ASSOCIATE HEAD COACH



LOUIS REYNAUD
San Francisco State '82
Sixth Year at California

Louis Reynaud, a native Californian who was born and raised in San Francisco, is in his sixth season with the Golden Bear program and first as associate head coach after serving five years as an assistant coach.

Reynaud is well known in the coaching profession and has the reputation as an excellent coach and administrator with outstanding organizational and leadership skills. There are very few areas in the Cal basketball program in which Reynaud is not directly involved. Among his many duties are heading up local and underclassman recruiting, scouting and game preparation, supervising support staff, and overseeing preseason and offseason individual workouts. He is the position coach for the Bears' perimeter players.

Prior to coming to Cal, Reynaud compiled an 84-31 record as head basketball coach at nearby De La Salle HS and led the Spartans to league titles in 1994 and '96. Reynaud was a two-time Bay Valley Athletic League Coach of the Year, and his 1996 team captured the Division I NorCal championship and finished second in the state, earning a No. 1 ranking in the Bay Area for the first time in school history.

Reynaud had his first head coaching opportunity at St. Patrick-St. Vincent HS in Vallejo from 1990-93. He directed the Bruins to a 69-39 record, three 20-win seasons and one Sac-Joaquin Section title. From 1986-90, Reynaud served as assistant varsity basketball coach at De La Salle HS.

In 1997, Reynaud was selected as head coach of the West Squad at the Magic Johnson Round Ball Classic for high school All-Americans, and he directed the prestigious ABCD summer camp for five years.

In addition to his coaching experience,

Reynaud served as Dean of Students at De La Salle from 1993-97 and as Dean of Students at St. Patrick-St. Vincent HS from 1990-93.

As a high school player, Reynaud was a standout at Archbishop Riordan HS in San Francisco and played for the late Lyle Newcomer at Skyline College in San Bruno.

Reynaud received his bachelor's degree in liberal studies along with his teaching credential from San Francisco State in 1982 and a master's degree in health/physical education from St. Mary's College in 1995. Reynaud and his wife, Cheryl, have one daughter, Lauren, and reside in the East Bay.

JON WHEELER
California '87
Third Year at California

A 13-year veteran of the collegiate coaching ranks, Jon Wheeler is in his third season as a member of Ben Braun's coaching staff at Cal.

Known for his strong recruiting ties, especially in the western United States, Wheeler works with the Golden Bear post players, coordinates recruiting, acts as the team's academic liaison and assists in many other areas of the program.

Wheeler gained his first coaching experience as a part-time assistant at Cal under Lou Campanelli from 1990-92. In 1990, he helped the Bears gain their first NCAA Tournament berth in 30 years.

Wheeler then moved onto UC Davis, where he served as head assistant coach for three seasons from 1992-95 under Bob Williams. During his final year there, the Aggies finished 20-11, captured their first league title in 18 years with a 13-1 mark and advanced to the regional semifinals of the NCAA Division II Tournament.

Wheeler returned to the Division I ranks as an assistant coach at Pepperdine in 1996. After one season with the West Coast Conference school, Wheeler moved on to UC Santa Barbara, where he spent four years before deciding to return to Cal.

While with the Gauchos, Wheeler worked under Jerry Pimm for two seasons and then was the only coach retained by Bob Williams, the former UC Davis coach, when he took over the program in 1998. During his tenure at UCSB, Wheeler served as recruiting and academic coordinator and worked with the Gaucho post players.

Wheeler's affiliation with Cal began when he transferred to Cal from Saint Mary's after his sophomore season with the Gaels. A two-year

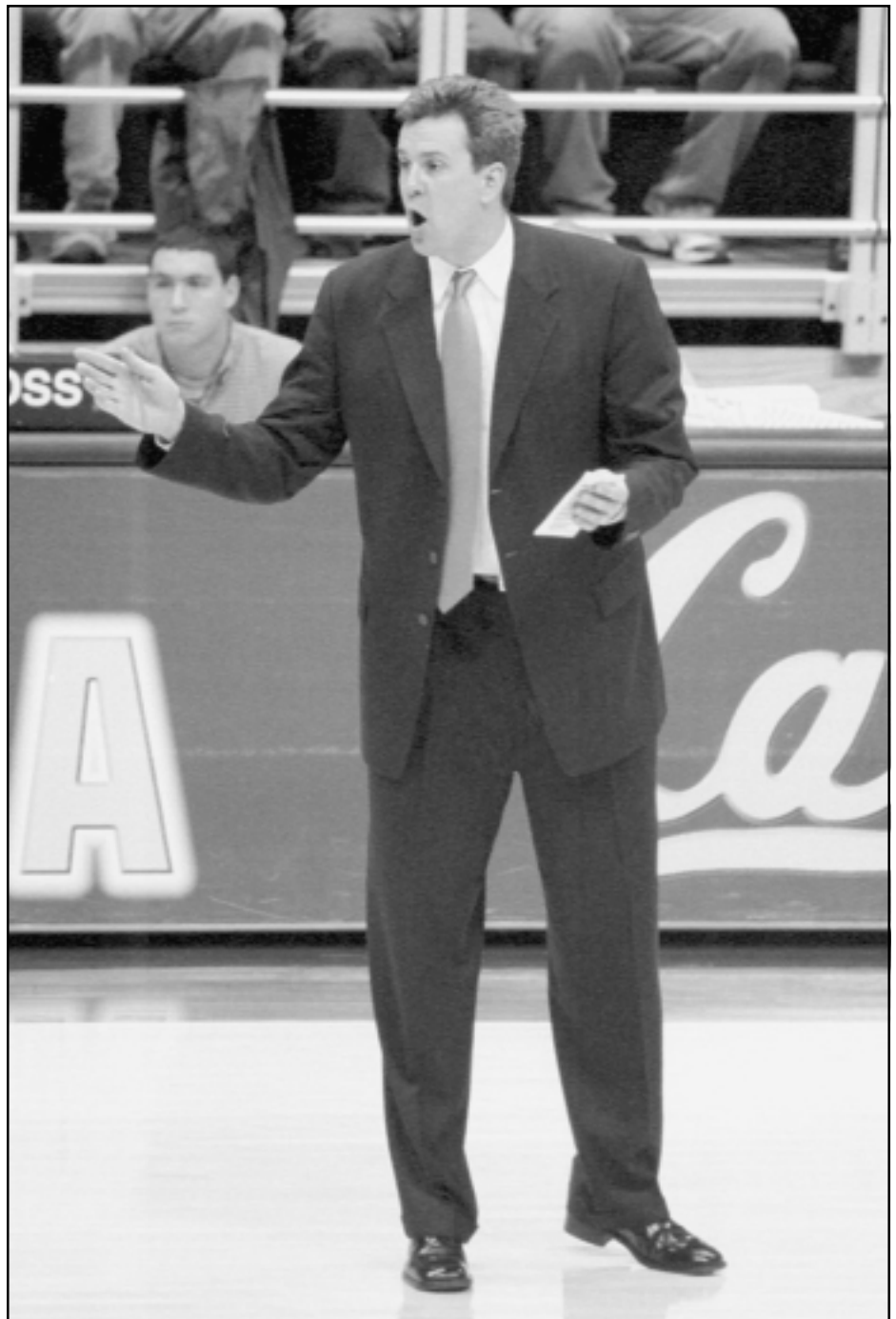
starter from 1986-87 as a 6-7 forward, Wheeler averaged 8.4 points per game as a senior, helping the Bears to the quarterfinals of the 1987 NIT.

Following graduation, he played professional basketball in France and later toured with an Australian-based team, the Illawarra Hawks.

A 1982 graduate of Petaluma High School in

Sonoma County, Wheeler earned All-Northern California honors as a senior.

Wheeler received his bachelor's degree from Cal in social science in 1987, and he earned a master's degree in athletic administration from Saint Mary's in 1998. Wheeler and his wife, Jynane, have a 2-year-old son, Michael, and reside in the East Bay.

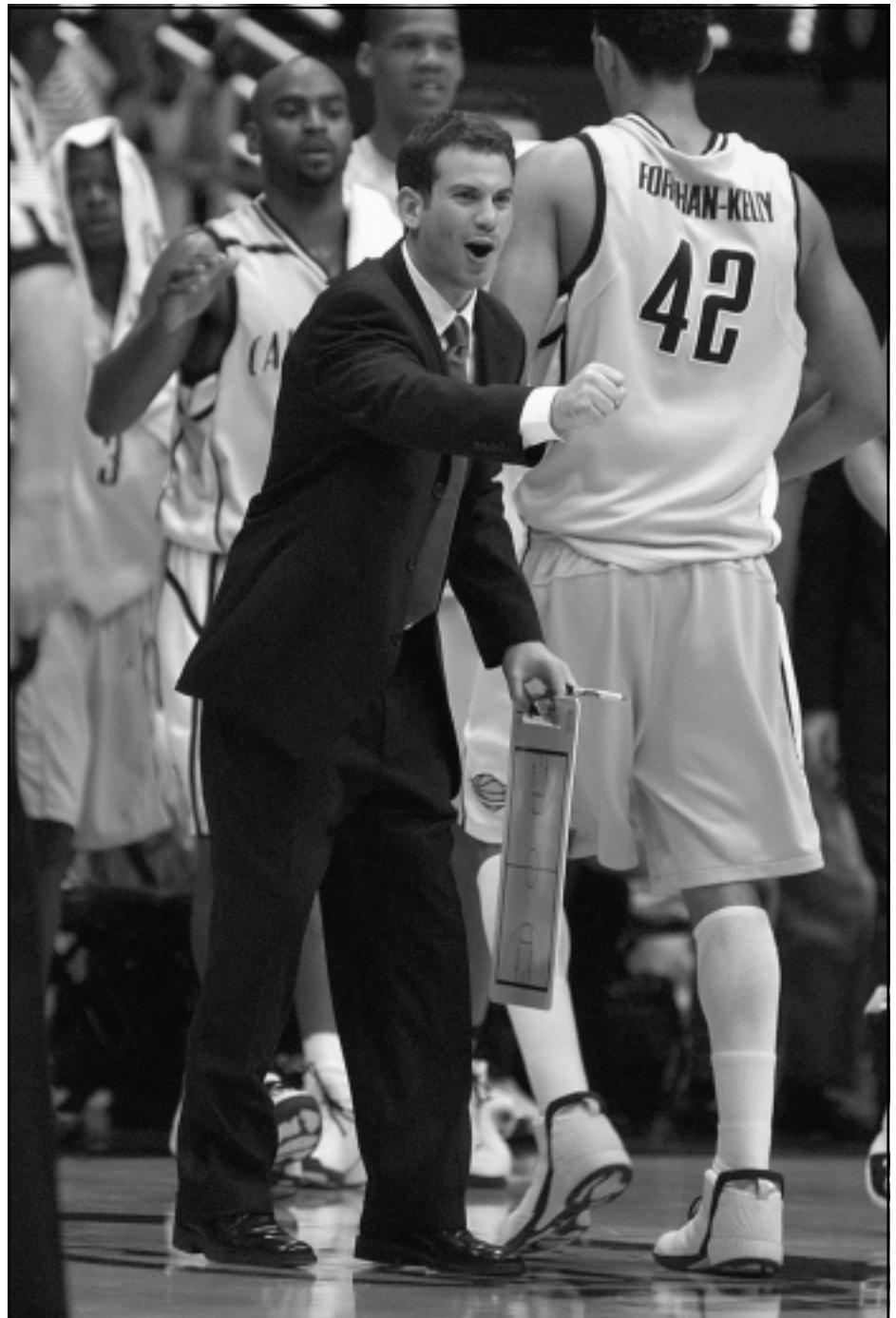
Pasternack writes scouting reports for the Bears and helps prepare the team on the court for upcoming opponents. At practice, he

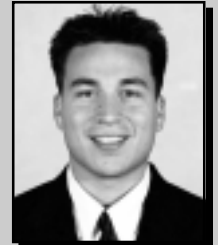


A graduate of Montgomery High School in Santa Rosa, Malvesti received her bachelor's degree from Cal in English in 2002.

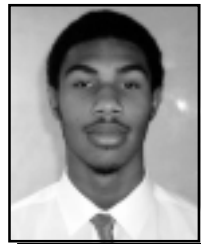
