at the 2004 U.S. Olympic Trials. In addition, Lewy recently won her first ever U.S. championship in the half-marathon in 1:11:47.


After assuming her coaching duties at Cal in 1996 while still an undergraduate, she left for the 1998 season to serve as the assistant women's cross country coach at Saint Mary's in Moraga, Calif. She then returned for the 1999 and 2000 collegiate seasons in Berkeley.

Lewy earned her All-America honor with a third-place finish in the 5000m at the 1997 NCAA Championships with a career-best time of 16:04.86. She qualified for the 1995 NCAA meet in the 3000m and 5000m, but only ran the 5000m.

On Cal's all-time performers list, Lewy ranks second in the 5000m (16:04.86), third in the 3000m (9:25.93) and eighth in the 1500m (4:23.20).

Originally from Poland, Lewy attended Lakewood High School in Southern California and then spent two years at Long Beach City College before transferring to Cal. She earned her bachelor's degree in human biodynamics from Cal in 1997 and a master's degree in exercise physiology from Cal State Hayward.


She lives in Oakland, Calif., with her husband, Richie Boulet, and their three-year-old son, Owen.

Slover's pole vaulters accomplished big things last year, as he led Katie Morgan to the 2008 NCAA Outdoor championship and is currently the school record holder in that event. Another one of Slover's vaulters, Allison Stokke, set the school's freshman pole vault record last season.

A history major who graduated from UCLA in 1999, Slover was an assistant coach with the Bruins and ranked fifth in the world in the pole vault in that same year. He was a five-time All-American, who took third place in the 1998 NCAA Outdoor Championships and fifth place in the 1996 NCAA Outdoor Championships in the pole vault. Competing in the pole vault at the NCAA Indoor Championships, he finished seventh in 1996, sixth in 1997 and seventh in 1998.

Slover was a two-time Pac-10 champion in the pole vault in 1996 and 1998. Slover ranks No. 2 in the pole vault, with a 1997 mark of 18-7.25, on UCLA's all-time top 10 list and still holds the UCLA freshman record of 18-0.25, set in 1995.

In 1994, he took ninth place at the World Junior Championships in Lisbon, Portugal.

As a coach, he's trained UCLA's Tracy O'Hara, who won the women's pole vault titles at the NCAA Indoor and Outdoor Championships in 2000 and at the 2002 NCAA Outdoor Championships.

Slover comes from strong track and field lineage, as his father, Bob Slover, competed in the 1968 and 1972 Olympics in the pole vault. The father-son duo has the second-best combined height in the world at 36-5.25. Bob Slover coached his son at Leland High School in San Jose, Calif., where Scott Slover was a two-time high school state champion.

The former Bruin has occasionally worked in television commercials, portraying a pole vaulter in ads for companies that include Nike, DHL and SBC.
