
# THE TEAM






A highly versatile big man who can score near the basket or outside the three-point arc. Anderson emerged as one of the top freshmen in the country last season ... paced the Bears in both scoring and rebounding as a rookie, shooting 38.2 percent from three-point range (58-152) and 79.8 percent from the free throw line (103-129) ... produced eight games with at least 20 points, including a high of 27 points vs. Oregon State in the Pac-10 Tournament ... a member of the 2006-07 Pac-10 All-Freshman team and was honorable mention All-Pac-10 ... also chosen a second-team Freshman All-American by Basketball Times ... named All-District 14 by the NABC ... most natural position is power forward, but was forced to play center much of his freshman campaign after starter DeVon Hardin hurt his foot in the year's 11th game ... should benefit from increased depth at the post position this season ... attended the Pete Newell Big Man Camp over the summer.

As a Freshman in 2006-07: Anderson completed one of the most outstanding

seasons for a freshman in Cal history, leading the Bears in both scoring (16.3 ppg) and rebounding (8.2 rpg) ... ranked fifth in the Pac-10 in both categories – the only player in the league to finish in the top five in each area ... set a school freshman record by grabbing 269 boards during the year, breaking the mark of 256 set by Leon Powe in 2004 ... shot 38.2 percent from behind the arc and made 58 three-pointers for the second-highest Cal freshman total ever (Ryan Drew, 60 in 1988) ... his scoring average and point total (539) are second only to Shareef Abdur-Rahim (1996) on the Cal freshman charts ... scored at least 20 points in each of his first three games (20 vs. Utah Valley State; 21 at San Diego State; 25 vs. Santa Clara), joining Abdur-Rahim as the only Cal players to do so ... named MVP of the Great Alaska Shootout after he led Cal to the title, averaging 17.3 ppg and 9.3 rpg ... in his first game after DeVon Hardin went out with a foot injury, finished with 24 points and 16 rebounds at DePaul, including 17 points and 11 boards in the first half ... reached double figures in scoring 30 times in 33 games ...

paced the Bears in scoring 18 times and in rebounding on 22 occasions ... in a match-up against Washington center Spencer Hawes in Berkeley, had 18 points and 14 rebounds in a 77-69 victory ... scored 18 of his 22 points in the first half at Oregon State ... played well at UCLA with 21 points against the Bruins ... named to the all-tournament team at the Pac-10 Tournament after he averaged 20.7 ppg and 11.7 rpg in three games ... set his career scoring high with 27 points and grabbed 15 rebounds in an opening-round win over Oregon State ... also had 18 points in a quarterfinal upset over top-seed UCLA and 17 points and 12 boards vs. Oregon in the semifinals ... ended the year with a team-high eight double-doubles ... shot 13-for-15 from the free throw line in the last two minutes and overtime of games, and was a 79.8 percent free-throw shooter overall ... selected Cal's Most Outstanding Freshman.

**High School:** Anderson was third-leading high school scorer in the state of California as a senior in 2005-06, pouring in 28.9 ppg ... also averaged 10.9 rpg and 3.9 bpg, shooting 55.8


**As a Freshman in 2006-07:** Christopher started 14 of 33 games during his freshman year, including 13 of 18 Pac-10 contests ... earned his first start at DePaul and contributed two points, two rebounds and three assists ... had eight points, four rebounds and two steals in a victory at Stanford ... tallied 10 points vs. USC for his first double-figure effort ... due to a groin injury, did not start at Washington State Feb. 10 ... came off the bench again vs. Oregon Feb. 15 and tossed in 16 points, with 13 coming

in the first half when Cal built an eight-point lead ... set his career high two days later vs. Oregon State with 24 points and 11 rebounds, shooting 10-for-16 from the floor ... chipped in nine points against Hawaii in the semifinals of the Great Alaska Shootout ... also had eight points in a win over Kansas State ... averaged 8.5 ppg in two games vs. Arizona.

An active and athletic center, Hardin gives the Bears an imposing and experienced force in the middle ... one of the top shot-blockers in school history and is the leading returning shot-blocker in the Pac-10 with 95 entering the season ... missed all but the first 11 games of his junior year after suffering a stress fracture to his left mid-foot ... enters the 2007-08 campaign in the best shape of his career ... declared for the 2007 NBA Draft, but did not hire an agent and elected to return to Cal despite first-round interest from several teams ... during his last healthy campaign in 2005-06, earned honorable mention All-Pac-10 honors after ranking among the league leaders in rebounding (5th, 6.6 rpg) and blocks (4th, 1.55 bpg) ... has started 54 of 71 career games ... attended the Pete Newell Big Man Camp in 2006.


**As a Junior in 2006-07:** Hardin started Cal's first 11 games before suffering a stress fracture to his left mid-foot vs. Furman Dec. 19 ... missed the rest of the season after undergoing surgery Dec. 22 ... Cal was 8-3 with Hardin in the lineup and 8-14 without him ... averaged 10.7 ppg and 8.4 rpg – both career highs – before the injury ... despite his shortened campaign, still led the Bears with 21 blocks ... named to the all-tournament team at

the Great Alaska Shootout after finishing with 16 points, nine rebounds and four blocks vs. Loyola Marymount in the championship game ... swatted away a career-best five blocks against Santa Clara ... recorded double-doubles vs. Santa Clara (12-10), Kansas State (12-12) and Nevada (14-10) ... shot 80 percent from the free throw line (32-40) after entering the year a career 53.1 percent free throw shooter.

As a Sophomore in 2005-06: Started all but one game (Senior Day vs. USC) for the Bears ... nearly doubled his scoring average from his freshman year, going from 4.3 ppg to 7.3 ppg, and received the team's Most Improved Player honor ... produced double-doubles in three of his first four games and had five double-doubles on the year ... led Cal in rebounding 11 times (includes ties) ... broke his career scoring high in consecutive outings vs. Long Beach State (14 points) Nov. 21, Northern Colorado (21) Nov. 25 and Northeastern (23) Nov. 26 early in the year ... also finished the Northeastern game with a personal-best 14 rebounds ... for his performances against Northern Colorado and Northeastern, was named both Golden Bear Classic MVP and Pac-10 Player of the Week ... blocked four shots in a game three times:

vs. Northern Colorado Nov. 25, vs. Arizona Feb. 16 and vs. Arizona State Feb. 18 ... his 48 blocks place him fifth on the school's season chart ... improved his free throw shooting from 38.6 percent as a freshman to 62.5 percent ... played a big role in Cal's win at UCLA Dec. 31 with 10 points and eight boards ... also grabbed 10 rebounds in a win at Arizona State ... added another 10 points and eight rebounds at Oregon and totaled 13 points and 10 caroms at home vs. ASU ... scored 10 points and corralled 11 boards in the home finale vs. USC ... although he did not score vs. Oregon in the Pac-10 Tournament semifinals, tied for team honors with six rebounds ... also added eight points and seven boards in the title game vs. UCLA ... underwent left shoulder surgery in April 2006 and was cleared for full contact in September.

**As a Freshman in 2004-05:** Ranked third on the team in rebounding with 4.5 per game while playing only 16.1 minutes per contest ... blocked 26 shots on the year, second on the team and ninth in the Pac-10 (0.90 per game) ... played well against Southern with eight points and seven rebounds, then earned his first start the next game at BYU Nov. 27 ... came through with his best night of the year against the Cougars with 12 points (4-7 FG,
