"Martin is extremely dedicated and hard working. Martin begins his senior year after being rewarded this offseason with a scholarship. 'Marty' saw a lot of action last season and started several games at the point for us. He possesses excellent leadership skills, as well as lightning quick ability to push the ball up the court. Martin continues to be one of the best in the Pac-10 in assist-to-turnover ratio."



A key asset to Cal's backcourt, Smith is a fourth-year walk-on who has been rewarded with a scholarship for his senior season ... started 16 of the Bears' 18 Pac-10 games at point guard last season ... takes care of the ball on offense, limiting his turnovers to just 2.0 per game last year ... an excellent defender, especially with his ability to pressure the ball ... plays with an energetic style all over the court, earning the team's Hustle Award in 2004 and Coaches

Award in '05 ... son of the late Phil Smith, a two-time NBA All-Star who played collegiately at San Francisco ... **2004-05** ... ranked seventh in the Pac-10 with an average of 3.90 assists per game ... also rated fifth in the league in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.95:1) ... earned his first career start at Washington Dec. 31 and finished with seven assists ... had 10 points and a career-high 8 assists vs. Hampton and earned a spot on the Golden Bear Classic all-tournament team after adding 6 points, 5 rebounds and 4 assists vs. Pepperdine ... scored a career-high 12 points vs. Arizona State ... had 11 points and tied career high with 8 assists at Arizona ... added 11 points and 5 assists vs. USC ... **2003-04** ... in a season-high 19 minutes at Arizona, scored three points and added then-career highs in both assists (6) and rebounds (5) ... also had six points, four rebounds and three assists in 15 minutes vs. Wyoming ... his season scoring high came at Washington when he finished with seven points ... averaged 8.0 minutes per game ... **2002-03** ... gained his first action vs. Howard and had a block in three

minutes ... played well at home vs. USF (13 minutes) and UCLA at home (9 minutes) ... had 12 assists and did not commit a turnover during the season ... scored two points vs. Oregon State Jan. 11 ... playing time diminished with the return of senior Donte Smith to the lineup from an injury ... however, returned to the rotation in the Pac-10 Tournament, scoring four points with two assists vs. Oregon State and adding three points and two assists against USC ... with Brian Wethers injured for much of the USC contest, played a season-high 17 minutes vs. the Trojans.

High School: Smith earned first-team all-league honors at The Bishop's School his senior year ... averaged 21.3 ppg and 4 apg that season ... as a junior, helped his team to the CIF-San Diego Section championship ... played defensive back on the football team for two years ... named his high school's Chemistry Student of the Year and was a Government Scholar.

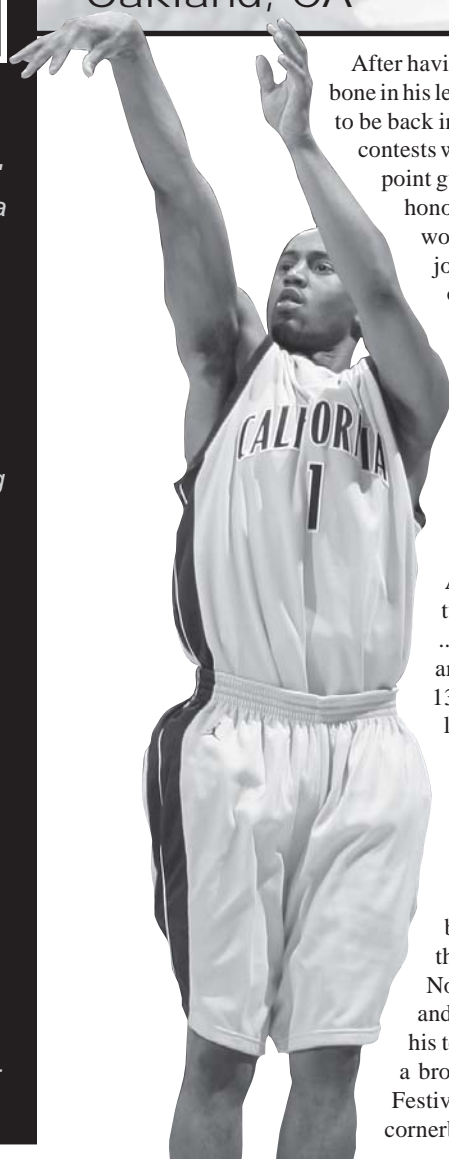

ACCORDING TO COACH BRAUN...

"Ayinde is coming off a sophomore campaign in which he missed several games due to a broken foot. He has worked very hard and has shown outstanding progress both on and off the floor. In Italy this past August, he showed his resolve, determination and leadership by posting 19 ppg and 9 apg. Ayinde is a big strong guard who is athletic, can see the floor and is an outstanding shooter. Look for Ayinde to have a breakout season this year."



After having his sophomore season derailed three games into the year by a broken bone in his left foot, Ubaka hopes for a fully healthy campaign in 2005-06 ... appeared to be back in top form during Cal's summer trip to Italy, averaging 18.8 ppg in five contests with consecutive games of 28 and 29 points ... served as the Bears starting point guard as a freshman and earned honorable mention Pac-10 All-Freshman honors in 2004 ... gives Cal another experienced player in the backcourt ... has worked to improve his shooting ... the first *Parade* All-American guard to join the Bears since Jason Kidd in the fall of 1992 ... **2004-05** ... jumped out to a strong start to the year, averaging 7.7 ppg and 4.0 apg through three games, shooting 53.3% from the floor and 62.5% (5-8) from three-point range ... broke the fifth metatarsal in his left foot vs. Southern Nov. 23 and had surgery the following day ... returned vs. Stanford Jan. 15 after missing 11 games ... had a better than 2-to-1 assist-to-turnover ratio (48-23) ... scored 9 points, with 4 assists and 0 turnovers at UCLA ... tied a career high with 13 points vs. Washington March 3 ... **2003-04** ... ranked third in the Pac-10 in assist-to-turnover ratio (1.96) and ninth in the league in assists (3.86 apg) to earn honorable mention Pac-10 All-Freshman honors ... also recognized with Cal's Most Unselfish Award ... paced the Bears with 108 assists while committing just 55 turnovers ... even better in Pac-10 action with 74 assists and 33 turnovers ... led Cal in minutes played (29.9 mpg) during league games ... had 13 points and eight assists in the Pac-10 opener vs. Washington ... also finished with 13 points against UCLA at home ... his two free throws with 18 seconds left lifted Cal to a 63-62 win over USC Jan. 22 ... set his career high with nine assists vs. Oregon Feb. 26.

High School: Averaged 23.5 points, 6.5 rebounds and 5.0 assists as a senior at Oakland HS ... earned fourth-team *Parade* All-America honors ... selected first-team all-state by *Cal-Hi Sports*, first-team All-ANG Newspapers and league MVP ... also chosen All-Metro by the *San Francisco Chronicle* ... rated as the No. 1 point guard on the West Coast by PacWestHoops.com ... a consensus Top 50 player nationally, claiming the No. 26 overall position by FoxSports.com, No. 38 by PrepStars and No. 40 by ESPN.com ... scored a career-high 35 points in a loss to Leon Powe and Oakland Tech HS ... as a junior, averaged 23 ppg, 8 apg and 8 rpg ... led his team to a quarterfinal berth in the state championship tournament ... won a bronze medal on the West team at the 2002 Men's Youth Development Festival sponsored by USA Basketball ... played both quarterback and cornerback on the Oakland High football team his sophomore and senior years.

Vierneisel has the ability to stretch defenses with his long-range shooting ability ... can also use his strength to drive to the basket ... plays on the wing ... rebounds well and sees the floor as a passer ... the third player from Illinois to play for Ben Braun at Cal, joining Sean Lampley (1998-2001) and Dennis Gates (1999-2002) ... **2004-05** ... made a big impact in his first game at Cal, going 4-for-4 from three-point range against UC Riverside in the season opener ... also sank a pair of treys at San Diego State Dec. 11, including a basket with just over five minutes left after SDSU had cut Cal's lead to one point ... started five games, including three Pac-10 contests ... tallied 10 points (4-6 FG, 1-3 3P, 1-2 FT) at USC ... scored eight points vs. Arizona in the Pac-10 Tournament, sinking a pair of three-pointers.

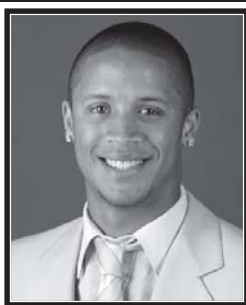

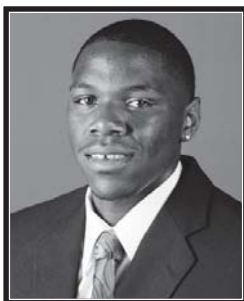

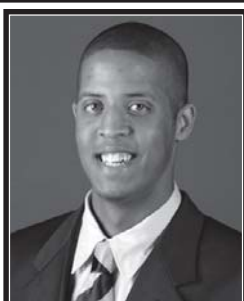
