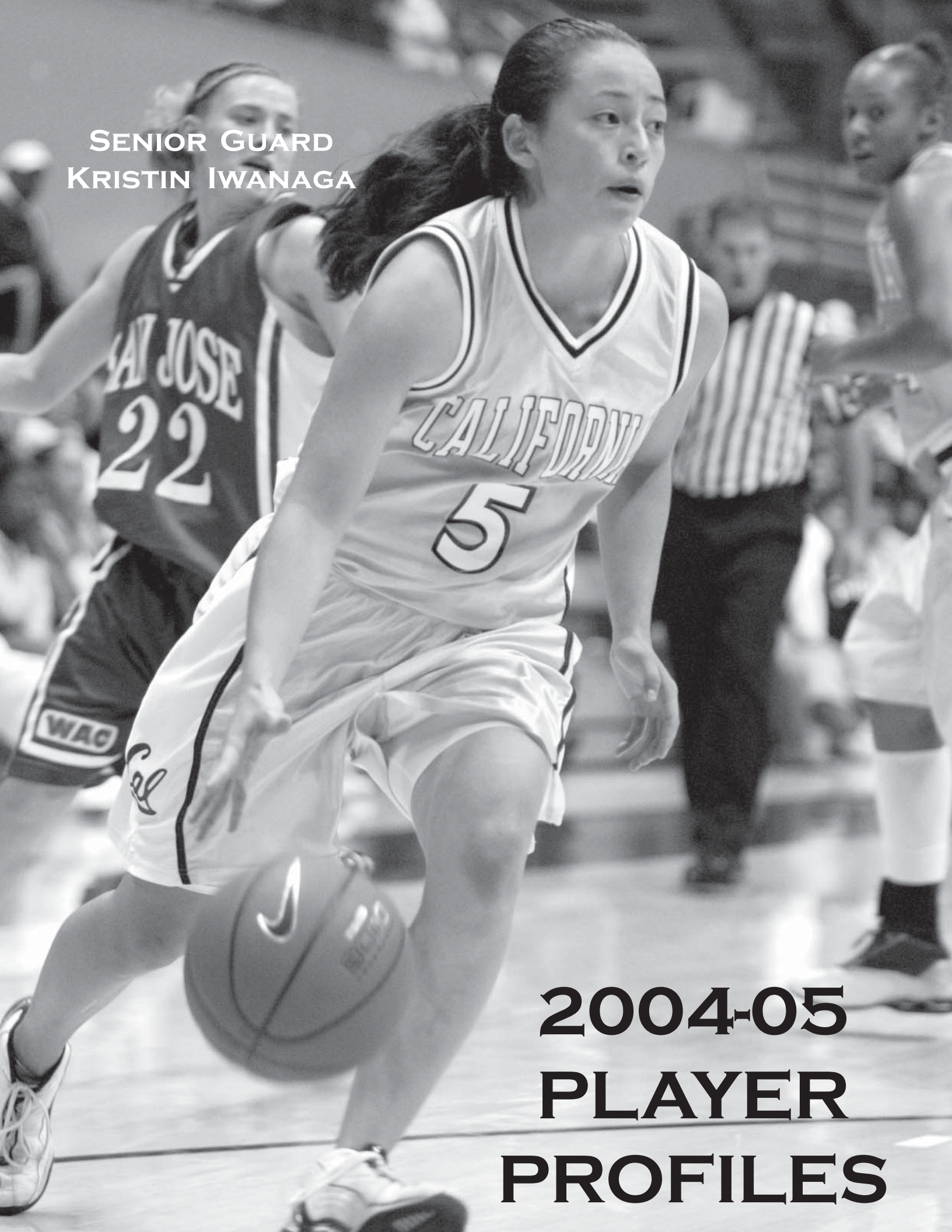

Coakley enters her senior season after showing great development over the last three years...came to Cal as a diamond in the rough with great potential...has shown promise as a rebounder and has developed her offensive footwork...a fast athlete who runs the floor well...one of the team's most athletic players.

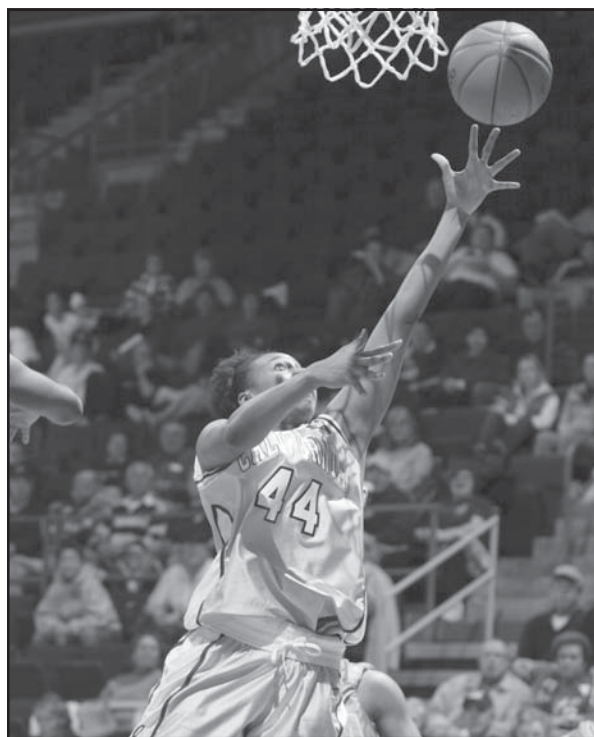
**As a junior in 2003-04:** Played in 15 games, more than both her previous two seasons...displayed an excellent work ethic coming off ACL surgery in March 2003...averaged 1.3 points and 0.7 rebounds per game...shot a career-best 72.7 percent from the free throw line...posted a career-high six points in a season-high 13 minutes of action vs. UCLA Feb. 19...also added one rebound and an assist against the Bruins...had four points, two rebounds and a steal in Cal's Pac-10 Tournament second-round game against Stanford...earned honorable mention Pac-10 All-Academic recognition.

**As a sophomore in 2002-03:** Named the team's Most Improved Player...saw minutes in 14 contests, almost doubling her minutes per game from her freshman (3.6) to sophomore season (7.0)...played double-digit minutes four times, including a career best of 15 minutes at Georgia...tallied four points and three boards in that game against the Bulldogs...showed efficiency on the glass, grabbing 2.1 rebounds per outing, while more than doubling (1.6 ppg from 0.6 ppg) her scoring average from the previous season...top performance of the year came at Oregon State on Jan. 11 when she tallied then-career bests for points (5), rebounds (6) and blocks (2)...corralled at least three rebounds in five contests...injured her knee during the shoot around prior to the Feb. 27 Arizona State game.

**As a freshman in 2001-02:** Participated in 13 games and earned the starting nod at Washington Jan. 17...contributed 0.6 points and 1.4 rebounds per game...snared a then-career-high five rebounds in Cal's home win over Central Connecticut State Dec. 1 and vs. Stanford at home Feb. 2...tied Amber White for team-high rebounding honors in that Stanford game, while playing a then-career-high 11 minutes.

**High School:** As a senior at Kearny High School, contributed approximately 10 points, 12 rebounds, three assists, three steals and five blocks per game...garnered second team all-league and second team all-academic honors...selected an NCAA Top 60 athlete in San Diego...two-time state Defensive Player of the Year...helped her team to three CIF titles...set school game records for rebounds (25) and blocks (11)...participated in a San Diego All-Star tournament...also competed on the volleyball team.

**Personal:** Khadijah Alia Coakley was born May 13, 1984, in Pasadena, CA...parents are Calbert Coakley and Patricia Dean-Coakley...has two siblings, Giselle and Anisa...her cousin, Calvin Bradley, played football at Wisconsin...economics major.

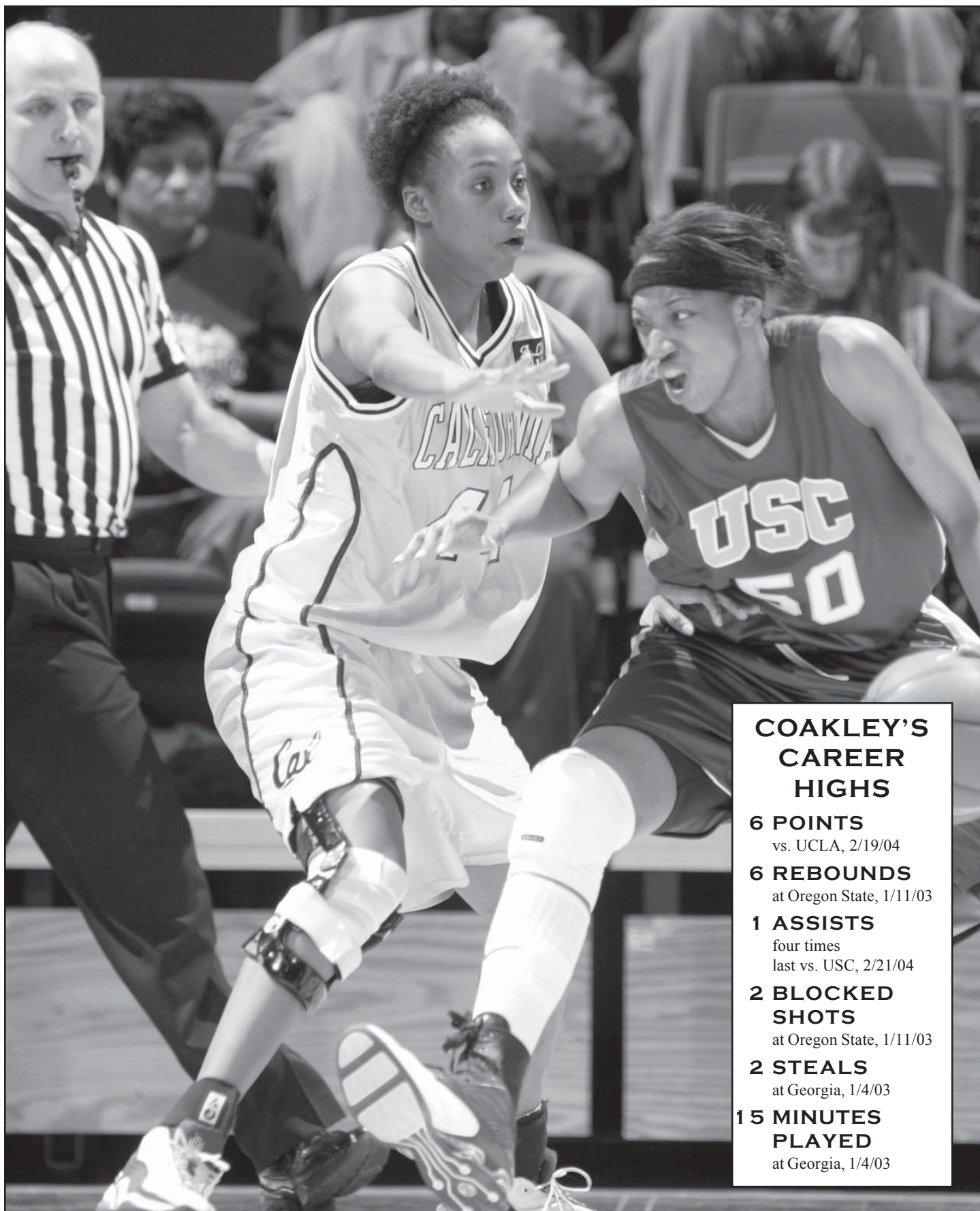

**As a freshman in 2003-04:** Saw action in 26 games as a reserve...averaged 1.5 points and 0.5 rebounds per game...contributed four blocks and two steals...shot 41.7 percent from the floor...her best outings came at home against both UCLA (eight points, three rebounds) and Oregon (seven points, one rebound and two blocks)...also had a career-high three boards in Cal's win over Lehigh Nov. 28...played a career-high 19 minutes in Cal's Pac-10 season-opening win over No. 22 Oregon Dec. 27...saw action in 17 minutes against UCLA Feb. 19.

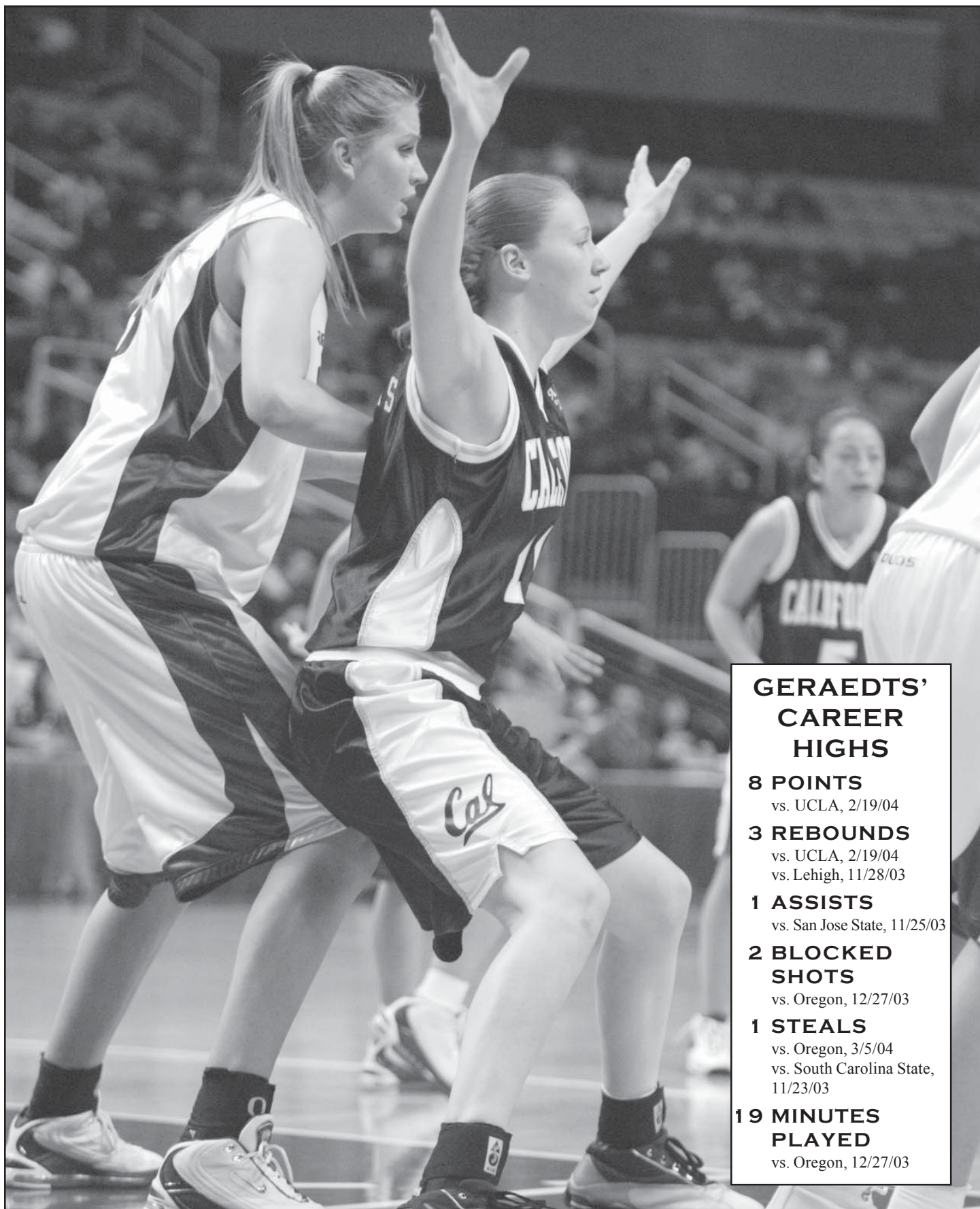

Gregory enters her senior season as a three-year starter at power forward...tri-captain...looks to become Cal's 17th 1,000-point scorer...led the 2004 San Francisco Bay Area Pro-Am in scoring (22.5 ppg)...one of the Pac-10's hardest workers and a go-to player for Cal...smart, agile player who runs the floor well...shown improvement as a perimeter and post defender...received the 2004 Walter A. Haas Jr., Award for Community Service.

**As a junior in 2003-04:** Started all 29 games and hasn't missed a start since her freshman year...tri-captain...finished second on the team in scoring with a career-best 11.5 ppg average...led the Bears in rebounding at 4.9 rpg...averaged a career-high 1.8 apg (52 total)...contributed a career-high 1.5 spg...had 43 total steals (2nd on the team)...led Cal and ranked fifth among Pac-10 FG shooters (51.0)...sank a career-best 74.1% from the foul line, with a team high for makes (83) and attempts (112)...set career highs for rebounds (11, vs. Oregon and Oregon State) and steals (5, vs. South Carolina State/Nevada)...three times tallied a season-high 18 points - vs. San Jose State and twice vs. Oregon State...posted her first career double-double (18 points, 11 rebounds) at home vs. OSU...had double-digit points in 17 games, including the last five games of the year (averaged 13.4 ppg)...member of the *Oakland Tribune* Classic all-tournament team...co-recipient of the All-Cal Award.

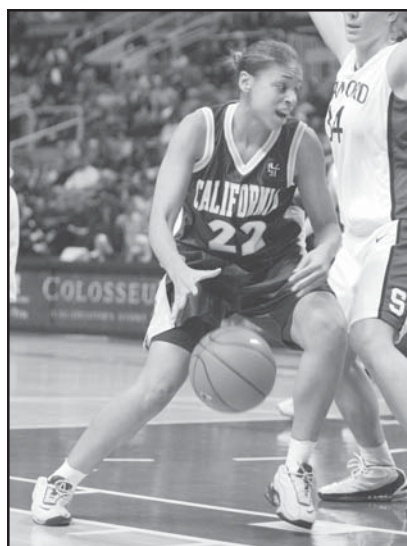
**As a sophomore in 2002-03:** One of three Cal players to start all 29 games...saw improvement in several statistical categories from her freshman season - scoring (8.8 to 9.2 ppg), rebounding (3.7 to 4.9 rpg), assists (0.7 to 1.2 apg), steals (0.88 to 0.93 spg) and free throw percentage (.640 to .667)...ranked second on the team in rebounding and third in scoring...posted double-figure points in eight of the first 10 games of the season and seven of the final 11 contests, including a stretch of three games where she averaged 18.7 ppg...led the team in scoring seven times and five of the final nine contests...poured in a career-high 22 points vs. Oregon...her 13 free throws made and 20 attempted vs. the Ducks tied Pac-10 season highs...had a strong trip to the state of Washington in February, tallying 17 points each against Washington and Washington State...twice grabbed a then-career-high 10 boards, vs. Washington State and vs. Stanford in the second round of the Pac-10 Tournament.

**As a freshman in 2001-02:** Started 18 of the 24 games she played in...one of two regular Cal freshmen

starters...missed four games from Dec. 21-30 after having surgery (right knee)...led all Cal freshmen in scoring at 8.8 points per game...scored a then-career-high 17 points at USC...third on the team in rebounding at 3.7 rpg and averaged 5.7 pg over the final seven contests of the season...led the Bears in rebounding at Oregon State with eight and followed that game up by sharing team-high honors at Oregon (5)...won team's Community Service Award.

**High School:** Earned a variety of awards as a senior at Carondelet High School after averaging 16.3 ppg, 6.0 rpg, 2.8 apg and 2.1 spg...earned first team all-league, first team All-ANG Newspapers, first team All-*Contra Costa Times* and the North Coast Section Scholar Athlete award...led her senior year team to a 23-8 record, its second straight league championship, its second straight second-place NCS Division II finish and to the Northern California semifinals...set the school's career rebounding record with 800+.

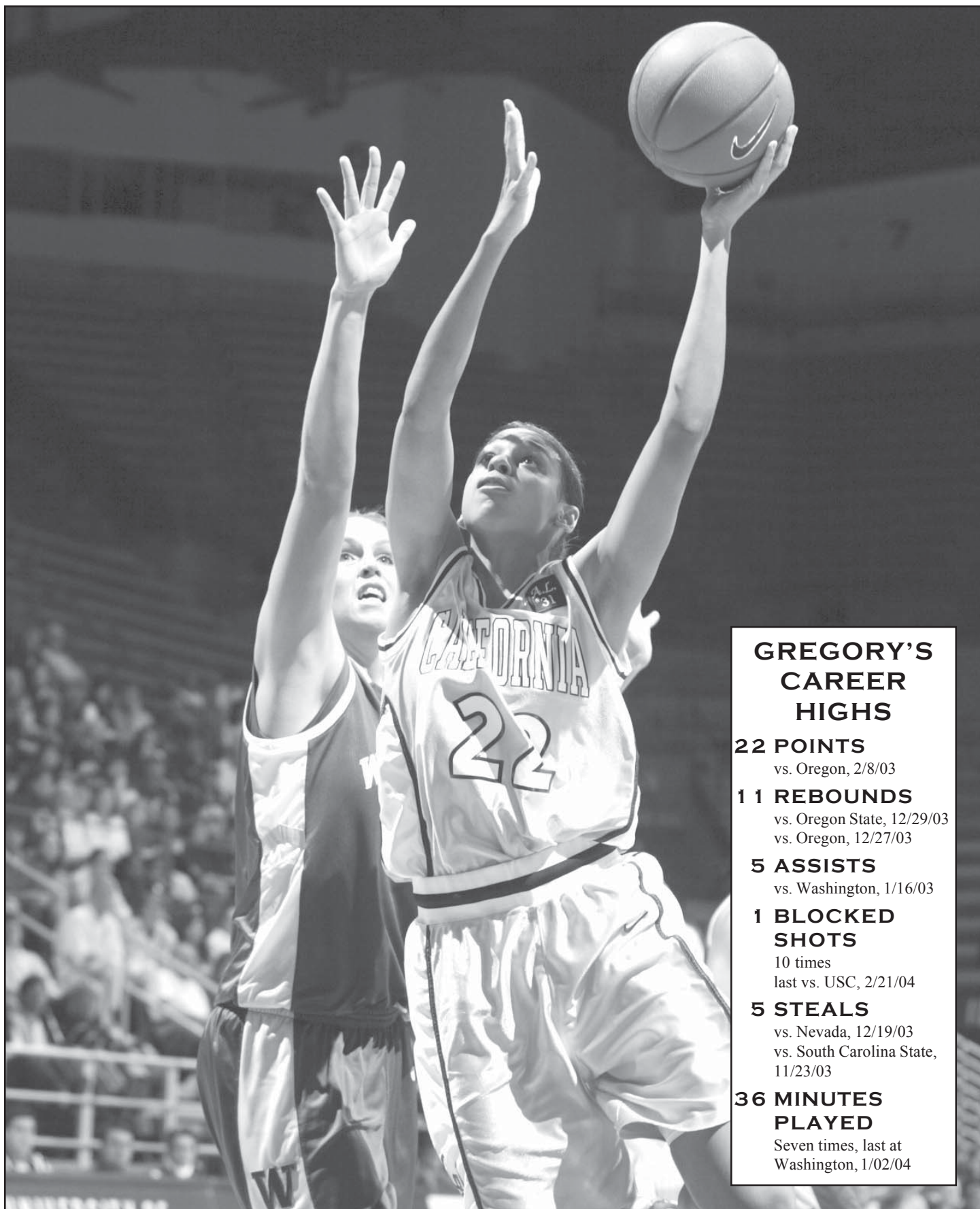

Iwanaga returns as a three-year starter at point guard...tri-captain...has started all but one game during her Cal career...currently Cal's all-time career free throw leader at 86.7 percent...also ranked fourth for career three-point percentage (38.2), ninth for three-pointers made (79) and 10th for three-pointers attempted (207)...smart point guard who takes good care of the ball...has a strong work ethic and is well conditioned.

**As a junior in 2003-04:** One of four Cal players to start all 29 games...tri-captain...contributed 6.9 ppg, 2.4 apg and 2.4 rpg...had 70 total assists to lead the Bears...paced the team in three-pointers made (28) and three-point percentage (.350, 10th Cal history) for the third consecutive year...continued to excel from the charity stripe, connecting on 85.4 percent (35-of-41) of her attempts...added 31 steals...tallied a season-high 18 points in Cal's win over Miami (OH)...corralled a career-high eight rebounds, along with 12 points, in Cal's Pac-10 Tournament triumph over Oregon...Bears won four of the six games she posted double-figure points (also defeated San Jose State, 11, and Lehigh, 17)...matched her career best of seven assists against Washington State Jan. 29...received Pac-10 All-Academic honorable mention and Cal's Golden Bear Award for having the team's highest GPA for the second straight season...chosen to the Coors Classic all-tournament team...co-recipient of the All-Cal Award.

**As a sophomore in 2002-03:** Joined Nihan Anaz as the team's co-MVP...also earned Pac-10 All-Academic honorable mention...one of three players to start all 29 games for Cal...surpassed the Pac-10's previous career free throw record of 84.7 percent but didn't have enough attempts as a junior to continue to hold the record...set the Bears' season free throw record by converting on 88.1 percent of her opportunities...hit a season-high 20 straight free throws...also led Cal in assists (85 total, 2.9 apg), three-pointers made (28) and three-point shooting percentage (.394), which ranks fifth in school history...in Pac-10 games, boasted a league-best 2.2 assist/TO ratio...helped the Bears defeat Syracuse with a career-high 20 points...in a Cal win over Oregon State, tallied 10 points, five rebounds and seven assists...posted 14 points, four rebounds and two assists in Cal's win at UCLA.

**As a freshman in 2001-02:** Started 27 of the 28 games she played in...served as co-captain with Ami Forney...averaged 7.1 ppg, 2.9 apg and 2.7 rpg...had the second most assists on the team (80)...paced Cal in scoring on four occasions, including a then-career-high 18 points in the Bears' home win over Washington State...led the Bears in free throw shooting (.863), three-point shooting (.411) and treys made (23)...her free throw percentage ranked third in the Pac-10 and is third all-time in school history...swiped the third-most steals on the team at 35...earned the Saul Becker Coaches Award...selected to the Nassau Knockout all-tournament team.

**High School:** Helped Archbishop Mitty to a 109-6 record in her four seasons...as a senior, averaged 11.6 ppg, 4.2 rpg, 5.8 apg and 3.6 spg to help Mitty post a 27-3 record, capture league and Central Coast Section championships and advance to the NorCal semifinals...senior honors included league MVP, first team All-CCS and All-Mid-Peninsula team...the starting point guard as a sophomore on Mitty's 1999 state championship team (31-0).

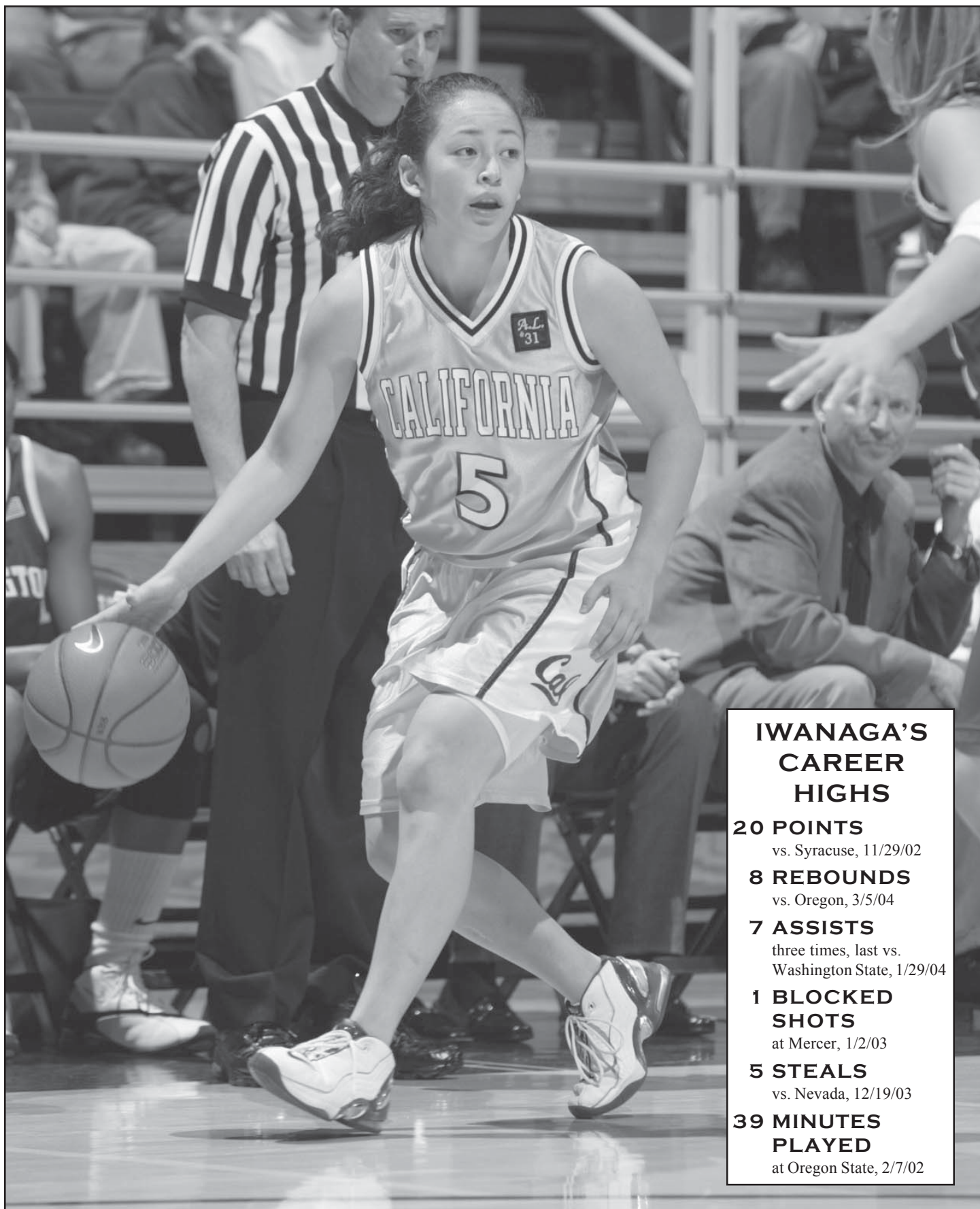

Levy enters her sophomore season at Cal after being selected the 2003 Iowa Gatorade High School Player of the Year...arguably the Bears' most athletic player...talented shooting guard with great potential...continues to work hard in the weight room to improve her strength...can take people on off the dribble and demonstrates three-point range...showed improvement as a perimeter defender as a freshman after only playing zone defense in high school.

**As a freshman in 2003-04:** Averaged 7.3 minutes per game in the 24 contests she entered off the bench...saw double-digit minutes of playing time in 10 games, with a career-high 19 minutes coming against UCLA Feb. 19...posted 2.0 points and 1.2 rebounds per game...contributed six steals, with a best of two in Cal's victory over Lehigh Nov. 28...sank six three-pointers, including a 2-of-2 effort in Cal's win versus San Jose State Nov. 25...amassed six points against the Spartans...tallied a career-high eight points versus UCLA at home after scoring seven points the game before at No. 11 Stanford...had a career-high five rebounds, along with five points and three assists in the Bears' win over Canisius Dec. 21.



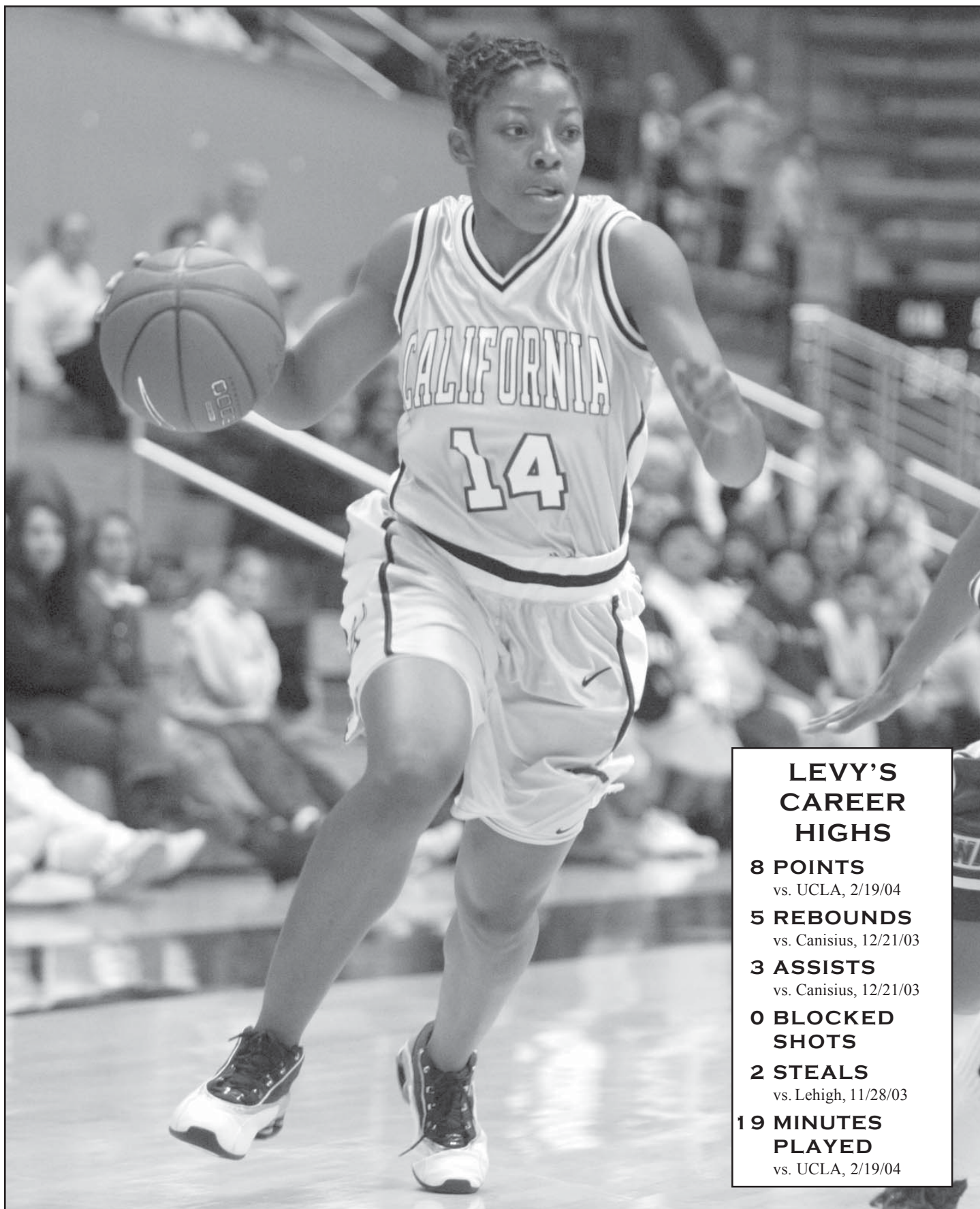
