### Kickoff – Cal at USC (Sat., Sept. 22, 3 p.m. PDT)

Cal remains on the road this week after nearly defeating then-No. 12 Ohio State in Columbus last Saturday. The Golden Bears will take on USC (No. 12 USA Today/No. 13 AP) on Saturday, Sept. 22, at the Los Angeles Coliseum in the Pac-12 opener for Cal and the second conference game of the season for the Trojans after their 21-14 loss at Stanford last Saturday. The Bears caused the Buckeyes to drop four spots in the AP poll after a narrow 35-28 win over Cal. The Bears head into Pac-12 play with a record of 1-2, which marks their first losing record heading into their conference opener since 2003 when they were 2-3 overall before knocking off the third-ranked Trojans, 34-31 in three overtimes, at Memorial Stadium in their memorable 2003 conference opener. Saturday's contest will be the 100th meeting between Cal and USC (USC leads 64-30-5). Two games played in the series were rugby games.

### Quick Hitters

- Standout wide receiver Keenan Allen, who racked up numerous preseason accolades and is a member of multiple watch lists including the Maxwell Award and Biletnikoff Award given annually to the nation's top player and wide receiver respectively, currently ranks 14th in the nation and second in the Pac-12 in punt returns with an average of 17.71 ypg that would be third on Cal's all-time single-season chart. He also ranks tied for 24th nationally and tied for fourth in the Pac-12 in receptions per game (6.67) and 48th nationally and sixth in the Pac-12 in all-purpose yardage (126.33 ypg). He is Cal's leading receiver with 20 catches for 216 yards after collecting season highs of nine receptions for 80 yards at Ohio State, along with throwing an eight-yard pass, the third completion of his career in as many attempts.
- Brendan Bigelow's 81-yard and 59-yard touchdown runs at Ohio State gave him a career-high 160 rushing yards on the day. Cal finished with 224 rushing yards as a team against Ohio State for its second straight 200-yard rushing performance. Bigelow was named the All-Purpose Performer of the Week by the College Football Performance Awards for his performance against the Buckeyes and was also an honorable mention CFP Running Back Performer of the Week.
- Steve Williams notched his fourth career interception – first of 2012 – to tie teammates Marc Anthony and Josh Hill as the Bears' active career leaders in that category.
- Four Bears – Josh Hill, Robert Mullins, Brennan Scarlett and Steve Williams – rank in the top 15 in the Pac-12 in tackles. Williams is tied for fourth (8.0 tpg), Mullins and Hill are tied for seventh (7.7 tpg) and Scarlett is tied for 14th (7.0 tpg).
- Zach Maynard had one of his strongest games as a Bear at Ohio State, setting a career-high in completions (26) while going 26-of-37 for 280 yards with one touchdown and one interception, and also scoring his first rushing touchdown of the season. Maynard spread the ball around, completing passes to eight different receivers and also picking up a reception himself.
- Cal has produced over 500 yards of total offense each the past two weeks. The Bears garnered 518 yards of total offense against Southern Utah before sporting 512 last week at Ohio State.

## A Decade of Sustained Success Under Jeff Tedford

Cal averaged 7.9 wins per year in the first 10 seasons (2002-11) under head coach Jeff Tedford and ranked tied for third among Pac-10 teams in victories during that period. After a brief one-year absence in 2010, Tedford led the Bears back to the bowl scene in 2011 with a trip to the Holiday Bowl against Texas. It was Cal's third appearance in the Holiday Bowl with Tedford at the helm. Tedford's most recent victory was his 80th career win at Cal when the Golden Bears knocked off Southern Utah on Sept. 8, 2012. Tedford is Cal's all-time winningest coach. Below is a look at Cal's year-by-year results and bowl appearances in the Tedford era.

## Early Pac-12 Success

Through the first three weeks of the season, the Pac-12 has produced numerous notable non-conference victories, and currently have five teams ranked among the nation's top 25 – Oregon (No. 3 AP/No. 3 USA Today), Stanford (No. 9 AP/No. 11 USA Today), USC (No. 12 USA Today/No. 13 AP), UCLA (No. 19 AP/No. 19 USA Today) and Arizona (No. 21 USA Today/No. 22 AP). Some of the big early-season victories include Oregon State topping Wisconsin, UCLA defeating Nebraska, Arizona beating Oklahoma State and Utah besting BYU. The only game between Pac-12 schools that has been played so far was Stanford upsetting then-No. 3 USC. The combined Pac-12 record thus far is 24-10, with Cal's North Division sporting a 12-4 mark.

## Cal in Pac-12 Openers

Cal has a 6-4 all-time record in conference openers under head coach Jeff Tedford. The Golden Bears had won six straight from 2003-08 (USC, at Oregon State, at Washington, Arizona State, Arizona, Washington State) before dropping each of the last three in road games at Oregon, Arizona and Washington, with the game at USC on Saturday marking the fourth consecutive season Cal has opened its conference slate on the road. Cal also lost Tedford's first-ever game against a Pac-10 team to Washington State in 2002. The victory over USC (the only other time Cal has played the Trojans in a conference opener under Tedford) was a 34-31 triple overtime decision in Berkeley on Sept. 27, 2003.

## Cal On Natural Grass Fields

Saturday's contest at USC will be Cal's first and only regular-season game played on natural grass in 2012. Last season, when the Bears called AT&T Park home – a natural grass field – Cal went 4-1 in those contests with wins over Presbyterian, Utah, Washington State and Oregon State, and a loss to USC. Cal played 11 games on natural grass fields in 2011, going 7-4 in those contests. Besides the five games played at AT&T Park, the Bears beat Fresno State at Candlestick Park, Colorado in overtime in Boulder, and Arizona State in Tempe, while losing to UCLA in Pasadena, at Stanford and to Texas in the Holiday Bowl. The team was 0-2 on artificial surfaces, falling at Washington and Oregon.

## All Eyes on Keenan Allen

Keenan Allen currently ranks 14th in the nation and second in the Pac-12 in punt returns (17.71 ypg) that ranks third on Cal's single-season chart. He also ranks tied for 24th nationally and tied for fourth in the Pac-12 in receptions per game (6.67 rpg), 48th nationally and sixth in the Pac-12 in all-purpose yardage per game (126.33 ypg), and 67th nationally and ninth in the Pac-12 in receiving yards per game (72.00 ypg).

With his season highs of nine receptions for 80 yards at Ohio State, Allen reclaimed the team lead in receiving, now with 20 catches for 216 yards. Allen also became the fastest Cal player to reach the 2000-yard career receiving mark when he did it in his 27th career game at Cal against Ohio State and now has 2,049 for his career, needing 36 more receiving yards to catch Steve Rivera (2,085) for 10th all-time at Cal. He also completed the third pass of his career in as many attempts that went to Zach Maynard for eight yards. His career passing totals are now 3-for-3 for 52 yards.

Allen owns updated career totals of 164 receptions, 2,049 receiving yards and 12 touchdown catches in 27 games played and 23 starts in just over two seasons at Cal. His 164 career receptions rank sixth all time at Cal and are only 38 shy of all-time school leader Geoff McArthur's career total of 202 from 2000-04. He is just outside the school's top 10 for career receiving yards and 1,139 yards shy of McArthur's school-record career total of 3,188. In addition, Allen has caught a pass in all 27 games he has played in, which ranks tied for eighth nationally and tied for first in the Pac-12.

## Freshmen Harper and Treggs Among Receiving Leaders

True freshmen Chris Harper and Bryce Treggs have joined Allen as the team's top receiving trio in the first three games. Harper currently boasts 15 catches for 183 yards and a team-high two touchdowns. Harper scored a touchdown in the season opener against Nevada and added another at Ohio State, and also hauling in career highs of seven receptions for 94 yards against Southern Utah. Treggs has nine catches for 128 yards and a touchdown with a 14.2 yard average that is the highest of the three, catching three passes in each of his contests vs. Nevada (62 yards, TD) and Southern Utah (38 yards), and at Ohio State (28 yards). Harper and Treggs became the first pair of true freshmen at Cal to score touchdowns in a season opener since Marshawn Lynch and Justin Forsett against Air Force in 2004.

## Zach Maynard Efficient Under Center

Zach Maynard's efficiency has improved since 2011, with a 2012 passer efficiency rating of 147.26 that would be fourth on Cal's all-time single season list, while his career mark of 130.67 ranks eighth all time at Cal. Against Ohio State, Maynard completed a career-high 26-of-37 passes for 280 yards with a touchdown, an interception, and his first rushing touchdown of the season. On the season, Maynard has completed 60-of-90 passes for 754 yards, with four passing touchdowns and two interceptions. Maynard began to come on strong at the end of last season, completed 68.1 percent of passes, throwing for five touchdowns to one interception, and posting a 154.25 rating over the final four regular-season games.

## The Rushing Game

The Cal rushing attack has been in full force the last two weeks against Southern Utah (289) and at Ohio State (224) with a combined 513 rushing yards for an average of 256.5 over those two contests. Over three contests, Cal is averaging 208.7 yards rushing per game to rank fourth in the Pac-12 and 36th nationally. Brendan Bigelow rushed for 160 yards at Ohio State, including an 81-yarder that was the longest rush by a Cal player since a 93-yard touchdown run by Jahvid Best at UCLA in 2009. Isi Sofele collected 104 yards on the ground on 19 carries with his first touchdown of 2012 the week before against Southern Utah. The 104 yards gave him his sixth career 100-yard performance, which tied him for 10th all-time at Cal. Sofele had 86 yards on the ground on a season-high 21 carries at Ohio State, and is now just 46 yards away from 2,000 career rushing yards. The Bears' leading rusher in the season opener, C.J. Anderson posted career highs in receptions (4) and receiving yards (65) at Ohio State. Daniel Lasco also saw his first action in the backfield against Southern Utah and made his presence felt with a 77-yard TD run.

On the season, Sofele leads the way with 212 yards and a touchdown on 45 carries. Bigelow is second with 175 yards and a pair of scores on only six carries, while Anderson is third with 125 yards and a touchdown on 23 carries and Lasco has 74 yards and a touchdown on two carries.

Cal also has the top two individual games in the Pac-12 this year in total offensive yards per play and rushing yards per play in Bigelow at Ohio State (40.0, 4-160) and Lasco against Southern Utah (37.0, 2-74).

## Big Play Bigelow

Brendan Bigelow had Cal's two biggest plays of the day at Ohio State and of the team's longest plays from the line of scrimmage this year with touchdown runs of 81 and 59 yards. The 81-yarder was the longest run in the history of Ohio Stadium, the longest by a Pac-12 player this year and the longest by a Cal rusher since Jahvid Best's 93-yard touchdown run at UCLA in 2009. His 160 rushing yards on the day were fourth highest single-game total in Pac-12 this season and most by a Cal player. It was also his first 100-yard rushing game. Bigelow also ranks second in the Pac-12 and 27th in the nation in kick return average, sporting an average of 26.67 ypr. He set a new career-high in all-purpose yards at Ohio State with 234 that was the highest total by a Cal player since Jahvid Best had 311 (all rushing) against Washington in 2009. As a result of Bigelow's big day, he earned All-Purpose Performer of the Week honors by the College Football Performance Awards and was also an honorable mention CFPA Running Back Performer of the Week.

## Bowling and Winning Bears

Cal has played in bowls eight of the last nine seasons, posting a school-record bowl game appearance streak of seven consecutive campaigns from 2003-09 and a school-record-tying string of eight consecutive winning seasons from 2002-09 before both came to an end in 2010. However, the

Bears started new streaks in both categories with a return to the bowl scene at the Holiday Bowl and a 7-6 overall record in 2011. Cal has posted a 5-3 (.625) mark in bowl games in the Jeff Tedford era that also included a school-record four straight bowl wins from 2005-08. Cal won enough games to be bowl eligible but was ineligible to play in a bowl game in 2002 due to NCAA sanctions imposed prior to the arrival of Tedford.

### Challenging Schedule With No Bye Week

Four teams on Cal's remaining 2012 schedule are currently nationally ranked as the Bears will visit USC (No. 12 USA Today/No. 13 AP) this Saturday, and then host UCLA (No. 19 AP/No. 19 USA Today), Stanford (No. 9 AP/No. 11 USA Today) and Oregon (No. 3 AP/No. 3 USA Today) on October 6 and 20, and November 10. Of the seven teams to visit Berkeley in 2012, six participated in a bowl game last season – Nevada, Arizona State, UCLA, Stanford, Washington and Oregon. Cal had a preseason strength of schedule ranking of No. 15 according to Phil Steele.

The Bears essentially do not have a bye week during their 12-game regular season schedule because their bye comes in the week after their regular season finale.

### New Coaches and Coaching Responsibilities in 2012

Wes Chandler (wide receivers) and Todd Howard (defensive line) joined the staff in 2012. Also, Marcus Arroyo added pass game coordinator to his duties while he will continue to work with the team's quarterbacks. Kenwick Thompson is also now an associate head coach in addition to his positions as the team's linebackers coach and recruiting coordinator.

### Two-Time League Leaders In Total And Pass Defense

Cal led the Pac-12 in total defense and pass defense each of the past two seasons, utilizing a balanced attack and creative schemes to create pressure and make the Bears one of the top big-play teams in the country. Cal was first in the conference and seventh nationally in tackles for loss in 2011, while ranking third in the league and 19th nationally in sacks. Cal led the league and ranked 13th nationally in sacks in 2010. Through three games in 2012, Cal has remained one of the nation's best team in tackles for loss as the Bears currently rank tied for 23rd in the nation and third in the Pac-12 (7.67 tflpg) in the category with 13 different players combining for the team's total of 23.0. J.P. Hurrell recorded a career-high 2.5 sacks vs. Southern Utah, the first of his career, and ranks tied for 18th nationally and tied second in the Pac-12 in that category.

### Quartet in Top 15 in Pac-12 in Tackles

Four Bears – Steve Williams, Josh Hill, Robert Mullins and Brennan Scarlett – rank in the top 15 in the Pac-12 in tackles. Williams is tied for fourth (8.0 tpg), Hill and Mullins are tied for seventh (7.7 tpg) and Scarlett is tied for 14th (7.0 tpg).

### Coleman Leads Defensive Line

Deandre Coleman leads the way on the defensive line with 17 tackles (tied for fifth on the team), 2.0 tackles for loss (-11 yards) and 1.5 sacks (-9 yards). Coleman, who is on the watch list for the Hendricks Award given annually to the nation's top defensive end, registered a career-high eight tackles against Nevada, including a half-sack. He followed that with six tackles, 1.5 tackles for loss (-10 yards) and 1.0 sack (-8 yards) against Southern Utah. before recording two tackles at Ohio State.

## Anthony, Hill and Williams – Active Career Leaders

The defensive backfield trio of Marc Anthony, Josh Hill and Steve Williams share the team's active lead with four career interceptions each and all are among Cal's active career leaders in other categories.

Hill, who has played in 39 career games with 23 starts, currently boasts 150 tackles as Cal's active career leader in tackles. Hill is also tied for first among the team's active players with four career interceptions and two forced fumbles, second with 46 interception return yards and third with 19 passes defended.

Anthony, who has played in 33 career games with 25 starts, is Cal's active career leader in interception return yards (93), passes defended (23) and pass breakups (19), while totaling 97 tackles to rank second to Hill in that category. Against Southern Utah, Anthony picked off Thunderbird quarterback Brad Sorensen and returned it 61 yards for his first career touchdown, following in the footsteps of Hill who had owned Cal's most-recent pick-six against Utah last year.

Williams shares Cal's active career lead along with Hill, Keni Kaufusi and Aaron Tipoti with two forced fumbles. He is also third in interception return yards (45), second in pass breakups (16) and passes defended (20).

## Sofele and Hurrell Have Played in Every Game

Isi Sofele and J.P. Hurrell share Cal's active career lead in games played, with both having played in all 41 games over the last four seasons from 2009-12. Dominic Galas had played in 38 games straight before missing the first three games of the 2012 season due to injury.

## Other Cal Player Individual Notes From Ohio State

Alex Logan paced Cal in tackles against Ohio State with a career-high seven ... Keni Kaufusi registered his second career forced fumble ... Steffan Mos had Cal's first two punts at Ohio State, including a 57-yarder on his first ever punt for the Golden Bears ... Darius Powe secured his first collegiate reception at Ohio State and ended the day with two grabs for 44 yards, including a 36-yarder ... Eric Stevens and Jacob Wark both had a career-high two receptions ... Cole Leininger had a career-best 47.6 yard punt average ... Brendan Bigelow had a season-long 32-yard kick return ... Jalen Jefferson and Nick Forbes earned their first career starts at linebacker, while Michael Lowe registered his first career start at safety.

## Bears As the Best, Against The Best

Cal is 15-8 when playing as a top-10 team and 36-21 when ranked in the top 25 of at least one set of rankings since head coach Jeff Tedford took over in 2002. Cal has played 34 nationally ranked teams during the Tedford era and posted a 13-21 record in those contests. In 2009, the Bears recorded back-to-back wins in consecutive weeks over nationally ranked teams for the first time since 1950, defeating No. 18 Arizona at Memorial Stadium before winning at No. 14 Stanford. But, Cal has dropped seven consecutive games against ranked teams since. Cal has four remaining games in 2012 scheduled against opponents currently ranked in the top 25 – Sept. 22 at USC (No. 12 USA Today/No. 13 AP), Oct. 6 vs. UCLA (No. 19 AP, No. 19 USA Today), Oct. 20 vs. Stanford (No. 9 AP/No. 11 USA Today) and Nov. 10 vs. Oregon (No. 3 AP/No. 3 USA Today). Prior to not being ranked during the 2011 campaign, Cal had been among the nation's top 25 teams at one point in each of the previous seven seasons and eight times in nine campaigns from 2002-10.



## Score 30 Points, Usually Win

Cal is 62-5 all-time when putting 30 points or more on the scoreboard under head coach Jeff Tedford, including nine straight times and 39 of the last 40 with the only exception a 52-31 loss at Nevada on Sept. 17, 2010. When the Bears don't score at least 30 points, their record under Tedford is 18-45.

## Turnover Margin a Key

The turnover battle has been emphasized since head coach Jeff Tedford's arrival at Cal in 2002 and rightly so. The Bears are 45-8 when committing fewer turnovers than opponents during the Tedford era, compared to 18-11 when tied and 17-31 when opponents win the battle. In conference games, Cal is 28-6 with a positive margin in turnovers, 10-7 when the turnover table is tied and 10-24 with a deficit. In the 2012 season opener, Nevada defeated Cal, and the Wolf Pack only had one turnover compared to the two the Bears gave up (all fumbles). Cal and Southern Utah each had two turnovers, with one interception and one fumble recovery each. Cal and Ohio State each had one turnover as well as each team had one interception.

## Cal's Southern California Connections

## Cal in the NFL

Cal has a total of 29 players on NFL rosters as of Sept. 16, 2012, which is the second-most among Pac-12 schools behind only USC. Cal has had 40 NFL Draft selections in the 10 drafts held since Jeff Tedford coached his first game at Cal in 2002, including eight first-rounders. Six former Cal players were chosen in the 2012 NFL Draft. The six draft selections tied for the second-most ever by Cal, who also had six players picked in both the 1977 and 2008 drafts. A school-record 10 Cal players were chosen in 1952. Offensive lineman Mitchell Schwartz (Cleveland Browns – No. 37 overall) and linebacker Mychal Kendricks (Philadelphia Eagles – No. 46 overall) were selected in the second round, followed by punter Bryan Anger (Jacksonville Jaguars – No. 70 overall) in the third round. Wide receiver Marvin Jones (Cincinnati Bengals – No. 166 overall) was taken in the fifth round. Defensive back D.J. Campbell (Carolina Panthers – No. 216 overall) and defensive lineman Trevor Guyton (Minnesota Vikings – No. 219 overall) were picked in the seventh round, although Guyton was recently cut.

## Academic Success Continues

Cal has posted 103 Pac-12 All-Academic honors in the first 10 seasons under head coach Jeff Tedford, second-most in the conference during that span. Nine Cal student-athletes were honored on the 2011 Pac-12 All-Academic Football Team, including four first-team selections in Mark Brazinski, Ernest Owusu, Mitchell Schwartz and John Tyndall.

In 2008, Alex Mack earned the Draddy Trophy (later renamed the Campbell Trophy) honoring college football's top scholar-athlete, while Mohamed was a finalist for the honor often referred to as the Academic Heisman in 2010 after earlier being given an NFF Scholar-Athlete Award. Giorgio Tavecchio was a semifinalist for the honor and a candidate for an NFF Scholar-Athlete Award in 2011.

A three-time member of the Pac-10/12 all-academic team, Matt Summers-Gavin is a candidate for the Senior Class Award and the Campbell Trophy presented by the National Football Foundation.

## Back In Berkeley – Memorial Stadium Reopens in 2012

Since it opened in the fall of 1923, Memorial Stadium has produced scores of unforgettable memories for generations of Golden Bears. From the Wonder Teams of the 1920s to the Pappy Waldorf years mid-century to the current success attained under head coach Jeff Tedford, the facility has treated fans of all ages to many of the greatest moments in the history of Cal football. It stands as one of the most enduring symbols of the University of California campus and has served as a gathering point for students, alumni, faculty, staff and other supporters for nearly 90 years.

This fall, the historic building begins a new era following an extensive retrofit and renovation that brings it up to modern standards for fans and student-athletes alike, creating a more enjoyable environment for the hundreds of thousands of people who visit and partake in games every year – all while maintaining the architecture and character of the celebrated stadium.

Major construction on the \$321 million project got underway in December 2010, and barely 21 months later, the Golden Bears are able to call Memorial Stadium home once again.

## The Renovation of Memorial Stadium

Preliminary work on the project, including installation of temporary bracing around the outer wall, hazardous material removal and interior demolition, began in June 2010. Major construction got underway in December 2010, starting with demolition of the interior bowl, soil excavation and wall shoring. The stadium is game-ready to host Cal football in September 2012, with work completed in early 2013.

The \$321 million renovation, which impacts all but the outer wall and the east-side seating area, capitalizes on the expertise of seismic engineers and



campus experts that found a unique solution to protect the stadium and its users in case of an earthquake. Design features include concrete “seismic blocks” at the end zone where the Hayward Fault bisects the facility and a press box that can sway in a large-scale temblor. The solution came as a result of collaboration between the campus Seismic Review Committee, the architectural team and the structural engineers hired for the job.

The significant number of upgrades to the facility include three club levels for those participating in the Endowment Seating Program, a new press box, wider concourses, improved ADA access, and more restrooms and concession stands. Capacity has been reduced from 71,799 seats to 63,186.

## **The History of Memorial Stadium**

Originally completed in November 1923, Memorial Stadium is dedicated to University of California, Berkeley students, alumni and other Californians who lost their lives in World War I. Cal boasts an all-time record of 318-214-16 (.594) at Memorial Stadium. The Bears have enjoyed 12 undefeated home campaigns, including three during the Jeff Tedford era (2004, 2006, 2008). Cal has twice won eight home games in a season (1924, 1938). The Bears went 4-3 at Memorial Stadium in 2010, the last season before the renovation. Cal was 4-1 in their 2011 temporary home at AT&T Park. Memorial Stadium is also home to one of the most memorable moments in college football history – “The Play” – Cal’s five-lateral kickoff return on the final play of the 1982 Big Game to beat Stanford.

## **2012 National Signing Day**

Cal put together a top 15 signing class for the third straight year with its 2012 class ranking as high as No. 15 according to MaxPreps, while ESPN (No. 22), Rivals (No. 23) and 247Sports (No. 25) also had the Bears in the top 25. Cal’s 2011 group ranked as high as No. 13 in the nation by Scout and its 2010 class was No. 11 according to Rivals. Head coach Jeff Tedford was named the Sporting News Recruiter of the Year in 2011.

## **Pac-12 Preseason Media Poll**

Cal was picked to finish fourth in the North division of the annual preseason poll of media members who cover the league. Oregon (North) and USC (South) were picked to win their respective divisions, both picking up 117 of 123 first-place votes, with the Trojans the choice to win the league’s championship game. Oregon was followed in the North division voting by Stanford, Washington, Cal, Washington State and Oregon State, with Stanford (5) and Cal (1) garnering the other first-place votes. USC was followed by Utah, UCLA, Arizona, Arizona State and Colorado in the South division voting, with Arizona State (3), UCLA (2) and Utah (1) picking up the first-place votes not awarded to the Trojans.

## **Simpson Center For Student-Athlete High Performance**

Cal football players train in the Simpson Center for Student-Athlete High Performance, a revolutionary student-athlete training, coaching, and applied sports science and sports medicine center that opened in January of 2012. The Simpson Center embodies the High Performance Initiative (HPI), Cal’s innovative performance philosophy designed to build competitive advantage, maximize efficiency and enhance the student-athlete experience.

A 142,000 square-foot facility, the Simpson Center is a state-of-the-art complex with year-round access for over 450 student-athletes. The Simpson Center is home to the locker rooms, meeting rooms and offices for Cal football and 12 Golden Bear Olympic sports for use on a daily basis. The signature feature of the Simpson Center is the High Performance Zone – a fully integrated training space with world-class strength and conditioning, sports medicine and sports science facilities and services. Developed with sports performance in mind, high quality equipment and an open layout provide impressive training options to prepare for the highest levels of competition.

This multi-purpose space encompasses 18,700 square feet, spans two stories and stretches the length of a football field. Planned to accommodate 100 student-athletes at a time, Golden Bears are able to complete a full training session without the need to move or wait for equipment.

The facility's weight room is outfitted with over 50,000 pounds of weight, 22 fully customized work stations with inlaid platforms that provide student-athletes with a state-of-the-art facility that incorporates the latest technology and adaptability in exercise and monitoring equipment. The 25-yard turf area is used for warm-ups, plyometrics, short agility work, medicine ball throws, rehabilitation and much more. Spin, Pilates, yoga and back classes are among the activities that take place in the fitness studio.

Other features in the Simpson Center include a training room, rehabilitation facilities including underwater and AlterG treadmills, cold plunges, a medical suite, dining and nutrition and academic support area, team meeting room, locker room and player lounge – all just a few steps away.

## **A Golden Olympics for the Golden Bears**

A total of 46 Golden Bear athletes, coaches and staff members represented Cal during the 2012 Summer Olympics in London, and together, they brought home a school-record tying 17 medals (11 gold, 1 silver, 5 bronze). The Bears have won 50 medals over the past three Olympics (16 in 2004, 17 in 2008, 17 in 2012), and they have captured 178 medals all-time (99 gold).

- Fullback Tanner Mohr joined the team during spring practice after having been on the Golden Bears' rugby team for his first three years at Cal.
- Punter Steffan Mos attended Clairemont High School, the school where Fast Times at Ridgemont High was filmed.
- Wide receivers Griffin Piatt and Allen are both experienced piano players.
- Fullback Dasarte Yarnway and defensive back Tyre Ellison grew up together in Visitation Valley in San Francisco. Yarnway and his brother plan to start numerous nonprofit organizations to help the youth in Visitation Valley.

## Jeff Tedford

## Head Coach • 11th Season at Cal (80-50, .615)

Jeff Tedford has established Cal as one of the elite football programs in the Pac-12 and lifted the Golden Bears into the national discussion on a consistent basis. The Bears have won the third-most Pac-10/12 games during his first 10-plus seasons on the job, have finished ranked among the nation's top 25 in four of the last eight seasons and been in the top 10 at some point in five of the past eight campaigns.

Cal posted a school-record run of seven straight bowl appearances from 2003-09 and is 5-3 in the postseason under Tedford. He is the only Cal mentor with more than two bowl victories, including a school-record string of four consecutive postseason wins from 2005-08. Tedford guided the Bears back to the bowl scene in 2011 with a trip to the Holiday Bowl. The Bears also put together a school-record-tying eight consecutive winning campaigns from 2002-09. Cal has twice posted a school-record-tying 10 wins under Tedford, the sixth and seventh times in school history, in 2004 and 2006.

Tedford boasts Cal's all-time record for victories with a 80-50 (.615) all-time mark at the school, surpassing the former record holder Andy Smith (74-16-7, 1916-25) last season. Tedford has now coached 130 games at Cal, setting the school record for most games coached during the 2010 campaign. Only two others – Pappy Waldorf (103, 1947-56) and Stub Allison (102, 1935-44) – have coached 100 games at Cal. Tedford also already has the school record with 26 road wins and is an impressive 48-38 (.558) in conference games. To top it off, he is 7-3 in the Big Game, equaling Waldorf's school record of seven wins against Stanford.

In the first 10 NFL Drafts that have occurred with Tedford as Cal's head coach, the Bears have had 40 players selected in the NFL Draft, including eight first-round picks. As of September 16, 2012, Cal's 29 former players on NFL rosters (includes injured reserve and physically unable to perform lists) according to ESPN.com rank second among Pac-12 schools, while the team's 25 former players on active 53-player rosters is tied for ninth nationally.

Tedford has also earned a reputation as a strong recruiter, with each of his last three classes from 2010-12 being ranked in the top 15 nationally. Prior to the 2011 campaign, Sporting News bestowed the honor of the Pac-12's best recruiter on Tedford.

All of this at the head of a program that won just one game in 2001, the year prior to his arrival. The Cal football renaissance over the past decade rates as one of the most impressive turnarounds in college football history.

But Tedford's teams have not only got it done on the field, they've also got it done in the classroom. His players have been recognized as Pac-12

All-Academic honorees 103 times since his arrival. Of the 202 seniors who have played for Tedford in his first 10 seasons, 178 (88%) earned their college degrees and/or have gone on to NFL careers.

Nationally, Cal has also had multiple Heisman Trophy candidates under Tedford, including J.J. Arrington (2004), Marshawn Lynch (2006), DeSean Jackson (2007) and Jahvid Best (2009).

Other national recognition has come the Bears way in recent years. Alex Mack was the winner of the 2008 Draddy Award (often referred to as the "academic Heisman"), while Mike Mohamed was one of 16 players across the country in the 2010 National Football Foundation's Scholar-Athlete Class of 2010 and a finalist for the prestigious honor won by Mack now known as the William V. Campbell Trophy. In 2006, the Bears had a pair of players collect national awards. Jackson was the recipient of the inaugural Randy Moss Award as the top returner in the country, while Daymeion Hughes earned The Lott IMPACT Trophy, given to a defensive player to equally recognize his athletic performance and personal character.

Despite his success as a coach and mentor, Tedford still follows a basic philosophy.

"We try to focus on one game at a time and try to reach our full potential," Tedford said emphatically.

And he still values each and every member of his football team.

"Whether it is the guys who are suited up, the guys who are going to play 50-60 plays or the guys who aren't going to play at all, I want them all to understand that they are very important to the success of the program," he said. "Their contributions are invaluable."

Tedford's hard work and dedication not only inspire his players, it has also made him a role model to the young men in the Cal program.

"Coach Tedford wasn't just a coach, I think of him as more like a father figure," said All-Pac-10 linebacker and current NFL player Desmond Bishop, who was a key player on the Packers' Super Bowl XLV winning squad. "He taught us lessons about life. He taught us to have integrity, to have character. He prepared us to be men."

# California-USC: Last Time, Series History and Notes

## USC 30, at California 9

**SAN FRANCISCO** – The Trojans kept Cal off the scoreboard until late in the third quarter, and the Bears struggled with turnovers in their eighth straight loss in the series against USC, 30-9.

Zach Maynard threw for 294 yards and ran for a touchdown and his half-brother, Keenan Allen, had a career-high 13 catches for 160 yards.

Cal was behind 23-0 early in the third quarter before the offense finally got going, with Maynard leading the Bears to a 27-yard Giorgio Tavecchio field goal and then scoring on a 3-yard run with 6 seconds left in the third to cut it to 23-9.

Cal's defense did a decent job defending Matt Barkley and the Trojans' high-powered offense but USC took advantage of short fields for its scores.

USC broke the game open with 17 points in the second quarter, getting a 39-yard TD catch, a field goal after Chris Galippo intercepted Maynard's pass deep in Cal territory and a 7-yard TD pass from Barkley to Brandon Carswell after punter Bryan Anger was stopped on a fake that made it 20-0.

Barkley completed 19 of 35 passes for a season-low 195 yards. Robert Woods, the nation's top receiver, was held to five catches for 36 yards.

Cal's only sustained drive of the first half ended in the final minute when Maynard threw into triple coverage and was intercepted in the end zone by Dion Bailey.

# 2012 Game Summaries

## Game 1 Nevada 31, at Cal 24

September 1, 2012 • TV: Pac-12 Networks • Attendance: 63,186

**BERKELEY** – Nevada quarterback Cody Fajardo engineered the winning drive by throw a 14-yard pass to Zach Sudfeld on third-and-4 from the Cal 38 and a 19-yarder to Brandon Wimberly that set up Jefferson's winning score, as Nevada topped Cal, 31-24, in the Bears' first game in the newly-renovated California Memorial Stadium.

Cal quarterback Zach Maynard returned after being benched for the first three series as punishment for missing a tutoring session earlier this summer to throw two touchdown passes for Cal (0-1). But he also lost a fumble deep in Nevada territory in the fourth quarter as the Bears lost at home to Nevada for the second time in 25 tries and first since 1903.

Cal appeared to seize the momentum in the third quarter when Keenan Allen answered Jefferson's second touchdown run with an elusive 39-yard score on a reverse.

Khalid Wooten fumbled the ensuing kickoff, but Cal had to settle for a field goal by Vincenzo D'Amato that cut the lead to 21-17. Maynard then fumbled at the Nevada 21 at the end of a scramble early in the fourth quarter.

The Bears did tie the game later in the fourth on a 13-yard TD pass to Chris Harper, but could never take the lead.

There wasn't much to celebrate early for the sellout crowd of 63,186 as the offense sputtered behind backup Allan Bridgford, who completed one of his seven passes and the defense once again struggled against Nevada's pistol offense.

Maynard led the Bears to a score on his third drive in the game, connecting on a 37-yard TD pass to freshman Bryce Treggs.

### Notes

- The Bears currently have an all-time record of 73-41-4 in season openers over the first 117 campaigns of Cal football that began in 1882. In the 2011 season opener, Cal defeated Fresno State, 36-21, at Candlestick Park in the Battle By the Bay. The Bears' most recent season-opening win at Memorial Stadium was a 52-3 victory over UC Davis on Sept. 4, 2010.

- This game was the first game played in the newly-renovated California Memorial Stadium since a 16-13 loss to Washington on Nov. 27, 2010. The most-recent win by the Bears in Memorial Stadium was a 50-17 win over Arizona State on Oct. 23, 2010.

- The game was a sellout, all 63,186 seats were filled. Cal had a streak of 43 consecutive games of at least 50,000 fans that was snapped in the 2010 season finale against Washington. The last Cal sellout came against USC on Oct. 3, 2009 (71,799).

- Cal leads the all-time series with Nevada, 22-3-1 (not including an additional 7-1 mark against the Wolf Pack from 1906-14 when both schools played rugby instead of football). Prior to today, the teams had played only twice since 1945, a 33-15 Cal win in Berkeley on Sept. 21, 1996, and a 52-31 victory by Nevada in Reno on Sept. 17, 2010.

- Keenan Allen extended his streak of consecutive games with a reception to 25, every game he's played at Cal. Allen scored his first touchdown of 2012 on a reverse that went for 39 yards in the third quarter. It was Allen's second rushing TD of his career, with the first one coming against UC Davis in 2010. On the receiving end, Allen paced the Bears with six catches for 67 yards.

- For the first time in his Cal career, C.J. Anderson paced Cal in rushing, garnering 66 yards on 14 attempts. Isi Sofele rushed five times for 21 yards. Sofele also caught three passes for 33 yards.

- Bryce Treggs' first career reception was good for a 37-yard touchdown reception from Maynard. Treggs joins Spencer Hagan as the only active Bears to score a touchdown on their first career receptions. Hagan's came last season against Presbyterian. Treggs caught three passes in the game for 62 yards and the score.

- Another true freshman wide receiver, Chris Harper, hauled in a big touchdown for the Bears halfway through the fourth quarter on a 13-yard pass from Maynard. Harper finished the day with five catches for 57 yards and the TD. The last time two Cal true freshmen both scored in their first game at Cal was Marshawn Lynch and Justin Forsett on Sept. 4, 2004, at Air Force.

- Marc Anthony collected a career-high three tackles for loss. Following Allen's touchdown, the first fumble of 2012 was recovered by Kameron Jackson. Playing in his first career game, Todd Barr secured 1.5 tackles, including a 0.5 sack and a 1.5 tackle for loss. Keni Kaufusi notched his first career forced fumble, to go along with a career-best 1.0 tackles for loss.

- Making their first career starts today were Jordan Rigsbee, Chris Adcock, Bryce Treggs, Richard Rodgers, Brennan Scarlett, Alex Logan and Allan Bridgford. Also, Matt Summers-Gavin started his 26th game, the most among active Cal players, and Brian Schwenke started his 25th game.

# 2012 Game Summaries

## Game 2 at Cal 50, Southern Utah 31

September 8, 2012 • TV: Pac-12 Networks • Attendance: 57,745

**BERKELEY** – California cornerback Marc Anthony scored on a 61-yard interception return in the fourth quarter and the Golden Bears beat Southern Utah, 50-31.

Keenan Allen had two touchdowns, one on a 69-yard punt return, to help the Bears notch their first victory at newly renovated Memorial Stadium.

Cal (1-1) had 518 yards of offense, and in the fourth quarter, forced two turnovers and scored 30 points.

Defensive end Aaron Tipoti recovered a fumble on Southern Utah's next possession, and Vincenzo D'Amato's third field goal made it 37-17.

Allen, who caught a 19-yard touchdown from quarterback Zach Maynard on the first play of the fourth quarter, made it 44-17 with a long punt return. Allen fumbled the ball, but recovered it and then broke free down the right sideline on his way into the endzone.

C.J. Anderson and Isi Sofele both added short touchdown runs, and Daniel Lasco scored on a 77-yard run in the fourth quarter.

Cal scored on four consecutive possessions in the second quarter to go in front.

Anderson's 7-yard touchdown run capped a 94-yard drive for the Bears. Sofele scored on a 12-yard run and D'Amato added a pair of field goals to give Cal a 20-3 lead.

Southern Utah stayed close and pulled within 20-17 midway through the third quarter on Sorensen's 5-yard touchdown pass to Brown, but the Thunderbirds couldn't slow Cal down in the fourth.

### Notes

- With Cal's victory over Southern Utah, Jeff Tedford earned his 80th career victory as head coach at Cal. Tedford is the Golden Bears' all-time winningest coach.

- This was the first-ever meeting between Cal and Southern Utah. The Bears are now 6-0 all-time against FCS opponents. Last year, Cal defeated FCS foe Presbyterian at AT&T Park, 63-12.

- Cal has now won 42 of its last 53 home games. With 50 points scored, the Bears improved to 62-5 all-time when scoring 30 or more points. The Bears are also 41-2 when scoring 40 or more and 15-0 when scoring 50 under Tedford. The last time Cal scored 50 or more points was a 63-12 victory against Presbyterian last season.

- After hauling in five catches for 57 yards against Nevada last week, true freshman Chris Harper posted seven catches for 94 yards against Southern Utah. Harper is now Cal's leading receiver on the season with 12 catches for 151 yards and a touchdown, while Allen is second with 11 catches for 136 yards and a touchdown.

- Isi Sofele was Cal's leading rusher on the day with 19 carries for 104 yards and a touchdown. The 104 yards gave Sofele his sixth career 100-yard performance, which ties him for sixth all-time at Cal. The previous five 100-yard games all came in 2011 with the last one occurring in the regular season finale at Arizona State.

- C.J. Anderson notched his ninth career rushing touchdown. The touchdown ended Cal's season-long drive of seven plays, 94 yards in 2:08. Today was the fifth time both Anderson and Sofele have scored a rushing TD in the same game, with the last occurrence happening at ASU last season.

- Daniel Lasco rushed 77 yards for his first career touchdown, which was also the longest rush of the season for the Bears. The run gave Cal 500 yards of total offense (520) for the first time since last year against Presbyterian (581)

- Keenan Allen extended his streak of consecutive games with a reception to 26, every game he's played at Cal. Allen ended the day with five catches for 69 yards and his first receiving touchdown of 2012. Entering the game ranked second in the Pac-12 and tied for 24th nationally in punt returns, Allen took a fourth-quarter punt back 69 yards for his first career punt return for a touchdown. On the season, Allen has returned six punts for 133 yards and a touchdown.

- Marc Anthony picked off his fourth career interception, and first of 2012, and returned it 61 yards for a touchdown. The last time Cal intercepted a pass and returned it for a TD was Josh Hill against Utah last season. The 61-yarder is the longest since Mychal Kendricks' 68-yard pick-six at UCLA in 2009.

- Jalen Jefferson garnered his first career tackle, and ended the day pacing the Bears with nine tackles. In the fourth quarter, Aaron Tipoti registered his first career fumble recovery. J.P. Hurrell and Brennan Scarlett secured their first career sacks, and Hurrell would go on to post three sacks (-15 yards) on the day. Nick Forbes (8) reached a new career high in tackles. Nathan Broussard earned his first career 0.5 tackle for loss.

- Vincenzo D'Amato was a personal-best 3-for-3 on field goals today, making him 4-for-5 on the season. His 47-yard field goal in the fourth quarter tied his career high (at Oregon, 2009). D'Amato also picked up a career-high 14 points on the day.

# 2012 Game Summaries

## Game 3

### at No. 12 Ohio State 35, Cal 28

September 15, 2012 • TV: ABC • Attendance: 105, 232

**COLUMBUS, Ohio** – Braxton Miller lofted a 72-yard touchdown pass to Devin Smith with 3:26 left and Christian Bryant snuffed out the Golden Bears' last chance with an interception as the 12th-ranked Buckeyes edged the Golden Bears, 35-28, at Ohio Stadium.

Cal (1-2) amassed 512 yards of offense (second-straight week the Bears went over 500 yards of total offense), including 331 yards to 173 for Ohio State in the second half alone. The Bears were victimized by three missed field goals and a touchdown that was called back by a penalty.

Ohio State built a 20-7 lead at half, but the Cal defense held the Buckeyes to just 25 yards and no first downs on 14 plays in the third quarter.

Brendan Bigelow raced 81 yards on his first carry of the game -- the longest run ever by an opposing back in 90-year-old Ohio Stadium and the longest by a Cal player since Jahvid Best's 93-yard touchdown run at UCLA in 2009. Maynard then kept on a one-yard sneak to give Cal a 21-20 lead early in the fourth quarter.

Just two plays after Ohio State took a 28-21 lead, Bigelow, who finished with career-best 160 yards on only four carries, burst through the Ohio State defense for a 16-yard run and then topped that on the next play with a 59-yarder to tie the game at 28.

Miller promptly turned the ball over by throwing an interception directly to Cal defensive back Steve Williams.

The Bears patiently drove to the Ohio State 25, where the drive stalled. On fourth-and-1, junior kicker Vincenzo D'Amato came out for a 42-yard field goal. He was wide left with 4:20 left, his third kick that sailed left of the mark on the day, missing twice from 42 and once from 40 yards.

Now down by seven after OSU's 72-yard score, the Bears still had a shot to tie, but Maynard overthrew a receiver with 1:09 left and Bryant picked it off.

## Notes

- This game was the seventh in the series between Cal and Ohio State, and the Buckeyes lead the series 6-1.
- This was also the seventh road game in the Jeff Tedford era that was played in a different time zone and started before noon PT. The Golden Bears now have a 5-2 record in those contests.
- This was the second game in a row that Cal boasted over 500 yards of total offense (512). They outgained Ohio State by 100 yards (412). Against Southern Utah, the Bears had 518 yards.
- Brendan Bigelow scored on a career-long 81-yard touchdown run. It was Cal's longest play from scrimmage this season. It is the longest rush since Jahvid Best's 93-yard touchdown run at UCLA in 2009. Bigelow followed that with a 59-yard touchdown later in the game. He ended the day with a personal-best 160 rushing yards and 234 all-purpose yards. His previous career best in all-purpose yards was 137 against Presbyterian last year.
- Zach Maynard finished 26-for-37 for 280 yards with a touchdown, an interception and a one-yard rushing touchdown. The completions were a career high. It was also Maynard's first rushing touchdown this season - fifth of his career - and the first since last year at Arizona State. Maynard spread the ball around, throwing to eight different receivers.
- Keenan Allen moved up to sixth all-time at Cal in career receptions with 164 after his nine grabs for 80 yards against the Buckeyes to pace the Bears. Na'il Benjamin is fifth with 165, Brian Treggs is fourth with 167 and Bobby Show is third with 180. Midway through the second quarter, he also registered his 2,000th-career receiving yard, and now has 2,049 for his career. Steve Rivera ranks 10th all time at Cal with 2,085 career receiving yards. Allen also had his first pass attempt since last year at Colorado. It went to Maynard for eight yards. For his career, Allen is 3-for-3 with 52 yards passing.
- Chris Harper hauled in a 19-yard touchdown reception - his second of the season - in the first quarter. He finished with three catches for 32 yards and the score.
- C.J. Anderson had a career-high four receptions for 65 yards. On the ground, Anderson carried the ball four times for 13 yards. Isi Sofele posted 21 rushes for 86 yards, including a season-best 26-yarder.
- After losing the time of possession battle the last two weeks, the Bears had the ball for 35:10 compared to 24:50 for Ohio State.
- Darius Powe made his first career catch in the first quarter. He later hauled in a 36-yard reception in the third quarter.
- Keni Kaufusi earned his second career forced fumble on the last play of the first quarter. He and Brennan Scarlett picked up their second career tackles for loss, as well. Todd Barr also registered a tackle for loss.
- Alex Logan was Cal's leading tackler with a personal-best seven takedowns. Michael Lowe also tied his career high in tackles with five.
- Steve Williams caught his fourth career interception, first of this season.

## Parking/Transportation

### Gameday

Parking at Cal is always at a premium and visitors are encouraged to use public transportation. The Downtown Berkeley BART station is located about a mile west of Memorial Stadium, in close proximity to Haas Pavilion, Edwards Stadium/Goldman Field, the Hellman Tennis Courts and Spieker Aquatics Complex. Hourly guest parking on non-football gamedays is available in the MLK Student Union and RSF garages along Bancroft Way adjacent to Haas Pavilion and at the Underhill Garage.

Underhill also serves as the football gameday parking location. Entrances are off either Channing Way or Haste Street, just west of College Avenue. The lot is about three blocks from Memorial Stadium. Media can either take the short walk to media will call (located in the third-floor lobby of the Simpson Center adjacent to Memorial Stadium) or use a media-only shuttle that begins running two hours before game time. A media shuttle is also available post-game from the pregame dropoff point along Warring Street to the Underhill Garage.

Parking passes cannot be left at will call on gamedays and must be picked up or mailed in advance.

Television crews should order parking passes for their crews by sending in the Special Event Parking Arrangements form found on the university's website (pt.berkeley.edu) in advance. Request the Underhill Garage for football games. Note that the campus parking office does not accept credit cards – only cash or check.

### Non-Gameday

**MLK Student Union Garage** – Paid parking is available at the MLK Student Union Garage located on the north side of Bancroft Way between Telegraph Avenue and Dana Street (basketball gameday media parking lot) about five blocks to the west of the Simpson Center and Memorial Stadium. If you park here, you would then need to walk east on Bancroft Way until you reach the venue.

**Public Transportation** – Public transportation is highly recommended when visiting Berkeley. There are multiple public transportation options that lead directly to Memorial Stadium and Witter Rugby Field. BART has a station in downtown Berkeley about a half-mile west of the venue. Please visit bart.org, actransit.org or 511.org for more information.

**Recreational Sports Facility Garage** – Paid parking is available at the Recreational Sports Facility Garage located on the north side of Bancroft Way between Telegraph Avenue and Dana Street (basketball gameday media parking lot) about six blocks to the west of Witter Rugby Field. If you park here, you would then need to walk east on Bancroft Way until you reach the venue.

**Street** – Paid parking is available all day on weekends and after 5 p.m. PT on weekdays along Stadium Rim Way. The payment machine is located in the southeast corner of Witter lot and accepts only \$1 and \$5 bills. No other forms of payment are available. Limited two-hour free and paid street parking (check signs) may be available on streets near Memorial Stadium/Simpson Center, with most options just south along Piedmont Avenue, Prospect Street, Channing Way or Warring Street.

**Underhill Garage** – Paid parking is available at the Underhill Garage located at the corner of Channing Way and College Avenue (football gameday media parking lot) about five blocks to the southwest of Witter Rugby Field. If you park here, you would then need to walk north on College Avenue to Bancroft Way and then east on Bancroft Way until you reach the venue.

**Witter Lot** – Paid parking in the vicinity of Witter Rugby Field is available in the adjacent Witter Lot located just south of Centennial Drive near the corner of Centennial and Stadium Rim Way on a first-come, first-served basis. The payment machine is located in the southeast corner of the lot and accepts only \$1 and \$5 bills. No other forms of payment are available. If you park here, you would then need to walk down the hill on Stadium Rim Way on the south side of the stadium keeping the stadium on your right until you reach the Simpson Center.

Pregame meals and drinks are available on the media level of the press box (seventh floor).

Access to the internet is available through both wireless and an ethernet connection, and passwords and usernames will be distributed on gamedays.

## Photographers

Field photographers must wear a photo vest at all times, in addition to a photo credential. Photo credentials are not distributed in advance and must be picked up on gamedays along with photo vests at media will call on the third floor Simpson Center. Photo vests will require an identification card to be left until the vests are returned.

NCAA rules limit shooting to outside the restraining line enclosing the playing field and outside the 25-yard lines (the team area).

In addition, the photographers and videographers are welcome to use the photo deck located on level six of the press box.

## Postgame Media Work Area

The Peter E. Haas Press Box at Memorial Stadium also serves as the postgame media work location. The area is equipped with desk space, electrical outlets and internet access. Final statistical game books, as well as postgame notes, quotes and other relevant media materials will be distributed.
