BEAR NOTES: No. 16-ranked California (27-14-2, 7-8) looks to snap a fourgame losing streak this weekend as the Golden Bears host Arizona (30-13, 7-8) in a Pac-10 series at Evans Diamond. The Bears and the Wildcats both sit with a 7-8 league record and are striving for strong late season finishes. Arizona was the No. 1-ranked team in Collegiate Baseball's preseason poll and features talented Friday starter Preston Guilmet (junior right-hander, 5-2, 2.61 ERA, 68 strikeouts in 69.0 innings), last week's Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week. Cal's top starter is junior right-hander Tyson Ross, 6-2 with a 4.66 ERA and 46 strikeouts in 48.1 innings, who has twice been the conference pitcher of the week this season. The Bears also showcase senior second baseman Josh Satin, junior first baseman David Cooper, junior closer Matt Gorgen and freshman righthander Kevin Miller. Satin, who hit safely in the first 22 games this season, leads the Pac-10 in batting average (.409) and has 14 home runs and 42 RBI. Cooper is the league leader with 17 home runs and is batting .386 with a teamhigh 48 RBI. Gorgen is among the top of the conference with eight saves and has a 2.32 ERA with 35 strikeouts in 31.0 innings. Miller is first in the league with a 2.03 ERA and a .163 opponent batting average. As a reliever and spot starter, Miller is 5-0 and has 56 strikeouts in 53.1 innings. Both Satin (Mar. 4) and Cooper (Apr. 1) have been named Pac-10 Players of the Week this year, and Ross was Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week Feb. 26 and Apr. 1. Cooper, Ross and Gorgen were all selected as 2008 preseason All-Americans, while Satin is a twotime Cape Cod League All-Star and was a Collegiate Baseball freshman All-American in 2005. In Rivals.com, Satin was recently mentioned as the nation's top senior in their Midseason Report.

SERIES RECORD: The Bears have a 63-90 all-time record against the Arizona Wildcats. Cal was swept (1-0 11 innings, 15-12, 5-3) last season, Apr. 5-7, 2007 in Tucson. In the last series at Evans Diamond, the Bears won two-of-three (W 3-2, L 5-1, W 5-4 in 13 innings) Mar. 30-Apr. 2, 2006.

HEAD COACH DAVID ESQUER: Esquer, 42, is in his ninth season at Cal with a career record of 257-229-2 (.529). In 2001, he was Pac-10 Coach of the Year after leading the Bears to a 34-25 mark and a berth to the NCAA Regional in Baton Rouge, La. (1-2). Thirty nine Cal players have signed professional contracts since Esquer became coach, including first round picks Brandon Morrow (RHP, Seattle, fifth overall) in 2006 and Conor Jackson (1B, Arizona, 19th overall) in 2003. On June 10, 1999, Esquer became the 10th coach in Cal baseball history, which began in 1892. He came to Berkeley after serving as the top assistant at Pepperdine from 1996-99, and the No. 2 assistant at Stanford from 1991-96. A shortstop at Stanford from 1984-87, he was a starter on the 1987 College World Series championship team, earning All-Tournament honors.

**NOTING ARIZONA:** The Arizona Wildcats (No. 20 in NCBWA, No. 24 in *USA Today*), coached by Andy Lopez (seventh year at UA, 240-154-1, .609), are 30-13 (7-8 in Pac-10), last weekend losing two-of-three at Oregon State (W 7-0, L 4-3, L 3-2), and winning two at home versus San Diego State (3-2, 13-4), Apr. 29-30. Top hitters for the Wildcats include freshman shortstop Bryce Ortega (.352, 1 HR, 19 RBI) and senior first baseman C.J. Ziegler (.325, 12 HR, 36 RBI). Arizona's tentative pitching rotation is junior right-hander Preston Guilmet (5-2, 2.61 ERA), senior left-hander David Coulon (6-3, 3.21 ERA) and junior left-hander Eric Berger (4-3, 4.81 ERA). In 2007, the Wildcats finished 42-17 overall, 15-9 (second) in the Pac-10, 2-2 in the NCAA Regional in Wichita, Kan.

*IMPRESSIVE ROSS:* Junior team captain and 6-6 right-hander **Tyson Ross** (6-2, 4.66 ERA) — a 2008 preseason All-American by *Baseball America, Collegiate Baseball* and Rivals.com; and a Golden Spikes and Wallace Award candidate — started the 2008 season on a high note by one-hitting Kansas State (5.0 innings, one hit, one run, one walk, seven strikeouts) to earn this season's first Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week award. He is coming off an outstanding 2007 summer season with the USA National Team, finishing 4-1 with a 0.82 ERA, striking out 39 batters with only seven walks in 43.2 innings. A first-team All-Pac-10 selection last spring, Ross finished 6-6 and was second in the league with a 2.49 ERA and third in the conference with 120 strikeouts in 115.2 innings. His 120 strikeouts were second on the Cal all-time single-season strikeout list and he threw at least 6.0 innings in 15 of his 17 starts, and 7.0 innings or more 11 times, including a complete game at Stanford. Ross was also named a semifinalist for the Golden Spike Award, and on Mar. 25, 2007, he was picked as the National Player of the Week by *Collegiate Baseball* after striking out 16 batters (three away from the school record of 19 set by Larry Colton in 1963) with only one walk in 7.0 innings against Oral Roberts. Ross was noted for fielding as well, winning the Rawlings Gold Glove award as the nation's best fielding pitcher. For his career, Ross now has 251 strikeouts (fourth on Cal's career list) in 248.2 innings with an 18-12 record and a 3.15 career ERA.

CLUTCH HITTING COOPER: Junior left-handed first baseman David Cooper is a Baseball America preseason All-American; and a 2008 Golden Spikes and Wallace Award candidate. Cooper has been dominant in 2008, going 66-for-171 (.386) at the plate with 11 doubles, 17 home runs (including a grand slam) and 48 RBI in 43 games. Cal's top newcomer in 2007, he was a transfer from Cal State Fullerton, where he was a member of the 2006 College World Series All-Tournament team. An All-Pac-10 selection and team MVP in 2007 for the Bears, Cooper batted a team-leading .382 with a team-best 14 doubles, 12 home runs and 55 RBI. He also paced Cal with a .627 slugging percentage, 30 walks and had a .450 on-base percentage. Cooper was third in the Pac-10 in batting average, fifth in the league in slugging and on-base percentage, and seventh in the conference in home runs. In 2006, he flirted with a College World Series record with seven consecutive hits, tying Terry Francona (1980) and one short of Dave Magadan (1983) and Barry Bonds (1984). Cooper led all players at the 2006 World Series with a .533 average (8-for-15) with five RBI. In less then two seasons at Cal, he has a combined batting average of .384 (144-for-375, vying for the school record for career batting average of .381 set by Mike Epstein, 1963-64) with 25 doubles, 28 home runs (eighth on the Cal all-time HR list) and 103 RBI.

SATIN'S STORY: Senior second baseman Josh Satin, after back-to-back summers as a Cape Cod League All-Star, had a school-record 27-game hitting streak carrying over from last year, hitting safely from May 20, 2007 through Mar. 29, 2008. During that time he was 54-for-123 (.439) with eight doubles, nine home runs and 38 RBI. This season, Satin leads Cal and the Pac-10 with a .409 average and has nine doubles, 14 home runs and 42 RBI. He also has a .740 slugging percentage and a .518 on-base percentage. Satin now owns a .314 career average with 40 doubles, two triples, 25 home runs and 143 RBI (seventh on the Cal all-time list). He had one of the finest freshman seasons in school history in 2005, earning All-Pac-10 and Collegiate Baseball Freshman All-America honors. As a redshirt freshman, Satin hit .348 with 15 doubles, a triple, five home runs and 40 RBI. He also had 77 hits, 26 multiple-hit games, a 15-game hitting streak and a team-best .434 average with runners in scoring position. Satin was the first Cal freshman to earn Freshman All-America and All-Pac-10 honors since Xavier Nady was National Freshman of the Year in 1998.

**STRIKEOUT CLOSER GORGEN:** The Bears' other Louisville Slugger and Rivals.com preseason All-American, and third Wallace Award candidate, is hard-throwing junior closer **Matt Gorgen** (eight saves in 2008). An honorable mention All-Pac-10 selection last season, Gorgen is one of 40 players on the NCBWA Stopper of the Year Watch List, having struck out 75 batters in 61.0 innings with a 2.51 ERA (third in the Pac-10) last year. He also led the Pac-10 with 31 appearances, was sixth in the league with nine saves (second on the Cal all-time single season list), and 38 of his 75 strikeouts were called looking (second in the Pac-10). In 82 career appearances, Gorgen now has 144 strikeouts in 131.2 innings, and is tied for third on Cal's career save list (18 saves, with Bobby Kahlon, 1993-94). His twin brother, Scott, is a standout starting pitcher at UC Irvine.

MASTERFUL MILLER: Freshman right-hander Kevin Miller is 5-0 with a 2.03 ERA and has 56 strikeouts in 53.1 innings. Miller gave up his first earned runs of the season (after starting his college career not giving up an earned run in his first 44.0 innings) Apr. 12 at USC. He had a solid outing Apr. 19 versus Washington, getting a no decision but throwing 6.2 innings (four hits, one earned run, five walks) with a career-high eight strikeouts. Miller had two wins in relief Apr. 1-6 versus Fresno State and Oregon State. On Apr. 5 versus the two-time defending national champion Beavers, he threw 6.2 innings with one hit, no runs, three walks and seven strikeouts to earn the victory. For that week, Miller pitched 8.2 innings, allowing only one hit with no runs, four walks and nine strikeouts. On the year, opponents are batting a Pac-10 best .140.

**TONNESON'S TIME:** Sophomore catcher **Dylan Tonneson** has done a spectacular job replacing injured junior captain **Charlie Cutler** (broken little finger of right hand sliding into first base versus Utah Valley Feb. 23, now playing left field). Tonneson, after only seeing action in 18 games last year, is third on the team with a .355 average (50-for-141) with 10 doubles, six home runs and 30 RBI, including a career-best 4-for-4 with a double, home run and two RBI Apr. 15 at Pacific. He was also 3-for-3 with two RBI in the Bears' 14-4 victory over then-No. 24 Fresno State in San Diego, three hits in Cal's 5-3 victory over No. 22 San Diego State, and three hits in a 6-1 win over Loyola Marymount Mar. 16. Tonneson is sixth in the Pac-10 with a .458 on-base percentage.

**STANDOUT SMITH:** Sophomore right fielder/pitcher **Blake Smith** is batting .299 with nine doubles, a triple, seven home runs (including a grand slam Apr. 2 versus Fresno State) and 32 RBI, while also going 2-0 with a 3.65 ERA and 20 strikeouts in 12.1 innings on the mound. Smith has picked up the win in relief two of the last three Sunday's of Pac-10 play (Apr. 20 versus Washington, Apr. 13 at USC)...he also had a two-run homer at USC on Apr. 13, besides throwing the final two innings with two strikeouts. On Apr. 7 versus Stanford, he threw the final 3.0 innings of a 5-5 tie, striking out a career-high six batters. On Mar. 4 versus Stanford, Smith was 3-for-3 at the plate and pitched an inning in relief with no hits and two strikeouts. He had a three-run homer versus Northern Iowa Mar. 7, and a 4-for-5 game with a double versus Minnesota Mar. 8, in the Metrodome.

JACKSON'S ACTIONS: Sophomore center fielder Brett Jackson has excelled during the 2008 campaign, batting .327 (50-for-153) with five doubles, four triples (first in the Pac-10), a home run and 30 RBI. Jackson is also sixth in the Pac-10 with 11 stolen bases. In game one of the doubleheader versus Utah Valley on Feb. 23, Jackson had a career day, hitting his first collegiate home run in the second inning, and hitting triples in both the fourth and seventh innings. On Mar. 4 against Stanford, he had a key two-run single in the seventh inning to break a 3-3 tie and help propel Cal to an 8-3 win.

**CAPBARAT CAPITALIZING:** Junior center fielder **Michael Capbarat** went 2-for-3 with a two-run homer versus Washington Apr. 20, and 2-for-5 with an RBI Apr. 22 versus Cal Poly. Also impressive was Capbarat's fielding Tuesday against the Mustangs, catching a ball that deflected off of left-fielder Charlie Cutler's glove, and later making an over the head Willie Mays' style catch, to double up Cal Poly. Capbarat was recently selected to be the recipient of the 2008 Pac-10 Sportsmanship Award.

**ROLLIN RACKING UP THE WINS:** Senior right-hander **Alex Rollin** was 8-5 with a 4.91 ERA in 2007. Rollin's eight wins were the 10th-most in the Pac-10, with victories over UC Irvine, Portland, UC Santa Barbara, Indiana State, Rhode Island, Oral Roberts, OSU and USC. His victory against the defending national champion Beavers was his most impressive, limiting OSU to four hits and no runs in 6.0 innings. Combined with **Craig Bennigson** and Gorgen, Rollin and the Bears shut out a Beaver team in Corvallis for the first time since Apr. 28, 2002. This season he is 4-1 (12-7 career record) and on Mar. 30 defeated No. 5 Long Beach State (5.0 innings, six hits, one run, two walks, two strikeouts). On Apr. 15 at Pacific, Rollin threw a career-high 7.0 innings with five strikeouts.

**WORKMAN-LIKE WOLFORD:** In the season-opener on Feb. 22 versus Kansas State, sophomore **Daniel Wolford** (2-0, 42 strikeouts in 33.0 innings), a right-handed transfer from Long Beach State, helped Cal one-hit the Wildcats (along with junior **Tyson Ross**, whose lone hit given up was a lead-off homer in the first inning) by throwing the final 4.0 innings with no hits, no runs, three walks and five strikeouts, earning his first save as a Bear. At the San Diego Tournament this season, three Cal pitchers – senior right-hander **Alex Rollin**, Wolford and Gorgen – combined to shut out then-No. 17-ranked San Diego, 5-0.

**BEARS PICKED FIFTH IN PAC-10 PRESEASON POLL:** The Bears were tabbed fifth in the 2008 Pac-10 preseason poll behind Arizona, ASU, UCLA and two-time defending national champion OSU. Arizona was ranked No. 1 in *Collegiate Baseball's* preseason poll, and UCLA was the No. 1-ranked team in *Baseball America's* preseason poll. The Bears barely missed the NCAA tournament in 2007, finishing 29-26 overall and were alone in fourth place in the Pac-10 with a 12-12 record. Cal won six of their last eight games, including sweeping USC at Evans Diamond, and earlier won series against World Series qualifiers UC Irvine and ASU. The Bears also shut out two-time defending national champion OSU, 4-0, in Corvallis. Cal was the only team in the conference to win two-of-three games over Pac-10 champion Arizona State when the Bears upset the then-No. 7-ranked Sun Devils at Evans Diamond.

ADDITIONAL CAL NOTES: Cal is now 10th in Rivals.com, 16th in Baseball America and Collegiate Baseball, 21st in USA Today and 22nd in the NCBWA...the highest Bears' ranking this season was fifth on Apr. 7 in Baseball America...the highest ranking ever was third in Baseball America on Mar. 20, 1989...Cal is second in the Pac-10 with a .316 team batting average and leads the league with 476 hits and 59 home runs...sophomore DH Rich Gorman led-off the bottom of the first inning with a home run in both the Mar. 15 and Mar. 16 games versus Loyola Marymount...the Bears had back-to-back-to-back home runs by sophomore Jeff Kobernus (grand slam), Cooper and Satin against LMU in game one on Mar. 15...former Bear catcher Bob Melvin (1980) was named the 2007 National League Manager of the Year for the Arizona Diamondbacks with former Cal standout Conor Jackson as his first baseman...the 2008 Bears have two infielders, redshirt freshman Austin Booker and true freshman Brian Guinn, who are sons of former Cal standouts and pro players Rod Booker (1979-80) and Brian Guinn, Sr. (1981-83)...video of junior right-hander Tyson Ross pitching for Team USA this past summer is available by clicking the left sidebar of the calbears.com baseball page, as well as Cal players and coaches, Dan Hubbs and Jon Zuber, featured on KQED's Out of the Park: The Physics of Baseball.

#### DID YOU KNOW?

\*Cal won the inaugural College World Series title in 1947, defeating former President George Bush's Yale team, 8-7, in Kalamazoo, Michigan.

\*The Golden Bears have had two players become league MVPs in professional baseball – **Jackie Jensen** was the American League MVP in 1958 and **Jeff Kent** was the National League MVP in 2001.

\*Cal is one of only 20 schools that have won NCAA Baseball titles and only one of 12 schools that have won more than one national championship (1947, 1957). The Bears have competed in five College World Series (1947, 1957, 1980, 1988, 1992).

\*Geoff Blum, Cal's starting shortstop as a freshman on the Bears' 1992 College World Series team, had a game-winning homer for the Chicago White Sox in the 2005 Major League World Series.

\*In 2006 the Bears had a school-record five players selected in the first 10 rounds of the Major League Amateur Draft, including junior right-hander **Brandon Morrow**, the fifth pick overall by the Seattle Mariners.
