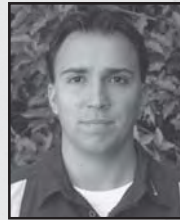

2008 SEASON OUTLOOK

Things are changing in the California women's gymnastics program.

The Golden Bears opened the eyes of everyone in the gymnastics world last year when they made a strong showing at the 2007 NCAA West Regional in Berkeley. With expectations reaching a higher level in 2008, Cal expects nothing but further success and won't settle for anything less.

This year's driven and focused squad has one major edge in its favor heading into the season – experience. Nine of the 15 members of the team are either seniors

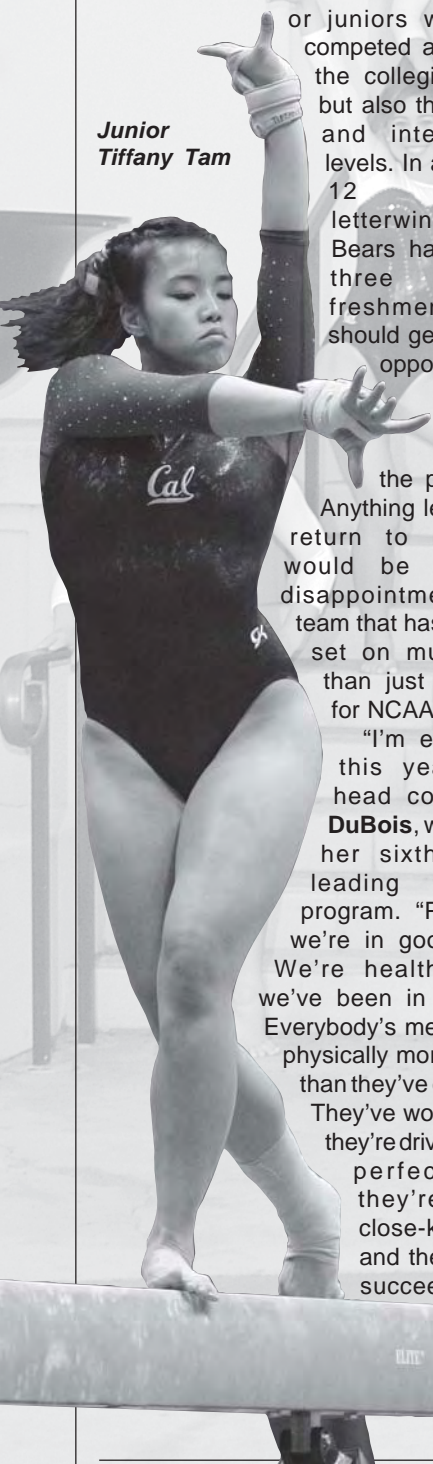
or juniors who have competed at not only the collegiate level, but also the national and international levels. In addition to 12 returning letterwinners, the Bears have added three stellar freshmen who should get plenty of opportunities to shine and turn some heads in the process.

Anything less than a return to regionals would be a major disappointment for a team that has its sights set on much more than just qualifying for NCAAs in 2008.

"I'm excited for this year," said head coach **Cari DuBois**, who begins her sixth season leading the Cal program. "Physically, we're in good shape. We're healthier than we've been in the past. Everybody's mentally and physically more focused than they've ever been.

They've worked hard, they're driven, they're perfectionists, they're a very close-knit group and they want to succeed."

SENIORS

Cal's experienced senior core of **Siobhan Luce, Keiko Nakamura, Alli Szutu** and **Nicki Wells** look to put an exclamation mark to their collegiate careers in 2008. Luce posted a career-high score of 9.8 on bars at the Pac-10 championships. Because of Luce's work ethic and consistency, her leadership role is a key ingredient to the Bears' success.

A captain on last year's squad, Nakamura showed that she can be a vocal leader and a leader by example. DuBois was skeptical whether or not Nakamura would be able to compete this year after having off-season surgery. Not only will Nakamura be ready to compete, she has been nailing beam routines since her return to practice.

According to DuBois, Szutu is due for a breakout season, and could really cap off her senior year. Szutu was solid on vault and floor in 2007 and hopes to continue that success this season.

Wells continues to be the workhorse she has always been, pushing herself each day in the gym. She showed that effort after recording a season-high 9.825 at the tri-meet against Denver and BYU.

"We have four seniors that have competed on a regular basis, so they're well experienced in the collegiate scene as well as national and international competition," DuBois said. "Siobhan just keeps building throughout the entire year and I don't expect anything different from her. Keiko provides leadership from her work ethic and ability to keep her composure and help others with whatever is needed in the gym and on the competition floor. I still feel like Alli could really cap off her season year with competing well on at least three events and being one of our top competitors on all three events. I'd really like to see our seniors all go out with the best season they've had in four years, which I think they're all capable of doing."

JUNIORS

The junior class is another portion of the team that DuBois is very excited to see in action. The five juniors on the squad will play a pivotal role in the team's success this year.

Jessica Kelley, an all-rounder, posted several top scores during her freshman campaign in 2006 in the all-around competition. In 2007, as a sophomore, she won three all-around titles. On vault, Kelley matched her career-best score of 9.800 three times last season. At the UC Davis quad meet, she won her third all-around title with her career-best score of

39.450, matched her career-best on vault of 9.800, while setting career highs on bars (9.875), beam (9.900) and floor (9.875).

"Jessica is a very consistent competitor and has had a lot of success," DuBois said. "I see her continuing to build upon that success."

Lydia Williams will add depth to the roster. The Toronto native hit her career best on bars twice last year with a score of 9.900. Williams looks to hone her skills and gain experience in 2008.

Competing primarily on beam, **Tiffany Tam** looks to also have another strong campaign. Last year at the UC Davis meet, Tam recorded her career-best score of 9.825 on beam. Tam will help build the team's consistency in that event this season.

"Tiffany looks more consistent than she's ever looked," DuBois said. "She looks better now on beam than she did at the end of last season."

One gymnast DuBois hopes to count on to produce high scores this year is **Bridgette Glass**. In her first all-around competition at the UCLA quad meet, she placed fourth. Glass had ACL surgery in April, but is already back and practicing on the beam and bars.

"I wasn't expecting her to compete at all this season, but her rehab has gone very well as of November," DuBois said. "Bridgette is a solid competitor and we are excited at how fast she has made a comeback."

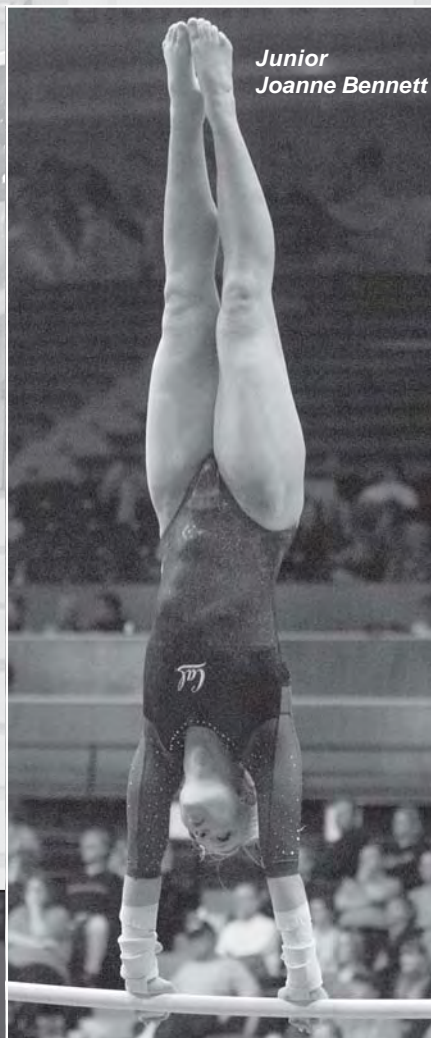
Joanna Bennett is another Bear with a lot of promise this season. Bennett reached a season best of 9.850 on bars at the UC Davis quad meet a year ago.

"Joanna looks stronger than ever and her desire is more prevalent than ever," DuBois said. "As most of the team, she stayed over the summer and trained and I expect to see her as a dominating contributor."

SOPHOMORES

Cal sports just two sophomores on the roster this year - **Sophia Hocini** and **Kendall**

Zdvorak. Hocini had a strong freshman year and DuBois is confident her sophomore campaign will be even better. In addition to earning academic All-America honors, Hocini also posted a season-high 9.875 against Air Force. Zdvorak adds to depth to the roster as she comes off a redshirt season last year. In addition, **Nicola Cashman** embarks on her second campaign on the team. Cashman will add to the depth as a redshirt freshman.

FRESHMEN

DuBois is excited about showing off her three freshmen - **Avery Gee**, **Stefanie Cheng** and **Nassim Mirreghabie**. DuBois said the group came in more prepared than she expected and their eagerness to learn and improve has made it fun working with them. Gee and Cheng were successful with the Airborne club team.

Mirreghabie was named the Most Improved Gymnast in 2006 by her club team, SCEGA (Southern California Elite Gymnastics Academy).

"They're amazing and so talented, and they're not even close to reaching their potential yet," DuBois said. "All three are very talented and I expect to see all three in the lineup on a fairly regular basis. There is some untapped talent in all three of them. I think they're going to surprise a lot of people in the coming years. Their potential is amazing."

SCHEDULE

It's no surprise the Pac-10 will be one of the most competitive conferences in the nation again this season. Two of the teams in the conference finished ranked in the top six nationally. For DuBois, it is essential to have her team ready and motivated for every competition if she wants to meet her goal of a top-five finish at the conference championships.

In Pac-10 dual meets, Cal will entertain Arizona State, Oregon State and UCLA. The Bears host one quad meet with Cal State Fullerton, San Jose State and UC Davis coming to Haas Pavilion. The team will make non-conference stops at Missouri, Boise State and locally at Sacramento State and UC Davis.

CALIFORNIA HEAD COACH

CARI DuBOIS

Head Coach
Sixth Season at Cal



Since arriving in Berkeley in 2003, Cari DuBois has led the California women's gymnastics program to immediate success and helped given Cal some recent national notoriety. In her short tenure, DuBois has guided the Golden Bears to their first back-to-back dual-meet winning seasons since 1991-92 and led the 2003 Cal team to a fourth-place NCAA regional finish. During that same season, she helped My-Lan Dodd become Cal's first NCAA championship meet representative in nearly a decade. She was also named Pac-10 Co-Coach of the Year and West Regional Coach of the Year in 2003. A year later, Cal finished fifth at NCAA regionals, the program's best back-to-back postseason showing since 1991-92. DuBois and the Bears returned to the NCAA West Regional last season for the first time since 2004, finished in fourth and ended the campaign with No. 26 national ranking.

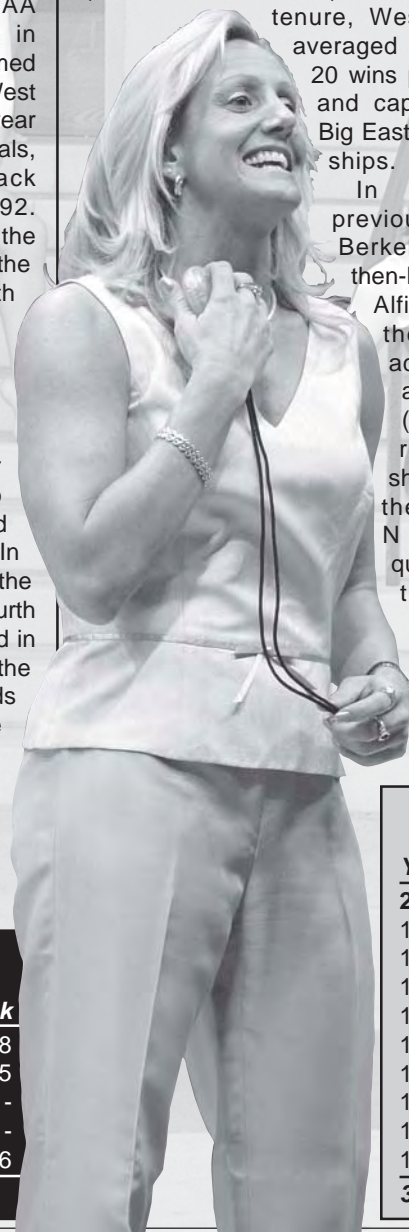
DuBois' presence in the Cal program was felt right away. She inherited a team that finished a disappointing 5-9 the year before her arrival, and with virtually no time to recruit for the upcoming season, guided the Bears to a 12-5 dual meet record. In 2003, Cal made its first appearance in the NCAA regionals in two years, finishing fourth – the best placement since taking third in 1992. In 2004, Cal finished 9-6, fifth at the NCAA regionals and set school records in the uneven bars (49.550), balance beam (49.300) and floor exercise (49.425). Last year, Cal scored its second highest team score in school history at 196.500. The Bears have finished nationally ranked in DuBois' first two seasons and in 2007.

Prior to coming to Cal, DuBois, spent six years as an assistant coach at West Virginia (1996-02) and three years with the Golden Bears (1993-96). At West Virginia, she helped the Mountaineers attain their highest national ranking ever (fourth, 2000) and helped lead West Virginia to a pair of 12th-place national finishes in 1999 and 2000. While she was in Morgantown, three WVU gymnasts were named conference gymnasts of the year, three others

garnered conference outstanding senior gymnast of the year honors and Danielle Lilly became the first Mountaineer freshman to win a NCAA regional title (balance beam, 1997). During DuBois' tenure, West Virginia averaged more than 20 wins per season and captured four Big East championships.

In DuBois' previous stint in Berkeley, under then-head coach Alfie Mitchell, the Bears accumulated a 37-20 (.649) meet record and she coached the last Cal N C A A qualifier prior to Dodd, Candice Kwok in 1994. During DuBois' l a s t

season at Cal in 1996, the Bears set a record team score of 193.925.

Prior to collegiate coaching, DuBois instructed and choreographed routines at several gymnastics camps and clubs nationwide, including the National Gymnastics Village in Colorado Springs, Colo. DuBois also spent time as a camp instructor at the Universities of Alabama, Georgia and West Virginia, coaching gymnasts of all skill levels. She is a certified national judge, with experience judging levels 5-10 in California, Colorado, Indiana, Nevada, Pennsylvania and West Virginia.

As a competitor, DuBois was a four-year letterwinner and three-time Mid-American Conference selection at Ball State from 1989-92. She earned team MVP honors in 1990 and 1992, and was nominated for Most Valuable MAC Gymnast of the Year and Top Female Athlete at Ball State. DuBois won the 1989 MAC Championship meet vault crown and the 1992 MAC floor exercise title. While competing for the Cardinals, DuBois set school records in the all-around (37.75) and vault (9.80).

A native of St. Joseph, Mo., DuBois received her bachelor's degree in exercise science and wellness from Ball State in 1992 and hold's a master's degree in athletic coaching education from West Virginia.

Scott Ryan was named assistant coach in the summer of 2005. Ryan served as the director and head coach at Aztec Gymnastics in San Diego prior to his hiring at Cal.

While at Aztec Gymnastics, Ryan led his teams to 33 state and regional championships in the state of California and national champions in both the United States and Mexico. Also 18 of his gymnasts earned college gymnastics scholarships.

In addition to Ryan's gymnastics teaching, he served as a lecturer at San Diego State University, where he taught undergraduate classes in the Department of Exercise and Nutritional Sciences.

Prior to his experience in San Diego, he served as the head coach and program director at Buckeye Gymnastics in Columbus, Ohio. He additionally occupied the position of event or meet director at the 1999-2000 San Diego Winter Classic, 1988-1996 Buckeye Classic, 1995 NCAA Men's Gymnastics Championships and 1985 Atlantic 10 Gymnastics championships.

Ryan is a graduate of West Virginia University, with an undergraduate degree in journalism and a master's of science in sports promotions.

MIKE LYNCH

First Year**



Mike Lynch was added to the coaching staff last fall.

Lynch has been responsible for many national champions and Olympians. In 1984, he coached Tracee Talavera to a silver medal in the team competition and a fourth-place finish on vault in the individual competition at the XXIII Olympic Games.

From 1984-87, Lynch was a part of the "Olympic Gold Medal Tour," coaching U.S. Olympic Team members in over 40 professional exhibitions throughout the United States. More recently in 1996, Lynch was named the Northern California

Coaches Association Coach of the Year.

For almost 30 years, Lynch has been a personal coach for over 40 Class 1, Level 10 and Elite Gymnasts in more than 35 competitions, including nationals, U.S. championships, World Championship Trials, Olympic Trials and Olympic Games. He has coached many Class 1, Level 10 and Elite national champions.

Lynch has also been the head coach, owner and founder of Golden Gate Gymnastics in Concord, Calif. He served as an assistant coach at Diablo Gymnastics from 1979-81 and was an assistant coach at Chico State, his alma mater, from 1978-79.

Ken Miller joined the Cal strength and conditioning staff in the summer of 2006.

In 2005, Miller earned a master's in exercise science and health promotion with emphasis in

performance enhancement and injury prevention from the California University of Pennsylvania. He holds certification with the National Academy of Sports Medicine as a personal trainer, and holds specialization certificates in corrective exercise and performance enhancement. Miller graduated from Cal Poly Pomona in 1993 with a bachelor's in physical education with emphasis in exercise science.
