BEAR NOTES: Cal (16-18, 3-9) hosts Oregon (12-24, 2-7) for the first time since the 1981 season in a three-game Pac-10 series at Evans Diamond. The Ducks brought back baseball after a 28-year hiatus and are coached by George Horton, the former Cal State Fullerton coach who led the Titans to the national championship in 2004. The Golden Bears are fresh off a 21-4 victory at UC Davis Wednesday in which they pounded out 22 hits and offensively are led by sophomore outfielder/first baseman **Mark Canha**, who is batting a team-leading .388 (3rd in Pac-10) with a team-best 11 home runs (4th in Pac-10) and 30 RBI (5th in Pac-10). Canha, who was the March 3 Pac-10 Player of the Week after Cal's sweep at Long Beach State, is also first in the Pac-10 with 52 hits and third in total bases (94), third in slugging percentage (.701) and ninth with a .458 on-base percentage. He had a career-high 19-game hitting streak from March 9-April 10 and has hit safely in 32 of 34 games this season. Another hot hitter for Cal is sophomore shortstop **Brian Guinn**, who is second on the team with a .379 average (5th in Pac-10) and fourth in the Pac-10 with 47 hits. Guinn had a spectacular game at UC Davis, going 5-for-7 with two, three-run homers. Junior center fielder **Brett Jackson**, a first-team Preseason All-American in *Baseball America*, is batting .340 and is first in the conference with 14 doubles. The Bears are first in the Pac-10 with 366 hits, 44 home runs and 594 total bases, and second with a .302 team batting average. On the mound, Cal junior left-hander **Michael Bugary** is 3-2 with a 2.67 ERA (6th in Pac-10) and a save. Bugary leads the Bears with 49 strikeouts (7th in Pac-10) in 33.2 innings. Opponents are batting .217 (8th in Pac-10) in 20 relief appearances (3rd in Pac-10). Cal is first in the Pac-10 with 104 strikeouts looking and 10 saves. Nine of Cal's opponents this season were 2008 NCAA Regional participants. The Bears' 2009 schedule is considered the nation's third toughest by Boyd's World.

SERIES RECORD: Cal has a 14-13 all-time record against Oregon, last winning two games during the 1981 season – 4-3, March 27; and, 6-2, March 28, at Evans Diamond.

HEAD COACH DAVID ESQUER: Esquer, 43, (10th season, 279-254-2, .523) was the 2001 Pac-10 Coach of the Year after the Bears went 34-25 and played in the Baton Rouge Regional (1-2). Last year, Cal was 33-21-2 and competed in the Long Beach Regional (0-2). Forty five Bears have signed pro contracts under Esquer, including first round picks **David Cooper** (1B, Toronto, 17th overall) in 2008, **Brandon Morrow** (RHP, Seattle, fifth overall) in 2006 and **Conor Jackson** (INF., Arizona, 19th overall) in 2003. Esquer came to Cal after serving as top assistant at Pepperdine (1996-99), and No. 2 assistant at Stanford (1991-96). A shortstop at Stanford (1984-87), he started on the 1987 College World Series championship team, earning All-Tournament honors. Esquer played professionally for four seasons with Baltimore, California and Milwaukee.

NOTING OREGON: The Oregon Ducks, coached by George Horton (first year at UO, 12-21, .363), are 12-21 (2-7) after getting swept at USC (3-2, 10-3, 9-1), April 9-11, in Los Angeles, and losing to Portland, 12-8, April 14 in Eugene. Top hitters for the Ducks are senior center fielder Caleb Tommasini (.315, 2 HR, 7 RBI), freshman second baseman Danny Pulfer (.277, 0 HR, 12 RBI) and junior left fielder Curtis Raulinaitis (.276, 0 HR, 10 RBI). Oregon's tentative pitching rotation is freshman left-hander Tyler Anderson (2-3, 3.16 ERA), junior right-hander Erik Stavert (3-2, 3.16 ERA) and freshman right-hander Alex Keudell (0-2, 3.86 ERA). In the Duck's last season in 1981, they finished 16-21 overall and 2-16 (fourth) in the Pac-10 Northern Division under coach Mel Krause.

JACKSON'S HONORS: Junior center fielder **Brett Jackson** has been named a 2009 first-team preseason All-American by *Baseball America*, is on the Golden Spikes Award Watch List and is a preseason All-Pac-10 selection by *Baseball America* and *Rivals.com*. Jackson is Cal's first, first-team preseason All-America selection since outfielder Brennan Boesch in 2006. Earlier he was named the nation's 13th best player by The College Baseball Blog. Jackson was honorable mention All-Pac-10 last season, and was also selected the eighth-best prospect out of the Cape Cod League by *Baseball America*, hitting .238 with six doubles, four home runs, 14 RBI and eight stolen bases this past summer for the Cotuit Kettleers. Last spring, he batted .307 (62-for-202, .302 versus the Pac-10) with seven doubles, four triples (fourth in the Pac-10), four home runs and 40 RBI for the Bears. Jackson led the team with 12 stolen bases (eighth in the Pac-10) and hit his first career grand slam May 2 versus Arizona. He finished the year batting .333 (23-for-69) with runners in scoring position. Jackson was a 2008 honorable mention Pac-10 All-Academic selection as well, majoring in sociology (now an art major). This season, he is batting .340 (48-for-141) with 14 doubles (1st in Pac-10), a triple, seven home runs (7th in Pac-10) and 24 RBI. Jackson is third in the Pac-10 in hits (48), fourth in total bases (85), fifth in runs (31), seventh in stolen bases (9) and ninth in slugging percentage (.603).

MULTI-TALENTED SMITH: Junior left-handed hitting, right-handed throwing outfielder/pitcher/first baseman **Blake Smith** is a second-team preseason All-American utility player in both *Baseball America* and *Collegiate Baseball*, and is on the Golden Spikes Award Watch List. Earlier Smith was named the nation's 16th best player, according to The College Baseball Blog, and was selected to the 2009 Wallace Award Watch List as a national player of the year candidate. Additionally, he was named the seventh best prospect from Team USA by *Baseball America* in early September. Smith was instrumental in the USA Baseball National (Collegiate) Team capturing the gold medal at the IV FISU World Collegiate Baseball Championship in the Czech Republic this past summer as the USA squad topped Japan, 1-0 in 12 innings for the title on July 27. He not only helped pace Team USA to an undefeated 24-0 record, he was the team's leading hitter during the national team's summer tour with a .327 average. Smith finished the summer 18-for-55 (.327) overall with five doubles, a triple, three home runs and 13 RBI in 20 games. He was also one of the national team's top relievers, sporting a 1-0 record with a 0.00 ERA and two saves, striking out 11 batters with only three hits and three walks in 9.0 innings. Another highlight for Smith was hitting a home run versus the Cuban squad that competed in the Beijing Olympics. Last spring, Smith batted .296 with 11 doubles, two triples, 12 home runs and 43 RBI for Cal. On the mound, he was 3-0 with a 3.80 ERA and had 36 strikeouts in 21.1 innings. Smith also threw two runners out at the plate from right field during the year and hit a two-run homer against Long Beach State at the NCAA Regional in Long Beach. This season, he is 40-for-136 (.294) at the plate with 10 doubles (8th in Pac-10), seven home runs (7th in Pac-10) and 27 RBI (9th in Pac-10). On the mound, Smith (0-1) has 26 strikeouts in 20.0 innings with a 5.85 ERA and two saves. He has also thrown two runners out at the plate from right field (March 4 versus San Francisco, March 14 versus Cal Poly).

CANHA'S CONTRIBUTIONS: Sophomore outfielder/first baseman **Mark Canha** is leading the Bears with a .388 average (52-for-134, 3rd in Pac-10) and has hit safely in 32 of 34 games. Canha has nine doubles, leads the Pac-10 with 52 hits, and is third with 94 total bases and a .701 slugging percentage. Canha also has 11 home runs (4th in Pac-10), 30 RBI (5th in Pac-10), and a .458 on-base percentage (9th in Pac-10). He was the March 3 Pac-10 Player of the Week after going 9-for-20 (.450) with seven runs, two doubles, two home runs and five RBI in Cal's wins over Vanderbilt (4-3), at Santa Clara (12-2) and three-game sweep at Long Beach State (11-8, 9-6, 6-3). Canha is leading the team with 16 multiple hit games and nine multiple RBI games.

GUINN'S GAME: Sophomore shortstop **Brian Guinn** had a career-high 15-game hitting streak from March 9-April 3 (23-for-56, .411, 6-2B, 2-3B, 12 RBI) and has seen his average rise to .379 (47-for-124, 5th in Pac-10) with eight doubles, two triples (7th in Pac-10), two home runs and 26 RBI. Guinn also has 47 hits (4th in Pac-10), scored 30 runs (8th in Pac-10), has a .432 on-base percentage and is leading the Bears with a .455 average (20-for-44) with runners in scoring position. He had a career-game on Wednesday at UC Davis, going 5-for-7 with two, three-run homers...Guinn also had a big game Feb. 25 at Santa Clara, going 4-for-4 with three runs scored, a double and three RBI. Guinn is third on the team with 14 multiple-hit games, second with seven multiple-RBI games, and has eight stolen bases.

BUGARY BATTLES: Junior left-hander **Michael Bugary** has overcome injuries (shoulder, knee) suffered the past two seasons to become one of the Pac-10's top relievers. Bugary is 3-2 with a save, a 2.67 ERA (6th in Pac-10), a team-high 49 strikeouts (7th in Pac-10) in 33.2 innings, and a team-high 20 appearances (3rd in Pac-10). He had an impressive seven strikeouts in 3.2 innings March 7 at Arkansas (earning his first career save), and six strikeouts in 2.0 innings March 23 versus Stanford.

KOBERNUS WATCH: Junior **Jeff Kobernus** has shown his versatility. As a freshman, Kobernus played in the Bears' outfield after starting as a shortstop in high school, earning *Collegiate Baseball* Freshman All-America honors after batting .331 with five doubles, a triple, a home run and 22 RBI. Last season, he moved to third base and hit .303 with 13 doubles, two triples, three home runs (including a grand slam against Loyola Marymount) with 27 RBI. This year Kobernus is Cal's second baseman, batting .319 (46-for-144) with eight doubles, a triple, two home runs and 22 RBI. He is fifth in the Pac-10 with 46 hits and seventh with nine stolen bases. On Feb. 23, Kobernus had the game-winning RBI in the ninth inning in the Bears' 4-3 victory over Vanderbilt.

MASTERFUL MILLER: The Bears have another Wallace Award candidate in sophomore right-hander **Kevin Miller**. Miller was a 2008 *Collegiate Baseball* Freshman All-American, as well as honorable mention All-Pac-10, finishing 6-1 with a 2.90 ERA. He had 68 strikeouts in 71.1 innings and started his college career not giving up an earned run in his first 44.0 innings on the mound. Miller was second in the Pac-10 with a 2.90 ERA and a .196 opponent batting average. Miller's top games in '08 included a career-high eight strikeouts in 6.2 innings versus Washington on Apr. 19, and defeating two-time defending national champion Oregon State in relief (6.2 innings, seven strikeouts). He had 21 appearances (five starts), picking up six straight wins from March 11 through May 11. This season, Miller (1-2) has 35 strikeouts (21 looking, 2nd in Pac-10) in 37.2 innings with a 4.06 ERA. He earned his first collegiate save March 25 versus Santa Clara (3.2 innings, five hits, one earned run, one walk, two strikeouts) and picked up the win March 31 versus USF (5.2 innings, five hits, one run, two walks, six strikeouts) at AT&T Park during the Dante Benedetti Classic.

OH'S HEROICS: Freshman outfielder **Danny Oh** (Mill Creek, Wash.) hit a two-run homer in his first collegiate at-bat, pinch-hitting in the seventh inning Feb. 20 in the Bears' season-opening 8-7 win over UC Riverside. Oh is batting .286 (34-for-119), with two doubles, a triple, three home runs, 21 RBI, and is second on the team with a .333 average (17-for-51) with runners in scoring position. He was impressive Feb. 25 at Santa Clara, going 4-for-5 with four RBI; was 4-for-5 with an RBI March 17 at Pacific and hit a grand slam April 9 at Washington.

FLEMER'S DEBUT: In one of the best pitching debut in Cal history, freshman right-hander **Matt Flemer** (El Cerrito, Calif.) threw 6.1 innings with four hits, two runs, no walks and 13 strikeouts Feb. 25 at Santa Clara. Flemer's 13 strikeouts were the most K's for a Bear hurler since Tyson Ross struck out 16 Oral Roberts batters on Mar. 22, 2007. Flemer yielded a lead-off homer to the first hitter he faced, but went on to retire 19 of the next 20 batters. He earned a save in his second outing Feb. 28 at Long Beach State (2.0 innings, no hits, no runs, no walks, three strikeouts). Flemer is 3-2 with a 7.38 ERA and a save with 39 strikeouts (17 looking, 5th in Pac-10) and only nine walks in 39.0 innings.

DIEMER DELIEVERS: Another strong pitching performance from a young Cal player was sophomore right-hander **Brian Diemer** Feb. 23 versus Vanderbilt. Diemer, who only made five appearances last season, threw a career-high 7.2 innings with three hits, three runs, one walk and eight strikeouts. He threw 6.0 innings with five hits, two earned runs, four walks and a career-high nine strikeouts March 22 versus Stanford. Diemer is 1-4 with a 6.30 ERA and has 25 strikeouts in 40.0 innings.

TONNESON'S TIME: Junior catcher **Dylan Tonneson** continues to be one of the Bears' most consistent players. After taking over behind the plate for an injured Charlie Cutler early last season, Tonneson has become Cal's everyday catcher. He is currently batting .250 (24-for-96) with six doubles, four home runs and 10 RBI after hitting .306 with 12 doubles, six home runs and 33 RBI as sophomore. Tonneson was the 2008 recipient of the George Wolfman Award as the team's most improved player.

YOUNG ACE JOHNSON: Freshman right-hander **Erik Johnson** (Los Altos, Calif.) has established himself as one of the Bears' top pitchers. Johnson (2-3) is fourth in the Pac-10 with four saves in 13 appearances (four starts), while striking out 31 batters in 30.2 innings. He picked up a save Feb. 20 versus UC Riverside (1.1 innings, one strikeout) and a win Feb. 23 versus Vanderbilt (1.1 innings, three strikeouts). Johnson earned two saves at Long Beach State (Feb. 27-28) and March 4 versus San Francisco. He won in a March 29 start versus Washington State (career-high 6.0 innings, six hits, one earned run, career-high four strikeouts).

CAL BITS: Cal head coach **David Esquer** has mentored seven All-Americans since 2000, including three freshman All-Americans in the last four years...last season, second baseman **Josh Satin** was Cal's first, first-team All-American in *Baseball America* since **Troy Penix** in 1992, and first baseman **David Cooper** was a member of four different All-America teams...in 2008, the Bears twice defeated eventual national champion Fresno State (14-4 in San Diego, 5-4 in Berkeley)...Cal is predicted by *Baseball America* to qualify for the 2009 NCAA Austin, Texas Regional as the No. 3 seed team behind Texas and Arkansas and ahead of Texas-San Antonio...Cal will be looking for back-to-back regional appearances for the first time since 1991-92 under former head coach **Bob Milano**...Milano, who guided the Bears from 1978-1999 and led them to three College World Series (third place finish in 1980), will be inducted into the ABCA Hall of Fame in January, 2010...he will join **Clint Evans** and **George Wolfman** as Cal coaches in the ABCA Hall of Fame...Evans led the Bears to the first-ever CWS title in 1947 and Wolfman guided Cal to the 1957 national championship...the Bears have two sophomore infielders, **Austin Booker** and **Guinn**, who are sons of former Cal standouts and professional ballplayers **Rod Booker** (1979-80) and **Brian Guinn, Sr.** (1981-83), while freshman infielder **Marcus Semien** is the son of former Cal wide receiver **Damian Semien** (1990-93)...Booker (.375, 3-for-8) hit a home run in his first at-bat of the season Feb. 21 (game one) against UC Riverside and scored the winning run in the Bears' 4-3 victory over Vanderbilt...

DID YOU KNOW?

*Cal won the inaugural College World Series title in 1947, defeating former President George H.W. Bush's Yale team, 8-7, in Kalamazoo, Michigan.

*The Golden Bears have had two players become league MVPs in professional baseball – **Jackie Jensen** (1947, 49) was the American League MVP in 1958 and **Jeff Kent** (was the National League MVP in 2001).

*Cal is one of only 20 schools that have won NCAA Baseball titles and only one of 12 schools that have won more than one national championship (1947, 1957). The Bears have competed in five College World Series (1947, 1957, 1980, 1988, 1992).

***Geoff Blum**, Cal's starting shortstop as a freshman on the Bears' 1992 College World Series team, had a game-winning homer for the Chicago White Sox in the 2005 Major League World Series.

*In 2006, the Bears had a school-record five players selected in the first 10 rounds of the Major League Amateur Draft, including junior right-hander **Brandon Morrow**, the fifth pick overall by the Seattle Mariners – the highest draft pick in Cal history.

DIXON ANDERSON, FR., RHP: 0-0 with a 3.38 ERA and a save in 13 appearances...has 24 strikeouts in 26.2 innings...threw a career-high 5.0 innings with one hit, no runs, one walk and a career-high five strikeouts April 10 at Washington...had three strikeouts in 1.2 innings (one hit, one earned run, no walks) April 3 at Oregon State...earned first collegiate save March 23 vs. Stanford (3.0 innings, no hits, no runs, no walks, two strikeouts)...threw 4.0 innings with four strikeouts March 14 vs. Cal Poly (eight hits, three runs)...

MICHAEL BRADY, SR., 3B/SS: Batting .297 (38-for-128, .325 vs. Pac-10) with 12 doubles (3rd in Pac-10), two triples (7th in Pac-10), four home runs, 22 RBI and 66 total bases (8th in Pac-10)...went 2-for-4 with a double and two RBI at Stanford April 13...was 4-for-5 with a double at Oregon State April 5...went 2-for-4 with a double, home run and three RBI March 27 vs. Washington State...was 3-for-4 with a double and RBI March 25 vs. Santa Clara...went 2-for-3 with two doubles and an RBI vs. Stanford March 21...was 2-for-5 with a double and RBI March 17 at Pacific...had a seven-game hitting streak from Feb. 28- March 7 (9-for-23, .391, 3-2B, 3B, HR, five RBI)...went 3-for-4 with a double and home run March 6 at Arkansas...was 2-for-4 with a double, triple and RBI Feb. 28 at Long Beach State...hit a home run in the season-opener vs. UC Riverside...is batting .317 (13-for-41) with runners in scoring position...

MICHAEL BUGARY, JR., LHP: 3-2 (9th in Pac-10) with a 2.67 ERA (6th in Pac-10) and a save in a team-high 20 appearances (3rd in Pac-10)...has a team-high 49 strikeouts (9th in Pac-10) in 33.2 innings...opponents are batting .217 (8th in Pac-10)...had four strikeouts in 2.1 innings April 11 at Washington...had three strikeouts in 1.2 innings (one hit, one walk) April 5 at Oregon State...won in relief March 23 vs. Stanford (2.0 innings, three hits, two runs, three walks, six strikeouts)...had four strikeouts in 2.1 innings March 31 vs. San Francisco...won in relief March 21 vs. Stanford (2.0 innings, one hit, no runs, no walks, three strikeouts)...had six strikeouts in 3.0 innings March 17 at Pacific...earned save March 7 at Arkansas with a career-high seven strikeouts in 3.2 innings...had five strikeouts in a career-high 4.0 innings Feb.21 vs. UC Riverside...
