A member of the defensive-line rotation who brings excellent quickness off the corner ... will look for an expanded role during his senior season.

2005: Saw action in eight games and was credited with eight tackles ... had a quarterback sack for a seven-yard loss against

Washington ... was credited with three tackles against the Huskies ... also had three stops against Illinois in his first career start.

2004: Redshirt.

Community College: Named to the 2003 NorCal All-Conference first team as a defensive end at CCSF... a key member of the 2003 team that was crowned community college national champions (12-0) for the seventh time in school history and beat Grossmont College, 38-35, to claim the California state title ... tracked down quarterbacks for 32.5 sacks during his two-year career, only one sack from tying the school's career record ... contributed greatly to CCSF defenses that ranked No. 1 nationally in both 2002 and 2003 ... recorded 22 sacks in '03 despite missing one game with a back injury ... perhaps his finest effort of 2003 came against San Jose City College, when he swarmed inside for eight tackles, three sacks, three caused fumbles and one fumble recovery.

A mobile signal caller who should benefit from a year of Division I experience ... a local product who started at City College of San Francisco before arriving in Berkeley in January of 2005 ... coming off a good spring.

**2005:** Started nine games at quarterback and guided the Bears to a 5-4 record

in those contests ... passed for 1,707 yards with 15 scores ... ended the season No. 8 in the Pac-10 in passing yards (155.2 ypg) and ninth in total offense (160.5 ypg) ... best game of the season may have come at New Mexico State when he was 17-of-26 through the air for a season-best 284 yards and a touchdown ... also ran for three scores against the Aggies on his first three carries ... his first career start came at Washington and he responded with a 17-of-27 passing performance that covered 271 yards with four first-half TD passes ... against Oregon State, he became the first Cal player since Kyle Boller in 2002 to catch a touchdown pass, run for a TD and throw a touchdown pass in the same game ... threw for 274 yards against Washington State, including 91 in the final seven minutes when he rallied the Bears to a 42-38 win ... was 4-of-4 with two touchdowns on Cal's last two possessions ... ran for a score and passed for two touchdowns in the 28-0 win over Arizona ... came off the bench to see action in the season opener against Sacramento State and the regular season finale at Stanford.

Community College: Regarded as one of the premier junior college quarterbacks in the nation ... named the state's 2004 community college offensive player of the year by the JC Athletic Bureau/California Community College Football Coaches Association ... earned first team JC Gridwire All-America notice after completing 61.3 percent (217-of-354) of his passes for 3,679 yards and 35 touchdowns in 2004 ... ranked No. 1 in the state in passing efficiency (177.5) and directed the most prolific juniorcollege offense in California (500.1 yards per game) ... SuperPrep rated him the No. 2 junior college player in the nation in its postseason JuCo 100 ... Rivals.com ranked him No. 15 on its national JC list ... engineered an 11-1 season at CCSF, with the team's only loss a 39-32 verdict to College of the Canyons in the California state championship game ... named the offensive player of the game in defeat, as he rifled passes for 386 yards and four touchdowns and also rushed for 62 yards on seven carries ... in his





two seasons at CCSF, he threaded 352-of-571 pass attempts (61.6 percent) for 5,790 yards and 55 touchdowns, and rushed for an additional nine TDs ... directed his school to a 23-1 record over his two campaigns, propelling CCSF to the national championship (12-0) in 2003 ... awarded MVP honors in the state championship game in each of his two seasons.

**High School:** Enjoyed a brilliant career at Terra Linda HS, where he was named first team all-league in football, basketball and baseball ... played in the North Coast Section championship football games in both his junior and senior seasons.

**2005:** A second-team All-Pac-10 linebacker in his first season of Division I football ... finished No. 14 in the Pac-10 in total tackles and led the Bears with 89, including 62 solos ... led Cal in

tackles seven times in 12 games ... had at least seven tackles in a game eight times during the regular season ... ended the regular season with five tackles behind the line of scrimmage against Stanford ... best game came against top-ranked USC when he was credited with 12 solo tackles. the most by a Bear all season ... had 11 tackles against Illinois ... at Oregon, had nine stops, including two tackles behind the line of scrimmage ... recorded seven tackles, a tackle for loss and forced a fumble in the Bears' victory at Washington ... began his career by leading Cal with seven tackles in the opener against Sacramento State ... finished the season with eight tackles, a tackle for a loss and a pass break-up in the bowl victory over Brigham Young.

Community College: Ranked by SuperPrep as the fourth-best community college player in the United States ... a teammate of quarterback Joe Ayoob at CCSF and was voted California's 2004 Junior College Defensive Player of the Year by the JC Athletic Bureau/California Community College Football Coaches Association ... a firstteam JC Gridwire All-American, averaging almost 12 tackles per game with 118 stops in 10 regularseason contests in 2004 ... virtually unstoppable in the state's championship game with a gamehigh 14 tackles (including eight solo stops), one sack and two tackles for loss against College of the Canyons ... the driving force behind a Ram defense that ranked seventh in points allowed (15.4 ppg) and ninth in yards yielded (249.7 ypg) in the state ... named the Northern California Conference Defensive Most Valuable Player ... also played on CCSF's undefeated (13-0) team that won the national championship in 2003.



**Personal:** Born March 15, 1983 in Healdsburg, CA ... parents are Christopher and Lynda Cameron ... legal studies major.


# LAREYLLE CUNNINGHAM
