


### **2005 PLAYER PROFILES**

Promising defensive back who is coming off a redshirt year in 2004 when he sat out the season due to a groin injury ... has played a key role on special teams during his career and should figure more into the playing rotation this fall ... after concentrating on cornerback his first couple of years, has made the switch to safety ... 2004 ... redshirted ... 2003 ... played in 11 games, posting one tackle against Arizona ... performed well on special teams ... underwent surgery for a broken thumb Nov. 11, but did not miss any games ... 2002 ... played in all 12 regular season games ... bagged three tackles on the campaign ... highlight play of his early Cal career came Nov. 9 against Arizona State at Tempe, when he returned a blocked punt 18 yards for a touchdown in the third quarter to give the Bears a 28-17 lead en route to a 55-38 upset over the Sun Devils.
