Kickoff – Nevada at Cal (Sat., Sept. 1, 12 p.m. PDT)

California opens the 2012 campaign by returning to Memorial Stadium and taking on Nevada on Saturday, Sept. 1, with kickoff scheduled for noon. The contest will be the first-ever Cal football game broadcast on the recently launched Pac-12 Networks. The Golden Bears return home to Memorial Stadium after calling San Francisco's AT&T Park their temporary home for the 2011 season. Cal is coming off of a 7-6 campaign in 2011 that was capped with the Bears' third trip to the Holiday Bowl since 2004. Cal welcomes Nevada to Memorial Stadium for the first time since 1996, a 33-15 victory for the Bears. The teams have only met one other time since 1996, a 52-31 win by Nevada in Reno during the 2010 season. The Cal offense and defense both bring back five starters from a year ago that are slated to start again in 2012. Quarterback Zach Maynard, tailback Isi Sofele and wide receiver Keenan Allen were big playmakers a year ago, while Matt Summers-Gavin and Brian Schwenke are back on the offensive line. Cal's five starters back on defense include the team's active career leading in tackles in defensive back Josh Hill. Marc Anthony and Steve Williams also return to the secondary, while defensive linemen Aaron Tipoti and linebacker Chris McCain are the other returning starters back in the starting lineup.

Quick Hitters

- Cal returns to a renovated Memorial Stadium for its 2012 home schedule after playing its 2011 home games at AT&T Park. The last game played at Memorial Stadium was a 16-13 loss to Washington on Nov. 27, 2010. The last Cal win at Memorial Stadium was a 50-17 win over Arizona State on Oct. 23, 2010.
- Cal features a preseason All-American and National Player of the Year candidate in wide receiver Keenan Allen, who is one of four first-team preseason All-Pac-12 picks on the Bears' roster along with defensive lineman Deandre Coleman, offensive lineman Matt Summers-Gavin and defensive lineman Aaron Tipoti.
- Cal has eight players on watch lists for national awards with Allen leading the way on a total of six (Biletnikoff Award, CFPA Special Teams Trophy, CFPA Wide Receiver Trophy, Maxwell Award, Paul Hornung Award, Walter Camp Player of the Year). Isi Sofele is on three (CFPA Running Back Trophy), Doak Walker Award, Maxwell Award), while Brendan Bigelow (CFPA Special Teams Trophy), Summers-Gavin (Outland Trophy), Coleman (Ted Hendricks Award) and Aaron Tipoti (Outland Trophy) are on one each. - Cal has played in a bowl game in eight of the last nine seasons, while winning enough games to be bowl eligible and posting winning seasons in nine of the last 10.
- Cal is coming off a 2011 season in which the Bears reached the Holiday Bowl, finished 7-6 overall, and were 4-5 in the Pac-12's North Division.
- Cal's Jeff Tedford is one win away from his 80th career victory with the Bears as he begins his 11th season at Cal and is the longest-tenured head coach in the Pac-12.

Back In Berkeley – Memorial Stadium Reopens in 2012

Since it opened in the fall of 1923, Memorial Stadium has produced scores of unforgettable memories for generations of Golden Bears. From the Wonder Teams of the 1920s to the Pappy Waldorf years mid-century to the current success attained under head coach Jeff Tedford, the facility has treated fans of all ages to many of the greatest moments in the history of Cal football. It stands as one of the most enduring symbols of the University of California campus and has served as a gathering point for students, alumni, faculty, staff and other supporters for nearly 90 years.

This fall, the historic building begins a new era following an extensive retrofit and renovation that brings it up to modern standards for fans and student-athletes alike, creating a more enjoyable environment for the hundreds of thousands of people who visit and partake in games every year – all while maintaining the architecture and character of the celebrated stadium.

Major construction on the \$321 million project got underway in December 2010, and barely 21 months later, the Golden Bears are able to call Memorial Stadium home once again.

The Renovation of Memorial Stadium

Preliminary work on the project, including installation of temporary bracing around the outer wall, hazardous material removal and interior demolition, began in June 2010. Major construction got underway in December 2010, starting with demolition of the interior bowl, soil excavation and wall shoring. The stadium is game-ready to host Cal football in September 2012, with work completed in early 2013.

The \$321 million renovation, which impacts all but the outer wall and the east-side seating area, capitalizes on the expertise of seismic engineers and campus experts that found a unique solution to protect the stadium and its users in case of an earthquake. Design features include concrete “seismic blocks” at the end zone where the Hayward Fault bisects the facility and a press box that can sway in a large-scale temblor. The solution came as a result of collaboration between the campus Seismic Review Committee, the architectural team and the structural engineers hired for the job.

The significant number of upgrades to the facility include three club levels for those participating in the Endowment Seating Program, a new press box, wider concourses, improved ADA access, and more restrooms and concession stands. Capacity has been reduced from 71,799 seats to just over 63,186.

The History of Memorial Stadium

Originally completed in November 1923, Memorial Stadium is dedicated to University of California, Berkeley students, alumni and other Californians who lost their lives in World War I. Cal boasts an all-time record of 317-213-16 (.595) at Memorial Stadium. The Bears have enjoyed 12 undefeated home campaigns, including three during the Jeff Tedford era (2004, 2006, 2008). Cal has twice won eight home games in a season (1924, 1938). The Bears went 4-3 at Memorial Stadium in 2010, the last season before the renovation. Cal was 4-1 in their 2011 temporary home at AT&T Park. Memorial Stadium is also home to one of the most memorable moments in college football history – “The Play” – Cal’s five-lateral kickoff return on the final play of the 1982 Big Game to beat Stanford.

Cal-Nevada Series History

Cal leads the all-time series with Nevada, 22-2-1 (not including an additional 7-1 mark against the Wolf Pack from 1906-14 when both schools played rugby instead of football). The teams have played only twice since 1945, a 33-15 Cal win in Berkeley on Sept. 21, 1996, and a 52-31 victory by Nevada in Reno on Sept. 17, 2010. Cal had previously won 12 straight in the series since a scoreless tie between the schools on Nov. 3, 1923.

Difficult Schedule With No Bye Week

The Bears never take a back seat when it comes to putting top-notch opponents on the schedule every year and the 2012 season is certainly no different. Four teams on Cal's schedule have earned preseason national rankings as the Bears will visit USC (No. 1 AP/No. 3 USA Today), host Oregon (No. 5 AP/USA Today) and Stanford (No. 18 USA Today/No. 21 AP), and travel to Ohio State (No. 18 USA Today). Of the seven teams to visit Berkeley – Nevada, Arizona State, UCLA, Stanford, Washington, Oregon – six participated in a bowl game in 2011. Cal has a strength of schedule ranking of No. 15 according to Phil Steele.

As if the tough opponents weren't enough of a challenge, the Bears won't get a break in the schedule because their bye week doesn't come until the final week of the regular season. Cal will play 12 weeks straight with one game that won't be played on a Saturday (Friday, Nov. 2 vs. Washington).

Cal Strong In Season Openers

Cal has an all-time record of 73-40-4 in season openers over the first 117 campaigns of Cal football (excluding 12 seasons when the Bears played rugby rather than football from 1882-95 and 1906-14). Cal has won five straight season openers and seven of its last eight, most recently with a 36-21 victory over Fresno State in the Battle by the Bay at Candlestick Park in 2011. The most recent season opener at Memorial Stadium was a 52-3 triumph over UC Davis in 2010 that extended the Bears' record in home season openers since head coach Jeff Tedford arrived prior to the 2002 campaign to 6-0. The Bears also have home victories over Baylor (2002), Sacramento State (2005), Tennessee (2007), Michigan State (2008) and Maryland (2009) during the period. Cal is 8-2 overall in season openers under Tedford, also with a victory at Air Force (2004), and losses at Kansas State (2003) and Tennessee (2006).

Home Field Advantage

Cal had a 37-9 record in its last 46 games at Memorial Stadium before the venue's renovation moved the Bears to AT&T Park for their 2011 home games. Cal responded by posting a 4-1 record in its temporary home and has now won 41 of its last 51 home games overall.

A Decade of Sustained Success Under Tedford

Cal averaged eight wins per year in the first nine seasons (2002-10) under head coach Jeff Tedford and ranked tied for third among Pac-10 teams in victories during that period. After a brief one-year absence in 2010, Tedford led the Bears back to the bowl scene in 2011 with a trip to the Holiday Bowl against Texas. It was Cal's third appearance in the Holiday Bowl with Tedford at the helm. Below is a look at Cal's year-by-year results and bowl appearances in the Tedford era.

Bowling and Winning Bears

Cal has played in bowls in eight of the last nine seasons, posting a school-record bowl game streak of seven consecutive seasons from 2003-09 and a school-record-tying string of eight consecutive winning campaigns from 2002-09 before both came to an end in 2010. However, the Bears started new streaks in both categories with a return to the bowl scene in 2011 by playing in the Holiday Bowl. Cal has posted a 5-3 (.625) record in bowl games in the Jeff Tedford era that also included a school-record four straight bowl wins from 2005-08. Cal won enough games to be bowl eligible but was ineligible to play in a bowl game in 2002 for NCAA sanctions imposed prior to the arrival of Tedford.

New Coaches and Coaching Responsibilities in 2012

Head coach Jeff Tedford has brought in a pair of new coaches for the 2012 season in Wes Chandler (wide receivers) and Todd Howard (defensive line). Also, Marcus Arroyo has added pass game coordinator to his title while he will continue to work with the team's quarterbacks. Kenwick Thompson is also now an associate head coach in addition to his job as the team's linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator.

Chandler has spent 25 seasons in professional football, including stints as an assistant coach with the Cleveland Browns, Dallas Cowboys and Minnesota Vikings. He has also coached at both the collegiate and high school levels.

Howard has a combined 20 years of coaching experience at the NFL and collegiate levels, and joins the Bears after being a member of the Washington State coaching staff as the defensive line coach in 2011, where he tutored second-team All-Pac-12 selection Travis Long on a vastly improved Cougar team. He was also at UCLA for five seasons from 2006-10.

All Eyes on Keenan Allen

Wide receiver Keenan Allen has been Cal's most decorated player prior to the 2012 season, earning nearly unanimous preseason All-American accolades and is on several national watch lists also including the Biletnikoff Award, Maxwell Award and Walter Camp Player of the Year given annually to college football's top receiver and player. He has also been named a second-team preseason All-American.

Allen caught 98 passes for 1,343 receiving yards and six touchdowns in 2011, with the receptions and receiving yards both ranking second on Cal's all-time single season lists behind school record holders Dameane Douglas (100 receptions in 1998) and Geoff McArthur (1,504 receiving yards in 2003). He returns the fourth-highest per-game averages from 2011 of all active Football Bowl Subdivision (FBS) players for both receptions (7.54) and receiving yards (103.31).

Allen has career totals of 144 receptions, 1,833 receiving yards and 11 touchdown catches in two seasons at Cal. His 144 career receptions are only 58 shy of all-time school leader Geoff McArthur's career total of 202 from 2000-04, while he will start the 2012 season 1,355 receiving yards short of McArthur's career total of 3,188. In addition, Allen has caught a pass in all 24 games he's played in since first arriving in Berkeley in 2010.

Zach Maynard Returns for Second Season as Starting QB

Zach Maynard completed 231-of-405 (57.0%) of his passes for 2,990 yards, with 17 touchdowns and 12 interceptions for a 126.98 quarterback rating in his first season as Cal's starting quarterback in 2011. Maynard finished third on Cal's all-time single-season list, finishing only 10 yards shy of becoming the third Cal passer to ever throw for 3,000 yards in a season. In addition, Maynard's additional 108 yards rushing brought his total offense yardage to 3,098 yards, also third on the school's single-season list.

Maynard came on strong at the end of the regular season as evidenced by the dramatic rise in his completion percentage, touchdown to interception ratio and quarterback rating. Over the last four regular-season games, he completed 68.1 percent of passes, threw five touchdowns to one interception, and posted a 154.25 rating.

The Dynamic Duo

Tailback Isi Sofele and C.J. Anderson combined for 1,667 rushing yards and 18 touchdowns on the ground last season, giving Cal a ninth consecutive campaign with 1,500 or more yards rushing by its top running backs.

Sofele also gave Cal its' ninth 1,000-yard rusher in the last 10 years by leading the team with 1,322 yards and 10 touchdowns on the ground on 252 carries to rank sixth on the school's single-season list for rushing yardage. His 101.69 yards per-game rushing average ranked fifth in the Pac-12 and 22nd nationally. Sofele had five 100-yard rushing games and posted at least 74 yards rushing in 11 of his 13 contests in 2011.

Anderson came on strong at the end of the year and finished second to Sofele with 345 yards rushing and eight scores on the ground on 72 carries. He had 195 of his rushing yards over the team's final four regular-season contests.

Helping lead the way for Sofele and Anderson in 2012 will be fullback Eric Stevens who returns for his senior season in 2012 after missing all of last year with an injury. Stevens recorded his lone collegiate touchdown against Nevada in 2010 on a four-yard pass from quarterback Kevin Riley.

There is plenty of talent in the backfield as Brendan Bigelow and Daniel Lasco figure to be in the mix, as well. Playing on special teams primarily last season, Bigelow notched Cal's only kickoff return for a touchdown in 2011 against Presbyterian.

Hagan, Rodgers, Wark Look Forward to Two-Tight End Sets

This past June, Jeff Tedford trekked to New England to visit with Bill Belichick and the New England Patriots, specifically to discuss how the Patriots use two tight ends in their offense. Tedford wants to maximize the abilities of three receiving tight ends that he has at his arsenal in sophomore Richard Rodgers, Spencer Hagan and Jacob Wark.

Summers-Gavin and Schwenke Anchor O-Line

One of the key factors why Cal has produced so many 1,000-yard rushers during the Jeff Tedford era has been the solid play from the offensive line, guided by offensive coordinator and offensive line coach Jim Michalczyk. The Bears lost some key linemen from last season – Mitchell Schwartz and Justin Cheadle – but returning to the trenches in 2012 are seniors Matt Summers-Gavin and Brian Schwenke. Experience is definitely on the side of Summers-Gavin and Schwenke. Summers-Gavin has started 25 games in the previous three years, which are the most among Cal's active players, one ahead of the 24 starts recorded by Schwenke. Last season, Summers-Gavin started all 13 of the team's games at right tackle protecting the back side of left handed starting quarterback Zach Maynard. Schwenke and Summers-Gavin are both candidates for national and All-America honors.

Two-Time League Leaders In Total And Pass Defense

Cal has led the Pac-12 in total defense and pass defense each of the past two seasons, utilizing a balanced attack and creative schemes to create pressure and make the Bears one of the top big-play teams in the country. Cal was first in the conference and seventh nationally in tackles for loss in 2011, while ranking third in the league and 19th nationally in sacks. Cal led the league and ranked 13th nationally in sacks in 2010.

Experienced Trio In Defensive Backfield

The most experience Cal has returning on the defensive side of the ball comes in the defensive backfield, where Josh Hill, Marc Anthony, and Steve Williams have combined to play in 91 games with 58 starts during their collegiate careers. After seeing most of his action as a nickel back a year ago, the versatile Hill is expected to move into a starting safety role. Anthony and Williams return as the team's starting corners. Both Anthony and Hill had big games the last time Cal played Nevada in 2010. Anthony was second among Cal players in the game with nine tackles, while Hill was right behind him with eight. Both players also had a half tackle for loss.

Josh Hill and Marc Anthony – Active Career Leaders

With the departure of Mychal Kendricks, Cal's active leading tackler is now defensive back Josh Hill. The starting safety who has played in 36 career games with 20 starts either set or tied his career high in every defensive category other than fumble recoveries in 2011. Last season against Utah, Hill garnered his fourth career interception and returned it 32 yards for his first collegiate touchdown. Hill isn't the only member of Cal's defensive backfield to be one of the team's active career leaders. Marc Anthony, who has played in 30 career games with 22 starts, is Cal's active career leader in passes defended (21) and pass breakups (18).

Tipoti, Payne Lead Defensive Line in 2012

New defensive line coach Todd Howard will have a lot of weapons to work with on the defensive line, with Aaron Tipoti, Kendrick Payne and Deandre Coleman leading the way as the projected starters. Tipoti received the most recognition in the 2012 preseason. He is on the watch list for the Outland Trophy given to the nation's top interior lineman and also a first-team preseason All-Pac-12 selection by Phil Steele. Tipoti has played in 33 career games with 10 starts. In 2011, he posted career-highs of 25 tackles, 4.0 tackles for loss (-22 yards), 1.5 sacks (-15 yards) and one pass breakup, while tying a career-best with one forced fumble. Payne appeared in all 13 games in 2011 with four starts. He registered a career-high 16 tackles, 3.0 tackles for loss (career-high -15 yards) and a career-high 2.0 sacks (-12 yards), including a career-high four tackles and 1.0 tackle for loss on the third sack of his career vs. Washington State. In addition to Tipoti and Payne, Howard expects a breakout campaign from Coleman, who played in every game last year and is on the watch list for the Hendricks Award. Coleman contributed career highs of 19 tackles, 6.0 tackles for loss (-23 yards) and 2.0 sacks (-15 yards) in 2011. Cal was first in the conference and seventh nationally in tackles for loss in 2011, while ranking third in the league and 19th nationally in sacks.

Fortt Finds a New Home

Former Penn State linebacker Khairi Fortt transferred to Cal prior to the 2012 season. Due to the recent NCAA sanctions against the Nittany Lions' football program, Fortt immediately became eligible to play in 2012 for the Golden Bears. Fortt, who finished 2012 spring practice listed as Penn State's co-starter at middle linebacker, played in 22 contests with one start over the last two seasons for the Nittany Lions after enrolling at the school in January of 2010. He compiled two-year totals of 50 tackles, 6.5 tackles for loss (-23 yards) and 2.5 sacks (-16 yards).

New Faces Among Specialists

After four seasons of Bryan Anger and Giorgio Tavecchio handling most of the team's punting and placekicking duties, respectively, the Bears will have an all new look in the kicking game in 2012. True freshman Cole Leininger has been listed on the post-training camp depth chart as the starting punter, while veteran Vincenzo D'Amato is expected to handle the team's placekicking duties after sharing them with Tavecchio as a true freshman in 2009. The team's long snapper and holder will also be new, with John Sheperdson listed as the long snapper and Jackson Bouza as the holder.

Sofele, Hurrell and Galas Have Played Every Game

There are three members on the 2012 Golden Bear squad who have played in every game during their tenure at Cal – tailback Isi Sofele, linebacker J.P. Hurrell and offensive lineman Dominic Galas. All three have played in all 38 games the past three seasons. Sofele took over as the team's starting tailback last season, posting a 1,000-yard season (1,322). Hurrell was recently named a starter for the first time in his collegiate career after spending most of the last three seasons as one of the Bears' top special teams' players and a backup linebacker who has 35 career tackles and a fumble recovery on his resume. The previous three years, Hurrell was playing behind current NFL players Mike Mohamed and Mychal Kendricks at linebacker. Galas started all 13 of the team's games at center in 2011 and had been slated to be the starting right guard in 2012 before an injury suffered while lifting weights in July will force him to miss several games at the start of his senior campaign.

Bears As the Best, Against The Best

Cal is 15-8 when playing as a top-10 team and 36-21 when ranked in the top 25 of at least one set of rankings since head coach Jeff Tedford took over in 2002. Cal has played 33 nationally ranked teams during the Tedford era and posted a 13-20 record in those contests. In 2009, the Bears recorded back-to-back wins in consecutive weeks over nationally ranked teams for the first time since 1950, defeating No. 18 Arizona at Memorial Stadium before winning at No. 14 Stanford, but has dropped six consecutive games against ranked teams since. Cal has four games scheduled against opponents ranked in the preseason top 25 in 2012 – Sept. 15 at Ohio State (No. 18 AP), Sept. 22 at USC (No. 1 AP/No. 3 USA Today), Oct. 20 vs. Stanford (No. 18 USA Today/No. 21 AP) and Nov. 10 vs. Oregon (No. 5 AP/No. 5 USA Today). Prior to not being ranked during the 2011 campaign, Cal had been among the nation's top 25 teams at one point in each of the previous seven seasons and eight times in nine campaigns from 2002-10.

Score 30 Points, Usually Win

Cal is 61-5 all-time when putting 30 points or more on the scoreboard under head coach Jeff Tedford, with a 6-0 mark last season. Cal scored 30 or more points in six of its seven victories in 2011, with the wins coming over Presbyterian (63), Arizona State (47), Colorado (36), Fresno State (36), Utah (34) and Washington State (30). The Bears had won 30 consecutive games when they scored at least 30 points prior to a 52-31 loss at Nevada on Sept. 17, 2010. When the Bears don't score at least 30 points, their record under Tedford is 18-43, including a 1-6 mark in 2011 with losses to Stanford (28), Washington (23), Oregon (15), at UCLA (14), Texas (10) and vs. USC (9). The Bears defeated Oregon State, 23-6, despite not scoring 30 or more points.

Turnover Margin a Key

The turnover battle has been emphasized since head coach Jeff Tedford's arrival at Cal in 2002 and rightly so. The Bears are 45-8 when committing fewer turnovers than opponents during the Tedford era, compared to 17-10 when tied and 17-29 when opponents win the battle. In conference games, Cal is 28-6 with a positive margin in turnovers, 10-7 when the turnover table is tied and 10-24 with a deficit. However, the numbers last season did not follow the trend quite as strongly as in previous seasons. The Bears won three games in 2011 (Fresno State, at Colorado, Washington State) despite not winning the turnover battle. Cal did win the turnover battle in victories over Presbyterian, Utah, Oregon State and Arizona State. Turnovers played a critical role in losses against USC, at UCLA and in the Holiday Bowl against Texas with Cal turning the ball over a season-high-tying five times in all three of those losses. Cal also turned the ball over twice in a loss at Stanford, while the Cardinal turned it over only once. Cal won the turnover battle twice (at Washington, at Oregon) in its five losses.

Cal's Nevada Connections

- Senior offensive lineman Dominic Galas' younger brother, Matt, is a sophomore offensive lineman on Nevada. Both brothers wear No. 65. Their father, Tim, played football for Cal from 1979-82 and was a three-year letterwinner on the offensive line.
- Sophomore offensive lineman Geoffrey Gibson is Cal's lone native of the state of Nevada. Gibson is from Las Vegas.

Cal in the NFL

Cal has a total of 39 players on NFL rosters as of August 27, 2012, which is the second-most among Pac-12 schools behind only USC. Cal has now had 40 NFL Draft selections in the 10 drafts held since Jeff Tedford coached his first game at Cal in 2002, including eight first-rounders. Six former Cal players were chosen in the 2012 NFL Draft. The six draft selections tied for the second-most ever by Cal, who also had six players picked in both the 1977 and 2008 drafts. A school-record 10 Cal players were chosen in 1952. Offensive lineman Mitchell Schwartz (Cleveland Browns – No. 37 overall) and linebacker Mychal Kendricks (Philadelphia Eagles – No. 46 overall) were selected in the second round, followed by punter Bryan Anger (Jacksonville Jaguars – No. 70 overall) in the third round. Wide receiver Marvin Jones (Cincinnati Bengals – No. 166 overall) was taken in the fifth round. Defensive back D.J. Campbell (Carolina Panthers – No. 216 overall) and defensive lineman Trevor Guyton (Minnesota Vikings – No. 219 overall) were picked in the seventh round. Other players from the 2011 squad that signed as undrafted free agents and remain with teams include defensive back Sean Cattouse (San Diego Chargers), linebacker D.J. Holt (Washington Redskins) and defensive lineman Ernest Owusu (signed originally with Minnesota Vikings, now with Cleveland Browns).

Academic Prowess Continues

Cal has posted 103 Pac-12 All-Academic honors in the first 10 seasons under head coach Jeff Tedford, second-most in the conference during that span. Nine Cal student-athletes were honored on the 2011 Pac-12 All-Academic Football Team, including four first-team selections in Mark Brazinski, Ernest Owusu, Mitchell Schwartz and John Tyndall.

In 2008, Alex Mack earned the Draddy Trophy (later renamed the Campbell Trophy) honoring college football's top scholar-athlete, while Mohamed was a finalist for the honor often referred to as the Academic Heisman in 2010 after earlier being given an NFF Scholar-Athlete Award. Giorgio Tavecchio was a semifinalist for the honor and a candidate for an NFF Scholar-Athlete Award in 2011.

A three-time member of the Pac-10/12 all-academic team, Matt Summers-Gavin is a candidate for the Senior Class Award and the Campbell Trophy presented by the National Football Foundation.

2012 National Signing Day

Cal put together a top 15 signing class for the third straight year with its 2012 class ranking as high as No. 15 according to MaxPreps, while ESPN (No. 22), Rivals (No. 23) and 247Sports (No. 25) also had the Bears in the top 25. Cal's 2011 group ranked as high as No. 13 in the nation by Scout and its 2010 class was No. 11 according to Rivals. Head coach Jeff Tedford was named the Sporting News Recruiter of the Year in 2011.

Pac-12 Preseason Media Poll

Cal was picked to finish fourth in the North division of the annual preseason poll of media members who cover the league. Oregon (North) and USC (South) were picked to win their respective divisions, both picking up 117 of 123 first-place votes, with the Trojans the choice to win the league's championship game. Oregon (732 points) was followed in the North division voting by Stanford (533), Washington (502), Cal (382), Washington State (228) and Oregon State (205), with Stanford (5) and Cal (1) garnering the other first-place votes. USC (729) was followed by Utah (514), UCLA (435), Arizona (385), Arizona State (353) and Colorado (164) in the South division voting, with Arizona State (3), UCLA (2) and Utah (1) picking up the first-place votes not awarded to the Trojans.

Cal football players train in the Simpson Center for Student-Athlete High Performance, a revolutionary student-athlete training, coaching, and applied sports science and sports medicine center that opened in January of 2012. The Simpson Center embodies the High Performance Initiative (HPI), Cal's innovative performance philosophy designed to build competitive advantage, maximize efficiency and enhance the student-athlete experience.

A 142,000 square-foot facility, the Simpson Center is a state-of-the-art complex with year-round access for over 450 student-athletes. The Simpson Center is home to the locker rooms, meeting rooms and offices for Cal football and 12 Golden Bear Olympic sports for use on a daily basis. The 25-yard turf area is used for warm-ups, plyometrics, short agility work, medicine ball throws, rehabilitation and much more. Spin, Pilates, yoga and back classes are among the activities that take place in the fitness studio.

Other features in the Simpson Center include a training room, rehabilitation facilities including underwater and AlterG treadmills, cold plunges, a medical suite, dining and nutrition and academic support area, team meeting room, locker room and player lounge – all just a few steps away.

Headquartered in San Francisco's SOMA district, Pac-12 Enterprises is the new content and multiplatform media company for the Pac-12 Conference, a leader in collegiate athletics that includes 12 of the most prestigious universities in the world. With a nation-leading 451 NCAA titles across 27 sports, the Pac-12 has earned its preeminent position as the "Conference of Champions."

Pac-12 Enterprises was created in 2011 to develop and launch the Pac-12 Networks and Pac-12 Digital, and to control the distribution of the Pac-12 intellectual property rights in sports, and other Conference initiatives.

A total of 46 Golden Bear athletes, coaches and staff members represented Cal during the 2012 Summer Olympics in London, and together, they brought home a school-record tying 17 medals (11 gold, 1 silver, 5 bronze). The Bears have won 50 medals over the past three Olympics (16 in 2004, 17 in 2008, 17 in 2012), and they have captured 178 medals all-time (99 gold).

Jeff Tedford

Head Coach • 11th Season at Cal (79-48, .622)

Jeff Tedford has established Cal as one of the elite football programs in the Pac-12 and lifted the Golden Bears into the national discussion on a consistent basis. The Bears have won the third-most Pac-10/12 games during his first 10 seasons on the job, have finished ranked among the nation's top 25 in four of the last eight seasons and been in the top 10 at some point in five of the past eight campaigns.

Cal posted a school-record run of seven straight bowl appearances from 2003-09 and is 5-3 in the postseason under Tedford. He is the only Cal mentor with more than two bowl victories, including a school-record string of four consecutive postseason wins from 2005-08. Tedford guided the Bears back to the bowl scene in 2011 with a trip to the Holiday Bowl. The Bears also put together a school-record-tying eight consecutive winning campaigns from 2002-09. Cal has twice posted a school-record-tying 10 wins under Tedford, the sixth and seventh times in school history, in 2004 and 2006.

Tedford boasts Cal's all-time record for victories with a 79-48 (.622) all-time mark at the school, surpassing the former record holder Andy Smith (74-16-7, 1916-25) last season. Tedford has now coached 127 games at Cal, setting the school record for most games coached during the 2010 campaign. Only two others – Pappy Waldorf (103, 1947-56) and Stub Allison (102, 1935-44) – have coached 100 games at Cal. Tedford also already has the school record with 26 road wins and is an impressive 48-38 (.558) in conference games. To top it off, he is 7-3 in the Big Game, equaling Waldorf's school record of seven wins against Stanford.

In his first 10 seasons as Cal's head coach, the Bears have had 40 players selected in the NFL Draft, including eight first-round picks. As of August 27, 2012, Cal's 41 active NFL players according to ESPN.com rank second among Pac-12 schools.

He has also earned a reputation as a strong recruiter, with each of his last three classes from 2010-12 being ranked in the top 15 nationally. Prior to the 2011 campaign, Sporting News bestowed the honor of the Pac-12's best recruiter on Tedford.

All of this at the head of a program that won just one game in 2001, the year prior to his arrival. The Cal football renaissance over the past decade rates as one of the most impressive turnarounds in college football history.

But Tedford's teams have not only got it done on the field, they've also got

it done in the classroom. His players have been recognized as Pac-12 All-Academic honorees 103 times since his arrival. Of the 202 seniors who played for Tedford in his first nine seasons, 178 (88%) earned their college degrees and/or have gone on to NFL careers.

Nationally, Cal has also had multiple Heisman Trophy candidates under Tedford, including J.J. Arrington (2004), Marshawn Lynch (2006), DeSean Jackson (2007) and Jahvid Best (2009).

Other national recognition has come the Bears way in recent years. Alex Mack was the winner of the 2008 Draddy Award (often referred to as the "academic Heisman"), while Mike Mohamed was one of 16 players across the country in the 2010 National Football Foundation's Scholar-Athlete Class of 2010 and a finalist for the prestigious honor won by Mack now known as the William V. Campbell Trophy. In 2006, the Bears had a pair of players collect national awards. Jackson was the recipient of the inaugural Randy Moss Award as the top returner in the country, while Daymeion Hughes earned The Lott IMPACT Trophy, given to a defensive player to equally recognize his athletic performance and personal character.

Despite his success as a coach and mentor, Tedford still follows a basic philosophy.

"We try to focus on one game at a time and try to reach our full potential," Tedford said emphatically.

And he still values each and every member of his football team.

"Whether it is the guys who are suited up, the guys who are going to play 50-60 plays or the guys who aren't going to play at all, I want them all to understand that they are very important to the success of the program," he said. "Their contributions are invaluable."

Tedford's hard work and dedication not only inspire his players, it has also made him a role model to the young men in the Cal program.

"Coach Tedford wasn't just a coach, I think of him as more like a father figure," said All-Pac-10 linebacker and current NFL player Desmond Bishop, who was a key player on the Packers' Super Bowl XLV winning squad. "He taught us lessons about life. He taught us to have integrity, to have character. He prepared us to be men."

RENO – Colin Kaepernick ran for 148 yards and three touchdowns and passed for 181 yards and two more scores in Nevada's 52-31 victory over California. Marlon Johnson scored on a 65-yard interception return, and Vai Taua added 151 yards rushing.

Shane Vereen ran for a career-high 198 yards and three touchdowns for the Bears. Cal was without linebacker Mike Mohamed, the Pac-10's leading tackler a year ago who was out with a sprained toe. Cal entered the game leading the nation in fewest yards allowed averaging 161.9 per game. But Nevada had 297 by the half while holding Cal to only 136 as the Wolf Pack scored on four of their six possessions for a 24-14 lead.

On the first series of the second half, Vereen ran 50 yards for a touchdown to pull Cal to 24-21. Nevada went three and out on the next series, but six plays later Johnson stepped in front of Cal quarterback Kevin Riley's quick out intended for Alex Lagemann and raced 65 yards down the sideline for a 31-21 lead.

Marvin Jones had career highs of 12 receptions and 161 receiving yards for Cal.

- Senior offensive lineman Dominic Galas' younger brother, Matt, is a sophomore offensive lineman on Nevada. Both brothers wear No. 65. They're father, Tim, played football for Cal from 1979-82 and was a three-year letterwinner on the offensive line.

- A win over Nevada would give Jeff Tedford 80 wins as head coach at Cal. Tedford became Cal's all-time winningest head coach when the Bears defeated Presbyterian in 2011

- Keenan Allen has caught a pass in all 24 games he has played at Cal and looks to extend that streak to 25 in the season opener.

- Cal has won seven of its last eight season openers, most recently with a 36-21 victory over Fresno State in the Battle by the Bay at Candlestick Park in 2011. The most recent season opener at Memorial Stadium was a 52-3 triumph over UC Davis in 2010 that extended the Bears' record in home season openers since head coach Jeff Tedford arrived prior to the 2002 campaign to 6-0.

Cal football will conduct postgame interviews in the Tahir Family Team Theater inside the Simpson Center for Student-Athlete High Performance. A member of the Athletic Communication staff will lead media to the room at the conclusion of each game.

Cal head coach Jeff Tedford will be present to answer questions, followed by players and coaches requested by media members. Visiting team interviews will be in the media room just outside the visiting team locker room on level one of the stadium. Contact the visiting team media relations office for postgame policies.

Non-Gameday

Media members wishing to conduct interviews with head coach Jeff Tedford and requested/selected players on non-gamedays are asked to gather in the third-floor lobby of the Simpson Center for Student-Athlete High Performance no later than the days/times listed in the 2012 Cal football non-gameday regular-season media schedule at the top of this page. Parking/Transportation

Gameday

Parking at Cal is always at a premium and visitors are encouraged to use public transportation. The Downtown Berkeley BART station is located about a mile west of Memorial Stadium, in close proximity to Haas Pavilion, Edwards Stadium/Goldman Field, the Hellman Tennis Courts and Spieker Aquatics Complex. Hourly guest parking on non-football gamedays is available in the MLK Student Union and RSF garages along Bancroft Way adjacent to Haas Pavilion and at the Underhill Garage.

Underhill also serves as the football gameday parking location. Entrances are off either Channing Way or Haste Street, just west of College Avenue. The lot is about three blocks from Memorial Stadium. Media can either take the short walk to media will call (located in the third-floor lobby of the Simpson Center adjacent to Memorial Stadium) or use a media-only shuttle that begins running two hours before game time. A media shuttle is also available post-game from the pregame dropoff point along Warring Street to the Underhill Garage.

Parking passes cannot be left at will call on gamedays and must be picked up or mailed in advance.

Television crews should order parking passes for their crews by sending in the Special Event Parking Arrangements form found on the university's website (pt.berkeley.edu) in advance. Request the Underhill Garage for football games. Note that the campus parking office does not accept credit cards – only cash or check.

Non-Gameday

MLK Student Union Garage – Paid parking is available at the MLK Student Union Garage located on the north side of Bancroft Way between Telegraph Avenue and Dana Street (basketball gameday media parking lot) about five blocks to the west of the Simpson Center and Memorial Stadium. If you park here, you would then need to walk east on Bancroft Way until you reach the venue.

Public Transportation – Public transportation is highly recommended when visiting Berkeley. There are multiple public transportation options that lead directly to Memorial Stadium and Witter Rugby Field. BART has a station in downtown Berkeley about a half-mile west of the venue. Please visit bart.org, actransit.org or 511.org for more information.

Recreational Sports Facility Garage – Paid parking is available at the Recreational Sports Facility Garage located on the north side of Bancroft Way between Telegraph Avenue and Dana Street (basketball gameday media parking lot) about six blocks to the west of Witter Rugby Field. If you park here, you would then need to walk east on Bancroft Way until you reach the venue.

Street – Paid parking is available all day on weekends and after 5 p.m. PT on weekdays along Stadium Rim Way. The payment machine is located in the southeast corner of Witter lot and accepts only \$1 and \$5 bills. No other forms of payment are available. Limited two-hour free and paid street parking (check signs) may be available on streets near Memorial Stadium/Simpson Center, with most options just south along Piedmont Avenue, Prospect Street, Channing Way or Warring Street.

Underhill Garage – Paid parking is available at the Underhill Garage located at the corner of Channing Way and College Avenue (football gameday media parking lot) about five blocks to the southwest of Witter Rugby Field. If you park here, you would then need to walk north on College Avenue to Bancroft Way and then east on Bancroft Way until you reach the venue.

Witter Lot – Paid parking in the vicinity of Witter Rugby Field is available in the adjacent Witter Lot located just south of Centennial Drive near the corner of Centennial and Stadium Rim Way on a first-come, first-served basis. The payment machine is located in the southeast corner of the lot and accepts only \$1 and \$5 bills. No other forms of payment are available. If you park here, you would then need to walk down the hill on Stadium Rim Way on the south side of the stadium keeping the stadium on your right until you reach the Simpson Center.

A photographer work room has been established at field level in of Memorial Stadium (west side at approximately the 20-yard line on the north end of the field). Power and internet access are available, as well as limited desk space on a first-come, first-served basis. Pregame meals and drinks are available on the media level of the press box (seventh floor).

Access to the internet is available through both wireless and an ethernet connection, and passwords and usernames will be distributed on gamedays.

Photographers

Field photographers must wear a photo vest at all times, in addition to a photo credential. Photo credentials are not distributed in advance and must be picked up on gamedays along with photo vests at media will call on the third floor Simpson Center. Photo vests will require an identification card to be left until the vests are returned.

NCAA rules limit shooting to outside the restraining line enclosing the playing field and outside the 25-yard lines (the team area).

In addition, the photographers and videographers are welcome to use the photo deck located on level six of the press box.

Postgame Media Work Area

The Peter E. Haas Press Box at Memorial Stadium also serves as the postgame media work location. The area is equipped with desk space, electrical outlets and internet access. Final statistical game books, as well as postgame notes, quotes and other relevant media materials will be distributed.

- Drafted in the second round (No. 37) by the Cleveland Browns in the 2012 NFL Draft

- Amassed three receptions for 18 yards in the 2012 NFL preseason
