CAL CAREER: Begins the 2009 season having played in all 39 games possible with 27 starts over the last three campaigns ... has made 130 tackles to go along with 14.5 TFL (-86 yards), 8.5 sacks (-68

yards), four passes defended, four fumble recoveries, two forced fumbles, a blocked kick and an interception.

2009: An honors candidate that has earned preseason honorable mention All-America honors from *NationalChamps.net*, as well as first-team All-Pac-10 honors from *Athlon* and *Sporting News*, and second-team recognition by *Lindy's* and *Phil Steele* ... ranked as the nation's No. 45 preseason defensive end by *Phil Steele*.

2008: Had a career-high 62 tackles (No. 47 Pac-10), most for a Cal defensive lineman since Duane Clemons had 82 in 1995 ... named second-team All-Pac-10 ... started all 13 games for the second consecutive season and played in all 13 for the third year in a row ... had at least 0.5 TFL in all but two games ... recipient of Cal's Brick Muller Award as the team's most valuable defensive lineman for the second straight year ... 11th in the Pac-10 with 6.0 sacks (No. 84-T NCAA) and tied for 16th in the league with 11.0 TFL ... finished off the regular season with a career-best 10 tackles, including a sack and two for loss, plus a forced fumble vs. Washington ... played well at Maryland with eight total tackles, including one sack ... had a pair of sacks for minus 17 yards and two pass breakups in a win over UCLA ... registered a 10-yard sack at USC among his 1.5 TFL ... finished with eight tackles plus a forced fumble in the Big Game vs. Stanford.

2007: Started all 13 games for the first time and played in all 13 for the second consecutive season ... paced defensive linemen with 52 tackles, including 3.5 for a loss ... added 2.5 sacks, an interception and a team-best four fumble recoveries ... had 20 tackles and a pair of fumble recoveries in the last three regular season games, including a season-high eight stops in the Big Game at Stanford ... recorded a pair of sacks and five tackles at Colorado State ... recovered his first career fumble and took it into the end zone for a touchdown vs. Arizona after a Thomas DeCoud blitz on quarterback Willie Tuitama jarred the ball loose ... snared a key interception at Oregon in the fourth quarter when the Ducks were driving and threatening to score ... also recovered a

fumble against USC ... earned the Brick Muller Award as the team's most valuable defensive lineman, an honor he would repeat in 2008.

2006: Stepped into the defensive line rotation as a true freshman ... saw action in all 13 games, including his first career start against Oregon State ... registered 16 tackles, fourth on the defensive line ... tallied a season-high six tackles (three solo) against UCLA and added five takedowns (two solo) in his college debut at Tennessee.

HIGH SCHOOL: A two-time All-State selection by the *Honolulu Star Bulletin* ... ranked as the No. 2 player in Hawaii in 2005 by *Rivals.com*, who also rated him as the No. 24 defensive tackle in America ... recorded seven sacks and had 59 tackles (39 solo stops), ranking first and second, respectively, in the Interscholastic League of Honolulu ... named the ILH's 2005 Defensive Player of the Year ... *PrepStar* placed him on its 2004 All-Far West Region team ... paramount game came against Punahou High School when he recorded nine tackles and 4.0 sacks ... also posted a pair of 14-tackle efforts in his senior season ... signed with Cal before the 2005 season, but enrolled in January of 2006.

2009: An honors candidate that has earned first-team preseason All-America honors from *Athlon*, as well as second-team mention by *NationalChamps.net*, *Phil Steele* and *Sporting News* ... has added

first-team preseason All-Pac-10 honors by *Athlon*, *Lindy's*, *Phil Steele* and *Sporting News* ... ranked as the No. 2 preseason punter by *Phil Steele*, while *Lindy's* has him at No. 3 ... on the watch list for the Collegiate Football Awards Punter of the Year ... a candidate for the Ray Guy Award.

2008: Established himself as one of the top punters in the country as a freshman ... named a first-team Freshman All-American by *Sporting News Today*, *College Football News* and *Rivals.com* ... also a second-team All-Pac-10 choice ... the only freshman and Pac-10 player to be named a semifinalist for the Ray Guy Award ... won the Bob Simmons Award given to Cal's Most Valuable Freshman ... ranked third in the Pac-10 and 18th nationally in punting average (43.1 ypp) and averaged 40.0 or more yards per punt in eight of 13 contests ... chosen Pac-10 Special Teams Player of the Week for Oct. 4 when he averaged 47.4 yards on seven punts and placed three kicks inside the 20-yard line vs. Arizona State ... set a school single-game record when he averaged a Pac-10 season-high 60.2 yards per punt on four punts vs. Stanford, including two of the longest punts in school history – a 76-yarder on his first boot (No. 4) that was a new Big Game record and a 75-yarder on his second (No. 5-T) that along with a 72-yarder vs. Arizona State were the three longest in the Pac-10 during the year ... 26 of 71 punts landed inside the opponent 20-yard line ... had 16 punts of at least 50 yards ... his 43.1 yards per punt ranked fifth on the Cal single-season list ... had one tackle.

CAL CAREER: A two-time first-team All-Pac-10 choice that has established himself as one of the top returning players in the country at any position after only 22 career games played and 10 starts ... has 1,801 career rushing yards and heads into the 2009 season just 389 yards out of the school's all-time top-10 ... has 2,947 career all-purpose yards (just 308 out of the school's top-10), adding 826 yards in kick returns on 31 tries (26.6 ypr) and 320 yards receiving on 40 catches (8.0 ypc) ... has 45 plays of more than 20 yards (22 rush, 1 receiving, 22 kick return) ... missed spring football for each of the last two seasons after foot and elbow surgeries following the 2008 campaign and a hip injury following 2007.

2009: One of the nation's top candidates to win the 2009 Heisman Trophy as the leading returning rusher in the nation ... recognized as one of the preseason 2009 Heisman Trophy favorites by *Athlon*, *Lindy's* (No. 4), *Phil Steele* (No. 6), *NationalChamps.net* (No. 9) and *Sports Network*, among others ... selected as a first-team preseason All-American by *Athlon* and *Lindy's*, as well as second-team choice by *Phil Steele* and *Sporting News*, and a third-team pick of *NationalChamps.net* ... named by *Sporting News* as the nation's top returning running back and the seventh-best player in the country ... a first-team preseason All-Pac-10 choice of *Athlon*, *Lindy's*, *Phil Steele* and *Sporting News* ... *Lindy's* also picked Best as the Pac-10's 2009 preseason Most Valuable Player ... added second-team preseason All-Pac-10 kick returner mention from *Athlon* and third-team according to *Phil Steele* ... *Lindy's* and *Rivals.com* list Best as its their top running back nationally, while he also checks in at No. 2 on *Lindy's* list of Pac-10 NFL talents ... *Phil Steele* has him as the No. 4 draft eligible running back and No. 25 kick returner in the country ... *Sporting News* tabs him No. 7 on its list of the nation's top players ... on official watch lists for the College Football Performance Awards Overall Performer and Running Back of the Year ... a candidate for the Doak Walker Award awarded to the nation's top running back.

2008: A first-team All-Pac-10 choice for the second straight year (special teams in 2007), as well as a second-team All-American by *College Football News* ... also shared the Bear Backers Award given to the Team MVP with seniors Zack Follett and Alex Mack, while taking home the team's Most Valuable Back honor ... led the Pac-10 and ranked third in the country in rushing, averaging 131.67 yards per game and finishing with a total of 1,580 rushing yards that was the second-highest ever at Cal, behind only J.J. Arrington's 2,018 yards in 2004 ... his 8.1 yards per carry was the best of any player in the Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) with at least 125 rushes in 2008, as well as a school record ... led the Pac-10 and ranked second in the nation with 187.3 all-purpose yards per game behind Missouri's Jeremy Maclin, who was selected in the first round of the 2009 NFL Draft ... also led the Pac-10 in kick return average (26.3, No. 21 NCAA), and tied for the league lead in scoring with an average of 8.0 points per game (No. 35-T NCAA) and scoring touchdowns with the same per game average on 16 TDs for a total of 96 points ... became the first non-quarterback to pace Cal in total offense (No. 8 Pac-10) since Gary Fowler co-led the team in 1969 and the first running back to lead by himself since John Olszewski in 1952 ... voted Offensive MVP of the Emerald Bowl after galloping for a bowl-record 186 yards and two touchdowns on 20 carries vs. Miami, Fla. (9.3 ypc) ... his 15 rushing TDs tied the Cal single-season mark also held by J.J. Arrington (2004) and Justin Forsett (2007) ... a three-time Pac-10 Offensive Player of the Week (Sept. 6, Nov. 22, Dec. 6) ... capped off the regular season with a school-record 311 yards on 19 carries vs. Washington – the fourth-highest total in Pac-10 history and the most in the Pac-10 as well as the fourth most in the nation in 2008 ... his 311 all-purpose yards against Washington were also the most in the Pac-10 in 2008 ... also had four rushing TDs vs. the Huskies, including scoring sprints of 60 and 84 yards, to tie the Cal modern era record and equal the most in the Pac-10 in 2008 with his 24 points scored, four touchdowns and four rushing TDs also matching a Pac-10 season-best ... had the two longest runs in the Pac-10; in addition to the 84-yard rush vs. Washington, went 86 yards at Washington State ... the only Cal player ever and the only Pac-10 player in 2008 to have three 200-yard games in a season (311 vs.

Washington, 201 vs. Stanford, 200 at Washington State) with those ranking as three of the top four 2008 rushing performances in the Pac-10 ... had eight 100-yard rushing games to tie for first in the Pac-10 ... ran for a combined 698 yards on 58 carries (12.0 yards per rush) in Cal's last three games vs. Stanford, Washington and Miami, Fla. ... had 19 rushes of 20 or more yards and seven of 60+ yards, including three runs of 80 or more yards ... recipient of the Berkeley Breakfast Club Award for the Most Outstanding Offensive Player in the Big Game ... tied for second on the team with 27 receptions for 246 yards and a touchdown ... opened the campaign with 111 yards rushing on 24 carries and one touchdown, 63 receiving yards and 103 kick return yards for 277 all-purpose yards against Michigan State ... became the first Cal player since J.J. Arrington in 2004 to open a season with back-to-back 100-yard rushing games after racking up 200 yards on the ground at Washington State in the second game of the season ... dislocated his left elbow vs. Colorado State in the fourth game of the year ... after missing the Arizona State contest, returned at Arizona and rushed for 107 yards and a touchdown ... went for 115 yards and a touchdown against UCLA and 116 yards with a score vs. Oregon State ... had two tackles.

2007: Burst onto the scene as a true freshman, seeing action at tailback, as a return man and a gunner on kick coverage ... a first-team All-Pac-10 selection as a special teams player ... named the team's Most Valuable Freshman and also received the J. Scott Duncan Award (Most Valuable Special Teams Player) ... missed the final three games of the season (Washington, Stanford and Air Force) due to a hip injury ... tallied 20 or more yards on 28.0% of his touches (16-of-57 plays) ... burst through tacklers for a season-best 64-yard touchdown run at Colorado State for his first career touchdown ... added his first career receiving touchdown against Louisiana Tech the following game with a 16-yard grab ... had four carries for 46 yards in his college debut against Tennessee ... returned 15 kickoffs for an average of 27.0 yards per effort (second in the Pac-10), including a career-long-tying 54-yarder at UCLA and added 12 others of 20 yards or more ... also a standout special teams gunner with 12 tackles and a fumble recovery.

HIGH SCHOOL: A *SuperPrep* and *Parade Magazine* All-America choice ... rated as the No. 18 running back in the country by *Scout.com* ... selected to the All-Far West team by *SuperPrep* ... *Rivals.com* also tabbed him with a No. 9 ranking at his position and as the No. 11 prospect overall in California ... selected first-team "Best in the West" by the *Long Beach Press-Telegram* ... *PrepStar* national Top-100 prospect ... the consensus Bay Area Offensive Player of the Year ... garnered *CalHiSports.com* first-team All-State honors ... for his career, rushed for 6,428 yards and scored 91 touchdowns ... rushed for 3,325 yards and found the end zone 48 times as a senior, both setting Bay Area single-season prep records ... over 25 percent of his touchdowns were 50 yards or longer as a senior ... ran for 1,444 yards to go along with 271 yards in receptions and 20 total touchdowns for the 12-1 BCAL and Class A CIF North Coast Section champion Chieftains in 2005 as a junior ... had 12 carries for more than 50 yards as a senior and 10 more as a junior, when he averaged 10.4 yards per carry ... also ran track and field, winning a gold medal in the 200 meters at the 2005 USTAF Junior Olympics ... won the 2007 California State Championship in the 100 meter dash with a time of 10.31 and also finished second in the 200 at 20.65.

2009: Selected third-team preseason All-Pac-10

by Phil Steele.

2008: Made a solid contribution in his first season in a Golden Bears' uniform, leading the club with 29 catches and 439 receiving yards (No. 21 Pac-10) for an average of 15.1 yards per catch ... also second on the club with five touchdowns receiving and third with an average of 15.1 yards per reception ... had at least one catch in nine consecutive contests (games 2-10) and 11 of the team's final 12 contests ... posted a career-high-tying four catches three times (at Washington State, at Maryland, at USC) and a career-high 67 yards receiving on only two catches vs. UCLA ... also had three other games with over 50 yards receiving at Maryland (4-64), vs. Oregon (3-56) and vs. Arizona State (3-51) ... caught touchdown passes in back-to-back home games twice (vs. Colorado State and Arizona State; vs. UCLA and Oregon) ... two of his TD receptions were on flea-flickers; the first came vs. UCLA when QB Kevin Riley got the ball back from TB Jahvid Best and hit Boateng for a 53-yard TD, before coralling a 30-yard pass from WR Jeremy Ross at Oregon State for his fifth and final touchdown catch of the season ... also recorded two tackles.

2007: Did not play due to transfer requirements.

AT FLORIDA: Appeared in five games as a true freshman at Florida in 2005 (against Kentucky, Alabama, Mississippi State, Vanderbilt and Iowa) ... recorded four catches for 77 yards and two carries for 16 yards ... had two receptions for 44 yards, including a 28-yarder, against Mississippi State ... tallied a 14-yard run against Alabama ... made his college debut with a 22-yard reception in a win at Kentucky ... did not play in 2006.

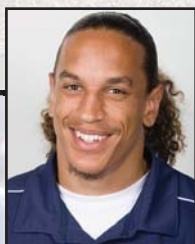

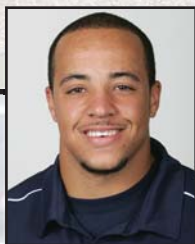
