

Frontline leader of nation's No. 13 defense ... the dominant interior lineman has started every game for the Bears ... run stopper for Cal's top rushing defense since 1968 ... a second team All-Pac-10 honoree ... consistently draws double-teams from opposing linemen ... has earned a reputation for stuffing the run, keeping offensive linemen off Cal's linebackers and providing internal pressure on the line ... enjoyed a great year at a position that doesn't generate a lot of numbers ... 26 total tackles (15 solo) ranks 10th on the team ... 4.5 tackles for loss (17 yards) and 1.5 sacks (7 yards) ... one forced fumble and one fumble recovered, two passes broken up ... opened the season with four tackles at Air Force (2 unassisted, 2 assisted) ... had a big game vs. UCLA with four tackles, three of them for losses (3 solo) ... another four tackles vs. Oregon, two solo ... recorded at least one tackle in every game and at least one solo tackle in all but one game (at OSU) ... recorded first full sack of season in Big Game vs. Stanford, a six-yard loss ... forced and recovered a fumble vs. Arizona State ... blocked a pass at Arizona ... tabbed second team All-Pac-10 by *Athlon Sports* in its 2004 preseason magazine ... one of the nation's premier recruits three years ago ... has a great combination of size, strength and instincts ... runs a 4.8 in 40-yard dash ... **2003** ... named honorable mention All-Pac-10 for a second straight season ... one of two defensive team captains, along with Donnie McCleskey ... spearheaded strong defensive efforts against Southern Mississippi (defensive shutout), Washington (293 yards, 7 points), Arizona (14 points), UCLA (228 yards, two TDs) and USC (24 points in regulation) ... given the Brick Muller Award as the team's most valuable defensive lineman after surpassing his career-high in tackles this year with 33 stops ... **2002** ... blossomed into one of the conference's better interior defensive linemen, earning All-Pac-10 honorable mention notice as a sophomore ... posted 25 tackles (19 solo), five tackles for losses, one sack and one fumble recovery in winning the Bob Tessier Award as Cal's Most Improved Lineman on defense ... also blocked two kicks on special teams ... played in all 12 games, drawing six starts (Game 1 and Games 8-12) ... paramount effort came in Cal's 17-12 win over UCLA Oct. 19 when he bagged four tackles, including two stops for losses of six yards, and recovered a critical fumble ... also nabbed four tackles in the season opener vs. Baylor and tallied his lone sack of the season in the Big Game against Stanford ... **2001** ... baptized under fire, receiving laudable playing time in all 11 games during his rookie year as a true freshman ... pocketed 24 tackles (including five for losses of 15 yards), one sack and one fumble recovery in earning 2001 Pac-10 All-Freshmen first team honors from *The Sporting News* ... started last five games at defensive tackle, a period in which he notched 16 tackles ... punched out season-high six tackles in the Big Game at Stanford ... despite not posting a single tackle, credited with a fumble recovery, a blocked extra-point and a pass defended against eventual Pac-10 champion Oregon Oct. 13 ... recorded a seven-yard sack at UCLA.

High School/Personal: Earned *SuperPrep* All-America honors, ranking as the No. 7 defensive line recruit in the country ... also rated No. 44 prospect in the nation by *SuperPrep* and ranked No. 5 among all recruits in Far West ... ranked as the No. 2 defensive line prospect in the West by *PrepStar*, earning Dream Team status and rating as the No. 10 defensive line prospect in the country by that publication ... picked to play on California

state all-star team vs. Florida ... finished his senior season with 120 tackles, including 17 sacks among 25 tackles behind the line of scrimmage ... also caused five fumbles and recovered three others ... mother is Stephanie Moore ... born May 31, 1983 ... legal studies major.

2004 ... Unleashed one of the greatest rushing seasons in Pac-10 history and arguably the most productive of any 2004 running back in the nation ... led NCAA in total rushing yards and yards per carry, was the only player to rush for 100+ yards in every game and gained the most yards by a Pac-10 rusher in 23 years ... named first team All-America (*Sports Illustrated.com*, *The Sporting News*, *ESPN.com* and Cingular ABC Sports/FWAA) and first team All-Pac-10 ... the NCAA's No. 2 rusher (167.7 ypg) with 1,845 yards and 14 touchdowns ... averaging an NCAA-best 7.0 yards per carry, which is also the best ever by a Pac-10 rusher with at least 1,200 yards ... Cal's all-time single-season rusher, eclipsing Heisman Trophy runner-up Chuck Muncie's 1975 record of 1,460 yards ... recorded the best single-season Pac-10 rushing total since 1981 (Marcus Allen - 2,342 yards) ... first Cal player to win Pac-10 rushing title since QB Joe Kapp in 1958 ... has rushed for 169+ yards seven times in 2004, and eight times in his career, in only 12 career starts ... leads the Pac-10 with 167.7 yards per game, more than 63 yards better than the conference's second-best rusher (Oregon's Terrence Whitehead) ... No. 7 in the NCAA with 176 yards per game all-purpose running ... surpassed the 1,000-yard plateau in seventh game, the fastest ever at Cal ... has 11 consecutive 100+ yard games in 2004, a new school record (4, Chuck Muncie, 1975), and poised to break Pac-10 single-season record (11, Marcus Allen, 1981) in the Holiday Bowl for most 100-yard games ... only Division I-A player to rush for 100+ yards in every game in 2004, twice rushing for 200+ yards ... needs 131 yards in Holiday Bowl to claim third-best Pac-10 single-season rushing total and 206 to take second-best honors (already the best non-USC rusher ever in Pac-10 play) ... holds eight of Cal's Top 32 rushing performances ... No. 6 all-time at Cal with 2,452 career yards ... career average of 6.6 yards per carry is the highest in school history ... first Cal running back to rush for three touchdowns in back-to-back games since Lindsey Chapman in 1993 (at Air Force and vs. New Mexico State) ... 89-yard run in season opener at Air Force was eighth-longest in Cal history ... only player to rush for 100+ yards against USC in 2004 ... his 261 yards at Southern Miss was the third-best rushing performance in Cal history and the most yards by a Bear in a single game since 1954 ... also authored rushing outbursts of 205 yards (T-10th all-time at Cal, vs. UCLA, with two touchdowns), 188 twice (17th, vs. Arizona State and Oregon, with one touchdown each), 181 (24th, at Air Force, with three touchdowns) and 177 (26th, vs. New Mexico State, with three touchdowns) ... twice named 2004 Pac-10 Offensive Player of the

Week, Oct. 16 and Oct. 30 ... one of three Doak Walker Award finalists, recognizing the nation's top running back ... Heisman Trophy Committee letter recipient ... Rivals.com All-Pac-10 Team ... **2003** ... emerged as one of the Pac-10's premier running backs ... churned out a conference-leading 5.7 yards per rush (tied with Arizona State's Loren Wade), netting 607 yards on 107 carries in 13 games as Pac-10's No. 10 rusher ... also caught 21 passes for 178 yards and scored eight touchdowns (5 rushing, 3 receiving) ... coming off the bench in the Insight Bowl, he led the Bears in rushing with 37 yards on 11 carries and also snagged five passes for 38 yards, including a clutch 13-yard touchdown strike from Aaron Rodgers with 30 seconds left before halftime that sliced Virginia Tech's lead to 28-21 at intermission ... averaged 13.2 yards per carry in shredding Washington's defense for 185 yards and one touchdown on only 14 attempts in his second-ever Cal start in place of regular tailback Adimchinobe Echemandu (knee) ... despite limited playing time, was fourth on the team in scoring with 48 points ... his 185-yard display vs. Washington tied fellow teammate Terrell Williams (185 at Rutgers, 2001) for the 15th greatest rushing day in Cal history ... included in that outburst were jaunts of 68 and 51 yards, as he blazed to 157 yards on 10 carries in the first half ... the 68-yard run was the longest by a Cal player since Joe Igber raced 80 yards against Arizona State in 2000 ... also caught a 30-yard pass from Aaron Rodgers in the rout over UW, giving him 215 total yards of offense ... prior to that Washington explosion, enjoyed two other big outings, rushing for 114 yards on 16 attempts in Cal's 34-2 romp over Southern Miss, and 92 yards and two TDs on 11 carries in the Bears' 42-14 conquest of Arizona ... had a career-long 32-yard catch at Arizona State ... also snared two touchdown passes (22 and 7 yards) in the season opener against Kansas State ... transferred to Cal after two stellar seasons in the JC ranks at College of the Canyons in Santa Clarita.

Junior College/High School/Personal: Listed as the 46th best junior college player in the country by *SuperPrep* magazine ... named to the 2002 All-Region 3 Team by the California Community College Football Coaches Association and *JC Athletic Bureau* ... rushed for 769 yards and 19 touchdowns in only 135 carries as a sophomore, while also catching 30 passes for 320 yards and four additional TDs ... his 19 rushing TDs in 2002 and 29 career rushing scores during his two-year stint were both school records ... also set or tied school marks for touchdowns in a game (5, twice) and season (23), and points in a game (30, twice), season (138) and career (198) ... originally from Rocky Mount, N.C., where he played at Northern Nash High School ... born Jan. 23, 1983 ... social welfare major.
