

### WOMEN'S 2008 OUTLOOK

### EXPERIENCE TO GUIDE BEARS IN 2008

xperience is the name of the game for the 2008 California women's tennis team. The Golden Bears return seven players from a 2007 squad that went 23-7 overall on its way to Cal's first appearance in the national semifinal of the NCAA Championships since 2003. Completing last season's campaign with a No. 5 national ranking, the Bears return to the court this season looking to improve on last years impressive postseason run.

The experience of the players on the court will usher in a new era in Cal women's tennis as first year head coach Amanda Augustus returns to her alma mater to take the helm of a program she once won national championships for. With the arrival of Augustus, the Bears bid farewell to nearly three decades of experience with the retirement of Jan Brogan, who guided the Cal women to 26 appearances in NCAA postseason play. Augustus will take over for a coach that saw her players achieve All-America honors on 71 occasions and took home conference coach of the year honors seven times herself.

The Bears are led by two-time All-American senior Susie Babos. Also a three-time member of the All-Pac-10 team, Babos claimed her third individual national championship in the fall as she captured the Riviera All-American Championship title for the second consecutive year. As a sophomore, she won the NCAA Singles Championship and received Pac-10 Freshman of the Year honors in 2005. Compiling a 37-12 doubles record with partner Zsuzsanna Fodor, the two earned 2007 Pac-10 Doubles Team of the Year recognition. As one of the most decorated Golden Bear players in school history, Babos has registered at least 30 singles wins in each of her three seasons at Cal. She will look to continue her steady performance after being named a team captain in her final season with Bears, as she heads into dual match play ranked No. 10 in the nation.

Joining Babos among the nation's ranked players are fellow seniors **Marion Ravelojaona** and **Cristina Visico**. Winner of the 2006 ASU Thunderbird Invitational, Ravelojaona holds the No. 52 ranking while Visico enters the dual season No. 54 nationally. Visico emerged from a vast field of the top players on the west coast as she advanced to the final match at the 2007 Wilson/ITA Northwest Regional

Championships in the fall. With 84 career singles victories, Visico is second on the team in both total wins and winning percentage, behind only the performance of Babos. Visico was also named one of 2008's team captains.

Senior **Stephanie Kusano** brings added depth to the Bears and is also one part of the formidable doubles duo that includes Babos. The pair will open the dual season ranked No. 36 in the nation and have big shoes to fill to follow up the success of Babos and Fodor. Rounding out the senior class is **Daron Moore**, a one-time transfer from Tennessee who has become an important part of this Bear team. Moore helped put up 17 doubles victories in 2007 and looks to contribute more success this season.

Junior **Bojana Bobusic** will be one of the most exciting players to watch this season as she completed fall tournament play with a team-high 14 wins on her way to capturing the Cal Invitational blue flight title and advancing to the semifinal at both the Wilson/ITA Northwest Regional Championships and the ASU Thunderbird Invitational. Bobusic is the fourth Bear to be ranked to open dual match play, holding a career-high No. 31 ranking in the season's first poll. The other junior is


Claire Ilcinkas, one of the Bears' newly elected team captains along with Babos and Visico. Ilcinkas put together a 9-2 singles record in the fall and went 7-3 in doubles, advancing to the semifinal at the Wilson/ITA Northwest Regional Championships with her partner. In two and a half years with the Bears, Ilcinkas has become a proven commodity, earning 54 singles wins and 55 doubles victories.

Without a single sophomore on the squad, the remaining three players joining the Bears this season come straight from the high school ranks. Freshman Marina Cossou has already begun to make her mark on the program, claiming the 2007 ASU Thunderbird Invitational singles title and advancing to the doubles semifinal with partner Ilcinkas. Only ten matches into her first season with the Bears, Cossou holds an 8-2 mark in singles play. The freshman class also includes the talents of Rachael Dillon and Bobbie Englert, the sister of former Golden Bear Hillary Englert.

Even with the departure of a long-time head coach and two All-Americans, this Bear squad is long in the tooth and has its sights set on claiming the NCAA Championship as a team after it came so close only a year ago. Balancing the arrival of new head coach Augustus is newly named associate head coach Cordell Ho who has been with the Golden Bears in a volunteer capacity for the past three years. Ho's appointment adds valuable experience and the stability component to what looks to be a strong Bear team.

The Bears open the spring hosting Fresno State, Nevada and St. Mary's in the Cal Winter Invitational Tournament (Jan. 18-20). The following weekend, Cal will take to the road to open dual match play against Long Beach State and Pepperdine. The first dual matches at Hellman Tennis Complex will take place on Feb. 3 as the Bears face San Francisco and UC Davis on the same day. Then on Feb. 7, Cal will travel to Madison, Wisc. to compete in the 2008 ITA National Team Indoor Championships. After the championships, the Bears will face their first Pac-10 opponents: rival Stanford followed by road matches at Washington State (Feb. 22) and Washington (Feb. 23). The Cal women will honor their five seniors on Apr. 18 as the Bears host Sacramento State on Senior Day before completing the dual season at Stanford on Apr. 19. The Pac-10 Championships will take place the following weekend (Apr. 24-27) in Ojai, Calif.

2005-06: 2006 NCAA Singles Champion, the first Golden Bear to win a national singles title, defeating USC's Lindsey Nelson, 6-4, 6-1 to claim the crown... upset 2005 NCAA champ and No. 4 seed Zuzana Zemenova of Baylor, 6-3, 6-4, in the NCAA quarterfinal... the second Bear to advance to the NCAA final since Lisa Albano in 1991... the sixth unseeded player to advance to the NCAA final, sixth sophomore to win the national championship and the 15th NCAA singles champion to come from the Pac-10... named to the 2006 ITA Collegiate All-Star team as a 2006 All-American singles selection and received All-Pac-10 second team honors... ended the season with a 32-13 record, including a 9-2 record in Pac-10 dual matches... Pac-10 All-Academic honorable mention... ranked No. 8 in doubles with partner Zsuzsanna Fodor at the end of the regular season...entered the 2005 fall season ranked No. 2 nationally on Oct. 5 in singles.

2004-05: Earned an NCAA tournament berth, defeating Kim Coventry of Kentucky in the first round, 3-6, 6-4, 6-2... won 10 of her 11 matches during a three month span form January to March, including a win over No. 9 Nicole Leimbach of USC, 7-6, 1-6, 10-8... finished her freshman season with a 33-10 overall singles record, playing at No. 1 singles exclusively for the Bears and ending the year ranked No. 6 nationally... with partner Zsuzsanna Fodor in doubles play, competed at the No. 1 doubles spot during the entire 2005 season... captured her first singles title, winning the Nike Cal Invitational, defeating Stephanie Balzert of Arizona 6-0, 6-3... earned ITA Northwest Region Rookie of the Year... named 2005 Pac-10 Freshman of the Year earning first-team All-Pac-10 honors.

## Amanda AUGUSTUS

Head Coach 1st year at Cal California '99



As one of Cal tennis' most successful players, A m a n d a Augustus returns to her alma mater, named head women's tennis coach at the University of California on July 20,

2007. Augustus, who most recently was the head coach at Michigan, succeeds her college coach Jan Brogan, who announced her retirement, after 29 years at the helm.

"I'm absolutely thrilled to have Amanda Augustus coming home to lead the Cal Bears Women's Tennis program," said Cal Director of Athletics Sandy Barbour. "Amanda has had phenomenal success at every juncture in both her playing and coaching career. I am confident that the leadership, determination and tenacity that she exhibited on the court as a Bear, will be instilled in her future Cal squads. There's no doubt that she understands what it takes to succeed at the highest level in both the classroom and the court at the University of California. She has

been mentored by Jan Brogan and Bitsy Ritt – two of the finest names in tennis. Collectively, those experiences will serve her well at Cal."

A four-time All-American at Cal from 1996-99, Augustus played professionally on the Women's Tennis Association tour for several years before turning her efforts to coaching. The Manhattan Beach, Calif. native served as head men's and women's tennis coach at Whittier College from 2004-05 and was an assistant at Michigan in 2005-06, before being elevated to the head position prior to last season.

While overseeing the Wolverine program in 2006-07, Augustus guided the team to a 17-8 overall record. Michigan placed second at the Big Ten team championships and reached the second round of the NCAA Tournament, completing its season with a No. 22 national ranking.

"I'm deeply honored to be selected for such a prestigious position at my alma mater," said Augustus. "I want to thank Sandy Barbour and the selection committee for giving me the opportunity to build on the legacy that Jan Brogan left behind. I am excited to carry on the program's great tradition and continue to strive for excellence through diversity. I look forward to guiding the young women towards achieving both their athletic and academic goals."

As a player for the Bears, Augustus earned All-Pac-10 honors each of her four years, including first-team recognition as a sophomore, junior and senior. She teamed with Amy Jensen to capture the



NCAA doubles titles in both 1998 and 1999 to become the first tandem ever to win back-to-back championships. In addition, Augustus and Francesca La'o were NCAA doubles quarterfinalists in 1996.

Augustus also earned an invitation to play in the NCAA singles tournament each of her four years at Cal, reaching the quarterfinals as a junior in 1998. During her career, she was ranked as high as fourth nationally in singles.

As a senior, Augustus received the Cissy Leary Sportsmanship Award for the ITA Northwest Region, as well as the Gladys Heldman Award for her outstanding combination of athletics and academics. In 1998, she was the Daily Californian's Female Athlete of the Year.

After graduating with her degree in economics and a minor in business administration, Augustus turned her attention to the WTA tour and successfully earned invitations to the main draw of all four Grand Slam events – Australian Open, French Open, Wimbledon and U.S. Open. She achieved world rankings of No. 82 in doubles and No. 304 in singles, and won 20 professional tournaments.

Following her season as the head women's and men's coach at Whittier College, Augustus became an assistant at Michigan and helped guide the team to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in 2006. She was named head coach for 2006-07, replacing long-time coach Bitsy Ritt, who retired from the profession to become an Associate Athletic Director at Michigan. Augustus resides in Emeryville, Calif.



Cordell Ho is California's associate head coach after serving as the team's volunteer assistant from 2004-07. His return to the program helped the Bears advance to the

NCAA final four and finish with a No. 5 ranking in 2006. Ho was instrumental in helping guide senior Susie Babos to her 2006 NCAA Singles Championship and has had an influential hand in shaping the visage of this Bear squad senior class. Ho had previously spent five seasons as the associate head coach for the men's program, as well as two seasons in a volunteer role.

Ho has held several head pro and tennis director appointments on the East Coast, as well as teaching positions at the University of Pennsylvania and the University of Washington. He has also had a long-time association with men's head coach Peter Wright, whom Ho coached both as a junior and as a professional on the men's tennis tour.

Born and raised in San Francisco, Ho began playing tennis competitively in Northern California junior tournaments and played collegiate tennis at the University of Oregon, before moving to Vienna, Austria, to continue pursue his music studies.

An active composer of symphonic and chamber music, Ho has written film scores, theater

pieces and opera. His music has been performed in the United States, Europe and Asia and he has lectured on music at UC Davis, Columbia University and the University of Washington.

Ho, a Cal graduate, (M.A. '75, B.A. '72), and his wife, Michele (B.A. Cal '79), live in Berkeley with their two daughters, Ally and Xin Xin.

first year as the volunteer assistant coach for the Golden Bears.

As a six-time Hungarian national champion, Fodor brings a wealth of experience to the Bears coaching staff.

She compiled a 68-30 singles record and put together a 65-23 doubles record in her two seasons at Cal.

Fodor has twice been named to the All-Pac-10 first team; the first time as she captured the 2006 Pac-10 Singles Championship title on her way to Pac-10 Conference Player of the Year honors. Coupled with fellow All-American Susie Babos, Fodor received recognition as part of the 2007 Pac-10 Doubles Team of the Year, posting a 21-7 record together.

Fodor earned a No. 5 singles ranking and a No. 2 doubles ranking as a junior in 2006 when she won the ITA Northwest Regional Championship doubles title in 2006 with Babos. A year earlier, she won the singles title at the ITA Regional Championship qualifier. She arrived at Berkeley after transferring from Mississippi State, where she was named the SEC freshman of the year in 2005.

Fodor resides in Berkeley, Calif.



### A TRIBUTE TO JAN BROGAN

### LONGTIME CAL COACH SERVES UP RETIREMENT

n eight-time conference coach of the year, Jan Brogan amassed more than 500 victories while guiding the California women's tennis program for 29 seasons.

Brogan's direction made the Golden Bears a perennial power, earning 19 Top-10 finishes and making 26 consecutive appearances in the NCAA Tournament. In her final season, Cal finished the 2006-07 campaign with a 23-7 record, a trip to the NCAA Championship Semifinal and a No. 5 ranking.

Under her tutelage, the Bears had 61 All-Americans, 19 first-team All-Pac-10 players and five conference players of the year. Brogan-coached players have won four doubles championships and one singles crown, all since 1999. Amanda Augustus and Amy Jensen teamed for doubles titles in 1999 and 2000, while Jensen partnered with Claire Curran for



the 2001 championship, and Raquel Kops-Jones and Christina Fusano reached the victory stand in 2003. In 2006, Susie Babos swept through the field to become Cal's

first women's NCAA Singles Champion.

Off the court, Cal players have also been named to the Pac-10 All-Academic squad on 27 occasions since 1994 and have been voted Academic All-American four times.

Brogan's career record comes to rest at 539-223 (.707), fourth on the NCAA's all-time women's tennis victory list. She is also fourth in career wins among all Cal coaches (Diane Ninemire, softball, 889; Bob Milano, baseball, 688; and Clint Evans, baseball, 547.)

A successful teaching professional in Los Gatos, Calif. before taking Cal's head coaching job in 1978, Brogan has been a




Jan Brogan coached Amanda Augustus and Amy Jensen to a pair of doubles titles in 1999-2000.

member of the ITA Board of Directors, ITA Operating Committee, NCAA Championship Tennis Committee and the ITA Sport Science Committee. Brogan graduated from San Jose State with a degree in physical education in 1978. In 1998, she completed a master's degree in sports psychology at John F. Kennedy University.

A true legacy at the University of California, Jan Brogan's contributions to the Golden Bears are innumerable. She will long be remembered for all of her great accomplishments.
