
JAN BROGAN

Head Coach
29th year at Cal



Jan Brogan has molded the Golden Bear program into one of the best in the country, guiding the Bears to 25 NCAA appearances, three AIAW showings, including a trip to

the finals in 1982, and 18 Top 10 finishes since 1982. Last season, Brogan guided Susie Babos to the NCAA singles championship and Zsuzsanna Fodor to the Pac-10 singles title. She has also produced four national champion doubles teams, 58 All-Americans, 17 first-team All-Pac-10 selections and five conference player of the year honorees during her career. The fifth Pac-10 Player of the Year under Brogan was Fodor, who earned the award last season. She currently boasts a 518-213 (.709) dual match record, and notched her 500th career win in 2005 when Cal defeated Mississippi in the first round of the NCAA tournament. Brogan is just the fourth Cal coach to reach the 500

win plateau and the winningest coach in Cal tennis history.

Known for developing players mentally, physically and technically, Brogan implements an applied sports psychology program with her athletes, stressing mental toughness and team culture. Her holistic educational coaching philosophy has guided the program to the highest graduation rate among sports teams at Cal, and one of the highest team GPAs on campus.

Although thorough in all aspects of player development, Brogan is known to have expertise as a doubles specialist. She has coached four NCAA doubles champions during her years with the Golden Bears, including back-to-back championships (1998-99) with the doubles tandem of Amanda Augustus and current associate head coach Amy Jensen and 2002-03 pair of Raquel Kops-Jones and Christina Fusano.

Recently, the Cal program under Brogan has made strides in singles, specifically with the success of Raquel Kops-Jones and Susie Babos. As a singles player in 2004, Kops-Jones spent much of the year ranked No. 1 in the nation, as well as being named Pac-10 Player of the Year and ITA Senior Player of the Year. Babos won the 2006 NCAA singles title and was an All-American last year. She entered the 2005 fall season ranked No. 2 in the nation and was awarded the 2005 Pac-10 Freshman of the Year and ITA Regional Rookie of the Year for the Northwest region.

Another recent success for Brogan was the signing of Nina Henkel. Henkel came to Cal hyped as one of its biggest recruits. This fall, she didn't disappoint, winning the ITA Northwest Regional singles title and defeating No. 3 Theresa Logar of Stanford in the semifinals.

Brogan herself has received an impressive list of accolades. Her dedication to excellence earned her the Wilson/ITA National Coach of the Year award in 1990 and three ITA Northwest Region Coach of the Year honors in 1988, 1991 and 1993. She has also been named conference coach of the year eight times during her career, six consecutive years from 1982-1987 ('82-86 NorPac, '87 Pac-10) and twice more in 1992 and '94 (Pac-10).

A successful teaching professional in Los Gatos before taking Cal's head coaching job in 1978, Brogan has been a member of the ITA Board of Directors, ITA Operating Committee, NCAA Championship Tennis Committee and is the co-chair of the ITA Sport Science Committee. A former USTA junior national coach, Brogan received her first U.S. National team assignment in 1985 and in 1995 as the U.S. women's head coach at the World University Games.

Brogan is a Bay Area native. A graduate of San Jose State University in physical education, she completed her teaching credential in 1978. In 1998 she completed a masters degree in sports psychology at John F. Kennedy University. She teaches an applied sports psychology and life skills class for student-athletes at Cal.

DAMON COUPE

Associate Head Coach
1st Year at Cal



Damon Coupe comes to Berkeley after serving as the women's head coach at Santa Clara (2004-06). Before taking the job with the Broncos, he was the men's assistant head

coach at Fresno State (2002-04) and the interim head coach at his alma mater, Sacramento State (2002). Coupe is ranked among the top three tennis players at Sacramento State, where he played from 1993-1995.

He led Santa Clara to a very successful, record-setting 2004-05 season. Santa Clara finished the campaign with its best record in the history of the program at 16-7, and the squad also was nationally ranked for the first time.

While at Fresno State, the Bulldogs advanced to the 2004 NCAA Tournament, after reaching their highest national ranking of 30. The season before, Fresno State advanced to the round of 32 of the NCAA Tournament. Under Coupe's guidance, the No. 1 doubles team was ranked as high as No. 20 in the country and qualified to play in the NCAA Doubles Championships.

Serving as the men's interim head coach at Sacramento State, Coupe led the Hornets to the 2002 Big Sky Championship and a birth into the 2002 NCAA Tournament. He took over as head coach when Sac State was 5-10, and they ended the season 12-10.

Coupe, a Northern California native from the Sacramento area, currently resides in Los Gatos with his wife Michelle.

CORDELL HO

Volunteer Assistant Coach
10th Year at Cal



Cordell Ho returns to the California women's squad for another season as a volunteer assistant coach. Ho had a four-year hiatus from the team, spending five seasons as

the associate head coach for the men's program, as well as two seasons in a volunteer role with the Bears after stepping down to pursue his classical music career full time.

Ho has held several head pro and tennis director appointments on the East Coast, as well as teaching positions at

the University of Pennsylvania and the University of Washington. He has also had a long-time association with men's head coach Peter Wright, whom Ho coached both as a junior and as a professional on the men's tennis tour.

Born and raised in San Francisco, Ho began playing tennis competitively in Northern California junior tournaments and played collegiate tennis at the University of Oregon, before moving to Vienna, Austria, to continue his music studies.

An active composer of symphonic and chamber music, Ho has written film scores, theater pieces and opera. His music has been performed in the United States, Europe and Asia and he has lectured on music at UC Davis, Columbia University and the University of Washington.

Ho, a Cal graduate, (M.A. '75, B.A. '72), and his wife, Michele (B.A. Cal '79), live in Berkeley with their two daughters, Ally and Xin Xin.
