




- Jeff Tedford has guided Cal to a bowl game for the sixth consecutive year with this season's appearance in the Emerald Bowl. He owns a 4-1 postseason record, making him the only Cal coach with more than two bowl victories to his credit.
- In addition to the Emerald Bowl, Cal has advanced to the Insight Bowl (2003), Holiday Bowl (2004, 2006), Las Vegas Bowl (2005) and Armed Forces Bowl (2007) under Tedford.
- Under Tedford, Cal has won 58 games over the past seven seasons, and his average of 8.3 wins per season is the highest for any Golden Bear football coach in history.
- ◆ Cal is one of just two Pac-10 teams that have advanced to bowl games in each of the last six years, and in the Tedford era, the Bears have won the second most Pac-10 games of any team.
- Cal set a season ticket record in 2007 at 41,336. In 2006, the Bears set an average attendance record at 64,318. Cal has now had 31 straight home games with over 50,000 fans.
- Cal has posted an undefeated home record three of the last five years, including a 7-0 mark in 2008 to match the team's best home record ever in Memorial Stadium.
- During the Tedford era, Cal has had 74 players recognized as academic all-conference. In addition, Alex Mack won the 2008 Draddy Trophy as the top scholar-athlete in all of college football.
- Tedford, a two-time Pac-10 Coach of the Year, was named a finalist for the 2006 Liberty Mutual Coach of the Year Award, which honors the college football coach who best exemplifies responsibility and excellence on and off the field of play.
- Of the 86 Pac-10 head coaches over the last 50 years, Tedford is one of just four to post a winning record in each of his first seven seasons.





