### Kickoff – Cal at No. 15 Oregon State (Saturday, Nov. 17, 7:30 p.m. PT)

Cal will take the field for the final time in 2012 this Saturday with a road game at Oregon State (No. 15 AP/No. 16 BCS/No. 17 USA Today). The Golden Bears will play a nationally-ranked team for a second consecutive week and the sixth time in 2012. The Bears have captured two of the last four meetings in Corvallis and also were a 23-6 winner in their temporary home at AT&T Park in San Francisco last season.

Last season's matchup between Cal and Oregon State saw Isi Sofele register a career-high 190 rushing yards, including a career-long 56-yard run. Sofele, who is coming off a season and game-high 134 rushing yards against Oregon last Saturday, is just 109 yards away from 10th place on Cal's all-time career rushing list. He also needs two more rushing touchdowns to crack Cal's all-time top 10 chart in that category.

Cal has been within a single score in the fourth quarter during five of its eight defeats in 2012 and was within a touchdown against then second-ranked and now top-ranked Oregon last Saturday before the Ducks put the game away by scoring touchdowns on five consecutive possessions.

### Quick Hitters

- The Bears rushed for 236 yards against Oregon to mark the fifth time this season and third time in the last five games that Cal has rushed for 200 or more yards as a team. The rushing attack against the Ducks was led by Isi Sofele and his season-best 134 yards on the ground. Cal's top three rushers of C.J. Anderson, Sofele and Brendan Bigelow have combined for 1,794 yards and seven 100-yard rushing performances this season, with Anderson and Sofele both hitting the 100-yard rushing mark twice and Bigelow once.

- Head coach Jeff Tedford is Cal's winningest coach ever, posting an 82-56 (.594) mark in 138 career games.

- Isi Sofele is just 109 yards away from 10th place on Cal's all-time career rushing list. He also needs two more rushing touchdowns to crack Cal's all-time top 10 chart in that category.

- Chris Harper has season totals of 38 receptions and 516 receiving yards. He is eight receptions short of Keen Allen's true freshman school-record 46 catches in 2010 and 85 receiving yards shy of DeSean Jackson's true freshman school-record 601 receiving yards in 2005.

- Vincenzo D'Amato continues to lead the Pac-12 in both field goals made (1.45 fgmpg) and field goal percentage (11-16, .696) following in the footsteps of 2011 Cal kicker Giorgio Tavecchio, who became the first Cal player to ever lead the conference in field goals made and the first since Doug Brien in 1991 to leader the league in field goal percentage.

- Cal is 31st nationally in sacks at 2.45 per game and 38th in tackles for loss at 6.36. Fourteen different Cal players have contributed to the team's sack total, with Chris McCain and Kendrick Payne co-leading the team at 3.5. Cal's tackles for loss have come from 22 different players, with McCain's 8.5 leading the way and followed by Marc Anthony and Steve Williams with 6.5 each. Last Saturday against Oregon, Cal produced 6.0 tackles for loss for 25 yards. The Bears have had at least 6.0 tackles for loss seven times in 2012, including each of the past three games.

## Allen Tops Cal's Career Receptions Record

Keenan Allen is the Golden Bears' all-time leader in receptions, surpassing former record-holder Geoff McArthur (202, 2000-04) at the top of the list during the last game in which he played at Utah on October 27. Allen, who now has 205 career catches in his first 33 collegiate games, is also third all-time at Cal in career receiving yards (2570), with McArthur (3188, 2000-04) and Bobby Shaw (2731, 1994-97) the only two Cal players ahead of him. He also has 17 career touchdown receptions to rank seventh all-time in career scoring catches at Cal. In addition, Allen has caught a pass in each of the 33 games he has played at Cal for a streak that currently ranks tied for eighth in the nation and tied first in the Pac-12. He has missed three games in his career due to injury, including Cal's most recent contests against Washington and Oregon.

Allen is the Bears' leading receiver through 11 games of 2012 with 61 receptions, 737 receiving yards and six touchdown catches. The 61 receptions ranks ninth on Cal's single-season list and makes him one of only two players in Cal history along with DeSean Jackson to post two of the school's top-10 single seasons in receptions. Allen's total of 98 catches in 2011 ranked second on the all-time list. Allen ranks tied for 18th nationally and tied for second in the Pac-12 in receptions (6.78 rpg), while he is 33rd nationally and sixth in the Pac-12 in receiving yards (81.89 ypg). Allen also ranks 10th nationally and second in the conference in punt returns (14.13 ypr), and tied 71st nationally and tied for 10th in the Pac-12 in all purpose yardage (109.78 ypg). Allen is tied for 22nd in the conference in scoring (5.3 ppg), adding two other scores on a 39-yard run vs. Nevada and a 69-yard punt return against Southern Utah.

## Tough Schedule With No Bye Week

Cal's strength of schedule ranks eighth nationally in the Sagarin NCAA football ratings. The team's eight losses have come to teams that have combined for a record of 56-24 (.700) in Oregon (10-0), Ohio State (10-0), Stanford (8-2), USC (7-3), Nevada (6-4), Washington (6-4), Arizona State (5-5) and Utah (4-6). Cal has played five teams ranked in the top 25 at the time of their contest in Oregon (No. 2 AP/No. 2 USA Today/No. 3 BCS), Ohio State (No. 12 AP), USC (No. 12 USA Today/No. 13 AP), Stanford (No. 20 BCS/No. 22 AP/No. 23 USA Today) and UCLA (No. 25 AP). Cal's final game of 2012 is against a 7-2 Oregon State team that is ranked No. 15 according to AP, while sitting at No. 16 in the BCS Standings and No. 17 in the latest USA Today coaching poll. Cal will also play its 2012 slate with essentially no bye as its "bye week" comes the week after the Bears' final game of the season at Oregon State this Saturday.

## A Decade of Sustained Success Under Jeff Tedford

Cal averaged 7.9 wins per year in the first 10 seasons (2002-11) under head coach Jeff Tedford and ranked tied for third among Pac-10 teams in victories during that period. After a brief one-year absence in 2010, Tedford led the Golden Bears back to a bowl game in 2011 with a trip to the Holiday Bowl against Texas. Tedford's most recent victory at Washington State on Oct. 13, 2012, was his 82nd career win and also his 50th conference triumph. Tedford is Cal's all-time winningest coach with an overall record of 82-56 (.594).

## Cal Rushing Trio Approaches 2,000 Yards

Cal's rushing leaders – C.J. Anderson (729), Isi Sofele (653) and Brendan Bigelow (412) – have totaled 1,794 yards rushing and are just 206 yards away from being the first Cal trio to reach 2,000 yards rushing since 2009 when Shane Vereen (952), Jahvid Best (867) and Covaughn DeBoskie-Johnson (211) achieved the feat. Last Saturday against Oregon, Sofele rushed for a season-high 134 yards to lead a rushing attack that totaled 236 yards, marking the fifth time in 2012 and third time in the last five games that the Bears have rushed for 200 or more yards as a team. The week before against Washington, Anderson paced Cal in rushing with his career-high 160 yards to mark his third career 100-yard performance. Anderson's efforts helped the Bears rush for 249 yards against the Huskies. Overall, the Bears are fourth in the conference in rushing (182.36 ypg). Anderson leads the Bears in rushing with his career-high 729 yards and four rushing touchdowns on 115 attempts. Sofele is second with his 653 yards and three scores on 128 carries, while Bigelow is averaging just under 11 yards per carry (10.6) with 412 yards and three touchdowns on the ground on 39 attempts. If Anderson and Sofele can combine for 118 yards at Oregon State to reach the 1,500-yard mark between them, it will extend Cal's streak of two players combining for 1,500 rushing yards to 10 consecutive seasons.

## Harper Making Run at True Freshmen Receiving Records

True freshman Chris Harper currently boasts season totals of 38 receptions and 516 receiving yards that are eight receptions short of Keenan Allen's true freshman record of 46 catches in 2010, as well as 85 yards shy of DeSean Jackson's true freshman record of 601 receiving yards in 2005. Playing without injured fellow receivers Keenan Allen and Bryce Treggs, Harper had a career-high 101 yards receiving on a career-high-tying seven catches against Washington, including a couple of impressive grabs including a one-hander that was the day's No. 2 play on SportsCenter. Has has paced the Bears in receiving four times on the season, including each of the last three contests.

## Maynard on All-Time Passing and Total Offense Lists

Zach Maynard is 10th on Cal's all-time list for both total offense and passing. Through his first 23 career games at Cal, Maynard has passed for 5,204 yards, while compiling 5,350 yards of total offense. Maynard has completed 180-of-296 passes for 2,214 yards over 10 games in 2012, with 12 touchdowns and 10 interceptions for a passer efficiency rating of 130.26 to rank 61st nationally, while his 128.36 career passer efficiency is eighth on Cal's all-time list. Arguably the best game of his career came when he completed 25-of-30 passes (career high 83.3%) for a season-high 295 yards, threw for four touchdowns and rushed for another in a 2012 win against UCLA, with the five touchdowns he was responsible for a career best. Maynard missed last week's game at Oregon due to injury.

## D'Amato Leads Pac-12 in Field Goals Made and Percentage

Vincenzo D'Amato leads the Pac-12 in field goals made (1.45 fgmpg) and field goal percentage (16-23, .696) on the footsteps of 2011 placekicker Giorgio Tavecchio, who last season became the first Cal player to ever lead the conference in field goal percentage and the first since Doug Brien in 1991 to lead the conference in field goals made. D'Amato made 11 straight field goals before missing his third attempt against Washington. He started his streak at USC when he tied his career best by making the final three of his four field goals attempts, equaling a mark he had previously set two games earlier by hitting all three of his attempts vs. Southern Utah. D'Amato was also good on his only attempts vs. Arizona State, UCLA, at Washington State (career-long 52-yarder) and against Stanford. At Utah, D'Amato was good on both of his attempts from 49 and 38 yards and had made his first two against the Huskies from 23 and 21 yards before missing wide right on a 41-yard attempt. He made his first attempt against Oregon from 27 yards before missing from 48. In the national and conference rankings, D'Amato is 23rd nationally in field goals made (1.45 fgmpg), 97th nationally and 12th in the Pac-12 in scoring (6.91 ppg) and sixth in the conference in scoring among kickers. D'Amato has a team-high 76 points for the season, adding 28-of-31 extra points to his 16 field goals. He is Cal's active career leader with 128 points (23-35 FG, 59-62 PAT).

## Cal Defense Forcing Lots of Turnovers Lately

The Cal defense forced 15 turnovers in a five-game stretch prior to not causing one against Oregon in its most recent contest. Cal forced six turnovers against UCLA for the highest total in the Jeff Tedford era and then came back with two more each both at Washington State and against Stanford. Cal had one turnover at Utah and then four more turnovers against Washington. Nine of the 15 turnovers were interceptions, while six were fumbles.

## Forbes and Hill Battle for Team Lead in Tackles

After Josh Hill led the team in tackles for most of the season, Nick Forbes has been the team's leader since taking over the lead during the team's contest vs. Washington on Nov. 2. Forbes, who has four double-digit tackle games in his last six outings, will head into Saturday's final contest of the season at Oregon State with 84. Forbes had a career-high 13 tackles against Stanford but his signature game arguably was against Washington when he had a game-high 11 tackles and also came up with two fumble recoveries and an interception. Forbes also has season totals of 4.5 tackles for loss (-20 yards), 1.5 sacks (-11 yards), three pass breakups, three quarterback hurries, a team-high three fumble recoveries, a forced fumble, an interception and the team's only blocked kick. He is third in the Pac-12 in fumbles recovered (0.27 frpg) and sixth in tackles (7.6 tpg). Hill, who had 11 tackles in Cal's most recent game vs. Oregon compared to 10 by Forbes, has had three double-digit contests this season, including two in his last four games. He is eighth in the Pac-12 in tackles (7.4 tpg) and has added seven pass breakups, a forced fumble and 0.5 tackles for loss (-0 yards).

## McCain Making Big Plays

Chris McCain leads Cal in tackles for loss (8.5, -38 yards) and quarterback hurries (4) and is tied with Kendrick Payne for the team's lead in sacks (3.5, team-high -27 yards). In just his second season at Cal, McCain is tied with Deandre Coleman for first among active Bears in career tackles for loss (14.5) with his 50 sacks yards the most among players on the Bears' current roster. His 5.0 career sacks (-28 yards) are second to Payne's 6.5. McCain has had at least 0.5 tackles for loss in each of his past five contests.

## Defensive Backfield Trio All Active Career Leaders

The defensive backfield trio of Marc Anthony, Josh Hill and Steve Williams each rank as Cal's active career leader in at least one category.

Hill, who has played in 47 career games with 31 starts, has 208 tackles to lead all players on the active roster, while his 81 stops on the season are second to the 84 posted by Nick Forbes. His three career forced fumbles and one interception returned for a touchdown are tied for the most among active Cal players, while his 22 pass breakups are second, and his 26 passes defended and two fumble recoveries are tied for second. In addition, Hill is third among the team's active players with four career interceptions and 46 interception return yards.

Anthony, who has played in 40 career games with 31 starts, is Cal's active career leader in interception return yards (96), while ranking tied for first in interception return touchdowns (1), tied for second in passes defended (26), and third in tackles (135), pass breakups (21) and tackles for loss (12.0, -27 yards).

Williams, who has played in 36 games with 27 starts, is Cal's active career leader in interceptions with six. His three interceptions in 2012 are tied with Kameron Jackson and Michael Lowe for the team lead. He also collected a career-high four pass breakups against the Cougars and is now the Bears' active career leader with 25 (tied for sixth on all-time list) to give him a career total of 31 passes defended that also paces the Bears' active players. He is tied for first among active players with three career forced fumbles, second in tackles (141) and fourth in interception return yards (45). Williams also currently ranks fourth in the Pac-12 in passes defended (1.18 pdpg).

## Turnover Margin a Key

The turnover battle has been emphasized since head coach Jeff Tedford's arrival at Cal in 2002 and rightly so. The Bears are 46-9 when committing fewer turnovers than opponents during the Tedford era, compared to 19-12 when turnovers are equal and 17-35 when opponents win the battle. In conference games, Cal is 29-7 with a positive margin in turnovers, 11-8 when the turnover table is tied and 10-30 with a deficit. A big key to the Bears' win against UCLA was forcing the six turnovers that were the most in the Jeff Tedford era and tied for the most in the Pac-12 this season, including the first three career interceptions by Kameron Jackson, which is also tied for the most in the Pac-12 this season and the most by a single player in a game in the Tedford era.

## Solid Home Attendance in 2012

In seven home games in 2012, Cal had an average attendance of 55,876, including a season-high attendance of 63,186 in the season opener against Nevada. Six of the seven games had an attendance of over 50,000.

Saturday's game at Oregon State will mark the final game at Cal for the Bears' 19 seniors – C.J. Anderson, Marc Anthony, Ross Bostock, Tyré Ellison, Dominic Galas, Josh Hill, J.P. Hurrell, Kameron Krebs, Kaulin Krebs, Mike Manuel, Zach Maynard, Robert Mullins, Kendrick Payne, Tyler Rigsbee, Brian Schwenke, Isi Sofele, Eric Stevens, Matt Summers-Gavin and Aaron Tipoti.

## Score 30 Points, Usually Win

Cal is 64-5 all-time when putting 30 points or more on the scoreboard under head coach Jeff Tedford. When the Bears don't score at least 30 points, their record under Tedford is 18-51.

## Under the Lights

Cal will be playing its sixth night game of the year this Saturday at Oregon State (7:30 p.m. PT). Each of the Golden Bears' final four games and six of their last seven were under the lights after each of the first five were played in daytime or late afternoon hours. Cal won its first two games under the lights in 2012 against UCLA and at Washington State before falling at Utah, vs. Washington and vs. Oregon in the Bears' last three games.

## Young Squad

Cal's current two-deep features 31 of the 56 positions manned by either a freshman (13) or sophomore (18).

Jalen Jefferson registered his first full career sack ... Steve Williams posted a career-high 2.0 tackles for loss ... Avery Sebastian notched his first career pass breakup ... Brendan Bigelow posted a season-high 57-yard kick return that was the second-longest of his career to an 88-yarder that he returned for a touchdown last season against Presbyterian ... Ross Bostock made his first career start ... the team's 19 seniors went through pregame ceremonies honoring them for their Cal careers ... the 1991 Cal football team who finished that campaign with a 10-2 record and a final AP ranking of eighth was honored in a ceremony during the game.



## Cal's State of Oregon Connections

- Head coach Jeff Tedford spent four seasons as the offensive coordinator at Oregon from 1998-2001 and helped lead the Ducks to four bowl games, three post-season wins, the best overall record (38-10) in the Pac-10 during the period and a No. 2 national ranking at the end of his last season in 2001.

- Associate head coach/run game coordinator Ron Gould played collegiately at Oregon for one season in 1987, graduated from the school in 1988, and then spent two seasons as a graduate assistant with the Ducks in 1990 and '91, with the 1990 squad going to the Freedom Bowl. He spent one season as the defensive backs coach at Portland State in 1992.

- Offensive coordinator/offensive line coach Jim Michalczyk spent three seasons (1999-2001) as the special teams coordinator at Oregon State, while also working with the tight ends and as an assistant offensive line coach. The Beavers went to bowl games twice in those three seasons.

- Director of Football Operations Mike McHugh held the same position at Oregon from 1999-2000.

- Five Cal players – Maximo Espitia (Salem, OR/South Salem HS), Isaac Lapite (Eugene, OR/Sheldon HS/South Eugene HS), Joey Mahalic (Portland OR/Wilson HS), Brennan Scarlett (Portland, OR/Central Catholic HS) and Jacob Wark (Tualatin, OR/Jesuit HS) – list cities in Oregon as their hometown and played prep football in the state as did Gabe King, who was briefly at South Eugene High School as a prep senior but lists Burlington, North Carolina, as his hometown.

- Brothers Kameron and Kaulin Krebs were members of the Oregon State football program before transferring to Cal.

- Video coordinator Matt Fox was a student assistant in the video office at Oregon from 1999-2000 and graduated from the school in 2001.

- Broadcaster Todd McKim was a long-time media member as a television anchor and sports director in Eugene, and was the 2000 Oregon Broadcaster of the Year.

- Assistant Player Personnel Director/Community Outreach Coordinator Kevin Parker played tailback and wide receiver at Oregon, and was twice named the Ducks' Most Inspirational Player before graduating from the school in 1999.

## Cal in the NFL

Cal has a total of 32 players on NFL rosters as of Nov. 12, 2012, which is the second-most among Pac-12 schools behind only USC, while the team's 25 former players on active 53-player rosters (does not include players on injured reserve and physically unable to perform lists) at the beginning of the 2012 NFL season was tied for ninth nationally. Cal has had 40 NFL Draft selections in the 10 drafts held since Jeff Tedford coached his first game at Cal in 2002, including eight first-rounders. Six former Cal players were chosen in the 2012 NFL Draft. The six draft selections tied for the second-most ever by Cal, who also had six players picked in both the 1977 and 2008 drafts. A school-record 10 Cal players were chosen in 1952. Offensive lineman Mitchell Schwartz (Cleveland Browns – No. 37 overall) and linebacker Mychal Kendricks (Philadelphia Eagles – No. 46 overall) were selected in the second round, followed by punter Bryan Anger (Jacksonville Jaguars – No. 70 overall) in the third round. Wide receiver Marvin Jones (Cincinnati Bengals – No. 166 overall) was taken in the fifth round. Defensive back D.J. Campbell (Carolina Panthers – No. 216 overall) and defensive lineman Trevor Guyton (Minnesota Vikings – No. 219 overall) were picked in the seventh round.

## Academic Success Continues

Cal has posted 103 Pac-12 All-Academic honors in the first 10 seasons under head coach Jeff Tedford, second-most in the conference during that span. Nine Cal student-athletes were honored on the 2011 Pac-12 All-Academic Football Team, including four first-team selections in Mark Brazinski, Ernest Owusu, Mitchell Schwartz and John Tyndall.

In 2008, Alex Mack earned the Draddy Trophy (later renamed the Campbell Trophy) honoring college football's top scholar-athlete, while Mohamed was a finalist for the honor often referred to as the Academic Heisman in 2010 after earlier being given an NFF Scholar-Athlete Award. Giorgio Tavecchio was a semifinalist for the honor and a candidate for an NFF Scholar-Athlete Award in 2011.

A three-time member of the Pac-10/12 All-Academic team, Matt Summers-Gavin is a candidate for the Senior CLASS Award® and the Campbell Trophy presented by the National Football Foundation in 2012.

## Back In Berkeley – Memorial Stadium Reopens in 2012

Since it opened in the fall of 1923, Memorial Stadium has produced scores of unforgettable memories for generations of Golden Bears. From the Wonder Teams of the 1920s to the Pappy Waldorf years mid-century to the current success attained under head coach Jeff Tedford, the facility has treated fans of all ages to many of the greatest moments in the history of Cal football. It stands as one of the most enduring symbols of the University of California campus and has served as a gathering point for students, alumni, faculty, staff and other supporters for nearly 90 years.

This fall, the historic building begins a new era following an extensive retrofit and renovation that brings it up to modern standards for fans and student-athletes alike, creating a more enjoyable environment for the hundreds of thousands of people who visit and partake in games every year – all while maintaining the architecture and character of the celebrated stadium.

Major construction on the \$321 million project got underway in December 2010, and barely 21 months later, the Golden Bears are able to call Memorial Stadium home once again.

## The Renovation of Memorial Stadium

Preliminary work on the project, including installation of temporary bracing around the outer wall, hazardous material removal and interior demolition, began in June 2010. Major construction got underway in December 2010, starting with demolition of the interior bowl, soil excavation and wall shoring. The stadium is game-ready to host Cal football in 2012, with work completed in early 2013.

The \$321 million renovation, which impacts all but the outer wall and the east-side seating area, capitalizes on the expertise of seismic engineers and campus experts that found a unique solution to protect the stadium and its users in case of an earthquake. Design features include concrete “seismic blocks” at the end zone where the Hayward Fault bisects the facility and a press box that can sway in a large-scale temblor. The solution came as a result of collaboration between the campus Seismic Review Committee, the architectural team and the structural engineers hired for the job.

The significant number of upgrades to the facility include three club levels for those participating in the Endowment Seating Program, a new press box, wider concourses, improved ADA access, and more restrooms and concession stands. Capacity has been reduced from 71,799 seats to 63,186.



## **The History of Memorial Stadium**

Originally completed in November 1923, Memorial Stadium is dedicated to University of California, Berkeley students, alumni and other Californians who lost their lives in World War I. The building was then rededicated during halftime of Cal's game against UCLA on Oct. 6, 2012. Cal boasts an all-time record of 319-218-16 (.591) at Memorial Stadium. The Bears have enjoyed 12 undefeated home campaigns, including three during the Jeff Tedford era (2004, 2006, 2008). Cal has twice won eight home games in a season (1924, 1938). Memorial Stadium is also home to one of the most memorable moments in college football history – "The Play" – Cal's five-lateral kickoff return on the final play of the 1982 Big Game to beat Stanford that celebrated its 30th anniversary in 2012.

## **Simpson Center For Student-Athlete High Performance**

Cal football players train in the Simpson Center for Student-Athlete High Performance, a revolutionary student-athlete training, coaching, and applied sports science and sports medicine center that opened in January of 2012. The Simpson Center embodies the High Performance Initiative (HPI), Cal's innovative performance philosophy designed to build competitive advantage, maximize efficiency and enhance the student-athlete experience. A 142,000 square-foot facility, the Simpson Center is a state-of-the-art complex with year-round access for over 450 student-athletes. The Simpson Center is home to the locker rooms, meeting rooms and offices for Cal football and 12 Golden Bear Olympic sports for use on a daily basis. The signature feature of the Simpson Center is the High Performance Zone – a fully integrated training space with world-class strength and conditioning, sports medicine and sports science facilities and services. Developed with sports performance in mind, high quality equipment and an open layout provide impressive training options to prepare for the highest levels of competition. This multi-purpose space encompasses 18,700 square feet, spans two stories and stretches the length of a football field. Planned to accommodate 100 student-athletes at a time, Golden Bears are able to complete a full training session without the need to move or wait for equipment. The facility's weight room is outfitted with over 50,000 pounds of weight, 22 fully customized work stations with inlaid platforms that provide student-athletes with a state-of-the-art facility that incorporates the latest technology and adaptability in exercise and monitoring equipment. The 25-yard turf area is used for warm-ups, plyometrics, short agility work, medicine ball throws, rehabilitation and much more. Spin, Pilates, yoga and back classes are among the activities that take place in the fitness studio. Other features in the Simpson Center include a training room, rehabilitation facilities including underwater and AlterG treadmills, cold plunges, a medical suite, dining and nutrition and academic support area, team meeting room, locker room and player lounge – all just a few steps away.

Adrienne is currently an assistant softball coach at her alma mater Hofstra, where she graduated in 2005 after playing four years of softball, once recording a string of 31 consecutive innings pitched in the NCAA Tournament without allowing a run that was the second most in NCAA history.
- Cal has six players who had fathers that also played at Cal. Wide receiver Jackson Bouza is the son of former Cal player and three-year letterwinner Matt Bouza (1978-80). Tight end Richard Rodgers' father, Richard Rodgers, Sr., lettered from 1980-83 was prominently involved in "The Play" in 1982 as the player who made the fourth of the five laterals. Wide receiver Bryce Treggs' father, Brian, was a wide receiver at Cal from 1988-91, while linebacker Hardy Nickerson's father, Hardy Sr., was a linebacker at Cal from 1983-86 and offensive lineman Dominic Galas' father, Tim, was an offensive lineman at Cal from 1979-82. Duke Moran's father, Michael, was a member of the Cal squad in 1979 and 1980 but did not earn a letter.
- Quarterback Austin Hinder is the grandson of Cal Athletic Hall of Famer Jim Hanifan, a longtime NFL and collegiate coach.
- Tailback Isi Sofele is one of eight siblings and a native of Utah.
- Bud "Dog" Turner is in his 43rd season involved with Cal football and likes to say that he is "halfway through his career".
- Tight end Jacob Wark is also a backup first baseman on Cal's baseball team that went to the College World Series in 2011.
- There are three sets of brothers on the team – wide receiver Keenan Allen and quarterback Zach Maynard, fullback Kameron and wide receiver Kaulin Krebs, and offensive linemen Jordan and Tyler Rigsbee.

## Jeff Tedford

## Head Coach • 11th Season at Cal (82-56, .594)

Jeff Tedford has established Cal as one of the elite football programs in the Pac-12 and lifted the Golden Bears into the national discussion on a consistent basis. During his first 10 seasons on the job, Cal won the third-most Pac-10/12 games and heading into 2012 had finished ranked among the nation's top 25 in four of the last eight seasons and been in the top 10 at some point in five of the past eight.

Cal posted a school-record run of seven straight bowl appearances from 2003-09 and is 5-3 in the postseason under Tedford. After a one-year absence, Tedford guided the Bears back to the bowl scene in 2011 with a trip to the Holiday Bowl. He is the only Cal mentor with more than two bowl victories, including a school-record string of four consecutive postseason wins from 2005-08. The Bears also put together a school-record-tying eight consecutive winning campaigns from 2002-09. Cal has twice posted a school-record-tying 10 wins under Tedford, the sixth and seventh times in school history, in 2004 and 2006.

Tedford boasts Cal's all-time record for victories with a 82-56 (.594) all-time mark at the school, surpassing former record holder Andy Smith (74-16-7, 1916-25) during the 2011 season. Tedford has now coached 138 games at Cal, setting the school record for most games coached during the 2010 campaign. Only two others – Pappy Waldorf (103, 1947-56) and Stub Allison (102, 1935-44) – have coached 100 or more games at Cal. Tedford also has school records in road wins (26) and conference victories (50). To top it off, he is 7-4 in the Big Game, equaling Waldorf's school record of seven wins against Stanford.

In the first 10 NFL Drafts that have occurred with Tedford as Cal's head coach, the Bears have had 40 players selected in the NFL Draft, including eight first-round picks. As of November 12, 2012, Cal's 32 former players on NFL rosters according to ESPN.com rank second among Pac-12 schools, while the team's 25 former players on active 53-player rosters (does not include players on injured reserve and physically unable to perform lists) at the beginning of the 2012 NFL season was tied for ninth nationally.

Tedford has also earned a reputation as a strong recruiter, with each of his last three classes from 2010-12 being ranked in the top 15 nationally. Prior to the 2011 campaign, Sporting News bestowed the honor of the Pac-12's best recruiter on Tedford.

All of this at the head of a program that won just one game in 2001, the year prior to his arrival. The Cal football renaissance over the past decade rates as one of the most impressive turnarounds in college football history.

But Tedford's teams have not only got it done on the field, they've also got it done in the classroom. His players have been recognized as Pac-12 All-Academic honorees 103 times since his arrival. Of the 202 seniors who have played for Tedford in his first 10 seasons, 178 (88%) earned their college degrees and/or have gone on to NFL careers.

Nationally, Cal has also had multiple Heisman Trophy candidates under Tedford, including J.J. Arrington (2004), Marshawn Lynch (2006), DeSean Jackson (2007) and Jahvid Best (2009).

Other national recognition has come the Bears way in recent years. Alex Mack was the winner of the 2008 Draddy Award (often referred to as the "academic Heisman"), while Mike Mohamed was one of 16 players across the country in the 2010 National Football Foundation's Scholar-Athlete Class of 2010 and a finalist for the prestigious honor won by Mack now known as the William V. Campbell Trophy. In 2006, the Bears had a pair of players collect national awards. Jackson was the recipient of the inaugural Randy Moss Award as the top returner in the country, while Daymeion Hughes earned The Lott IMPACT Trophy, given to a defensive player to equally recognize his athletic performance and personal character.

Despite his success as a coach and mentor, Tedford still follows a basic philosophy.

"We try to focus on one game at a time and try to reach our full potential," Tedford said emphatically.

And he still values each and every member of his football team.

"Whether it is the guys who are suited up, the guys who are going to play 50-60 plays or the guys who aren't going to play at all, I want them all to understand that they are very important to the success of the program," he said. "Their contributions are invaluable."

Tedford's hard work and dedication not only inspire his players, it has also made him a role model to the young men in the Cal program.

"Coach Tedford wasn't just a coach, I think of him as more like a father figure," said All-Pac-10 linebacker and current NFL player Desmond Bishop, who was a key player on the Packers' Super Bowl XLV winning squad. "He taught us lessons about life. He taught us to have integrity, to have character. He prepared us to be men."

# California-Oregon State: Last Time, Series History and Notes

## at California 23, Oregon State 6

**SAN FRANCISCO**—Isi Sofele rushed for a career-high 190 yards and one touchdown, quarterback Zach Maynard threw for one score and ran for another, and California beat Oregon State, 23-6.

The win, the Golden Bears' third in four games, makes them bowl eligible after sitting out the postseason last year. It also snapped Cal's four-game losing streak to the Beavers.

Backup running back C.J. Anderson ran for 96 yards and wide receiver Michael Calvin, a fifth-year senior, caught his first career touchdown for the Bears.

Sofele, whose previous high of 138 yards was set in the previous week's win over Washington State, easily eclipsed that mark while anchoring a ground game that dominated the Beavers.

Cal outgained Oregon State, 296-27, on the ground and held the ball for more than 36 minutes while beating the Beavers for the first time since Sept. 30, 2006.

Safety D.J. Campbell intercepted a deflected pass thrown by Sean Mannion at the Bears 4-yard line to stop one drive, safety Sean Cattouse recovered a fumble at the 3 and linebacker Mychal Kendricks picked off a Mannion pass with 45 seconds left to end the Beavers' night.

After Oregon State punted and pinned the Bears at their own 9-yard line, Sofele got them out of the hole quickly with a 56-yard burst up the middle on a trap play. Sofele ran twice more for 14 yards and Maynard completed one pass and took a sack before finding Calvin for a 19-yard touchdown.

Maynard later directed a 16-play, 96-yard scoring march that just over nine minutes off the clock.

# 2012 Game Summaries

## Game 1 Nevada 31, at Cal 24

September 1, 2012 • TV: Pac-12 Networks • Attendance: 63,186

**BERKELEY** – Nevada quarterback Cody Fajardo engineered the winning drive by throwing a 14-yard pass to Zach Sudfeld on third-and-4 from the Cal 38 and a 19-yarder to Brandon Wimberly that set up Stephon Jefferson's winning score, as Nevada topped Cal, 31-24, in the Bears' first game in the newly-renovated California Memorial Stadium.

Cal quarterback Zach Maynard returned after being benched for the first three series as punishment for missing a tutoring session earlier this summer to throw two touchdown passes for Cal. But he also lost a fumble deep in Nevada territory in the fourth quarter as the Bears lost at home to Nevada for the second time in 25 tries and first since 1903.

Cal appeared to seize the momentum in the third quarter when Keenan Allen answered Jefferson's second touchdown run with an elusive 39-yard score on a reverse.

Khalid Wooten fumbled the ensuing kickoff, but Cal had to settle for a field goal by Vincenzo D'Amato that cut the lead to 21-17. Maynard then fumbled at the Nevada 21 at the end of a scramble early in the fourth quarter.

The Bears did tie the game later in the fourth on Maynard's 13-yard TD pass to Chris Harper, but could never take the lead.

There wasn't much to celebrate early for the sellout crowd of 63,186 as the offense sputtered behind backup Allan Bridgford, who completed two of his nine passes and the defense once again struggled against Nevada's pistol offense.

Maynard led the Bears to a score on his third drive in the game, connecting on a 37-yard TD pass to freshman Bryce Treggs.

### Notes

- The Bears have an all-time record of 73-41-4 in season openers over the first 117 campaigns of Cal football that began in 1882. In the 2011 season opener, Cal defeated Fresno State, 36-21, at Candlestick Park in the Battle By the Bay. The Bears' most recent season-opening win at Memorial Stadium was a 52-3 victory over UC Davis on Sept. 4, 2010.

- This game was the first played in the newly-renovated California Memorial Stadium and the first at the venue since a 16-13 loss to Washington on Nov. 27, 2010. The most recent win by the Bears in Memorial Stadium was a 50-17 victory over Arizona State on Oct. 23, 2010.

- The game was a sellout of 63,186. Cal had a streak of 43 consecutive games of at least 50,000 fans that was snapped in the 2010 season finale against Washington. The last Cal sellout came against USC on Oct. 3, 2009 (71,799).

- Cal leads the all-time series with Nevada, 22-3-1 (not including an additional 7-1 mark against the Wolf Pack from 1906-14 when both schools played rugby instead of football). Prior to today, the teams had played only twice since 1945, a 33-15 Cal win in Berkeley on Sept. 21, 1996, and a 52-31 victory by Nevada in Reno on Sept. 17, 2010.

- Keenan Allen extended his streak of consecutive games with a reception to 25, every game he's played at Cal. Allen scored his first touchdown of 2012 on a reverse that went for 39 yards in the third quarter. It was Allen's second rushing TD of his career, with the first one coming against UC Davis in 2010. On the receiving end, Allen paced the Bears with six catches for 67 yards.

- For the first time in his Cal career, C.J. Anderson paced Cal in rushing, garnering 66 yards on 14 attempts. Isi Sofele rushed five times for 21 yards. Sofele also caught three passes for 33 yards.

- Bryce Treggs' first career reception was good for a 37-yard touchdown reception from Maynard. Treggs became the third Cal player in the last five seasons to score a touchdown on his first career receptions, joining Anthony Miller with the winning touchdown in the 2008 Emerald Bowl victory over Miami (FL) and Spencer Hagan against Presbyterian in 2011. Treggs caught three passes in the game for 62 yards and the score.

- Another true freshman wide receiver, Chris Harper, hauled in a game-tying touchdown pass for the Bears halfway through the fourth quarter on a 13-yard reception from Maynard. Harper finished the day with five catches for 57 yards and the TD. The last time two Cal true freshmen both scored in their first game at Cal was Marshawn Lynch and Justin Forsett on Sept. 4, 2004, at Air Force.

- Marc Anthony collected a career-high 3.0 tackles for loss. Following Allen's touchdown, the first fumble of 2012 was recovered by Kameron Jackson. Playing in his first career game, Todd Barr secured 1.5 tackles, including a 0.5 sack and a 1.5 tackle for loss. Keni Kaufusi notched his first career forced fumble, to go along with a career-best 1.0 tackles for loss.

- Making their first career starts were Chris Adcock, Allan Bridgford, Alex Logan, Jordan Riggsbee, Richard Rodgers, Brennan Scarlett and Bryce Treggs. Also, Matt Summers-Gavin started his 26th game, the most among active Cal players, and Brian Schwenke started his 25th game.

## Game 2 at Cal 50, Southern Utah 31

September 8, 2012 • TV: Pac-12 Networks • Attendance: 57,745

**BERKELEY** – California cornerback Marc Anthony scored on a 61-yard interception return in the fourth quarter and the Golden Bears beat Southern Utah, 50-31.

Keenan Allen had two touchdowns, one on a 69-yard punt return, to help the Bears notch their first victory at newly renovated Memorial Stadium.

Cal (1-1) had 518 yards of offense, and in the fourth quarter, forced two turnovers and scored 30 points.

Defensive end Aaron Tipoti recovered a fumble on Southern Utah's next possession, and Vincenzo D'Amato's third field goal made it 37-17.

Allen, who caught a 19-yard touchdown from quarterback Zach Maynard on the first play of the fourth quarter, made it 44-17 with a long punt return. Allen fumbled the ball, but recovered it and then broke free down the right sideline on his way into the endzone.

C.J. Anderson and Isi Sofele both added short touchdown runs, and Daniel Lasco scored on a 77-yard run in the fourth quarter.

Cal scored on four consecutive possessions in the second quarter to go in front.

Anderson's 7-yard touchdown run capped a 94-yard drive for the Bears. Sofele scored on a 12-yard run and D'Amato added a pair of field goals to give Cal a 20-3 lead.

Southern Utah stayed close and pulled within 20-17 midway through the third quarter on Sorensen's 5-yard touchdown pass to Brown, but the Thunderbirds couldn't slow Cal down in the fourth.

### Notes

- With Cal's victory over Southern Utah, Jeff Tedford earned his 80th career victory as head coach at Cal. Tedford is the Golden Bears' all-time winningest coach.

- This was the first-ever meeting between Cal and Southern Utah. The Bears are now 6-0 all-time against FCS opponents. Last year, Cal defeated FCS foe Presbyterian at AT&T Park, 63-12.

- Cal has now won 42 of its last 53 home games. With 50 points scored, the Bears improved to 62-5 all-time when scoring 30 or more points. The Bears are also 41-2 when scoring 40 or more and 15-0 when scoring 50 under Tedford. The last time Cal scored 50 or more points was a 63-12 victory against Presbyterian last season.

- After hauling in five catches for 57 yards against Nevada last week, true freshman Chris Harper posted seven catches for 94 yards against Southern Utah. Harper is now Cal's leading receiver on the season with 12 catches for 151 yards and a touchdown, while Allen is second with 11 catches for 136 yards and a touchdown.

- Isi Sofele was Cal's leading rusher on the day with 19 carries for 104 yards and a touchdown. The 104 yards gave Sofele his sixth career 100-yard performance, which ties him for sixth all-time at Cal. The previous five 100-yard games all came in 2011 with the last one occurring in the regular season finale at Arizona State.

- C.J. Anderson notched his ninth career rushing touchdown. The touchdown ended Cal's season-long drive of seven plays, 94 yards in 2:08. Today was the fifth time both Anderson and Sofele have scored a rushing TD in the same game, with the last occurrence happening at ASU last season.

- Daniel Lasco rushed 77 yards for his first career touchdown, which was also the longest rush of the season for the Bears. The run gave Cal 500 yards of total offense (520) for the first time since last year against Presbyterian (581)

- Keenan Allen extended his streak of consecutive games with a reception to 26, every game he's played at Cal. Allen ended the day with five catches for 69 yards and his first receiving touchdown of 2012. Entering the game ranked second in the Pac-12 and tied for 24th nationally in punt returns, Allen took a fourth-quarter punt back 69 yards for his first career punt return for a touchdown. On the season, Allen has returned six punts for 133 yards and a touchdown.

- Marc Anthony picked off his fourth career interception, and first of 2012, and returned it 61 yards for a touchdown. The last time Cal intercepted a pass and returned it for a TD was Josh Hill against Utah last season. The 61-yarder is the longest since Mychal Kendricks' 68-yard pick-six at UCLA in 2009.

- Jalen Jefferson garnered his first career tackle, and ended the day pacing the Bears with nine tackles. In the fourth quarter, Aaron Tipoti registered his first career fumble recovery. J.P. Hurrell and Brennan Scarlett secured their first career sacks, and Hurrell would go on to post three sacks (-15 yards) on the day. Nick Forbes (8) reached a new career high in tackles. Nathan Broussard earned his first career 0.5 tackle for loss.

- Vincenzo D'Amato was a personal-best 3-for-3 on field goals today, making him 4-for-5 on the season. His 47-yard field goal in the fourth quarter tied his career high (at Oregon, 2009). D'Amato also picked up a career-high 14 points on the day.

# 2012 Game Summaries

## Game 3

### at No. 12 Ohio State 35, Cal 28

September 15, 2012 • TV: ABC • Attendance: 105, 232

**COLUMBUS, Ohio** – Braxton Miller lofted a 72-yard touchdown pass to Devin Smith with 3:26 left and Christian Bryant snuffed out the Golden Bears' last chance with an interception as the 12th-ranked Buckeyes edged the Golden Bears, 35-28, at Ohio Stadium.

Cal (1-2) amassed 512 yards of offense (second-straight week the Bears went over 500 yards of total offense), including 331 yards to 173 for Ohio State in the second half alone. The Bears were victimized by three missed field goals and a touchdown that was called back by a penalty.

Ohio State built a 20-7 lead at half, but the Cal defense held the Buckeyes to just 25 yards and no first downs on 14 plays in the third quarter.

Brendan Bigelow raced 81 yards on his first carry of the game -- the longest run ever by an opposing back in 90-year-old Ohio Stadium and the longest by a Cal player since Jahvid Best's 93-yard touchdown run at UCLA in 2009. Maynard then kept on a one-yard sneak to give Cal a 21-20 lead early in the fourth quarter.

Just two plays after Ohio State took a 28-21 lead, Bigelow, who finished with career-best 160 yards on only four carries, burst through the Ohio State defense for a 16-yard run and then topped that on the next play with a 59-yarder to tie the game at 28.

Miller promptly turned the ball over by throwing an interception directly to Cal defensive back Steve Williams.

The Bears patiently drove to the Ohio State 25, where the drive stalled. On fourth-and-1, junior kicker Vincenzo D'Amato came out for a 42-yard field goal. He was wide left with 4:20 left, his third kick that sailed left of the mark on the day, missing twice from 42 and once from 40 yards.

Now down by seven after OSU's 72-yard score, the Bears still had a shot to tie, but Maynard overthrew a receiver with 1:09 left and Bryant picked it off.

## Notes

- This game was the seventh in the series between Cal and Ohio State, and the Buckeyes lead the series 6-1.
- This was also the seventh road game in the Jeff Tedford era that was played in a different time zone and started before noon PT. The Golden Bears now have a 5-2 record in those contests.
- This was the second game in a row that Cal boasted over 500 yards of total offense (512). They outgained Ohio State by 100 yards (412). Against Southern Utah, the Bears had 518 yards.
- Brendan Bigelow scored on a career-long 81-yard touchdown run. It was Cal's longest play from scrimmage this season. It is the longest rush since Jahvid Best's 93-yard touchdown run at UCLA in 2009. Bigelow followed that with a 59-yard touchdown later in the game. He ended the day with a personal-best 160 rushing yards and 234 all-purpose yards. His previous career best in all-purpose yards was 137 against Presbyterian last year.
- Zach Maynard finished 26-for-37 for 280 yards with a touchdown, an interception and a one-yard rushing touchdown. The completions were a career high. It was also Maynard's first rushing touchdown this season - fifth of his career - and the first since last year at Arizona State. Maynard spread the ball around, throwing to eight different receivers.
- Keenan Allen moved up to sixth all-time at Cal in career receptions with 164 after his nine grabs for 80 yards against the Buckeyes to pace the Bears. Na'il Benjamin is fifth with 165, Brian Treggs is fourth with 167 and Bobby Show is third with 180. Midway through the second quarter, he also registered his 2,000th-career receiving yard, and now has 2,049 for his career. Steve Rivera ranks 10th all time at Cal with 2,085 career receiving yards. Allen also had his first pass attempt since last year at Colorado. It went to Maynard for eight yards. For his career, Allen is 3-for-3 with 52 yards passing.
- Chris Harper hauled in a 19-yard touchdown reception - his second of the season - in the first quarter. He finished with three catches for 32 yards and the score.
- C.J. Anderson had a career-high four receptions for 65 yards. On the ground, Anderson carried the ball four times for 13 yards. Isi Sofele posted 21 rushes for 86 yards, including a season-best 26-yarder.
- After losing the time of possession battle the last two weeks, the Bears had the ball for 35:10 compared to 24:50 for Ohio State.
- Darius Powe made his first career catch in the first quarter. He later hauled in a 36-yard reception in the third quarter.
- Keni Kaufusi earned his second career forced fumble on the last play of the first quarter. He and Brennan Scarlett picked up their second career tackles for loss, as well. Todd Barr also registered a tackle for loss.
- Alex Logan was Cal's leading tackler with a personal-best seven takedowns. Michael Lowe also tied his career high in tackles with five.
- Steve Williams caught his fourth career interception, first of this season.

# 2012 Game Summaries

## Game 4 at No. 13 USC 27, Cal 9

September 22, 2012 • TV: Pac-12 Networks • Attendance: 83,421

**LOS ANGELES** – Matt Barkley passed for 192 yards and threw two touchdown passes to Marqise Lee, and No. 13 USC bounced back from its first loss with a 27-9 victory over Cal on Saturday.

Keenan Allen had nine catches for 93 yards for the Bears, who managed just 250 total yards and couldn't get into the Coliseum end zone, failing to build on an encouraging effort in last week's narrow loss at Ohio State.

Cal's defense could feel good about shutting down All-America receiver Robert Woods and managing two interceptions against Barkley, who couldn't beat the Bears on any long downfield throws.

At least kicker Vincenzo D'Amato shook off last week's struggles at Ohio State to hit three field goals for Cal.

D'Amato, who missed three field goal attempts in Columbus last week, missed an early 35-yard try at the Coliseum, but hit his second attempt.

USC appeared to be in position to take control after Lee's TD catch capped a sharp drive early in the second quarter, but Barkley threw his second interception on a tipped pass deep in Cal territory shortly before halftime. The Trojans added a late field goal for a 17-3 lead.

Cal pulled within 17-9 midway through the third quarter, and McNeal's fumble led to a drive deep into USC territory – but Cal burned two timeouts on the drive before T.J. McDonald picked off Maynard's throw at the 7. After Andre Heidari made his second field goal and the USC defense forced another three-and-out, the Trojans embarked on their clock-consuming drive.

### Notes

- With today's 27-9 USC victory, the Trojans extended their winning streak over Cal to nine games.
- Jeff Tedford's record is now 6-5 in conference openers. Today's game marked the fourth consecutive conference opener that the Golden Bears played on the road.
- Today's game is the only regular-season contest that Cal will play on natural grass. In 2011, all but two of the Bears' games were played on natural grass.
- With his 9 receptions on the day, Keenan Allen moved up to fourth all time at Cal in career receptions with 173. Brian Treggs, father of Cal freshman Bryce Treggs, is third on the list with 180 catches. Allen also cracked Cal's top 10 in career receiving yards. He posted 94 yards against USC to give him 2,143 yards for his career, which ranks ninth in school history. Allen passed both Steve Rivera (2,085, 1973-75) and Sean Dawkins (2,124, 1990-92) today.
- Keenan Allen extended his streak of consecutive games with a reception to 28 - every game he's played in at Cal. Heading into today's action, the streak ranked tied for eighth nationally and tied for first in the Pac-12.
- Marc Anthony set a career high with 13 tackles. He entered the game with a best of 10 at Oregon State in 2010. The 13 sets a season best for a Cal player this year, ahead of Steve Williams, Josh Hill and Robert Mullins, who all had 12 stops in the opener vs. Nevada.
- Steve Williams became Cal's active leader in interceptions with the fifth of his career on the first drive of the game. It was his second of the season. J.P. Hurrell secured his first career interception on a tipped pass with four minutes remaining in the first half.
- Cal's active career leader in tackles for loss, Deandre Coleman, secured his 12th career tackle for loss.
- For the second time in his career, Vincenzo D'Amato made three field goals (also vs. Southern Utah, Sept. 8, 2012). He was 3-for-4 on the day.
- Jacob Wark had a personal-best 26 yards receiving on two catches, second to Allen among the Bears.

# 2012 Game Summaries

## Game 5 Arizona State 27, at Cal 17

September 29, 2012 • TV: FX • Attendance: 51,634

**BERKELEY** – Taylor Kelly threw three touchdown passes to help Arizona State send California to a 1-4 start with a 27-17 victory on Saturday.

The Sun Devils, who lead the Pac-12 in scoring and total defense, harassed Zach Maynard all afternoon, proving they can be just effective against a starting quarterback after feasting on backups the previous three weeks.

Maynard finished 9 for 28 for 126 yards with a touchdown. Isi Sofele rushed for 105 yards and scored his second touchdown of the season. Cal's standout wide receiver Keenan Allen hauled in four catches for 79 yards and a touchdown, including a season-best 44-yard reception. Allen moved up to seventh in career receiving yards at Cal, now with 2,221. He surpassed Na'il Benjamin and Wesley Walker today.

Kelly completed 26 of 45 passes for 292 yards, but Arizona State was unable to pull away. The Sun Devils settled for field goal attempts on five drives deep into Cal territory. Alex Garoutte made only two of them, hitting the upright on a 39-yard try in the third quarter and having a 37-yarder blocked by Nick Forbes early in the fourth to keep the lead at 20-10.

Cal responded with an 80-yard scoring drive that featured a career-best 44-yard run by C.J. Anderson and a 10-yard TD pass from Maynard to Allen, to make it 20-17.

Kelly coolly led Arizona State on 74-yard drive, completing 4 of 5 passes for 45 yards, capped by a 22-yarder to Ozier to make it 27-17 with 6:17 to play.

Cal went three-and-out on its next possession before punting and then through three incomplete passes and took a sack in its final drive inside the last two minutes of the game.

Cal's first quarter touchdown took only 1:01 off the clock and covered 76 yards in three plays, starting with a 44-yard pass from Maynard to Allen. After an 8-yard pass play to Bryce Treggs, Sofele scampered 24 yards up the middle to tie the game at 7-7.

The Sun Devils scored early in the first quarter on Rogers' first catch of the season, a 1-yarder from Kelly. Garoutte made a 28-yard field goal later in the quarter before the Sun Devils capitalized on a fumble by Sofele late in the first half to score on Kelly's 9-yard pass to Ozier with 53 seconds remaining.

### Notes

- With today's 27-17 Arizona State victory, Cal fell to 1-4, 0-2 on the season. It was the first time the Sun Devils beat the Golden Bears in five years and only the second time in Jeff Tedford's tenure at Cal. It was also the first time ASU beat Cal at Memorial Stadium since 1997.

- Keenan Allen hauled in four catches for 79 yards and a touchdown on the day. The receiving touchdown was his second of the season and the 13th of his career, which ties him for eighth all-time at Cal. His first catch of the day was good for 44 yards, a season high.

- Allen now has 177 career receptions. That total ranks fourth all-time at Cal and is three shy of Bobby Shaw's third-place total of 180. He also has 2,221 career receiving yards, which ranks seventh all-time at Cal, as he passed Na'il Benjamin and Wesley Walker today. Marvin Jones is sixth with 2,270 career receiving yards while Brian Treggs and Dameane Douglas are tied for fourth with 2,335 yards each.

- Allen also extended his streak of consecutive games with a reception to 29 - every game he's played in at Cal. Heading into today's action, the streak ranked tied for eighth nationally and tied for first in the Pac-12.

- On Cal's first drive of the game, Isi Sofele rattled off a season-high 32-yard rush. On Cal's second drive, Sofele reached 2,000-career rushing yards. He now has 2,075 for his career. On the day, he finished with 15 carries for 105 yards and his second touchdown run of the season - 13th of his career. He also posted his seventh career 100-yard rushing performance - second this season - which ranks 10th all-time in school history.

- C.J. Anderson had a career-long 44-yard rush to set up Allen's touchdown reception in the fourth quarter. He finished with 78 yards on eight carries.

- Avery Sebastian notched a career-high 15 tackles, the most since D.J. Holt (at Nevada), Chris Conte (at USC) and Mike Mohamed (vs. Oregon) tallied 16 each in 2010. The total included his first career tackle for loss.

- Todd Barr and Brennan Scarlett notched their third and second career sacks, respectively. Michael Lowe chipped in a personal-best nine tackles and Jalen Jefferson tied his career high in tackles with nine, as well.

- Nick Forbes blocked a field goal attempt in the fourth quarter, Cal's first blocked field goal this season. The last time Cal blocked a field goal was by Rulon Davis against Washington State on Sept. 6, 2008.

- Cal's one penalty for 15 yards was the lowest in the Pac-12 this season in both categories

## Game 6

### at Cal 43, No. 25 UCLA 17

October 6, 2012 • TV: Pac-12 Networks • Attendance: 57,643

**BERKELEY** – Zach Maynard matched his career high with four touchdown passes and added a fifth score on the ground and California forced a season-high six turnovers to defeat No. 25 UCLA, 43-17.

Richard Rodgers caught seven passes for 129 yards, both career bests, while Keenan Allen caught a pair of touchdowns and finished with eight receptions to move into third place on Cal's career list and also had a career-high-tying two touchdown catches.

Maynard, who completed only 9 of 28 passes in last week's loss to Arizona State, was almost flawless against UCLA. He completed 13 consecutive throws during one stretch in the second half and finished 25 of 30 for 295 yards.

The Bears' senior quarterback also scored on a 1-yard keeper in the fourth quarter following a 57-yard interception return by safety Michael Lowe.

UCLA quarterback Brett Hundley threw four interceptions, three by Bears cornerback Kameron Jackson that were the first three of his career. The Bruins, who had only one turnover in their previous two games, also fumbled twice.

C.J. Anderson rushed for a career-high 151 yards, 68 on a touchdown run in the fourth quarter to extend Cal's lead to 26 points. Anderson's 151 rushing yards on the night were the most since Brendan Bigelow amassed 160 earlier this season at Ohio State.

Following a 26-yard field goal by Vincenzo D'Amato, his fifth straight make, Cal later took the lead on Maynard's 5-yard touchdown pass to Anderson midway through the second quarter. Maynard got the drive started with a 42-yard completion to tight end Rodgers then capped it with the throw to Anderson, who beat safety Tevin McDonald on an slant pattern.

Five plays after a UCLA fumble, Maynard connected with Allen for an 8-yard touchdown on an inside slant play similar to the one run by Anderson.

Maynard threw touchdowns on Cal's first two drives in the second half to push the lead to 29-14.

## Notes

- With the 43-17 California victory over No. 25 UCLA, Jeff Tedford continued his streak of not losing to UCLA at Memorial Stadium during his tenure at Cal. The last time the Bruins won at Memorial Stadium was in 1998. The last time the Bears beat a top-25 team before tonight was in 2009 when Cal beat then-No. 14 Stanford, 34-28. The Golden Bears are 63-5 when scoring 30 points and 42-2 when scoring 40 points.

- Keenan Allen hauled in eight catches for 79 yards and two touchdown receptions. The receiving touchdowns were his third and fourth of the season and the 14th and 15th of his career. He is tied for seventh all-time at Cal in career touchdowns.

- Allen now has 185 career receptions. That total ranks third all-time at Cal, as he passed Bobby Shaw tonight. He is 10 receptions away from Dameane Douglas for second (195), and Geoff McArthur is first with 202. He also has 2,300 career receiving yards, which ranks sixth all-time at Cal, as he passed Marvin Jones today. Brian Treggs and Dameane Douglas are tied for fourth with 2,335 career receiving yards and DeSean Jackson is third with 2,423 receiving yards.

- Allen also extended his streak of consecutive games with a reception to 30 - every game he's played in at Cal. Heading into today's action, the streak ranked tied for eighth nationally and tied for first in the Pac-12.

- Zach Maynard tied his career high with four touchdown passes, two of which went to Allen. It was the first time he threw four touchdowns in a regulation contest, and also added a rushing TD, making him responsible for five touchdowns for the first time in his career. The only other time he threw for four touchdowns was in the overtime win at Colorado last season. He ended the contest completing 25 of 30 passes for a season-high 295 yards with an interception along with the four passing TDs.

- Richard Rodgers enjoyed a career day, catching seven passes for 129 yards, his first career 100-yard performance. In the fourth quarter, he racked up a career-high 50-yard reception. In the second quarter, he collected a 42-yard reception.

- C.J. Anderson snagged his first touchdown reception of the season - second of his career - for Cal's first touchdown of the night in the second quarter. In the fourth quarter, he secured his second touchdown of this season - 10th of his career - that came on a personal-best 68-yard run. Anderson finished the day with a career high in carries (21) and rushing yards (151). The 100-yard performance was the first of his career.

- Earning his first career start, Brendan Bigelow hauled in his first receiving touchdown, good for 32 yards. It was his fourth career score.

- Kameron Jackson notched his first career interception right before halftime, and then grabbed his second and third INTs in the fourth quarter. The last time a Cal player had two or more interceptions was Sean Cattouse against Presbyterian last year.

- Michael Lowe earned his first career interception and returned it 42 yards. It was one of six turnovers Cal's defense forced on the night. The last time the Cal defense forced five or more turnovers was against Colorado in 2010.

- Vincenzo D'Amato has made his last five consecutive field goals, including a 26-yarder tonight in his only attempt. The drive that ended with D'Amato's field goal was the Bears' longest drive of the season (16 plays) that lasted a season-high 6:35.

## Game 7

### Cal 31, at Washington State 17

October 13, 2012 • TV: Pac-12 Networks • Attendance: 27,339

**PULLMAN, Wash.** – Quarterback Zach Maynard threw for a touchdown and ran for another as California beat Washington State 31-17 on Saturday night.

C.J. Anderson rushed for two touchdowns as the Golden Bears (3-4, 2-2 Pac-12) earned their eighth straight win over the Cougars.

Cal got a balanced ground attack from Anderson, Brendan Bigelow and Maynard, who each rushed for more than 50 yards. As a team, Cal rushed for over 300 yards (318) for the first time since 2010 and produced over 500 yards of total offense (507) for the third time this season.

The Bears held Washington State to just 36 rushing yards for the game.

The Bears scored first, after Michael Lowe's interception gave Cal the ball on its own 25. On the third play, Maynard connected with his brother, Keenan Allen, on a short pass that turned into a 69-yard touchdown reception and a 7-0 Bears lead late in the first quarter.

WSU's Andrew Furney's 20-yard field goal to cut Cal's lead to 7-3 in the second quarter.

Cal responded with a 75-yard drive, and Anderson ran over from the 4 to give the Bears a 14-3 lead that they held at the end of the first half.

Cal marched 71 yards on the opening drive of the second half, with Maynard running over from the 1-yard line for a 21-3 lead.

Washington State came back with a 75-yard drive, with Tuel passing 8 yards to Brett Bartolone for a touchdown to narrow Cal's lead to 21-10 with 6:42 left in the third. That broke a string of six quarters in which WSU had not scored a touchdown.

Vincenzo D'Amato hit a 52-yard field goal to lift Cal to a 24-10 lead with 2:02 left in the third. Furney missed a 43-yarder for WSU early in the fourth quarter.

Anderson added a 29-yard touchdown run for a 31-10 lead.

Cal's Steve Williams hauled in his sixth career interception and his third this season. In the last two games, Cal has posted six interceptions.

## Notes

- With today's 31-17 California victory over Washington State, Jeff Tedford continued his winning streak against the Cougars, which now stands at eight. The last time Cal lost to Washington State was in 2002. Tonight's win also marked Tedford's 50th career conference victory at Cal.

- The Golden Bears are 64-5 when scoring 30 points in the Tedford era.

- Keenan Allen hauled in 11 catches for 166 yards and a season-high 69-yard touchdown reception. It was his first 100-yard receiving performance of the season and the seventh of his career, which ranks fifth all time at Cal. The 11 catches gave Allen his first double-digit reception game this season. The receiving touchdown was the fifth of the season and the 16th of his career. He is seventh all-time at Cal in career touchdowns. The touchdown also marked the first time this season that Cal scored first.

- Allen now has 196 career receptions. That total ranks second all-time at Cal, as he passed Dameane Douglas tonight. He is just six receptions away from Geoff McArthur with 202. He also has 2,466 career receiving yards, which ranks third all-time at Cal. Bobby Shaw is second with 2,731 and Geoff McArthur is first with 3,188.

- Allen also extended his streak of consecutive games with a reception to 31 - every game he's played in at Cal. Heading into today's action, the streak ranked tied for eighth nationally and tied for first in the Pac-12.

- Zach Maynard completed 14 of 23 passes for 189 yards with a touchdown pass, a rushing touchdown and two interceptions. He set a new personal best in rushing yards with 78 on 10 carries. He also rushed for his seventh career rushing touchdown, third in 2012.

- C.J. Anderson punched in his team-leading third and fourth rushing touchdowns this season - 11th and 12th of his career - and ended the night with 112 yards on 15 carries. It was his second career 100-yard performance, as he also went over 100 yards last week against UCLA. Anderson is the second Cal player to score two rushing touchdowns in a game this season (Brendan Bigelow vs. Ohio State). Anderson is Cal's leading rusher on the season with 498 yards. Tonight marked the third game that Anderson led Cal in rushing.

- Anderson, Sofele and Bigelow have now combined for 1,000 rushing yards this season. The trio, along with Maynard, each rushed for at least 50 yards tonight.

- Vincenzo D'Amato connected on a career-long 52-yard field goal in the third quarter. He has now made his last six consecutive field goal attempts.

- Cal posted 500 yards of total offense (507) for the third time this season. The Bears also produced 318 rushing yards. The last time Cal rushed for over 300 yards as a team was against UCLA in 2010 (304). In the last three games, the Cal rushing attack is averaging 220 yards per game.

- Steve Williams secured his third interception of the season - sixth of his career - in the first quarter. He is Cal's active career and season leader in that category. Williams also set a new career high with four pass breakups, giving him 22 for his career with ranks tied for 10th all time at Cal.

- Michael Lowe caught his second career interception, and his second in as many weeks. As a team, the Bears have secured six interceptions in the last two games.

## Game 8

### Stanford 21, at Cal 3

October 20, 2012 • TV: FOX • Attendance: 61,024

**BERKELEY** – The No. 22 Cardinal (5-2, 3-1 Pac-12) outgained the Bears 475 to 217 yards, outrushed them 252 to 3 yards and beat Cal, 21-3.

Stepfan Taylor ran for a career-high 189 yards and a touchdown, Josh Nunes completed 16 of 31 passes for 214 yards and a score and the Cardinal coasted to victory.

Cal (3-5, 2-3) had not scored so few points in the Big Game since losing 10-3 in 1998. Zach Maynard was sacked four times, the Bears fumbled three times - losing two of them - and had another interception of Nunes wiped out by a penalty.

Scrambling for yards on the game's opening possession, Nunes fumbled and Deandre Coleman recovered at the Cal 47. On the ensuing drive, Chase Thomas jarred the ball loose from Maynard on third down and forced the Bears to punt.

On the ensuing drive, Taylor shook two defenders at the line of scrimmage, cut outside and sliced back up the middle for a 7-yard touchdown run to give Stanford a 7-0 lead late in the first quarter.

Starting out of a power formation, Ertz broke free for a short catch and ran 68 yards down the sideline. Fellow tight end Levine Toilolo followed with a 9-yard touchdown pass from backup Kevin Hogan - normally just a read-option quarterback - to put the Cardinal ahead 14-3 on the first throw of his career.

The Bears lost 2 yards on three plays - all runs - after Keenan Allen returned a punt 29 yards and Brendan Bigelow took a short slant for a 31-yard gain to Stanford's 2. They settled for a 21-yard field goal by Vincenzo D'Amato.

Bigelow also fumbled early in the second quarter to end another Cal drive, and a pass interference penalty on Steve Williams wiped out an interception. And after a video review, officials ruled that Jordan Richards stripped Allen before the wide receiver went down and Stanford's Devon Carrington recovered.

Nunes found Ertz on the next play for a 20-yard touchdown pass to give Stanford a 21-3 lead and quiet the crowd, other than the small smattering of boos fans mixed in on occasion.

Stanford stuffed Isi Sofele on fourth-and-1 from the Cal 44 early in the fourth quarter, a play that essentially put the game away. Marc Anthony stepped in front of a pass by Nunes for an interception on the following possession and returned it to the Cal 10. But the Bears' best drive of the game then ended when Wayne Lyons tip-toed the sideline to intercept Maynard's pass at the Stanford 3.

Maynard completed 19 of 31 passes for 214 yards - most with the game already decided. Allen, one of the nation's best receivers, was held to four catches for 43 yards.

## Notes

- Jeff Tedford fell to 7-4 against the Cardinal in the Big Game. He is tied with the legendary Pappy Waldorf for the most wins against Stanford at Cal.

- Chris Harper led Cal in receiving for the second time this season, posting four catches for 82 yards. He also notched a season-high 29-yard reception. Three of his four catches were good for 20 or more yards, and he compiled three of the four grabs in the fourth quarter.

- Keenan Allen hauled in four catches for 43 yards. Allen now has 200 career receptions. That total ranks second all-time at Cal, as he is just two receptions away from Geoff McArthur with 202. He also has 2,509 career receiving yards, which ranks third all-time at Cal. Bobby Shaw is second with 2,731 and Geoff McArthur is first with 3,188.

- Allen also extended his streak of consecutive games with a reception to 32 - every game he's played in at Cal. Heading into today's action, the streak ranked tied for eighth nationally and tied for first in the Pac-12.

- Brendan Bigelow returned a kick return for a season-high 40 yards. He also hauled in a 31-yard reception - one yard shy of his personal best - that led to Cal's field goal. He added a second catch to end the game with 40 receiving yards.

- Vincenzo D'Amato made his seventh consecutive field goal in the second quarter. He has now been good on 11 of his 16 attempts this season.

- On the opening drive of the game, Robert Mullins forced his second career fumble that was recovered by Deandre Coleman, the second recovery of his career.

- In the fourth quarter, Marc Anthony picked off his fifth career interception and his second this season. In the last three games, the Bears have registered seven interceptions.

- Josh Hill ended the game with 11 tackles, second to Nick Forbes' game high of 13, which was a personal best for him.

- Cole Leininger booted eight punts for an average of 40.0, including a 56-yarder. Three of his punts were inside the 20.

- The 217 yards of total offense were the lowest for the Bears this season. The previous low in 2012 was 250 at USC. Cal finished the game with three rushing yards as a team. The last time the Bears were held to less than 10 rushing yards was against Texas in the Holiday Bowl last year (7).

## Game 9 at Utah 49, Cal 27

October 27, 2012 • TV: Pac-12 Networks • Attendance: 45,017

**SALT LAKE CITY, Utah** – Reggie Dunn set a school record with two 100-yard kickoff returns, and Utah's defense forced three turnovers in a 49-27 victory over California. Keenan Allen hauled in five catches to become Cal's all-time career receptions leader, but the Bears could not overcome a slow start.

Reggie Topps' 17-yard fumble return for a touchdown gave Utah a 14-3 lead with 2:13 left in the first quarter. The Utes led 28-6 at halftime after a 5-yard TD run by freshman quarterback Travis Wilson.

In his third start, Wilson completed 16 of 24 passes for 156 yards.

Utah intercepted Zach Maynard once and sacked him four times.

Allen surpassed Geoff McArthur (202, 2000-04) to become Cal's all-time receptions leader and now has 205 career catches, but he didn't get on track until the game was well in hand.

Cal outgained Utah 441-344, but turnovers and penalties hurt the Bears, who scored a pair of late touchdowns after being kept out of the end zone for seven straight quarters.

Utah's defense, which held Oregon State to 228 yards in a road loss last week, allowed Cal to average over 10 yards on its first four plays.

D'Amato added a 38-yarder, his ninth straight, in the second quarter.

Cal finished with 153 yards rushing, but a huge chunk came on Brendan Bigelow's 57-yard TD on the final play of the third quarter, when the Bears trailed 42-6.

Maynard finished 20 of 32 for 288 yards with two TDs and an interception.

Allen, meanwhile, needed just three catches to become Cal's all-time receptions leader, but he didn't catch his first pass until 10:52 remained in the third quarter. Five plays later, Lacy made a play against Allen to break up what would have been a 29-yard TD reception.

Allen tied the all-time mark of 202 catches with 4:26 left in the third on a 15-yard reception, but Maynard fumbled the ball away on the next play on a hit by Trevor Reilly. Allen broke the record on an 11-yard catch with 12:43 remaining, and added a 23-yard TD reception on the next play with 12:17 to go.

### Notes

- Utah has now defeated Cal in three of the last four meetings. The Bears lead the overall series, 5-4.

- With an 11-yard catch in the fourth quarter, junior wide receiver Keenan Allen recorded the 203rd reception of his career, passing Geoff McArthur for Cal's all-time career record. McArthur had 202 catches from 2000-04. Allen ended the night with 5 catches for 61 yards and a career total of 205 receptions.

- Keenan Allen also extended his streak to 33 games with a catch - every game of his Cal career - with a nine-yard reception earlier in the third quarter. Heading into today's action, the streak ranked eighth nationally and first in the Pac-12.

- Freshman tight end Richard Rodgers had a career-long 51-yard reception late in the first quarter - one yard longer than his previous personal best, which he obtained against UCLA. He had his first career TD catch late in the fourth quarter, a 7-yarder.

- Cornerback Steve Williams recorded his team-leading ninth pass break-up of the year on an attempt into the end zone. Williams now has 24 break-ups during his career, which ranks ninth in Cal history.

- Tailback Brendan Bigelow had a his third touchdown run of at least 50 yards this season when he went 57 yards for a score at the end of the third quarter. Bigelow also had TD rushes of 81 and 59 yards at Ohio State. The last time a Cal running back had three rushes of 50 or more yards was Jahvid Best in 2009 (61, 73, 93).

- Vincenzo D'Amato connected on two field goals against Utah to run his streak to nine consecutive makes. He had a 49-yarder in the first quarter and a 38-yarder early in the second quarter. D'Amato is now 13-for-18 on the year.

- Freshman wide receiver Chris Harper matched his career high with seven catches. He also had seven against Southern Utah.

- Despite the loss, Cal outgained Utah, 441 yards to 334. The Bears had 288 yards through the air and 153 on the ground.

# 2012 Game Summaries

## Game 10

### Washington 21, at Cal 13

November 2, 2012 • TV: ESPN2 • Attendance: 42,226

**BERKELEY** – Bishop Sankey ran for a career-high 189 yards and two touchdowns to give Washington a 21-13 over California on Friday night at Memorial Stadium.

Cal's running back also reached a new personal best as C.J. Anderson rushed for 160 yards on 22 carries, including a 64-yarder.

The Golden Bears (3-7, 2-5) lost for the fourth time in six games at their renovated stadium and are assured of missing out on a bowl for just the second time since 2003.

Cal played the game without injured star receiver Keenan Allen and then lost starting quarterback Zach Maynard to a left knee injury late in the fourth quarter.

Backup Allan Bridgford drove the Bears to the Washington 25 with just over a minute left but he missed Anderson down the sideline on fourth-and-5 to end Cal's hopes.

Each team had four turnovers in a sloppy game, including three lost fumbles in a span of six plays early in the fourth quarter. An interception on the next drive helped seal the win for Washington.

Cal settled for field goals twice in the third quarter after driving deep into Washington territory, which proved costly when Seferian-Jenkins made a leaping grab over the smaller Steve Williams for a 29-yard score on third-and-goal to give the Huskies a 14-13 lead in the final minute of the third quarter.

The score remained there when Cal failed to capitalize on another good chance. Maynard overthrew an open Chris Harper in the end zone and D'Amato missed wide right from 41 yards, ending a streak of 11 straight makes.

Cal's lone touchdown came late in the second quarter on Harper's 14-yard reverse on a drive extended by a personal foul on Danny Shelton on third-and-long.

Harper finished with a career-high 101 yard receiving on a career-high-tying seven catches, including a career-long 36-yard reception.

## Notes

- Chris Harper led Cal in receiving for the third time this season, posting a career-high tying seven catches for a personal-best 101 yards, his first 100-yard performance. Harper scored on a 14-yard reverse, his first career rush. It was his third touchdown of the season and his first rushing score. He also notched a season-long 36-yard reception.
- C.J. Anderson paced Cal in rushing for the fifth time this season. Part of his career-high 160 yards on 22 carries was a 64-yard run in the third quarter that was the second-longest rush of his career (68 vs. UCLA). Tonight marked his third game of rushing for over 100 yards this season.
- As a team, the Bears rushed for 249 yards. It was the fourth time this season that Cal hit 200 or more yards rushing.
- Zach Maynard moved into 10th in career passing yards at Cal, now with 5,204 for his career. Against Washington, Maynard completed 15 of 29 passes for 175 yards and an interception.
- After entering Saturday's contest with just one fumble recovery, Nick Forbes contributed three turnovers against the Huskies. He gamered his first career interception at the end of the first half and returned it 26 yards. Later in the third quarter, Forbes recovered a fumble that was forced by Robert Mullins. It was Mullins' third career forced fumble and Forbes second career recovery. In the fourth quarter, Forbes boasted his third career fumble recovery that was forced by Todd Barr, his first forced fumble.
- Forbes entered the night tied with Josh Hill for Cal's season lead in tackles. He took sole possession of the lead with his game-high 11 tackles against Washington, including a tackle for loss.
- With the four turnovers tonight, the Cal defense has now forced 15 turnovers in the past five games.
- Vincenzo D'Amato made his 10th and 11th consecutive field goals in the third quarter (23 and 21 yards) before missing in the fourth quarter. He has now been good on 15 of his 21 attempts this season.
- Chris McCain picked up a 16-yard sack in the third quarter. He now has 3.5 sacks on the season and five for his career.
- In the fourth quarter, McCain recovered a fumble for the first time in his career. That fumble was forced by Brennan Scarlett, the second of his career. Scarlett also recorded a sack on that play and now has 2.5 in his career.
- Keni Kaufusi also posted his second career sack.
- Allan Bridgford made his third appearance of the season, completing two of seven passes for 26 yards. He replaced an injured Zach Maynard on Cal's final drive of the game.
- In five of the seven games Cal has lost this season, the Bears have been within one score in the fourth quarter. The Bears lost by eight points tonight.
- The last three Cal-Washington games have been decided in the final minute..

# 2012 Game Summaries

## Game 11 Oregon 59, at Cal 17

November 10, 2012 • TV: ESPN • Attendance: 57,672

**BERKELEY** – Marcus Mariota overcame a brief injury to throw for a career-high 377 yards and tie a school record with six touchdown passes as No. 2 Oregon beat California, 59-17.

Oregon raced past the Bears with their passing game instead of the vaunted running attack that had rushed for at least 400 yards in the previous three games. Cal held Kenjon Barner to 65 yards on 20 carries - 256 fewer yards than he had last week against USC - and even knocked him out briefly with a hard hit that sent him to the locker room in the first half.

Mariota also left the game after a hard fall late in the second quarter but returned the following series. He then helped the Ducks break the game open in the second half with four TD passes, including his second and third of the game to Josh Huff.

Mariota completed 27-of-34 passes and tied the school TD record last achieved by Darron Thomas last year against Nevada. Huff finished with five catches for 109 yards and three scores as the Ducks set a major college football record by scoring at least 40 points for a 13th straight game.

The biggest moment came midway through the third quarter after the Bears cut Oregon's lead to 24-17 and got a stop on defense to fire up a crowd that has had little to cheer about this season.

Isi Sofele, who rushed for a season-best 134 yards, had been gashing Oregon's defense in the second half and started this drive with a 14-yard run. But Allan Bridgford threw an incomplete pass, Brendan Bigelow was stopped for a 1-yard gain and then Bridgford was intercepted by Boseko Lokombo on a screen pass under heavy pressure from Arik Armstead.

Mariota found Huff on a 35-yard touchdown pass on the next play to make it 31-17 and the Ducks rolled from there. Mariota and Huff teamed up on a 39-yard score on the next drive and the rout was on.

Bridgford finished 9 for 21 for 113 yards, one touchdown and two interceptions. His touchdown pass, the first of his career, was caught by Darius Powe. The touchdown reception was also the first at Cal for Powe.

### Notes

- Isi Sofele posted his eighth career 100-yard performance, third of 2012, with a season-high 134 yards on 15 carries with a touchdown. He garnered rushes of 31 and 35 yards. They were the longest running plays that the Oregon defense has allowed all season. The previous longest run was 25 yards against Colorado.
- As a team, Cal rushed for 236 yards. It was the fifth time this season that the Bears have rushed for at least 200 yards as a team.
- Filling in for the injured Zach Maynard, Allan Bridgford completed nine of 21 passes for 113 yards with a touchdown and two interceptions. His first career touchdown pass was caught by Darius Powe, which was also the first career touchdown reception for Powe.
- Vincenzo D'Amato has made 12 of his last 14 field goal attempts. He was good on a 27-yard attempt in the second quarter. D'Amato, who leads the Pac-12 in field goals made and percentage, has made 16 of his 23 attempts this season.
- Brendan Bigelow posted a season-high 57-yard kick return. His personal best was an 88-yarder that he returned for a touchdown last season against Presbyterian.
- Josh Hill and Nick Forbes paced the Bears on defense with 10 tackles each. Hill also recorded a pass breakup, while Forbes tallied a tackle for loss.
- Senior Ross Bostock made his first career start.
- The game marked the final appearance at Memorial Stadium for Cal's 19 seniors - C.J. Anderson, Marc Anthony, Ross Bostock, Tyré Ellison, Dominic Galas, Josh Hill, J.P. Hurrell, Kameron Krebs, Kaulin Krebs, Mike Manuel, Zach Maynard, Robert Mullins, Kendrick Payne, Tyler Rigsbee, Brian Schwenke, Isi Sofele, Eric Stevens, Matt Summers-Gavin and Aaron Tipoti. The group was honored with a pregame ceremony.
- The 1991 Cal football team was honored in a ceremony during the game. The 1991 Bears finished that campaign with a 10-2 record and a final AP ranking of eighth.
- The attendance was 57,672. In the seven home games this season, Cal had an average attendance of 55,876, including a season-high attendance of 63,186 in the season opener against Nevada. Six of the seven games had an attendance of over 50,000.

## Parking/Transportation

### Gameday

Parking at Cal is always at a premium and visitors are encouraged to use public transportation. The Downtown Berkeley BART station is located about a mile west of Memorial Stadium, in close proximity to Haas Pavilion, Edwards Stadium/Goldman Field, the Hellman Tennis Courts and Spieker Aquatics Complex. Hourly guest parking on non-football gamedays is available in the MLK Student Union and RSF garages along Bancroft Way adjacent to Haas Pavilion and at the Underhill Garage.

Underhill also serves as the football gameday parking location. Entrances are off either Channing Way or Haste Street, just west of College Avenue. The lot is about three blocks from Memorial Stadium. Media can either take the short walk to media will call (located in the third-floor lobby of the Simpson Center adjacent to Memorial Stadium) or use a media-only shuttle that begins running two hours before game time. A media shuttle is also available post-game from the pregame dropoff point along Warring Street to the Underhill Garage.

Parking passes cannot be left at will call on gamedays and must be picked up or mailed in advance.

Television crews should order parking passes for their crews by sending in the Special Event Parking Arrangements form found on the university's website ([pt.berkeley.edu](http://pt.berkeley.edu)) in advance. Request the Underhill Garage for football games. Note that the campus parking office does not accept credit cards – only cash or check.

### Non-Gameday

**MLK Student Union Garage** – Paid parking is available at the MLK Student Union Garage located on the north side of Bancroft Way between Telegraph Avenue and Dana Street (basketball gameday media parking lot) about five blocks to the west of the Simpson Center and Memorial Stadium. If you park here, you would then need to walk east on Bancroft Way until you reach the venue.

**Public Transportation** – Public transportation is highly recommended when visiting Berkeley. There are multiple public transportation options that lead directly to Memorial Stadium and Witter Rugby Field. BART has a station in downtown Berkeley about a half-mile west of the venue. Please visit [bart.org](http://bart.org), [actransit.org](http://actransit.org) or 511.org for more information.

**Recreational Sports Facility Garage** – Paid parking is available at the Recreational Sports Facility Garage located on the north side of Bancroft Way between Telegraph Avenue and Dana Street (basketball gameday media parking lot) about six blocks to the west of Witter Rugby Field. If you park here, you would then need to walk east on Bancroft Way until you reach the venue.

**Street** – Paid parking is available all day on weekends and after 5 p.m. PT on weekdays along Stadium Rim Way. The payment machine is located in the southeast corner of Witter lot and accepts only \$1 and \$5 bills. No other forms of payment are available. Limited two-hour free and paid street parking (check signs) may be available on streets near Memorial Stadium/Simpson Center, with most options just south along Piedmont Avenue, Prospect Street, Channing Way or Warring Street.

**Underhill Garage** – Paid parking is available at the Underhill Garage located at the corner of Channing Way and College Avenue (football gameday media parking lot) about five blocks to the southwest of Witter Rugby Field. If you park here, you would then need to walk north on College Avenue to Bancroft Way and then east on Bancroft Way until you reach the venue.

**Witter Lot** – Paid parking in the vicinity of Witter Rugby Field is available in the adjacent Witter Lot located just south of Centennial Drive near the corner of Centennial and Stadium Rim Way on a first-come, first-served basis. The payment machine is located in the southeast corner of the lot and accepts only \$1 and \$5 bills. No other forms of payment are available. If you park here, you would then need to walk down the hill on Stadium Rim Way on the south side of the stadium keeping the stadium on your right until you reach the Simpson Center.

Power and internet access are available, as well as limited desk space on a first-come, first-served basis. Pregame meals and drinks are available on the media level of the press box (seventh floor).

Access to the internet is available through both wireless and an ethernet connection, and passwords and usernames will be distributed on gamedays.

## Photographers

Field photographers must wear a photo vest at all times, in addition to a photo credential. Photo credentials are not distributed in advance and must be picked up on gamedays along with photo vests at media will call on the third floor Simpson Center. Photo vests will require an identification card to be left until the vests are returned.

NCAA rules limit shooting to outside the restraining line enclosing the playing field and outside the 25-yard lines (the team area).

In addition, the photographers and videographers are welcome to use the photo deck located on level six of the press box.

## Postgame Media Work Area

The Peter E. Haas Press Box at Memorial Stadium also serves as the postgame media work location. The area is equipped with desk space, electrical outlets and internet access. Final statistical game books, as well as postgame notes, quotes and other relevant media materials will be distributed.
