

One of the most dominant interior linemen in the Pac-10 last season, consistently drawing double-team strategy from opposing offenses ... named honorable mention All-Pac-10 for a second straight season last fall ... along with Donnie McCleskey, one of two defensive team captains in 2003 ... tabbed second team All-Pac-10 by Athlon Sports in its 2004 preseason magazine ... has earned a reputation for stuffing the run and providing internal pressure on the interior line ... one of the nation's premier recruits three years ago ... a massive player with all the tools to develop into a college All-American ... has a great combination of size, strength and instincts ... runs a 4.8 in 40-yard dash ... 2003 ... spearheaded strong defensive efforts against such teams as Southern Mississippi (defensive shutout), Washington (293 yards, 7 points), Arizona (14 points), UCLA (228 yards, two TDs) and USC (24 points in regulation) ... given the Brick Muller Award as the team's most valuable defensive lineman after surpassing his career-high in tackles this year with 33 stops ... 2002 ... blossomed into one of the conference's better defensive interior linemen, earning All-Pac-10 honorable mention notice as a sophomore ... posted 25 tackles (19 solo), five tackles for losses, one sack and one fumble recovery in winning the Bob Tessier Award as the team's Most Improved Lineman on defense ... also blocked two kicks on special teams ... played in all 12 games, drawing six starts (Game 1 and Games 8-12) ... paramount effort came in Cal's 17-12 win over UCLA Oct. 19 when he bagged four tackles, including two stops for losses of six yards, and recovered a critical fumble ... also nabbed four tackles in the season opener vs. Baylor and tallied his lone sack of the season in the Big Game against Stanford ... 2001 ... baptized under fire, receiving estimable playing time in all 11 games during his rookie year as a true freshman ... pocketed 24 tackles (including five for losses of 15 yards), one sack and one fumble recovery in earning 2001 Pac-10 All-Freshmen first team honors from The Sporting News ... started last five games at defensive tackle, a period in which he notched 16 tackles ... punched out season-high six tackles in the Big Game at Stanford ... despite not posting a single tackle, credited with a fumble recovery, a blocked extra-point and a pass defensed against eventual Pac-10 champion Oregon Oct. 13 ... recorded a seven-yard sack at UCLA.

High School/Personal: Earned SuperPrep All-America honors, ranking as the No. 7 defensive line recruit in the country ... also rated No. 44 prospect in the nation by SuperPrep and ranked No. 5 among all recruits in Far West ... ranked as the No. 2 defensive line prospect in the West by PrepStar, earning Dream Team status and rating as the No. 10 defensive line prospect in the country by that publication ... picked to play on California state all-star team vs. Florida ... finished his senior season with 120 tackles, including 17 sacks among 25 tackles behind the line of scrimmage ... also caused five fumbles and recovered three others ... mother is Stephanie Moore ... born May 31, 1983 ... undeclared major.

One of the Pac-10's premier running backs entering the 2004 season after emerging last fall as one of the better second-string backs in the nation ... churned out a Pac-10-leading 5.7 yards per rush last season (tied with Arizona State's Loren Wade), netting 607 yards on 107 carries in 13 games as league's No. 10 rusher ... also caught 21 passes for 178 yards and scored eight touchdowns (5 rushing, 3 receiving) ... coming off the bench in the Insight Bowl, he led the Bears in rushing with 37 yards on 11 carries and also snagged five passes for 38 yards,

including a clutch 13-yard touchdown strike from Aaron Rodgers with 30 seconds left before halftime that sliced Virginia Tech's lead to 28-21 at intermission ... transferred to Cal after two stellar seasons in the JC ranks at College of the Canyons in Santa Clarita ... 2003 ... averaged 13.2 yards per carry in shredding Washington's defense for 185 yards and one touchdown on only 14 attempts in his second-ever Cal start in place of regular tailback Adimchinobe Echemandu (knee)... despite limited playing time, was fourth on the team in scoring with 48 points ... his 185-yard display vs. Washington tied fellow teammate Terrell Williams (185 at Rutgers, 2001) for the 15th greatest rushing day in Cal history ... included in that outburst were jaunts of 68 and 51 yards, as he blazed to 157 vards on 10 carries in the first half ... the 68-yard run was the longest by a Cal player since Joe Igber raced 80 yards against Arizona State in 2000 ... also caught a 30-yard pass from Aaron Rodgers in the rout over UW, giving him 215 total yards of offense ... prior to that Washington explosion, enjoyed two other big outings, rushing for 114 yards on 16 attempts in Cal's 34-2 romp over Southern Mississippi, and galloping for 92 yards and two TDs on 11 carries in the Bears' 42-14 conquest of Arizona ... had a career-long 32-yard catch at Arizona State ... also snared two touchdown passes (22 and 7 yards) in the season opener against Kansas State.

Junior College/High School/Personal: Listed as the 46th best junior college player in the country by SuperPrep magazine ... named to the 2002 All-Region 3 Team by the California Community College Football Coaches Association and JC Athletic Bureau ... rushed for 769 yards and 19 touchdowns in only 135 carries as a sophomore, while also catching 30 passes for 320 yards and four additional TDs ... his 19 rushing TDs in 2002 and 29 career rushing scores during his two-year stint were both school records ... also set or tied school marks for touchdowns in a game (5, twice) and season (23), and points in a game (30, twice), season (138) and career (198) ... originally from Rocky Mount, N.C., where he played at Northern Nash High School ... born Jan. 23, 1983 ... social welfare major.

Made an immediate impact as a transfer student last year, but watched his season come to a crashing halt when he fractured his left leg during practice Nov.

11 ... expected to be back a full strength this fall and battle for starting duties ... prior to the injury, had become an increasing receiving option for quarterback Aaron Rodgers, his former teammate at Butte College ... 2003 ... exhibiting deep-threat potential on occasion, caught a combined five passes for 88 yards and one touchdown in his final two games of the season vs. Arizona State (2 for 29) and Oregon (3 for 59, including an 18-yard TD) ... his seven grabs for 41 yards vs. USC equaled the most receptions by a Cal tight end in eight years ... also made a two-yard touchdown catch in that 34-31, triple-overtime win over the Trojans ... snared a 30-yard scoring pass against Southern Mississippi, his longest reception of the year.

Defying his age (19) and lack of major college experience, Rodgers emerged as one of the top field generals in the Pac-10 in his rookie campaign at Cal last season ... named 2004 preseason Pac-10 Player of the Year by Athlon Sports ... staged one of the best passing seasons of any sophomore in conference history, completing 61.6 percent of his passes (215-of-349) for 2,903 yards, 19 touchdowns and only five interceptions in 13 games to earn honorable mention All-Pac-10 notice ... his crowning moment came in the Insight Bowl, where - despite missing his All-American wide receiver Geoff McArthur (fractured arm) in the lineup – he set all-time Cal bowl records for passing yardage (394) and highest completion percentage (77.1%, 27-of-35), and accounted for four touchdowns (two passing, two rushing) while throwing no interceptions ... completed 15-of-17 passes for 245 yards in the second half, when Cal exploded for 31 points to overtake favored Virginia Tech in a 52-49 win ... produced the third- and fourth-highest total offensive outputs in the school's 121-year history in his final two 2003 games against Stanford (414 yards) and Virginia Tech (424 yards) ... also owns four of top 15 total offensive games in Ca annals ... his 2,903 passing yards last season rank second on Cal's single season list, even surpassing 2003 NFL first-round draft pick Kyle Boller's 2,805 yards at Cal the previous season ... set a school record for lowest interception percentage with five picks in 349 attempts (his 1.43% eclipsed the old mark of 1.69% by Gary Graumann in 1977) and ranked third on Cal's all-time single-season list for pass efficiency with a 146.6 rating ... dating back to his 2002 season at Butte JC, he has thrown 47 touchdown passes and only nine interceptions over the last two years combined ... earned JC All-America honors in his only year at Butte College, where he threw for 2,408 yards, 28 touchdowns and only four interceptions last season ... a JC teammate of Cal tight end Garrett Cross ... 2003

BEARS ATTRACT ANOTHER NATIONALLY RANKED RECRUITING CLASS IN 2004

Riding the momentum of its 2003 Insight Bowl victory over Virginia Tech, Cal produced its second straight nationally ranked recruiting class earlier this year.

Head coach Jeff Tedford and his coaching staff, which led Cal to a third-place finish in the Pac-10, continue to reap the benefits of establishing strong recruiting ties within the state of California. All but two of the Bears' recruits hail from the Golden State, with Australia-born punter-placekicker David Lonie – a transfer from Ellsworth College in Iowa – and Texas prep star running back Justin Forsett the only prospects signed from outside California. A year ago, Cal's 2003 class was comprised exclusively of in-state talent.

The Bears signed an equal number of players from Northern and Southern California, including 10 student-athletes that received All-American accolades this past season. The entire group receiving national recognition, including a No. 17 ranking from *PrepStar* magazine.

"We are extremely pleased with the overall quality of this year's class, and believe we have addressed needs at several positions," said Tedford. "It is our goal to take Cal football to the next level and we believe this new group can help us attain that goal. I would like to commend my staff for all their hard work and also thank our current players, who have become our best ambassadors in the recruiting process. It's very gratifying to know we have taken another important step towards building a championship program."

Reports from several media outlets and national recruiting services indicate that Tedford and the Bears made quite a recruiting haul in 2004. Some facts and figures to reinforce that perception:

- Five of the Bears' recruits were ranked among the nation's top 11 at their respective positions, according to at least one major recruiting service.
- •Insiders.com listed nine Cal recruits among its Pac-10 Area Hot 100, including six Berkeley-bound players among its Top 50 prospects.
- Rivals.com tabbed five Golden Bears among its top 31 in the All-West region, including two of the top 12 players. Rivals.com also tabbed nine Cal recruits among the state's Top 100, including five of the 23 highest-ranked prospects in California.
- •SuperPrep's All-Far West Team lists five Bears among its first 41 players, and 10 in the West's Top 116.

Offensive line was the most popular position for the recruiting class, as five of the Bears' signings were interior linemen. The group features two of the Top 40 offensive guards in the nation in John Gibson and Noris Malele, according to Rivals.com.

In addition, the five new Bears that were ranked among the nation's Top 11 at their respective positions are: Marshawn Lynch (2nd running back, Rivals.com), Phillip Mbakogu (4th strongside defensive end, Rivals.com; 6th defensive end, TheInsiders.com), Worrell Williams (6th outside linebacker, Rivals.com), Nate Longshore (8th pro-style quarterback, Rivals.com) and Virdell Larkins (11th cornerback, Rivals.com).






