WOMEN'S 2007 OUTLOOK

NATIONAL, CONFERENCE INDIVIDUAL CHAMPIONS LEAD BEARS INTO 2007

Accomplishing feats like winning individual NCAA Championships and conference championships are the pinnacle for most schools. However, in the case of the 2007 California women's tennis team, the championships it brought home last season were only springboards for more titles this year.

As impressive as it is to win the individual singles titles in the country and the Pac-10, the Golden Bears want a stronger team finish this season. They're looking to strengthen their overall performance in doubles and become one of the elite teams in the nation. Brogan guided Cal to its 25th NCAA tournament appearance a year ago, as the Bears ended the season ranked No. 13 with a record of 17-8 (6-2 in the Pac-10).

"Our outcome goals are to improve our ranking," Brogan said. "With the team that we have, it's possible to return to the top four. It's a programmatic goal to win championships and to strive for excellence. We all felt like we underperformed in the team championships at the end of the year, although the consequences of pretty serious illnesses and injuries had something to do with that. Still, I felt like we should have made it at least another round."

Returning in 2007 is the reigning NCAA singles champion, junior **Susie Babos**, and the 2006 Pac-10 singles champion, senior **Zsuzsanna Fodor**. Fodor, the only senior on this year's squad, was a first-team all-Pac-10

selection in 2006.

Babos and Fodor, both 2006 All-Americans, carried their momentum into last fall with a very impressive campaign in doubles. The duo, who entered the fall ranked No. 2, posted a doubles record of 12-2 and won the ITA Northwest Regional doubles title. Later, the pair won the backdraw in the ITA Indoor Championships.

Doubles wasn't the only area in which Babos excelled in the fall. She added another championship to a collegiate resume that seems to be growing at a rapid pace. Babos captured the singles crown in the All-American Championships in October.

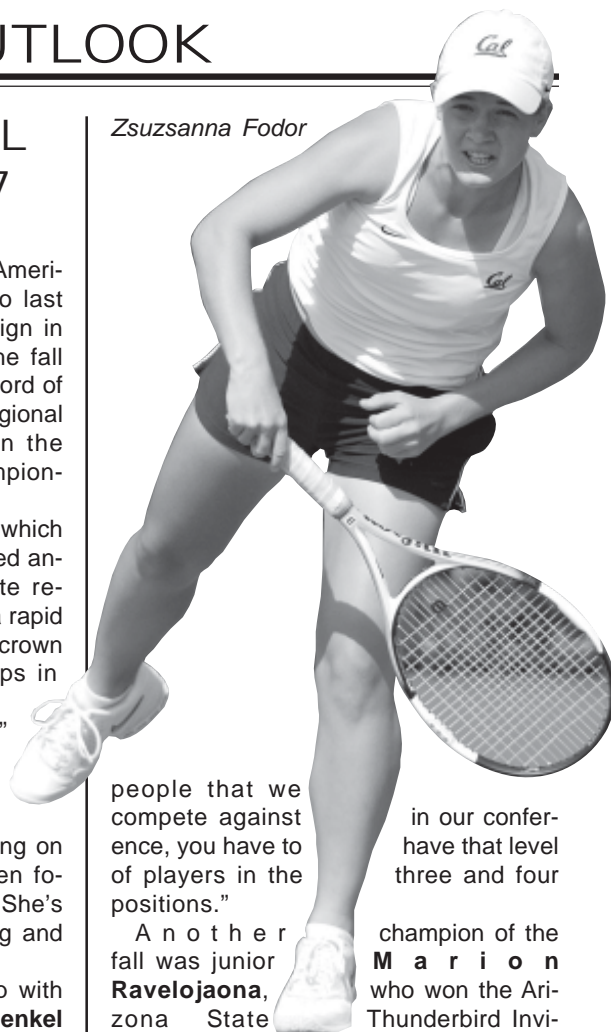
"Babos is more mentally tough," Brogan said. "She added a drop shot to her game and a kick serve. Her serve is one of her weapons, and she's adding to it. She's working on her volleys more. She's really been focusing on improving her doubles. She's more of a factor at the net, serving and volleying."

The accomplishments don't stop with Babos and Fodor. Freshman **Nina Henkel** got her tenure with the Bears off to the right foot when she won the ITA Northwest Regional singles title, beating No. 3 ranked Theresa Logar of Stanford in the semifinals. Henkel was one of the best recruits in the country, and she showed what she can bring to the table last fall. She will no doubt be a huge factor in Cal's success in '07.

Besides posting an 11-4 singles record, Henkel and partner sophomore **Daron Moore** were very successful in doubles. The duo went 9-2 in the fall and won seven of its first eight matches. Henkel and Moore captured the doubles title in the Saint Mary's Invitational as well.

"We've reloaded with Nina Henkel," Brogan said. "Nina's considered pretty close to being the top recruit in the country this

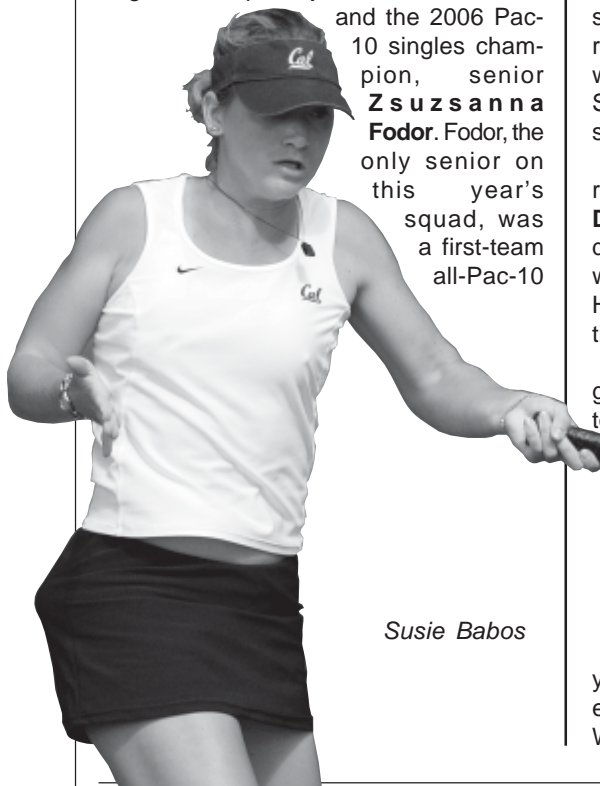


people that we compete against, you have to be one of the players in the positions."

Another champion of the fall was junior **Ravelojaona**, who won the Arizona State Thunderbird Invitational singles draw in November. After Ravelojaona battled with health issues a year ago, Brogan feels that Ravelojaona's game is finally back to where it was when she was ranked No. 35.

Ravelojaona was one of three Bears to finish the fall with a singles record of 9-4, while junior **Cristina Visico** and sophomore **Claire Ilcinkas** were the other two. Visico won her first six matches of the fall. In those six wins, she won one of the singles draws in the Cal Invitational. Ilcinkas won 10 doubles matches in the fall with partners Visico and sophomore **Bojana Bobusic**. Bobusic also won 10 doubles matches this fall and all of her singles victories were two-set wins. Another important member on the roster is junior **Stephanie Kusano**, who finished the fall with an 8-4 record after coming in with a preseason ranking of 60.

"Bojana and Claire as a doubles team are really strong," Brogan said. "Claire hasn't reached her potential yet. She's made some improvements this fall and Bojana's definitely made some improvements this fall. Cristina started slow last fall, but this fall she's really on top of her game. Stephanie has gotten better at playing her game."
