Kickoff – Cal vs. Stanford (Saturday, Oct. 20, Noon PT)

California, winners of its last two games over UCLA and Washington State, will try to make it three in a row when the Golden Bears host Stanford (No. 20 BCS/No. 22 AP/No. 23 USA Today) this Saturday in the 115th edition of the Big Game. The Cardinal comes to Berkeley having played overtime contests in each of its last two games, winning at home against Arizona before losing last Saturday at Notre Dame. Stanford enters the Big Game in third place in the North Division in the Pac-12, with Cal a half-game behind the Cardinal in fourth.

A key to this season's Big Game could be the effectiveness of a rejuvenated Cal rushing attack against a Stanford defense that ranks second in the Pac-12 and seventh nationally against the run, allowing only 89.5 yards per contest. Cal has averaged 220.7 yards rushing per game over its past three contests, including a season-high 318 yards in its most recent outing at Washington State that were the most since the Golden Bears rolled up 342 against Eastern Washington in 2009. For the season, Cal is averaging 195.0 yards per game on the ground and is ranked third in the Pac-12 and No. 38 nationally.

The Cal defense has also forced eight turnovers in the past two weeks, including six interceptions, with the Cardinal giving up only eight turnovers all year (second lowest in the Pac-12).

Quick Hitters

- Keenan Allen has moved up to second all time at Cal in career receptions with 196 and is six shy of all-time leader Geoff McArthur (202, 2000-04), while his 2,466 career receiving yards rank third in school history, his seven 100-yard games are sixth and his 16 touchdown catches are seventh. Allen has caught at least one pass in every game he's played at Cal (31), which ranks tied for eighth nationally and tied for first in the Pac-12. He is Cal's leading receiver in 2012 with 52 catches for 633 yards and five touchdowns.

- Cal rushed for 318 yards as a team last Saturday at Washington State, surpassing the 300-yard mark for the first time since 2010 against UCLA (304) and racking up the most since 342 vs. Eastern Washington in 2009. In the last three games, the Bears have averaged 220.7 rushing yards per contest.

- The Cal defense has held its last two opponents, UCLA and Washington State, to 17 points each. In addition to the low scoring totals, the Bears have forced six interceptions in those two games, with eight turnovers total.

- Cal has 11 defenders with at least 30 tackles. Josh Hill is Cal's leader with 47, with Steve Williams (46) and Nick Forbes (43) ranking a close second and third.

- Cal has won its past two games, both conference games. If Cal wins on Saturday, it would mark the Bears' first three-game winning streak since the first three contests of the 2011 season. The last three-game conference winning streak happened in 2009 when Cal beat UCLA, Washington State and Arizona State in consecutive weeks.

- Head coach Jeff Tedford is 7-3 all-time in the Big Game and needs one more victory to become Cal's all-time leader in victories over Stanford. He is currently tied with the legendary Pappy Waldorf at seven.

- The 115th Big Game marks the 30th anniversary of "The Play" that gave Cal an improbable 25-20 victory over Stanford in 1982.

Big Game Series History

Stanford holds an all-time series lead of 57-46-11 over the first 114 Big Games played between the teams in a series that began in 1892 with a 14-10 Stanford victory before an overflow crowd of 20,000 at the Haight Grounds in San Francisco. Cal has won seven of the 10 meetings since Jeff Tedford became the Bears' head coach in 2002, but the Cardinal has won two in a row, including a 31-28 win on The Farm last season and a 48-14 victory the last time the teams met in Berkeley in 2010. In last season's matchup, the Bears just missed pulling off an upset over an eighth-ranked Cardinal team. The last time Cal beat Stanford was a 34-28 triumph in 2009 on The Farm when the Bears beat a 14th-ranked Cardinal squad that was armed with the likes of current NFL players Andrew Luck and Toby Gerhart. The victory came in dramatic fashion when Mike Mohamed intercepted Luck at Cal's three-yard line in the waning moments of the game as the Cardinal was driving for a potential game-winning score. Cal's last victory over the Cardinal in Berkeley came in 2008 with a 37-16 win over a Jim Harbaugh-coached squad. Prior to Tedford's arrival, Stanford had its longest win streak of the series with seven consecutive Big Game victories from 1995-2001. Cal has won five in a row twice, from 1919-23 and 2002-06, the latter during Tedford's first five seasons as Cal's head coach. The Bears also had an eight-year unbeaten string from 1947-54, winning six times and tying twice. The teams have played every season since that first meeting in 1892 other than during World War I (1915-17) and World War II (1943-45). The schools also met 10 times between 1906-18 that are not counted in the official series records because they played rugby rather than football.

Saturday's game also marks the 30th anniversary of "The Play". In the 1982 version of the Big Game, Cal beat Stanford on a five-lateral, 57-yard kickoff return that will forever be remembered as "The Play." Trailing 20-19, the Bears received Stanford's kickoff with just four seconds left. Cal proceeded to travel the length of the field and march through both the Stanford defense and the Stanford Band to produce an improbable 25-20 victory. "The Play" has gone down as one of, if not the most, memorable and spectacular plays in the history of college football.

Keenan Allen Nears School Receptions Record

Keenan Allen continues to move up Cal's all-time charts and is now second on the school's all-time list for receptions and six shy of Geoff McArthur's school record of 202 catches from 2000-04. Allen now has 196 receptions after his performance last Saturday at Washington State when he posted season highs of 11 catches for 166 yards and also had his team-leading fifth receiving touchdown of the campaign – 16th of his career – that came on a season-long 69-yard reception. He also moved up to third in career receiving yards with 2,466 yards and extended his streak to 31 straight contests with a reception – every game he's played at Cal. That streak currently ranks tied for eighth in the nation and tied for first in the Pac-12.

Allen is the Bears' leading receiver through seven games with 52 receptions, 633 receiving yards and five touchdown catches. Allen ranks tied for 11th nationally and is third in the Pac-12 in receptions per game (7.43), while he is 18th nationally and leads the conference in punt returns (13.07 ypr). Allen is also 25th nationally and sixth in the Pac-12 in receiving yards (90.43 rpg), and 56th nationally and eighth in the Pac-12 in all purpose yardage (122.10 ypg). He is tied for seventh in the conference in scoring touchdowns with seven (6.0 ppg), adding two others on a 39-yard run vs. Nevada and a 69-yard punt return against Southern Utah.

Close Battles to the End in All Four Losses

In each of the four games Cal has lost this season, the Golden Bears have been within one score in the fourth quarter. In the season opener, Cal was edged by Nevada, 31-24, but the game was tied until Nevada's game-winning touchdown with 0:36 remaining. The Bears nearly pulled off an upset at then-No. 12 Ohio State, tying the game at 28-28 in the fourth quarter before being beat on a 72-yard touchdown pass with 3:26 to go. A pair of Vincenzo D'Amato field goals in the third quarter brought Cal to within 17-9 of USC the following week before the Trojans put the game away with 10 fourth-quarter points. Against Arizona State, the Bears pulled within three of the Sun Devils on Keenan Allen's touchdown reception at the 9:33 mark in the fourth quarter before eventually falling, 27-17.

Tough Schedule With No Bye Week

Cal's strength of schedule for its seven games played is currently rated 12th nationally in the Sagarin NCAA football ratings. The team was as high as second through the first six games that included four losses to teams that have combined to post a record of 23-3 (.885) in Ohio State (7-0), Nevada (6-1), USC (5-1) and Arizona State (5-1). The Golden Bears have played three teams ranked in the top 25 this season at the time of their contest in Ohio State (then No. 12 AP), USC (then No. 12 USA Today/No. 13 AP) and UCLA (then No. 25 AP). Cal still has three teams currently in the top 25 remaining on the schedule in Oregon (No. 2 AP/No. 2 USA Today/No. 3 BCS), Oregon State (No. 8 BCS/No. 8 AP/No. 11 USA Today) and Stanford (No. 20/No. 22 AP/No. 23 USA Today) that have combined for a record of 15-2 (.882). Also, the Bears essentially do not have a bye week during their 12-game regular-season schedule because their bye comes in the week after their regular-season finale at Oregon State on November 17.

Going For Three in a Row

If Cal beats Stanford, it would mark the Bears' first three-game winning streak since the first three contests of 2011. The most-recent three-game conference winning streak happened in 2009 when Cal beat UCLA, Washington State and Arizona State on the last three Saturdays in October.

A Decade of Sustained Success Under Jeff Tedford

Cal averaged 7.9 wins per year in the first 10 seasons (2002-11) under head coach Jeff Tedford and ranked tied for third among Pac-10 teams in victories during that period. After a brief one-year absence in 2010, Tedford led the Golden Bears back to a bowl game in 2011 with a trip to the Holiday Bowl against Texas. Tedford's most recent victory when the Bears won at Washington State on Oct. 13, 2012, was his 82nd career win and also his 50th conference triumph. Tedford is Cal's all-time winningest coach with an overall record of 82-52 (.612) and has an opportunity on Saturday to also become the school's all-time leader in Big Game wins. He is currently tied with the legendary Pappy Waldorf, posting a 7-3 mark in the Big Game. Below is a look at Cal's year-by-year results and bowl appearances in the Tedford era.

Zach Maynard's Second Season as Starting QB

Zach Maynard has completed 126-of-204 passes for 1,537 yards in 2012, with 10 touchdown throws, including at least one in six of seven contests, and seven interceptions for a passer efficiency rating of 134.37, which ranks 56th nationally while his career passer efficiency mark of 129.55 is eighth all-time at Cal. Maynard's top game of the season came when he completed 25-of-30 passes (career high 83.3%) for 295 yards, threw for four touchdowns and rushed for another in a win against UCLA, with the five touchdowns he was responsible for a career best. It was the second time of his career (at Colorado, 2011) and the first time in a non-overtime game that Maynard threw four touchdown passes. The passing yards were also a season high. Maynard continued his strong play in his following game at Washington State, connecting with Keenan Allen for a 69-yard touchdown while going 14-of-23 for 189 yards. He also rushed 10 times for a career-best 78 yards and his third rushing score of the season as well as the seventh in his career.

Top Three Rushers Reach 1,000 Yards on The Ground

Cal's top three rushers – C.J. Anderson (72-498-4TD), Isi Sofele (87-417-2TD) and Brendan Bigelow (23-277-2TD) – have combined for 1,192 yards on the ground through the first seven games of the regular season. Collectively, Cal's rushing attack ranks third in the Pac-12, with Sofele, Anderson and Bigelow accounting for 170.3 of the team's 195.0 yards per game rushing average. Cal has had nine 1,000-yard rushers in the last 10 campaigns and had its top two rushers combine for 1,500 or more yards in each of the last nine seasons. Anderson paced the Bears in rushing for the third time this season and the second consecutive game at Washington State with 112 yards on 15 carries and a career-high-tying two touchdowns. The game before he posted career highs of 151 rushing yards and 21 carries against UCLA in a contest in which he also had a career-long 68-yard run and a receiving touchdown. Sofele has a pair of 100-yard rushing games this season (105 vs. Arizona State; 104 vs. Southern Utah), while Bigelow rushed for a career-high 160 yards on only four carries at Ohio State. One of Bigelow's runs was an 81-yard touchdown that was the longest rush by a Cal player since a 93-yard touchdown run by Jahvid Best at UCLA in 2009, the longest run by an opponent in the history of Ohio Stadium, and the second-longest run by a Pac-12 player in 2012. Bigelow also had another score of 59 yards against the Buckeyes. In the last three games, Cal has averaged 220.7 yards rushing as a team.

New Heroes Emerge

There have been several players emerge for the Golden Bears over the past few games. In the Arizona State contest it was Avery Sebastian who picked up a career-high 14 tackles in his first career start that are also tied for the most by a Pac-12 player in 2012. Against UCLA, players that had breakout games included Kameron Jackson, Michael Lowe and Richard Rodgers. Jackson equaled a Pac-12 season high with three interceptions, while Lowe had a career-high nine tackles and an interception that he returned 57 yards and Rodgers posted career bests of seven catches for 135 yards, including a 50-yarder that was the longest reception of his career and at the time the longest by a Cal player this season. Also, inside linebackers Nick Forbes and Jalen Jefferson shared the team lead in tackles against the Bruins as each recorded a career-high 10, with Forbes also adding his first career forced fumble and fumble recovery. Neither was in the starting lineup when the season began. Lowe added another interception at Washington State.

D'Amato Leads Pac-12 in Field Goal Percentage

Vincenzo D'Amato has made each of the last six field goals he has attempted and now leads the Pac-12 in field goal percentage (10-15, 66.7%) on the footsteps of 2011 placekicker Giorgio Tavecchio, who became the first Cal player to ever lead the conference in field goal percentage last season. D'Amato started his current streak at USC when he tied his career best by making the final three of his four field goals attempts, equaling a mark he had previously set two games earlier by hitting all three of his attempts vs. Southern Utah. D'Amato was also good on his only attempts vs. Arizona State and UCLA, and at Washington State when he connected on a career-long 52-yarder, which is also the second-longest in the Pac-12 in 2012. In the national and conference rankings, D'Amato is tied for 24th nationally and tied for second in the Pac-12 in field goals made (1.43 fgmpg), and tied for 84th nationally and 10th in the conference in scoring (7.43 ppg). He is also fourth in the Pac-12 in scoring among kickers. D'Amato has a team-high 52 points, adding 22-of-25 extra points to his 10 field goals.

Leininger Improving With Punts

True freshman Cole Leininger has continued to improve in his role taking over for Cal's former standout punter and this year's NFL punting leader Bryan Anger now of the Jacksonville Jaguars. In particular, Leininger has posted four consecutive punting averages of 41.8 yards or better in his last five contests. Against Washington State, he booted a career-long 61-yard punt with an average of 45.5. He booted punts of 54 and 51 yards vs. Arizona State. At Ohio State, he recorded his best average on the year at 47.0. He also had a 43.0 average at USC and 42.0 versus UCLA. For the season, he is averaging 41.2 yards per punt despite averages of 38.6 and 30.7 over 10 punts in his first two games.

Four Bear Defenders Rank in Pac-12's Top 30 in Tackles

Four Bears – Josh Hill, Steve Williams, Jalen Jefferson and Nick Forbes – rank in the top 30 in the Pac-12 in tackles per game. Hill is tied for 13th (6.7 tpg), while Williams is tied for 17th (6.6 tpg), Jefferson is tied for 22nd (6.3 tpg) and Forbes is 29th (6.1 tpg).

Stingy Defense Sparked By Turnovers

The Cal defense has held its last two opponents, UCLA and Washington State, to 17 points each. In addition to the low scoring totals, the Bears forced six interceptions in those two games, eight turnovers total.

Anthony, Hill and Williams – Active Career Leaders

The defensive backfield trio of Marc Anthony, Josh Hill and Steve Williams each rank as Cal's active career leader in at least one category.

Hill, who has played in 43 career games with 27 starts, has 174 tackles to lead all players on the active roster, while his 47 stops on the season pace the Bears. His three career forced fumbles and two fumble recoveries are also both the most among active Cal players, while his one interception return for a touchdown is tied for first. In addition, Hill is tied for second among the team's active players with four career interceptions and third with 46 interception return yards, 18 pass breakups and 22 passes defended.

Anthony, who has played in 37 career games with 28 starts, is Cal's active career leader in interception return yards (93), while ranking tied for first in interception return touchdowns (1), second in passes defended (24), pass breakups (20) and tackles (120), and third in tackles for loss (11.0, -26 yards). Anthony is tied for first with 5.5 tackles for loss (-16 yards) in 2012.

Williams, who has played in 32 games with 23 starts, is Cal's active career leader in interceptions with six after snagging one in each of the last two games at Washington State and vs. UCLA. His three interceptions in 2012 are tied for first on the team. He also collected four pass breakups against the Cougars to become the Bears' active career leader with 22 (tied for 10th on all-time list) to give him a total of 28 passes defended to also pace the Bears' active players. He is also tied for second with two forced fumbles, third in tackles (116) and fourth in interception return yards (45). He currently ranks sixth in the Pac-12 in passes defended (1.43 pdpg) and tied for seventh in interceptions (0.43 ipg).

Turnover Margin a Key

The turnover battle has been emphasized since head coach Jeff Tedford's arrival at Cal in 2002 and rightly so. The Bears are 46-9 when committing fewer turnovers than opponents during the Tedford era, compared to 19-11 when turnovers are equal and 17-32 when opponents win the battle. In conference games, Cal is 29-7 with a positive margin in turnovers, 11-7 when the turnover table is tied and 10-26 with a deficit. A big key to the Bears' win against UCLA was forcing six turnovers, including the first three career interceptions by Kameron Jackson, which tied for the most in the Pac-12 this season and are the most by a single player in a game in the Tedford era. The six turnovers tied for the most in the Pac-12 this season and are the most the Bears have caused in the Tedford era. Last Saturday at Washington State, the Bears notched two more interceptions. Cal is tied for 44th in the nation in turnover margin (+.29), with 15 takeaways and 13 lost.

Bowling and Winning Bears

Cal has played in bowls eight of the last nine seasons, posting a school-record bowl game appearance streak of seven in a row from 2003-09 and a school-record-tying eight consecutive winning seasons from 2002-09 before both came to an end in 2010. However, the Bears started new streaks in both categories in 2011 with a return to the bowl scene at the Holiday Bowl and a 7-6 overall record. Cal has posted a 5-3 (.625) mark in bowl games in the Jeff Tedford era that also included a school-record four straight bowl wins from 2005-08. Cal won enough games to be bowl eligible but was ineligible to play in a bowl game in 2002 due to NCAA sanctions imposed prior to the arrival of Tedford.

Other Cal Notes From Washington State

Cal held Washington State to an opponent 36 yards rushing as a team ... Keenan Allen recorded his first tackle since 2010 ... Nathan Broussard, Darius Powe and Kameron Jackson posted their first career starts, and Broussard also garnered a sack ... Cal had 507 yards of total offense for its third game with 500 or more in 2012 ... Cal was successful on 6-of-12 third-down conversions and is now 12-of-23 (52.2%) in its last two contests ... Cal did not allow a sack for the first time in 2012 after giving up 26.0 in its previous four contests.

Bears As the Best, Against The Best

Cal is 15-8 when playing as a top-10 team and 36-21 when ranked in the top 25 since head coach Jeff Tedford became the head coach in 2002, while the Bears are 14-22 against ranked teams. In 2009, the Bears recorded back-to-back wins in consecutive weeks over nationally ranked teams for the first time since 1950, defeating No. 18 Arizona at Memorial Stadium before winning at No. 14 Stanford. Cal snapped an eight-game losing streak against ranked teams with a win over No. 25 UCLA on Oct. 6, 2012. Prior to not being ranked during the 2011 or 2012 campaigns, Cal had been among the nation's top 25 teams at one point in each of the previous seven seasons and eight times in nine campaigns from 2002-10.

Score 30 Points, Usually Win

Cal is 64-5 all-time when putting 30 points or more on the scoreboard under head coach Jeff Tedford. When the Bears don't score at least 30 points, their record under Tedford is 18-47.

Bears Strong On Punt Returns

Cal ranks second in the Pac-12 and 23rd nationally in punt returns with an average of 13.07 yards per return. Keenan Allen is the Bears' punt returner, ranking 18th nationally and first in the conference in punt returns (13.07 ypr). He is the only Cal player with a punt return in 2012, returning 14 punts for 183 yards including one 69 yards for a touchdown.

Home Field Advantage

Cal has a 43-12 record in its last 55 home games and is 39-11 at Memorial Stadium during the stretch, going 2-2 at Memorial Stadium in 2012 and also going 4-1 in home games at AT&T Park in 2011 while Memorial Stadium was being renovated.

Young Squad

Cal's current two-deep features 30 of the 56 positions manned by either a freshman (10) or sophomore (20).

Cal in the NFL

Cal has a total of 31 players on NFL rosters as of Oct. 15, 2012, which is the second-most among Pac-12 schools behind only USC, while the team's 25 former players on active 53-player rosters (does not include players on injured reserve and physically unable to perform lists) at the beginning of the 2012 NFL season was tied for ninth nationally. Cal has had 40 NFL Draft selections in the 10 drafts held since Jeff Tedford coached his first game at Cal in 2002, including eight first-rounders. Six former Cal players were chosen in the 2012 NFL Draft. The six draft selections tied for the second-most ever by Cal, who also had six players picked in both the 1977 and 2008 drafts. A school-record 10 Cal players were chosen in 1952. Offensive lineman Mitchell Schwartz (Cleveland Browns – No. 37 overall) and linebacker Mychal Kendricks (Philadelphia Eagles – No. 46 overall) were selected in the second round, followed by punter Bryan Anger (Jacksonville Jaguars – No. 70 overall) in the third round. Wide receiver Marvin Jones (Cincinnati Bengals – No. 166 overall) was taken in the fifth round. Defensive back D.J. Campbell (Carolina Panthers – No. 216 overall) and defensive lineman Trevor Guyton (Minnesota Vikings – No. 219 overall) were picked in the seventh round.

Academic Success Continues

Cal has posted 103 Pac-12 All-Academic honors in the first 10 seasons under head coach Jeff Tedford, second-most in the conference during that span. Nine Cal student-athletes were honored on the 2011 Pac-12 All-Academic Football Team, including four first-team selections in Mark Brazinski, Ernest Owusu, Mitchell Schwartz and John Tyndall.

In 2008, Alex Mack earned the Draddy Trophy (later renamed the Campbell Trophy) honoring college football's top scholar-athlete, while Mohamed was a finalist for the honor often referred to as the Academic Heisman in 2010 after earlier being given an NFF Scholar-Athlete Award. Giorgio Tavecchio was a semifinalist for the honor and a candidate for an NFF Scholar-Athlete Award in 2011.

A three-time member of the Pac-10/12 All-Academic team, Matt Summers-Gavin is a candidate for the Senior CLASS Award® and the Campbell Trophy presented by the National Football Foundation in 2012.

Back In Berkeley – Memorial Stadium Reopens in 2012

Since it opened in the fall of 1923, Memorial Stadium has produced scores of unforgettable memories for generations of Golden Bears. From the Wonder Teams of the 1920s to the Pappy Waldorf years mid-century to the current success attained under head coach Jeff Tedford, the facility has treated fans of all ages to many of the greatest moments in the history of Cal football. It stands as one of the most enduring symbols of the University of California campus and has served as a gathering point for students, alumni, faculty, staff and other supporters for nearly 90 years.

This fall, the historic building begins a new era following an extensive retrofit and renovation that brings it up to modern standards for fans and student-athletes alike, creating a more enjoyable environment for the hundreds of thousands of people who visit and partake in games every year – all while maintaining the architecture and character of the celebrated stadium.

Major construction on the \$321 million project got underway in December 2010, and barely 21 months later, the Golden Bears are able to call Memorial Stadium home once again.

The Renovation of Memorial Stadium

Preliminary work on the project, including installation of temporary bracing around the outer wall, hazardous material removal and interior demolition, began in June 2010. Major construction got underway in December 2010, starting with demolition of the interior bowl, soil excavation and wall shoring. The stadium is game-ready to host Cal football in September 2012, with work completed in early 2013.

The \$321 million renovation, which impacts all but the outer wall and the east-side seating area, capitalizes on the expertise of seismic engineers and campus experts that found a unique solution to protect the stadium and its users in case of an earthquake. Design features include concrete “seismic blocks” at the end zone where the Hayward Fault bisects the facility and a press box that can sway in a large-scale temblor. The solution came as a result of collaboration between the campus Seismic Review Committee, the architectural team and the structural engineers hired for the job.

The significant number of upgrades to the facility include three club levels for those participating in the Endowment Seating Program, a new press box, wider concourses, improved ADA access, and more restrooms and concession stands. Capacity has been reduced from 71,799 seats to 63,186.

The History of Memorial Stadium

Originally completed in November 1923, Memorial Stadium is dedicated to University of California, Berkeley students, alumni and other Californians who lost their lives in World War I. The building was then rededicated during halftime of Cal's game against UCLA on Oct. 6, 2012. Cal boasts an all-time record of 319-215-16 (.595) at Memorial Stadium. The Bears have enjoyed 12 undefeated home campaigns, including three during the Jeff Tedford era (2004, 2006, 2008). Cal has twice won eight home games in a season (1924, 1938). The Bears went 4-3 at Memorial Stadium in 2010, the last season before the renovation. Cal was 4-1 in their 2011 temporary home at AT&T Park and is 2-2 in its return to Memorial Stadium in 2012. Memorial Stadium is also home to one of the most memorable moments in college football history – “The Play” – Cal's five-lateral kickoff return on the final play of the 1982 Big Game to beat Stanford that will celebrate its 30th anniversary this Saturday.

Simpson Center For Student-Athlete High Performance

Cal football players train in the Simpson Center for Student-Athlete High Performance, a revolutionary student-athlete training, coaching, and applied sports science and sports medicine center that opened in January of 2012. The Simpson Center embodies the High Performance Initiative (HPI), Cal's innovative performance philosophy designed to build competitive advantage, maximize efficiency and enhance the student-athlete experience. A 142,000 square-foot facility, the Simpson Center is a state-of-the-art complex with year-round access for over 450 student-athletes. The Simpson Center is home to the locker rooms, meeting rooms and offices for Cal football and 12 Golden Bear Olympic sports for use on a daily basis. The signature feature of the Simpson Center is the High Performance Zone – a fully integrated training space with world-class strength and conditioning, sports medicine and sports science facilities and services. Developed with sports performance in mind, high quality equipment and an open layout provide impressive training options to prepare for the highest levels of competition. This multi-purpose space encompasses 18,700 square feet, spans two stories and stretches the length of a football field. Planned to accommodate 100 student-athletes at a time, Golden Bears are able to complete a full training session without the need to move or wait for equipment. The facility's weight room is outfitted with over 50,000 pounds of weight, 22 fully customized work stations with inlaid platforms that provide student-athletes with a state-of-the-art facility that incorporates the latest technology and adaptability in exercise and monitoring equipment. The 25-yard turf area is used for warm-ups, plyometrics, short agility work, medicine ball throws, rehabilitation and much more. Spin, Pilates, yoga and back classes are among the activities that take place in the fitness studio. Other features in the Simpson Center include a training room, rehabilitation facilities including underwater and AlterG treadmills, cold plunges, a medical suite, dining and nutrition and academic support area, team meeting room, locker room and player lounge – all just a few steps away.

A Golden Olympics for the Golden Bears

A total of 46 Golden Bear athletes, coaches and staff members represented Cal during the 2012 Summer Olympics in London, and together, they brought home a school-record tying 17 medals (11 gold, 1 silver, 5 bronze). The Bears have won 50 medals over the past three Olympics (16 in 2004, 17 in 2008, 17 in 2012), and they have captured 178 medals all-time (99 gold).

Storylines

- Defensive lineman Austin Clark's sister, Adrienne, is now training for the skeleton event to participate at the 2014 Winter Olympics. Adrienne is currently an assistant softball coach at her alma mater Hofstra, where she graduated in 2005 after playing four years of softball, once recording a string of 31 consecutive innings pitched in the NCAA Tournament without allowing a run that was the second most in NCAA history.
- Cal has six players who had fathers that also played at Cal. Wide receiver Jackson Bouza is the son of former Cal player and three-year letterwinner Matt Bouza (1978-80). Tight end Richard Rodgers' father, Richard Rodgers, Sr., lettered from 1980-83 was prominently involved in "The Play" in 1982 as the player who made the fourth of the five laterals. Wide receiver Bryce Treggs' father, Brian, was a wide receiver at Cal from 1988-91, while linebacker Hardy Nickerson's father, Hardy Sr., was a linebacker at Cal from 1983-86 and offensive lineman Dominic Galas' father, Tim, was an offensive lineman at Cal from 1979-82. Duke Moran's father, Michael, was a member of the Cal squad in 1979 and 1980 but did not earn a letter.
- Quarterback Austin Hinder is the grandson of Cal Athletic Hall of Famer Jim Hanifan, a longtime NFL and collegiate coach.
- Tailback Isi Sofele is one of eight siblings and a native of Utah.
- Bud "Dog" Turner is in his 43rd season involved with Cal football and likes to say that he is "halfway through his career".
- Tight end Jacob Wark is also a backup first baseman on Cal's baseball team that went to the College World Series in 2011.
- There are three sets of brothers on the team – wide receiver Keenan Allen and quarterback Zach Maynard, fullback Kameron and wide receiver Kaulin Krebs, and offensive linemen Jordan and Tyler Rigsbee.
- Five players are from Greensboro, North Carolina (Allen, wide receiver Maurice Harris, defensive lineman Gabe King, Maynard, linebacker Chris McCain).
- Placekicker Benjamin Calder and tailback Darren Ervin were high school teammates at Lamar High School in Houston.
- Defensive back Josh Hill and defensive linemen Kendrick Payne were high school teammates at Klein Forest High School in Houston.
- Quarterback Zach Kline and wide receiver Patrick Worstell were high school teammates at San Ramon Valley High School in Danville. Playing the guitar is a hobby of Kline.
- Defensive backs Adrian Lee and Steve Williams were high school teammates at Skyline High School in Dallas.
- Placekicker Vincenzo D'Amato is of Italian heritage, same as last year's placekicker Giorgio Tavecchio, who with the San Francisco 49ers for much of their 2012 training camp before being released.
- Cal has two players – offensive linemen Alejandro Crosthwaite (Rosarito Beach, Mexico) and Matt Williams (Liverpool, England) – that list hometowns outside the United States.
- Quarterback Joey Mahalic is a 23-year-old true freshman that spent five seasons as a pitcher with the Cleveland Indians after being drafted by the organization in the 32nd round of the 2007 MLB Draft, posting a 15-21 overall record with a 4.73 ERA and 223 strikeouts in 323.2 innings pitched.
- Fullback Tanner Mohr joined the team during spring practice after having played rugby for his first three years at Cal.
- Punter Steffan Mos attended Clairemont High School, the school where Fast Times at Ridgemont High was filmed.
- Wide receivers Keenan Allen and Griffin Piatt are both experienced piano players.
- Fullback Dasarte Yarnway and defensive back Tyre Ellison grew up together in Visitation Valley in San Francisco. Yarnway and his brother plan to start numerous nonprofit organizations to help the youth in Visitation Valley.
- Cal freshman long snapper Duke Moran has a couple of relatives that played for rival Stanford, with his grandfather playing college football for Pop Warner and aunt, Noel, swimming for the Cardinal and setting an American record in the 200 breast.

Jeff Tedford

Head Coach • 11th Season at Cal (82-52, .612)

Jeff Tedford has established Cal as one of the elite football programs in the Pac-12 and lifted the Golden Bears into the national discussion on a consistent basis. Since his arrival at Cal prior to the 2002 season, the Bears have won the third-most Pac-10/12 games during his first 10-plus campaigns and heading into 2012 had finished ranked among the nation's top 25 in four of the last eight seasons and been in the top 10 at some point in five of the past eight.

Cal posted a school-record run of seven straight bowl appearances from 2003-09 and is 5-3 in the postseason under Tedford. After a one-year absence, Tedford guided the Bears back to the bowl scene in 2011 with a trip to the Holiday Bowl. He is the only Cal mentor with more than two bowl victories, including a school-record string of four consecutive postseason wins from 2005-08. The Bears also put together a school-record-tying eight consecutive winning campaigns from 2002-09. Cal has twice posted a school-record-tying 10 wins under Tedford, the sixth and seventh times in school history, in 2004 and 2006.

Tedford boasts Cal's all-time record for victories with a 82-52 (.612) all-time mark at the school, surpassing the former record holder Andy Smith (74-16-7, 1916-25) during the 2011 season. Tedford has now coached 134 games at Cal, setting the school record for most games coached during the 2010 campaign. Only two others – Pappy Waldorf (103, 1947-56) and Stub Allison (102, 1935-44) – have coached 100 or more games at Cal. Tedford also has the school record with 26 road wins and is 50-40 (.556) in conference games. To top it off, he is 7-3 in the Big Game, equaling Waldorf's school record of seven wins against Stanford.

In the first 10 NFL Drafts that have occurred with Tedford as Cal's head coach, the Bears have had 40 players selected in the NFL Draft, including eight first-round picks. As of October 15, 2012, Cal's 31 former players on NFL rosters according to ESPN.com rank second among Pac-12 schools, while the team's 25 former players on active 53-player rosters (does not include players on injured reserve and physically unable to perform lists) at the beginning of the 2012 NFL season was tied for ninth nationally.

Tedford has also earned a reputation as a strong recruiter, with each of his last three classes from 2010-12 being ranked in the top 15 nationally. Prior to the 2011 campaign, Sporting News bestowed the honor of the Pac-12's best recruiter on Tedford.

All of this at the head of a program that won just one game in 2001, the year prior to his arrival. The Cal football renaissance over the past decade rates as one of the most impressive turnarounds in college football history.

But Tedford's teams have not only got it done on the field, they've also got it done in the classroom. His players have been recognized as Pac-12 All-Academic honorees 103 times since his arrival. Of the 202 seniors who have played for Tedford in his first 10 seasons, 178 (88%) earned their college degrees and/or have gone on to NFL careers.

Nationally, Cal has also had multiple Heisman Trophy candidates under Tedford, including J.J. Arrington (2004), Marshawn Lynch (2006), DeSean Jackson (2007) and Jahvid Best (2009).

Other national recognition has come the Bears way in recent years. Alex Mack was the winner of the 2008 Draddy Award (often referred to as the "academic Heisman"), while Mike Mohamed was one of 16 players across the country in the 2010 National Football Foundation's Scholar-Athlete Class of 2010 and a finalist for the prestigious honor won by Mack now known as the William V. Campbell Trophy. In 2006, the Bears had a pair of players collect national awards. Jackson was the recipient of the inaugural Randy Moss Award as the top returner in the country, while Daymeion Hughes earned The Lott IMPACT Trophy, given to a defensive player to equally recognize his athletic performance and personal character.

Despite his success as a coach and mentor, Tedford still follows a basic philosophy.

"We try to focus on one game at a time and try to reach our full potential," Tedford said emphatically.

And he still values each and every member of his football team.

"Whether it is the guys who are suited up, the guys who are going to play 50-60 plays or the guys who aren't going to play at all, I want them all to understand that they are very important to the success of the program," he said. "Their contributions are invaluable."

Tedford's hard work and dedication not only inspire his players, it has also made him a role model to the young men in the Cal program.

"Coach Tedford wasn't just a coach, I think of him as more like a father figure," said All-Pac-10 linebacker and current NFL player Desmond Bishop, who was a key player on the Packers' Super Bowl XLV winning squad. "He taught us lessons about life. He taught us to have integrity, to have character. He prepared us to be men."

California-Stanford (The Big Game): Last Time, Series History and Notes

STANFORD – Zach Maynard finished with 280 yards passing and two touchdown throws for the Golden Bears, but Cal fell short to Stanford, 31-28.

Cal scored 15 points in the fourth quarter, including a C.J. Anderson 1-yard touchdown with 14 seconds left. But Stanford recovered the onside kick to clinch the contest.

In the fourth quarter, Maynard led a 68-yard drive ending with a three-yard TD pass to Spencer Hagan on third down. After a two-point conversion on a pass to Marvin Jones, Cal cut Stanford's lead to 28-21 with 10:53 left.

Jordan Williamson, who missed a 33-yard field goal wide left in the first half, kicked a 35-yard field to give the Cardinal a two-score cushion.

That proved pivotal when Anderson's TD run for the Bears with 14 seconds left pulled Cal within 31-28. But Stanford tight end Coby Fleener recovered the onside kick.

Steve Williams stepped in front of a falling Ty Montgomery to intercept Andrew Luck's pass midway through the first quarter and return it 49 yards for a score that was called back because of an illegal block in the back.

But three plays later, Maynard found Keenan Allen for a 17-yard TD pass and a 10-7 Bear advantage. GioGio Tavecchio kicked his second field goal of the game from 19 yards to give Cal a 13-7 lead in the second quarter.

Game 1 Nevada 31, at Cal 24

September 1, 2012 • TV: Pac-12 Networks • Attendance: 63,186

BERKELEY – Nevada quarterback Cody Fajardo engineered the winning drive by throwing a 14-yard pass to Zach Sudfeld on third-and-4 from the Cal 38 and a 19-yarder to Brandon Wimberly that set up Stephon Jefferson's winning score, as Nevada topped Cal, 31-24, in the Bears' first game in the newly-renovated California Memorial Stadium.

Cal quarterback Zach Maynard returned after being benched for the first three series as punishment for missing a tutoring session earlier this summer to throw two touchdown passes for Cal. But he also lost a fumble deep in Nevada territory in the fourth quarter as the Bears lost at home to Nevada for the second time in 25 tries and first since 1903.

Cal appeared to seize the momentum in the third quarter when Keenan Allen answered Jefferson's second touchdown run with an elusive 39-yard score on a reverse.

Khalid Wooten fumbled the ensuing kickoff, but Cal had to settle for a field goal by Vincenzo D'Amato that cut the lead to 21-17. Maynard then fumbled at the Nevada 21 at the end of a scramble early in the fourth quarter.

The Bears did tie the game later in the fourth on Maynard's 13-yard TD pass to Chris Harper, but could never take the lead.

There wasn't much to celebrate early for the sellout crowd of 63,186 as the offense sputtered behind backup Allan Bridgford, who completed two of his nine passes and the defense once again struggled against Nevada's pistol offense.

Maynard led the Bears to a score on his third drive in the game, connecting on a 37-yard TD pass to freshman Bryce Treggs.

Notes

- The Bears have an all-time record of 73-41-4 in season openers over the first 117 campaigns of Cal football that began in 1882. In the 2011 season opener, Cal defeated Fresno State, 36-21, at Candlestick Park in the Battle By the Bay. The Bears' most recent season-opening win at Memorial Stadium was a 52-3 victory over UC Davis on Sept. 4, 2010.

- This game was the first played in the newly-renovated California Memorial Stadium and the first at the venue since a 16-13 loss to Washington on Nov. 27, 2010. The most recent win by the Bears in Memorial Stadium was a 50-17 victory over Arizona State on Oct. 23, 2010.

- The game was a sellout of 63,186. Cal had a streak of 43 consecutive games of at least 50,000 fans that was snapped in the 2010 season finale against Washington. The last Cal sellout came against USC on Oct. 3, 2009 (71,799).

- Cal leads the all-time series with Nevada, 22-3-1 (not including an additional 7-1 mark against the Wolf Pack from 1906-14 when both schools played rugby instead of football). Prior to today, the teams had played only twice since 1945, a 33-15 Cal win in Berkeley on Sept. 21, 1996, and a 52-31 victory by Nevada in Reno on Sept. 17, 2010.

- Keenan Allen extended his streak of consecutive games with a reception to 25, every game he's played at Cal. Allen scored his first touchdown of 2012 on a reverse that went for 39 yards in the third quarter. It was Allen's second rushing TD of his career, with the first one coming against UC Davis in 2010. On the receiving end, Allen paced the Bears with six catches for 67 yards.

- For the first time in his Cal career, C.J. Anderson paced Cal in rushing, garnering 66 yards on 14 attempts. Isi Sofele rushed five times for 21 yards. Sofele also caught three passes for 33 yards.

- Bryce Treggs' first career reception was good for a 37-yard touchdown reception from Maynard. Treggs became the third Cal player in the last five seasons to score a touchdown on his first career receptions, joining Anthony Miller with the winning touchdown in the 2008 Emerald Bowl victory over Miami (FL) and Spencer Hagan against Presbyterian in 2011. Treggs caught three passes in the game for 62 yards and the score.

- Another true freshman wide receiver, Chris Harper, hauled in a game-tying touchdown pass for the Bears halfway through the fourth quarter on a 13-yard reception from Maynard. Harper finished the day with five catches for 57 yards and the TD. The last time two Cal true freshmen both scored in their first game at Cal was Marshawn Lynch and Justin Forsett on Sept. 4, 2004, at Air Force.

- Marc Anthony collected a career-high 3.0 tackles for loss. Following Allen's touchdown, the first fumble of 2012 was recovered by Kameron Jackson. Playing in his first career game, Todd Barr secured 1.5 tackles, including a 0.5 sack and a 1.5 tackle for loss. Keni Kaufusi notched his first career forced fumble, to go along with a career-best 1.0 tackles for loss.

- Making their first career starts were Chris Adcock, Allan Bridgford, Alex Logan, Jordan Riggsbee, Richard Rodgers, Brennan Scarlett and Bryce Treggs. Also, Matt Summers-Gavin started his 26th game, the most among active Cal players, and Brian Schwenke started his 25th game.

Game 2 at Cal 50, Southern Utah 31

September 8, 2012 • TV: Pac-12 Networks • Attendance: 57,745

BERKELEY – California cornerback Marc Anthony scored on a 61-yard interception return in the fourth quarter and the Golden Bears beat Southern Utah, 50-31.

Keenan Allen had two touchdowns, one on a 69-yard punt return, to help the Bears notch their first victory at newly renovated Memorial Stadium.

Cal (1-1) had 518 yards of offense, and in the fourth quarter, forced two turnovers and scored 30 points.

Defensive end Aaron Tipoti recovered a fumble on Southern Utah's next possession, and Vincenzo D'Amato's third field goal made it 37-17.

Allen, who caught a 19-yard touchdown from quarterback Zach Maynard on the first play of the fourth quarter, made it 44-17 with a long punt return. Allen fumbled the ball, but recovered it and then broke free down the right sideline on his way into the endzone.

C.J. Anderson and Isi Sofele both added short touchdown runs, and Daniel Lasco scored on a 77-yard run in the fourth quarter.

Cal scored on four consecutive possessions in the second quarter to go in front.

Anderson's 7-yard touchdown run capped a 94-yard drive for the Bears. Sofele scored on a 12-yard run and D'Amato added a pair of field goals to give Cal a 20-3 lead.

Southern Utah stayed close and pulled within 20-17 midway through the third quarter on Sorensen's 5-yard touchdown pass to Brown, but the Thunderbirds couldn't slow Cal down in the fourth.

Notes

- With Cal's victory over Southern Utah, Jeff Tedford earned his 80th career victory as head coach at Cal. Tedford is the Golden Bears' all-time winningest coach.

- This was the first-ever meeting between Cal and Southern Utah. The Bears are now 6-0 all-time against FCS opponents. Last year, Cal defeated FCS foe Presbyterian at AT&T Park, 63-12.

- Cal has now won 42 of its last 53 home games. With 50 points scored, the Bears improved to 62-5 all-time when scoring 30 or more points. The Bears are also 41-2 when scoring 40 or more and 15-0 when scoring 50 under Tedford. The last time Cal scored 50 or more points was a 63-12 victory against Presbyterian last season.

- After hauling in five catches for 57 yards against Nevada last week, true freshman Chris Harper posted seven catches for 94 yards against Southern Utah. Harper is now Cal's leading receiver on the season with 12 catches for 151 yards and a touchdown, while Allen is second with 11 catches for 136 yards and a touchdown.

- Isi Sofele was Cal's leading rusher on the day with 19 carries for 104 yards and a touchdown. The 104 yards gave Sofele his sixth career 100-yard performance, which ties him for sixth all-time at Cal. The previous five 100-yard games all came in 2011 with the last one occurring in the regular season finale at Arizona State.

- C.J. Anderson notched his ninth career rushing touchdown. The touchdown ended Cal's season-long drive of seven plays, 94 yards in 2:08. Today was the fifth time both Anderson and Sofele have scored a rushing TD in the same game, with the last occurrence happening at ASU last season.

- Daniel Lasco rushed 77 yards for his first career touchdown, which was also the longest rush of the season for the Bears. The run gave Cal 500 yards of total offense (520) for the first time since last year against Presbyterian (581)

- Keenan Allen extended his streak of consecutive games with a reception to 26, every game he's played at Cal. Allen ended the day with five catches for 69 yards and his first receiving touchdown of 2012. Entering the game ranked second in the Pac-12 and tied for 24th nationally in punt returns, Allen took a fourth-quarter punt back 69 yards for his first career punt return for a touchdown. On the season, Allen has returned six punts for 133 yards and a touchdown.

- Marc Anthony picked off his fourth career interception, and first of 2012, and returned it 61 yards for a touchdown. The last time Cal intercepted a pass and returned it for a TD was Josh Hill against Utah last season. The 61-yarder is the longest since Mychal Kendricks' 68-yard pick-six at UCLA in 2009.

- Jalen Jefferson garnered his first career tackle, and ended the day pacing the Bears with nine tackles. In the fourth quarter, Aaron Tipoti registered his first career fumble recovery. J.P. Hurrell and Brennan Scarlett secured their first career sacks, and Hurrell would go on to post three sacks (-15 yards) on the day. Nick Forbes (8) reached a new career high in tackles. Nathan Broussard earned his first career 0.5 tackle for loss.

- Vincenzo D'Amato was a personal-best 3-for-3 on field goals today, making him 4-for-5 on the season. His 47-yard field goal in the fourth quarter tied his career high (at Oregon, 2009). D'Amato also picked up a career-high 14 points on the day.

Game 3

at No. 12 Ohio State 35, Cal 28

September 15, 2012 • TV: ABC • Attendance: 105, 232

COLUMBUS, Ohio – Braxton Miller lofted a 72-yard touchdown pass to Devin Smith with 3:26 left and Christian Bryant snuffed out the Golden Bears' last chance with an interception as the 12th-ranked Buckeyes edged the Golden Bears, 35-28, at Ohio Stadium.

Cal (1-2) amassed 512 yards of offense (second-straight week the Bears went over 500 yards of total offense), including 331 yards to 173 for Ohio State in the second half alone. The Bears were victimized by three missed field goals and a touchdown that was called back by a penalty.

Ohio State built a 20-7 lead at half, but the Cal defense held the Buckeyes to just 25 yards and no first downs on 14 plays in the third quarter.

Brendan Bigelow raced 81 yards on his first carry of the game -- the longest run ever by an opposing back in 90-year-old Ohio Stadium and the longest by a Cal player since Jahvid Best's 93-yard touchdown run at UCLA in 2009. Maynard then kept on a one-yard sneak to give Cal a 21-20 lead early in the fourth quarter.

Just two plays after Ohio State took a 28-21 lead, Bigelow, who finished with career-best 160 yards on only four carries, burst through the Ohio State defense for a 16-yard run and then topped that on the next play with a 59-yarder to tie the game at 28.

Miller promptly turned the ball over by throwing an interception directly to Cal defensive back Steve Williams.

The Bears patiently drove to the Ohio State 25, where the drive stalled. On fourth-and-1, junior kicker Vincenzo D'Amato came out for a 42-yard field goal. He was wide left with 4:20 left, his third kick that sailed left of the mark on the day, missing twice from 42 and once from 40 yards.

Now down by seven after OSU's 72-yard score, the Bears still had a shot to tie, but Maynard overthrew a receiver with 1:09 left and Bryant picked it off.

Notes

- This game was the seventh in the series between Cal and Ohio State, and the Buckeyes lead the series 6-1.
- This was also the seventh road game in the Jeff Tedford era that was played in a different time zone and started before noon PT. The Golden Bears now have a 5-2 record in those contests.
- This was the second game in a row that Cal boasted over 500 yards of total offense (512). They outgained Ohio State by 100 yards (412). Against Southern Utah, the Bears had 518 yards.
- Brendan Bigelow scored on a career-long 81-yard touchdown run. It was Cal's longest play from scrimmage this season. It is the longest rush since Jahvid Best's 93-yard touchdown run at UCLA in 2009. Bigelow followed that with a 59-yard touchdown later in the game. He ended the day with a personal-best 160 rushing yards and 234 all-purpose yards. His previous career best in all-purpose yards was 137 against Presbyterian last year.
- Zach Maynard finished 26-for-37 for 280 yards with a touchdown, an interception and a one-yard rushing touchdown. The completions were a career high. It was also Maynard's first rushing touchdown this season - fifth of his career - and the first since last year at Arizona State. Maynard spread the ball around, throwing to eight different receivers.
- Keenan Allen moved up to sixth all-time at Cal in career receptions with 164 after his nine grabs for 80 yards against the Buckeyes to pace the Bears. Na'il Benjamin is fifth with 165, Brian Treggs is fourth with 167 and Bobby Show is third with 180. Midway through the second quarter, he also registered his 2,000th-career receiving yard, and now has 2,049 for his career. Steve Rivera ranks 10th all time at Cal with 2,085 career receiving yards. Allen also had his first pass attempt since last year at Colorado. It went to Maynard for eight yards. For his career, Allen is 3-for-3 with 52 yards passing.
- Chris Harper hauled in a 19-yard touchdown reception - his second of the season - in the first quarter. He finished with three catches for 32 yards and the score.
- C.J. Anderson had a career-high four receptions for 65 yards. On the ground, Anderson carried the ball four times for 13 yards. Isi Sofele posted 21 rushes for 86 yards, including a season-best 26-yarder.
- After losing the time of possession battle the last two weeks, the Bears had the ball for 35:10 compared to 24:50 for Ohio State.
- Darius Powe made his first career catch in the first quarter. He later hauled in a 36-yard reception in the third quarter.
- Keni Kaufusi earned his second career forced fumble on the last play of the first quarter. He and Brennan Scarlett picked up their second career tackles for loss, as well. Todd Barr also registered a tackle for loss.
- Alex Logan was Cal's leading tackler with a personal-best seven takedowns. Michael Lowe also tied his career high in tackles with five.
- Steve Williams caught his fourth career interception, first of this season.

Game 4 at No. 13 USC 27, Cal 9

September 22, 2012 • TV: Pac-12 Networks • Attendance: 83,421

LOS ANGELES – Matt Barkley passed for 192 yards and threw two touchdown passes to Marqise Lee, and No. 13 USC bounced back from its first loss with a 27-9 victory over Cal on Saturday.

Keenan Allen had nine catches for 93 yards for the Bears, who managed just 250 total yards and couldn't get into the Coliseum end zone, failing to build on an encouraging effort in last week's narrow loss at Ohio State.

Cal's defense could feel good about shutting down All-America receiver Robert Woods and managing two interceptions against Barkley, who couldn't beat the Bears on any long downfield throws.

At least kicker Vincenzo D'Amato shook off last week's struggles at Ohio State to hit three field goals for Cal.

D'Amato, who missed three field goal attempts in Columbus last week, missed an early 35-yard try at the Coliseum, but hit his second attempt.

USC appeared to be in position to take control after Lee's TD catch capped a sharp drive early in the second quarter, but Barkley threw his second interception on a tipped pass deep in Cal territory shortly before halftime. The Trojans added a late field goal for a 17-3 lead.

Cal pulled within 17-9 midway through the third quarter, and McNeal's fumble led to a drive deep into USC territory – but Cal burned two timeouts on the drive before T.J. McDonald picked off Maynard's throw at the 7. After Andre Heidari made his second field goal and the USC defense forced another three-and-out, the Trojans embarked on their clock-consuming drive.

Notes

- With today's 27-9 USC victory, the Trojans extended their winning streak over Cal to nine games.
- Jeff Tedford's record is now 6-5 in conference openers. Today's game marked the fourth consecutive conference opener that the Golden Bears played on the road.
- Today's game is the only regular-season contest that Cal will play on natural grass. In 2011, all but two of the Bears' games were played on natural grass.
- With his 9 receptions on the day, Keenan Allen moved up to fourth all time at Cal in career receptions with 173. Brian Treggs, father of Cal freshman Bryce Treggs, is third on the list with 180 catches. Allen also cracked Cal's top 10 in career receiving yards. He posted 94 yards against USC to give him 2,143 yards for his career, which ranks ninth in school history. Allen passed both Steve Rivera (2,085, 1973-75) and Sean Dawkins (2,124, 1990-92) today.
- Keenan Allen extended his streak of consecutive games with a reception to 28 - every game he's played in at Cal. Heading into today's action, the streak ranked tied for eighth nationally and tied for first in the Pac-12.
- Marc Anthony set a career high with 13 tackles. He entered the game with a best of 10 at Oregon State in 2010. The 13 sets a season best for a Cal player this year, ahead of Steve Williams, Josh Hill and Robert Mullins, who all had 12 stops in the opener vs. Nevada.
- Steve Williams became Cal's active leader in interceptions with the fifth of his career on the first drive of the game. It was his second of the season. J.P. Hurrell secured his first career interception on a tipped pass with four minutes remaining in the first half.
- Cal's active career leader in tackles for loss, Deandre Coleman, secured his 12th career tackle for loss.
- For the second time in his career, Vincenzo D'Amato made three field goals (also vs. Southern Utah, Sept. 8, 2012). He was 3-for-4 on the day.
- Jacob Wark had a personal-best 26 yards receiving on two catches, second to Allen among the Bears.

Game 5 Arizona State 27, at Cal 17

September 29, 2012 • TV: FX • Attendance: 51,634

BERKELEY – Taylor Kelly threw three touchdown passes to help Arizona State send California to a 1-4 start with a 27-17 victory on Saturday.

The Sun Devils, who lead the Pac-12 in scoring and total defense, harassed Zach Maynard all afternoon, proving they can be just effective against a starting quarterback after feasting on backups the previous three weeks.

Maynard finished 9 for 28 for 126 yards with a touchdown. Isi Sofele rushed for 105 yards and scored his second touchdown of the season. Cal's standout wide receiver Keenan Allen hauled in four catches for 79 yards and a touchdown, including a season-best 44-yard reception. Allen moved up to seventh in career receiving yards at Cal, now with 2,221. He surpassed Na'il Benjamin and Wesley Walker today.

Kelly completed 26 of 45 passes for 292 yards, but Arizona State was unable to pull away. The Sun Devils settled for field goal attempts on five drives deep into Cal territory. Alex Garoutte made only two of them, hitting the upright on a 39-yard try in the third quarter and having a 37-yarder blocked by Nick Forbes early in the fourth to keep the lead at 20-10.

Cal responded with an 80-yard scoring drive that featured a career-best 44-yard run by C.J. Anderson and a 10-yard TD pass from Maynard to Allen, to make it 20-17.

Kelly coolly led Arizona State on 74-yard drive, completing 4 of 5 passes for 45 yards, capped by a 22-yarder to Ozier to make it 27-17 with 6:17 to play.

Cal went three-and-out on its next possession before punting and then through three incomplete passes and took a sack in its final drive inside the last two minutes of the game.

Cal's first quarter touchdown took only 1:01 off the clock and covered 76 yards in three plays, starting with a 44-yard pass from Maynard to Allen. After an 8-yard pass play to Bryce Treggs, Sofele scampered 24 yards up the middle to tie the game at 7-7.

The Sun Devils scored early in the first quarter on Rogers' first catch of the season, a 1-yarder from Kelly. Garoutte made a 28-yard field goal later in the quarter before the Sun Devils capitalized on a fumble by Sofele late in the first half to score on Kelly's 9-yard pass to Ozier with 53 seconds remaining.

Notes

- With today's 27-17 Arizona State victory, Cal fell to 1-4, 0-2 on the season. It was the first time the Sun Devils beat the Golden Bears in five years and only the second time in Jeff Tedford's tenure at Cal. It was also the first time ASU beat Cal at Memorial Stadium since 1997.

- Keenan Allen hauled in four catches for 79 yards and a touchdown on the day. The receiving touchdown was his second of the season and the 13th of his career, which ties him for eighth all-time at Cal. His first catch of the day was good for 44 yards, a season high.

- Allen now has 177 career receptions. That total ranks fourth all-time at Cal and is three shy of Bobby Shaw's third-place total of 180. He also has 2,221 career receiving yards, which ranks seventh all-time at Cal, as he passed Na'il Benjamin and Wesley Walker today. Marvin Jones is sixth with 2,270 career receiving yards while Brian Treggs and Dameane Douglas are tied for fourth with 2,335 yards each.

- Allen also extended his streak of consecutive games with a reception to 29 - every game he's played in at Cal. Heading into today's action, the streak ranked tied for eighth nationally and tied for first in the Pac-12.

- On Cal's first drive of the game, Isi Sofele rattled off a season-high 32-yard rush. On Cal's second drive, Sofele reached 2,000-career rushing yards. He now has 2,075 for his career. On the day, he finished with 15 carries for 105 yards and his second touchdown run of the season - 13th of his career. He also posted his seventh career 100-yard rushing performance - second this season - which ranks 10th all-time in school history.

- C.J. Anderson had a career-long 44-yard rush to set up Allen's touchdown reception in the fourth quarter. He finished with 78 yards on eight carries.

- Avery Sebastian notched a career-high 15 tackles, the most since D.J. Holt (at Nevada), Chris Conte (at USC) and Mike Mohamed (vs. Oregon) tallied 16 each in 2010. The total included his first career tackle for loss.

- Todd Barr and Brennan Scarlett notched their third and second career sacks, respectively. Michael Lowe chipped in a personal-best nine tackles and Jalen Jefferson tied his career high in tackles with nine, as well.

- Nick Forbes blocked a field goal attempt in the fourth quarter, Cal's first blocked field goal this season. The last time Cal blocked a field goal was by Rulon Davis against Washington State on Sept. 6, 2008.

- Cal's one penalty for 15 yards was the lowest in the Pac-12 this season in both categories

Game 6 at Cal 43, No. 25 UCLA 17

BERKELEY – Zach Maynard matched his career high with four touchdown passes and added a fifth score on the ground and California forced a season-high six turnovers to defeat No. 25 UCLA, 43-17.

Richard Rodgers caught seven passes for 129 yards, both career bests, while Keenan Allen caught a pair of touchdowns and finished with eight receptions to move into third place on Cal's career list and also had a career-high-tying two touchdown catches.

Maynard, who completed only 9 of 28 passes in last week's loss to Arizona State, was almost flawless against UCLA. He completed 13 consecutive throws during one stretch in the second half and finished 25 of 30 for 295 yards.

The Bears' senior quarterback also scored on a 1-yard keeper in the fourth quarter following a 57-yard interception return by safety Michael Lowe.

UCLA quarterback Brett Hundley threw four interceptions, three by Bears cornerback Kameron Jackson that were the first three of his career. The Bruins, who had only one turnover in their previous two games, also fumbled twice.

C.J. Anderson rushed for a career-high 151 yards, 68 on a touchdown run in the fourth quarter to extend Cal's lead to 26 points. Anderson's 151 rushing yards on the night were the most since Brendan Bigelow amassed 160 earlier this season at Ohio State.

Following a 26-yard field goal by Vincenzo D'Amato, his fifth straight make, Cal later took the lead on Maynard's 5-yard touchdown pass to Anderson midway through the second quarter. Maynard got the drive started with a 42-yard completion to tight end Rodgers then capped it with the throw to Anderson, who beat safety Tevin McDonald on an slant pattern.

Five plays after a UCLA fumble, Maynard connected with Allen for an 8-yard touchdown on an inside slant play similar to the one run by Anderson.

Maynard threw touchdowns on Cal's first two drives in the second half to push the lead to 29-14.

Notes

- With the 43-17 California victory over No. 25 UCLA, Jeff Tedford continued his streak of not losing to UCLA at Memorial Stadium during his tenure at Cal. The last time the Bruins won at Memorial Stadium was in 1998. The last time the Bears beat a top-25 team before tonight was in 2009 when Cal beat then-No. 14 Stanford, 34-28. The Golden Bears are 63-5 when scoring 30 points and 42-2 when scoring 40 points.

- Keenan Allen hauled in eight catches for 79 yards and two touchdown receptions. The receiving touchdowns were his third and fourth of the season and the 14th and 15th of his career. He is tied for seventh all-time at Cal in career touchdowns.

- Allen now has 185 career receptions. That total ranks third all-time at Cal, as he passed Bobby Shaw tonight. He is 10 receptions away from Dameane Douglas for second (195), and Geoff McArthur is first with 202. He also has 2,300 career receiving yards, which ranks sixth all-time at Cal, as he passed Marvin Jones today. Brian Treggs and Dameane Douglas are tied for fourth with 2,335 career receiving yards and DeSean Jackson is third with 2,423 receiving yards.

- Allen also extended his streak of consecutive games with a reception to 30 - every game he's played in at Cal. Heading into today's action, the streak ranked tied for eighth nationally and tied for first in the Pac-12.

- Zach Maynard tied his career high with four touchdown passes, two of which went to Allen. It was the first time he threw four touchdowns in a regulation contest, and also added a rushing TD, making him responsible for five touchdowns for the first time in his career. The only other time he threw for four touchdowns was in the overtime win at Colorado last season. He ended the contest completing 25 of 30 passes for a season-high 295 yards with an interception along with the four passing TDs.

- Richard Rodgers enjoyed a career day, catching seven passes for 129 yards, his first career 100-yard performance. In the fourth quarter, he racked up a career-high 50-yard reception. In the second quarter, he collected a 42-yard reception.

- C.J. Anderson snagged his first touchdown reception of the season - second of his career - for Cal's first touchdown of the night in the second quarter. In the fourth quarter, he secured his second touchdown of this season - 10th of his career - that came on a personal-best 68-yard run. Anderson finished the day with a career high in carries (21) and rushing yards (151). The 100-yard performance was the first of his career.

- Earning his first career start, Brendan Bigelow hauled in his first receiving touchdown, good for 32 yards. It was his fourth career score.

- Kameron Jackson notched his first career interception right before halftime, and then grabbed his second and third INTs in the fourth quarter. The last time a Cal player had two or more interceptions was Sean Cattouse against Presbyterian last year.

- Michael Lowe earned his first career interception and returned it 42 yards. It was one of six turnovers Cal's defense forced on the night. The last time the Cal defense forced five or more turnovers was against Colorado in 2010.

- Vincenzo D'Amato has made his last five consecutive field goals, including a 26-yarder tonight in his only attempt. The drive that ended with D'Amato's field goal was the Bears' longest drive of the season (16 plays) that lasted a season-high 6:35.

PULLMAN, Wash. – Quarterback Zach Maynard threw for a touchdown and ran for another as California beat Washington State 31-17 on Saturday night.

C.J. Anderson rushed for two touchdowns as the Golden Bears (3-4, 2-2 Pac-12) earned their eighth straight win over the Cougars.

Cal got a balanced ground attack from Anderson, Brendan Bigelow and Maynard, who each rushed for more than 50 yards. As a team, Cal rushed for over 300 yards (318) for the first time since 2010 and produced over 500 yards of total offense (507) for the third time this season.

The Bears held Washington State to just 36 rushing yards for the game.

The Bears scored first, after Michael Lowe's interception gave Cal the ball on its own 25. On the third play, Maynard connected with his brother, Keenan Allen, on a short pass that turned into a 69-yard touchdown reception and a 7-0 Bears lead late in the first quarter.

WSU's Andrew Furney's 20-yard field goal to cut Cal's lead to 7-3 in the second quarter.

Cal responded with a 75-yard drive, and Anderson ran over from the 4 to give the Bears a 14-3 lead that they held at the end of the first half.

Cal marched 71 yards on the opening drive of the second half, with Maynard running over from the 1-yard line for a 21-3 lead.

Washington State came back with a 75-yard drive, with Tuel passing 8 yards to Brett Bartolone for a touchdown to narrow Cal's lead to 21-10 with 6:42 left in the third. That broke a string of six quarters in which WSU had not scored a touchdown.

Vincenzo D'Amato hit a 52-yard field goal to lift Cal to a 24-10 lead with 2:02 left in the third. Furney missed a 43-yarder for WSU early in the fourth quarter.

Anderson added a 29-yard touchdown run for a 31-10 lead.

Cal's Steve Williams hauled in his sixth career interception and his third this season. In the last two games, Cal has posted six interceptions.

Notes

- With today's 31-17 California victory over Washington State, Jeff Tedford continued his winning streak against the Cougars, which now stands at eight. The last time Cal lost to Washington State was in 2002. Tonight's win also marked Tedford's 50th career conference victory at Cal.

- The Golden Bears are 64-5 when scoring 30 points in the Tedford era.

- Keenan Allen hauled in 11 catches for 166 yards and a season-high 69-yard touchdown reception. It was his first 100-yard receiving performance of the season and the seventh of his career, which ranks fifth all time at Cal. The 11 catches gave Allen his first double-digit reception game this season. The receiving touchdown was the fifth of the season and the 16th of his career. He is seventh all-time at Cal in career touchdowns. The touchdown also marked the first time this season that Cal scored first.

- Allen now has 196 career receptions. That total ranks second all-time at Cal, as he passed Dameane Douglas tonight. He is just six receptions away from Geoff McArthur with 202. He also has 2,466 career receiving yards, which ranks third all-time at Cal. Bobby Shaw is second with 2,731 and Geoff McArthur is first with 3,188.

- Allen also extended his streak of consecutive games with a reception to 31 - every game he's played in at Cal. Heading into today's action, the streak ranked tied for eighth nationally and tied for first in the Pac-12.

- Zach Maynard completed 14 of 23 passes for 189 yards with a touchdown pass, a rushing touchdown and two interceptions. He set a new personal best in rushing yards with 78 on 10 carries. He also rushed for his seventh career rushing touchdown, third in 2012.

- C.J. Anderson punched in his team-leading third and fourth rushing touchdowns this season - 11th and 12th of his career - and ended the night with 112 yards on 15 carries. It was his second career 100-yard performance, as he also went over 100 yards last week against UCLA. Anderson is the second Cal player to score two rushing touchdowns in a game this season (Brendan Bigelow vs. Ohio State). Anderson is Cal's leading rusher on the season with 498 yards. Tonight marked the third game that Anderson led Cal in rushing.

- Anderson, Sofele and Bigelow have now combined for 1,000 rushing yards this season. The trio, along with Maynard, each rushed for at least 50 yards tonight.

- Vincenzo D'Amato connected on a career-long 52-yard field goal in the third quarter. He has now made his last six consecutive field goal attempts.

- Cal posted 500 yards of total offense (507) for the third time this season. The Bears also produced 318 rushing yards. The last time Cal rushed for over 300 yards as a team was against UCLA in 2010 (304). In the last three games, the Cal rushing attack is averaging 220 yards per game.

- Steve Williams secured his third interception of the season - sixth of his career - in the first quarter. He is Cal's active career and season leader in that category. Williams also set a new career high with four pass breakups, giving him 22 for his career with ranks tied for 10th all time at Cal.

- Michael Lowe caught his second career interception, and his second in as many weeks. As a team, the Bears have secured six interceptions in the last two games.

Parking/Transportation

Gameday

Parking at Cal is always at a premium and visitors are encouraged to use public transportation. The Downtown Berkeley BART station is located about a mile west of Memorial Stadium, in close proximity to Haas Pavilion, Edwards Stadium/Goldman Field, the Hellman Tennis Courts and Spieker Aquatics Complex. Hourly guest parking on non-football gamedays is available in the MLK Student Union and RSF garages along Bancroft Way adjacent to Haas Pavilion and at the Underhill Garage.

Underhill also serves as the football gameday parking location. Entrances are off either Channing Way or Haste Street, just west of College Avenue. The lot is about three blocks from Memorial Stadium. Media can either take the short walk to media will call (located in the third-floor lobby of the Simpson Center adjacent to Memorial Stadium) or use a media-only shuttle that begins running two hours before game time. A media shuttle is also available post-game from the pregame dropoff point along Warring Street to the Underhill Garage.

Parking passes cannot be left at will call on gamedays and must be picked up or mailed in advance.

Television crews should order parking passes for their crews by sending in the Special Event Parking Arrangements form found on the university's website (pt.berkeley.edu) in advance. Request the Underhill Garage for football games. Note that the campus parking office does not accept credit cards – only cash or check.

Non-Gameday

MLK Student Union Garage – Paid parking is available at the MLK Student Union Garage located on the north side of Bancroft Way between Telegraph Avenue and Dana Street (basketball gameday media parking lot) about five blocks to the west of the Simpson Center and Memorial Stadium. If you park here, you would then need to walk east on Bancroft Way until you reach the venue.

Public Transportation – Public transportation is highly recommended when visiting Berkeley. There are multiple public transportation options that lead directly to Memorial Stadium and Witter Rugby Field. BART has a station in downtown Berkeley about a half-mile west of the venue. Please visit bart.org, actransit.org or 511.org for more information.

Recreational Sports Facility Garage – Paid parking is available at the Recreational Sports Facility Garage located on the north side of Bancroft Way between Telegraph Avenue and Dana Street (basketball gameday media parking lot) about six blocks to the west of Witter Rugby Field. If you park here, you would then need to walk east on Bancroft Way until you reach the venue.

Street – Paid parking is available all day on weekends and after 5 p.m. PT on weekdays along Stadium Rim Way. The payment machine is located in the southeast corner of Witter lot and accepts only \$1 and \$5 bills. No other forms of payment are available. Limited two-hour free and paid street parking (check signs) may be available on streets near Memorial Stadium/Simpson Center, with most options just south along Piedmont Avenue, Prospect Street, Channing Way or Warring Street.

Underhill Garage – Paid parking is available at the Underhill Garage located at the corner of Channing Way and College Avenue (football gameday media parking lot) about five blocks to the southwest of Witter Rugby Field. If you park here, you would then need to walk north on College Avenue to Bancroft Way and then east on Bancroft Way until you reach the venue.

Witter Lot – Paid parking in the vicinity of Witter Rugby Field is available in the adjacent Witter Lot located just south of Centennial Drive near the corner of Centennial and Stadium Rim Way on a first-come, first-served basis. The payment machine is located in the southeast corner of the lot and accepts only \$1 and \$5 bills. No other forms of payment are available. If you park here, you would then need to walk down the hill on Stadium Rim Way on the south side of the stadium keeping the stadium on your right until you reach the Simpson Center.

Photo vests will require an identification card to be left until the vests are returned.

NCAA rules limit shooting to outside the restraining line enclosing the playing field and outside the 25-yard lines (the team area).

LORENZO ALEXANDER (LB – WASHINGTON REDSKINS)

- Has played in all five games off the bench, contributing 14 tackles, 1.5 sacks and a fumble recovery, posting a season-high five tackles, all 1.5 of his sacks and a fumble recovery in a Week 6 win over Minnesota

TYSON ALUALU (DT – JACKSONVILLE JAGUARS)

- Has 17 tackles and 1.0 sack while starting each of the first five games, highlighted by a season-high six-stop game in a Week 2 loss to Houston, as well as four tackles and 1.0 sack in a Week 1 loss at Minnesota

BRYAN ANGER (P – JACKSONVILLE JAGUARS)

- Leads the NFL with a 51.3 yards per punt average, punting 31 times for 1,591 yards that rank fourth and third in the league, respectively ... has a 43.9 yard net punting average that is also third in the league ... has pinned opponents inside their own 20-yardline seven times and forced six fair catches ... has had one punt of 60 or more yards in each of his last four games, including a career-long 66-yarder in a Week 3 win at Indianapolis, and one of at least 57 yards in all five of his contests ... has averaged at least 48.5 yards per punt in each of his first five contests

BRIAN DE LA PUENTE (OG – NEW ORLEANS SAINTS)

- Has started all five games for a team that picked up its first victory in a Week 5 win over San Diego

THOMAS DeCOUD (S – ATLANTA FALCONS)

- Co-leads the NFL with four interceptions that he has returned 37 yards ... has started all six games for the only remaining unbeaten NFL team, adding 27 tackles and six passes defended ... had the game-clinching interception late in the fourth quarter of a Week 5 win at Washington and returned it 24 yards ... had a huge performance in a Week 3 win at San Diego with two interceptions and a fumble recovery ... returned his other interception 15 yards in a Week 2 win vs. Denver ... posted a season-high seven tackles in a Week 1 win at Kansas City

JUSTIN FORSETT (RB – HOUSTON TEXANS)

NICK HARRIS (P – DETROIT LIONS)

- Signed following the team's third game and has combined to punt 12 times for a 41.4 average during a Week 4 loss vs. Minnesota and a Week 6 overtime win at Philadelphia ... in his 12th NFL season, including a previous eight-season stint with the Lions (2003-10) as well as two-plus campaigns with Cincinnati (2001-03) to begin his career and one with Jacksonville (2011)

LAVELLE HAWKINS (WR – TENNESSEE TITANS)

- Has three catches for 13 yards, playing in three of the team's first six games off the bench

DESEAN JACKSON (WR – PHILADELPHIA EAGLES)

- Has 29 catches for 465 yards and an average of 16.0 yards per catch in six games (all starts), including season bests of seven receptions for 114 yards in a Week 2 win vs. Baltimore ... added six catches for 99 yards and a touchdown on a 19-yard reception from Michael Vick in a Week 4 win vs. the New York Giants, as well as five grabs for 74 yards in a Week 6 loss to Detroit

MARVIN JONES (WR – CINCINNATI BENGALS)

- Has started all five games and contributed 26 tackles and 2.0 sacks, including a career and game-high 11 stops in a Week 1 loss to Washington, for a team that picked up its first win with a Week 5 victory vs. San Diego when he notched his second sack of the season and third of his career

MYCHAL KENDRICKS (LB – PHILADELPHIA EAGLES)

- Has started each of the first six games and compiled 27 tackles and three passes defended, with a career best six tackles in a Week 3 loss at Arizona and a season high two passes defended in a Week 2 win against Baltimore

L.P. LaDOUCER (LS – DALLAS COWBOYS)
