2005 OUTLOOK

OPTIMISM ABOUNDS IN 2005

California has reasons to be optimistic heading into the 2005 season. The Golden Bears return everyone from last year's team which posted an 11-6-3 record and earned the program's sixth NCAA Tournament bid in the last seven years. This year's squad features six seniors and nine juniors.

"The mood is excited because the entire team sees our potential," said Kevin Boyd, who enters his ninth season at the helm at Cal as the winningest women's soccer coach in school history at 96-54-13 (.629). "Everyone is looking at this fall like this could be a very big year. They're seeing that our strength is not only our talent but our depth of talent."

Cal showed its potential against nationally-ranked teams last year, knocking off No. 24 Arizona and No. 6 UCLA – the Pac-10's co-champions. The Bruins also were the national runner-ups.

Led by senior forward Liz Eisenberg's 21 points, the Bears welcome back six double-digit point scorers from last season. In addition to points, Eisenberg led Cal in goals (9) and game-winning goals (3) in 2004 after combining for four points during her first two years. Also returning from last year's leaders are sophomore forward Stephanie Wieger (19 points, 7G, 5A) and a quartet of players who notched 10 points – seniors Dania Cabello and Sierra Schlesinger and juniors Nadia Al-Lami and Katie Ratican.

Add forward Julia Schnugg, a junior transfer from Florida State, to the mix and a couple of promising freshmen, and it's no wonder Boyd is excited about the offensive outlook.

"We have so many players who are capable of scoring," Boyd said. "It's going to be spread out. I'm hoping we get a couple of players to score at least 10 goals each."

The Bears ranked third in the Pac-10 in goals-against average last season at 0.76, and the team's defense should be even stingier this year. Senior Ashley Sulprizio and junior Anna Key combine to be one of the most dominant goalkeeper tandems in the country. The starting backline of senior Tracy Hamm, junior Alivia Mazura and sophomores Kristine Relja and Courtney Hooker have another year of experience under their belts.

Opponents will be well aware of the depth of Cal's talent pool this year. "Last year, we did quite well with a very young, unheralded team," said Boyd, who plans to utilize many reserves in 2005 to always keep a fresh team on the field. "It was a team nobody knew anything about. We wanted to prove people wrong. We did that very well last year. When you return your entire squad and add a few talented players, you're not going to sneak up on anyone. We have never had this many talented players this deep into our roster."

FORWARDS

Cal's offense showed dramatic improvement from 2003 to 2004, jumping from ninth in the Pac-10 with 22 total goals to third in the conference with 37. Look for six players to see ample playing time on Cal's frontline – seniors Liz Eisenberg and Dania Cabello, juniors Julia Schnugg and Katie Ratican and sophomores Stephanie Wieger and Bri Wiles.

"Those six are the ones we're primarily expecting to rotate up top," Boyd said. "But, we've added three talented freshmen in Katherine Daiss, Valerie Barnes and Torrey Delaplaine. Preseason will show how they will factor in this season."

Eisenberg, Cabello, Ratican and Wieger tallied double-figure points for the Bears last season, with Eisenberg leading the way with three game-winning goals and Wieger and Cabello finishing second with two each. Wieger, an honorable mention All-Pac-10 selection, netted the only goals in 1-0 wins over No. 6 UCLA (in overtime) and No. 24 Arizona.

Schnugg joined Cal in the spring and made an immediate impact, according to Boyd. The Alamo, Calif., product helped Florida State to the 2003 NCAA Final Four by posting

22 points (six goals, 10 assists) and earned second team All-ACC honors in 2004 with 17 points (seven goals, three assists).

"Julia is a giant boost to our team," Boyd said. "She is a different style in terms of the frontline. We're expecting quite a bit from her."

MIDFIELDERS

Seven players will compete for three or four midfield spots. Anchoring the midfield from the holding spot is junior Nadia Al-Lami – Cal's 2004 team MVP and a two-time honorable mention All-Pac-10 pick. Sophomore Caroline Lea, a U.S. under-20 national team player, made a smooth transition in the spring from forward to defensive midfielder, giving the Bears the luxury of not having to play Al-Lami for 90 minutes.

Seniors Lindsay Clute and Sierra Schlesinger and sophomores Chioma Igwe, Laurie Gartrell and Caitlin Hannegan round out the other five contenders. Schlesinger recorded a career-high 10 points last season while starting 18 of 20 games, while Clute made eight starts and added a career-high seven points.

Igwe, who also has U.S. U20 experience, was critical to the Bears' ability to control the tempo of games last season. She started 13 of the 19 games she entered, tying for the team lead with five assists, including one in a first round NCAA Tournament game at Santa Clara.

"We're excited about the depth we have in the midfield," Boyd said. "If you rotate six deep for three spots, it gives you the luxury of not missing a beat if you take an injury."

Juniors Jamie Mangiardi, who has been plagued by knee injuries, and Beth DeAraujo and sophomores Katie Wilcox and Dayna Queisser bolster the Bears' midfield. Sophomore Jenny Wendell will assist the coaching staff this year due to a knee injury.

DEFENDERS

The same physical and fast backline returns from last season when Cal permitted only 16 goals – 14 in the regular season – and four fewer than they did in 2003. Senior Tracy Hamm and junior Alivia Mazura patrolled the outside of the Bears' formation in 2004, while sophomores Courtney Hooker and Kristine Relja anchored the center of the defense.

Hooker garnered numerous honors during her rookie year, including Soccer Buzz Freshman All-America, second team All-Pac-10 and third team all-region.

Junior Emily Ward and sophomore Katie Martinez are expected to play bigger roles this season, and freshman speedster Nkechi Kanu, from Pleasanton, Calif., should also have an impact.

"Tracy and Alivia both are capable of coming forward and being active in the attack," Boyd said. "Courtney and Kristine had unbelievable freshman seasons and play well off each other. Nkechi has a different speed than everyone on the field."

Redshirt junior Karissa Goodwin adds depth to the defensive unit.

GOALKEEPERS

Senior Ashley Sulprizio and junior Anna Key will battle for the starting goalkeeper job again. Both saw considerable playing time last year, with Sulprizio posting a 0.87 goals-against average in her 16 starts, and Key making four starts and allowing only three goals (0.49 GAA). Sulprizio even scored a goal in the Bears' dramatic 1-1 tie against Stanford last year.

"The battle for goalkeeping is going to be pretty intense," Boyd said. "Ashley and Anna have matured and gained confidence over the last few years."

Redshirt freshman Nicole Jarbo made strides last year despite tearing her ACL.

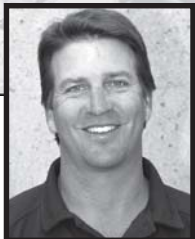

Ninth Season at Cal



Kevin Boyd enters his ninth season at the helm of the California women's soccer team as the winningest coach (in terms of victories) in the program's 23-year history. Under his direction, the Golden Bears have competed in six NCAA Tournaments—including a school record five straight from 1998-02 – and captured their first-ever Pac-10 championship in 1998.

Boyd boasts an overall record of 96-54-13 (.629) in eight seasons in Berkeley, for an average of 12 wins per year. He owns 35 more wins than any of the five other head coaches who have led the Cal women's soccer team. Last season, the Bears earned their 12th all-time NCAA Tournament selection and posted wins over No. 6 UCLA and No. 24 Arizona, the Pac-10's co-champions. The Bruins were also the 2004 NCAA College Cup runner-ups.

In 2000, Boyd coached Cal to the most wins in school history, as the Bears finished the year with a 17-3-1 record, a first-round NCAA Tournament bye and a final national ranking of No. 4 by *Soccer America*. In the Boyd era, Cal has consistently been regarded as one of the top teams in the country, holding a final ranking of No. 18 last season.

The Bears' recruiting classes have been tabbed in the top 15 nationally by Soccer Buzz for five of the last seven years. Headlined by U.S. under-20 national team members Chioma Igwe and Caroline Lea, Cal showcased the No. 10-rated class and second best on the West Coast last fall. Leading the 2005 newcomers is junior forward Julia Schnugg, an All-ACC transfer from Florida State who earned *Parade* All-America honors as a prep.

Several of Boyd's pupils have gone on to professional playing careers.

Maitte Zabala (2001-03) and Laura Schott (2003) competed in the WUSA, and in 2003, Carly Fuller became the first American woman to play professionally in China. Zabala, a 2004 member of Spain's Athletic Bilbao, emerged as Cal's career shutout leader (26.5) in 2000. Schott, a two time All-American, developed into the school's all-time goal scorer (56) in 2002 after grabbing a share of the season goal record (23) in 2000.

Boyd's Cal teams have produced 21 first or second team All-Pac-10 selections, as well as 17 first or second team Pac-10 All-Academic choices. The 2003-04 Bears showcased the highest GPA (3.34) of Cal's 27 intercollegiate teams.

One of the veteran coaches of the Pac-10, Boyd, 37, possesses over 14 years of collegiate and youth coaching experience and holds USSF National "A" and NSCAA Premier coaching licenses.

Prior to being named head coach at Cal, Boyd worked the 1996 season as the program's assistant coach and recruiting coordinator. As such, he played an instrumental role in landing what proved to be one of the nation's top recruiting classes that season. With Boyd on staff, the '96 Bears also returned to the national rankings for the first time in three years.

Since 1996, Boyd also has coached several Bay Area club teams. In 2002, he led the U18 Marin Rockers to the Cal-North state title. He also coached the U17 Cal-North state team.

Boyd began his coaching career with the Idaho Youth Soccer Association where he served as a coach and club director from 1991-96. During that same period, he also managed the Idaho under-18 state select team, and in 1992, he founded the Les Bois United Soccer Club in Boise, Idaho.

As head coach and director of Les Bois for four years, he turned the club into an Idaho state youth soccer powerhouse, winning a remarkable 22 state titles during his tenure.

In 1994, Boyd became involved with the Region IV Olympic Development Program, and between 1994-97, he coached three separate regional teams, in three different age groups, which were selected to represent the 14 Western states at the ODP national tournament.

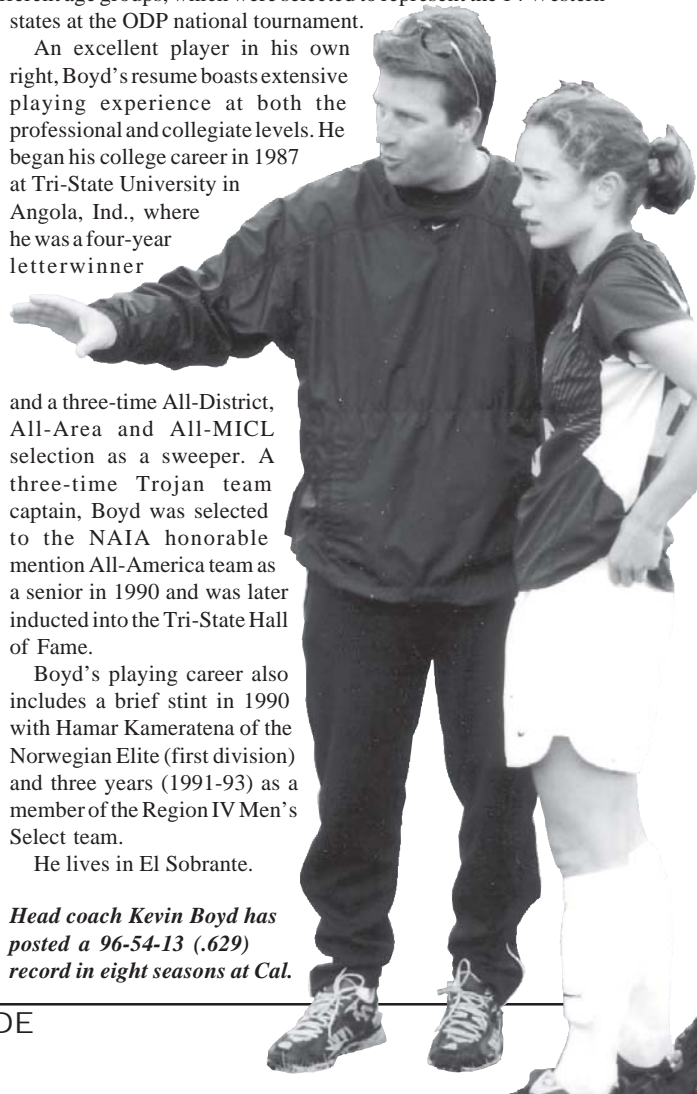
An excellent player in his own right, Boyd's resume boasts extensive playing experience at both the professional and collegiate levels. He began his college career in 1987 at Tri-State University in Angola, Ind., where he was a four-year letterwinner

and a three-time All-District, All-Area and All-MICL selection as a sweeper. A three-time Trojan team captain, Boyd was selected to the NAIA honorable mention All-America team as a senior in 1990 and was later inducted into the Tri-State Hall of Fame.

Boyd's playing career also includes a brief stint in 1990 with Hamar Kameratena of the Norwegian Elite (first division) and three years (1991-93) as a member of the Region IV Men's Select team.

He lives in El Sobrante.

Eighth Season at Cal

Jennifer Thomas, who dominated California's backline from 1982-85, continues to support the blue and gold in her eighth season as an assistant coach for her alma mater.

Thomas has played an integral role in Cal's rise to being a perennially nationally-ranked program and a consistent participant in the NCAA Tournament. During her stint as an assistant, the Golden Bears have posted a record of 85-47-12 (.632) and have advanced to the postseason six times.

From 2001-02, Thomas also served as a sideline reporter and then as a color commentator for local broadcasts of the WUSA's San Jose CyberRays.

Before returning to Cal as a coach in 1998, Thomas spent the previous four years as the athletic director at Incline High School in Incline, Nev., where she was responsible for coordinating and supervising the school's 31-sport interscholastic athletic department. While at Incline, she also acted as the soccer coordinator for the Nevada Interscholastic Athletic Association.

Prior to her duties as athletic director, Thomas founded and directed the FC Soccer Camps in Incline in 1993 and held that role until 2001. In addition to her own camp, she concurrently managed a similar camp in Incline, run by the American Youth Soccer Organization (AYSO).

Thomas brought five years of coaching experience with her to Cal. In addition to her duties as athletic director at Incline High, Thomas founded and coached Incline's girls' varsity and junior varsity soccer teams. In 1997, she expanded her coaching responsibilities when she took over as head coach of the Sierra Nevada Soccer Club's under-19 girls' team. Thomas coached, administered and played on the Reno Rattlers in 1997.

Still an avid soccer player, she helped lead her over-30 club team to a regional and national championship in 2003 and 2004.

An all-conference and all-region selection, Thomas graduated from Cal in 1986 with a bachelor's of arts degree in political economies of industrial societies. With Thomas patrolling the Bears' backline, they advanced to two NCAA Tournaments and made their first of three final four appearances in 1984. She earned a master's of arts degree in education from Stanford in 1991 and has a USSF "A" coaching license.

Originally from Portola Valley, Calif., Thomas and Rich Meyer live in Berkeley with their son, Wyatt, who will celebrate his fourth birthday on Nov. 12.



MAITE ZABALA

Assistant Coach

Second Season at Cal

Maite Zabala, who has been associated with California soccer for eight years, begins her second season as a full-time assistant coach for her alma mater. Before assuming her current role, Zabala served as a volunteer coach for the Golden Bears for three seasons, and prior to that, she distinguished herself as one of the nation's top collegiate goalkeepers.

With Zabala as a Cal player or coach, the Bears have posted seven winning seasons and have garnered six NCAA Tournament bids.

As a student-athlete at Cal from 1997-00, Zabala emerged as the Bears' all-time leader for career shutouts with 26.5 and finished the 2000 season with the 10th-best goals-against average in the country at 0.64. All told, she recorded a .900 career GAA in 6,295 minutes of action.

Zabala garnered four All-Pac-10 honors, including first team recognition as a sophomore and junior, and received the Bears' team MVP award during her final two campaigns. She led the Bears to three NCAA Tournament berths (1998, '99 and '00), the program's only Pac-10 title in 1998 and a school-record 17 wins in 2000.

Following her Cal career, Zabala gained additional experience playing for the WUSA's Atlanta Beat, Philadelphia Charge and Carolina Courage. During the spring of 2004, she helped Athletic Bilbao win the Spanish SuperLiga.

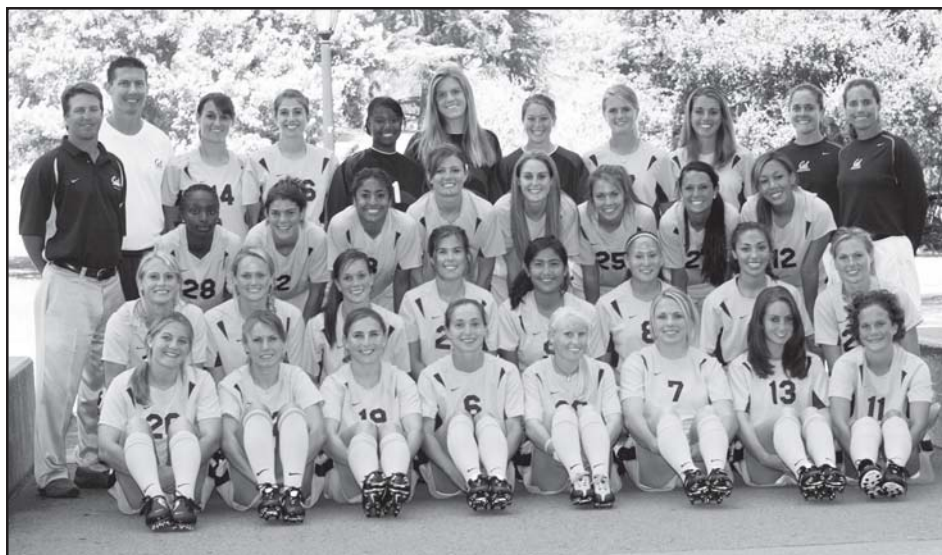
Zabala earned her bachelor's degree in political science from Cal in 2001.

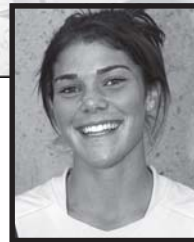

2004 SEASON IN REVIEW

THE RECORDS

California finished the 2004 season with an 11-6-3 overall record and in a tie for fourth in the Pac-10 with Stanford and Arizona State at 4-3-2. Cal knocked off No. 24 Arizona and No. 6 UCLA, the Pac-10 co-champions. The Bruins were the national runner-ups. The Golden Bears earned their sixth NCAA Tournament bid in the last seven years, losing to Santa Clara, 2-1, on the road in the first round. After opening the season with a 7-1-1 record, Cal achieved its highest ranking of the year at No. 7 by Soccer Buzz. The Bears ended the season ranked as high as No. 18 by Soccer America.



CAL'S OFFENSE IMPROVES IN 2004

Junior forward Liz Eisenberg posted 21 points to lead six Cal double-digit point scorers in 2004, while freshman forward Stephanie Wieger was second with 19 points (7 goals, 5 assists). Wieger and freshman midfielder Chioma Igwe shared the team assists lead with five. Eisenberg also led the Bears in goals (9) and game-winning scores (3). Juniors Sierra Schlesinger and Dania Cabello, and sophomores Nadia Al-Lami and Katie Ratican each added 10 points. Cal tied for third in the Pac-10 with 37 goals, 15 more than the Bears' 2003 total.

BEARS STEP UP DEFENSIVE INTENSITY

Goalkeepers Ashley Sulprizio and Anna Key combined for a 0.76 goals-against average, which ranked fourth in the Pac-10. The Bears allowed only 16 goals (T3rd in the Pac-10) – four fewer than 2003. Their goalkeeping tandem also secured 11 shutouts (T3rd in the Pac-10) after posting only seven in 2003. The starting backline of Tracy Hamm, Courtney Hooker, Kristine Relja and Alivia Mazura were instrumental in Cal's strong defense.

HOOKER HEADLINES ALL-PAC-10 PICKS

Hooker, a freshman, garnered second team All-Pac-10 honors after shining as one of the leaders of Cal's stingy defense. Hooker also earned third team

all-region honors from the NSCAA and Soccer Buzz and Freshman All-America accolades from Soccer Buzz. Wieger, Al-Lami (midfielder) and Igwe received honorable mention. Al-Lami also was an honorable mention selection as a freshman.

IGWE, LEA INVITED TO U.S. U-20 CAMP

Igwe and freshman forward Carolina Lea competed at a U.S. under-20 national team camp May 22-28 at the Home Depot Center in Carson, Calif. Igwe was an alternate for the 2004 U19 World Championships in November and had previously attended U19 camps. Lea gained experience on the U.S. U17 and U19 teams.

ELEVEN BEARS EARN CONFERENCE ACADEMIC HONORS

Redshirt freshman midfielder Jenny Wendell was named first team Pac-10 All-Academic team for women's soccer, while Key received second team recognition. Nine Golden Bears earned honorable mention – Al-Lami, Cabello, Eisenberg, Hamm, Mazura, Ratican, Schlesinger, Sulprizio and Emily Ward. Eisenberg was picked to the second team Academic All-District VIII squad.

TEAM AWARDS

Al-Lami was voted the team Most Valuable Player for the first time in her career. Eisenberg received Most Valuable Offensive Player accolades, while Hooker earned the team's Most Valuable Defensive Player and Freshman of the Year awards. Junior midfielder Lindsay Clute was honored as the Bears' Most Improved Player and received the Coaches' Award. Wendell was chosen as the Most Inspirational Player and earned the Golden Bear Award for having the highest GPA on the women's soccer team.
