2005-06 CAL NOTES

THE RECORDS

California finished the 2005-06 campaign with an 18-12 overall record, marking its first winning season in 13 years. Cal placed sixth in the Pac-10 at 10-8, giving the Golden Bears their first winning record in conference play since the 1992-93 team tied for fourth at 10-8. The Bears posted at least one victory over eight of its nine league opponents, including recording season sweeps over fourth-place USC and 10th-place Washington State and a 65-58 victory over Pac-10 Tournament champion UCLA. For the first time in the five-year history of the Pac-10 Tournament, Cal received a first-round bye as the sixth seed. In 2005-06, the Bears also finished higher than eighth in the league for the first time since tying for sixth in 2000-01. The coaches and media picked Cal to place eighth in the preseason polls last year.

CAL EARNS FIRST NCAA TOURNAMENT BID IN 13 YEARS

Cal received its first NCAA Tournament selection in 13 years last March. The Bears, who earned the 10th seed in the Albuquerque Regional, lost to seventh-seeded St. John's, 78-68, in the first round in State College, Pa. Ashley Walker led Cal with career highs of 21 points and six assists, and Alexis Gray-Lawson and Devanei Hampton chipped in 17 and 16 points, respectively. Cal has now made four trips to the NCAA Tournament, including a program-best second-round showing in 1993.

BEARS POST SECOND-BIGGEST TURNAROUND IN SCHOOL HISTORY

Cal posted seven more wins in 2005-06 than it had the previous year (11-18 to 18-12), which equals the second-biggest jump in program history. The biggest was nine wins from 1975-76 (6-12) to 1976-77 (15-7). From 1982-83 (17-12) to 1983-84 (24-8), Cal also had seven more wins. BEARS BEAT FIRST RANKED FOES SINCE 2003

The win over No. 13/15 Arizona State Jan. 19 marked Cal's first over a team ranked in the Associated Press Top 25 poll since an 80-75 triumph over No. 9 Colorado State Dec. 21, 1998, in the championship game of the Oakland Tribune Classic. The Sun Devils entered the game ranked No. 15 in the AP poll and No. 13 in the ESPN-USA Today-WBCA poll. Cal's last win over a team ranked in the coaches' poll was Dec. 27, 2003 (61-57 over No. 22 Oregon). Nine days after the ASU win, Cal defeated No. 23/25 (AP/coaches) USC, 72-67, in Los Angeles. Cal received as many as 11 votes in the AP poll (1/30) and one in the coaches poll (1/3) last season.

FOUR CAL FRESHMEN EARN PAC-10 HONORS

Cal guard Alexis Gray-Lawson became the first Golden Bear to receive the Pac-10 Fresh-

man of the Year award, and freshman center Devanei Hampton was one of 10 players – the 10th ever freshman – selected to the All-Pac-10 team. Forward/center Ashley Walker joined Gray-Lawson and Hampton on the Pac-10 All-Freshman squad, giving Cal the distinction of being the first school to ever land three players on the five-member rookie honor team. Former Bears guard Jené Morris garnered honorable mention Pac-10 All-Freshman. Gray-Lawson also was tabbed an honorable mention All-Pac-10 pick. Led by Hampton's 15.4 ppg, those four rookies led Cal in scoring last season. The Bears were likely the only team in the country to start four freshmen for the majority of the season.



TWO DEFENSIVE RECORDS FALL

Cal set school records for scoring defense and field goal percentage defense last season. The Bears ranked second in the Pac-10 in scoring defense (60.4 ppg) and third in field goal percentage defense (37.8), breaking the previous school records of 63.2 ppg (2001-02) and 40.2% (1978-79). The team showed dramatic improvement from 2004-05 when opponents averaged 71.3 ppg (10th Pac-10) and shot 44.4 percent

(10th). In 2005-06, Cal was 15-2 when holding opponents under 60 points and 5-0 when holding them under 50 points.

TWO HOME ATTENDANCE RECORDS SET

Cal averaged 1,656 fans last season, surpassing the old Haas and Harmon Gym record of 1,615, set in 2003-04. Last year's average was helped when Cal drew a Haas Pavilion record crowd of 4,859 fans against No. 14 Stanford Feb. 11. The previous facility record of 3,712 was established Jan. 16, 2004, when No. 7 Stanford beat Cal, 63-53. The Feb. 11 crowd fell slightly below the women's basketball record for Harmon Gym – the Bears' home court before Haas opened in 1999 – but is the second-best ever. Harmon's record was 4,908 (82-50, Stanford win vs. Cal, 2/28/97).

OTHER NOTABLES

Devanei Hampton led all Pac-10 rookies in scoring (15.4 ppg) and rebounding (7.9 rpg), and Ashley Walker paced the Pac-10 in blocks (51) and blocks/game (1.70) last season. Her 51 blocks ranks fifth all-time in Cal history. Cal won the *Contra Costa Times* Classic for the second consecutive time, with Hampton earning MVP honors and Reneé Wright being picked to the all-tournament team. Hampton was named the team's Best Offensive Player, while Jené Morris received the Best Defensive Player honor. Cal recorded 20 double-doubles after notching only four the previous year. Four of Cal's starters averaged at least 30 minutes per game. Cal set a new Haas Pavilion Golden Bears' scoring record in a 94-48 triumph over South Carolina State. The Bears' 81-58 victory over Washington signified its biggest margin of victory ever over the Huskies and broke an 11-game losing streak to its Pac-10 rival.
