BEAR NOTES: California (19-21, 6-9) hosts UCLA (23-16, 7-5) this weekend in a crucial Pac-10 series at Evans Diamond. Cal has captured league series from Washington, Arizona and at Washington State, but will be striving for more as it was swept at USC and last weekend at home by No. 9-ranked Oregon State. The Bears will be looking to snap a four-game losing streak after falling to San Francisco, 7-6, Tuesday at AT&T Park (home of the San Francisco Giants) in the inaugural Dante Benedetti Classic. In the first collegiate game at AT&T Park, Cal's junior center fielder Brennan Boesch, lead-off the scoring with a three-run homer to right field in the first inning. Senior shortstop Allen Craig and junior left fielder Chris Errecart also performed well as Craig homered in the fifth and doubled in the ninth, while Errecart had two doubles, including the game-tying hit in the ninth. The Bears feature two players, junior right-hander Brandon Morrow and Craig, who are putting themselves in position for postseason honors. Morrow, a third-team preseason All-American in Baseball America, is 7-1 with a Pac-10 leading 1.52 ERA, and has 81 strikeouts in 77.0 innings. He also has one complete game, has only allowed 49 hits and opponents are batting .187 against him. Morrow was the National Pitcher of the Week on Feb. 6, and is on the Roger Clemens Award Watch List as a National Pitcher of the Year candidate. Craig is having an outstanding year after being selected as a 2005 first-team Summer All-American in Baseball America. He is batting .364 with 12 doubles, nine home runs and 24 RBI, and has hit home runs in four of his last five games. Craig is third in the Pac-10 with his 98 total bases and fourth with his nine home runs.

SERIES RECORD: The Bears have a 164-156 all-time series record against the UCLA Bruins. Last season, Cal won two-of-three (W 7-1, W 6-4, L 4-2) Apr. 29-May 1 in Los Angeles. In 2004, the Bears won one-of-three (L 7-2, L 10-7, W 3-2) Apr. 23-25 at Evans Diamond.

HEAD COACH DAVID ESQUER: Esquer, 40, is in his seventh season at Cal with a career record of 194-182 (.516). In 2001, he was the Pac-10 Coach of the Year after leading the Bears to a 34-25 mark, a third place finish in the Pac-10 (14-10) and a berth to the NCAA Regional in Baton Rouge, La. (1-2). Twenty nine Cal players have signed professional contracts since Esquer became coach, including Conor Jackson, who was a first round draft choice of the Arizona Diamondbacks in 2003. On June 10, 1999, Esquer became only the 10th coach in the history of Cal baseball, which began in 1892. He came to Berkeley after serving as the top assistant at Pepperdine from 1996-99. Esquer was the No. 2 assistant coach at Stanford under Mark Marquess from 1991-96. A shortstop at Stanford from 1984-87, he was a starter on the 1987 College World Series championship team, earning All-Tournament honors. Esquer also earned All-Pac-10 Southern Division honors and went on to play professional baseball for four seasons with the Baltimore, California and Milwaukee organizations.

NOTING UCLA: The UCLA Bruins, coached by John Savage (2nd year at UCLA, 38-58, .396), are 23-17 and 7-5 in the Pac-10 after winning two-of-three versus No. 10 Arizona State (L 3-2, W 5-1, W 11-10 in 10 innings) Apr. 21-23 in Los Angeles, and losing, 11-8, Tuesday at home to UC Santa Barbara. Leading hitters for the Bruins are junior designated hitter Hector Ambriz (.339, 4 HR, 28 RBI), freshman shortstop Brandon Crawford (.319, 5 HR, 25 RBI) and senior right fielder Chris Jensen (.317, 4 HR, 24 RBI). UCLA's tentative pitching rotation is junior right-hander Hector Ambriz (5-5, 3.54 ERA), junior left-hander Dave Huff (5-2, 2.85 ERA) and junior right-hander Tyson Brummett (5-4, 4.57 ERA). In 2005, the Bruins finished 15-41 overall and 4-20 in the Pac-10 (eighth).

BEARS ARE HUNGRY: Cal returns seven regular position players from a squad that was 34-23 overall and 13-11 (fifth) in the Pac-10 in 2005. Last season, the Bears notched 13 wins against teams that advanced to an NCAA Regional; captured Pac-10 series versus Stanford, Arizona State and Arizona; and swept Long Beach State; yet were denied an NCAA berth. Cal became the first Pac-10 team not to advance to postseason with an over .500 record in the conference play. Baseball America felt Cal was the most deserving team left off the 2005 NCAA tournament field.

CRAIG'S STANDOUT SENIOR CAMPAIGN: Senior **Allen Craig** is coming off a phenomenal summer playing shortstop for Alexandria (Minn.) of the Northwoods League, batting .362 with 12 home runs and 40 RBI, earning first-team Summer All-America accolades in *Baseball America*. Craig has not missed a beat this spring as he owns a .364 average with a team-best 59 hits, 30 runs and 12 doubles. He also has 22 multiple-hit games. Craig was honorable mention All-Pac-10 in 2005, batting.358 against conference foes and leading off a game with a home run three times during the year. For his career, Craig has a .309 average with 45 doubles (8th on the Cal all-time list), a triple, 26 home runs (9th on the Cal all-time list) and 100 RBI in 182 games.

MORROW CONTINUES TO SHINE: Similar to Craig, junior Brandon Morrow had an outstanding summer that has carried over to the spring. Competing for the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox in the Cape Cod League, Morrow and junior outfielder Chris Errecart wowed the scouts and were named preseason All-Americans in Baseball America (Errecart second-team, Morrow third-team). Morrow struck out 24 batters in 14.7 innings with a 1.84 ERA and three saves, and was selected the fifth-best professional prospect, while Errecart hit .303 with six home runs and 22 RBI and was selected the fourth-best professional prospect by Baseball America. This spring for the Bears, Morrow was named the National Pitcher of the Week when he allowed no hits in 6.3 innings with 12 strikeouts and only one walk in the Feb. 3 season-opener at UC Irvine, and at UNLV on Mar. 10, threw his first career complete-game with six hits, one run, three walks and seven strikeouts. He is on the Roger Clemens Award Watch List as a candidate for the national pitcher of the year. This spring, Errecart is batting .270, but has six home runs, and hit two, two-run homers at UNLV. He also teamed-up with Brennan Boesch to hit back-to-back homers to defeat Long Beach State Feb. 11, on his 21st birthday.

HONORING CARL VAN HEUIT: On Sunday, Apr. 23, the official dedication of the Carl J. Van Heuit Training Facility (which includes the Jeff Kent Batting Cages and Stuart Gordon Bullpens) took place at Evans Diamond. The Carl Van Heuit Training Facility, named after the former Cal football Hall of Famer and staunch supporter of the Bears' baseball program, provides the team with indoor batting cages, indoor and outdoor bullpens, as well as weight training equipment. Van Heuit, who was an All-American safety in 1950 and helped Cal to the 1949 and '50 Rose Bowls, was also instrumental in the fundraising for the Jackie Jensen Press Box in 1987, and the field facelift in the fall of 1992.

PRESEASON ACCOLADES GALORE FOR BOESCH: Junior center fielder Brennan Boesch entered the 2006 season with the most preseason accolades since Xavier Nady was Baseball America's National Preseason Player of the Year in 2000. Boesch is a preseason All-American with the Collegiate Baseball Writers (first-team), Baseball America (second-team) and Collegiate Baseball (third-team). He is also on the Brooks Wallace List as a candidate for national player of the year honors. Last season, Boesch batted .355 (fifth in the Pac-10) with 21 doubles (fifth in the Pac-10), two triples, seven home runs and 33 RBI. His 21 doubles were third on the Cal all-time single-season doubles list, and he hit .367 (22-for-60) with runners in scoring position, earning first-team All-Pac-10 honors. This season, Boesch is hitting .269, but leads the team with 10 home runs and 30 RBI.

SATIN'S STELLAR FRESHMAN CAMPAIGN: Sophomore **Josh Satin** was stellar in 2005, earning All-Pac-10 and *Collegiate Baseball* Freshman All-America honors. As a redshirt freshman second baseman, Satin had a .348 average and 40 RBI. He also had 77 hits, 15 doubles, a triple, five home runs, a team-leading 26 multiple-hit games, a 15-game hitting streak and a team-best .434 average with runners in scoring position. Satin was the first Cal freshman to earn both Freshman All-America and All-Pac-10 honors since **Xavier Nady** was the National Freshman of the Year in 1998.

CAL'S JENSEN AND EVANS ON HALL OF FAME BALLOT: Cal has two baseball legends – Jackie Jensen and Clint Evans – who were among the 46 nominees for the inaugural class of the College Baseball Hall of Fame. The list of legendary players included such athletes as Jensen, Will Clark of Mississippi State, Dave Winfield of Minnesota, Robin Ventura of Oklahoma State and Fred Lynn of USC. Evans is part of a list of pre-1947 candidates who also included Lou Gehrig of Columbia and Bobby Layne of Texas, among others. One of the greatest athletes ever to play for the University of California, Jensen twice earned All-America status (1947, 1949) as an outfielder for Cal's baseball team, and helped the Bears to the NCAA College World Series title in 1947. He also pitched Cal to one of its victories in the 1947 College World Series, over a Yale team that featured future president George

Bush. Jensen had a distinguished pro baseball career and was selected as the American League MVP while with the Boston Red Sox in 1958, and played in the World Series for the New York Yankees as well. He also earned first-team All-America honors at running back in 1948 while becoming Cal's first-ever 1,000-yard rusher in a season. Jensen rushed for 1,703 yards in his three years as a starter and averaged 6.0 yards per carry. He is one of the few athletes in history to play in both the Rose Bowl and the World Series, and was voted into the National Football Foundation College Hall of Fame in 1984. Clint Evans was the head baseball coach at Cal from 1930-54, amassing a .681 winning percentage with a 547-256 mark during his 25 seasons leading the Golden Bears. Evans coached Cal to the nation's first NCAA College World Series title in 1947 with an 8-7 victory over Bush's Yale team in Kalamazoo, Mich. He was instrumental in college baseball establishing a world series in order to determine a national champion, and overall his Cal teams won six California Intercollegiate Baseball Association titles and tied for three others. Cal's baseball field, Evans Diamond, is named in his honor.

ADDITIONAL CAL NOTES: Cal senior outfielder Rob Nesbitt was impressive last week against UC Davis and Oregon State, going 7-for-10 with two doubles and two RBI...Nesbitt, who has only started six games this season, went 6-for-7 in the last two games against OSU, including going 4-for-4 with an RBI double Sunday against the Beavers...earlier, Nesbitt came off the bench to hit the game-winning homer in the 13th inning against Arizona in the Bears' 5-4 victory Apr. 1-2...he is now batting .379 (11-for-29) on the season with three doubles, a home run and five RBI in 17 games...as a result of Tuesday's 7-6 loss to USF at AT&T Park, Cal has now lost 10, one-run games this season, including four, one-run games in extra-innings...the Bears are leading the Pac-10 with 115 strikeout versus conference foes and are third in the league with a 3.81 team ERA...Cal has captured two games via dramatic home runs – on Feb. 11, Cal defeated Long Beach State after trailing 2-1 going into the bottom of the ninth on back-to-back homers by Boesch and Errecart for a 3-2 win, and on Apr. 2 Nesbitt defeated Arizona, 5-4 in 13 innings, with an opposite field homer to right...Boesch was involved in another dramatic finish, throwing Washington's Bradley Boyer out at the plate in the top of the ninth to preserve Cal's 2-1 win Mar. 24.
