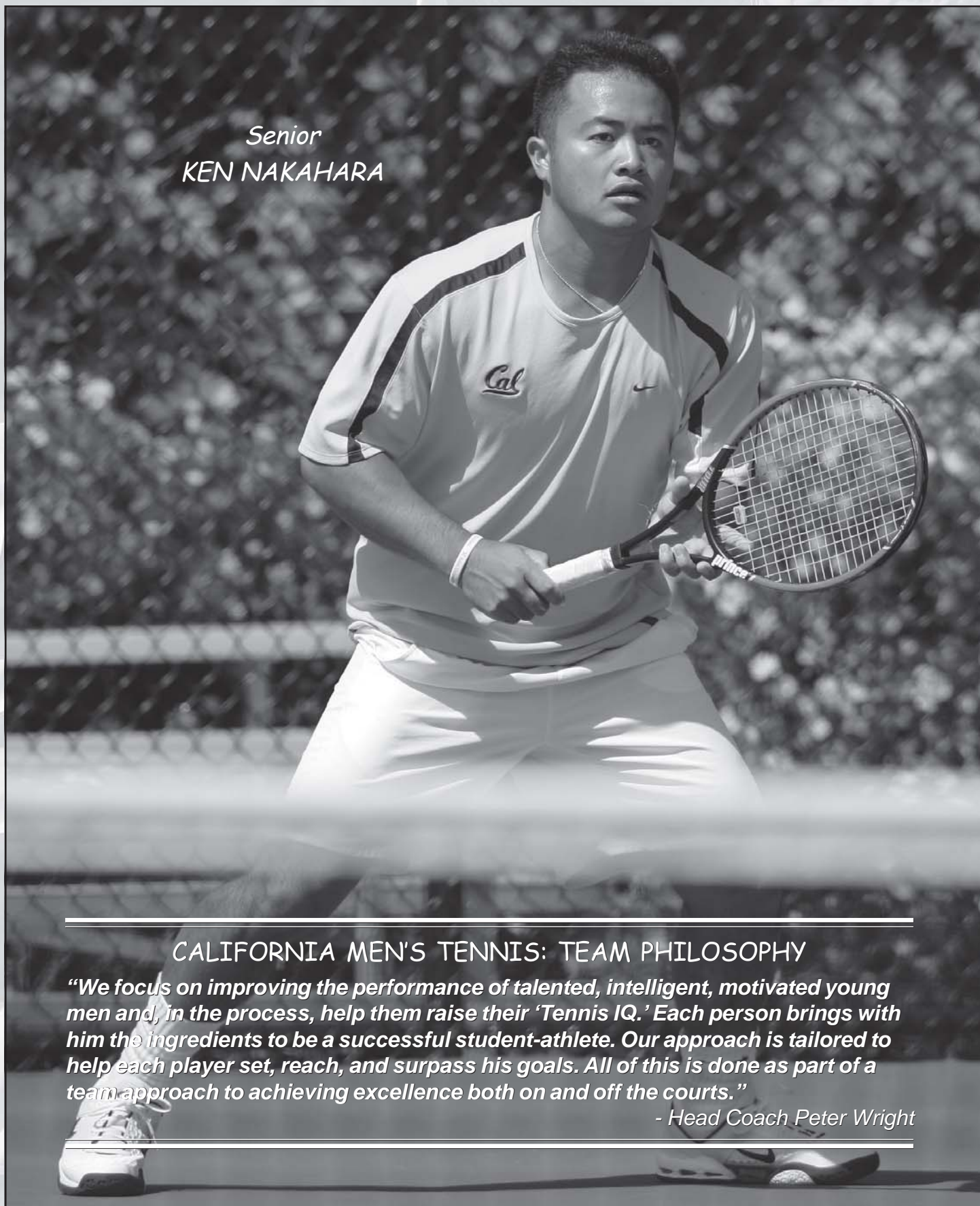

MEN'S 2008 SEASON OUTLOOK

DEPTH A KEY FOR
GOLDEN BEARS
IN 2008

Going deeper has more than one meaning for the 2008 version of the California men's tennis team. Bringing in the talents of five freshmen, the Golden Bears will add incredible depth and lineup options in 2008 while the team as a unit aims to go deeper into the postseason. Led by a core duo of seniors in captain **Ken Nakahara** and All-Pac-10 First Team sensation **Pierre Mouillon**, the Bears will once again do battle in one of the toughest conferences for collegiate men's tennis.

In his 15th season guiding the Bears, head coach **Peter Wright** will be looking to take his team to postseason NCAA play for a school-record ninth consecutive year.

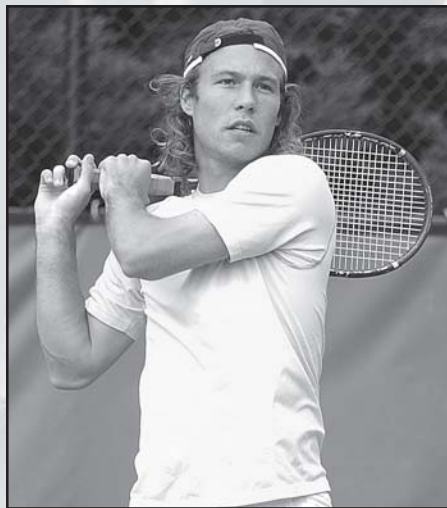
"Our expectations are very high" Wright said, "We have high quality players and a good number of them. The strengths of the team are evenly balanced clear across the board, and we will be looking for marked improvement throughout the season."

Cal finished the 2007 season with a 14-10 overall record in dual matches and took four wins (three losses) in Pac-10 Conference play to end up in a third-place tie, holding the No. 42 ITA national ranking at season's end. The Bears met No. 26 Oklahoma in the first round of the NCAA Championships and suffered a heart-breaking 4-3 loss at the hands of the Sooners. The last time Cal advanced past the second round in postseason play was in 2003, but this 2008 squad feels it has the balance and depth needed to make a deep run into the NCAA Championship Tournament.

Senior captain Ken Nakahara needs one singles win to reach the 80-win plateau after putting up a 10-5 fall tournament record and winning the Chandler Cup Blue Flight singles title. The team rallies around Nakahara's spirit on the court and will look to their captain for inspiration throughout the dual season. The other elder statesman for the Golden Bears is 2007 All-Pac-10 First Team honoree Pierre Mouillon. A transfer from Mississippi State, Mouillon put together a 28-16 overall singles record in 2007 and was named the ITA West Region Player to Watch coming into the 2007-08 season.

The junior class is depth with breadth and is led by **Eoin Heavey**, who notched a 20-15 overall record in 2006-07 and went

7-2 in dual matches on court No. 4 for the Bears. Heavey brings a fiery attitude to the squad and has the tools to make an impact in both singles and doubles play this season. A deceptively court-aware doubles player, **Geoff Chizever** specializes in duets, putting up a 10-4 record in fall tournaments when teamed up on the court. Chizever and Heavey led all Bears doubles teams with 10 wins last season. Rounding out the junior class is **Nicolai Horgen**. An aggressive player at the net, Horgen brought home five singles victories in the fall and advanced to the semifinal at the Fresno State Bulldog Classic.

Leading the sophomore class is **Kallim Stewart**. Stewart will look to continue his strong play on the second court for the Bears as they head into the dual season. As a freshman, Stewart put up a 20-16 record and went 5-2 in Pac-10 dual matches. This fall, he compiled an 8-4 singles record and advanced to the quarterfinal round at the Wilson/ITA Northwest Regional Championships. **Andy Chirita** joined the team before the dual season last year and did not participate in competition. Armed with a deadly volley, the strong attacker at the net will look to contribute to Cal's success this season.

The freshman class boasts the talents of five newcomers, each with already impressive resumes. Coming out of fall tournaments, **Bozhidar Katsarov** leads all Bears with 13 singles victories. As a result of those wins, Katsarov won the Fresno State Bulldog Classic and the Chandler Cup titles. His play at the Wilson/ITA Northwest Regional Championships also put him in the singles semifinal. Frosh **Pedro Zerbini** nabbed eight

wins in fall singles play and advanced to the quarterfinal at the Wilson/ITA Northwest Regional Championship. Zerbini's performance as one half of the Bears' most impressive fall doubles duo has caught the attention of opponents. Teamed with Chizever, Zerbini helped put together a 10-2 doubles record, advancing to the semifinal at the Wilson/ITA Northwest Regional Championships before winning the Chandler Cup doubles title to close the tournament season.

Jonathan Dahan and **Zach Gilbert** each registered five wins in singles play to open their collegiate careers. As one of the Bears' most cerebral players, Dahan looks to get time on the court in both singles and doubles as a freshman. Partnered with senior Nakahara, Gilbert enjoyed success in doubles play, advancing to the final at the Fresno State Bulldog Classic and the doubles quarterfinal at the Wilson/ITA Northwest Regional Championship. The most recent addition to the Bear squad is Saddleback CC transfer **Shan Sondhu** who will compete as a redshirt freshman this season. Sondhu was a top-five national recruit as a senior coming out of Dana Hills HS and will bring a steady all-around game to the Bears.

With the departure of John Petit, Daniel Sebesen, Vaclav Burger and Carsten Thorstensen, the Bears lose a wealth of on-court experience but the team will retain the expertise of one of last year's team captains in undergraduate assistant coach **Tyler Browne**. Browne received All-Pac-10 Honorable Mention last season after returning from an injury to post 12 wins in dual matches. Also returning to the coaching staff this year will be third-year assistant coach **Morten Christensen** and ninth-year volunteer assistant coach **Wayne Ferreira**.

The Golden Bears open the dual season with matches at Tulsa and Oklahoma State before returning to Berkeley for a daytime double-header against Reno and St. Mary's on Jan. 26 at Hellman Tennis Complex. Cal will meet its first Pac-10 opponents on Feb. 1 and 2 as it hosts perennial conference-powers USC and UCLA, respectively. The team will travel to La Jolla, Calif. on Feb. 29-Mar. 2 to participate in the 119th Pacific Coast Men's Doubles Championships. The Bears will begin Pac-10 Conference matches against Arizona on Mar. 28 and play all seven conference matches in a row, concluding with Stanford on Apr. 19. The 2008 Pac-10 Championships will be held in Ojai, Calif. on Apr. 24-27.

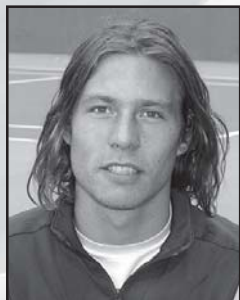

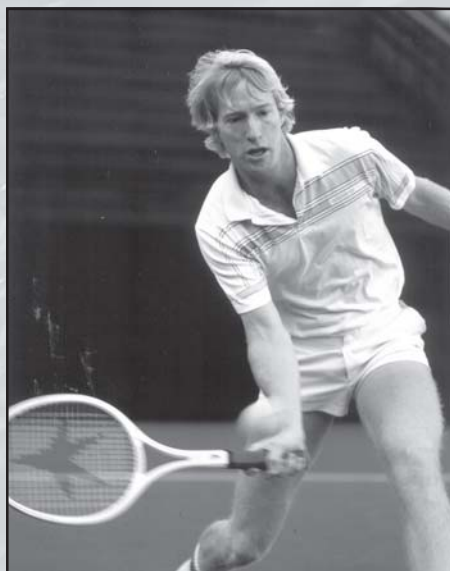


Considered one of the best teachers and tacticians in men's collegiate tennis, Peter Wright has developed a reputation for getting more out of his players than perhaps any

coach in the nation.

Wright's coaching talent hasn't gone unnoticed. Pac-10 Coach of the Year in 2001 and in 1997, he received his first coaching award in 1994 when he was named Wilson/ITA Regional Coach of the Year for guiding the Bears back to postseason play after Cal had missed the Big Dance the previous two seasons. Wright and the Bears have become a fixture in the NCAA Tournament almost every year since.

The ninth coach in the 115-year history of Cal tennis, Wright has compiled a 190-137 (.581) career record during his tenure in Berkeley. Last season, with a 14-10 overall record (4-3 Pac-10, tied for third), the Bears made their eighth consecutive postseason appearance in the NCAA Tournament, the 13th of the 14 years under Wright's guidance. Pierre Mouillon earned 2007 All-Pac-10 Conference First Team honors, reaching the Pac-10 Singles Championship semifinal under Wright's tutelage.

In 2006, with a 16-7 overall record, the team ended the season ranked No. 21 in the final ITA poll. In addition, Wright also coached 2006 Pac-10 Men's Player of the Year, Conor Niland to All-America honors. In all, under Wright, nine Cal players have combined to receive 13 All-America selections. The 2005 Bears advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament and ended the year with a No. 23 national ranking. Wright's 2003 squad completed the season ranked fourth nationally, and boasted two All-Americans and three all-conference selections. That team's 21-5 record surpassed the 2002 mark of 19-7, which at the time was considered the school's all-time best squad since joining the Pac-10. In 2003, the Bears finished in second-place in conference play, which is California's best-ever showing in one of the most competitive conferences for collegiate men's tennis. The 2002 season also marked the first time that Cal enjoyed a series sweep of UCLA since 1953 and the first time ever that the Bears beat Stanford, UCLA and USC in the same season.

A four-year letterman during his collegiate career at Cal, Wright worked his way to the No. 1 singles and doubles positions in the Bears lineup before joining the men's professional tour in 1986. In his six years as a pro, Wright played in numerous tournaments around the world including Wimbledon and the Australian Open. In addition to a doubles victory over Pete Sampras, Wright's career highlights include playing Andre Agassi, Goran

Ivanisevic, David Wheaton, Marc Rosset, Jonas Bjorkman and Tim Henman.

Wright's tour highlights include representing Ireland in the Davis Cup from 1988-95. His parents, Stanley and Elizabeth, were born and raised in Ireland, allowing Wright to compete as an Irish national. He has won numerous Irish national singles and doubles championships, and was instrumental in Ireland's upset victories over Greece, Spain and Belgium as the nation captured the 1992 European Cup. In addition to playing in the Davis Cup for Ireland, Wright served as the Irish Davis Cup captain from 1995 - 2003. He also served as the head coach of the 1996 Irish Olympic tennis team in Atlanta.

Wright's community involvement includes serving as vice-president of Youth Tennis Advantage, whose organizational mission is to inspire inner-city kids to achieve their full potential through tennis and academic programs. In 2001, he established the Bear Trax program at Cal, which brings YTA children from Oakland to the Berkeley campus for academic tutoring with Cal students and tennis instruction with the Golden Bear men's and women's teams.

A Berkeley native, Wright was born in San Francisco on Dec. 8, 1963, attended Berkeley High School and earned a B.A. in Social Science from Cal after returning to school in 1991. His wife of 15 years, Fionnuala, is a former Irish national tennis champion and a former member of the Irish national basketball team. The Wrights currently reside in Berkeley with their sons, Thomas and Michael, and daughter, Carly.

3rd year at Cal



One of Europe's most successful players for more than a decade, Christensen enters his third year with the California men's tennis program after returning to the Golden

Bears last season. Prior to his return to the program, Christensen assisted Coach Wright at Cal during the 1999-00 season.

Between his two stints with the Bears, he was the national head coach in Denmark from 2000-06, coaching all members of the National Tennis Centre and Danish national teams.

Before coming to California, Christensen had been a fixture in Danish tennis since 1984, winning 17 Danish national titles (five singles, 12 doubles), and representing his nation in the Davis Cup from 1984-96. The Copenhagen native's distinguished pro career (1986-93) included wins over such ATP stars as Thomas Muster, Goran Ivanisevic, Emilio Sanchez, Magnus Gustavsson and Martin Damm.

Christensen also won five ATP Challenger tournaments in doubles, and represented Denmark in the 1988 Seoul Olympics, reaching the doubles quarterfinal.

Immediately before joining the Bear program, Christensen was a member of the Danish Tennis Federation's executive

committee from 1995-99, where his responsibilities included overseeing the National Tennis Centre and the Danish Elite Tennis Program. He holds the Danish Tennis Federation's highest coaching diploma and was also in charge of sales, marketing and promotion for Penn balls and Prince rackets in Denmark.

Christensen resides in Berkeley, with his wife, Dorte, and his daughters, Sarah and Julie.

Wayne FERREIRA

Volunteer Assistant Coach
9th year at Cal



Wayne Ferreira enters his ninth season as an assistant coach with the Cal program. Recently retired from professional tennis, Ferreira was a 14-year ATP Tour veteran, where he

finished the 1995 and 1996 seasons ranked in the Top 10 in the world.

Ferreira was one of the most successful players on the pro circuit during the 1990's, having won 20 career titles since turning pro in 1989. Ferreira's career prize earnings top \$8 million and his highest rankings were No. 6 in singles (1995) and No. 11 in doubles (2000).

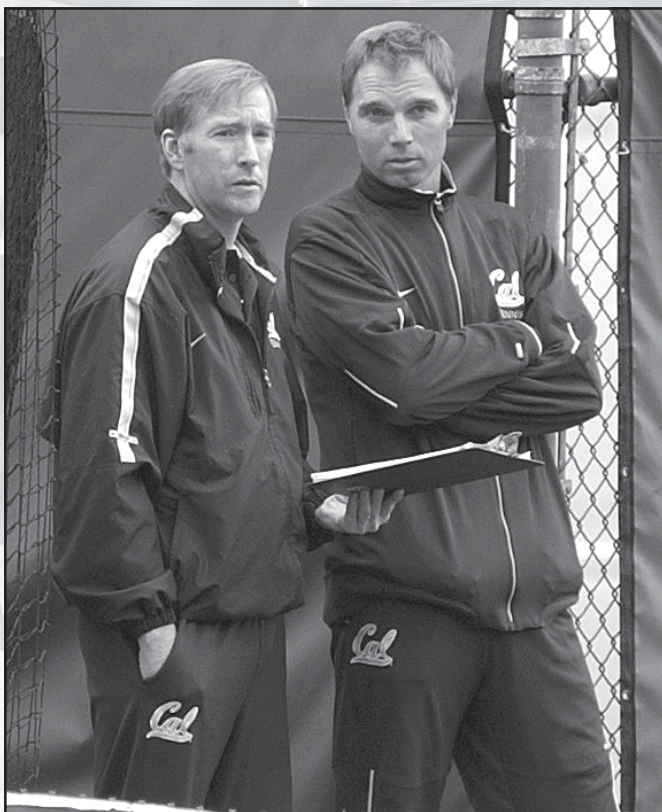
In 2004, his final year on the circuit, Ferreira participated in his record-breaking 55th consecutive Grand Slam tournament, the longest streak by any player. Ferreira eclipsed Stefan Edberg's record of 54 when he advanced to the third-round of Wimbledon.

One of his career highlights came in August 2003 when Ferreira saved three match points to defeat Australian star Lleyton Hewitt (6-3, 4-6, 7-5) to claim the Mercedes Benz Cup title at the UCLA Tennis Center. Ferreira turned in one of his most consistent performances during the 2002 season, advancing to the fourth round in every Grand Slam event. He finished the year with a No. 38 ranking in singles and No. 52 in doubles.

Wayne and his wife, Liesl, live in Lafayette, Calif. with their sons Marcus and Magnus.
