Quickly

The California Golden Bear softball team finished the 2007 season with a 34-32 record and a 22nd consecutive berth to the NCAA postseason. With the bid, Cal has the longest active postseason streak in the Pac-10 and the second-longest streak in the nation. According to the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA), Cal boasted the fourth-best strength of schedule in the nation's No. 1-rated conference (RPI). With a squad that featured seven freshmen, the Bears also had eight wins against top 25 teams in 2007. Despite an up and down 2007 campaign, head coach Diane Ninemire guided a program to a 20th consecutive winning season. Five players were named all-conference as well.

Cal Lands Five on All-Pac-10 Team

Senior Alex Sutton headlined Cal's all-conference selections after earning second-team honors, while teammates Gina Leomiti, Bernice Masaniai, Christina Schallig and Vernae Sevilla landed honorable mention nods on the 2007 Pac-10 all-conference team announced May 17 by the league office.

California in the Polls

Cal remained out of the ESPN/USA Softball Top 25 poll, but did collect 11 "receiving votes" in the latest poll released on Tuesday (May 15). The Bears were picked to finish in a sixth place tie according to the annual Pac-10 softball preseason coaches poll released in January. Arizona claimed another conference crown this season, followed by Arizona State, UCLA, Washington, Oregon State, Stanford, Oregon and Cal.

Tuscaloosa Regional Recap

May 18 vs. Florida State ... Cal set a program record for the most runs (in a game) scored in postseason history with their 13-6 win over the Florida State Seminoles in the opening game of the Tuscaloosa Regional hosted by Alabama. Cal scored nine runs against BYU in 2005 in the Fresno Regional and nine runs against Michigan in the Ann Arbor Regional in 2003. The ten runs in the third stanza were the most by Cal for an inning this season. The victory gave Cal nine wins in its last 10 opening regional games since 1998. Cal also improved to 5-1 all-time over FSU in postseason competition and 11-1 overall since 1991. The Bears also broke two other records in the seven-run victory at the Alabama Softball Complex - most runs in a season (320) and most RBI in a season (276). Gina Leomiti connected for her fifth home run of the season (a two-run shot) in the top of the seventh. Alex Sutton notched two hits on the evening and scored two runs, while Meyer connected for three hits on four plate appearances. Leomiti finished 4-for-5 with four RBI and two runs. Every-one in the Cal line up scored at least one run.

May 19 vs. Tennessee Tech ... The Tennessee Tech Golden Eagles continued to surprise fans at the Tuscaloosa Regional after their 3-1 win over the California Golden Bears on Saturday afternoon from the Alabama Softball Complex. TTU, who advanced in the winner's bracket, also defeated nationally-seeded Alabama in its opening game. Tennessee Tech wasted little time in generating its first two runs of the game. After Beth Boden drew a lead off walk, Katie Speiser connected for a home run over the left field wall to put the Golden Eagles up 2-0. Cal responded in the top of the third when Julie Meyer belted a solo home run over the center field wall, trimming the TTU lead to 2-1. The Bears had one of their best scoring opportunities in the fourth inning when Gina Leomiti

Former CAL Players

Golden Bears – Pro League

Seven former Cal players are competing in the National Pro Fastpitch softball league. Lisa Iancin and Jocelyn Forest both play for the New England Riptide. Chelsea Spencer, Emily Friedman, and Kristina Thorson play on the Philadelphia Force. Kaleo Eldrege competes on the Arizona Heat, and Vicky Galindo appears on the Chicago Bandits roster.

>>Jocelyn Forest

Selected as the 2006 NPF Championship Series MVP, Forest struck out seven batters over seven innings to give the New England Riptide a 2-0 victory over the Connecticut Brakettes in the National Pro Fastpitch Championship game.

>>Vicky Galindo

Chosen by the Chicago Bandits in 2005, Galindo was selected to the 2005 NPF All-Star team. Galindo hit .455 to lead the US National Team to the title game in the inaugural World Cup of Softball held in Oklahoma City in 2005 as well. She is currently an assistant coach at San Jose State University.

Golden Bears – Olympics

Since softball's inception as an Olympic sport in 1996, a Golden Bear player or coach has participated in each Olympiad. Cal players have also competed for various national teams during non-Olympic years. Michele Granger (USA), Gillian Boxx (USA) and Lisa Martinez (Puerto Rico) appeared in the 1996 Summer Olympics held in Atlanta. In addition, former Cal assistant coach Kim Maher, a standout at Fresno State, played for the United States as well that summer. In 2004 Olympics in Athens, head coach Diane Ninemire, along with Lindsay James and Chloe Kloezezan, suited up for the inaugural Greek national team, while Nicole DiSalvio returned for a second stint with Italian national team.

>>Michele Granger

A four-time All-American from 1989-93, Granger was a member of the USA Olympic team that won the gold medal at the 1996 Olympic Games in Atlanta. Granger squared off against former Golden Bear Lisa Martinez in the first-ever Olympic softball game. Granger finished the Summer Games 2-0 with a 0.87 ERA and 25 strikeouts. Her wins came in the opener against Puerto Rico and in the gold medal game against China.

>>Others...Jennifer Deering was hired as an assistant coach at Boston University this season. A member of the 2002 national championship team, Deering most recently served as the head varsity softball coach at Piedmont High School. Deering's responsibilities as an assistant will include working with the pitching staff and spearheading BU's recruiting efforts.

and Bernice Masaniai produced back-to-back singles to start the stanza. Despite a Katie Vickers sacrifice bunt which moved the runners to second and third, Golden Eagle pitcher Bonnie Bynum got Vernae Sevilla and Meyer to strikeout to end the scoring threat.

May 19 vs. Alabama ...The 2007 postseason run came to an end for Cal after their 13-1 loss to 11th-seeded and regional host, Alabama on Saturday night from the Alabama Softball Complex. Cal lost earlier in the day to Tennessee Tech, 3-1, in the double-elimination format. Cal concluded its season at 34-32. Alex Sutton, the lone senior on the squad, put the Bears on the scoreboard first after her solo home run (12th of the season) cleared the left field wall in the bottom of the first inning. The Crimson Tide evened the score at 1-1 after Ashley Holcombe produced an RBI single to plate pinch runner Mallory Benak in the top of the second. Kelly Montalvo's two-run single gave Alabama a 3-1 lead, before Mandy Burford's RBI single thru the left side pushed the Crimson Tide's lead to 4-1 in the top of the third.

'07 Team Quick Notes

Cal set a school mark with its 49th home run of the season (courtesy of an **Alex Sutton** solo home run on May 19) -- the previous mark was 46 home runs set in 2004 ... Cal also established new single-season team records in runs scored (322) and RBI (278) ... Cal set a postseason record for most runs scored in a game (13) vs. Florida State on May 18 ... Cal's win over Florida State also gave the Bears their ninth in their last 10 opening regional games since 1998 ... **Diane Ninemire** is one win away from career victory No. 890 after earning career win No. 889 vs. Florida State in the Tuscaloosa Regional on May 18 ... the Bears were 29-9 when scoring first this season, and 29-5 when leading after four innings ... the Bears did not commit an error from Apr. 28-May 6 ... the pitching staff allowed just three earned runs from Apr. 28-May 4 -- a span of 28 innings ... Cal's pitching staff posted 17 strikeouts against the Arizona State Sun Devils (Apr. 28-29) ... the 18 runs scored by the Bears vs. Liberty on Mar. 23 were the most runs scored since 1993 when Cal defeated Stanford 22-2 ... Cal posted back-to-back come from behind victories over Iowa State and Northern Iowa (Mar. 10 and 11) ... the Bears pounded out 71 hits from Mar. 9-14 ... also in that span, Cal produced 47 runs and 42 RBI ... Cal had at least one home run from Mar. 9-15, a span of seven straight games ... Cal produced 40 hits from Mar. 17-23 ... the Bears drew a season-high nine walks vs. UConn on Mar. 9 ... the Bears had a season-high 18 hits vs. Baylor on Mar. 14 ... Cal equaled its highest RBI output (14) vs. Liberty on Mar. 23 ... Cal recorded a season-high seven stolen bases vs. Liberty on Mar. 23 ... the Bears were involved in 19 games this season that have been called due to an implemented run rule -- Cal was 9-10 in such games ... Cal scored a total of 101 runs in the first two innings this season (51 in the first and 50 in the second) and 71 total runs in the third inning

Cal on TV

Cal's match-up at Arizona State was televised (on a tape delay basis) on Fox Sports Bay Area on Sunday, Apr. 15. Cal also tangled with Tennessee Tech in the Tuscaloosa Regional which was broadcast live on ESPN2 from the Alabama Softball Complex on May 19.

Sutton Drafted by New England Riptide

Senior Alex Sutton was selected in the third round by the New England Riptide in February's National Professional Fastpitch draft. Players selected in the NCAA draft will be permitted to pursue any available roster spot on their assigned team after completing their college season, according to league bylaws.

"The NPF showcases the nation's best softball players, and the draft gives us the opportunity to tap into the elite softball talent from the college level and bring it to our fans," said newly appointed NPF Commissioner Cheri Kempf. "We are excited at the prospect of adding the hottest college players to our teams and bringing even more electricity to our 2007 season."

Sutton, who hit .352 as a junior and was team was announced this season as one of 50 players on the Amateur Softball Association's Top-50 Preseason Watch List for Player of the Year honors, joins other Golden Bear alumnae, Jocelyn Forest and Lisa Iancin on the Riptide squad. "She's a welcome addition to the Riptide rebuilt outfield," said Riptide General Manager Joe Adlman. "We're happy we were able to draft her when we did."

Led by Forest, New England captured the 2006 NPF Championship. Forest was named MVP of the series, pitching all 16 innings of the playoffs without allowing a run and striking out 15. The NPF season begins in June.

The 2007 Preseason Watch List is comprised of 50 players representing 33 schools and 11 different NCAA Division I Conferences. A complete list of the players with photos and links to their collegiate bios can be found in the "College Corner" on the USA Softball website -- www.usasoftball.com.

The ASA announced its 25 finalists (**Sutton did not make it on the finalist ballot**). A player did not have to appear on the initial watch list to be considered as a Top-25 finalist, but once the Top-25 is named the remaining finalist must be selected from that list. Just days before the start of post-season play, a list of 10 finalists will be named and released on May 9. The final three finalists will be announced May 23 while the winner of the 2006 USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Year Award will be announced prior to the start of the 2007 NCAA Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City.

The '07 Schedule

The 2007 California softball schedule had the Golden Bears traveling throughout the country, facing 18 opponents that made postseason appearances in the 2006 season. Of those 18 opponents, 14 finished the season ranked in top 25 national polls (ESPN.com/USA Softball and USA Today/NFCA). The 2007 schedule also included 15 home games at Levine-Fricke Field, including 11 Pac-10 Conference match-ups. In the Tuscaloosa Regional, Cal tangled with a Florida State team that had 44 wins, while facing an Alabama team that was ranked No. 1 in the country towards the end of the season.

#00 Brittany LaRosa (Fr., Diamond Bar, CA): Finished the 2007 season with a 5-8 record and two shutouts this season ... in her collegiate debut vs. Kansas (2/9) LaRosa allowed just two hits in five innings of work for her first complete game and shutout ... she scattered four hits in seven innings for her second win and shutout vs. UCSB on 2/10 ... From Feb. 18-20 (6.1 innings pitched) LaRosa gave up just one run on two hits and two strikeouts ... A LOOK AROUND THE PAC-10

All Eight Pac-10 Teams Qualify For NCAA Championships

The Pac-10 has accounted for five of the past six NCAA Champions.

The defending champion University of Arizona was named the No. 1 seed in the NCAA Division I Softball Championship today when the NCAA Division I Softball Committee announced the 64-team field. The Wildcats, champions of the Pacific-10 Conference, are 39-12-1 and will open play against the automatic qualifier from the Mid-Eastern Athletic Conference (winner of North Carolina A&T University vs. Howard University), May 18, in front of a home crowd in Tucson.

Other Pac-10 teams earning top-16 seeds in the tournament are No. 6 Washington, No. 7 Arizona State, and No. 12 UCLA. The Bruins will host their regional, as will unseeded Stanford.

CAL HEAD COACH Diane Ninemire

THE NINEMIRE EFFECT

No coach in the history of California athletics has won more games than Diane Ninemire (889). Since her first year in the dugout in 1988, Ninemire has continually taken the Bears to new heights as one of the winningest and most successful softball programs in the nation, especially over the past nine seasons. Under the guidance of Ninemire, California has earned a place among the nation's elite. With a national championship, nine Women's College World Series trips, and 20 straight NCAA Regional appearances to her credit, it is no wonder that Cal enters every season as a national contender.

Since the 1999 season, California is an impressive 446-178 (.715), including a 187-74 mark (.716) since 2004. Since 1999, Ninemire's teams have won at least 48 games in eight of the last nine seasons, including five 50-win seasons.

Since Ninemire's tenure at Cal, 34 All-America, 80 all-region, and 134 all-conference certificates have been issued to Golden Bear athletes. Two of Ninemire's former players – Michele Granger and Gillian Boxx – were four-time All-Americans and helped the United States to win a Gold Medal as members of the 1996 Olympic Team in Atlanta.

Despite an up and down 2007 campaign, Ninemire guided a program that featured seven freshmen to its 22nd consecutive NCAA Regional. The '07 Bears finished 34-32 to give Ninemire her 20th consecutive winning season at the helm. Five players were named all-conference as well.

CAL ATHLETICS ALL-AROUND EXCELLENCE

California sits in second place in the final winter standings in the race for the 2006-07 U.S. Sports Academy Directors' Cup and is on track for its highest finish ever. The Golden Bears have a total of 761.5 points, trailing only Stanford, which has 997.5 points. Wisconsin is third with 753.5 points, followed by Michigan (731.25) and Penn State (704.33). During the winter sports seasons, Cal picked up points in seven of its programs that compete during the term. Women's swimming & diving posted the highest finish with a third-place showing at the NCAA championships. Other programs to finish in the Top 10 nationally were men's gymnastics, which took seventh, and men's swimming & diving, which was eighth. In addition, the Bears were 15th in women's indoor track & field, 19th in women's gymnastics, 19th in men's indoor track & field and tied for 33rd in women's basketball. Cal stood in first place in the Directors' Cup following the fall campaigns for the first time, keyed by a national championship in men's water polo and Top 10 finishes in field hockey, volleyball and men's soccer.

Cal placed a program-record seventh last year, and the Bears have finished in the Top 15 six times over the past seven years. Cal had 501 points at the end of the 2005-06 winter sports seasons, putting the Bears more than 250 points ahead of last season's pace.
