BEAR NOTES: The California baseball team (25-16, 6-6) faces the challenge of hosting another nationally-ranked opponent at Evans Diamond, this time entertaining No. 25-ranked USC (24-11, 6-3) in a key Pac-10 series. Cal has kept its postseason hopes alive by winning its last two games in decidedly different fashion. The Bears defeated Washington on Apr. 17 in Seattle when freshman first baseman Mike Van Winden knocked in his third game-winning RBI of the season with a two-out single in the 11th inning, scoring senior designated hitter James Holder. On Wednesday, Cal shut out Hawaii, 11-0, at Evans Diamond behind the pitching of junior starter Joe Todoroff and five other Bear hurlers, while senior third baseman and team captain Matt Einspahr hit a grand slam to pace the Cal offense. Einspahr leads the Bears with 33 RBI and also had the game-winning RBI in the bottom of the ninth in Cal's 4-3 come-from-behind versus then No. 24-ranked Arizona State on Apr. 10. Senior right-hander and team captain Matt Swanson picked up the win in relief at Washington, throwing the final 2.3 innings with one hit, no runs, two walks and four strikeouts. For the year, he is an impressive 5-0 with two saves, and a 1.07 ERA in a Pac-10 leading 21 appearances. Sophomore center fielder Brennan Boesch is the Bears' offensive leader with a .392 average (third in the Pac-10), 100 total bases, 62 hits, .633 slugging percentage, .455 on-base percentage, 13 doubles and seven home runs. Cal is currently 25-16, with at least 16 regular season games left, after only winning 25 games (25-31, 9-15) all of last season.

SERIES RECORD: Cal has a 131-216 series record against the USC Trojans. In the last meeting, the Bears won two of three games (W 4-2, L 11-4, W 12-9) at Dedeaux Field, Apr. 8-10, 2004. In the last series played at Evans Diamond, Cal won two of three (L 3-1, W 11-2, W 8-3) Apr. 17-19, 2003.

HEAD COACH DAVID ESQUER: Esquer, 39, is in his sixth season at Cal with a career record of 166-154 (.519). In 2001, he was the Pac-10 Coach of the Year after leading the Bears to a 34-25 mark, a third place finish in the Pac-10 (14-10) and a berth to the NCAA Regional in Baton Rouge, LA (1-2). Twenty-five Cal players have signed professional contracts since Esquer became coach, including Conor Jackson, who was a first round draft choice of the Arizona Diamondbacks in 2003. On June 10, 1999, Esquer became only the 10th coach in the history of Cal baseball, which began in 1892. He came to Berkeley after serving as the top assistant at Pepperdine from 1996-99. Esquer was the No. 2 assistant coach at Stanford under Mark Marquess from 1991-96. A shortstop at Stanford from 1984-87, he was a starter on the 1987 College World Series championship team, earning All-Tournament honors. Esquer also earned All-Pac-10 Southern Division honors and went on to play professional baseball for four seasons with the Baltimore, California and Milwaukee organizations.

NOTING USC: The No. 25 (*Baseball America*) USC Trojans, coached by Mike Gillespie (19th year at USC, 721-427-2, .628), are 24-11, 6-3 after most recently defeating UC Santa Barbara, 8-2, at USC Apr. 19, and falling at No. 2 Cal State Fullerton, 5-3, Apr. 20. Top hitters for the Trojans are junior catcher Jeff Clement (.345, 9 HR, 32 RBI), sophomore left fielder Cyle Hankerd (.328, 1 HR, 25 RBI) and junior third baseman Billy Hart (.313, 2 HR, 18 RBI). USC's tentative pitching rotation is sophomore right-hander lan Kennedy (6-1, 2.87 ERA), junior left-hander Jack Spradlin (4-1, 3.36 ERA) and junior right-hander Zack Kalter (2-2, 1.60). In 2004, the Trojans finished 24-32 overall and 10-14 (sixth tie) in the Pac-10.

CAL'S SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Some highlights for the Bears up to this point of the season include – winning nine-straight games from Feb. 13-Mar. 1 (longest winning streak since 1998). Sophomore outfielder Chris Errecart earning Feb. 15 Pac-10 Player of the Week honors after Cal won two-of-three at Loyola Marymount. Sweeping then-No. 14-ranked Long Beach State in Long Beach (first road sweep of the 49ers since 1991). Sweeping Saint Mary's, including senior right-hander Eric Dworkis throwing a complete game with 10 strikeouts and senior right-hander Matt Swanson, sophomore right-hander Michael Cooper, junior right-hander Joe Todoroff and freshman right-hander Jason Corder combining to shutout the Gaels, 7-0, Feb. 27. Winning 10-4 at No. 12 Stanford (first win at Sunken Diamond since 2001). Nearly throwing a no-hitter at Pacific (behind the pitching of Todoroff and Swanson – infield single in the bottom of the ninth). Sweeping Washington State for the first Pac-10 series sweep since 2002, winning two of three over then No. 24-ranked Arizona State at Evans Diamond, and shutting out Hawaii, 11-0, Wednesday at Evans Diamond.

BOESCH'S GOLDEN SEASON: Sophomore center fielder **Brennan Boesch** continues to be Cal's leading hitter and is making a strong push for postseason honors, sporting a .392 average (62-for-158) with 13 doubles, a triple, seven home runs and 29 RBI. Boesch also owns a team-best .633 slugging percentage, a .455 on-base percentage and is 20-for-52 (.385) with runners in scoring position. He has at least one hit in 35 of 41 games this season and has 16 multiple hit games, including Apr. 12 at Sac. State when he was 2-for-4 with two doubles and a RBI on his 20th birthday. In Cal's first victory this season, Boesch was a perfect 3-for-3 with a double, a home run and scored the winning run in the Bears' Feb. 5 extra-inning win over UC Irvine. Last season in his first collegiate at-bat, Boesch hit a two-run homer versus BYU, and went on to hit another two-run homer later in the game against the Cougars. In a doubleheader this season (Mar. 6) at Stanford, he hit two-run homers in each of the two games.

SENIOR CAPTAINS MATT SWANSON AND MATT EINSPAHR: Senior captains Matt Swanson and Matt Einspahr are saving their best for last as both players are having outstanding senior campaigns. Swanson has a 5-0 record with two saves and a 1.07 ERA, only giving up four earned runs in 33.7 innings. Earlier this season, he earned the win at Stanford, throwing a season-high 4.0 shutout innings with one hit, two walks and three strikeouts to defeat the Cardinal at Sunken Diamond for the first time since 2001. Most recently, Swanson helped the Bears to a key extra-inning win at Washington, throwing the final 2.3 scoreless innings with one hit, two walks and four strikeouts. Einspahr, who came into this season with a .237 career batting average with one home run and 18 RBI, is hitting .289 with a team-best 33 RBI, including a grand slam Wednesday versus Hawaii and the game-winning RBI in the ninth inning versus Arizona State.

BEARS FEATURE YOUNG, TALENTED INFIELD: The Bears feature one of the youngest infields in the nation as three of their four infielders are freshmen – shortstop Kyle Spraker, second baseman Josh Satin and first baseman Mike Van Winden. Spraker, a true freshman, has started 36 games at short. He is hitting .217, but only five errors in 144 chances (.965 fielding percentage). Satin, a redshirt freshman, is batting .376 with nine doubles, a triple, three home runs and 25 RBI. He is hitting .436 against Pac-10 competition and a team-best .429 (24-for-56) with runners in scoring position. Satin and Boesch were high school teammates at Harvard-Westlake High School in Los Angeles. Van Winden, a redshirt freshman as well, has proven to be an extremely valuable with the knack for game-winning hits, batting .307 with 11 doubles, a triple, a home run, 25 RBI and a team-leading 28 walks. This season, he scored the game-winning run against UC Irvine, knocked in game-winning RBI doubles at Long Beach State and versus Washington State, had the game-tying RBI against Arizona State and hit the game-winning single at Washington.

TALBOTT A TOP RELEIVER: Senior left-hander Travis Talbott (3-1, six saves, 1.50 ERA) has been one of the Pac-10's top relievers this season, earning saves versus Loyola Marymount, Long Beach State (two), San Francisco, Hawaii-Hilo and Nevada, and wins versus Saint Mary's, Washington State and Arizona State. Talbott is third in the conference with six saves, has a 1.50 ERA and opponents are batting .208 against him, only giving up five earned runs in 30.0 innings. He is also fifth in the Pac-10 with 19 appearances. Another impressive stat for Talbott is his 24 strikeouts and only eight walks in his 30.0 innings.

VALUABLE STARTERS DWORKIS AND GOLD: A key addition to Cal's pitching staff is senior transfer **Eric Dworkis** (3-5, 4.02 ERA), who played at Gonzaga from 2002-04. Dworkis was outstanding Feb. 26 at Saint Mary's, throwing the Bears' first complete game since **Adam Gold's** one-hitter at Fresno State last season (Feb. 21). Dworkis went 9.0 innings with six hits, one run, only one walk with 10 strikeouts. He is currently third in the Pac-10 with 71.7 innings pitched. Last year at Gonzaga, Dworkis was 8-4 with five complete games, earning second team All-West Coast Conference honors. Junior right-hander Gold (5-4, 5.49) is Cal's top returning starter after earning honorable mention All-Pac-10 accolades last year. He leads the Bears this season with 51 strikeouts in 62.3 innings.

BEARS HAVE A FLAIR FOR THE DRAMATIC: The 2005 Bears have won three extra-inning games, have captured two road games in the top of the ninth and scored two runs in the bottom of the ninth for a come-from-behind win. Cal won its first game of the season in extra-innings when freshman second baseman Josh Satin had a two-out single in the bottom of the 11th inning to defeat UC Irvine, 5-4, on Feb. 5. On Feb. 13 at Loyola Marymount, sophomore left fielder Chris Errecart had a three-run homer in the ninth to defeat the Lions, 8-5. On Feb. 20, freshman Mike Van Winden had the game-winning two-run double in the ninth inning at Long Beach State, followed by junior right-hander Alex Trafton forcing a double play with the bases loaded in the bottom of the ninth. Senior designated hitter James Holder had a two-out single in the bottom of the 12th to defeat Saint Mary's, 5-4, Feb. 25. On Apr. 10, Van Winden and senior Matt Einspahr combined to defeat ASU as Van Winden tied the game with a hard hit single, followed by Einspahr's game-winner. Finally, Van Winden had the game-winning RBI with two outs in the 11th to defeat Washington, 4-3 on Apr. 17. Due to weather, the Bears have been forced to play four doubleheaders this season, but have been able to win six of those eight contests.
