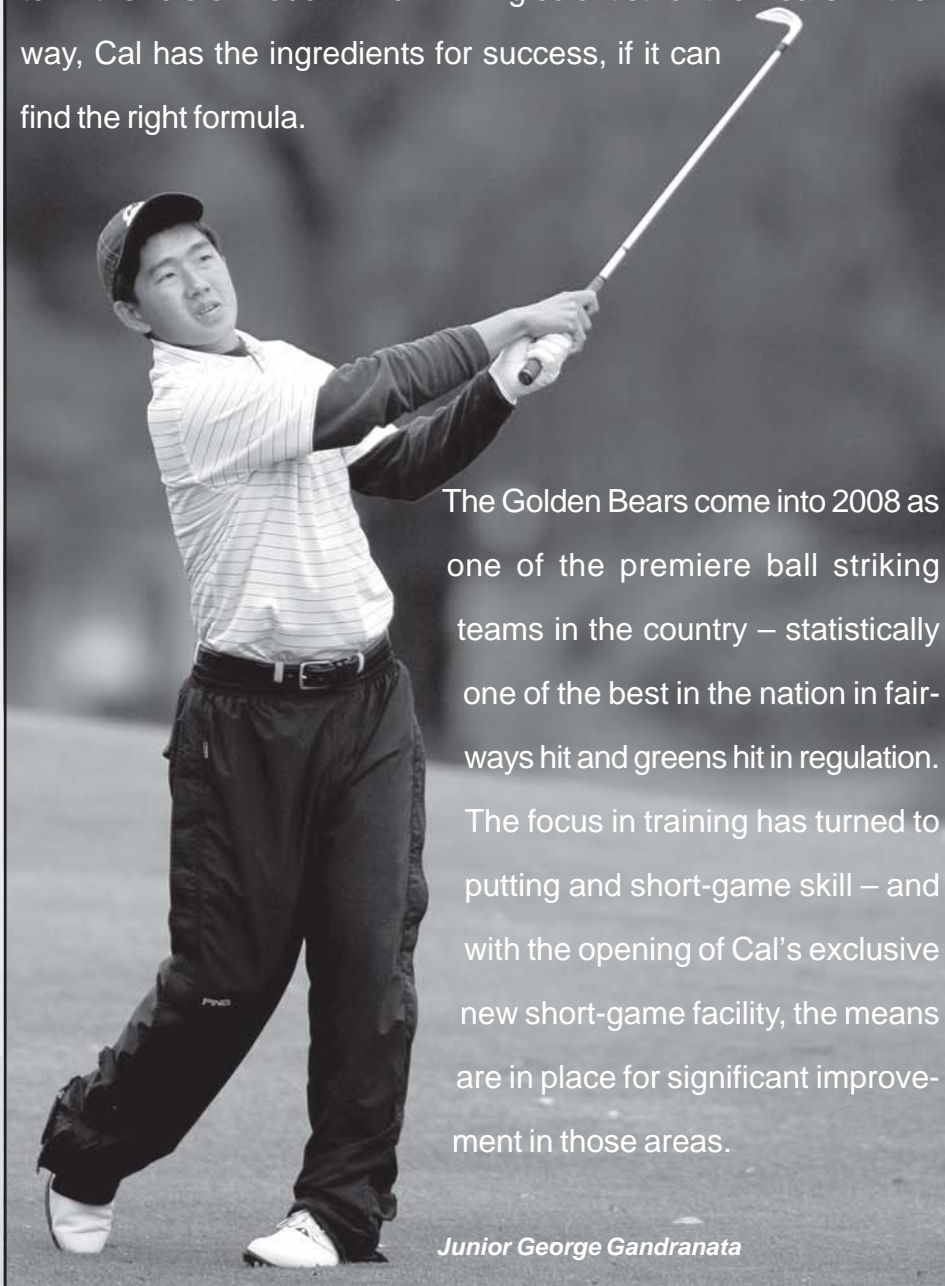

2008 CAL MEN'S GOLF OUTLOOK

DESIMONE HOPES TO MIX GOLDEN BEARS INTO CHAMPIONS

With a solid mix of veteran talent and young promise, California head coach **Steve Desimone** hopes to play the part of world-famous chef and blend the Golden Bear men's golf team into a championship contender in 2008. Or more appropriately for the University of California, Desimone hopes to fill the role of Nobel Prize-winning scientist for the Bears. Either way, Cal has the ingredients for success, if it can find the right formula.



The Golden Bears come into 2008 as one of the premiere ball striking teams in the country – statistically one of the best in the nation in fairways hit and greens hit in regulation. The focus in training has turned to putting and short-game skill – and with the opening of Cal's exclusive new short-game facility, the means are in place for significant improvement in those areas.

Another important key for the team will be the return to health of senior **Brandon Beck** who missed the fall due to illness. A proven leader and a Pac-10 all-conference selection, Beck's experience will be leaned on heavily by Desimone.

"If we want to be a major player on the national scene, a lot of things have to fit," Desimone said. "Brandon's going to have to play at a very high level and our other veterans need to play well and provide solid leadership. But for us to be a national contender, our young guys are going to have to grow quickly. If we can improve in the two areas we've identified, then this is going to be a good golf team, no doubt about it. Our best years are definitely ahead of us."

Cal used the fall of 2007 to work heavily on developing its younger players, especially with seniors **Michael Jensen** and **Kent Yamane** redshirting the 2007-08 campaign and Beck missing the fall. Junior **George Gandranata** (71.7 fall average) and sophomore **Andrey Mindirgasov** (tied for 13th at Falcon Invitational) continued to be solid members of the lineup. Sophomore **Evan Derian**, who battled injuries as a rookie, looks to be back to full-health and tallied an even 72.0 stroke average in the fall. Freshmen **Stephen Hale** (72.2 fall average) and **Eric Mina** (73.5) were both highly-touted rookies who have justified their early praise. Senior **Freddy Wolfe** is very powerful off the tee while junior **Erick Thorson** and another freshman, **Feldman Tan**, who competed in the Falcon Invitational, add further depth to the Bear lineup.

"There's not a large margin for error," Desimone said. "There are great college teams and great players all over the country, but you can once again make a case the Pac-10 is the best conference in the nation. We need the juniors and seniors to be our anchors. They need to put up good numbers round after round. From that, the hope is that the younger guys will gain valuable experience, gain confidence and put up solid numbers. And that is what has happened so far. Stephen Hale has one top 10, one top 20, and one top 25 finish in his four events. Evan Derian has played very well now that he is healthy and has two top-eight finishes. Evan has clearly shown to be one of the best ball-strikers

on the west coast. When you look at that, we feel like we have a pretty good group heading into the spring."

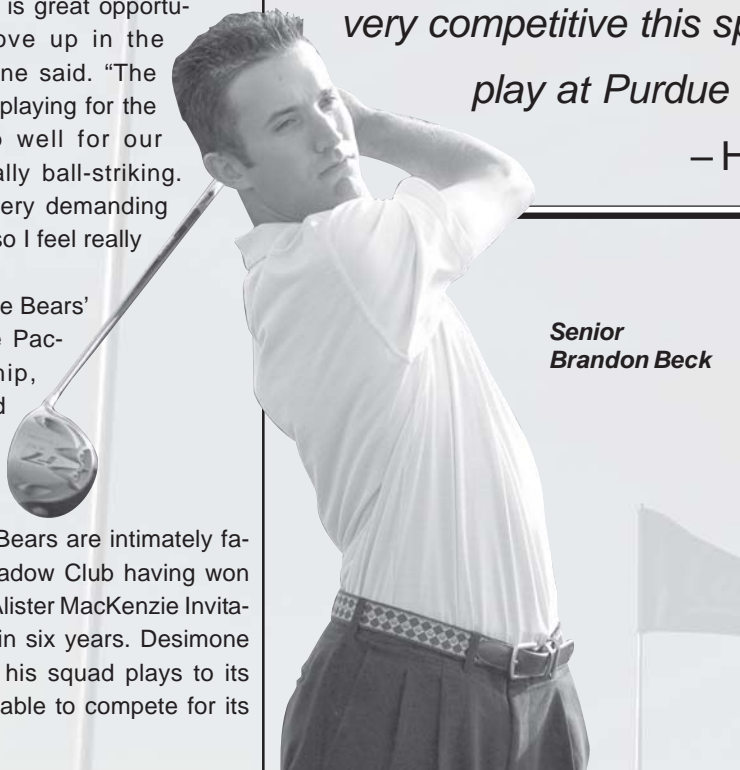
Scheduling has also been part of Desimone's plan to develop his 2008 squad into national contenders. The Golden Bears will play a national slate of tournaments, with visits to Arizona, Hawaii, Arizona State as well as the top California events once again.

"With the competition we'll see at these tournaments, there is great opportunity for us to move up in the rankings," Desimone said. "The golf courses we're playing for the most part set up well for our strengths, especially ball-striking. The courses are very demanding from tee to green, so I feel really good about that."

Another key to the Bears' fortunes lies in the Pac-10 Championship, which will be hosted by Cal on one of its home courses, The Meadow Club in Fairfax, Calif. The Bears are intimately familiar with The Meadow Club having won their fall event, the Alister MacKenzie Invitational, three times in six years. Desimone is confident that if his squad plays to its potential, it will be able to compete for its

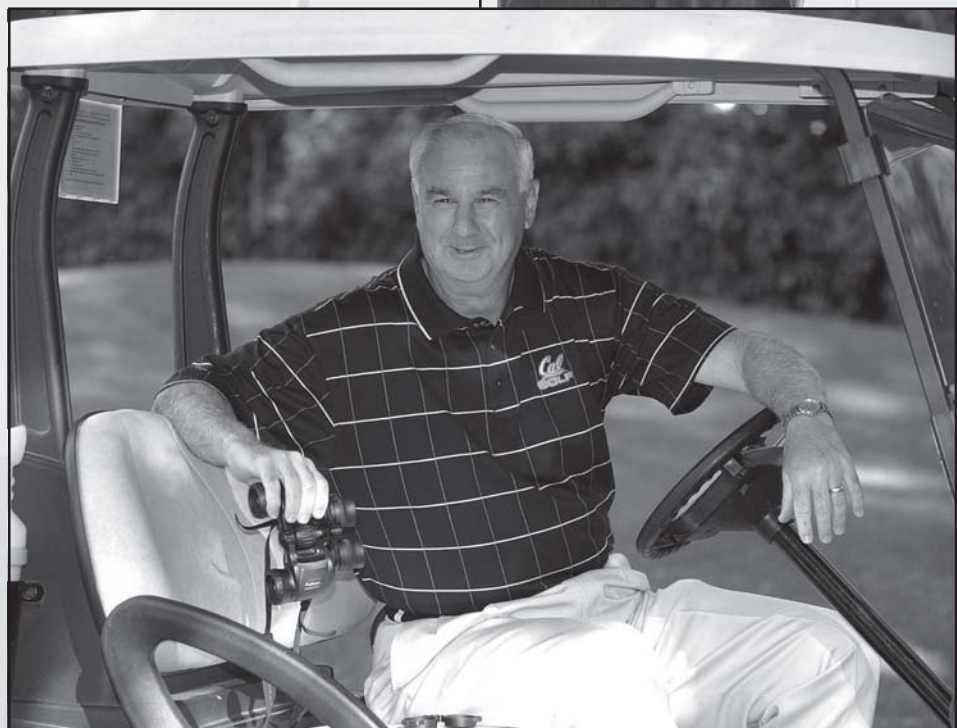
first league championship – which of course guarantees a bid to the NCAA Regionals.

"Our primary goal is to qualify and compete in the NCAA Championship every year," Desimone said. "It's pretty simple. You have to make it to the Regionals first, play well there and then be ready for college golf's grandest stage. With what we have in place on this team, I think we'll be very competitive this spring, and our goal will be to play at Purdue in late May."

Cal has qualified for the NCAA Regionals in nine of the last 11 years, advancing to the NCAA Championships five times in that stretch – of course, the most memorable year was 2004 when Desimone's tweaking brought the Golden Bears together at just the right time, directing Cal to its first men's golf national title.

For the Bears to reach that level again, Desimone will need to use his 36 years of coaching experience to find that scientific formula for success. Or more accurately, he will need to be less a scientist than chef – and follow his heart and instincts to develop the recipe for success for the 2008 Golden Bears.

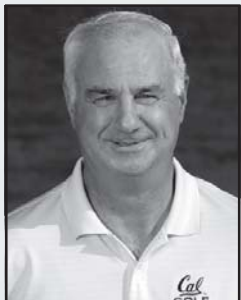

STEVE DESIMONE

Head Coach • 29th Season
University of California, 1970



Head coach Steve Desimone, now in his 29th year at the helm of California Men's Golf, is the man largely responsible for the level of success enjoyed by the Golden Bears program.

The 2004 season was magical for Desimone as the veteran coach was able to achieve the ultimate prize – the NCAA Men's Golf Championship. It was through his hard work and dedication that the Cal Golf program was in a position to win a National Championship.

Cal produced one of the greatest stories in the history of NCAA golf in 2004, coming back from eight strokes down to UCLA in the final day to win by six strokes over the Bruins. It was the culmination of a season in which the Bears had to overcome several injuries, but they were able to play the best golf when it meant the most – at the NCAA Championship. As a result of his team's impressive accomplishment, Desimone was named *Golfweek* Magazine's Collegiate Coach of the Year, and was honored as 2004 Grand Master of the Year by the Northern California Golf Association.

The Bears' program has made tremendous strides since the spring of 1980. It went from a club sport in the early '80s to one of the elite golf programs in the country, having won over 30 tournament titles under Desimone's leadership. Cal has now competed in 12 NCAA Western Regional Championships and five NCAA Championships (1995, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2004), including back-to-back-to-back appearances from 1998 through 2000.

Desimone graduated from Cal in 1970 after playing for the Bears' men's basketball team as an undergraduate. He then served in the United States military before returning to Cal to complete a double major in history and physical education and earning his Master's degree in Physical Education. Upon leaving Cal, Desimone became the Athletic Director at the College Preparatory School in Oakland where he remained until 1988. Desimone eventually returned to Cal in 1980 as head coach,

and from 1980 to 1988, shared responsibilities between the University and the College Preparatory School. In 1989, Desimone moved to Cal on a full-time basis.

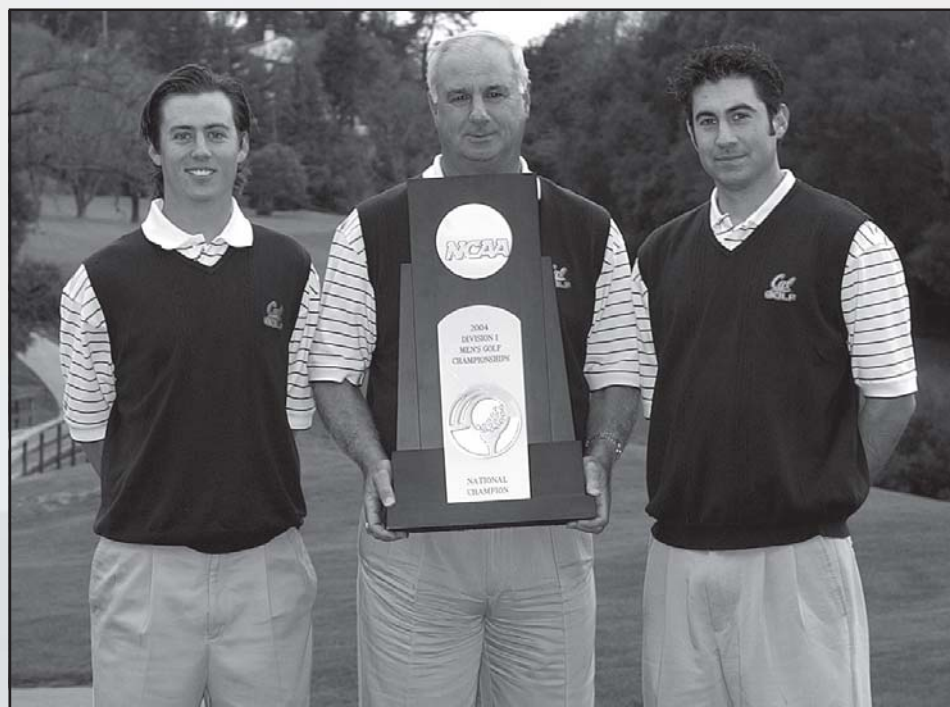
When Desimone came aboard as head coach in 1980, he was intent on taking Cal Golf to a higher level. The first steps taken were to form the Cal Golf Committee in 1980, the primary support group for the golf team, and to return the program from a club team to NCAA status, which was accomplished in 1982. Soon after, Desimone began crafting Cal into the nationally respected golf program it has become today. In addition to developing a winning program, he has helped produce seven All-Americans (Ben Furth, Charlie Wi, Garrett Larson, Dan Arroyo, Han Lee, Jeff Hood and last, Peter Tomasulo, who was selected twice in 2003 and 2004) and seven All-America Scholars (Furth, Bill Albers, Dan Coyle, Walter Chun, Scott Carlyle, Tomasulo, and Michael Wilson - Furth, Albers, Chun, Carlyle, Tomasulo and Wilson were each selected twice). Carlyle was also selected a first team Academic All-American in 2004.

By 1986-87, Desimone had Cal ranked among the Top 25 teams in the nation for the first time in the history of the program. One outstanding performance that season was a dramatic comeback at San Diego State's Frank Scott Memorial Tournament. Trailing fourth-ranked Fresno State by 17

shots going into the final round, the Bears rallied to win their first major championship in 17 years. Cal's success that year helped Desimone win the honor of Pacific-10 Conference Co-Coach of the Year.

During the outstanding 1989-90 season, Desimone brought the Bears golf program to an unprecedented level. The team earned its first NCAA playoff berth in 26 years. Cal competed in the 1964 tournament, but earned its first actual berth in 1990 after the NCAA switched to a selection/qualifying format. Cal played in 13 tournaments that year, placing among the Top 10 in all but two, including three team titles and a third-place tie at the Pac-10 Championships. In addition, the Bears were ranked among the Top 20 teams in the nation throughout the season. The major contributor to the Bears success that year was Cal Golf's first All-American and a Cal Sports Hall of Famer – Ben Furth.

The following season came to a disappointing conclusion for Desimone and the Bears. A career-ending back injury to Furth brought to an end the hope that 1990-91 would surpass Cal's great season the preceding year. Off the course, however, another important step in the rebuilding of Cal Golf was undertaken. With the generous support of the Cal Golf Committee, a small amount of financial aid was offered to incoming student athletes for the first time in 15 years. This was a critical step because it finally demonstrated the Bears

were committed to competing nationally in all respects.

The 1994-95 season stands as the second best in the history of Cal Golf. The team finished second to Arizona State at the Pac-10 championships, being selected for its third berth in the NCAA Western Regional in six years. The Bears qualified for the NCAA Championships in Columbus, Ohio, and finished that great season with a sixth-place at the finals. Leading the way was Charlie Wi, 1995 Pac-10 Champion and First-Team All-American.

In February 2008, Desimone had the honor of watching three of his former golfers - Wi, Tomasulo and Michael Wilson - compete as professionals at the Pebble Beach National Pro-Am on the Monterey Peninsula. It was the second time he had three golfers participate in the event.

In addition to his current duties at Cal, Desimone is the Manager of the University of California Golf Club, a 130-member Associate Club of the Northern California Golf Association, and is a member of the Ping Advisory Committee for college golf. He has served twice on the NCAA Pacific Region Selection Committee for the NCAA Western Regional (1991-93, 2002-04) and served on the campus-wide NCAA Self-Certification Committee in the mid-90s.

Desimone lives in Orinda with his wife, Linda. They have two children, Kim, who graduated in the spring of 2006 from Cal Poly-San Luis Obispo, and Robert, who will graduate in May from Northern Michigan University.

WALTER CHUN

**Assistant Coach • Fourth Season
University of California, 2001**



A former California golf standout, Walter Chun enters his fourth year as assistant coach with the Golden Bears. Prior to his current position, he was the Bears' administrative assistant

for the 2003-04 campaign, helping the Bears to the 2004 NCAA title.

Chun was a two-time team captain and competed in three NCAA Western Regionals (2000-02) and the 2000 NCAA Championship as a member of the Cal Golf team from 1997-2002. He has also qualified for two U.S. Amateur Championships, the first in 1999 at Pebble Beach and the second in 2002 at Oakland Hills Country Club.

Chun received his bachelor's degree from the Walter A. Haas School of Business in 2001, and earned his Master's from Cal's Graduate School of Education in 2003. In addition to his success on the course, Chun was a three-time Pac-10 All-Academic selection (2000-2002) and a two-time All-America Scholar (2001, 2002) for the Bears.

Gene Bakkum is in his fourth year as a volunteer assistant after a two-year stint as assistant coach for the Bears for the 2002-03 and 2003-04 seasons. Before Cal, Bakkum served

two years as the assistant men's golf coach for his alma mater, UC Davis, and helped the Aggies to a No. 1 ranking in Division II golf and back-to-back NCAA West Regional appearances.

Since 1997, Bakkum has instructed at the Nike Jr. Golf camps in Pebble Beach, where he also served as Assistant Director. Recently, Bakkum was the Director of the Nike Coaches All-Star Golf Academy in Phoenix, AZ. He is in his fourth year as Assistant Director of Instruction at Metropolitan Golf Links in Oakland, and has been affiliated with the PGA of America since 2005.



Q & A WITH HEAD COACH STEVE DESIMONE

A graduate of Cal, Coach Desimone is entering his 29th season as the Golden Bears' head men's golf coach. While Cal's 2004 NCAA Championship is absolutely one of his greatest moments, the experiences he has had working with young student-athletes throughout his career will be the memories he will treasure for the rest of his life.

What do you look for when recruiting a student-athlete for the Cal Golf team?

That's simple....we look for good guys, good students and good players, especially young men willing to work hard but who also have a sense of humor and a great personality. We are looking for special young men who understand and welcome the academic and athletic challenges here at Cal; young men with high goals and aspirations who have personalities that will fit in with our team.

What other aspects of the university help in your recruiting efforts?

Clearly, the quality of the education, the environment and the diversity of the campus – there's no campus in the world like it – are all factors. Then when you add the world-class athletic programs we have, it doesn't get any better than the University of California.

What about Cal's location?

Northern California and the San Francisco Bay Area are two of the greatest areas in the world in which to live. People travel from all over to visit the city and the area and it offers an incredible range of activities, from educational to cultural to athletic. The Bay Area also has a wide-range of professional opportunities for recent college graduates. And the climate is as good as it gets. We have students here who can go surfing in the Pacific in the morning, play golf in the afternoon, and then head to Lake Tahoe to go skiing later that evening. This area has the whole package .

What is the biggest challenge for a young golfer joining the Cal program?

The transition from high school to college can be very difficult. In order to be successful, they have to grow; they have to communicate; and they have to do things differently than they have before. Cal forces you to think, to grow as a person, and we believe those are healthy things.

Does Cal provide what is necessary to help a young golfer make the transition from high school?

The formula for success is here. If they understand and execute the formula, the sky's the limit. Semester after semester, our players achieve at a high academic level. We're not here to just be a golf factory. We're here to challenge our young men in school and in golf and to help them succeed in that challenge.

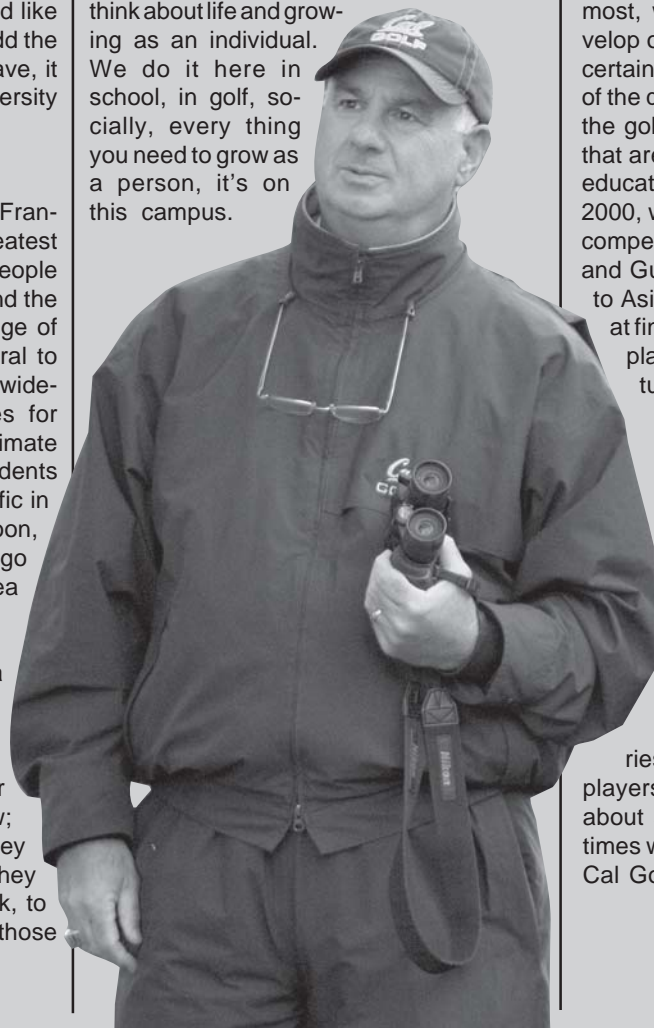
What is your favorite thing about coaching?

Working with our young men and seeing them grow as people and as players. It's teaching our student-athletes about teamwork, about work ethic, commitment, leadership, the intangibles and the tangibles.

What is your favorite thing about coaching at Cal?

The quality of the young men in our program. They challenge us every day. They are always soaking up information, they're thinking, they're questioning, they're always making life interesting. The many experiences here at Cal challenge our players to think about life and growing as an individual.

We do it here in school, in golf, socially, every thing you need to grow as a person, it's on this campus.



What do you hope each of your golfers learns during his time at Cal?

First and foremost, we want our young man to come out of here having a wonderful experience, knowing that they've been challenged. When they leave us after four or five years, we hope to have provided a solid foundation that prepares our players for the next steps in their lives. We strive for all of them to do well academically and to graduate – to get a quality education and a meaningful degree.

What would make a dream season with Cal Golf for you?

It would be a second NCAA championship and doing it exactly as we did it in 2004. We had great players who excelled in both school and golf, and their hard work paid off in an NCAA championship. To me, that is the true definition of a dream season, and I'd like to think we can do it again using the same formula.

What is your philosophy with scheduling?

We take into account many factors when planning our schedule. First and foremost, we're looking at how to best develop our team. Following that, there are certain events we want to play in because of the quality of the field and the quality of the golf course. There are some events that are great opportunities for our team, educationally and culturally. In the fall of 2000, we competed in Japan; we used to compete in Mexico, playing in Monterrey and Guadalajara; we're looking at going to Asia this June. We're always looking at finding new places; it's great that our players can have these cross-cultural experiences.

Do you keep in contact with many of your former golfers?

Yes, I hear from former players all of the time. I've had, and still have, great relationships with many of my former players – and even with past parents. Once you are a part of the Cal Golf program, you are part of the Cal Golf family. When I look back, some of my fondest memories are getting together with former players and laughing and reminiscing about some of the incredibly wonderful times we have had together as part of the Cal Golf program.

CAL GOLF COMMITTEE

The University of California's intercollegiate golf tradition dates back to 1912. Over the years, the Cal Golf team has competed in many of collegiate golf's finest tournaments, including the Pac-10 and NCAA Championships, and in 2004, winning the NCAA Championship. In January of 1980, a group of golf supporters formed The Friends of Cal Golf to raise the necessary funds to support the golf program at Cal.

Operating costs have been covered by the annual Cal Golf Tournament, satellite tournaments in Sacramento, Marin, Palm Springs, Santa Rosa, Fresno, Los Angeles and Seattle, from annual donations and from the Cal Golf endowments. The Cal-Stanford rivalry, perhaps the finest rivalry in intercollegiate athletics, has spawned a series of popular and competitive events, especially the Big Game Cup, which will be played for the 18th time this November.

On September 16, 2004, the Cal Golf Committee announced a five-year, \$8 million endowment campaign with the goal of funding Men's Golf in perpetuity. Endowment funds, both active and pledged, now stand at over \$4 million. The Cal Golf team has an endowed grant-in-aid funded by the Sacramento Valley Group for deserving Sacramento Valley golfers choosing to attend Cal. Nine partially-endowed grant-in-aids are continuing to accept funds: the Edward and Mollie Arnold Golf Grant-in-Aid, the Edward M. Burnham Family Memorial Endowment Golf Grant-in-Aid, the Edward and Lynn Little Men's Golf Scholarship, the Marin County Golf Grant-in-Aid, the William V. Power Golf Endowed Scholarship, the Sacramento Valley Golf Grant-in-Aid Fund, the Robert G. Tuck Memorial Golf Grant-in-Aid, and the John Lloyd Memorial Scholarship. NCAA rules permit up to 4.5 golf scholarships for the men's programs and the Cal Golf Committee has concluded that

the completion of the endowment campaign is essential to both the program's ongoing success and assuring Men's Golf in perpetuity at Cal.

The Pac-10 Conference is the equal of any conference in the nation and in the sport of golf, as it has produced many of the premier professional players on the PGA Tour. The purpose of the Cal Golf program is to provide a competitive atmosphere for young men who desire a place in the worlds of collegiate and professional golf, as well as to make available to them the considerable educational opportunities of the University of California.

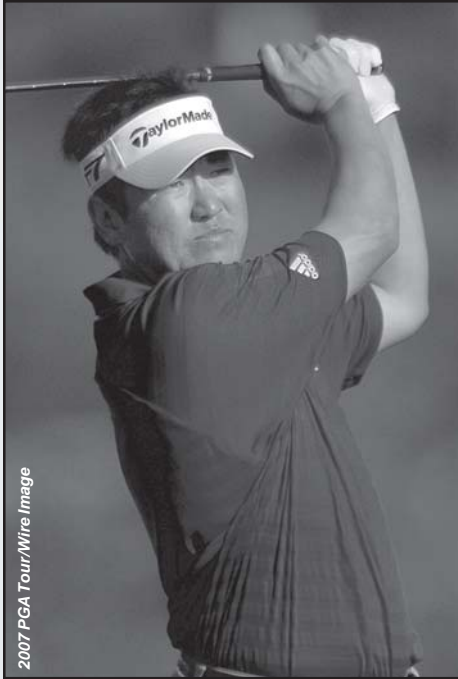
