BEAR NOTES: The California baseball team (21-12, 3-3) will face a nationallyranked Pac-10 opponent for the second week in-a-row when the Golden Bears host No. 24-ranked (Baseball America) Arizona State (21-13, 2-1) in a threegame series at Evans Diamond. Cal is looking to rebound from being swept last weekend at No. 16 Oregon State, after opening the 2005 league schedule with a sweep of Washington State. The Bears were able to capture a hard-fought 11-8 victory at Nevada (15-11) on Tuesday, behind key performances from seniors Matt Einspahr, Matt Swanson and Travis Talbott. Einspahr had a clutch threerun double in the seventh inning, Swanson earned the win throwing 2.3 innings of shutout relief, and Talbott picked up his sixth save pitching the ninth with no hits and a strikeout. Even though Cal features a starting line-up that includes three freshmen and three sophomores, seniors have be vital to the Bears' success this season. Einspahr is batting .308 with a team-leading 25 RBI. Swanson is 4-0 with two saves, a 1.26 ERA, and is third in the Pac-10 with 17 appearances. Talbott is 2-1 with a 0.76 ERA, has a league-leading six saves, has 20 strikeouts and only five walks in 23.7 innings, and has only given-up two earned runs. Sophomore outfielders Brennan Boesch and Chris Errecart, and freshman second baseman Josh Satin, are the Bears' top three hitters. Boesch leads the team with a .405 average and six home runs, Satin is hitting .375 overall and .460 with runners in scoring position, and Errecart has gone 16-for-35 with five doubles and two home runs in the past two weeks to raise his average from .270 to .319.

SERIES RECORD: Cal has a 49-87 series record against the Arizona State Sun Devils. In the last meeting, the Bears won two of three games (W 9-7, W 20-8, L 8-4) at Packard Stadium, Mar. 19-21, 2004. In the last series played at Evans Diamond, Cal was swept (11-3, 6-0, 10-1) Apr. 11, 13, 2003.

HEAD COACH DAVID ESQUER: Esquer, 39, is in his sixth season at Cal with a career record of 162-150 (.519). In 2001, he was the Pac-10 Coach of the Year after leading the Bears to a 34-25 mark, a third place finish in the Pac-10 (14-10) and a berth to the NCAA Regional in Baton Rouge, LA (1-2). Twenty-five Cal players have signed professional contracts since Esquer became coach, including Conor Jackson, who was a first round draft choice of the Arizona Diamondbacks in 2003. On June 10, 1999, Esquer became only the 10th coach in the history of Cal baseball, which began in 1892. He came to Berkeley after serving as the top assistant at Pepperdine from 1996-99. Esquer was the No. 2 assistant coach at Stanford under Mark Marquess from 1991-96. A shortstop at Stanford from 1984-87, he was a starter on the 1987 College World Series championship team, earning All-Tournament honors. Esquer also earned All-Pac-10 Southern Division honors and went on to play professional baseball for four seasons with the Baltimore, California and Milwaukee organizations.

NOTING ARIZONA STATE: The No. 24 Arizona State Sun Devils, coached by Pat Murphy (11th year at ASU, 422-209-1, .669), are 21-13 after sweeping Wright State (13-1, 11-3, 14-1) at ASU Apr. 1-3. Top hitters for the Sun Devils are freshman right fielder Rocky Laguna (.356, 1 HR, 21 RBI), junior third baseman Travis Buck (.351, 2 HR, 23 RBI) and senior catcher Tuffy Gosewisch (.346, 5 HR, 39 RBI). Arizona State's tentative pitching rotation is junior left-hander Erik Averill (6-2, 3.03 ERA), sophomore right-hander Pat Bresnehan (3-2, 3.74 ERA) and senior right-hander Jason Urquidez (5-2, 4.64). In 2004, the Sun Devils finished 41-18 overall, 13-11 (fourth) in the Pac-10 and were 1-2 in the NCAA Regional in Fullerton, Calif.

BOESCH'S GOLDEN SEASON: Sophomore center fielder **Brennan Boesch** continues to be Cal's leading hitter, sporting a .405 average (51-for-126) with nine doubles, a triple, six home runs and 23 RBI. Boesch also owns a team-best .651 slugging percentage, a .469 on-base percentage and is 17-for-40 (.425) with runners in scoring position. He has at least one hit in 28 of 33 games this season and has 13 multiple hit games. In Cal's first victory this season, Boesch was a perfect 3-for-3 with a double, a home run and scored the winning run in the Bears' Feb. 5 extra-inning win over UC Irvine. Last season in his first collegiate at-bat, Boesch hit a two-run homer versus BYU, and went on to hit another two-run homer later in the game against the Cougars.

BEARS FEATURE YOUNG, TALENTED INFIELD: The Bears feature one of the youngest infields in the nation as three of their four infielders are freshmen – shortstop Kyle Spraker, second baseman Josh Satin and first baseman Mike Van Winden. Spraker, a true freshman, has started 29 games at short, missing only four games due to a strained hamstring. He is hitting .242, but more importantly, Spraker has only made five errors in 124 chances for a .960 fielding percentage. Satin, a redshirt freshman, is batting .375 with a team-leading nine doubles (along with Boesch and Errecart) and is second on the team with 24 RBI. He is also hitting a team-best .460 (23-for-50) with runners in scoring position. Van Winden, also a redshirt freshman, has also proven to be an extremely valuable addition, batting .304 with eight doubles, a triple, a home run, 21 RBI and a team-leading 24 walks. This season, he has knocked in game-winning RBI doubles at Long Beach State and versus Washington State, and scored the game-winning run against UC Irvine.

TALBOTT TOP RELEIVER: Senior left-hander Travis Talbott has been one of the Pac-10's top relievers, earning saves versus Loyola Marymount, Long Beach State (two), San Francisco, Hawaii-Hilo and Nevada, and wins versus Saint Mary's and Washington State. Talbott is tied for first in the conference with six saves, has a 0.76 ERA and opponents are batting .158 against him, only giving up two earned runs in 23.7 innings. He is also third in the Pac-10 with 16 appearances. Another impressive stat for Talbott is his 20 strikeouts and only five walks in his 23.7 innings. He came into this season with one career save and a 4-1 career record in 54 appearances.

CAL'S BULLPEN SUCCESS: A key to Cal's success in 2005 has been its bullpen. The Bears' four main relievers – Talbott, junior right-hander **Alex Trafton**, senior right-hander **Matt Swanson** and sophomore right-hander **Michael Cooper** – have a combined 40 appearances in relief. In those 47 relief appearances, they are 10-1 with eight saves, and have only given up 12 earned runs in 83.7 innings for a 1.29 ERA.

VALUABLE TRANSFER DWORKIS: A key addition to Cal's pitching staff is senior transfer Eric Dworkis, who played at Gonzaga from 2002-04. Dworkis was outstanding Feb. 26 at Saint Mary's, throwing the Bears' first complete game since Adam Gold's one-hitter at Fresno State last season (Feb. 21). Dworkis went 9.0 innings with six hits, one run, only one walk with 10 strikeouts. His 10 strikeouts were only one away from his career-best 11 strikeouts, recorded against the Gaels when he was a sophomore at Gonzaga. At Stanford Mar. 6, Dworkis, despite giving up 11 hits, limited the Cardinal to three runs with one walk and three strikeouts in 8.3 innings. He is currently second in the Pac-10 in innings pitched with 60.0. Last year at Gonzaga, Dworkis was 8-4 with five complete games, earning second team All-West Coast Conference honors.

BEARS HAVE A FLAIR FOR THE DRAMATIC: The 2005 Bears have won two extra-inning games this season and have captured two road games in the top of the ninth inning. Cal won its first game of the season in extra-innings when freshman second baseman **Josh Satin** had a two-out single in the bottom of the 11th inning to defeat UC Irvine, 5-4, Feb. 5. On Feb. 13 at Loyola Marymount, sophomore left fielder **Chris Errecart** had a three-run homer in the ninth to defeat the Lions, 8-5. On Feb. 20, freshman **Mike Van Winden** had the game-winning two-run double in the ninth inning at Long Beach State, followed by junior right-hander **Alex Trafton** forcing a double play with the bases loaded in the bottom of the ninth. Senior designated hitter **James Holder** had a two-out single in the bottom of the 12th to defeat Saint Mary's, 5-4, Feb. 25. Due to weather, the Bears have also been forced to play three doubleheaders, but have won five of six of those contests, with their only loss being a 3-2 affair at Stanford Mar. 6.

CAL'S SEASON HIGHLIGHTS: Some highlights for the Bears up to this point of the season include – winning nine-straight games from Feb. 13-Mar. 1 (longest winning streak since 1998). Sophomore outfielder Chris Errecart earning Feb. 15 Pac-10 Player of the Week honors after Cal won two-of-three at Loyola Marymount. Sweeping then No. 14 Long Beach State in Long Beach (first road sweep of the 49ers since 1991). Sweeping Saint Mary's, including senior right-hander Eric Dworkis throwing a complete game with 10 strikeouts and senior right-hander Matt Swanson, sophomore right-hander Michael Cooper, junior right-hander Joe Todoroff and freshman right-hander Jason Corder combining to shutout the Gaels, 7-0, Feb. 27. Winning 10-4 at No. 12 Stanford (first win at Sunken Diamond since 2001). Nearly throwing a no-hitter at Pacific (behind the pitching of Todoroff and Swanson – infield single in the bottom of the ninth). Sweeping Washington State for the first Pac-10 series sweep since 2002.

BEARS AMOUNG PAC-10 TEAM STAT LEADERS: Cal is currently fourth in the Pac-10 with a team ERA of 4.16, giving up 124 earned runs in 292.3 innings. The Bears are also third in the conference with a .975 team fielding percentage and are fifth in the league with a .293 team batting average (334-for-1,140) with 66 doubles, four triples, 25 home runs and 175 RBI.
