MEN'S 2007 SEASON OUTLOOK

FALL '06 SUCCESS SPRINGBOARDS BEARS INTO 2007 CAMPAIGN

The key to success in 2007 for the California men's tennis team will be its veteran leadership. This season, the elite squad embarks on a journey that leads to the NCAA Championships. They are armed with a core group of seniors, returning talented players, and a few new players who will each play a vital role. It will take a total team effort for Cal to get to where it wants to be.

"We have a really tough schedule this year," head coach Peter Wright said. "There's always an overarching goal to be one of the top-10 teams in the country. Beyond that, if we're doing the right things to get us there, and if we continue to do those things, we won't be concerned about the results."

According to Wright, it's a process easier said than done, but he thinks he has more than enough gifted athletes on this year's team to

accomplish that goal. The veteran leadership will come from seniors **Tyler Browne**, **Daniel Sebescen** and **John Pettit**. Browne missed nearly all of the fall season after getting injured in the opening tournament. Still, Browne looks to come back better than ever for his final season as a Bear.

Daniel Sebescen

"Given the type of competitor that Tyler is, and the quality of game that he has, he'll bounce back in the spring," Wright said. "He's really excited about being able to play again. That's a good thing for our whole team. Tyler's an incredibly gifted athlete and very experienced."

Sebescen already has a tournament victory under his belt this fall, as him and partner junior **Pierre Mouillon** won the Wilson/ITA Northwest Regional doubles tournament in October.

"Sebescen was very solid and had a good fall," Wright said. "In the spring, he's going to be one of the guys we're counting on for his experience and his competitiveness to come through. He's a very intelligent player and he fights."

In addition to his doubles title with Sebescen, Mouillon had a very strong fall. His 12 wins during the fall campaign were a team high. He also advanced to the semifinals of the singles draw in the ITA Northwest Regional.

"Pierre had a great fall in terms of his consistency and his results all the way through," Wright said. "Pierre has been traditionally a strong singles player. This fall he made a big jump in his doubles play."

Mouillon is one of five new members to the '07 team. The other four new additions are sophomores **Geoff Chizever** and **Carsten Thorstensen** and freshmen **Kallim Stewart** and **Andy Chirita**. Stewart came on strong at the end of the fall, advancing to the quarterfinals in his last two tournaments.

"Kallim Stewart had a wonderful finish to his fall," Wright said. "He was a little rusty coming into school. Towards the end of the fall, he really showed why he's one of the top players in the U.S. He'll be very exciting to watch this spring. In doubles, he's one of the guys who can excel, and we'll continue to work with him on that element of his game. He's got all the shots and he possesses tremendous mental strength."

Thorstensen and sophomore **Nicolai Horgen** captured the doubles title in the Santa Clara Bronco Classic and finished the fall with a record of 5-1.

"Nicolai Horgen made tremendous strides this fall," Wright said. "He improved as much as I've seen anyone improve in that amount of time."

Chizever, a transfer from Colorado, excelled in doubles during the fall, finishing with a record of 5-2 with Pettit.

"Geoff Chizever is a wonderful addition to the team in terms of attitude, and he's been working incredibly hard," Wright said. "He's done well in doubles, but also is poised to make some big moves in singles as well. As we move forward, he certainly figures to be a force in doubles and, in the not too distant future, in singles as well."

Rounding out the depth and experience on the roster are four returners, juniors **Vaclav Burger** and **Ken Nakahara** and sophomore **Eoin Heavey**. Nakahara's fall singles record of 6-4 was the third best on the team, including two, two-set wins in the ITA Northwest Regional.

"Ken Nakahara is one of the toughest competitors you'll ever meet," Wright said. "Eoin Heavey has recovered from his injuries and he should feature prominently this year."

The Bears took a big hit when they lost last season's ITA Senior Player of the Year and Pac-10 Player of the Year, Conor Niland, but Wright thinks this year's team will develop its own identity and they will make up for Niland's absence together.

"This year's team has great depth and a hard-working mentality," Wright said.
