# 2008 SEASON OUTLOOK

# CAL LOOKS FORWARD TO A SUCCESSFUL 2008 SEASON

hirty-four wins and a berth to the NCAA postseason would be considered a successful season for most softball programs. Then again, California is not "most" softball programs. The Golden Bears will look to improve on its 2007 NCAA Regional appearance and focus on reclaiming their dominance on the national scene in 2008 with a stronger veteran presence and another potent offensive arsenal.

For head coach **Diane Ninemire**, who enters her 21st season at the helm, Cal has the tools in place to have a legitimate World Series run, but it will take a full team effort, both offensively and defensively. "Our offense was one of the best we've ever had last season," said Ninemire. "We just couldn't get a complete game. I think that our pitching is getting stronger every day, and if we can get everything going at the same time, we will be a force to be reckoned with."

Cal will have a steady mix of leadership this season, beginning with its three with its three or not season.

seniors - Julie Meyer, Katie Vickers and Erika Racklin. "Julie will be behind the plate, managing the pitchers and assisting in calling the game and running the infield," said Ninemire. "Her experience of being the only current player in our program that has been to a World Series is invaluable. I'm looking forward to her having a stellar year and using her leadership to guide this team for another World Series run. Katie is an outstanding third baseman who brings a lot of leadership abilities. She will assist Julie as being our vocal leader in the infield. Erika will anchor center field and help guide our outfield. I feel we have good leadership in the infield and the outfield and these seniors will help our team get to where they need to be to make another championship run."

### **PITCHERS**

The pitching staff will enjoy the advantage of having a year of experience under its belt. Cal returns sophomores Marissa Drewrey and Brittany LaRosa, while adding a potential young ace to the staff with freshman Valerie Arioto. Drewrev showed flashes of dominance last year with 11 wins and 71 strikeouts. Her best outing came in a complete game three-hit shutout in Cal's 1-0 win over No. 7 Arizona State. LaRosa got off to a productive start to the '07 campaign and finished the year with five wins in 86 innings of action. Arioto is one of Cal's most decorated incoming freshmen in recent memory. The Pleasanton product was named the East Bay Player of the Year and an EA Sports All-American her senior season.

"We have three pitchers that are all really different and can do a lot for this program," said Ninemire. "Marissa, who had an early season foot injury, had a good second half and we saw glimpses of her really coming out. I feel she has all of the tools to become a top NCAA pitcher. Now it's a matter of putting that whole package together. She is getting stronger every day. I think Marissa is gong to be a very different pitcher when she takes the mound in February."

"Brittany has matured a lot. She is start-

ing to find herself here and she is getting excellent movement on her pitches. She is also a very capable hitter. I think she is going to bring a lot of different things as a pitcher as well as a hitter."

"Valerie is an excellent utility player who brings a lot of enthusiasm. She possesses a variety of pitches that keeps the batters off balance. We also have her playing some in right field. She will also be able to bring another bat to the table. I feel that all three are all well-rounded athletes, and all three will help this team down the stretch."

### **INFIELD**

Cal, which returns a number of infielders this season, should be poised not only to have tremendous firepower in the lineup, but also have a steady defensive prowess to limit the opposition's attack. "We have a lot of talent and depth in the infield," said Ninemire. "I feel comfortable and confident putting any one of those players in the lineup."

At first base, **Sanoe Kekahuna** will be handling most of the duties, along with LaRosa. "She adds a big stick in our lineup which will give us a lot of firepower," Ninemire said of Kekahuna. As a senior, Kekahuna helped guide her team to a Hawaii State Championship and a Maui Interscholastic League Championship. She earned first-team all-state and all-league honors after producing a .688 batting average.

At second base, Vernae Sevilla showed the potential for a breakout sophomore campaign after producing a .241 batting average with 23 RBI and three home runs in 61 games last season. "Vernae has excellent hands and brings punch to the lineup with her bat speed," said Ninemire. "She was real consistent for us last year and even had a couple of walk-off home runs. This year she is developing into more of a leader. She is starting to talk a lot more and she is starting to find her own voice. She is starting to become more comfortable in our system. Carrie Arth will be backing up Vernae. Carrie is a transfer from San Francisco State with good defensive skills and someone who has been improving her hitting every day."

Returning to short stop is defensive standout **Taylor Kelly**. As a freshman, she had 66 putouts and 92 assists; to go along with five stolen bases and 17 runs. "Taylor will be anchoring short stop again this season," said Ninemire. "She had an excellent ending to her season last year. She has a lot of range and her bat is improving day by day."

At third base Vickers enjoyed a solid junior campaign, notching 37 RBI and a .244 batting average last season. "Katie possesses a big punch in her bat," said Ninemire. "She brings a lot of vocal leader-



ship to the line-up, and does a good job of keeping our team mentally in the game. Backing her up will be **Lauren Bauer**, a transfer from UC Riverside who brings a great bat and someone who can help this team."

Junior **Heather Camara** will back up Meyer at the catcher position.

### OUTFIELD

Two-thirds of Cal's returning outfield this season possesses speed and power with Rackin and **Gina Leomiti**. Blend in a freshman, sophomore and junior to the mix, and Cal has a formidable outfield for 2008. "All five outfielders will help us this year and all are capable of producing big hits for us this season," said Ninemire.

Handling the duties again in center field is the speedy and crafty Racklin. She enjoyed her best season in a Cal uniform in 2007, scoring 39 runs with 18 stolen bases. "Erika is very quick and really gets a good jump on the ball." Ninemire stated. "She also has an accurate arm. We're thinking of batting her second in the lineup to help move runners around. She is someone who increased her consistency at the plate last season and her consistency as an outfielder."

There is no doubt that **Gina Leomiti** had the breakout performance of the year in 2007. As a sophomore, she led the team with a .354 batting average, while generating 30 RBI and five home runs. "Gina had an excellent season last year," said

Ninemire. "She led our team in batting average and she had one of the most significant improvements in hitting from her freshman to sophomore year. This offseason she really improved her

arm, and her bat is as good as ever. We are looking for her to produce a lot of RBIs for us."

Ninemire will have options in right field this season with Arioto, sophomore Shannon Houston and junior Savannah Hensley. Last season Houston had 22 runs and 12 stolen bases in a pinch hitting role. "We have a couple of choices for us in right field," said Ninemire. "Valerie is a freshman pitcher that can bring a big stick into the lineup. Shannon brings a little more speed and a consistent bat with a strong arm - so there will be a battle for that spot. When Valerie is pitching, we will have Shannon in right field. We also have Savannah, who has shown great im-

provement with her bat in the fall."

Filling the utility position will be sophomore **Bernice Masaniai**. Another talented bat in the Cal lineup, Masaniai hit .289 with


10 home runs and 35 RBI last season. "Bernice brings a very big bat," said Ninemire. "She had a great fall

season and she can drive the ball anywhere on the field. Her RBI production should be very high as well this season."

### SCHEDULE

One staple with the Cal program has always been the consistently tough nonconference schedules before a grind it out grueling Pac-10 slate. The Bears this season face perennial powers such as Northwestern, Oklahoma, Ohio State, Hawaii, Mississippi State and Nebraska, before opening conference play at home versus Arizona State on March 28. The season begins on February 8 at the Palm Springs Classic.

There is little doubt that Cal has the talent to make a deep run in the NCAA postseason. If the Bears can put together a complete game – offensively and defensively – on a consistent basis, Cal will ultimately leave its footprint on the Pac-10 and the country.



# HEAD COACH DIANE NINEMIRE

### Diane NINEMIRE

Head Coach 21st Season at Cal



Since her first year in the dugout in 1988, Diane Ninemire has continually taken the Bears to new heights as one of the winningest and most successful softball programs in the

nation. From 1999-2005, Cal made seven straight trips to the College World Series. With a national championship, nine Women's College World Series trips, and 20 straight NCAA Regional appearances to her credit, it is no wonder that Cal enters every season as a national contender.

Entering the 2008 campaign, Ninemire is 11 victories away from No. 900 (the most of any coach in the history of Cal athletics).

Since the 1999 season, California is an impressive 446-178 (.714), with five 50-win seasons. Over the last four seasons, Ninemire's squad has posted a 187-74 (.711) mark.

During Ninemire's tenure at Cal, 34 All-America, 80 all-region, and 134 all-conference certificates have been issued to Golden Bear athletes. Two of Ninemire's former players - Michele Granger and Gillian Boxx - were four-time All-Americans and helped the United States win a Gold Medal as members of the 1996 Olympic Team in Atlanta.

History was made in 2002 when Ninemire helped direct Cal to its


first NCAA Championship at the WCWS with a 6-0 win over the Arizona Wildcats, the first

women's title in Cal athletic program history. The 2002 team set a school record for wins (56), while Jocelyn Forest claimed the tournament's Most Outstanding Player honor, and Ninemire was chosen as the NFCA National Coach of the Year. Cal became the first Pac-10 team other than UCLA and Arizona to win the softball national title. Forest went undefeated in Cal's postseason run and completed the WCWS with a 4-0 record, 0.50 earned run average and 33 strikeouts in 28.0 innings.

Ninemire has enjoyed plenty of other memorable moments along her career path. In 2005, Cal won a share of the Pac-10 title (a first for a Ninemire squad), and advanced to its seventh consecutive WCWS. The 2004 version of the Bears were one of Ninemire's most successful and most decorated groups, as four All-Americans and eight All-Pac-10 selections helped drive Cal to its third consecutive WCWS championship game appearance. In 2001, Cal began the season 32-0 before finishing fifth at the WCWS. Under Ninemire, Cal has also finished third

(1999), fifth (1992, 1996) and seventh (2000) at the WCWS.

Despite an up-and-down 2007 campaign, Ninemire's Golden Bears finished the season with 34 wins and a 22nd consecutive berth in the NCAA postseason (the longest active postseason streak in the Pac-10 and second-longest in the nation). According to the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA), Cal boasted the fourth-hardest strength of schedule in the nation's No. 1-rated conference. With a squad that featured seven freshmen, the Bears posted eight wins against top 25 teams.

Prior to becoming head coach, Ninemire served as an assistant for five years at Cal under Donna Terry. Together, the tandem led the Bears to three appearances in the NCAA Tournament, a third-place finish at the 1986 WCWS and the inaugural Pac-10 championship in 1987.

In 2004, Ninemire's winning reputation was recognized internationally when she was named as an assistant coach to the inaugural Greek Olympic softball team. At home, Ninemire is a past member of the NCAA Pacific Region Advisory Committee and a former chair of the All-American Selection Committee.

Ninemire began her collegiate playing career at Midland Lutheran College (Fremont, Neb.), leading the team to a state

# ASSISTANT COACHES

### John REEVES Assistant Coach 15th year



John Reeves, the driving force behind Cal's pitching success, begins his 15th season with the Golden Bear program. Reeves, who brings more than two decades of coaching expe-

rience to the field, has helped numerous Cal pitchers earn All-American accolades, including recent Cal graduate Kristina Thorson (36-10, 0.83 ERA in 2006), who was a three-time All-American from 2004-06. Other All-American pitchers under Reeves' watch include, Jocelyn Forest and Whitney Floyd.

Prior to his arrival at Cal in 1994, Reeves served as head softball coach at Lynbrook High School in San Jose. He led his teams to a combined 105-27 record over five years, including a Central Coast Section title. From 1987-93, he coached the Twin Creeks Diamonds ASA team, developing more than 30 players who earned positions on Division I softball teams. He has also served as a Bobby Sox and PAL coach for 12 years.

In addition to his coaching stints, Reeves has presented pitching techniques and strategies at various clinics, including the NFCA Softball Exposure Camp.

Reeves graduated from San Jose State with a bachelor's degree in liberal studies in 1980. He resides in San Jose.

### Tammy LOHMANN Assistant Coach 3rd year



T a m m y Lohmann begins her third year of service with the California softball program this season.

Because of her assistance in the development of the Cal hitters, the

Golden Bears produced team records in home runs (49), RBI (278) and runs (322) in 2007.

Since Lohmann's arrival, Cal hitters have garnered 16 all-conference selections, including recent graduate Alex Sutton, who posted career-high numbers as a senior in 2007.

Prior to her arrival in the Bay Area, Lohmann was an assistant coach at Wisconsin, helping guide the Badgers to three straight NCAA Regional appearances. She coached numerous all-conference and regional players with the Badgers. Wisconsin hitters posted a record-breaking offensive season in 2005, setting multiple school records.

As a player, Lohmann was a two-time all-conference selection at Arizona State and was team captain for the 1997 season. She was the ASU Freshman of the Year in 1993 and is on ASU's single-season and career record charts in hits, doubles, and stolen bases.

During the summer of 1998, Lohmann was a pitcher and a shortstop for the Arizona Peppers in the Ladies Professional

Baseball League. She played the same positions during the 1998 USA Women's Baseball National Tournament, helping the Arizona Angels to a runner-up finish. In 1999, Lohmann played in the Women's Professional Softball League as a member of the North Carolina Diamonds.

She earned her master's degree in human service administration from Bradley in December 2002.

### Marcus SMITH Volunteer Assistant 1st year



Marcus Smith begins his first season with the California Golden Bear coaching staff. Smith joins the Bears after spending the 2007 season helping guide his Northwestern Christian

High School squad to an Arizona state championship with a 33-5 record.

Prior to his coaching stint in Arizona, Smith spent two years in Minnesota as an assistant coach at Division III national runner-up University of St. Thomas (in 2006) and as an assistant at Bethel University in 2005.

Smith was an assistant coach at the University of Wisconsin-Oshkosh for a year in 2002, before serving as the head softball coach at Wausau East High School in Wisconsin from 2003-04.

Smith played men's fastpitch for six years and coached football at Wisconsin-Stevens Point as well.
