**G**eraedts, a member of the Dutch National team, begins her fourth year at Cal after gaining valuable experience over the last three seasons...spent the summer of 2006 playing for the Dutch National team and will benefit from playing against international competition...can play power forward and center...has a good touch out to about 15 feet...quick learner who has a great work ethic...a finesse player with excellent fundamentals...talented passer out of the post.

**AS A JUNIOR IN 2005-06:**

Saw limited action as a junior...played in seven games...saw a season-high 15 minutes of playing time in Cal's win over Columbia, posting four points and two rebounds...competed for 10 minutes in the victory over South Carolina State, grabbing one rebound and dishing off an assist...corralled two boards in the road win over San Jose State...swatted her only block of the season and sixth of her career at Arizona...averaged 0.6

points and 0.9 rebounds per game...made her only two free throws of the year vs. Columbia.

**AS A SOPHOMORE IN 2004-05:**

Played in 13 games, averaging 2.8 points and 1.1 rebounds per game, which about doubled the output of her rookie season...converted 53.1 percent of her field goals...posted a career-high 10 points at Washington Jan. 29 in a career-best 20 minutes of playing time...added a career-high five rebounds in Cal's win over Tennessee Tech...played at least 10 minutes in four games...missed the last four games of the season with plantar fasciitis.

**AS A FRESHMAN IN 2003-04:**

Saw action in 26 games as a reserve...averaged 1.5 points and 0.5 rebounds per game...contributed four blocks and two steals...shot 41.7 percent from the floor...her best outings came at home against both UCLA

(eight points, three rebounds) and Oregon (seven points, one rebound)...had a then-career-high three boards in Cal's win over Lehigh...played a then-career-high 19 minutes in Cal's Pac-10 season-opening win over No. 22 Oregon Dec. 27...saw action in 17 minutes against UCLA Feb. 19.

**L**evy enters her senior season at California after being selected the 2006 Cal Most Improved Player...one of the Bears' most athletic players...talented shooting guard with great potential...has worked hard in the weight room to improve her strength and stamina...can take people on off the dribble and demonstrates three-point range...has shown great improvement as a perimeter defender after only playing zone defense in high school...may step up as a defensive stopper this year...played in the 2006 San Francisco ProCity Summer League.

### AS A JUNIOR IN 2005-06:

Levy saw action in 11 games, including a career-high 29 minutes against St. John's in the NCAA Tournament...posted eight points, one rebound and one assist against the Red Storm, hitting 2-of-3 field goals, 1-of-1 treys and 3-of-4 free throws...selected the team's Most Improved Player...saw action in 16 minutes in wins over Columbia and

South Carolina State...posted a season-high nine points, a career-high eight rebounds and a steal vs. Columbia...hit her other three-pointer of the season against Columbia...added three rebounds, two steals and an assist vs. South Carolina State...tallied two points, one assist and one steal in the season-opening victory over Eastern Washington...recorded a basket against No. 5 Baylor...grabbed two boards in a win at San Jose State...scored at Oregon and Oregon State and in the Bears' 81-58 triumph over Washington in the regular-season finale...dished off an assist in eight minutes of action at Arizona...averaged career bests of 2.4 points and 1.4 rebounds per game...hit a career-high 47.6 percent from the floor.

### AS A SOPHOMORE IN 2004-05:

Saw action in 27 games...minutes increased from her freshman year to 8.9 mpg...contributed 1.5 points and 1.1 rebounds per game...converted all six of her free throw attempts...posted a career-high 10 points vs. USC Jan. 20...equaled her career high of three assists at Arizona State Jan.

**G**ray-Lawson, the 2005-06 Pac-10 Freshman of the Year, enters her second season at Cal after an outstanding rookie year...finalist for a spot on the 2006 USA Under-20 National team...had to withdraw from USA Basketball consideration due to a knee injury she sustained during the 2006 San Francisco ProCity Summer League...expected to be at full strength to start the season...an iron woman on the court...physical, athletic point guard and shooting guard...shows unbelievable ball-handling ability...takes excellent care of the ball...possesses a great shooting touch...shows incredible skills with her right and left hand...her strength allows her to post up other guards.

### AS A FRESHMAN IN 2005-06:

Became the first Cal player to be named Pac-10 Freshman of the Year...joined teammate Devanei Hampton on the Women's Basketball News Service All-Freshman team...selected to the Pac-10 All-Freshman team and received honorable mention all-conference...joined Ashley

Walker as the only two Cal players to start all 30 contests, which was tied for sixth for starts among all freshmen in the country...ranked second on the team in scoring (14.6 ppg, ninth Pac-10), first in assists (2.7 apg), first in three-pointers made (42, ninth in Cal history in a season) first in three-point percentage (38.9, fifth in Pac-10 and seventh in Cal history) and fourth in rebounding (3.9 rpg)...during the conference season, Gray-Lawson contributed 16.2 points per game (sixth in the Pac-10)...posted a career-high 30 points in the loss at No. 14 Stanford Jan. 14...tied for second on the team with 23 double-figure scoring games to her credit, including seven games with at least 20 points (tied for ninth nationally among all freshmen)...notched 21 points and a career-high seven boards vs. No. 5 Baylor...contributed 22 points and five rebounds in a home triumph over USC, completing the Bears' first sweep over UCLA and USC since 2000-01 and first in Berkeley since 1992-93...led Cal in scoring 10 times, including a game-high 23 points in a 66-64 win over No. 13 Arizona State and with 19 in a victory at No. 23 USC...tallied 17 points and four rebounds

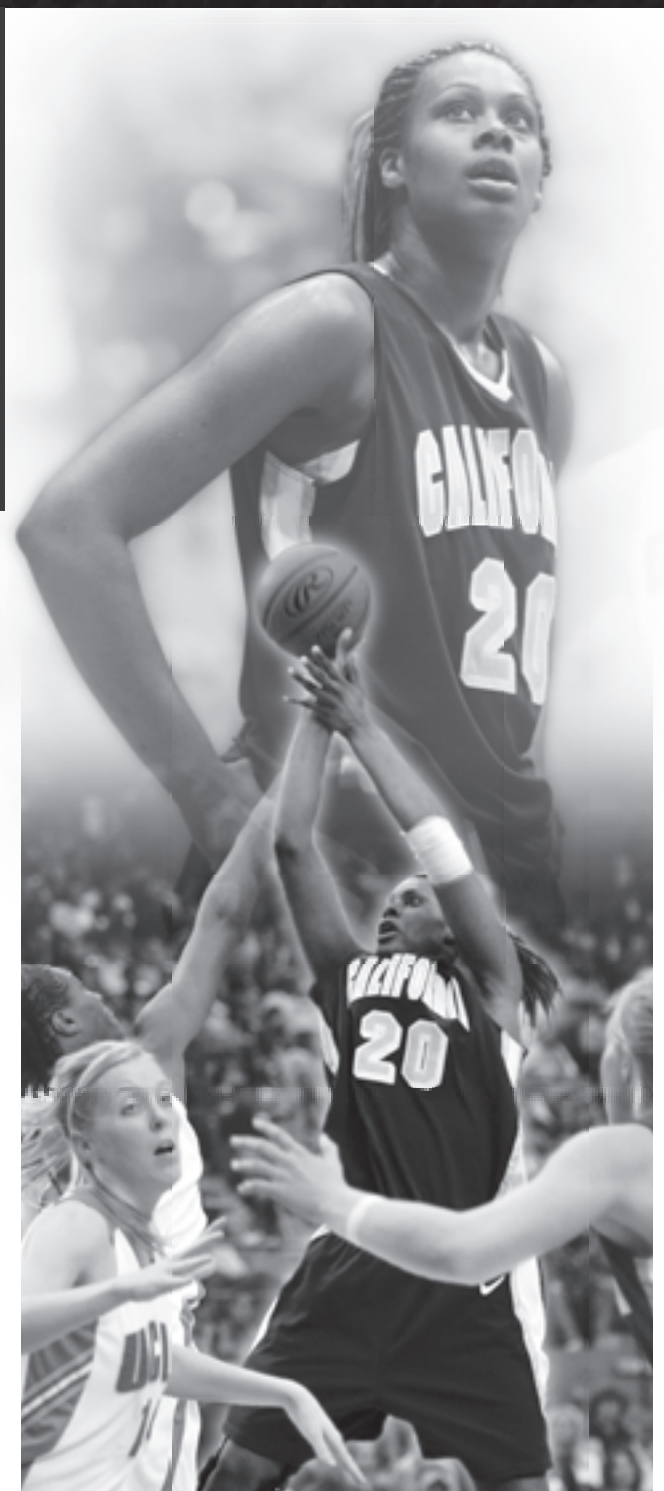

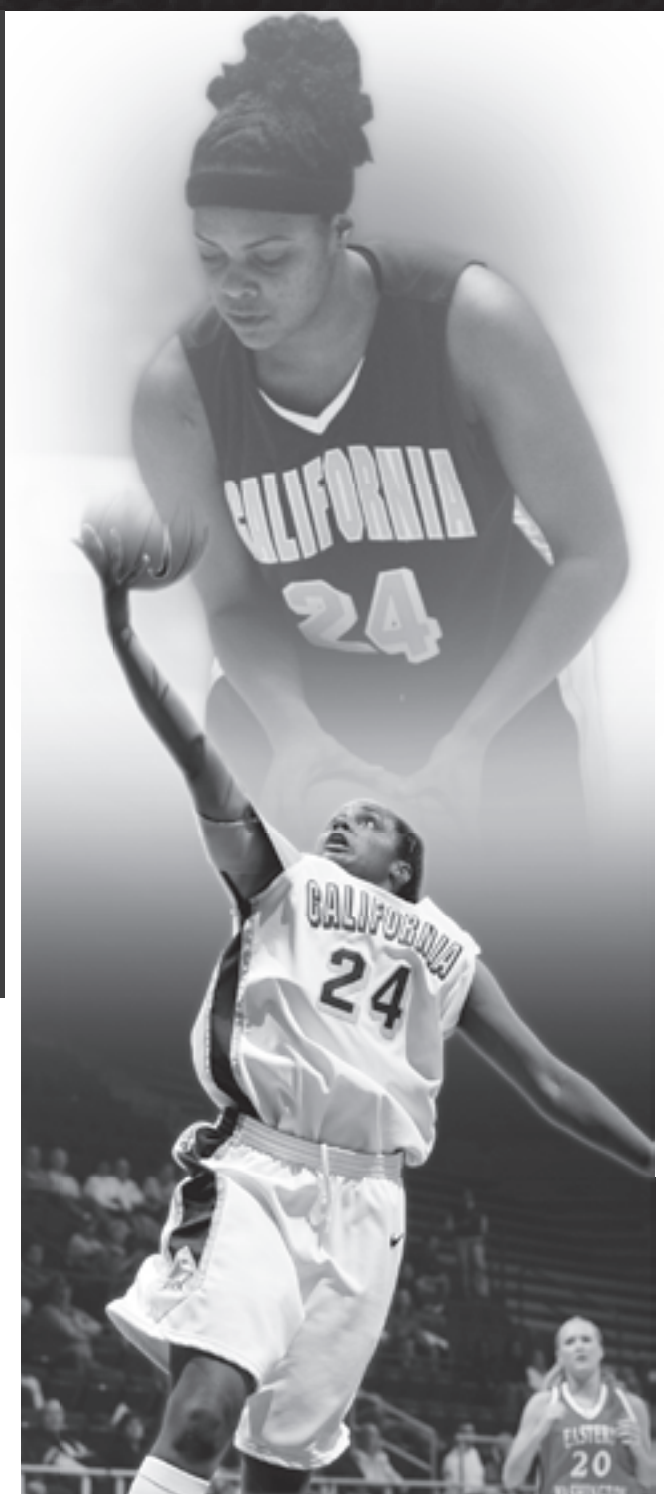

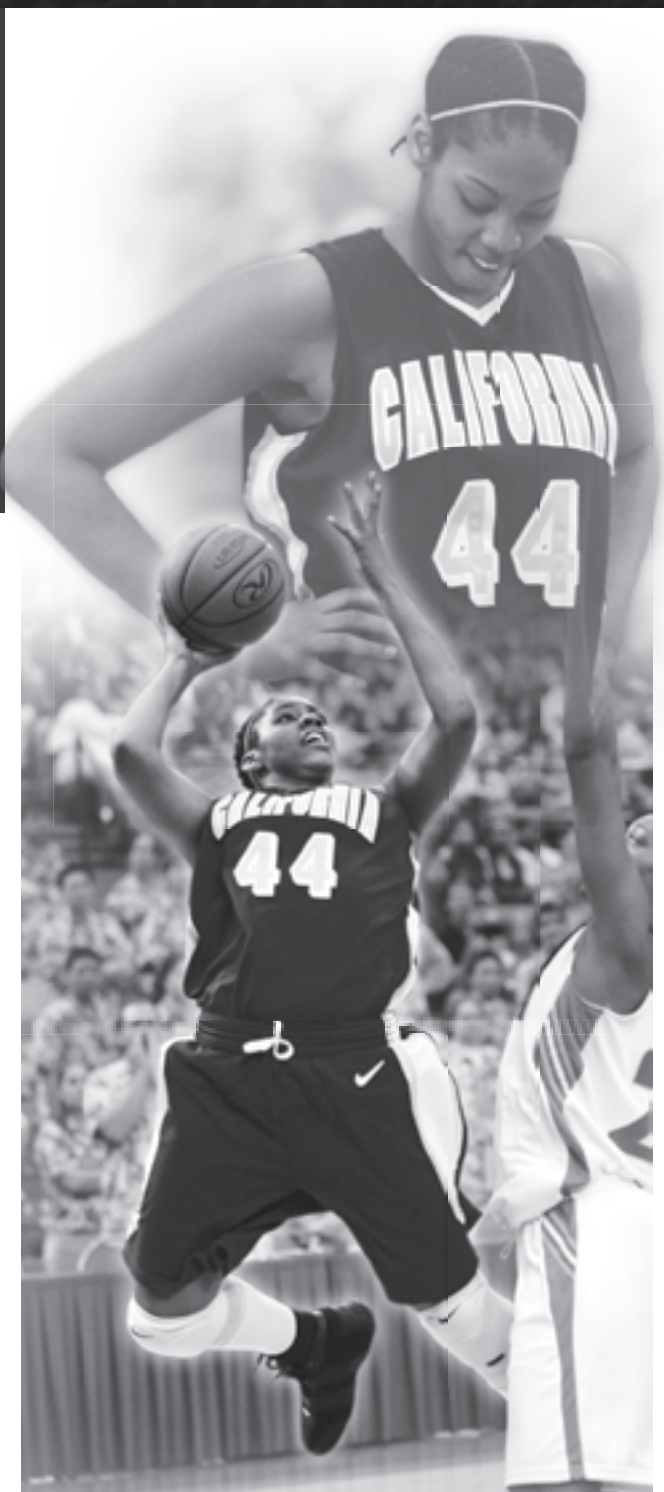
