Coaching Staff

Barry Weiner – Head Coach, 19th Year at Cal

Barry Weiner led the Golden Bears to national championships in 1997 and 1998. He has had a total of 10 Top-5 national finishes and 14 NCAA individual championships in his 16 seasons at Cal.

Weiner was National Coach of the Year after leading the Bears to a perfect 17-0 regular season in 1997 and went the entire '98 season without a loss en route to its second-consecutive team championship, after which Weiner was named MPSF Coach of the Year for the third time (he won the award for the fourth time in 2004) and National Coach of the Year. Including the 16-1 overall record of 2004, Weiner's career record stands at an impressive 223-67-1 (.769) spanning over the last fifteen years.

Weiner took the reins of the men's gymnastics program in 1992 after Cal's worst-ever 1-18 season in '91. Under his guidance, Cal rebounded to a 15-13 dual meet record, third in the conference and reaching the NCAA Regionals, where the team took seventh.

A native of Philadelphia, he earned a bachelor of science degree from Temple in 1970.

Aaron Floyd – Assistant Coach, 5th Year at Cal

Aaron Floyd joined the Golden Bear coaching staff four years ago after spending four seasons, 1999-2003, as a student-athlete on the Cal gymnastics team. Floyd was the team captain his junior and senior seasons, and during his stint at Cal, he earned three Academic All-American honors.

BERKELEY – The No. 6 California men's gymnastics team is ready for its biggest weekend of competition of the season at the NCAA Championships in West Point, N.Y. On Thursday, the Golden Bears (7-7) will compete against No. 10 Nebraska, No. 7 Minnesota, No. 2 Oklahoma, No. 3 Michigan and No. 11 Iowa in the team qualifier. To advance to Friday's team championships, Cal must finish as one of the top three in its qualifying session. The individual event finals are scheduled to take place on Saturday, April 17.

About the NCAA Championships

Competition begins Thursday, April 15, with two pre-qualifying sessions starting at 10 a.m. and at 4 p.m., PST, in the later of which Cal will be competing. The top three teams from each session along with the top three individuals in each of the six team events not part of a qualifying team, or as an all-arounder, advance to the team and all-around finals Friday evening, April 16, to vie for the national title. The team finals will be televised by ESPN2 on tape-delay April 23 at 1:30 p.m. The top 10 gymnasts in each of the six team events Friday evening advance to Saturday's (April 17) NCAA Championship individual event finals at 4 p.m. PST, where the top six finishers on each of the six events will be awarded All-America status.

Cal Tradition at NAAs

The Bears have a rich history in the NCAA Championships with 195 individual top-10 finishers since 1948, including 29 individual national champions. Cal has finished in the top five at NAAs 18 times since 1959, including six times this decade with last season's fourth-place finish. The Bears boast four team national championships - 1968, '75, '97 and '98. Cal has 29 individual national championship titles, 14 with Barry Weiner as the head coach. His most recent national champion was crowned last year when Evan Roth won rings. In 2008, Tim McNeill added two more to that list when he took top honors on pommel horse and parallel bars, bring his career total to five. Since their back-to-back NCAA titles in '97 and '98, the Bears' best finish in the NCAA Championships was third, which they accomplished in 2001 and 2002. The best team score Cal has earned in the Weiner era is 233.825, a total the Bears earned in the '97 championship year. Since 1996, Cal has qualified for the NCAA Championships every year except one (1999). The lowest the Bears have placed in the national championships under Weiner was a seventh-place finish in 2003.

Flashback: 2009 NCAA Championships

Cal's fourth-place finish at the 2009 NAAs marked the 10th time in the past 12 years that the team has closed the year as one of the top-five teams in the country at the NCAA Championships. It was also the highest the Bears have finished since 2002, when they were third. The 13 top-10 individual finishes was the first time since 1959 that a Cal team has achieved this feat and only the second time in program history. In the two days of competition at the national championships, Cal set five team season highs and four program bests. Evan Roth took home the NCAA individual title on still rings for his first championship and the 29th individual title in program history. Seven Bears competed in the individual championships, combining for nine All-America honors - Glen Ishino and Bryan del Castillo on high bar; Ishino on pommel horse; Roth and Kyle Brady on rings; Roth on vault; and Brady, Ishino and Jim Kerry on parallel bars.

Recently in the Gym

The Bears took second at the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Championships on April 3, edged by .100 of a point, 354.550-354.450, by Oklahoma. At the MPSF meet, Ishino won the all-around championships by almost three full points. Ishino also took home the

pommel-horse crown, while junior Kyle Bunthuwong won parallel bars and high bar. Cal's second-place finish was the highest since 2005, when the Bears also took second at the MPSFs.

MPSF Lauds Weiner as Coach of the Year

Barry Weiner has been selected as the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Coach of the Year, marking the sixth time in his career that Weiner has been lauded as the best coach in the competitive conference. In his 19th season at the helm of the Golden Bears, Weiner continues his track record of producing top-ranked men's gymnastics teams and student-athletes. This season, Weiner has led the Bears to a 7-7 overall record. Most recently, the Bears took second at the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Championships on April 3. Thus far in 2010, Weiner's coaching has helped Cal land three MPSF Gymnast of the Week honors with Ishino earning the award twice and Bunthuwong once. Both Ishino and Bunthuwong are U.S. senior national team members.

Ishino Tabbed as MPSF Gymnast of the Year

Glen Ishino was named the MPSF Gymnast of the Year; the conference office announced recently. At the MPSF meet, Ishino won the all-around championships by almost three full points. Ishino also took home the pommel-horse crown, while junior Kyle Bunthuwong won parallel bars and high bar. Cal's second-place finish was the highest since 2005, when the Bears also took second at the MPSFs. Though he is just a sophomore, Ishino demonstrates his superior gymnastics week in and week out for the Bears. At the recent MPSF Championships, Ishino took home the all-around title with a 90.100, well ahead of second-place finisher Steven Legendre of Oklahoma, who scored 87.300. Ishino also took home the gold medal on pommel horse with his 15.150. Despite suffering an injury during warm-ups just minutes before the first meet of the season, Ishino has returned in high fashion - notching six event titles and four all-around victories.

Scouting Cal's Qualifier Opponents

Competing in the evening session are Nebraska, Minnesota, Oklahoma, Michigan, California and Iowa along with individual all-arounders Andrew Faulk of Navy, Nash Mills of Air Force and Army's Ty Smith. Against the teams in their field, the Bears have only met with Nebraska, Oklahoma and Iowa this season. Cal posted a 349.450-331.050 victory over Iowa at the Pacific Coast Collegiate Classic on Feb. 20. The Bears recently saw action against the Huskers and Sooners at the MPSF Championships on April 3. At that conference championship, Cal defeated Nebraska, 354.540-341.650 but Oklahoma edged the Bears out of the title, 354.550-354.450.

Daring Donathon

Freshman Donathon Bailey has been a key contributor for the Bears on each of the events over the course of his freshman campaign. His primary events are horse and rings, on which his personal highs are 14.750 and 14.200, respectively, and both of which he set in the first meet of the season. The Gold Country Classic was the first time that he competed in the all-around, scoring an 82.650. At that meet, he set career highs on vault (14.800), parallel bars (14.500) as well as high bar (13.550).

The del Castillo Factor

Despite returning from injury, junior Bryan del Castillo has been a high point for the Bears all season. A key member of the all-around team and someone Cal relies on for high schools in the all-round, del Castillo has competed in every meet except for one this season. He achieved new personal all-time bests on floor (15.200), horse (14.750) and vault (15.500) this season.

Lucky Lacombe

Freshman Steven Lacombe has competed in each of Cal's five team meets as a true freshman this year, earning placement on Cal's floor, rings and vault team. He set his personal high on floor with a 14.00 at the Stanford Open on Jan. 30. At the Gold Country Classic (Feb. 13), the Mission Viejo, Calif., native had his first outing on vault, notching a 14.500. He also set a new career/season high on rings at the last meet with a 14.000 at the Pacific Coast Classic.

The Montecarlo Mark

Like Steven Lacombe, the Montecarlo brothers - Jean and Christian - have earned their

way into the starting line-up for each of Cal's five team meets. The pair are key members of the Bears' vault team, and they further proved their worth at the Pacific Coast Classic with Jean taking sixth with a season/career-high 15.800 while Christian had a 15.550. Christian set his personal best in his very first meet - Stanford on Jan. 15 - with a 15.650.

The Representative from Switzerland... Dennis Mannhart

Freshman Swiss national team star Dennis Mannhart performed in his first meet as a Golden Bear at the Gold Country Classic. On floor, he was Cal's second highest finisher, grabbing a 14.350. The 5-5 freshman helped the Bears to a team victory on rings with his 13.800. Further contributing to the team cause, Mannhart won his first event title in a Bear uniform with his 14.800 on p-bars to lead the Bears to their 58.250-56.450 event victory. He concluded his career-opening performance with a grand total score of 85.400 for second place in the all-around.

Ishino Named March 15 MPSF, National Gymnast of the Week

Sophomore Glen Ishino, the reigning national and Mountain Pacific Sports Federation gymnast of the week, repeated as the MPSF and national gymnast for the week of March 15. Against Penn State on March 13, Ishino notched 90.900 all-around win, tying for first on parallel bars and took home the titles on vault and pommel horse. On floor, Ishino was Cal's top finisher with a 15.250, a new season high, for second place. Ishino's event-winning 15.450 on pommel horse was not only yards above the other competitors - second place was a 14.800 by PSU's Felix Aronovich - but also good enough for a new season and career high. Ishino's previous best on horse in 2010 was a 15.200 and his career high was 15.400. Thanks to Ishino's score, Cal hit a 2010 high on horse with a 58.200, above its previous season best of 56.950 and just

short of its all-time best of 58.250. Ishino soared to a first-place finish on vault with his 15.850 to push the Bears to a 62.450-61.850 win on the event. On high bar, Ishino tied for first, scoring a 14.950, helping Cal set a new 2010 best with its 59.400 on h-bar, above its previous high of 58.100.

Ishino Recognized as March 8 National, MPSF Gymnast of the Week

Glen Ishino won the all-around for the California men's gymnastics team in the March 6 close loss to Ohio State, earning him stature as the MPSF and national gymnast of the week. Ishino earned an 89.050 to best teammate and Swiss national team star Dennis Mannhart, who notched an 88.200. Ishino's team-high 14.750 helped the Bears set a new team season high on floor at 57.500, which narrowly edged the Buckeyes' 57.050 on floor. Ishino was Cal's top finisher on pommel horse, where he took second with a 15.000, and rings, on which he was third with his 15.150. He took second place on parallel bars with a 15.050, just .200 behind event winner Mannhart. The Santa Ana's 15.150 set a new personal and all-time career best on still rings. He also tied his 2010 season high on floor at 14.750 and set new year bests on parallel bars (15.050) and in the all-around (89.050).

Bunthuwong Named Feb. 22 MPSF, National Gymnast of the Week

Once again, Kyle Bunthuwong played a large role in California's success, this time at the Pacific Coast Classic on Feb. 20, and he was rewarded as the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation gymnast of the week. Bunthuwong took first in the all-around with a 90.500 ahead of Stanford's Tim Gentry (second, 88.500) and Bear teammate Glen Ishino (third, 86.850). Bunthuwong won parallel bars with his 15.500 and took second on pommel horse with a season best 14.800. Not only were his scores on vault (15.900), p-bars (15.500) and in the all-around (90.500) new season highs, but they also bested his previous career highs since the

implementation of FIG scoring. His first-place victory on parallel bars proved to be huge for the Bears, who set a new season high on the event en route to their first-place finish. With his fourth-place vault finish (15.900), Bunthuwong was also instrumental in Cal's tying of the all-time program best of 63.050 on vault. In all, the Bears set new season highs on five events and in the overall team squad, which no doubt could have been achieved without Bunthuwong's successful outing.

Bears Earn No. 2 Preseason Ranking

Cal was ranked second in the nation according to the Troester preseason coaches' poll. The Bears had four first-place votes for second place in the country. Despite losing four letterwinners, including NCAA individual champion Evan Roth, the Golden Bears welcome six newcomers and a solid core of 12 experienced returners. Tops on the list of lettermen are senior national team members Kyle Bunthuwong, who traveled with the U.S. delegation to the Japan Cup this summer, and Glen Ishino. Cal also brings back 2009 All-Americans Jim Kerry and Bryan del Castillo.

Cal Coaching Staff

The Bears are coached by Barry Weiner, who is in his 19th year at the helm of Cal and boasts a 255-97-1 record. He has had a total of 10 top-five national finishes, adding another spectacular season with a fourth-place finish in 2009. He has also coached 14 NCAA individual championships in his 18 seasons at Cal. The most recent individual championship was last season, when Evan Roth won the title on still rings. Weiner coached Tim McNeill to five individual national championships - three NCAA titles on pommel horse and two on parallel bars. Weiner is assisted by Aaron Floyd. During four seasons in his current role as assistant coach, Floyd has helped Weiner lead the Bears to four winning seasons - three top-five and one top-10 national finishes - as well as six individual NCAA championship titles.

No. 2 California Edged by No. 1 Stanford, 352.75-340-100

Cal won pommel horse.

Jan. 15, 2010

BERKELEY - The No. 2 California men's gymnastics team gave defending national champion Stanford a run to the finish, but dropped the final result, 352.75-340-100. The meet, which occurred at Haas Pavilion, was the season opener for both squads with the Cardinal improving to 1-0 and the Golden Bears dropping to 0-1.

"I think our guys fought hard," Cal head coach Barry Weiner said. "Obviously we were out-manned; we didn't have our full team out there tonight."

Cal won pommel horse, one of its signature events, 56.950-55.200. The Bears also took home the parallel-bars title, outlasting Stanford on the event, 58.350-56.800. Bryan del Castillo and Donathon Bailey tied for a first-place victory on pommel horse, each notching a 14.750.

Kyle Bunthuwong won p-bars (15.500) while Eric Haeussler was second (14.900). Bunthuwong took second in the all-around with an 86.700. Del Castillo was just behind him in fourth place thanks to his 86.350 final score.

"We're driven by our all-arounders," Weiner noted. "If we're going to make a significant move this year, we need all five all-arounders to be healthy."

Bunthuwong paced the Bears on vault with a 15.700. Brothers Christian Monteclaro and Jean Monteclaro were right on his heels with a 15.650 and 15.550, respectively. Haeussler notched a 15.300 (ninth) and del Castillo earned a 14.500 (11th). Stanford narrowly edged the Bears on vault, 63.700-62.200 on vault and also took home rings, 59.400-55.200. Thanks to those two event wins, the Cardinal took a 239.200-229.000 lead into the final third of the competition.

Bunthuwong's parallel bars routine elicited a loud cheer from the crowd and a 15.550 from the judges, good for first place. Haeussler was second with a 14.900, Del Castillo scored a 14.500 (fourth) and Bailey had a 13.450 (ninth). With just one rotation to go, Stanford was still clinging to its lead, 295.950-287.350.

The Cardinal sealed its win with a strong outing on parallel bars, though it dropped the event to the Bears. Cal scored 52.750 points to Stanford's 56.750 on high bar. Del Castillo was Cal's highest finisher on h-bar with a 14.050 for third place. Bunthuwong took fifth (13.600), Haeussler seventh (12.750) and Nic Blair 11th (11.800).

No. 7 Cal Drops Big Meet Rematch to No. 2 Stanford, 349.650-340.850

Bears win pommel horse.

Jan. 24, 2010

STANFORD, Calif. - The No. 7 California men's gymnastics team lost to defending national champion No. 2 Stanford, 349.650-340.850, on Saturday evening. The meet, which was the second of three consecutive dual meets between the two rival squads, took place at the Cardinal's Burnham Pavilion. With the win, Stanford maintains its undefeated status at 2-0 while the Golden Bears stand at 0-2 on the young season.

Bryan del Castillo had an outstanding meet, winning the all-around with an 86.900. He paced the Bears on floor with a 15.100, which was good for third place. Kyle Bunthuwong was also a high point - taking home a 14.950 on the still rings. He also won parallel bars with a 15.250 and led his squad with a 14.800 on high bar.

Eric Haeussler was the shining point for the Bears on vault, notching a 15.100. Further spreading the high scores around the team was freshman Donathan Bailey, who tied for first with Stanford's Eric Hergenrader with a 13.750 on pommel horse.

The Bears are now 122-61-2 in the all-time series with Stanford. The two rival teams will compete at least six times this season, four of which are Cal-Stanford dual meets, with the second occurring this week. Last season, Cal went 3-3 against Stanford, defeating the Cardinal in the first three meets of the season.

Bears Notch Two Individual Event Wins, Team Victory on Pommel Horse at Stanford Open

Cal puts full team up for pommel horse.

Jan. 30, 2010

STANFORD, Calif. - The No. 7 California men's gymnastics team won pommel horse and took home two individual event wins at the annual Stanford Open on Saturday evening at the No. 2 Cardinal's Burnham Pavilion. Putting up a full team on pommel horse, the Golden Bears won the event, 56.450-51.400. Stanford took home the meet title, 337.950-238.300.

"Team morale is very good," Cal head coach Barry Weiner said.

Kyle Bunthuwong took home the event title on high bar with a 15.050, well ahead of Stanford's Cameron Foreman (14.600). Raion Sabo tied for third with Eddie Penev at 14.050 while Nic Blair and Abhinav Ramani tied for fifth (13.900).

Pommel horse was a smashing event for Cal with the Bears sweeping the first three spots on the podium. Glen Ishino was first on the squad and of the meet with a 15.200 while Donathan Bailey took second (14.150) and Bunthuwong narrowly behind him in third (14.100). Holding down the sixth and seventh spots, respectively, were Nic Blair (13.000) and Bryan del Castillo (12.600).

On parallel bars, it was John Martin who came in first (14.550) but Cal's Eric Haeussler was right behind him in a tie for second with Nicholas Noone, both scoring a 14.200. Steven Lacombe paced the Bears on still rings, notching a 13.650 for third, just .050 behind second-place finisher Nicholas Noone (13.700).

Two Bears tied for fourth on vault with Bailey and Jean Monteclaro each earning a 14.550 from the judges. Fellow freshman Christian Monteclaro came in at seventh with a 13.800. Haeussler led the Bears on floor with a 14.500 for third. Bailey and Ramani tied for fourth (14.450) while Lacombe took seventh (14.000).

The Bears rested several members of the team at this third consecutive dual meet against defending national champion Stanford.

"We will soon have Glen Ishino back in full soon as well as Swiss national team star Dennis Mannhart, as well," Weiner said. "We will field a complete and very strong line-up in the weeks to come."

Cal Contingent Closes Cup Qualifier

Three Bears compete in Las Vegas, two advance to finals.

Feb. 4, 2010

LAS VEGAS - Two current members of the California men's gymnastics team as well as former Golden Bear Evan Roth finished the first day of competition at the Winter Cup Challenge in Las Vegas. In their respective rounds of the three-session qualifier held Thursday afternoon through the evening, Senior Bryan del Castillo and Evan Roth earned scores high enough to propel them to Saturday's final round. Del Castillo earned 25 points (20th place) to move to the finals while Roth scored 15 for 35th place. Also competing was redshirt junior Eric Haeussler.

The field includes three 2008 Olympians, five members of the 2009 World Championships team, nine members of the senior national team and 12 members of the junior national team. The gymnasts are vying for 15 spots on the U.S. men's senior national team from now through the 2010 Visa Championships, when the team is chosen again.

In the first session of the three-session evening, del Castillo took second place in the all-around with an 83.500, just .400 behind first-place finisher Tyler Mizoguchi of Illinois. Del Castillo tied for second in his session with a 14.150 on parallel bars, owned sole possession of third on pommel horse (14.350) and tied for third on vault (15.550).

After all of the results had been tabulated, del Castillo ended up tying for seventh on pommel horse with his 14.350. He ended the prelims tying for 20th in the all-around (83.500) and in a tie for 12th on parallel bars (14.150).

Haeussler also competed in the same session as del Castillo, with his highest finish coming on parallel bars, where he took fifth with a 13.600. He also tied for seventh on floor with a 13.850. He ended up finishing in 81st place overall out of the competitors with his parallel bars' score (13.600) being his highest at a tie for 28th.

Bears Finish Competing at Winter Cup; Two Petition for National Team Spots

Bunthuwong, Ishino make the senior national team.

Feb. 7, 2010

LAS VEGAS - Senior Bryan del Castillo and former Golden Bear Evan Roth finished competing at the Winter Cup on Saturday evening. The pair scored high marks but not high enough to propel them onto the senior national team. Kyle Bunthuwong and Glen Ishino, who did not compete this weekend, successfully petitioned for spots on the national team. The Winter Cup provides the basis for placement on the national squad from now until the Visa Championships in August.

On floor, del Castillo scored a 13.600 for 36th place against some of the best competition in the country. Del Castillo took eighth after two nights of competition on pommel horse with a combined score of 28.400.

Evan Roth had a successful outing on rings, besting his Thursday's score of 14.050 with a Saturday night tally of 14.450 for a cumulative 28.500 to tie for ninth place.

Also improving on his preliminary score (15.200), del Castillo scored a 15.500 to move him into 16th place (30.700) on vault. Increasing by leaps and bounds on parallel bars, del Castillo moved two full points ahead of his Thursday score of 11.700 with a 14.150 on Saturday evening to finish in 31st place (25.850). Roth and del Castillo qualified for Saturday evening's finals session thanks to their successful outings in the Thursday qualification rounds. Del Castillo earned 25 points (20th place) to move to the finals while Roth scored 15 for 35th place.

Bears Narrowly Edged by Stanford, 342.700-340.850

Bunthuwong wins all-around title.

LIVERMORE, Calif. - The California men's gymnastics team lost the Gold Country Classic by a very slim margin to Stanford, 342.700-340.850. The meet, which was the fourth dual meet between the Golden Bears (0-4) and the Cardinal (4-0), took place Saturday night at the Robert Livermore Center.

The Bears earned team wins on still rings (57.050-56.000) and parallel bars (58.250-56.450). Kyle Bunthuwong took home the all-around title thanks to his 86.700, defeating Stanford's Eddie Penev (84.200). Getting right to work on that all-around win, Bunthuwong took second place on floor with a 14.850. In his first collegiate outing, Swiss national team star Dennis Mannhart was Cal's second highest finisher, grabbing a 14.350.

On pommel horse, it was freshman Donothan Bailey who was the shining star for the Bears, earning a 13.600, which was good for third. It was a complete team effort to capture the rings title for the Bears. Bunthuwong took second (14.900) while sophomore Glen Ishino was third (14.800). Also contributing high scores were Mannhart (13.800) and Steven Lacombe (13.550).

The Cardinal won vault by incredibly slim margins - 60.850-60.600. Bunthuwong was racking up the points with a 15.500 for second while freshman Christian Monteclaro notched a 15.350 for third.

Things swung back the Bears' way on parallel bars with their 58.250-56.450 event victory. Mannhart won his first event title in a Golden Bear uniform with his 14.800 on the p-bars. Ishino was right behind him in a tie for second with a 14.550 and Bailey was fourth (14.500).

It was not as promising on the horizontal bar, where the Bears lost by .200 points. Bunthuwong confirmed his all-around supremacy with a 14.600 for first place. His score was just one of two on the event for both teams that scored higher than a 14.00.

OAKLAND, Calif. - The California men's gymnastics team finished third out of all teams and second out of the collegiate squads at the annual Pacific Coast Classic. The meet, which featured a team of Japanese all-stars as well as four other college teams, took place Saturday evening at the Oakland Convention Center and saw the Bears improve to 3-5 overall.

"We're getting better but we're not close to having our whole team together just yet," Cal head coach Barry Weiner noted after the meet. "Having said that, the guys who competed tonight showed a lot of heart."

Kyle Bunthuwong took first in the all-around with a 90.500 ahead of Stanford's Tim Gentry (second, 88.500) and Bear teammate Glen Ishino (third, 86.850).

The Bears set 2010 season team highs on five of the six events - floor (57.300), rings (57.700), vault (63.050), p-bars (59.050) and h-bar (58.100) - as well as in their overall score of 349.450. The 63.050 tied the program's all-time best (according to FIG scoring) on vault. Cal won parallel bars with a 59.050, well above the Japanese (second, 57.200) and Stanford (third, 56.700). Cal took second on vault and third on floor, pommel and rings.

Bunthuwong won p-bars with his 15.500 and took second on pommel horse with a season best 14.800. His scores on vault (15.900), p-bars (15.500) and in the all-around (90.500) were new season as well as career highs (according to FIG scoring). Ishino's highest event finishes came on p-bars, where he took fourth with a 14.700, and h-bar, also fourth with a 14.900. Competing in his second meet as a Golden Bear after becoming eligible, Dennis Mannhart was sixth in the all-around with an 85.650, taking fifth on parallel bars with a 14.550.

Bryan del Castillo's helped the Bears on vault with a 15.100. Taking eighth overall on parallel bars was Jim Kerry, who notched a 14.300. Freshman Steven Lacombe set a new career best on rings with a 14.00 while Nic Blair bested his season high on pommel horse with a 14.250 for seventh.

Further proving their worth on the vault squad were true freshmen twins Jean and Christian Monteclaro. Jean took sixth with a season/career-high 15.800 while Christian had a 15.550. Raion Sabo set a new 2010 and career high on parallel bars thanks to his 14.150 score for 14th place.

No. 8 Cal Outlasted by No. 5 Ohio State, 351.800-346.000

COLUMBUS, Ohio - The No. 8 California gymnastics team lost, 351.800-346.00, to No. 5 Ohio State on Saturday afternoon. The meet, which was the Golden Bears' first dual meet with a team other than Stanford this year, saw the Bears win parallel bars and high bar. Glen Ishino won the all-around with an 89.050 while Swiss national team star Dennis Mannhart was second at 88.200.

On floor, the Bears took the event by a slim margin - 57.500-57.050 - taking the second, third and fourth spots on the podium. Leading the Bears was Dennis Mannhart, who placed second with a 15.050. Sophomore Glen Ishino was third (14.750) and Jim Kerry took fourth (14.550).

Ishino was Cal's top finisher on pommel horse, taking second with a 15.00. Donathon Bailey was the next closest competitors for the Bears in sixth, scoring a 14.100. Nic Blair was seventh (13.950) and Mannhart took eighth (13.850).

Ishino paced the Bears on the next events - rings - with a 15.150, good for third place. No. 9 Bears Upend No. 6 Penn State

Glen Ishino wins the all-around

BERKELEY - In its final home meet of the 2010 campaign, the No. 9 California men's gymnastics team entertained the fans at Haas Pavilion with a 354.650-344.300 upset win over No. 6 Penn State on Saturday afternoon. Sophomore Glen Ishino, the reigning national and Mountain Pacific Sports Federation gymnast of the week, further established his dominance with a 90.900 all-around win.

Cal took home four team titles - horse, rings, vault, parallel bars and high bar. Kyle Bunthuwong and Ishino tied for first on horizontal bar. Bunthuwong won parallel bars and Ishino took home the titles on vault and pommel horse. The Bears set multiple season and career records at the meet, including a new season high team overall score at 354.650.

On floor, Ishino was Cal's top finisher with a 15.250, a new season high, for second place. Also setting a personal best - year and career - was Dennis Mannhart, who scored a 14.750 for sixth place. The Bears' collective score of 58.650 was a new season high, breezing by their previous 57.500.

Ishino's event-winning 15.450 on pommel horse was not only yards above the other competitors - second place was a 14.800 by PSU's Felix Aronovich - but also good enough for a new season and career high. Ishino's previous best on horse in 2010 was a 15.200 and his career high was 15.400. Cal hit a 2010 high on horse with a 58.200, above its previous season best of 56.950 and just short of its all-time best of 58.250. Also helping the Bears to their 58.200-54.550 win on p-horse were Kyle Bunthuwong, who took third with a 14.650, and Mannhart, who was in fourth at 14.550. Freshman Donathon Bailey finished out the Cal scorers in sixth with a 13.550.

Two Cal gymnasts set year and career highs on rings en route to the Bears' 57.350-57.300 edging of the Nittany Lions on the event. Steven Lacombe (seventh) bested his former high of 14.000 with a 14.200 and Mannhart had a 14.350 (fifth). Ishino took second with a 14.500. Ishino soared to a first-place finish on vault with his 15.850. Freshman Christian Monteclaro took third place with a career-best tying 15.650. Mannhart tied for fourth (15.600) while Jean Monteclaro was the final Cal score to count with a 15.350 to push the Bears to a 62.450-61.850 win on the event.

The Bears absolutely dominated parallel bars, taking the first five spots with Bunthuwong leading the way with his event-winning 15.000.
