TELEVISION: The Saturday, May 11 Oregon State-Cal game will be televised live on Fox Sports Net...Barry Tompkins (play-by-play) and former Arizona coach Jerry Kindall (color) will be announcing...**RADIO:**KALX Radio (90.7 FM) will broadcast the May 10-12 OSU-Cal series...**SERIES RECORD:** Cal has a 23-13 overall series record against the Oregon State Beavers...last year the Bears won one-of-three (L 6-5, L 10-1, W 12-1) Apr. 6-8 at Goss Stadium/Coleman Field...

HEAD COACH DAVID ESQUER: The 2001 Pac-10 Coach of the Year, Esquer, 36, is in his third season at Cal and has a career record of 85-79 (.518)...he became only the 10th coach in the history of Cal baseball, which began in 1892, when he was hired June 10, 1999...Esquer replaced longtime Bear mentor Bob Milano, who retired May 17, 1999 after 22 years as the Bears head coach and 29 years involved in the Cal baseball program...Esquer came to Berkeley after serving as the top assistant at Pepperdine from 1996-99...prior to working at Pepperdine, he was the No. 2 assistant coach at Stanford under Mark Marquess from 1991-96...a shortstop at Stanford from 1984-87, Esquer was a starter on Stanford's 1987 College World Series championship team, earning All-Tournament honors after hitting .350 with six RBI in Omaha...he also earned All-Pac-10 Southern Division honors as a senior and went on to play professional baseball for four seasons with the Baltimore Orioles, California Angels and Milwaukee Brewers organizations...

BEAR NOTES: The California baseball team (26-26, 8-13 Pac-10) are in the midst of a seven-game losing streak, being swept at home by Washington Apr. 26-28, losing 8-7 in 11 innings Apr. 30 at USF and being swept May 3-5 at Stanford (8-4, 13-6, 8-5)...it is the Bears longest losing streak since Mar. 20-29, 1998...Cal has had three players-sophomore first baseman Conor Jackson, sophomore right-hander Matt Brown and senior right-hander Trevor Hutchinson-earn Pac-10 Pitcher or Player of the Week honors this season...Jackson was named Pac-10 Player of the Week Apr. 22 and on Apr. 24 was invited to try out for the USA National Team in June...he is batting .374 with 13 doubles, two triples, 16 home runs, two grand slams and 59 RBI...Jackson leads the Pac-10 in home runs. RBI, hits (76) and total bases (141)...Brown was named Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week Apr. 15 after throwing a complete game Apr. 14 versus Arizona (four hits, one run, one walk, career-high 10 strikeouts)...he is 5-3 with a 3.70 ERA and six saves and is tied for fourth on the Cal all-time saves list with 14 saves...Hutchinson was the Apr. 8 Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week and on Apr. 28 versus UW became the Bears all-time career strikeout leader with his 276th strikeout (now has 280)...in 13 starts this season, he has not thrown less than 6.3 innings, has two complete games, is 7-5 with a 3.56 ERA and leads the Pac-10 with 90 strikeouts and 108.7 innings pitched...junior catcher John Baker, on the Johnny Bench Award watch list, is also excelling, batting a team-leading .376 (.429 in league play) with a Pac-10 leading .515 on base percentage...

OREGON STATE: The Oregon State Beavers, coached by Pat Casey (8th year at OSU, 238-167-4, .587), are 30-15 (9-6 Pac-10) on the year, last sweeping WSU (18-1, 10-6, 22-21) May 3-5 at Washington State...top hitters for the Beavers are junior third baseman Brian Barden (.365, 8 HR, 45 RBI), freshman center fielder Aaron Mathews (.364, 1 HR, 23 RBI) and junior catcher Wick Udy (.357, 1 HR, 17 RBI)...Oregon State's tentative pitching rotation is sophomore right-hander Ben Rowe (7-3, 4.72 ERA), junior right-hander Stephen Copeland (5-2, 5.56 ERA) and junior left-hander Mark McLemore (2-3, 5.16 ERA)...in 2001, the Beavers were 31-24 overall and 11-13 (6th) in the Pac-10...

JOHN BAKER: Is batting a team-best .376 (7th in Pac-10, 50-for-133, 11-2B, 3B, 4-HR, 22 RBI, .429 vs. Pac-10) with a Pac-10 leading .515 on-base percentage...sixth in Pac-10 in walks (28)...went 3-for-11 with a double and RBI last week at Stanford...had a career-high 14-game hitting streak from Mar. 10-Apr. 26 (24-for-46, .522, 3-2B, 2-HR, 12 RBI)...was 4-for-9 with three doubles Apr. 26-28 vs. UW...went 7-for-13 with an RBI Apr. 19-21 at ASU...was 6-for-11 with a double, home run and five RBI Apr. 12-14 vs. Arizona, including going 3-for-4 with four RBI and a three-run homer Apr. 13...went 4-for-12 with a home run and three RBI Apr. 5-7 vs. UCLA... was 2-for-2 with an RBI Mar. 12 vs. USF, but was hit by a pitch, breaking a bone in his right hand and was out Mar. 13-Apr. 1...went 3-for-8 with a double, home run and three RBI Feb. 22-24 vs. Boston College...is batting .432 (16-for-37) with runners in scoring position...is 4-for-18 (.222) with a double and RBI career vs. Oregon State...was Pac-10 Honorable Mention last season and was a Cape Cod League All-Star this past summer...is on the Johnny Bench Award watch list...
