

2007 CAL MEN'S GOLF OUTLOOK

TALENTED VETERANS AND NEWCOMERS AIM TO LIFT CALIFORNIA GOLF BACK INTO THE NCAAS

California head men's golf coach **Steve Desimone** has always been a positive thinker, using his optimistic attitude to direct the Golden Bears to many successes, including the 2004 National Championship. However, for the 2007 golf campaign, the 28-year veteran mentor qualifies his optimism with a key distinction:

"Every indication is that we should be positive about this year. We have an excellent mix of veterans and youth and young players have a tendency to make quantum leaps in a positive way. There's a scenario here where we could be very good, and quickly."

The leader of the team is senior **Michael Wilson**, the only remaining player from Cal's 2004 NCAA title squad. Wilson's performance at the top of the lineup will be key to the team's success in 2007. The veteran, who won his first collegiate tournament, has added victories in each of the last two years to match the school record for individual tournament wins set by **Ben Furth** from 1987-91. Known for his outstanding short game and for being arguably the best putter in the history of Cal Golf, Wilson averaged a 74.3 in 2005 and improved to 73.0 in the fall, when he punched a team-best 65 en route to winning the Alister MacKenzie Invitational.

Sophomore **George Gandranata** joins Wilson at the top of the Bear rotation. The product of Indonesia has been the team's most consistent performer over the last year and a half. He posted a stroke-average of 73.6 in 2005 and this fall, he tallied an impressive 71.7. In less than two years, he has six rounds below 70, including a pair of 67's at the Alister MacKenzie this fall.

Michael Jensen is the third key veteran for the Bears. The junior, who was Honorable Mention All Pac-10 as a freshman, has established himself in his first two seasons as one of the top players in the West Coast, with his strong all-around game and his distance off the tee. He will be looked to as a leader for the Bears this spring. Jensen has a top collegiate round of 66 and led Cal with a three-round 212 at the Miranda Falcon Invitational in the fall campaign.

"We have an interesting mix of experience and youth," Desimone said. "We need to have a very steady Michael Wilson at the top of the lineup, George needs to continue to play with heart and smarts and Michael Jensen needs to provide leadership and solid play. The younger guys will round out the top five. They have all played well at times and have all proven to be capable of lifting this program to the level we expect it to be."

Freshman **Andrey Mindirgasov** stepped right onto the course in the fall and made an immediate impact. The Pacific Grove, Calif., product averaged 73.1 over 15 rounds in the fall, including a 67 at the MacKenzie. The other impres-

sive newcomers are freshman **Chris Jensen**, the younger brother of Michael Jensen, and junior college transfer **Kent Yamane**. The younger Jensen played 12 rounds at a 73.6 clip, while Yamane was at 73.2 over nine rounds this fall.

Juniors **Brandon Beck** and **Freddy Wolfe** bring valuable experience to the lineup. Beck, a two year letterman and who redshirted last year, was a 2005 Honorable Mention All-Pac-10 selection after finishing tied for fifth at the Pac-10 Championship with a two-under 282. Wolfe, whose father attended Cal and played basketball and golf, came to the Bears in 2005 from junior college. He played in a number of

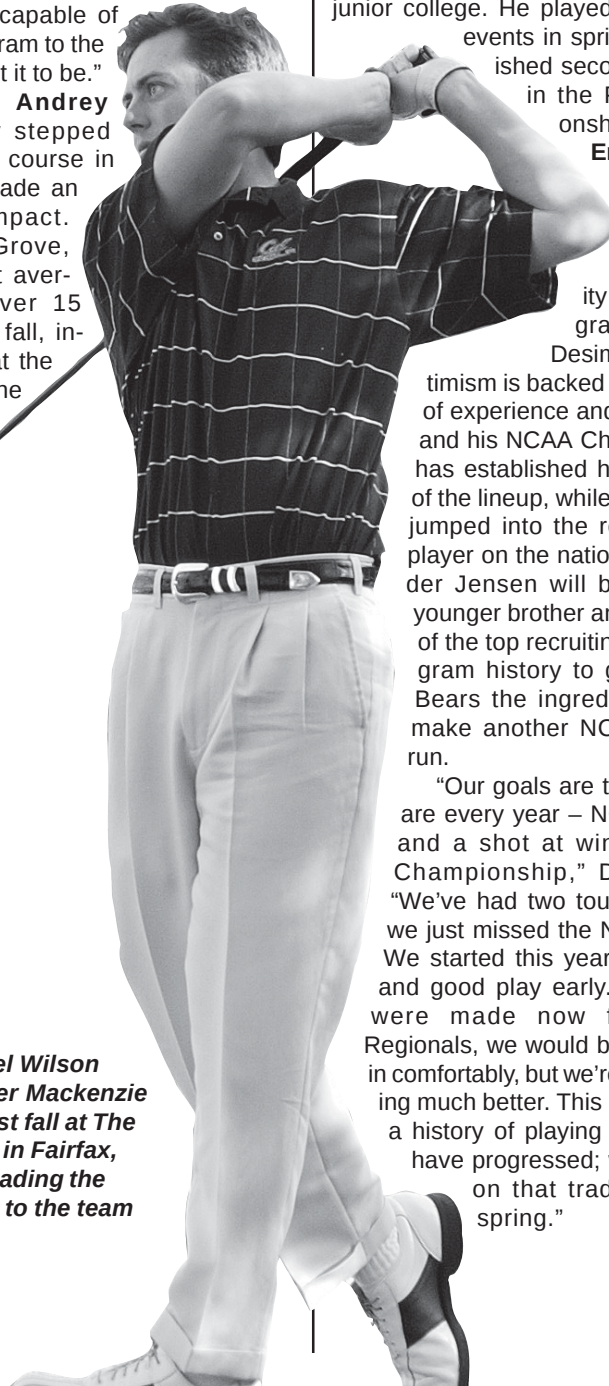
events in spring 2006 and finished second for the Bears in the Pac-10 Championships. Sophomore

Erick Thorson and freshmen **Evan Derian** and **John Yeun** also add quality depth to the program.

Desimone's usual optimism is backed by his potent mix of experience and talent – Wilson, and his NCAA Championship ring, has established himself at the top of the lineup, while Gandranata has jumped into the rotation as a top player on the national level. The elder Jensen will be joined by his younger brother and the rest of one of the top recruiting classes in program history to give the Golden Bears the ingredients needed to make another NCAA Tournament run.

"Our goals are the same as they are every year – NCAA competition and a shot at winning an NCAA Championship," Desimone said. "We've had two tough years, where we just missed the NCAA Regionals. We started this year with a solid fall and good play early. If the selection were made now for the NCAA Regionals, we would be in and we'd be in comfortably, but we're capable of playing much better. This program has had a history of playing well as seasons have progressed; we'd like to build on that tradition again this spring."

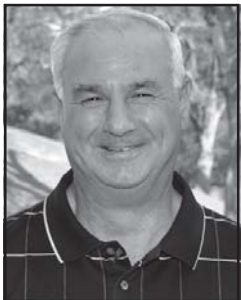

CALIFORNIA COACHING STAFF

Steve DESIMONE

Head Coach • 28th Season
University of California, 1970



Head coach Steve Desimone, now in his 28th year at the helm of California Men's Golf, is the man largely responsible for the level of success enjoyed by the Golden Bears program.

The 2004 season was magical for Desimone as the veteran coach was able to achieve the ultimate prize – the NCAA Men's Golf Championship. It was through his hard work and dedication that the Cal Golf program was in a position to win a National Championship.

Cal produced one of the greatest stories in the history of NCAA golf in 2004, coming back from eight strokes down to UCLA in the final day to win by six strokes over the Bruins. It was the culmination of a season in which the Bears had to overcome several injuries, but they were able to play the best golf when it meant the most – at the NCAA Championship. As a result of his team's impressive accomplishment, Desimone was named *Golfweek* Magazine's Collegiate Coach of the Year, and was honored as 2004 Grand Master of the Year by the Northern California Golf Association.

The Bears' program has made tremendous strides since the spring of 1980. It went from a club sport in the early '80s to one of the elite golf programs in the country, having won over 30 tournament titles under Desimone's leadership. Cal has now competed in 11 NCAA Western Regional Championships and five NCAA Championships (1995, 1998, 1999, 2000, 2004), including back-to-back-to-back appearances from 1998 through 2000.

Desimone graduated from Cal in 1970 after playing for the Bears' men's basketball team as an undergraduate. He then served in the United States military before returning to Cal to complete a double major in history and physical education and earning his Master's degree in Physical Education. Upon leaving Cal, Desimone became the Athletic Director at the College Preparatory School in Oakland where he remained until 1988. Desimone eventually returned to Cal in 1980 as Head Coach, and from 1980 to 1988, shared responsibilities between the University and the College Preparatory School. In 1989, Desimone moved to Cal on a full-time basis.

When Desimone came aboard as Head Coach in 1980, he was intent on taking Cal Golf to a higher level. The first steps taken were to form the Cal Golf Committee in 1980, the primary support group for the golf team, and to return the program from a club team to NCAA status, which was accomplished in 1982. Soon after, Desimone began crafting Cal into the nationally respected golf program it has become today. In addition to developing a

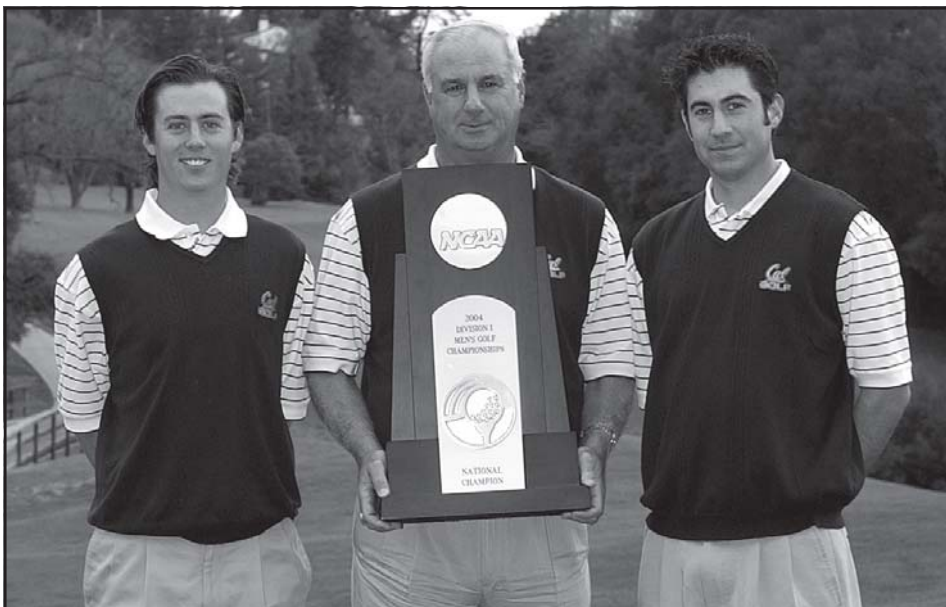
winning program, he has helped produce seven All-Americans (Ben Furth, Charlie Wi, Garrett Larson, Dan Arroyo, Han Lee, Jeff Hood and last, Peter Tomasulo, who was selected twice in 2003 and 2004) and seven All-America Scholars (Furth, Bill Albers, Dan Coyle, Walter Chun, Scott Carlyle, Tomasulo, and Michael Wilson - Furth, Albers, Chun, Carlyle and Tomasulo were each selected twice). Carlyle was also selected a first team Academic All-American in 2004.

By 1986-87, Desimone had Cal ranked among the Top 25 teams in the nation for the first time in the history of the program. One outstanding performance that season was a dramatic comeback at San Diego State's Frank Scott Memorial Tournament. Trailing fourth-ranked Fresno State by 17 shots going into the final round, the Bears rallied to win their first major championship in 17 years. Cal's success that year helped Desimone win the honor of Pacific-10 Conference Co-Coach of the Year.

During the outstanding 1989-90 season, Desimone brought the Bears golf program to an unprecedented level. The team earned its first NCAA playoff berth in 26 years. Cal competed in the 1964 tournament, but earned its first actual berth in 1990 after the NCAA switched to a selection/qualifying format. Cal played in 13 tournaments that year, placing among the Top 10 in all but two, including three team titles and a third-place tie at the Pac-10 Championships. In addition, the Bears were ranked among the Top 20 teams in the nation throughout the season. The major contributor to the Bears success that year was Cal Golf's first All-American and a Cal Sports Hall of Famer – Ben Furth.

The following season came to a disappointing conclusion for Desimone and the Bears. A career-ending back injury to Furth brought to an end the hope that 1990-91 would surpass Cal's great season the preceding year. Off the course, however, another important step in the rebuilding of Cal Golf was undertaken. With the generous support of the Cal Golf Committee, a small amount of financial aid was offered to incoming student athletes for the first time in 15 years. This was a critical step because it finally demonstrated the Bears were committed to competing nationally in all respects.

The 1994-95 season stands as the second best in the history of Cal Golf. The team finished second to Arizona State at the Pac-10 championships, being selected for its third berth in the NCAA Western Regional in six years. The Bears qualified for the

NCAA Championships in Columbus, Ohio, and finished that great season with a sixth-place at the finals. Leading the way was Charlie Wi, 1995 Pac-10 Champion and First-Team All-American.

In February 2005, Desimone had the honor of watching three of his former golfers - Wi, Tomasulo and Jesse Ruda - compete as professionals at the 2005 Pebble Beach National Pro-Am on the Monterey Peninsula.

In addition to his current duties at Cal, Desimone is the Manager of the University of California Golf Club, a 130-member Associate Club of the Northern California Golf Association. He has served twice on the NCAA Pacific Region Selection Committee for the NCAA Western Regional from 1991-93 and from 2002-04, and served on the campus-wide NCAA Self-Certification Committee in the mid-90s.

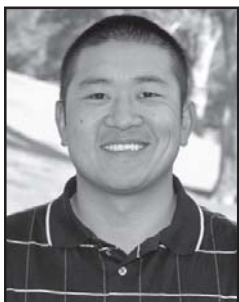

Walter CHUN

A former California golf standout, Walter Chun enters his third year as assistant coach with the Golden Bears. Prior to his current position, he was the Bears' administrative assistant

for the 2003-04 campaign, helping the Bears to the 2004 NCAA title.

Chun was a two-time team captain and competed in three NCAA Western Regionals (2000-02) and the 2000 NCAA Championship as a member of the Cal Golf team from 1997-2002. He has also qualified for two U.S. Amateur Championships, the first in 1999 at Pebble Beach and the second in 2002 at Oakland Hills Country Club.

Chun received his bachelor's degree from the Walter A. Haas School of Business in 2001, and earned his Master's from Cal's Graduate School of Education in 2003. In addition to his success on the course, Chun was a three-time Pac-10 All-Academic selection (2000-2002) and a two-time All-America Scholar (2001, 2002) for the Bears.

Recently, Bakkum was the Director of the Nike Coaches All-Star Golf Academy in Phoenix, AZ. He is in his third year as Assistant Director of Instruction at Metropolitan Golf Links in Oakland, and has been affiliated with the PGA of America since 2005.
