### 2006 OUTLOOK

### BEARS MATURE INTO CHAMPIONSHIP CONTENDER

oming off a third-round appearance at the 2005 NCAA Tournament, California is eager to take the next step on the national scene this season.

The Golden Bears recorded a 16-4-2 overall record last year and placed second in the Pac-10 at 7-1-1 for their best-ever record in conference play. It was Cal's first venture past the third round of the postseason since 1988.

"The team feels confident," said **Kevin Boyd**, who enters his 10th season at Cal. "By getting to the third round, we believe that we belong in the third round every year. The focus should be on taking the next step."

Despite returning only five starters, Cal welcomes back 13 players who saw significant playing time last year. Three of those starters are from the Bears' dominant backline. Senior Alivia Mazura and juniors Courtney Hooker and Kristine Relja were huge factors in the Bears ranking seventh in the nation in 2005 in goals-against average with a school record 0.475 mark.

Cal's focus in the spring was its offense. The team has graduated four of last year's top-five leaders in points, including second-team All-Pac-10 selection **Liz Eisenberg**, who paced the Bears with 26 points and 11 goals.

Boyd is confident that this year's attack, led by seniors **Katie Ratican** and **Julia Schnugg**, has the potential to be potent. Ratican led Cal with six assists a year ago and ranked third on the team in points (12), and Schnugg—a secondteam All-ACC pick at Florida State before transferring to Cal—came on strong late last season, finishing with six points (one goal, four assists).

"We dominated opponents in the spring," Boyd said. "We were dangerous and saw a lot of creativity from our players."

### **GOALKEEPERS**

Senior **Anna Key** is the frontrunner to replace **Ashley Sulprizio**, who had a dazzling 2005 senior season. Key has played in 15 games and made five starts over the last two years, allowing only four goals in 723 minutes in the net for a 0.50 GAA. As a freshman, the Oakland, Calif., product started 14 of the 15 games she entered.

Redshirt sophomore **Nicole Jarbo** gained experience in the spring after seeing action in only one game last season.

Freshman Gina
Pellegrini is also
targeted to challenge
for minutes in goal. A
member of the 2005 National Select
team, Pellegrini was a three-time

all-league selection at Santa Rosa High School. The Bears have also added **Rosie Aguilera**, who transferred to Berkeley after posting a 1.37 GAA in 14 outings in 2005 as a rookie for UC Irvine.

"You'd expect Anna to be the starter, but there could be a battle for playing time," Boyd said. "Nicole had a great spring, and Gina is solid in goal. Rosie gained valuable experience last year."

### **DEFENDERS**

Senior Alivia Mazura returns as a starting outside back, while juniors Courtney Hooker and Kristine Relja will continue to anchor the center of the Bears' backline. All three athletes have been regular starting defenders over the last two campaigns. Mazura was chosen Cal's Freshman of the Year in 2003 and is known for being the team's iron woman and a leader.

Hooker, who spent time with the U.S. under-20 national team in the spring, received secondteam All-America and first-team All-Pac-10 accolades as a sophomore. Relja brings a physical presence to the defensive unit.

"Our backline is experienced," Boyd said. "In the spring, when we played teams 30-minute halves, we were giving up one shot at most, and it wasn't even dangerous."

Senior **Emily Ward** and sophomore **Nkechi Kanu** are prime candidates to replace second-team All-Pac-10 selection **Tracy Hamm**, who has exhausted her eligibility. Kanu saw minutes

in six games last year, including one start, and recorded an assist in Cal's game against Florida State in the third round of the NCAA Tournament. Ward played in 12 games as a

junior.

Kristine Relja

Junior Katie Martinez, and freshmen Brianna Bak and Jessica Mazura, Alivia's sister, add depth to the Bears' defense.

### **MIDFIELDERS**

Senior Nadia Al-Lami and junior Caroline Lea look to lead Cal's midfield. Al-Lami has started 53 games during her career, earning three honorable mention All-Pac-10 honors. In 2005, Al-Lamilaunched the game-winning goal in a 2-1 come-from-behind win over USC and registered the game-winning assist in a 1-0 road triumph over Utah.

Lea, who participated in a U.S. under-21 national team camp in June, garnered second-team All-Pac-10 recognition as a sophomore after notching game-winning goals against Washington (1-0) and Stanford (2-0).

"Nadia and Caroline play well together and complement each other's game," Boyd said. "Nadia is more of the ball-winner and destroyer, while Caroline excels at creating a rhythm for the team. They're both great in the air."

Juniors Caitlin Hannegan and Laurie Gartrell are slated to play bigger roles in Cal's midfield in 2006. Hannegan missed most of last season with a knee injury after competing in 14 games, making three starts, as a freshman. Gartrell has been a sparkplug off of Cal's bench in 38 games over the last two years and was credited with the second goal in Cal's 2-0 victory over Rice in the 2005 NCAA Tournament.

Redshirt junior **Jenny Wendell**, who missed the 2003 and 2005 seasons with knee injuries, and freshmen **Katie Oakes** and **Kelly Menachof** should find time in the rotation. Oakes is listed as one of the top 100 recruits for 2006 by Soccer Buzz, and Menachof helped her Colorado club team to five state titles.

#### **FORWARDS**

Veterans **Julia Schnugg** and **Katie Ratican** are expected to ignite Cal's offense during their final season. Schnugg helped Florida State to the 2003 NCAA semifinals by posting 22 points.

Ratican has improved her offensive numbers each season, recording seven points, 10 points and 12 points, respectively.

"Katie and Julia stood out for us in the spring," Boyd said. "We're hoping to get a lot out of both players this fall. We need someone to stick the ball in the back of the net with regularity like Gidget (Eisenberg) and score timely goals."

Junior **Stephanie Wieger** battled injuries to both ankles last season and is now on track to return to her freshman-year form. In 2004, Wieger posted 19 points from seven goals and five assists. Redshirt junior **Bri Wiles** will also battle for time after participating in 18 contests, including two starts, as a sophomore.

Sophomores Valerie Barnes and Katherine Daiss will be counted on for contributions. Barnes was voted the team's Freshman of the Year and tallied the game-winning goal in the Bears' 2-1 decision over UTEP in the second round of the postseason. Daiss saw playing time in 13 games, logging a goal against Oregon and the game-winning assist vs. UC Santa Barbara.

Freshmen Katie Oakes and Lisa Kevorkian may also be factors on the frontline. Kevorkian netted 143 goals during her fours years at Monrovia High School. Redshirt freshman Torrey Delaplane hopes to see action, as well.

# KEVIN BOYD

Head Coach 10th Season at Cal

Kevin Boyd, the 2005 Pac-10 Coach of the Year, enters his 10th season at the helm of the California women's soccer team as the winningest coach in the program's 24-year history. Under his direction, the Golden



Bears have competed in seven NCAA Tournaments—including a school record of five straight from 1998-02—and captured their first-ever Pac-10 championship in 1998.

Boyd boasts an overall record of 112-58-15 (.646) in nine seasons in Berkeley, for an average of over 12 wins per year. With a 1-0 double-overtime decision over Dartmouth on Sept. 9, 2005, Boyd earned his 100th-career victory. He owns 51 more wins than any of the five other head coaches who have led the Cal women's soccer team. Last season, the Bears earned their 13th all-time NCAA Tournament selection and advanced to the third round for the first time since 1988. The Bears posted a 16-4-2 overall record and placed second in the Pac-10 with their best-ever conference record of 7-1-1, earning Boyd Cal's first Pac-10 Coach of the Year accolade in women's soccer.

Also in 2005, the program set a school season record for lowest goals-against average (0.475, seventh in nation) and tied Cal records for shutouts (14) and fewest goals allowed (11).

In 2000, Boyd coached Cal to the most wins in school history, as the Bears finished the year with a 17-3-1 record, a first-round NCAA Tournament bye and a final national ranking of No. 4 by Soccer America. In the Boyd era, Cal has consistently been regarded as one of the top teams in the country, holding a final ranking of No. 6 last season.

Several of Boyd's pupils have gone on to professional playing careers. Maite Zabala (2001-03) and Laura Schott (2003) competed in the WUSA, and in 2003, Carly Fuller became the first American woman to play professionally in China. Zabala, a 2004 member of Spain's Athletic Bilbao, emerged as Cal's career shutout leader (26.5) in 2000. Schott, a two-time All-American, developed into the school's all-time goal scorer (56) in 2002 after grabbing a share of the season goal record (23) in 2000.

Boyd's Cal teams have produced 25 first- or second-team All-Pac-10 selections, as well as 19 first- or second-team Pac-10 All-Academic choices. The 2003-04 Bears showcased the highest GPA (3.34) of Cal's 27 intercollegiate teams.

One of the veteran coaches of the Pac-10, Boyd, 38, possesses over 15 years of collegiate and youth coaching experience and holds USSF National "A" and NSCAA Premier coaching licenses. The Bears' recruiting classes have been tabbed in the top 15 nationally by Soccer Buzz for five of the last eight years.

Prior to being named head coach at Cal, Boyd worked the 1996 season as the program's assistant coach and recruiting coordinator. As such, he played an instrumental role in landing what proved to be one of the nation's top recruiting classes that season. With Boyd on staff, the '96 Bears also returned to the national rankings for the first time in three years.

Since 1996, Boyd has also coached several Bay Area club teams. In 2002, he led the U18 Marin Rockers to the Cal North state title. He also coached the U17 Cal North state team.

Boyd began his coaching career with the Idaho Youth Soccer Association, where he served as a coach and club director from 1991-96. During that same period, he also managed the Idaho U18 State Select team, and in 1992, he founded the Les Bois United Soccer Club in Boise, Idaho.

As head coach and director of Les Bois for four years, he turned the club into an Idahostate youth s o c c e r powerhouse, winning a remarkable 22 state titles during his tenure.

In 1994, Boyd became involved with the Region IV Olympic Development Program, and from 1994-97, he coached three separate regional teams, in three different

age groups, to the ODP national tournament.

An excellent player in his own right, Boyd's resume boasts extensive playing experience at both the professional and collegiate levels. He began his college career in 1987 at Tri-State University in Angola, Ind., where he was a four-year letterwinner and three-time all-district, allarea and all-MICL selection as a sweeper. A three-time Trojan team captain, Boyd was

selected to the NAIA honorable mention All-America team as a senior in 1990 and was later inducted into the Tri-State Hall of Fame.

Boyd's playing career also includes a brief stint in 1990 with Hamar Kameratena of the Norwegian Elite (first division) and three years (1991-93) as a member of the Region IV Men's Select team.

He currently resides in El Sobrante.

Kevin Boyd is the winningest coach in Cal women's soccer history.

# JENNIFER THOMAS

Assistant Coach Ninth Season at Cal

Jennifer Thomas, who anchored California's backline from 1982-85, enters her ninth season as an assistant coach for her alma mater.

Thomas is linked to Cal's recognition as a national soccer power and a consistent



participant in the NCAA Tournament. During her stint as an assistant, the Golden Bears have posted a record of 101-51-14 (.651), for an average of almost 13 wins per season, and have advanced to the postseason seven times. In 2005, the program advanced to the third round of the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1988, set a school record for goals-against average (0.47) and tied Cal bests for shutouts (14) and goals allowed (11).

From 2001-02, Thomas also served as a sideline reporter and then as a color commentator for local broadcasts of the WUSA's San Jose CyberRays.

Before returning to Cal as a coach in 1998, Thomas spent the previous four years as the athletic director at Incline High School in Incline, Nev., where she was responsible for coordinating and supervising the school's 31sport interscholastic athletic department. While at Incline, she also acted as the soccer coordinator for the Nevada Interscholastic Athletic Association.

Prior to her duties as athletic director, Thomas founded and directed the FC Soccer Camps in Incline in 1993 and held that role until 2001. In addition to her own camp, she concurrently managed a similar camp in Incline, run by the American Youth Soccer Organization (AYSO).

Thomas brought five years of coaching experience with her to Cal. In addition to her duties as athletic director at Incline High, Thomas founded and coached the school's girls' varsity and junior varsity soccer teams. In 1997, she expanded her coaching responsibilities when she took over as head coach of the Sierra Nevada Soccer Club's under-19 girls' team. Thomas coached, administered and played on the Reno Rattlers in 1997.

Still an avid soccer player, she helped her over-30 club team to regional and national championships in 2003 and 2004.

An all-conference and all-region selection, Thomas graduated from Cal in 1986 with a bachelor's of arts degree in political economies of industrial societies. With Thomas patrolling the Bears' backline, they advanced to two NCAA Tournaments and made their first of three final four appearances in 1984. She earned a master's of arts degree in education from Stanford in 1991 and has a USSF "A" coaching license.

Maite Zabala, who has been associated with California's soccer prominence for nine years, begins her third season as a full-time assistant coach for her alma mater.



Before assuming her current role, Zabala

served as a volunteer coach for the Golden Bears for three seasons from 2001-03, and prior to that, she distinguished herself as one of the nation's top collegiate goalkeepers.

With Zabala as a Cal player or coach, the Bears have posted eight winning seasons and have garnered seven NCAA Tournament bids, highlighted by a third-round appearance in 2005. Under Zabala's tutelage, goalkeeper Ashley Sulprizio ranked ninth in the nation in goalsagainst average last season at 0.474, which is the second-best mark in school history, and the Bears were tabbed seventh in the country as a team at 0.475.

As a student-athlete at Cal from 1997-00, Zabala emerged as the Bears' all-time leader for career shutouts with 26.5 and finished the 2000 season with the 10th-best goals-against average in the country at 0.64. All told, the Boise, Idaho, product recorded a .900 career GAA in 6.295 minutes of action.

Zabala garnered four All-Pac-10 honors, including first-team recognition as a sophomore and junior, and received the Bears' team MVP award during her final two campaigns. She led the Bears to three NCAA Tournament berths (1998, '99 and '00), the program's only Pac-10 title in 1998 and a school-record 17 wins in 2000.

Following her Cal career, Zabala gained additional experience playing for the WUSA's Atlanta Beat, Philadelphia Charge and Carolina Courage. During the spring of 2004, she helped Athletic Bilbao win the Spanish SuperLiga.

Zabala earned her bachelor's degree in political science from Cal in 2001.
