# WOMEN'S TENNIS OUTLOOK

## VETERAN BEARS POISED FOR CONTINUED SUCCESS

In its 29 years of existence, the Cal women's tennis program has established itself with the nation's elite. The numbers speak for themselves. As a team, the Bears have made an NCAA appearance in each of the past 21 consecutive years, 12 NCAA quarterfinal showings since 1983, and four Final Four appearances since 1985. This cornerstone of continued success is a direct result of the tutelage and expertise of the fourth active winningest coach in NCAA history, Jan Brogan.

In 1976, Brogan inherited a four-year-old tennis program that hadn't achieved any real measurable amount of success prior to her arrival. Within five years, she started a legacy that produced a trio of national champion doubles teams, 51 All-Americans, 14 first team All-Pac-10 selections and three conference player of the year honorees in that time. This year's squad looks to follow in this tradition of accomplishment.

Helping that cause is a veteran-laden team that boasts four players ranked in the Top 50 with last season's lineup still intact. The wealth of depth and experience as well as the close-knit team unit should set the framework for continued success in 2003.

### SINGLES

Returning All-American and 2002 second team All-Pac-10, junior **Raquel Kops-Jones** inherits the Bears' No. 1 spot for the second year in a row. This fall Kops-Jones continued in her tradition of success, compiling an 11-4 record with impressive victories over Stanford's No. 7 Erin Burdette and Alice Barnes en route to the Omni Hotels Northwest Regional singles title. The win propelled Kops-Jones into the national spotlight, securing a spot at the ITA National Indoor Championships.

Battling for the No. 2 position this season will be senior team captain No. 34 **Christina Fusano** and junior No. 33 **Catherine Lynch**. While Fusano only played four matches on the second court last year, she performed admirably, etching a 4-0 record while finishing the season leading the Bears in dual wins with 18. Fusano made a case for herself this fall, finishing with a 6-2 record and an impressive run at the ITA Northwest Regionals landing herself in the Final Four.

Lynch, a native of Dublin, Ireland, spent most of her time on courts one through four last year, posting a 13-5 record. Her 13 dual match wins ranked second on the team as she proved to be one of the most consistent performers day in and day out. The junior did not relax over the fall months, finishing with a 9-4 record and advancing at least three rounds in every tournament. Lynch appeared on the national scene after an impressive run at the All-American Championships, qualifying into the main draw of the prestigious tournament. Returning from a stress fracture in her leg, look for a healthy Lynch to be a mainstay in the top of the lineup this year.

In the mix for time on the middle courts are a trio of juniors in No. 49 **Jieun Jacobs**, **Jody Scheldt** and **Nicole Havlicek** – all capable of playing at courts three through five.

Jacobs spent valuable time at courts two through five last year, splicing together a 12-9 dual match record while leading the team in overall wins with 30. Last season's momentum carried through to this fall, as Jacobs etched out a 9-3 record, claiming

the title of the consolation draw at the All-American Championships in Los Angeles.

A solid middle lineup player last year, Scheldt returns this season after coming off a shoulder injury. Transferring from the University of Iowa in January 2002, she made an immediate impression on the team, completing a 12-8 dual record. A consummate team player, Scheldt should be a constant feature in the middle of the lineup again in 2003.

Havlicek played last season on the No. 5 and No. 6 courts, posting a 9-5 record in dual matches. One of the team leaders, she brings a strong serve and forehand to the table as a crafty problem solver and another powerful all-court player for the Bears.

Vying for the No. 6 spot this season will be sophomores **Carla Arguelles** and **Brooke Borisoff**, and freshman **Jessica Shu**. All three are talented players that should find time in the lower half of the lineup.

Arguelles was a consistent feature in the singles lineup last year, competing in 12 singles matches in her first season with the team. This fall she posted an inspiring 7-3 record in three tournaments, advancing to the quarterfinals at the Saint Mary's Invitational.

Borisoff received a medical redshirt last year after recovering from shoulder surgery. In her first competition as a Golden Bear this fall, she competed in four tournaments and advanced to the Round of 16 at the Northwest Regional Championships.

As the lone member of this year's recruiting class, the freshman out of Lowell High School in San Francisco, Shu brings an impressive resume to the team. The winner of the 2001 National Open Girls' 16's title, Shu was a two-time all-city individual champion on a high school squad that won the city championship four years straight. Her impressive 8-4 fall performance will most likely secure a spot in this season's lineup.

Rounding out the roster and adding a necessary depth to the team are junior **Kristen Case** and sophomore **Rio Del Rosario**. Case, daughter of former tennis professional Ross Case, made a nice contribution last year filling in for injured players, compiling a 3-3 dual match record. Del Rosario is a versatile athlete that will also be competing for playing time this year.

### DOUBLES

Known to have a certain expertise as a doubles specialist, Brogan may have crafted yet another strong doubles lineup in 2003. With nine various combinations last season, the Golden Bear doubles rotation finished the year with an overall dual match record of 38-28. This fall, the head coach tinkered with eight different groupings, but seems to have settled on the top four.

Bolstering the top spot on court No. 1 will be the tandem of Kops-Jones and Fusano. The pair competed in seven matches together last season, finishing with an overall record of 7-0. The two battled through some of the nation's top doubles teams en route to capturing the 2002 Pac-10 doubles championship and a No. 6 national ranking. This fall, the duo defeated three Top 30 doubles teams to advance to the semifinal rounds of both the Northwest Regionals and National Indoor Championships.

Jacobs and Scheldt look to team together on the second court this year. The pair enters the season as the No. 32-ranked duo in the nation after finishing the fall campaign with a 4-1 record. Most notably, Jacobs and Scheldt cruised their way to victory in capturing the Thunderbirds Invitational title in November. Neither player is a stranger to the limelight, as last season Jacobs primarily worked

with Fusano in the No. 2 slot, assembling a 10-8 dual mark. Scheldt predominantly played on court No. 1 with Kops-Jones, collecting a 27-18 overall record and a No. 30 national ranking. The pair also competed for the NCAA doubles championship.

Arguelles and Havlicek will see action in the third spot to open the season, but could be challenged by a teaming of Lynch and Shu. Arguelles and Havlicek seem to have the upper hand after completing a 9-2 fall finish, including the Saint Mary's

Invitational doubles title. Last season Lynch played primarily with Arguelles on the third court, but this fall she upped her doubles stake by advancing to the finals of the Bulldog Classic with Kops-Jones.

"Our team slogan this year is to be fast, tough, lean and mean," said Brogan. "In creating a championship team culture, we have to keep in mind that the whole is greater than the sum of all its parts. If we create this synergistic atmosphere, the wins will follow."

In her 24 years at Cal, Brogan has molded the Golden Bear program into one of the best in the country, guiding the Bears to 21 NCAA appearances, three AIAW showings, including a trip to the finals in 1982, and 17 Top 10 finishes since 1982. Brogan has also produced a trio of national champion doubles teams, 51 All-Americans, 14 first team All-Pac-10 selections and three conference

player of the year honorees during her career. She currently boasts a 447-181 (.711) dual match record, making her the fourth active winningest coach in NCAA history.

Known for developing players mentally, strategically and technically, Brogan implements an applied sports psychology philosophy into her athletes, stressing class peak performance and life skills training. Her holistic educational coaching philosophy has guided the program to a 100 percent graduation rate, a team average GPA of 3.2 while surpassing the 400-win mark in that time. A clinician for both the USTA and the ITA on team building and sport psychology, Brogan has written on the topic for the ITA newsletter and *Prince Sports Science Magazine*.

Although thorough in all aspects of player development, Brogan is known to have expertise as a doubles specialist. She has

coached three NCAA doubles champions during her years with the Golden Bears, including back-to-back championships (1998-99) with the doubles tandem of Amanda Augustus and current assistant coach Amy Jensen.

Brogan herself has received an impressive list of accolades. Her continued dedication to excellence earned her the Wilson/ITA National Coach of the Year award in 1990, in addition to three ITA Northwest Region Coach of the Year honors in 1988, 1991 and 1993. She has also been named conference coach of the year eight times during her career, six consecutive years from 1982-1987 ('82-86 NorPac, '87 Pac-10) and twice more in 1992 and '94 (Pac-10).

A successful teaching professional in Los Gatos before taking Cal's head coaching job in 1978, Brogan has been a member of the ITA Board of Directors, ITA Operating Committee, NCAA Championship Tennis Committee and is the co-chair of the ITA Sport Science Committee. A former USTA junior national coach, Brogan received her first U.S. National team assignment in 1985 and in 1995 as the U.S. women's head coach at the World University Games.

Brogan is a Bay Area native. A graduate of San Jose State University in Physical Education, she completed her teaching credential in 1978. In 1998 she completed a master's degree in sports psychology at John F. Kennedy University. She teaches an applied sports psychology and life skills class for student-athletes at Cal.

A former Cal All-American who won an unprecedented three consecutive NCAA doubles titles, Amy Jensen enters her first year as an assistant coach with the Golden Bears. Previously, she spent two years in the capacity of volunteer assistant coach with the women's tennis program.

The 24-year old Australian native was a three-year letter-winner for the Golden Bears (1996-2000), posting a career record of 105-52 in singles and 94-29 in doubles. She won her doubles titles in 1998, 1999 and 2000, as well as being named a 1997 NCAA Singles All-American.

Before coming to Cal, Jensen was one of Australia's top juniors, earning a No. 15 world doubles ranking in 1996. She competed in both the 1996 Junior Wimbledon and Junior French Open, as well as claiming two European doubles titles with former Cal teammate Anita Kurimay in 1996.

Jensen graduated from Cal in May 2002 with a degree in Integrative Biology. After recently attaining her strength and conditioning certification, Jensen now assists Dini Wong as strength and conditioning specialist with the tennis program.

## BEAR TRAX: A YOUTH TENNIS ADVANTAGE COLLEGE PATHWAYS PROJECT

In October 2000, Youth Tennis Advantage launched a new college-based learning center at U.C. Berkeley to serve children from low-income communities in Oakland. This center offers 40 YTA participants intensive tutoring and advanced tennis training with Cal college students. The objective of this project is to form a link between diverse, low-income communities and higher education campuses to increase the number of Oakland children who go to college.

Tennis instructors and after-school educational staff at four neighborhood-based programs will maintain this link. Laney College will serve as an intermediate site between the neighborhood programs and U.C. Berkeley. Through a partnership with the tennis program at U.C. Berkeley, YTA envisions a pathway from disadvantaged communities to the university campus.

A similar program at Stanford University provides intensive tennis and tutoring to 100 children from East Palo Alto. This program has proven to be a successful model for increasing the number of low-income children of color who attend college. Problem Statement Children from low-income families do not get the academic support they need to perform well on college entrance exams and admissions applications.

Oakland schools have received very low ratings compared to other schools in California. Neighborhood-based programs can provide support and activities that both keep children from getting in trouble and help them in school, but regular exposure to a rich educational environment helps participants understand the value of learning and see the pathway to college. Without these programs, children drift toward negative activities, failure in school and dead-end choices.

### PROGRAM PLAN

YTA will create linkages between its neighborhood program sites that serve low-income children and the university community. Staff at neighborhood sites will select forty children and youth to participate in the university program on a weekly basis during the school year. A linkage coordination team, comprised of both academic and tennis staff, plan and implement programs for outreach to parents and children in Oakland.

Participants are picked up by a U.C. Berkeley bus and taken to the tennis complex at the university campus. Two YTA program staff escort participants on the trip. Participants will arrive at 4:30 p.m. to receive tennis instruction until 6:00 p.m. U.C. Berkeley students will provide academic tutoring until 7:30 when participants will be taken back to Oakland. A partnership with the Men's Tennis Team at U.C. Berkeley anchors the program at the university.

Service learning and student activities programs on campus supply college student tutors.

### OBJECTIVES

1. Increase the awareness among YTA participants of the university, its educational resources and criteria for admission.
2. Provide a supportive environment for participants to improve their study skills and understanding of educational resources.
3. Form mentor relationships between college students and YTA participants.
4. Guide YTA participants to web-based educational resources that they can access from neighborhood learning centers and from home.
5. Develop strong tennis players and strong students who can qualify for athletic and academic scholarships.

Progress reporting will include measures of: The number of nights students do homework, reading level, math level, attitude toward school, grade point average and understanding of college entrance criteria. Over the course of two years, we intend to track actual college entrance data for high school students. Outcome data from younger children will be collected for the reading, math and attitude toward school. This program is part of the network of programs operated by Youth Tennis Advantage. Tennis and academic activities are provided during the school year and summer months to children at six sites in Oakland and San Francisco.
