**BEAR NOTES:** California (26-25, 9-12), winners of seven of its last 10 games, wraps up the 2006 regular season with a Pac-10 series at No. 19 Arizona State (33-19, 11-10), May 26-28, in Tempe, Ariz. Cal has captured league series from Washington, Arizona, Washington State and UCLA this season, and would like nothing more than to have a good showing against the Sun Devils, a 2005 College World Series participant. The Bears have won the last two series over ASU, winning two-of-three last season at Evans Diamond, and two-of-three in Tempe in 2004. Cal features junior right-hander **Brandon Morrow** and senior shortstop **Allen Craig**, who are both in position for postseason honors. Morrow, a third-team preseason All-American in *Baseball America*, is 7-3 with a 1.74 ERA, and has 96 strikeouts in 93.3 innings after May 5's heartbreaking 3-2 loss at Stanford (8.3 innings, six hits, three runs, no walks, 11 strikeouts). He now has two complete games, has only allowed 65 hits, and opponents are batting .200 against him. Morrow was the Feb. 6 National Pitcher of the Week, and is one of 10 semifinalists for the Roger Clemens Award as a National Pitcher of the Year. Craig is having an outstanding year as well after being selected as a 2005 first-team Summer All-American in *Baseball America*. He is batting .348 with 14 doubles, 10 home runs and 31 RBI. Freshman right-hander **Tyson Ross** and junior center fielder **Brennan Boesch** are two more Cal players of note. Ross is 6-4 with a 3.24 ERA, and 78 strikeouts in 77.7 innings, with victories at Stanford and Pacific in his last two outings. Boesch tops the Bears with 10 home runs (with Craig), and has a team-best 37 RBI, including three game-winning RBI.

**SERIES RECORD:** The Bears have a 51-88 all-time series record against the Arizona State Sun Devils. Last season, Cal won two-of-three (L 11-7, W 7-3, W 4-3) Apr. 9-10 at Evans Diamond. In 2004, the Bears won two-of-three (W 9-7, W 20-8, L 8-4) Mar. 19-21 at Packard Stadium.

**HEAD COACH DAVID ESQUER:** Esquer, 40, is in his seventh season at Cal with a career record of 200-186 (.518). In 2001, he was the Pac-10 Coach of the Year after leading the Bears to a 34-25 mark, a third place finish in the Pac-10 (14-10) and a berth to the NCAA Regional in Baton Rouge, La. (1-2). Twenty nine Cal players have signed professional contracts since Esquer became coach, including **Conor Jackson**, who was a first round draft choice of the Arizona Diamondbacks in 2003. On June 10, 1999, Esquer became only the 10th coach in the history of Cal baseball, which began in 1892. He came to Berkeley after serving as the top assistant at Pepperdine from 1996-99. Esquer was the No. 2 assistant coach at Stanford under Mark Marquess from 1991-96. A shortstop at Stanford from 1984-87, he was a starter on the 1987 College World Series championship team, earning All-Tournament honors. Esquer also earned All-Pac-10 Southern Division honors and went on to play professional baseball for four seasons with the Baltimore, California and Milwaukee organizations.

**NOTING ARIZONA STATE:** The No. 19-ranked (*Baseball America*) Arizona State Sun Devils, coached by Pat Murphy (12th year at ASU, 476-240-1, .665), are 33-19 and 11-10 after winning one-of-three at Arizona (W 15-6, L 18-12, L 5-4) last weekend. Leading hitters for the Sun Devils are sophomore right fielder Eric Sogard (.375, 8 HR, 41 RBI), freshman designated hitter Brett Wallace (.372, 6 HR, 30 RBI) and freshman first baseman Ike Davis (.343, 8 HR, 61 RBI). Arizona State's tentative rotation is senior right-hander Tony Barnette (5-1, 5.28 ERA), sophomore left-hander Josh Satow (3-1, 4.75 ERA) and TBA. In 2005, ASU was 42-25 overall, 15-9 in the Pac-10 (3rd), 3-0 in NCAA Tempe Regional, 2-1 in the NCAA Fullerton Super Regional and 3-2 (third) in the College World Series.

**CRAIG'S STANDOUT SENIOR CAMPAIGN:** Senior **Allen Craig** had a phenomenal summer playing shortstop for Alexandria (Minn.) of the Northwoods League, batting .362 with 12 home runs and 40 RBI, earning first-team Summer All-America accolades in *Baseball America*. Craig did not miss a beat this spring as he owns a .348 average with a team-best 72 hits, 36 runs and 14 doubles. He also has 26 multiple-hit games. Craig was honorable mention All-Pac-10 in 2005, batting .358 against conference foes and leading off a game with a home run three times during the year. For his career, Craig has a .308 average with 47 doubles (7th on the Cal all-time list), a triple, 27 home runs (9th on the Cal all-time list) and 107 RBI in 192 games. His 737 career at-bats are ninth on the Cal all-time list.

**MORROW CONTINUES TO SHINE:** Similar to Craig, junior **Brandon Morrow** had an outstanding summer that has carried over to the spring. Competing for the Yarmouth-Dennis Red Sox in the Cape Cod League, Morrow and junior outfielder **Chris Errecart** wowed the scouts and were named preseason All-Americans in *Baseball America* (Errecart second-team, Morrow third-team). Morrow struck out 24 batters in 14.7 innings with a 1.84 ERA and three saves, and was selected the fifth-best professional prospect, while Errecart hit .303 with six home runs and 22 RBI and was selected the fourth-best professional prospect by *Baseball America*. This spring for the Bears, Morrow was named the National Pitcher of the Week when he allowed no hits in 6.3 innings with 12 strikeouts and only one walk in the Feb. 3 season-opener at UC Irvine, and at UNLV on Mar. 10, threw his first career complete-game with six hits, one run, three walks and seven strikeouts. He is on the Roger Clemens Award Watch List as a candidate for the national pitcher of the year. Morrow's 96 strikeouts this season is one away from the Cal all-time Top-10 single-season strikeout list (trailing Andy Messersmith's 97 strikeouts in 1965). This spring, Errecart is batting .282, but has eight home runs, and hit two, two-run homers at UNLV. He also teamed-up with **Brennan Boesch** to hit back-to-back homers to defeat Long Beach State Feb. 11, on his 21st birthday.

**PRESEASON ACCOLADES GALORE FOR BOESCH:** Junior center fielder **Brennan Boesch** entered the 2006 season with the most preseason accolades since **Xavier Nady** was *Baseball America's* National Preseason Player of the Year in 2000. Boesch was a preseason All-American with the Collegiate Baseball Writers (first-team), *Baseball America* (second-team) and *Collegiate Baseball* (third-team). He was also on the Brooks Wallace List as a candidate for national player of the year honors. Last season, Boesch batted .355 (fifth in the Pac-10) with 21 doubles (fifth in the Pac-10), two triples, seven home runs and 33 RBI. His 21 doubles were third on the Cal all-time single-season doubles list, and he hit .367 (22-for-60) with runners in scoring position, earning first-team All-Pac-10 honors. This season, Boesch is hitting .312, had the game-winning RBI in three games, is tied for the team lead with 10 home runs and has a team-best 37 RBI. He also owns the team's longest hitting streak this season (12 games), has got a hit in 16 of the last 17 games, and is currently 10th on the Cal all-time list with a .540 career slugging percentage.

**BEARS NOTED NATIONALLY:** Besides having three players – **Brennan Boesch**, **Chris Errecart** and **Brandon Morrow** – selected as preseason All-Americans, Cal has also been noted by the College Baseball Foundation's National Honor Roll. Morrow and freshman right-hander **Matt Gorgen** were selected Feb. 28 after combining for a 3-0 shutout of UC Santa Barbara on Feb. 24 (Morrow 6.0 innings, one hit, six walks, nine strikeouts; Gorgen 3.0 innings, two hits, no walks, five strikeouts). Boesch was a Mar. 28 national honoree after going 6-for-16 with a double, two home runs and six RBI, plus throwing a runner out at the plate, Mar. 21-26 against Sacramento State and Washington.

**BEARS ARE HUNGRY:** Cal returned seven regular position players from a squad that was 34-23 overall and 13-11 (fifth) in the Pac-10 in 2005. Last season, the Bears notched 13 wins against teams that advanced to an NCAA Regional; captured Pac-10 series versus Stanford, Arizona State and Arizona; and swept Long Beach State; yet were denied an NCAA berth. Cal became the first Pac-10 team not to advance to postseason with an over .500 record in the conference play. *Baseball America* felt Cal was the most deserving team left off the 2005 NCAA tournament field.

**ADDITIONAL CAL NOTES:** Cal is leading the Pac-10 with a 2.97 team ERA in league play...the Bears also top the conference with 162 strikeouts versus league opponents...Cal is second in the Pac-10 with a overall 3.65 team ERA, the lowest team ERA since Cal's College World Series team of 1980 (3.13)...on Thursday, the Bears had seven players selected to the Pac-10 All-Academic Team – senior shortstop **Allen Craig**, senior right-hander **Alex Trafton** and junior infielder **Brett Munster** were first-team; senior outfielder **Rob Nesbitt** and sophomore outfielder **Taylor Grigsby** were second-team; and junior right-hander **Michael Copper** and sophomore right-hander **Nick Tess** were honorable mention...**Munster** has had multiple hits in each of the last three games, going 6-for-11 with a double, home run and three RBI versus USF, Santa Clara and Pacific...**Nesbitt** was impressive against UC Davis

and Oregon State Apr. 18-23, going 7-for-10 with two doubles and two RBI...Nesbitt, who has started the past 13 games, went 6-for-7 in the last two games against OSU, including going 4-for-4 with an RBI double Apr. 23 against the Beavers...earlier, Nesbitt came off the bench to hit the game-winning homer in the 13th inning against Arizona in the Bears' 5-4 victory Apr. 1-2...Cal has lost 11, one-run games this season, including four, one-run games in extra-innings...however, the Bears have won four one-run games in their last seven victories (3-2 in 11 innings versus UCLA Apr. 29, 4-3 versus Stanford May 1, 7-6 at Saint Mary's May 2, 3-2 at Pacific May 23)...Cal has captured two games via dramatic home runs – on Feb. 11, the Bears defeated Long Beach State after trailing 2-1 going into the bottom of the ninth on back-to-back homers by Boesch and Errecart for a 3-2 win, and on Apr. 2 Nesbitt defeated Arizona, 5-4 in 13 innings, with an opposite field homer to right...Boesch was involved in another dramatic finish, throwing Washington's Bradley Boyer out at the plate in the top of the ninth to preserve Cal's 2-1 win Mar. 24...the Bears currently have six former players on major league rosters (**Geoff Blum**, 1992-94, San Diego; **Ryan Drese**, 1995, 98, Washington; **Conor Jackson**, 2001-03, Arizona; **Jeff Kent**, 1987-89, Los Angeles Dodgers; **Xavier Nady**, 1998-00, New York Mets; **Tyler Walker**, 1996-97, Tampa Bay), which trails only USC (14) and UCLA (seven) as the most in the Pac-10.
