Smith's senior season will get a late start after he underwent quadriceps surgery in September ... expected to return to action by early January in time for Cal's Pac-10 opener against Stanford ... when in the lineup, gives the Bears an experienced performer who can play both guard positions ... spent much of the summer working on his ball-handling and shooting before being slowed by the injury ... a three-time honorable mention Pac-10 All-Academic selection ... displays a quick first step and may be the Bears' best player driving to the basket ... has a career free throw percentage above 80 percent ... earned Washington, D.C., Player of the Year honors after his senior season at Anacostia HS.

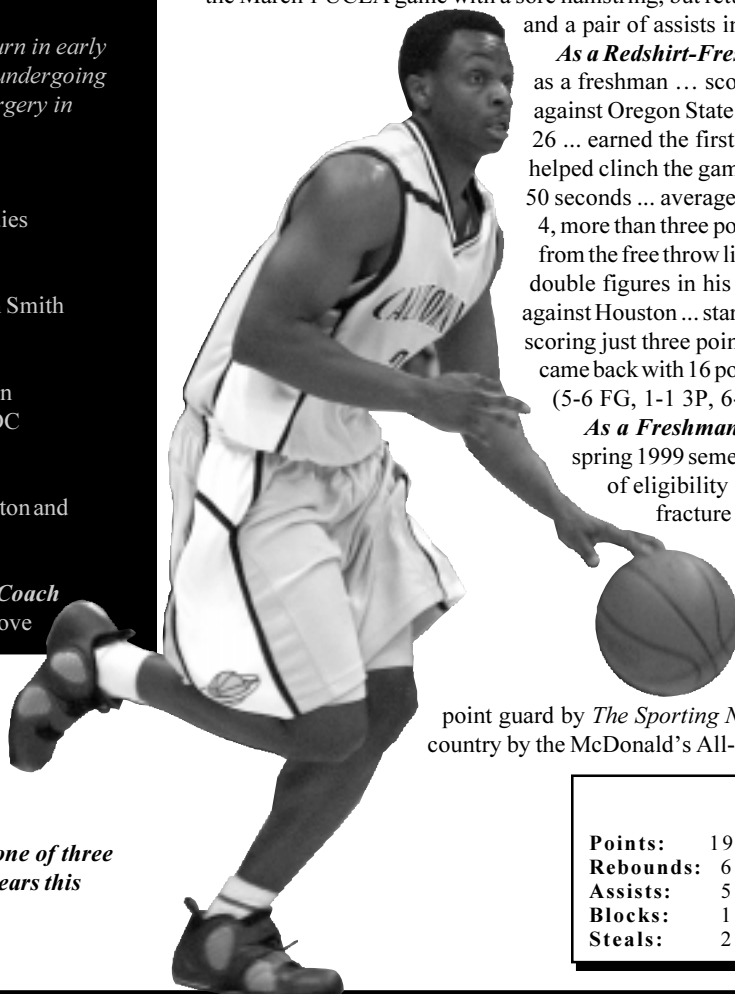
As a Junior in 2001-02: Smith appeared in 14 games during the season, averaging 1.1 ppg ... top performance came vs. Washington State when he scored six points, including a 4-for-4 outing from the free throw line ... also had four points in a win over Mount St. Mary's and three points against both Saint Louis and at WSU ... played a season-high 13 minutes vs. USC Feb. 23, helping the Bears to an 83-64 victory.

As a Sophomore in 2000-01: Smith played in 27 games for the Bears, all coming off the bench... scored six points against Albany in December and had five points and two assists in a season-high 17 minutes vs. South Florida Jan. 20 ... best game came against UCLA at home with 10 points (4-5 FG, 2-2 3P) and two rebounds in 11 minutes of action ... in back-to-back games against Washington and Washington State in late February, had eight points vs. the Huskies (3-3 FG, 2-2 3P) and seven points vs. the Cougars (3-5 FG, 1-3 3P) ... sat out the March 1 UCLA game with a sore hamstring, but returned to action two days later at USC ... had two points and a pair of assists in Cal's NCAA Tournament game vs. Fresno State.

As a Redshirt-Freshman in 1999-00: Smith started 14 of Cal's 33 games as a freshman ... scored a season-high 19 points (6-7 FG, 5-6 3P, 2-4 FT) against Oregon State Feb. 10 ... also had 15 points at Washington State Feb. 26 ... earned the first of four consecutive starts at Washington Feb. 24 and helped clinch the game by going 5-for-6 from the free throw line in the final 50 seconds ... averaged 9.6 ppg in seven games from Feb. 10 through March 4, more than three points higher than his season average ... shot 81.0 percent from the free throw line, the third-best rate ever by a Cal freshman ... reached double figures in his first two games with 13 points vs. TCU and 11 more against Houston ... started each of Cal's first six contests at point guard ... after scoring just three points against San Jose State in his first game as a reserve, came back with 16 points in a win over UC Irvine Dec. 18 ... also had 17 points (5-6 FG, 1-1 3P, 6-7 FT) against Davidson Jan. 2.

As a Freshman in 1998-99: Smith enrolled in classes at Cal for the spring 1999 semester, but elected to redshirt to preserve four full seasons of eligibility ... missed most of the practice sessions due to a stress fracture in his lower back, but returned in full health for '99-00.

High School: Smith averaged 28.3 ppg, 6.2 apg and 5.7 rpg as a senior, leading his team to a 24-5 record and the Interscholastic Athletic Association title ... had a high of 44 points, making 11 three-pointers, in one game ... rated the No. 52 overall recruit by *Bob Gibbons' All-Star Sports* and ranked as the No. 21 point guard by *The Sporting News* ... also listed as one of the Top 50 players in the country by the McDonald's All-America committee and participated in the prestigious

One of the most versatile big men in the country, the 6-11 Tamir not only excels on the block, but he also has shooting range out to the three-point line ... brings a high degree of maturity and international experience to the Bears ... member of the Israeli National team ... attended the Pete Newell Big Man Camp over the summer ... earned Pac-10 All-Freshman honors last year ... capable of explosive scoring outings, but hopes to become a more consistent contributor this year ... sees the court well and is an accomplished passer ... clearly Cal's most experienced big man, will be counted on for rebounding and defense under the basket ... the second Israeli native to play for the Bears under Ben Braun, joining former center Shahar Gordon (1999-2000).

As a Freshman in 2001-02: Tamir had to sit out the first eight games of the season for playing with professionals in Israel ... then in his first action for Cal, had a big impact in the Golden Bear Classic ... not only scored 12 points and grabbed a team-high nine rebounds in the title game vs. Penn State, but he forced a key turnover in the closing seconds to set up the Bears' winning basket in a 76-73 squeaker ... totaled 19 points on 8-of-14 shooting (3-for-4 from three-point range) at Oregon and added 17 points vs. Washington State ...

capped a run of four consecutive double-figure outings with 39 points in a double OT win over Oregon ... made 14-of-19 shots, including 6-of-8 three-pointers, to garner both Pac-10 Player of the Week and ESPN.com National Player of the Week honors ... the total was the fifth highest in school history and all came after he entered the game with 6:14 left in the first half ... scored 18 points in wins over UCLA at home and at Arizona State ... shot just 1-for-7 from the floor vs. USC Feb. 23, but contributed seven assists with no turnovers ... had nine starts during the year, the last coming Feb. 2 vs. Arizona State at home ... co-winner of Cal's Best Academic Performance award.

High School: Tamir attended Ort HS in Jerusalem ... named best newcomer of the Israeli league ... led his team to the Jerusalem high school title ... played for Israeli under-22 team at the 1998 European Championships in Sicily.

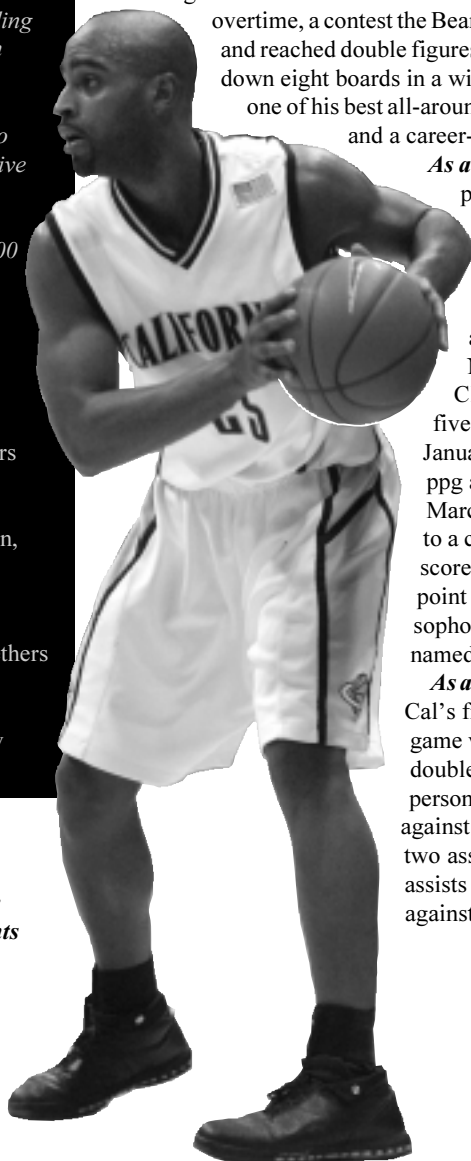

Brian Wethers enters the season needing 230 points for 1,000 in his career.



A veteran with almost 60 starts to his credit, Wethers enters his senior campaign with all the tools to have an outstanding year ... not only expected to be one of Cal's leading scorers again, but also provides strong play on defense and is a solid rebounder ... a physical performer who brings a degree of versatility to the lineup ... has the ability to post up smaller guards and get inside to the hoop ... perhaps the best athlete on the team with his combination of size, strength and leaping ability ... has raised his scoring average every season and poised to join Cal's 1,000-point club this year ... according to Ben Braun, has the capability of dominating a game from a defensive standpoint.

As a Junior in 2001-02: Wethers averaged 10.3 ppg to rank second on the squad in scoring ... came on especially strong down the stretch, pumping in 22 points in the Pac-10 Tournament semifinals vs. Arizona and adding 19 more in the NCAA playoffs against Penn ... tallied a season-high 24 points at USC Jan. 24, with 20 coming after halftime ... hit a turnaround three-pointer with four seconds left in regulation to send the game into overtime, a contest the Bears eventually won, 92-91 ... had 18 points at Arizona in the regular-season and reached double figures a total of 16 times ... led Cal in rebounding on seven occasions ... pulled down eight boards in a win over Stanford and matched that total vs. Arizona State at home ... had one of his best all-around games vs. UCLA Feb. 21 when he finished with 15 points, six rebounds and a career-high six assists ... presented with Cal's Hustle and Spirit Award.

As a Sophomore in 2000-01: Wethers ranked ninth in the Pac-10 in field goal percentage (51.7%), tops among guards ... even better in conference games (53.5%) ... started the final 23 games of the season, earning his first start against Coppin State Dec. 23 ... began the year with nine points, all on three-pointers, vs. Mississippi State ... after not scoring in consecutive games against UC Irvine and Cleveland State, had nine points vs. Albany and a then-career-high 21 points vs. Georgia (9-15 FG, 3-5 FT) in the Pete Newell Challenge ... named to the all-tournament team at the Golden Bear Classic after scoring 10 points with three assists vs. Yale and 12 points with five assists against LaSalle ... led the Bears with 18 points at Stanford in mid-January ... in a home sweep of Washington and Washington State, averaged 8.0 ppg and made 7-of-9 attempts from the field ... played well in a loss at USC March 3 with 18 points (6-9 FG, 3-4 3P, 3-4 FT) ... in Cal's next game, soared to a career-best 27 points (10-13 FG, 5-6 3P, 2-2 FT) against Arizona State ... scored 10 points vs. Fresno State in the NCAA Tournament ... raised his three-point shooting rate from 18.9 percent as a freshman to 43.9 percent as a sophomore ... shot 48.6 percent (18-37) from behind the arc in league play ... named Cal's Most Improved Player at the end of the year.

As a Freshman in 1999-00: Wethers had 18 starts on the season, second among Cal's freshmen ... did not score in the TCU opener, then had 11 points the next game vs. Houston ... rated third on the squad in assists with 56 ... had a double-double against Arizona State at home with 16 points and 10 rebounds, both personal highs ... also grabbed seven rebounds vs. Arizona Jan. 6 and had six more against both Oregon and Stanford ... scored 12 points to go with six rebounds and two assists in the home opener against Pacific ... dished out a season-best five assists vs. Davidson and had at least three assists seven times, including three against Long Beach State in the first round of the NIT ... started the first six games

of the year, then had six consecutive starts from Jan. 2 through Jan. 19 ... in front of three busloads of fans from Murrieta who drove up to see him play at USC Feb. 3, came off the bench for eight points, three rebounds, two assists and two steals.

High School: Wethers was a member of the *Orange County Register's* Feb 15 and the *Long Beach Press-Telegram's* Best of the West squad ... voted first team all-state, Riverside County Player of the Year and league MVP after his senior year ... averaged 27 points and 10 rebounds as a senior ... scored 44 points in the title game of the Nighthawk Classic one day after scoring 42 points in a tournament game ... rated the No. 25 recruit in the country by *Recruiting USA* and the No. 30 prospect by *FastBreak*

magazine ... other national rankings came from *PrepStar* (No. 11 small forward), *Van Coleman's Future Stars* (No. 58 overall) and *Blue Ribbon College Basketball Yearbook* (Top 44 All-American) ... led team to a 22-6 record and a second straight league championship, the first two in school history ... as a junior, averaged 22.6 ppg, 10.2 rpg, 2.5 spg and 2.5 apg ... shot 54 percent from the floor and was named league MVP.

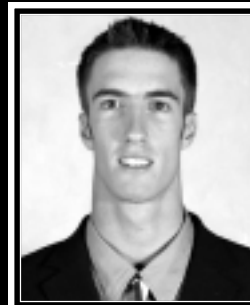

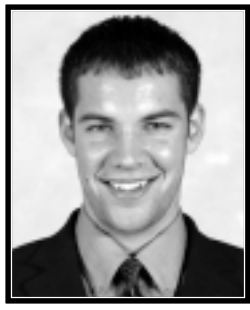

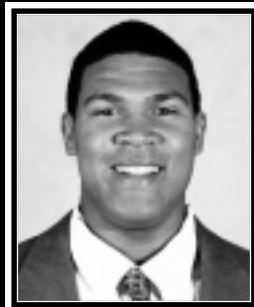
