Richard is a proven winner and is relentless on both ends of the floor. Coming off a shoulder injury last season, a healthy Richard Midgley makes him one of the best players in the conference."



A hard-nosed player on both ends of the court, Midgley provides leadership and experience to the Bear lineup ... enters his final campaign with 70 starts in 85 career contests ... eager to finish his career with a productive final year after playing the final two months of last season with a sprained right shoulder ... one of the top long-range shooters in Cal history having made 134 three-points (No. 6 all-time) and connected on 37.6 percent of his attempts

... can play both guard positions ... drives well to the basket and has a knack for getting to the free throw line ... brings international experience to the Bears, having grown up in England, but played his final two years of high school basketball in Modesto, Calif. ... **2004-05** ... scored 26 points (8-13 FG, 6-8 3P, 4-6 FT) and added six rebounds vs. Southern Nov. 23 ... sank his first five three-point attempts against the Tigers ... later set a career high with 28 points (11-15 FG, 6-9 3P) vs. Fairleigh Dickinson Dec. 4 ... a strained forearm

suffered at San Diego State Dec. 11 helped limit him to 4 points (2-8 FG, 0-6 3P) against the Aztecs, but he still tied a career best with 6 assists in the game ... nailed a game-winning three-pointer as time expired to lift Cal to a 61-58 win over Pepperdine Dec. 23 and named to the all-tournament team at the Golden Bear Classic ... had 22 points and shot 6-for-6 from the line in the final 1:03

at Washington State ... however, hurt his shoulder in the game and sat out Cal's games at USC and UCLA and vs. Oregon due to the injury ... set a Cal record for 3-points attempts (6-13) at Arizona ... banked in the game-winner off an offensive rebound with 2.7 seconds left at Arizona State, finishing with 15 points and 5 boards ... named Cal's Most Courageous Player after the year ... **2003-**

04 ... after getting off to a slow start to the year, came on much stronger during the Pac-10 season ... made just 33.3 percent of his field goal attempts in non-conference games and 45.9 percent in league play ... voted Pac-10 Player of the Week Feb. 9 after averaging 19.0 ppg in home wins over Arizona (18 points) and Arizona State (20 points) ... added 19 points at

Stanford (7-11 FG, 3-5 3P, 2-3 FT) – all in the second half ... set or tied season highs in points (22), rebounds (7), assists (5) and steals (3) vs. USC Jan. 22 ... 12 of his 17 points at Oregon State were in the first half ... earned a spot on the all-tournament team in the Golden Bear Classic with 21 points against Columbia ... **2002-03** ... named to the Pac-10

All-Freshman team ... set a Cal freshman record by connecting on 44.9 percent of his three-point attempts (44-98) as he started the Bears' final 22 games of the season ... his biggest shot came in the first round of the NCAA Tournament when he drained a

three-pointer with 3.9 seconds left in overtime to lift the Bears to a 76-74 win over North Carolina State ... scored 11 points in that game, including 3-for-6 from behind the arc ... came off the bench the first nine games of the season before assuming starting duties with the Pac-10 opener against Stanford ... scored a season-high 23 points (8-16 FG, 4-8 3P, 3-3 FT) in Cal's home win over USC Jan. 23 ... also had 16 points in an overtime victory over San Francisco (6-7 FG, 4-5 FT) ... had a perfect shooting night from the floor in the championship game of the Golden Bear Classic vs. Louisiana-Lafayette when he went 5-for-5, including 2-for-2 on three-pointers, on his way to 16 points ... scored 13 of his 15 points in the second half in a win over Washington at home ... sank 9-of-10 free throws in the second half to help Cal beat Oregon in Eugene ... one of his best all-around games came against Washington State Feb. 13 when he had seven points, six rebounds, five assists and a career-best five steals ... had four threes vs. OSU in the Pac-10 Tourney.

High School: Midgley moved to California in 1999 and played two seasons at Modesto Christian HS, leading the team to a 34-4 record and a runner-up finish in the state tournament in 2001 ... averaged 19 points and 5 assists that season ... rated a Top 100 recruit by both CNNSI.com and *The Sporting News* ... did not play his senior season after his high school league ruled him ineligible to compete due to his age ... in England, won 11 national age-group titles at the club, school and county school levels ... twice scored 91 points in a game, once for his school in an overtime win in the Under-15 National School Cup and the second for his local club team (Haywards Heath Eagles) in an Under-15 Sussex Youth League Cup Final ... served as captain of the England Youth National team.

Personal: Richard Henry Midgley ... born July 7, 1983 in Maidstone, England ... parents are Kevin and Gill Midgley ... older brother, Daniel, played basketball at the University of Maine-Machias, an NAIA Division II school ... social welfare major.

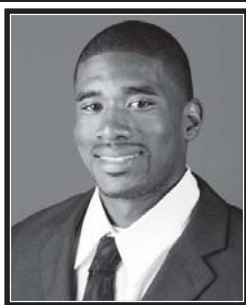

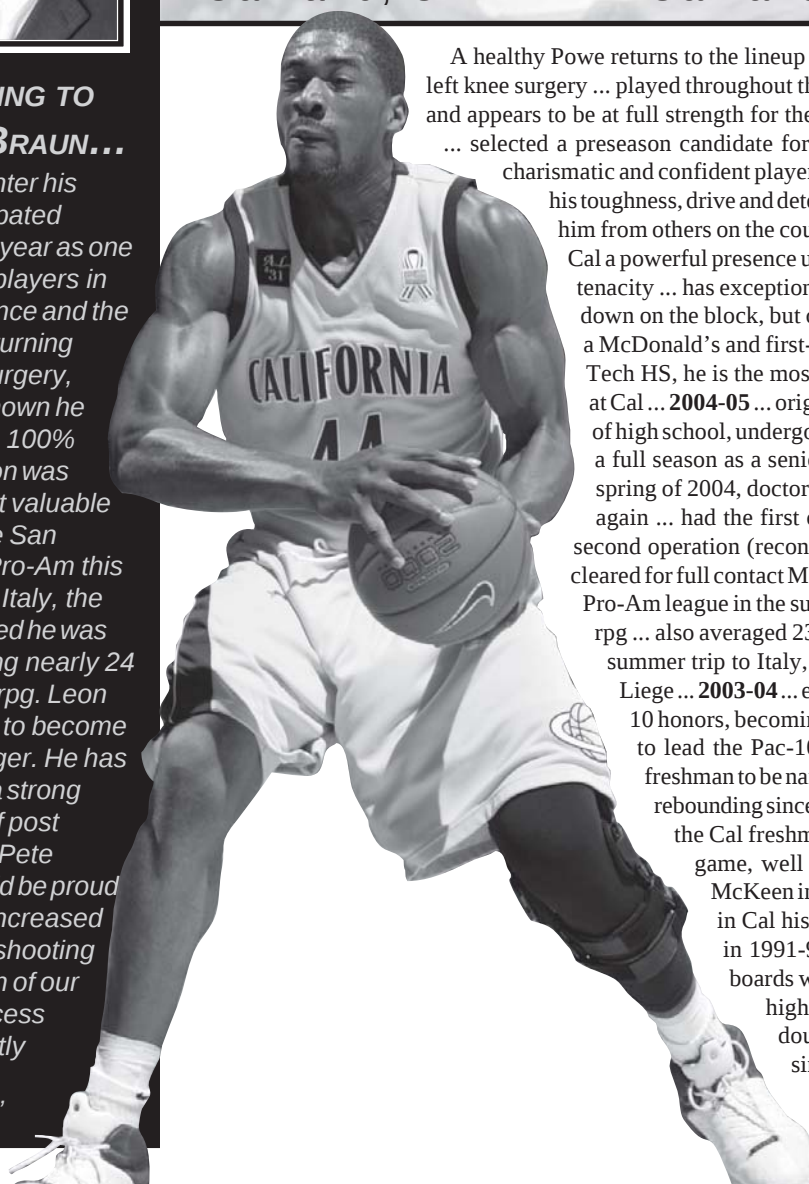

ACCORDING TO COACH BRAUN...

"Leon will enter his much anticipated sophomore year as one of the best players in our conference and the country. Returning from ACL surgery, Leon has shown he is back and 100% healthy. Leon was named most valuable player in the San Francisco Pro-Am this summer. In Italy, the 'Show' proved he was back, posting nearly 24 ppg and 12 rpg. Leon has worked to become much stronger. He has developed a strong repertoire of post moves that Pete Newell would be proud of. He has increased his outside shooting range. Much of our team's success will be directly related to number 44."



A healthy Powe returns to the lineup this year after missing all of last season due to left knee surgery ... played throughout the summer without pain or swelling in the knee and appears to be at full strength for the first time since his junior year of high school ... selected a preseason candidate for the 2005-06 Wooden All-America team ... a charismatic and confident player who provides vocal leadership for the Bears ...

his toughness, drive and determination are three characteristics that separate him from others on the court, according to head coach Ben Braun ... gives Cal a powerful presence under the basket, especially with his rebounding tenacity ... has exceptional hands and control around the hoop ... excels down on the block, but can also step out to hit the mid-range jumper ... a McDonald's and first-team *Parade* All-American at nearby Oakland Tech HS, he is the most highly acclaimed recruit to play under Braun at Cal ... **2004-05** ... originally hurt his knee in April after his junior year of high school, undergoing reconstructive surgery, but returned to play a full season as a senior ... after a normal postseason physical in the spring of 2004, doctors noted he needed to have the knee operated on again ... had the first of two surgeries April 21 (bone graft) and the second operation (reconstructive) in the two-part procedure Sept. 8 ... cleared for full contact May 26, 2005 ... named MVP of the San Francisco Pro-Am league in the summer of 2005 when he averaged 33 ppg and 11 rpg ... also averaged 23.6 ppg and 10.4 rpg in five games during Cal's summer trip to Italy, with a high of 37 points vs. the Belgian team, Liege ... **2003-04** ... earned Pac-10 Freshman of the Year and All-Pac-10 honors, becoming the first freshman in the history of the league to lead the Pac-10 in rebounding ... also the first Golden Bear freshman to be named team MVP and pace Cal in both scoring and rebounding since Shareef Abdur-Rahim in 1995-96 ... obliterated the Cal freshman rebounding record by pulling down 9.5 per game, well ahead of the former mark of 8.6 rpg by Bob McKeen in 1951-52 ... the 9.5 rpg rate was the 15th highest in Cal history, topped only by Brian Hendrick (10.7 rpg in 1991-92) in the previous 20 seasons ... his 256 total boards were also a school freshman record and the 14th highest total in Cal annals ... led the Pac-10 with 14 double-doubles – tying for most by a Golden Bear since Mark McNamara had 20 in 1981-82 ... opened his career with five consecutive double-doubles and finished the year with seven in his final 12 games ... led Cal in rebounding in 25 of the 27 games he played ... set his career high

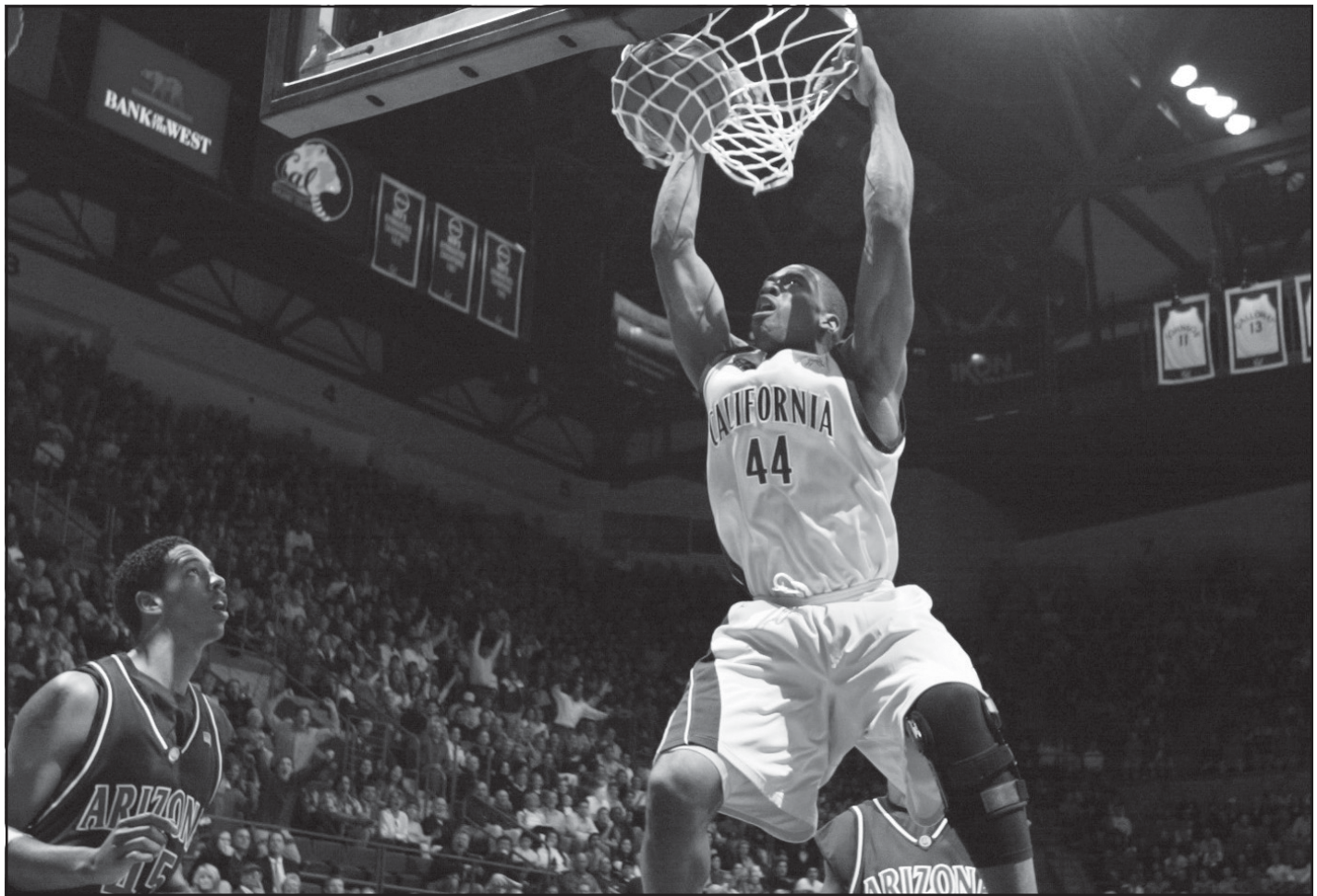

High School: Averaged 27.4 ppg, 14.2 rpg and 3.1 bpg as a senior at Oakland Tech ... selected a first-team *Parade* All-American and the Gatorade California Player of the Year ... also voted the ANG Newspapers Player of the Year three times, the 2003 *San Francisco Chronicle* Bay Area Player of the Year and first-team all-state by *Cal-Hi Sports* ... scored 15 points and added a game-high 12 rebounds in the McDonald's All-America game, becoming the first player in the history of the Oakland Athletic League to play in the contest ... also had 13 points, eight rebounds, two blocks and two steals in the EA Sports Roundball Classic following his senior season ... rated the No. 6 player in the country by *PrepStars* ... also pulled down Top 10 rankings from *Athlon* (No. 7) and *TheInsiders.com* (No. 8) ... scored 40 or more points in three straight games in 2002-03, including 42 vs. McClymonds HS to clinch the league title, 87-80 in overtime, with 27 points coming in a nine-minute stretch ... averaged 33 ppg and 14 rpg during the state playoffs, which ended with a loss in the championship game to Westchester HS ... had his No. 44 jersey retired – the first Oakland Tech athlete to receive the honor ... as a junior, named a third-team *Parade* All-American when he averaged 28 ppg, 14.8 rpg and 3 bpg ... chosen the *Cal-Hi Sports* Junior of the Year in California ... also a first-team All-American by *Street & Smith's* magazine ... guided Oakland Tech to a 28-4 record and a berth in the state championship game.
