With the ability to play virtually every position on the floor, Robertson has been a valuable member of the roster during his tenure at Cal ... began his sophomore year on the wing before moving inside following injuries to a pair of Cal big men ... plays well around the basket and can also step out to three-point range, where he is a career 38.8 percent shooter ... has 41 career starts entering the season ... underwent hip surgery in April 2007, a procedure that requires approximately six months rehabilitation and put him on track for a return to the court in October.

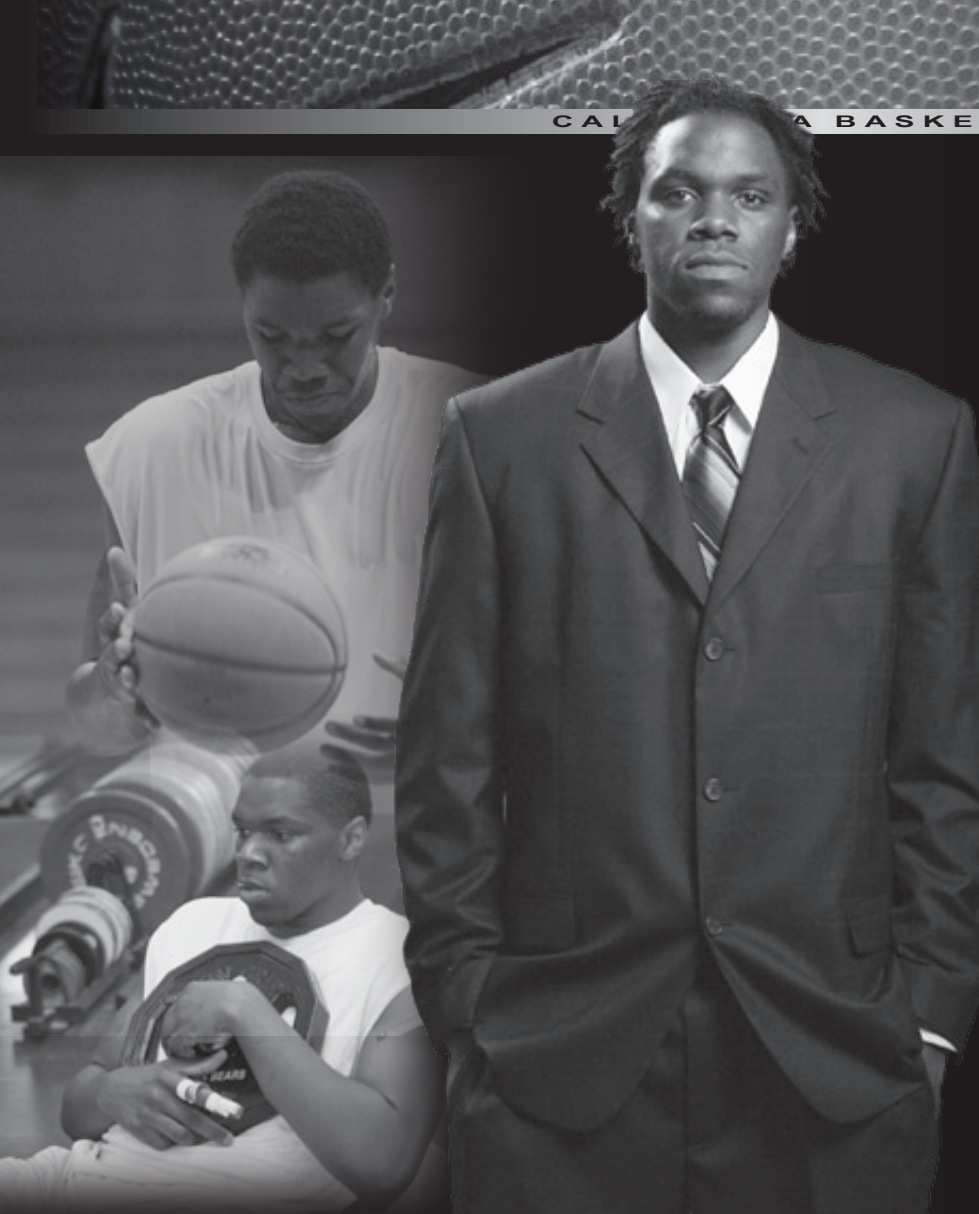
As a Sophomore in 2006-07: Due to injuries to two of Cal's centers – DeVon Hardin and Jordan Wilkes – Robertson played much of the year at power forward despite his 6-6 frame ... responded admirably with 8.8 ppg and 4.3 rpg, starting all 33 contests ... scored 12 points vs. Chicago State and 13 points against San Diego to claim all-tournament honors in the Golden Bear Classic ... scored a career-best 21 points in a home win vs. Oregon State (6-8 FG, 1-1 3P, 8-10 FT) ... also had 19 points at Oregon and 16 points vs. UCLA in consecutive games in January

... led the Bears with 27 steals and was third on the squad with nine blocks ... had 17 points vs. Oregon in the Pac-10 Tournament semifinals ... recipient of Cal's Best Defensive Player award after the season.

As a Freshman in 2005-06: Started in place of an injured Leon Powe (foot) the first four games of the year and averaged 11.8 ppg on 54.8 percent field goal shooting during the span ... had 12 points in the opener at Eastern Michigan and followed with 14 points vs. Long Beach State and 13 points against Northern Colorado ... ranked second on the squad in three-point accuracy (40.7%) and drained 10 of his final 14 attempts... came off the bench for 10 points at Arizona State and 11 points at Arizona in January ... had nine points, four assists and a pair of steals in a home victory over Washington ... his free throw with five seconds left gave Cal a three-point lead in an eventual 62-60 win at Oregon ... after Omar Wilkes sprained an ankle, started consecutive home games vs. Stanford, Arizona and Arizona State in mid-February ... finished with eight points, including 2-of-2 on

three-pointers, against the Cardinal and with 12 points (5-7 FG) vs. the Wildcats ... played well at Washington Feb. 26 with 13 points ... his three-pointer with 29 seconds left in regulation tied the score and sent the March 2 UCLA game into overtime ... played extremely well in the Pac-10 Tournament, averaging 9.3 ppg (7-11 FG, 5-7 3P, 9-10 FT) in three games ... finished with eight points vs. USC, then poured in a career-high 18 points against Oregon in the semifinals ... started in place of Richard Midgley (knee) in the NCAA Tournament vs. North Carolina State (3 points) ... overall, earned eight starts as a rookie and averaged 9.1 ppg in those games ... claimed honorable mention Pac-10 All-Freshman honors in a vote of the league's coaches.

High School: Set De La Salle HS records for three-point percentage and overall field goal accuracy ... finished his career with 1,220 points ... named MVP of the Bay Valley Athletic League as a senior when he averaged 17.1 ppg and 6.3 rpg ... chosen first-team All-East Bay by the *Contra Costa Times* and second-team All-Bay Area by the *San Francisco Chronicle* ... scored a game-

Along with DeVon Hardin, Vierneisel is one of two seniors on the squad this year ... brings the experience of 78 games played entering the 2007-08 campaign ... has been particularly effective down the stretch the past two seasons ... has the ability to stretch defenses with his long-range shooting ability, making 38.8 percent of his three-point tries last year ... can also use his strength near the basket ... one of four players from Illinois to play for Ben Braun at Cal (also: Sean Lampley, 1998-2001; Dennis Gates, 1999-2002; and sophomore Jerome Randle).

As a Junior in 2006-07: Vierneisel contributed 11 points through Cal's first 11 games before erupting for 11 points at DePaul Dec. 23 in a game played about 30 miles from his hometown ... followed that performance with double-digit efforts in four of his next six games, including a career-high 13-point night at Oregon State when he nailed 4-of-5 from three-point distance ... during the run, had 10 points and a personal-best four steals at Arizona ... earned a start at Stanford

and finished with eight points and three boards ... scored all 10 of his points vs. Washington State in the first half ... sprained his ankle in practice Jan. 24 and did not play vs. UCLA or USC Jan. 25-27 ... performed well in the Pac-10 Tournament with eight points vs. Oregon State and 10 points against UCLA ... named Cal's Most Improved Player at the end of the season.

As a Sophomore in 2005-06: Appeared in 22 games for the Bears ... started in Game 2 vs. Long Beach State Nov. 21 for an injured Richard Midgley (shoulder) and finished with five points in 15 minutes ... also played 15 minutes against Northern Colorado Nov. 25 when he pitched in six points ... drained a 24-foot three-pointer in a win at UCLA Dec. 31 ... suffered a concussion at Arizona Jan. 21 and missed Cal's home series vs. Washington and Washington State Jan. 26-28 ... did not play in consecutive games vs. Arizona State, WSU and Washington in late February, but came back to log 11 minutes vs. UCLA March 2 ... played well in the Pac-10 Tournament, especially

vs. USC in the quarterfinals when he scored a season-high 10 points (4-5 FG, 1-2 3P, 1-1 FT) and grabbed a career-best five rebounds.

As a Freshman in 2004-05: Made a big impact in his first game at Cal, going 4-for-4 from three-point range against UC Riverside in the season opener to finish with 12 points ... also sank a pair of treys at San Diego State Dec. 11, including a basket with just over five minutes left after SDSU had cut Cal's lead to one point ... started five games, including three Pac-10 contests ... tallied 10 points (4-6 FG, 1-3 3P, 1-2 FT) at USC ... scored eight points vs. Arizona in the Pac-10 Tournament, sinking a pair of three-pointers.

High School: Averaged 18.7 points, 6.5 rebounds and 4.4 assists as a senior, helping Jacobs High to a 17-11 record ... career high was 36 points ... played in the Chicago vs. New York Wendy's All-Star Shootout ... a three-time all-state and all-conference selection and was chosen all-area four times ... averaged 17 ppg and 8 rpg as a junior in 2003.

Wilkes returns to the lineup this year after a medical hardship season in 2006-07 when he missed the entire campaign with a preseason knee injury ... is a highly skilled post player who has benefited from offseason work in the weight room ... a good rebounder who runs the court very well ... is adept at shooting in the 12-15-foot range and even knocked down a three-pointer as a freshman ... attended the Pete Newell Big Man Camp in 2006 ... partially tore the patella tendon in his left knee in practice Nov. 7, 2006, and underwent surgery two weeks later.

As a Freshman in 2005-06: Jumpstarted his Cal career by scoring 11 points (5-6 FG) – all in the first half – in the Bears' season-opener at Eastern Michigan ... added five points in back-to-back games vs. Long Beach State and

Northern Colorado ... sprained his right ankle in practice and missed four straight games from Nov. 30 through Dec. 10 ... sank all four of his free throw attempts at Arizona State ... played 14 minutes in consecutive contests vs. Washington State, at Oregon State and at Oregon ... had eight points and four boards at OSU ... sank a three-pointer in the first half of Cal's Feb. 18 home date vs. Arizona State.

Kamp is a fundamentally sound post player who led his high school team to three Arizona state championships ... has a strong internal drive and pays attention to detail ... a three-time all-state performer and the state Player of the Year as a sophomore in 2005.
