2005: Saw spot duty during the course of the season ... earned his biggest chunk of playing time against Stanford ... credited with 1.5 pancake blocks and a knockdown block against the Cardinal ... also saw action against Illinois and Washington State.

A tall, athletic defensive back that has seen action at safety and corner ... also a standout special teams player with six career blocked kicks ... has been rated by ESPN's Mel Kiper as the No. 6 pro prospect at safety in the nation ... has been invited to the 2008 Senior Bowl.

2007: Anchored the Golden Bear secondary from his free safety position ... an honorable mention All-Pac-10 selection ... voted the team's defensive MVP and also earned the Andy Smith Award for seeing the most playing time and the Cort Mangers Award as a team captain ... led the team with 116 tackles (fourth in the Pac-10) ... had six double-figure tackle games in 2007 and eight in his career ... tallied 49 tackles in the last four games alone ... paced the Bears with 10 takedowns in the Armed Forces Bowl victory over Air Force ... posted an 11-tackle performance against Stanford ... registered a career-high 16 tackles (13 solo) against Washington ... led the Bears with 12 tackles while forcing a fumble against USC ... also posted 12 tackles in the Oregon State game ... tallied nine tackles (eight solo) against Arizona State ... registered his first career sack and first career interception in the victory over Arizona - his sack caused a fumble that Tyson Alualu recovered for a touchdown ... finished the Arizona game with 10 tackles ... ran down a Tennessee back at the three-yard line and then was part of the goal-line stand which helped preserve the Cal advantage in the season-opening victory.

2006: Led the Bears with 27 tackles in the first four games, but then suffered a knee injury, missing two full games (Oregon State and Oregon) as well as much of the Washington State contest ... finished the year with 45 tackles (20 solo) and was selected as the team's Most Improved Player ... led the Bears with 13 tackles (10 solo) at Tennessee, his second career double-figure tackle game ... logged one of the top blocks of the season against UCLA, taking out two defenders to spring DeSean Jackson for a 72-yard punt return TD ... added seven takedowns against Minnesota ... third on the team with six tackles, including his only tackle for loss of the year, in the Holiday Bowl win over Texas A&M.

2005: Ended the season with 28 tackles in 11 games ... had blocked punts vs. Sacramento State and Oregon and a blocked field goal against New Mexico State ... recorded a team-leading 10 tackles against NMSU to go with the blocked field goal

... tallied four solo stops against Washington State ... was credited with at least one tackle in each game that he played ... had a tackle for a six-yard loss in the win at Washington.

2004: Tallied nine tackles while appearing in 10 of Cal's 12 games off the bench ... blocked an extra-point attempt at Southern Miss that was returned for a defensive PAT by Wendell Hunter ... also blocked kicks at Arizona and at Washington ... recovered a fumble vs. Arizona State.

Closed his Cal career ranked third in career rushing yards (3,220) and tied for second in career 100-yard games (150), despite starting just 17 career games ... his 26 career rushing touchdowns are the fourth-best single-season total at Cal ... has been invited to the 2008 Senior Bowl.

2007: Led the Pac-10 in touchdowns (15, tied for first in a season at Cal) and ranked second in rushing (118.9 yards per game) ... an All-Pac-10 First Team honoree ... earned multiple team honors including the Bear Backer Award as the team's offensive MVP and the Stub Allison Award (Most Inspirational) ... set the Cal school record with 305 rushing attempts in 2007 ... ranked second in single-season rushing ... recorded his ninth 100-yard game of the season with an Armed Forces Bowl-record 140 yards and two touchdowns against Air Force ... tallied 141 rushing yards, including a career-long 58-yard burst, against Washington ... logged a 164-yard performance against USC ... registered 132 yards on a career-best 32 carries against Washington State, capping the evening with a game-clinching 44-yard touchdown run with 2:42 remaining ... against an Oregon State defense which entered the game leading the nation in rushing defense, tallied 150 yards on 28 carries, while running for a TD for the seventh game in a row ... ran for 101 yards on 23 carries against Oregon while scoring a pair of second-half touchdowns ... added 117 yards and two TDs on 23 carries in the Arizona win ... recorded 152 rushing yards on 23 carries (6.6 yards per carry) with a career-best three touchdowns in the victory over Louisiana Tech ... in his first game as the Bears' primary tailback, rushed for 156 yards on 26 carries to go with a touchdown against Tennessee ... Doak Walker Award candidate ... a Pac-10 All-Academic Second Team selection.

2006: Rushed for over 600 yards for the second year in a row ... ran for 124 yards on eight carries (15.5 yards per carry) and a touchdown in the Bears' Holiday Bowl win over Texas A&M ... with Marshawn Lynch injured for the bulk of the Oregon game, rushed for 163 yards, including 146 in the second half and 115 in the fourth quarter, as the Bears ground out the clock in the key victory ... had a season-best 48-yard run in the Duck game ... rushed for 75 yards on 11 carries in the win over Stanford and 78 yards on 12 carries in the Minnesota triumph ... ran for touchdowns against Portland State, Oregon and Washington ... had a nine-yard touchdown reception against Arizona State for his first career receiving score.

2005: Ended the season with 999 rushing yards and an eye-catching 7.6 yards per rush ... ranked seventh in the Pac-10 with 83.2 rushing yards per game ... his 7.6 average yards per carry was second in the nation to Heisman winner Reggie Bush (among America's top 50 rushers) ... finished second on the squad with six rushing touchdowns ... broke the 100-yard rushing mark four times, including a 235-yard effort at New Mexico State, the fourth-best rushing day in Cal history ... ran for 187 yards in the win over Illinois and 153 (including a season-best 57-yard run) in the UCLA game ... added 111 yards on just 12 carries against Washington State ... had a 45-yard run vs. Illinois and a 39-yard jaunt at New Mexico State ... also caught seven passes covering 68 yards during the year and returned four kicks for 70 yards.

2004: Carried the ball seven times for 34 yards and a touchdown in the season opener at Air Force ... recovered a blocked punt in the end zone at Washington for his second touchdown of the season ... tallied a pair of tackles vs. UCLA and one vs.

Oregon on special team coverage units.

High School: Scored 63 touchdowns and rushed for nearly 5,000 yards during his last two seasons, propelling Grace Prep to back-to-back Texas state championships in the private school division ... member of the Dallas Morning News' Area Top 100 Team ... darted for 2,560 yards and 38 TDs as a senior ... also reeled off 2,365 rushing yards and 25 touchdowns as a junior ... named first-team all-state and Most Valuable Player for Class 4A ... earned MVP honors in the Texas All-Star Game ... also participated in basketball and track ... moved to Texas from Mulberry, Fla., after his sophomore year.

2007: Protected Nate Longshore's blind side from his all-important left tackle position ... an honorable mention All-Pac-10 selection ... collected the team's Ken Cotton Award as its most courageous player ... part of a superb offensive line which allowed just 11 sacks in 2007 (best in the Pac-10, fourth in the nation) ... Cal ran for over 2,000 yards including nine individual 100-yard efforts ... helped pave the way to 471 yards of total offense, including 230 on the ground, against Tennessee ... Cal leads the Pac-10 and ranks third in the nation in sacks allowed over the last two years (24) ... missed the Armed Forces Bowl against Air Force due to injury.

2006: An outstanding debut year for the Bears, earning All-Pac-10 Second Team honors after moving into the starting lineup in the fourth game of the year following an injury to Scott Smith ... played in all 13 games with nine starts ... recorded 30.5 knockdown blocks and a team-best 11 cuts.

Community College: Earned All-America honors ... listed as the No. 8 offensive line prospect in the junior college ranks by SuperPrep and the No. 55 player in the country regardless of position by that service ... two-time all-league first-teamer at Solano College ... listed by JC Gridwire.com as the 14th-best two-year player in the country and the fifth-best prospect in California ... ranked as the 14th-best junior college player in the country by Rivals.com.

2006: An impact player in his first year as a starter for the Bears ... ranked fourth on the team with 63 tackles ... also had

a pair of interceptions ... registered a season-best 10 tackles (seven solo) in the win over Oregon State ... snagged an interception on the first play of the Oregon game to set up a quick Cal score as the Bears went on to win big ... collected five tackles and his first career solo sack (for a loss of 11 yards) in the Holiday Bowl win over Texas A&M ... also had nine stops against Minnesota and eight against Arizona State ... credited with six tackles against both USC, Oregon and Tennessee ... also nabbed an interception against the Volunteers.

Closed his career ranked 10th all-time in receptions (136) and 11th in receiving touchdowns (12) despite playing just three seasons after transferring ... has been invited to the 2008 Senior Bowl.

2007: An All-Pac-10 Second Team selection ... has been rated as the No. 1 senior receiver in the country by ESPN's Mel Kiper, Jr. ... led the Bears with 72 catches (fourth in the Pac-10 with 5.53/game) and receiving yards with 872 (third in Pac-10 with 67.1 per game) ... earned the team's Dink Artal Award as the player showing special academic commitment and improvement ... closed his career with just three catches for 17 yards, but one was a key touchdown grab in the first quarter ... snagged seven balls for 63 yards against Stanford ... had three catches for 53 yards including a diving grab in the end zone for a 20-yard touchdown against USC ... matched his career-high with nine catches for 78 yards against Washington State ... monster game against Oregon State with nine catches for 192 yards (sixth-most in school history) including a 64-yard TD reception and a 10-yard scoring grab ... had just two catches against Oregon, but both came on third-and-long and led to Cal touchdowns ... recorded six catches for 95 yards in the win over Arizona ... returned the opening kickoff 90 yards for a touchdown in the victory over Louisiana Tech ... also added seven catches for 87 yards in the win over the Bulldogs ... paced the Golden Bears with seven catches for 90 yards, including a three-yard TD reception, in the win over Tennessee ... also serves as Cal's primary kick returner averaging 22.0 yards per return.

2006: An honorable mention All-Pac-10 selection ... ranked second on the team with 46 catches for 705 yards and five touchdowns ... caught touchdowns in the last three games, including a 32-yard TD catch against Stanford ... had four catches for 33 yards and a four-yard TD grab in the Holiday Bowl win over Texas A&M ... held on to a six-yard touchdown pass against USC after getting hit hard by two Trojans ... caught six passes for 99 yards to lead the Bears against Washington ... was the leading receiver against Oregon State with six receptions for 128 yards and a touchdown ... caught his first touchdown of the season against Arizona State (a 31-yarder to close the first quarter) ... recorded his first career 100-yard receiving game with nine catches for 125 yards, including a 42-yarder, against Minnesota.

2005: Finished his first season as a Bear third on the team in receiving with 18 catches for 171 yards ... missed the season opener while fulfilling NCAA transfer requirements ... lone touchdown of the season was the game winner in the final minutes of the come-from-behind win over Washington State ... ended that game with eight catches for 71 yards ... also returned seven kickoffs for 129 yards ... had a 29-yard return at UCLA and a 24-yarder against the Beavers ... slowed in mid-season by an ankle injury.

Community College: A junior-college SuperPrep All-America selection ... hauled in 23 passes for 525 yards and four touchdowns in only seven games as one of former Cal QB Joe Ayooob's favorite targets on the state runner-up club (22.8 yards per catch) ... also ranked seventh in the state in punt returns in 2004, averaging 15.0 yards on nine attempts ... cranked out 114.7 yards per outing in all-purpose yardage ... caught four passes for 56 yards in CCSF's narrow loss to College of the Canyons in the California community college state championship game ... originally attended LSU in the spring of 2004 before transferring to CCSF.

High School: Parade All-American at Edison High School in Stockton as one of the nation's most recruited wide receivers ... gained more than 1,000 yards receiving and 800 yards rushing as a senior, when he was named the Stockton Record's area player of the year ... caught 53 passes for almost 1,000 yards and 12 touchdowns as a junior, and also collected 75 tackles, four interceptions, three forced fumbles and two sacks at free safety ... Rivals.com ranked him the No. 4 athlete and No. 73 overall player in the United States, and pegged him the No. 10 overall player in the state of California.

2007: Earned first-team All-America honors by the American Football Coaches Association and third-team honors from the Associated Press ... An All-Pac-10 Second Team selection at receiver and at punt returner ... tallied five catches for 84 yards, including a 40-yard TD reception on a difficult twisting catch, in Cal's victory over Air Force in the Armed Forces Bowl ... had five grabs for 88 yards and a touchdown against Arizona State ... snagged nine passes for 136 yards and a pair of touchdowns against UCLA ... registered career-bests of 11 catches and 161 yard, including two impressive touchdown grabs, to lead the Bears to a crucial road victory over No. 11 Oregon ... dazzled fans with a career-best 73-yard end-around TD run in the win over Colorado State ... added to his reputation in the season-opener against Tennessee with 143 yards on just six touches (23.8 yards per touch), including a 77-yard punt return touchdown - his sixth career PR TD...also had a 19-yard run in the win over the Volunteers ... missed the second-half of the Washington game and all of the Stanford game with a bruised thigh ... rated as the No. 1 receiver in the nation by The Sporting News and Rivals.com, as well as the No. 1 special teams player by Rivals in the preseason ... Playboy Magazine Preseason All-American.

2006: A first-team All-Pac-10 selection as a wide receiver and as a punt returner ... first-team All-America punt returner by the Associated Press, Walter Camp Foundation, the Football Writers Association of America, the Sporting News and Rivals.com ... captured the inaugural Randy Moss Award as the top return man in the nation ... led the nation with 18.2 yards per punt return ... ranked second in the Pac-10 with nine receiving touchdowns ... set school and Pac-10 records for season (4) and career punt return TDs (5) with a 95-yarder against Arizona ... had four 100-yard receiving games ... registered 28 plays of 20 or more yards ... Cal's top receiver against Arizona, catching six passes for 131 yards, including a career-long 62-yard TD, while returning a kickoff 26 yards to finish with 285 all-purpose yards ... had a 72-yard punt return for a TD against UCLA and caught three passes for 58 yards, including a 34-yarder ... collected seven passes for 127 yards against Stanford, including a 44-yard reception ... registered a 65-yard punt return TD and a 36-yard TD catch against Oregon ... tallied a team-best seven catches for 74 yards and a touchdown against Oregon State ... returned a punt 80 yards for a touchdown against Arizona State ... also had four catches for 67 yards, including a 52-yarder, and a TD against the Sun Devils ... recorded 103 yards on five catches against Portland State ... hooked up with Nate Longshore for three touchdowns against Minnesota as he finished with 114 yards receiving ... tallied a team-best 87 receiving yards on four catches against Tennessee, including a 40-yard catch-dodge-and-run for a TD ... led the Bears with five catches for 81 yards in the Holiday Bowl victory over Texas A&M.

2005: Led the Bears with 38 catches and 601 yards ... also topped Cal with seven touchdown receptions ... first career reception (and first collegiate touch of the football) resulted in a 31-yard touchdown vs. Sacramento State in the season opener ... his first collegiate punt return came in the same game and he took it 49 yards for another touchdown ... credited with nine catches for 130 yards and a touchdown against New Mexico State and 10 catches for 128 yards and a TD against UCLA ... in the bowl game against BYU, tallied six catches for 130 yards and two touchdowns with the TD grabs covering 42 and 22 yards ... longest reception of the year was a 56-yard TD grab at Stanford for the first score of the game ... had a season-best run of 17 yards at UCLA ... missed the Washington State game due to injury.

High School: One of the premier high school wide receivers in the nation ... Parade Magazine All-American ... named the 2004 Glenn Davis Award winner by the Los Angeles Times as Southern California's player of the year ... flagged down 60 passes for 1,075 yards for Long Beach Poly's CIF Southern Section championship team ... scored 15 touchdowns, eight which measured at least 60 yards or more, including two on punt returns ... voted Most Valuable Player of the U.S. Army All-American Bowl in San Antonio, as he had seven receptions for 141 yards and passed for a 45-yard touchdown in leading the West squad to a 35-3 victory in a game that featured 80 of the nation's top players ... sparkled in the CaliFlorida Bowl game, posting five catches for 145 yards and one touchdown ... ESPN.com's Tom Lemming rated him as the No. 4 wide receiver in the country, PrepStar selected him an All-American and a member of its Dream Team Top 100 players, and Calhisports.com voted him the 2004 Mr. Football State Player of the Year ... SuperPrep ranked him No. 21 in its Elite 50 players in the nation and No. 4 player in the state of California ... Rivals.com rated him the No. 3 player in the Golden State and the No. 32 player in the USA ... in the CIF title game, he was a last-minute replacement on defense and responded with two interceptions, one which he returned 68 yards for a touchdown to help fuel Long Beach Poly's 21-6 victory over Los Alamitos High ... as a junior, hunted down 43 passes for 821 yards and 11 touchdowns in earning first team accolades ... a two-time member of the famed Long Beach Press-Telegram "Best in the West" first team.
