**BEAR NOTES:** The California baseball team (23-14, 5-4) continues its quest for a postseason berth as the Golden Bears travel to Seattle to play Washington (21-13, 2-4) in a three-game series at Husky Ballpark. Cal is coming off winning twoof-three games from then-No. 24 Arizona State last week at Evans Diamond, including a come-from-behind 4-3 victory Apr. 10. Senior third baseman and team captain Matt Einspahr, who hails from Port Orchard, Wash., knocked in the game-winning RBI in the bottom of the ninth in Cal's dramatic win. Einspahr leads the Bears with 27 RBI and is hitting .414 against Pac-10 opponents. Senior right-hander and captain Matt Swanson was impressive last week as well, earning the win in relief Apr. 5 at Nevada and preserving Cal's 7-3 win over ASU Apr. 9 by throwing the final 1.7 innings with two hits, no runs, no walks and two strikeouts. For the year, he is 4-0 with two saves, and a 1.19 ERA in a team-high 18 appearances. Senior left-hander Travis Talbott continues his fine season, earning the win in the Bears' 4-3 victory over ASU, throwing a season-high 4.3 innings to improved his record to 3-1 with six saves and a 0.96 ERA. Redshirt freshman second baseman Josh Satin has put up impressive offensive numbers, batting .380 overall and a team-best .464 in Pac-10 play. Satin is also hitting a team-best .453 (24-for-53) with runners in scoring position. Sophomore center fielder Brennan Boesch still leads the Bears with a .401 average (third in the Pac-10), 91 total bases, 57 hits, .641 slugging percentage, .466 on-base percentage, 12 doubles and six home runs. Cal currently 23-14 after winning 25 games all of last season. The Bears are hitting .327 against Pac-10 competition.

**SERIES RECORD:** Cal has a 21-18 series record against the Washington Huskies. In the last meeting, the Bears won one of three games (W 9-4, L 7-4, L 6-4) at Evans Diamond, Apr. 2-4, 2004. In the last series played at Husky Ballpark, Cal won one of three (L 16-3, W 6-3, L 11-3) Apr. 25-27, 2003.

HEAD COACH DAVID ESQUER: Esquer, 39, is in his sixth season at Cal with a career record of 164-152 (.519). In 2001, he was the Pac-10 Coach of the Year after leading the Bears to a 34-25 mark, a third place finish in the Pac-10 (14-10) and a berth to the NCAA Regional in Baton Rouge, LA (1-2). Twenty-five Cal players have signed professional contracts since Esquer became coach, including Conor Jackson, who was a first round draft choice of the Arizona Diamondbacks in 2003. On June 10, 1999, Esquer became only the 10th coach in the history of Cal baseball, which began in 1892. He came to Berkeley after serving as the top assistant at Pepperdine from 1996-99. Esquer was the No. 2 assistant coach at Stanford under Mark Marquess from 1991-96. A shortstop at Stanford from 1984-87, he was a starter on the 1987 College World Series championship team, earning All-Tournament honors. Esquer also earned All-Pac-10 Southern Division honors and went on to play professional baseball for four seasons with the Baltimore, California and Milwaukee organizations.

**NOTING WASHINGTON:** The Washington Huskies, coached by Ken Knutson (13th year at UW, 449-286-2, .611), are 21-13, 2-4 after winning two of three (W 9-0, W 19-3, L 14-1) at UC Riverside Apr. 8-10. Top hitters for the Huskies are senior third baseman Nick Batkoski (.345, 3 HR, 24 RBI), junior left fielder Zach Clem (.333, 4 HR, 25 RBI) and senior center fielder Taylor Johnson (.317, 6 HR, 31 RBI). Washington's tentative pitching rotation is sophomore right-hander Tim Lincecum (5-4, 3.24 ERA), sophomore right-hander Kyle Parker (5-4, 4.82 ERA) and junior right-hander Matt Kasser (3-3, 5.28). In 2004, the Huskies finished 39-20-1 overall, 15-9 (second) in the Pac-10 and were 2-2 in the NCAA Regional in Oxford, Miss.

CAL'S SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Some highlights for the Bears up to this point of the season include – winning nine-straight games from Feb. 13-Mar. 1 (longest winning streak since 1998). Sophomore outfielder Chris Errecart earning Feb. 15 Pac-10 Player of the Week honors after Cal won two-of-three at Loyola Marymount. Sweeping then No. 14 Long Beach State in Long Beach (first road sweep of the 49ers since 1991). Sweeping Saint Mary's, including senior right-hander Eric Dworkis throwing a complete game with 10 strikeouts and senior right-hander Matt Swanson, sophomore right-hander Michael Cooper, junior right-hander Joe Todoroff and freshman right-hander Jason Corder combining to shutout the Gaels, 7-0, Feb. 27. Winning 10-4 at No. 12 Stanford (first win at Sunken Diamond since 2001). Nearly throwing a no-hitter at Pacific (behind the pitching of Todoroff and Swanson – infield single in the bottom of the ninth). Sweeping Washington State for the first Pac-10 series sweep since 2002, and winning two of three over then No. 24-ranked Arizona State last weekend at Evans Diamond.

**BOESCH'S GOLDEN SEASON:** Sophomore center fielder **Brennan Boesch** continues to be Cal's leading hitter and is making a strong push for postseason honors, sporting a .401 average (57-for-142) with 12 doubles, a triple, six home runs and 25 RBI. Boesch also owns a team-best .641 slugging percentage, a .466 on-base percentage and is 17-for-40 (.391) with runners in scoring position. He has at least one hit in 31 of 37 games this season and has 15 multiple hit games, including last Tuesday (Apr. 12) at Sac. State when he was 2-for-4 with two doubles and a RBI on his 20th birthday. In Cal's first victory this season, Boesch was a perfect 3-for-3 with a double, a home run and scored the winning run in the Bears' Feb. 5 extra-inning win over UC Irvine. Last season in his first collegiate at-bat, Boesch hit a two-run homer versus BYU, and went on to hit another two-run homer later in the game against the Cougars.

**BEARS FEATURE YOUNG, TALENTED INFIELD:** The Bears feature one of the youngest infields in the nation as three of their four infielders are freshmen – shortstop **Kyle Spraker**, second baseman **Josh Satin** and first baseman **Mike Van Winden**. Spraker, a true freshman, has started 33 games at short, missing only four games due to a strained hamstring. He is hitting .223, but more importantly, Spraker has only made five errors in 137 chances for a .964 fielding percentage. Satin, a redshirt freshman, is batting .380 with nine doubles and is second on the team with 25 RBI (along with Boesch and Errecart). He is also hitting a team-best .464 against Pac-10 competition and .436 (24-for-55) with runners in scoring position. Van Winden, also a redshirt freshman, has proven to be an extremely valuable addition, batting .305 with nine doubles, a triple, a home run, 22 RBI and a team-leading 27 walks. This season, he has knocked in game-winning RBI doubles at Long Beach State and versus Washington State, the game-tying RBI against Arizona State and scored the game-winning run against UC Irvine.

**TALBOTT TOP RELEIVER:** Senior left-hander Travis Talbott has been one of the Pac-10's top relievers, earning saves versus Loyola Marymount, Long Beach State (two), San Francisco, Hawaii-Hilo and Nevada, and wins versus Saint Mary's, Washington State and Arizona State. Talbott is tied for second in the conference with six saves, has a 0.96 ERA and opponents are batting .176 against him, only giving up three earned runs in 28.0 innings. He is also sixth in the Pac-10 with 17 appearances. Another impressive stat for Talbott is his 22 strikeouts and only five walks in his 28.0 innings. He came into this season with one career save and a 4-1 career record in 54 appearances.

**GOLD SOLID:** Junior right-hander Adam Gold was impressive in Cal's 7-3 win over Arizona State Apr. 9, pitching a season-high 7.3 innings with eight hits, three runs, two walks and four strikeouts to improve his record to 5-3. Another top victory for Gold this season was winning 3-2 at then No. 14-ranked Long Beach State Feb. 18, throwing 7.0 innings with five hits, no earned runs, two walks and three strikeouts. An honorable mention All-Pac-10 selection last season, he now leads the Bears in victories with five and has a team-high 47 strikeouts in 55.7 innings.

**VALUABLE TRANSFER DWORKIS:** A key addition to Cal's pitching staff is senior transfer **Eric Dworkis**, who played at Gonzaga from 2002-04. Dworkis was outstanding Feb. 26 at Saint Mary's, throwing the Bears' first complete game since **Adam Gold's** one-hitter at Fresno State last season (Feb. 21). Dworkis went 9.0 innings with six hits, one run, only one walk with 10 strikeouts. At Stanford Mar. 6, Dworkis, despite giving up 11 hits, limited the Cardinal to three runs with one walk and three strikeouts in 8.3 innings. He is currently third in the Pac-10 with 64.0 innings pitched. Last year at Gonzaga, Dworkis was 8-4 with five complete games, earning second team All-West Coast Conference honors.

BEARS HAVE A FLAIR FOR THE DRAMATIC: The 2005 Bears have won two extra-inning games this season, have captured two road games in the top of the ninth inning, and most recently scored two runs in the bottom of the ninth for a come-from-behind win. Cal won its first game of the season in extra-innings when freshman second baseman Josh Satin had a two-out single in the bottom of the 11th inning to defeat UC Irvine, 5-4, Feb. 5. On Feb. 13 at Loyola Marymount, sophomore left fielder Chris Errecart had a three-run homer in the ninth to defeat the Lions, 8-5. On Feb. 20, freshman Mike Van Winden had the game-winning two-run double in the ninth inning at Long Beach State, followed by junior right-hander Alex Trafton forcing a double play with the bases loaded in the bottom of the ninth. Senior designated hitter James Holder had a two-out single in the bottom of the 12th to defeat Saint Mary's, 5-4, Feb. 25. Last Sunday, Van Winden and senior Matt Einspahr combined to defeat ASU as Van Winden tied the game with a hard hit single, followed by Einspahr's game-winner. Due to weather, the Bears have been forced to play four doubleheaders this season, but have won six of eight of those contests.

**BEARS AMOUNG PAC-10 TEAM STAT LEADERS:** Cal is currently sixth in the Pac-10 with a team ERA of 4.28, giving up 161 earned runs in 327.3 innings. The Bears are also third in the conference with a .975 team fielding percentage and are fifth in the league with a .297 team batting average (379-for-1,275) with 74 doubles, four triples, 31 home runs and 196 RBI.
