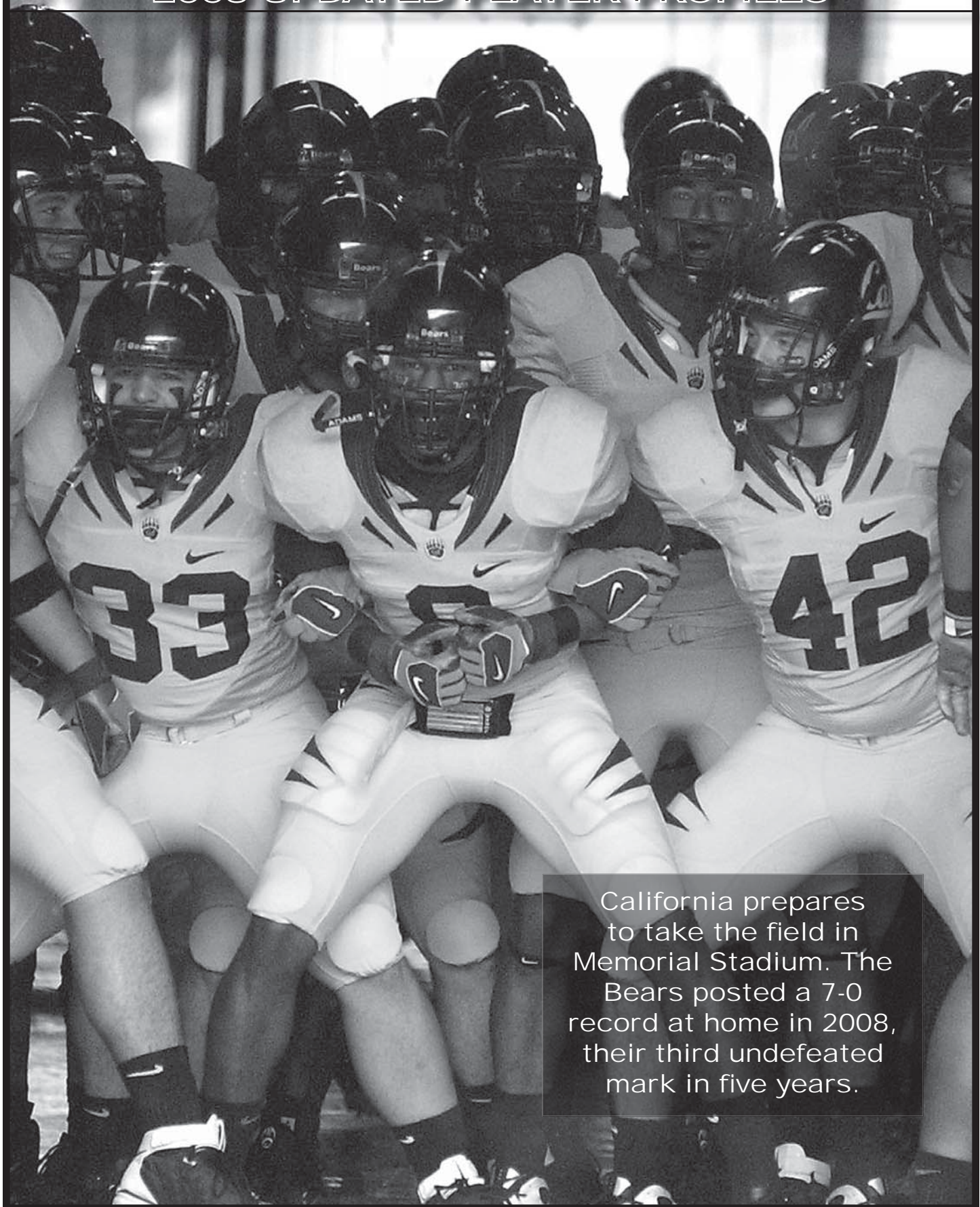

2008: Has a career-high 59 tackles entering the Emerald Bowl ... with two more stops will pass Andre Carter (60 in 2000) for most tackles by a Cal lineman since Duane Clemons had 82 in 1995 ... named second-team All-Pac-10 ... started every

game at a defensive end spot this year ... has had at least one tackle for loss in all but two games ... recipient of Cal's Brick Muller Award as the team's most valuable defensive lineman ... tied for 10th in the Pac-10 with 6.0 sacks and is tied for 15th in the league with 10.5 TFL ... finished off the regular season with a career-best 10 tackles, including a sack and two for loss, plus forced fumble vs. Washington ... played well at Maryland with eight total tackles, including one sack ... had a pair of sacks for minus 17 yards, as well as two pass break-ups, in Cal's win over UCLA ... registered a 10-yard sack at USC ... finished with eight tackles plus a forced fumble in the Big Game vs. Stanford.

2007: Started all 13 games at defensive end ... paced the defensive line with 52 tackles, including 3.5 for a loss ... also had 2.5 sacks, an interception and a team-best four fumble recoveries ... had 20 tackles and a pair of fumble recoveries in the last three regular season games ... recorded a pair of sacks at Colorado State ... recovered his first career fumble and took it into the end zone for a touchdown vs. Arizona after a Thomas DeCoud blitz on quarterback Willie Tuitama jarred the ball loose ... snared a key interception at Oregon in the fourth quarter when the Ducks were driving and threatening to score on Cal's 17-yard line ... also recovered a fumble against USC ... earned the team's Brick Muller Award.

2006: Stepped into the defensive line rotation as a true freshman ... saw action in all 13 games, including his first career start against Oregon State ... registered 16 tackles, fourth on the defensive line ... tallied six tackles (three solo) against UCLA and added five takedowns (two solo) in his debut at Tennessee.

2008: In his first year as Cal's punter, quickly established himself as one of the best as his position in the country ... named a first-team Freshman All-American by Sporting News Today, as well as second-team All-Pac-10 ... the only freshman and

Pac-10 player to be named a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award ... named Pac-10 Special Teams Player of the Week Oct. 6 when he averaged 47.4 yards on seven punts and placed three kicks inside the 20-yard-line vs. Arizona State ... set a school single-game record when he averaged 60.2 ypp on four punts vs. Stanford, including two of the five longest punts in school history – a 76-yarder on his first boot (#4) and a 75-yarder on his second (#5-T) ... including a 72-yarder vs. Arizona State, has the three longest punts in the Pac-10 this year ... 25 of his 66 punts have landed inside the opponent 20 and has 15 50-yard punts on the year ... his 43.7 ypp ranks fourth on the Cal season list ... named Cal's most valuable freshman.

2007: Redshirted the season.

High School: USA Today and EASports first-team All-American ... listed as the No. 2 punter in the country by Rivals.com and No. 5 by Scout.com ... averaged 41.8 yards per punt with 11 being downed inside the 20 as a senior ... also caught

42 passes for 678 yards as a receiver ... selected as school's Scholar-Athlete of the Year.

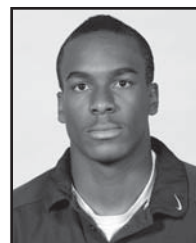

2008: Ranks first in the Pac-10 and fifth in the country averaging 126.7 ypg ... his 1,394 yards this year are the fourth-highest season total in school history ... first-team All-Pac-10 and a three-time Pac-10 Player of the Week ... his 8.0 yards per carry

is the best of any player in the FBS with at least 125 rushes this season, as well as a school record ... named Cal's Co-Offensive MVP ... capped off the regular season with a school-record 311 yards on 19 carries vs. Washington – the fourth-highest total in Pac-10 history and the No. 4 performance in the nation this fall ... also scored four TDs in the game, including sprints of 60 and 84 yards ... has the two longest runs in the Pac-10 this season; in addition to the 84-yard rush vs. UW, went 86 yards at Washington State ... ranks second in the nation in all-purpose yards (183.5 ypg) ... the only Cal player ever to have three 200-yard games (311 vs. Washington, 201 vs. Stanford, 200 at Washington State) ... ran for a combined 512 yards on 38 carries (13.5 ypc) in Cal's last two games vs. Stanford and UW ... has had seven rushes of 60+ yards this season, including three runs of 80 or more yard ... had four rushing touchdowns against Washington, which tied the modern-day school record (also Carl Montgomery vs. Oregon State in 1981 and Don Johnson vs. Minnesota in 1952) ... recipient of the Berkeley Breakfast Club Award (outstanding player in the Big Game) ... leads Cal with 27 receptions and could become the first Cal back to lead the Bears in both rushing yards and catches since Chuck Muncie in 1973 ... opened the 2008 campaign with 111 yards on 24 carries (1 TD), 63 receiving yards and 103 kickoff-return yards for a career-best 277 all-purpose yards against Michigan State ... became the first Cal player since J.J. Arrington in 2004 to open a season with back-to-back 100-yard rushing games after racking up 200 yards on the ground at Washington State ... dislocated his left elbow vs. Colorado State Sept. 27 ... after missing the Arizona State game, returned at Arizona Oct. 18 and rushed for 107 yards and a touchdown vs. the Wildcats ... went for 115 yards against UCLA and 116 yards against Oregon State ... in his brief career, already has 67 plays (rush, receive, KO return) of at least 10 yards.

2007: Burst onto the collegiate scene as a true freshman, seeing action at tailback, as a return man and as a gunner ... a first-team All-Pac-10 selection as a special teams player ... selected as

the team's Most Valuable Freshman and received the team's J. Scott Duncan Award (Most Valuable Special Teams Player) ... missed the Washington, Stanford and Air Force games due to a hip injury ... tallied 10 or more yards on 36.8% of his touches (21-of-57 plays) ... burst through tacklers for a 64-yard touchdown run against Colorado State for his first career touchdown ... added his first receiving touchdown against Louisiana Tech with a 16-yard grab ... had four carries for 46 yards in his collegiate debut against Tennessee ... returned 15 kickoffs for an average of 27.0 yards per effort (second in the Pac-10), including a career-long 54-yarder against UCLA and 11 others of 20 yards or more ... also a standout special teams gunner with 12 tackles and a fumble recovery.
