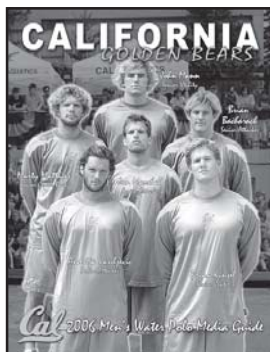

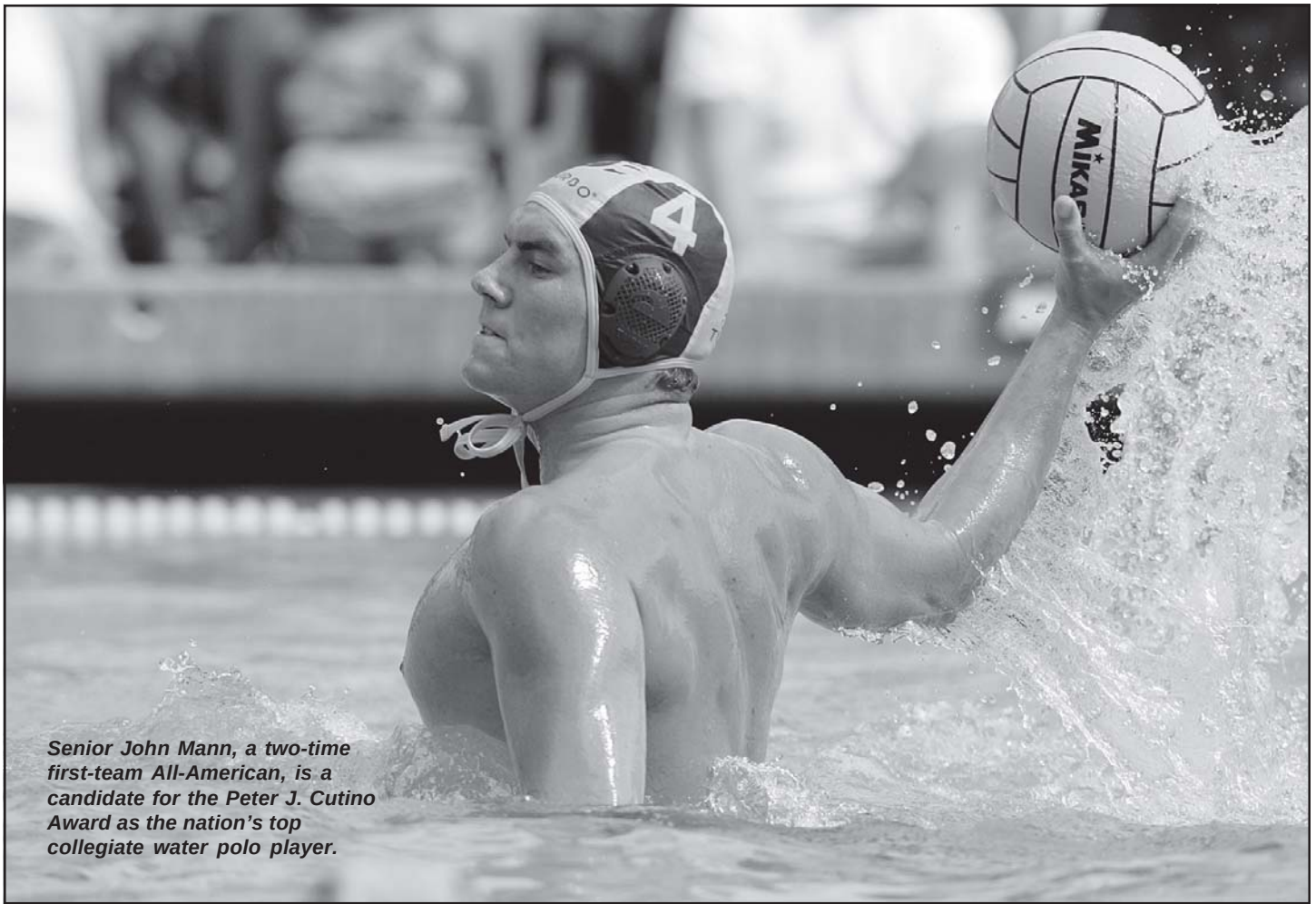

GOLDEN BEARS IN MIDST OF 2006 NATIONAL TITLE CHASE

Imagine having a team with so much talent that a coach couldn't possibly give everyone enough playing time, but that is exactly the predicament for California men's water polo coach **Kirk Everist**. That is a good problem, but what is more of a challenge for Everist is to figure out how to lead his top-ranked Golden Bears to the 2006 NCAA Men's Water Polo crown.

"I really think we have what it takes to get over the hump this season and win a national championship," said Everist, whose crew finished third in the nation last year after narrowly missing the four-team NCAA Tournament when they fell to eventual national champion USC, 10-8, in the Mountain Pacific Sports Federation semifinal. "We have an extremely experienced group that has been playing together for a long time. They are ready to take the next step and everyone is excited. It is a good mix of seniors and younger players who are ready to push the veterans."

So, all indicators point towards a successful season for Everist's squad, but as the case year-in and year-out, there

is little room for error. Only two teams from the nation's best water polo conference, the MPSF, make it to the NCAAs; in order

to be assured of a spot a team needs to be either No. 1-ranked or win the MPSF Tournament. Still, with a veteran cast, Cal

should be in a strong position to make a run for the program's 12th NCAA title, featuring returning All-America standouts **John Mann, Michael Sharf, Marty Matthies** and **Andrija Vasiljevic**. The Bears also showcase seniors **Brian Kinsel** and **Brian Bacharach**, who enter their final campaign with 96 and 95 career goals, respectively.

A candidate for the Peter J. Cutino Award as the nation's top collegiate player, senior captain Mann is a two-time first-team All-American and All-MPSF selection, and was a member of the 2005 MPSF All-Tournament team. He is Cal's top returning scorer with 56 goals last season and notched 138 goals in his first three years as a Bear. If the 6-4, 240-pound Mann could garner the Pete Cutino Award, he would be the first Bear to win the prestigious award named after the beloved Cal coaching legend who won eight national titles.

Junior attacker Sharf was a third-team All-American as a sophomore in 2005 and was second on the team in scoring last season with 31 goals. An outstanding shooter and all-around player, Sharf and Mann both competed with the United States National Team this past summer and are potential 2008 Olympians.

Senior center back Matthies is a two-time honorable mention All-American and was second-team All-MPSF in 2005. He is considered the team's top all-around player and defender, and according to Everist, is the type of athlete who does all the little things that helps a team win.



Junior Michael Sharf was a third-team All-American last year after tallying 31 goals for the Bears.

Senior attacker Vasiljevic is another Bear stalwart who has been a key contributor since his freshman year. The talented left-hander was an honorable mention All-American in 2004, was a second-team All-MPSF pick in 2005, and has tallied 104 career goals entering the year.

The 6-5, 235-pound Kinsel and the 6-3, 200-pound Bacharach provide additional problems for Cal opponents as the seniors

are strong both offensively and defensively. They have been major contributors since 2003.

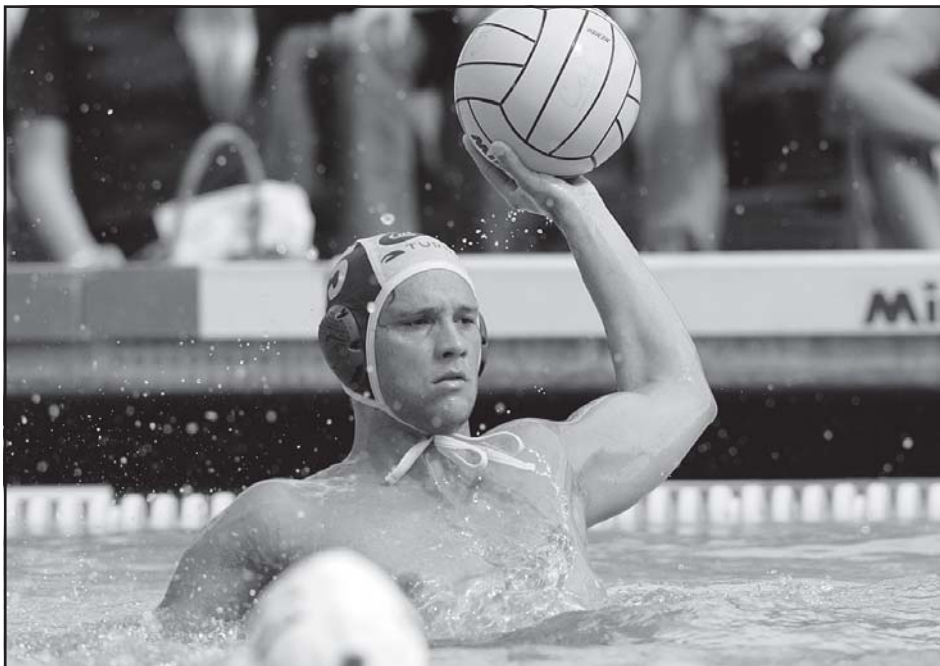
The Bears' wave of talent continues. The junior class of **Adam Haley, Mike Hayes, Kevin Platshon, Jeff Tyrrell** and **Zac Monsees** feature strong scorers and strong defenders. Two more returnees who will be in the playing rotation are junior utility man **Cameron Jones** and sophomore center **Trent Calder**, a talented young performer, both offensively and defensively, at the center position.

Senior Andrija Vasiljevic, from Belgrade, Serbia, has been a four-year starter for the Bears and enters the season with 104 goals.

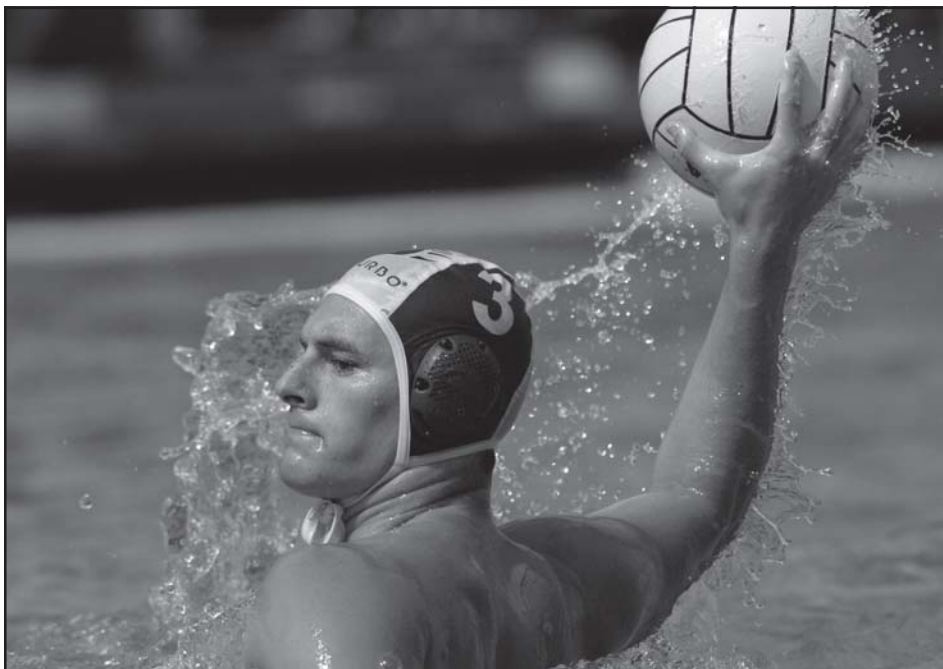
Senior center (below) Brian Kinsel has been a powerful force in the middle for Cal, producing 96 goals in three seasons.

Even with the abundance of talent, the Cal coaching staff is also excited about their 2006 newcomers. A top newcomer for the Bears will be redshirt freshman **Spencer Warden**, a fine all-around player who was a member of the USA Junior National Team after starring at Soquel High School. Another key addition will be sophomore attacker **Frank Reynolds**, who played at USC in 2004 and is an experienced athlete. American River junior college transfer **Kenny Waldthaler**, a 6-4 utility man, and redshirt freshmen **Scott Cruikshank** and **Mike Sample**, should also step in and contribute.

The one question mark for the Bears entering this season is the goalie position, as Cal has to replace All-American and national team player **Nate Bennett**. But, Everist is confident in his two top candidates, sophomore **Marc Vacquier**, who recorded 17 saves in six matches last season, and 6-6 junior college transfer **Mark Sheredy**, who redshirted in 2005 after an All-American career at West Valley Junior College.

"We are obviously excited for this season," said Everist, who knows what it takes to win the NCAA title after leading the Bears to national crowns in 1987 and 1988 as a player. "We are solid defensively at two-meters, and on the perimeter. We are also real athletic offensively. The guys are in a good frame of mind and are looking towards what they can accomplish this season."

Senior Brian Bacharach, a two-year team captain, has tallied 95 career goals and was named the team's top Scholar-Athlete.

THE COACHING STAFF

KIRK EVERIST

Head Coach • Fifth Year



As the head coach of the University of California men's water polo program, Kirk Everist is the perfect person to continue the tradition of excellence that defines the Golden Bears. A former three-time All-American, NCAA Player of the Year and two-time United States Olympian, Everist earned 2002 Mountain Pacific Sports Federation Coach of the Year honors in his inaugural season, and most recently was inducted into both the 2004 Cal Athletic Hall of Fame and the USA Water Polo Hall of Fame.

On July 29, 2002 Everist, 39, returned to his alma mater and immediately led Cal to a 20-7 mark and the Bears' first MPSF title and national runner-up finish since 1995. Now after solid 20-win seasons in 2003, 2004 and 2005, including a Big Splash victory over Stanford and an upset of defending national champion UCLA last year, Everist and his troops are looking to vie for the program's 12th NCAA title in 2006.

Before returning to Berkeley, Everist had contributed to eight CIF North Coast championships as an assistant at Miramonte High School. During Everist's 11-year tenure there, the school also produced nine league titles and three third-place finishes in the California State Tournament. He helped develop 22 high school All-Americans, and three of his former players went on to earn NCAA All-American recognition, while two ex-pupils have played on NCAA championship teams.

In addition to his work at Miramonte, Everist served as water polo commissioner at San Francisco's Olympic Club from 1999-2001, a period that produced a gold medal and two silver medals in FINA World Masters competition. Also, since 2000 he has been co-head coach for the Lamorinda water polo team, leading that club to the 2001, 2004 and 2005 USA Water Polo 20-Under national championships, and the 2002 Northern California Zone Junior Olympic title. In January of 2005, Everist added to his duties the position of treasurer of the College Water Polo Coaches Association.

A 1990 Cal graduate, Everist propelled the Bears to national championships in 1987 and 1988. He earned NCAA All-American status from 1986-88 and was named the NCAA National Player of the Year in 1988. Everist went on to play for the United States National Team for nine years (1988-96) and was a member of the USA Olympic Team in the 1992 Barcelona and 1996 Atlanta Games. He also competed on America's

gold medal winning water polo teams at the 1991 World University Games and 1995 Pan American Games.

"Kirk has been an Olympian and an All-American, but I believe he is now a better coach than he was as a player," said four-time NCAA Coach of the Year Pete Cutino, Everist's former Cal mentor who passed away in September of 2004. "He is a very intense person who has always been a student of the game. Kirk is everything we would want in a coach."

Everist lives in nearby Pleasant Hill with his wife, Kim.

BOYD LACHANCE

Associate Head Coach



Boyd Lachance was promoted to associate head coach for the Cal men's water polo team on July 18, 2003 after playing a key role in the Bears winning the MPSF title and advancing to the NCAA title match in his first year as an assistant in 2002.

Lachance, 34, came to Cal after an outstanding water polo career at Pacific in the early '90s and seven years of coaching club, high school and junior college water polo. As a two-year starter for the Tigers (1992-93), he was Pacific's second leading scorer in 1992, finishing his career with a scoring average of 1.09 goals per game. In addition, Lachance was a member of the only Tiger water polo team in school history to reach the NCAA tournament, achieving a No. 5 national ranking in 1993.

Transferring his skills from the pool to the pool deck, Lachance has coached in the national and international scene. He was an assistant coach with the National Cadet Team in Yugoslavia in 2002 and was head coach of the Pacific Zone Division II Premier League team that won the 2004 national championship. Lachance was also co-head coach at Campolindo High School from 1999-2000 and an associate head coach at Diablo Valley College in 2001.

Lachance has been part of eight national championships (five 20-under, two Premier League, one 18-under) in his coaching tenure, while developing 65 USWP All-Americans, six high school All-Americans and three community college All-Americans along the way.

In addition to his coaching duties at Cal, Lachance is the club director of Lamorinda Water Polo, which he founded in 1999.

Lachance received a degree in sociology from Pacific in 1994. He resides in West Sacramento with his wife, Gretchen, and son, Carson, born July 7, 2004.

SEAN NOLAN

Assistant Coach

Former Golden Bear goalie (1991-94) and 2000 Olympian Sean Nolan, 34, is in his second season as an assistant coach at Cal.



Nolan joins the Bears' coaching staff after a successful national and international water polo career. A member of the USA Senior National Team from 1994-2000, he competed in the 2000 Sydney Olympics, helping the United States

to sixth place finish along with other former Cal stars Gavin Arroyo, Chris Humbert and Chris Oeding. Nolan was also on Team USA's gold medal-winning squad at the 1993 World University Games in Buffalo, NY; was named Goalie of the Tournament at the 1997 Unicon Cup in Budapest, Hungary; and helped the United States to a gold medal at the 1999 PanAm Games in Winnipeg, Ontario, Canada. He played professionally in Greece for the club team, Naok, in the town of Corfu from 1996-97.

A three-time All-American (1992, 1993, 1994) at Cal, Nolan graduated in 1995 with a degree in political economies of industrial societies. He led the Bears to NCAA titles in 1991 and 1992, including making two match-saving blocks at the end of regulation in the '92 title match against Stanford. The 1992 NCAA championship match is considered by many to be the greatest title match in NCAA water polo history as Cal went on to win 12-11 in sudden death overtime to finish with a perfect 31-0 season record. Nolan was the recipient of the Peter J. Cutino Water Polo Trophy in 1992 as the team's most improved player, and was the team's Most Valuable Player in 1994.

BRIAN SCHULMAN

Trainer



Brian Schulman is in his third season as the head athletic trainer for the California men's water polo program. Schulman, 27, has extensive experience in athletic training, having worked for the San Francisco 49ers, at

Fresno State and UC Santa Barbara, and for the Los Angeles Dodgers. He is also the athletic trainer for the Golden Bears' baseball program.

Prior to joining Cal in March of 2004, Schulman was an intern assistant athletic trainer for the San Francisco 49ers in 2003-04. He came to the 49ers from Fresno State, where he worked with the football and baseball programs while earning his masters' degree in exercise physiology. As an undergraduate at UC Santa Barbara, Schulman was a student athletic trainer for the baseball, men's basketball and men's soccer programs. He graduated from UCSB in 2001 with degrees in political science, and health and exercise science. Schulman had an internship with the Los Angeles Dodgers in the summer of 2000 and is also a certified strength and conditioning specialist.

A native of Encino, Calif., Schulman and his wife, Megan, reside in Dublin.
