A two-time, first-team Pac-10 All-Academic choice during his career ... also a member of the *ESPN the Magazine*/CoSIDA Academic All-District squad as a senior ... started all 12 games for the Bears in 2005 and finished fifth on the team

with 55 total tackles, including 42 solo stops ... season high in tackles was nine at New Mexico State ... also had eight stops against Washington State ... credited with 2.5 tackles behind the line of scrimmage for 21 yards in losses in the shutout against Arizona ... had pass break-ups against Washington State and USC ... received the team's Frank J. Schlessinger Coaches Award for achievement in athletics, academics and community service ... earned his bachelor's degree in business administration in 2005 and competed as a graduate student in education his senior season.

2004: Made five starts for the Bears at outside linebacker, sharing the post with Francis Blay-Miezah ... tied for 13th on the team in tackles with 25 ... recorded at least one tackle in all 11 games he played in ... notched a three-yard tackle for loss at Oregon State ... five tackles vs. Arizona State, three of them solo, were a season-high ... broke up two pass plays during the year.

2003: Although his work was strictly on special teams and as a reserve linebacker, he made significant contributions to the Bears ... pumped out 29 tackles (including 20 solos) in 11 games.

2002: Appeared in all 12 regular-season games on special teams, managing to register one tackle on the year (vs. Arizona, Nov. 16) ... hampered by a foot arch strain during the season.

2001: Redshirted his first season with the Bears.

Signed with the NFL's Washington Redskins ... a first-team Pac-10 All-Academic choice as a senior in 2005 ... did not have a punt blocked during his career ... ranked third in the Pac-10 and 32nd nationally with an average of 41.95 yards per punt

last season ... 21 of his 61 punts landed inside opponents' 20-yard line ... had 10 punts that covered more than 50 yards, including a 56-yarder against USC ... had five punts downed inside the Sacramento State 20 in the season opener ... also kicked off 68 times with 27 touchbacks ... credited with three tackles during the season ... American studies major.

2004: Averaged 40.0 yards per punt to rank ninth in the Pac-10, but the Bears' 35.8 net average rated No. 7 in the conference ... sent seven punts over 50 yards ... laid down 22 punts inside the 20-yard line ... longest punt of the year came at Arizona, a 61-yard boot ... season-high average recorded at Arizona with 48.8 yards per punt.

Lupoi had his senior season (and sixth year on campus) interrupted early and late by injury ... a second-team Pac-10 All-Academic choice ... played in seven games and ended the season with 15 tackles, including 12 solo stops ... had two

tackles behind the line of scrimmage and a quarterback sack ... best game was a five-tackle outing against Washington State, which included a sack for a four-yard loss ... also had a sack the following week at Oregon ... credited with three tackles against Oregon State and Sacramento State ... received Cal's Dink Artal Award for the player best exemplifying Cal spirit ... competed as a graduate student in education last fall after

earning his bachelor's degree in American studies.

2004: Sat out the season with a foot injury after earning preseason second-team all-league honors from *Athlon*.

2003: Played in 11 games, including starts in the season's final four outings and eight of the last nine contests ... swarmed for three tackles in the Bears' victory over Virginia Tech in the Insight Bowl, including one sack ... recipient of team's Ken Cotton Award as the squad's most courageous player, as he played the final four regular games of the campaign wearing a cast for a broken right thumb ... the Bears' seventh-leading tackler with 37 stops (including 26 unassisted) ... dumped opposing quarterbacks for three sacks and 32 yards in losses and had five tackles for losses of 34 yards overall.

2002: Collected two tackles and broke up one pass as backup end, appearing in all 12 games during his sophomore campaign ... his two solo stops came in the season-opening 70-22 win over Baylor.

2001: Missed Cal's first two games with a rib injury, but came on strong once he got into the lineup, making nine tackles in his first three games back ... had four solo tackles vs. Washington and three total stops against Oregon ... earned starts against Oregon, Stanford and Rutgers ... also registered a six-yard sack in the Big Game at Stanford.

2000: Listed as Cal's top reserve at defensive end behind Andre Carter and earned a spot on the traveling squad, but never played and redshirted.

freshman campaign ... fought through a broken jaw during spring '05 drills and was ready to go during the fall ... finished sixth on the squad with 13 catches for 188 yards ... his 54-yard reception



at New Mexico State was one of Cal's longest pass plays of the season ... caught TD passes against Washington State and Arizona and ran for scores against Sacramento State and USC ... had a 27-yard pass reception against the Trojans ... caught three passes covering 37 yards at Washington ... recipient of the Cal Coaches Award ... American studies major.

2004: Tallied excellent numbers at USC, rushing three times for 15 yards and catching a pair of passes for 21 yards ... had a season-long reception of 36 yards against Oregon ... scored his first touchdown of the season at Oregon State on a seven-yard pass.

2003: Played in all 14 games for the Bears, starting in every game (seven) when Cal opened the contest in a two-back set ... his longest run of the season came Nov. 15 when he ripped off a 15-yarder against Washington ... made vital contributions to Cal's Insight Bowl victory over Virginia Tech, rushing for 11 yards on three carries and catching three passes for 23 yards ... his three-yard touchdown plunge to open the second half vaulted the Bears into a 28-28 tie with the Hokies, and Cal never again trailed in the bowl game.

2002: Burst onto the scene in the Baylor opener, hauling in three passes for 41 yards, including an 18-yard TD catch in the second quarter ... rushed three times for nine yards vs. Air Force ... closed out the season with one of his better games vs. Stanford, finishing with two runs for 12 yards and a 17-yard pass reception.

Signed with the NFL's Chicago Bears ... a second-team All-Pac-10 choice as a senior ... finished his career in eighth place on Cal's career list with 258 tackles ... also tied for third all-time with 25 pass break-ups ... rebounded from an injury-plagued junior season with a standout senior campaign ... finished second on the team with 73 tackles ... led the defensive backs with 8.5 tackles for loss ... had 2.5 tackles for 10 yards in

losses against Stanford ... had 10 tackles against Illinois ... forced a fumble against Oregon State and picked off a pass against the Beavers that he returned for 27 yards ... forced a fumble and broke up two passes against UCLA ... recorded a season-high 11 stops vs. BYU in the Las Vegas Bowl ... voted Cal's defensive MVP by his teammates ... also received the Stub Allison Award (most inspirational player) and served as the defensive team captain ... interdisciplinary studies major.

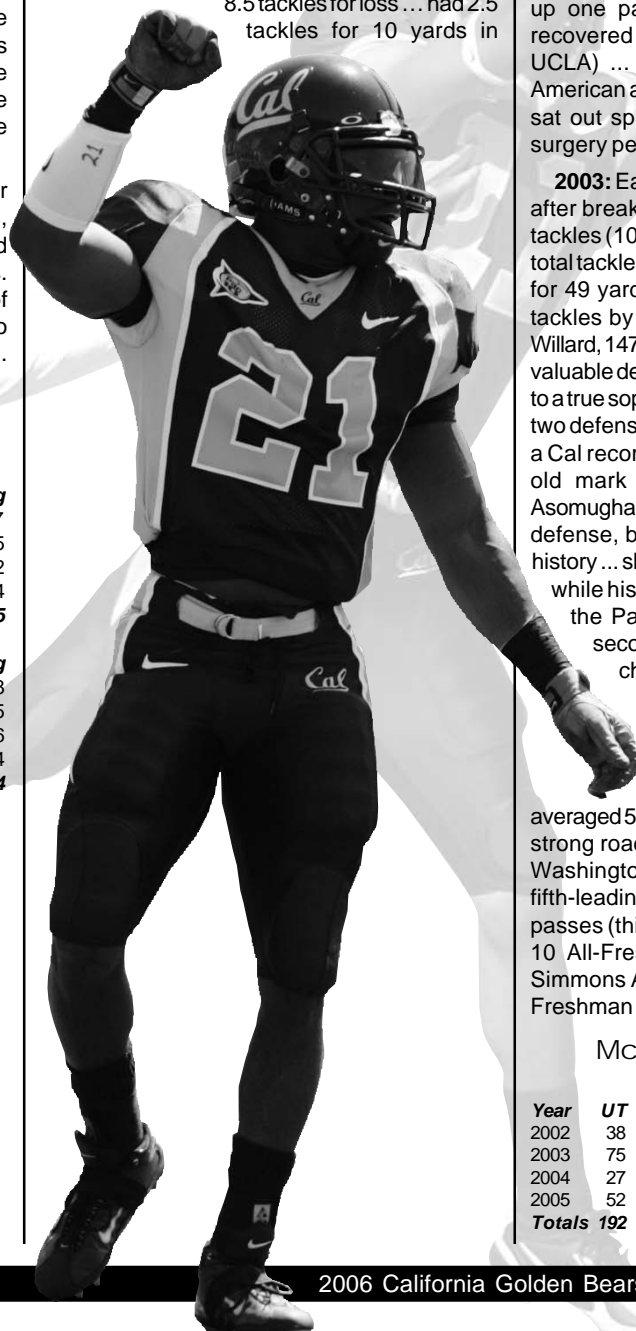
2004: Suffered a shoulder injury early in the year, missing the Oregon State game, but returned to play in every game thereafter despite being less than 100 percent ... started at rover for two games before assuming reserve duties ... ranked seventh on the team with 38 tackles ... paramount tackle performance came in the Holiday Bowl, where he bagged seven stops to tie Ryan Gutierrez for team-high honors, and also broke up one pass ... broke up five passes and recovered a fumble (returning it 14 yards vs. UCLA) ... named preseason third-team All-American and first-team All-Pac-10 by *Athlon* ... sat out spring practice rehabbing from knee surgery performed on Jan. 9.

2003: Earned All-Pac-10 first team accolades after breaking Cal's defensive back record for tackles (102) and leading all conference DBs in total tackles, sacks (5.5) and tackles for loss (12 for 49 yards) ... the 102 stops were the most tackles by any Cal player in 10 years (Jerrott Willard, 147 in 1993) ... teammates voted him most valuable defensive player, an award rarely given to a true sophomore ... served as one of the club's two defensive captains ... his 5.5 sacks also set a Cal record for defensive backs, eclipsing the old mark of three by cornerback Nnamdi Asomugha ... his 102 tackles not only led the 2003 defense, but also ranked 13th most in school history ... shared club lead in interceptions (two), while his 13 passes broken up ranked 11th in the Pac-10 (0.93 per game) and tied for second most on the Bears' single-season chart at the time.

2002: Inserted into the Bears' lineup midway through his true-freshman season ... in starting the final seven games of the season, averaged 5.4 tackles during that stretch, including strong road performances at USC (7 tackles), Washington (6) and Oregon State (6) ... Cal's fifth-leading tackler overall ... also broke up five passes (third on the club) ... named to the Pac-10 All-Freshman team ... received the Bob Simmons Award, signifying the Most Valuable Freshman on the squad.

Made the transition from walk-on to second-team All-Pac-10 honoree following his senior season ... chosen by the Buffalo Bills in the seventh round of the NFL Draft ... started 10 of 12 games in 2005, missing the Illinois and New Mexico State games ... one of three Cal offensive linemen who earned all-league recognition ... ranked second on the team with 9.5 pancake blocks and finished third on the squad with 24 knockdown blocks during the regular season ... received Cal's Ken Cotton Award as the team's most courageous player ... sociology major.

2004: An honorable mention all-league selection ... started all 12 games for the Bears ... produced 31.5 pancake blocks during the year—second only to Marvin Philip's 43.5—and had 10.5 vs. Texas Tech in the Holiday Bowl ... won the starting left guard spot coming out of spring practice, despite seeing limited time due to shoulder surgery in December 2003.

2003: Filled in admirably for the injured Jonathan Giesel at left guard, drawing the starting nod the final four games of the season, including the 2003 Insight Bowl, and six of the final eight contests.

2002: Appeared in 10 games as a reserve left tackle.

2001: Redshirt.

2002: Saw action in two of Cal's first three games vs. Baylor and Michigan State.

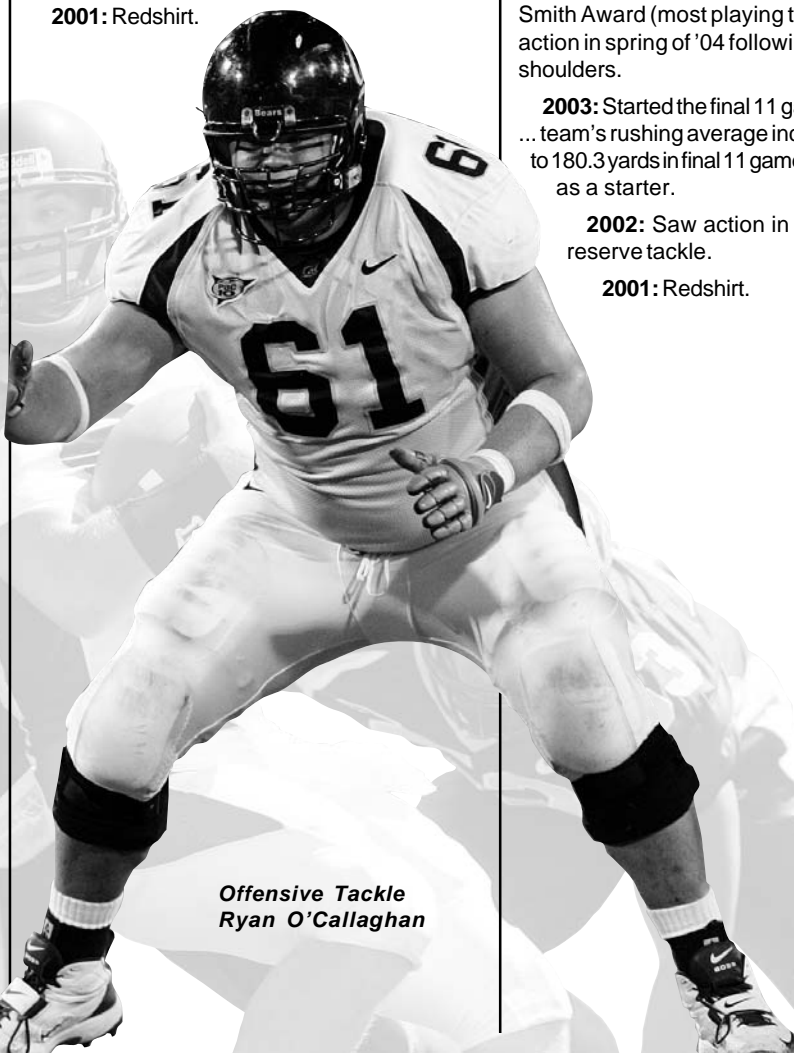

2004: Registered a team-high 29 knockdown blocks ... recipient of both the Bob Tessier Award (most improved offensive lineman) and Andy Smith Award (most playing time) ... saw limited action in spring of '04 following surgery on both shoulders.

2003: Started the final 11 games of the season ... team's rushing average increased from 124.3 to 180.3 yards in final 11 games with O'Callaghan as a starter.

A two-time All-Pac-10 selection at center, as well as a finalist for the Rimington Award in both 2004 and '05 ... selected in the sixth round of the NFL Draft by the Pittsburgh Steelers ... started every game at center as a senior in 2005 ... led Cal in pancake blocks with 25 and finished second on the team with 32 knockdowns during the regular season ... on the preseason watch list for the Outland Trophy ... had seven pancake blocks and 7.5 knockdowns in the win over Stanford ... those numbers were season highs for a Cal offensive lineman ... *The Sporting News* rated him as the No. 1 center in the country entering the season ... returned to campus in the spring of 2003 after two years on a Mormon mission based in the upper Midwest ... after his senior year, voted Cal's most valuable offensive player and received the Joe Roth Award for courage, attitude and sportsmanship ... served as offensive team captain ... American studies major.

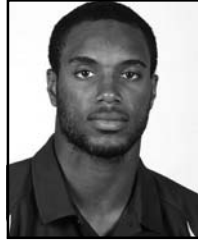
2004: Started in every game for a Bear offense that led the Pac-10 in yards per game ... voted a second-team Associated Press All-American and one of seven finalists for the Dave Rimington Trophy (nation's best center) ... paced the squad with 43.5 pancake blocks, with a high of seven coming against both Washington and Arizona State ... also had 22 knockdown blocks ... recipient of Cal's Brick Muller Award as Cal's most valuable offensive lineman

2003: After serving as Nolan Bluntzer's understudy at center for the first nine games, reclaimed the starting job he held as a freshman before leaving on his mission, after Bluntzer suffered an ankle sprain ... had to gain approximately 30 pounds to return to his original playing weight ... led all Cal linemen in pancake blocks and knockdowns during the season ... bestowed the Bob Tessier Award as the team's most improved offensive lineman.

2000: Started several games as a true freshman, gained his first starting assignment just three games into his career at Fresno State ... also started vs. Arizona State, but suffered a sprained knee and did not return to the lineup until late in the season.

HARRISON SMITH

Oakland, Calif. (Skyline HS)



Signed with the NFL's Detroit Lions ... started all 12 games for the Bears at free safety as a senior after earning honorable mention All-Pac-10 honors as a cornerback in 2004 ... tied Chidi Iwuoma for Cal's all-time passes defended record with 35 ... had 72 tackles last fall – third-best on the team – after recording 13 stops plus an interception in the Las Vegas Bowl ... had a team season-high 14 tackles against Oregon State, including a tackle behind the line of scrimmage and a pass break-up ... had nine tackles against USC and returned an interception 32 yards against the Trojans ... broke up three passes at New Mexico State ... had seven stops, a tackle for loss and broke up two passes against UCLA ... named Cal's Senior Lifter of the Year ... sociology major.

2004: Ranked second in the Pac-10 and seventh nationally in passes defended with 18 broken up (1.50 per game) ... his 18 passes defended also broke Cal's single-season record, surpassing Jemeel Powell's mark of 16 ... finished eighth on the team with 31 tackles, 22 unassisted ... intercepted a pass in the end zone at USC ... broke up three passes vs. UCLA and Texas Tech and two passes three times, vs. New Mexico State, at Arizona and vs. Stanford ... also recovered a fumble vs. Texas Tech in the Holiday Bowl.

2003: The Bears' sixth-leading tackler with 44 stops (including 37 solos) and ranked second on the team with seven passes broken up ... also blocked punts vs. Southern Miss and USC ... a key contributor to the Bears' special teams ... returned from off-season shoulder injury ... started 11 games, coming off the bench against Washington and Virginia Tech while missing the UCLA game ... his top tackle game of the season came vs. Washington, as he made six stops, including half a sack for a seven-yard loss ... returned two punts for 35 yards in limited duty for a 17.5 yards-per-return average.

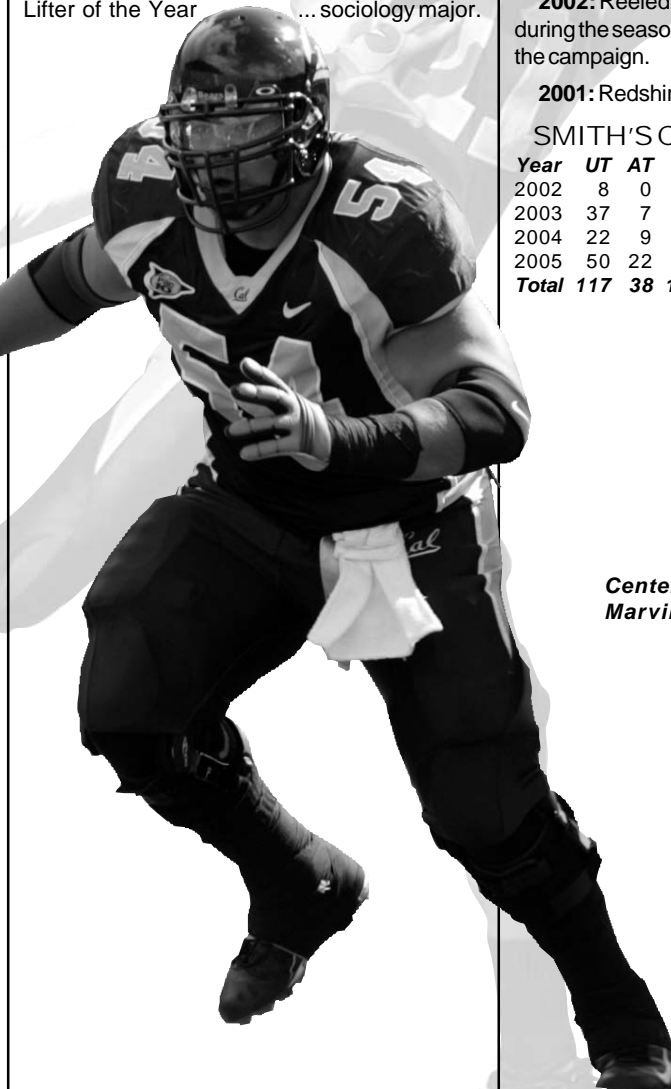

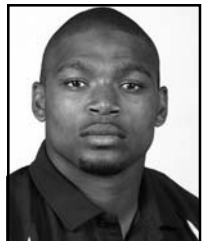

Williams rushed for 82 yards and tossed a 14-yard touchdown pass to highlight his senior season ... TD pass came in his final regular-season game at Stanford ... a former prep quarterback, he was 5-for-6 for 199 yards and three touchdowns throwing out the backfield for his Cal career ... had eight rushes for 36 yards against New Mexico State ... ran for 23 yards on 11 carries at Washington ... credited with four tackles on special teams ... received Cal's Ken Harvey Award for academic commitment and improvement ... social welfare major.

2004: Saw action in all 12 of Cal's games as a reserve back and on special teams ... returned six kickoffs for 95 yards with a long of 28 ... also

completed a pair of passes, one at Oregon State for a 79-yard touchdown and again at Arizona for a 28-yard completion ... tallied a season-high 46 yards rushing on five carries vs. New Mexico State, including a 22-yard TD jaunt ... notched seven tackles, six of them unassisted, in special teams work.

2003: As a redshirt, worked out with the scout teams and was named Cal's Scout Team Player of the Year for special teams.

2002: Despite missing the final three games, was Cal's second-leading rusher with 139 yards and one touchdown on 37 carries ... helped ignite Cal's season when he threw a 71-yard touchdown aerial to David Gray on a halfback option pass, the Bears' first play of the year ... tore knee ligaments during bye week in practice prior to the Arizona State game Nov. 9 ... best performances came in his final two games vs. UCLA (7 carries, 41 yards) and at Oregon State (9 carries, 31 yards and two receptions for 15 yards).

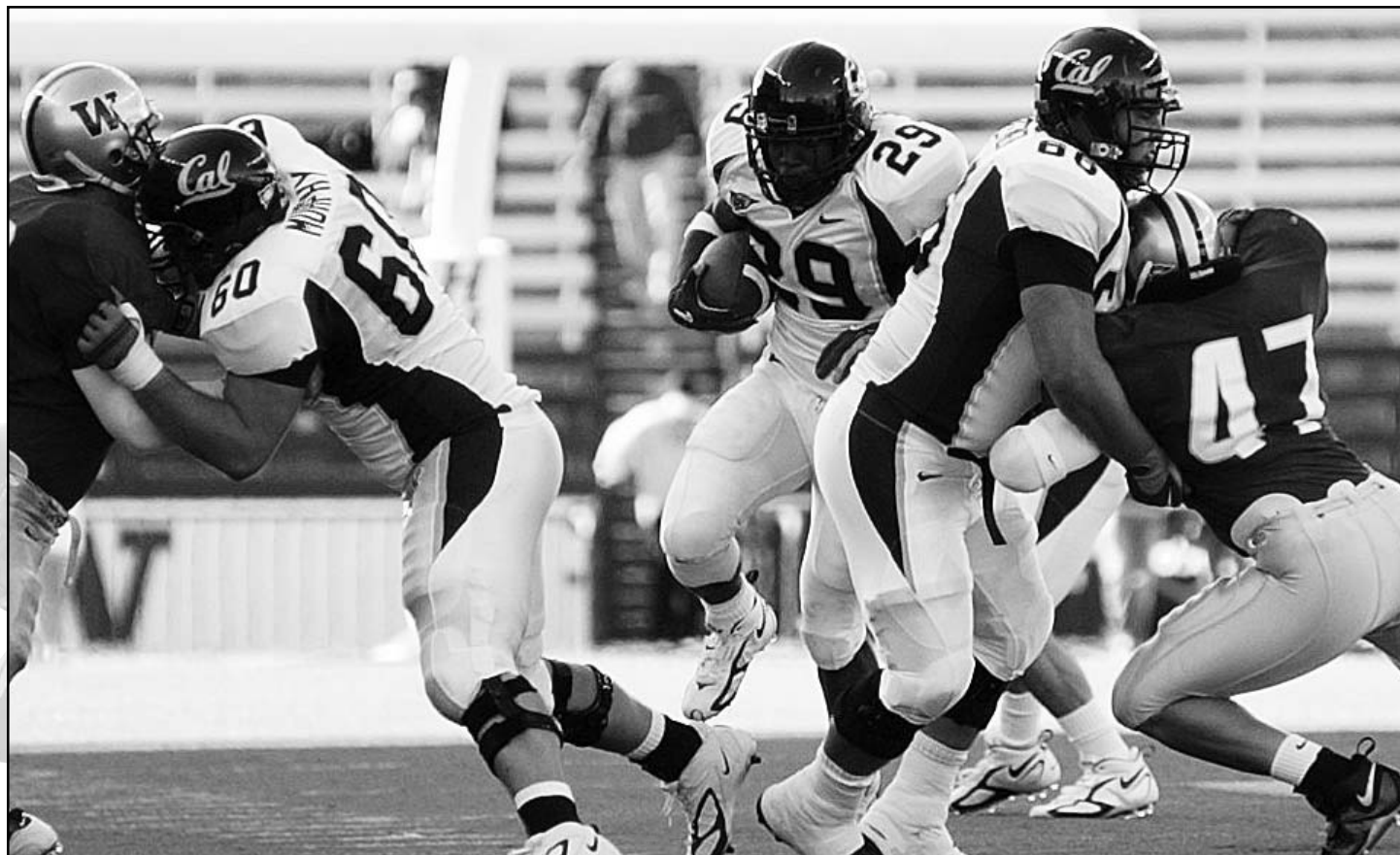
2001: Led Cal in rushing as a true freshman and was named to *The Sporting News* Pac-10 All-Freshman first team ... inserted into starting

lineup in five games ... averaged 105.2 yards rushing (526 yards, 123 carries and 3 TDs) over his last five contests ... his 62.5 yards-per-game figure for the year ranked eighth in conference, as he rattled off team-high 688 yards and club-best 4.3 yards per carry ... his best game came in Bears' season closer, when he bolted for 231 yards in total offense at Rutgers, rushing for a Cal freshman-record 185 yards on 36 carries and catching five passes for 46 additional yards ... earned the team's Bob Simmons Award as the most valuable freshman player.
