No. 1 seed Cal and No. 16 seed Washington will meet in Berkeley, Calif., Saturday and Sunday for the NCAA Super Regionals with the winner to advance to the Women's College World Series in Oklahoma City next weekend.

The Huskies (39-17) won the Seattle Regional, going 3-0 with wins over Harvard (twice) and Texas Tech. Cal (54-5) went 4-1 having to go through the loser's bracket and beat Arkansas twice in the championship game. Both games, and game three if necessary, will be on ESPN2. Saturday's game is at 7 p.m. PT and Sunday's at 4 p.m. followed by game three.

Mike Brown and Alyssa Olveda will be calling all the games live via all-access on [www.gohuskies.com](http://www.gohuskies.com) for free. Live stats are free provided by Cal on the website as well.

The UW and Cal met on the second week of the Pac-12 season in Berkeley with the Golden Bears taking the series, 3-0. All three games were close, 2-1, 5-3 and 6-4.

This will be just the third meeting between the Huskies and Golden Bears in the postseason and first in Super Regionals. The UW is 2-0 in those games vs. Cal winning 9-7 in 1996 and 3-0 in 1999 both at the WCWS.

This is the fourth-straight year the UW will compete in the Super Regionals. The Huskies advanced to the WCWS in two of those years; 2009 and 2010 winning the 2009 National Championship.

The Huskies were ranked No. 18 in both national polls two week's ago and finished 18 in the regular season polls. The UW was as high as No. 3 in the country in the polls after starting the season 32-1.

The UW currently sits 18 in the latest RPI. In 2012 regular season, the Huskies ended with a 36-17 record and earned an at-large berth into the tournament.

This is the 19th-straight postseason appearance for the UW. The Huskies are 83-36 all-time in the NCAA tournament. Since UW started the program in 1993, the Huskies have won 14 Regionals and have been to the Women's College World Series 10 times; tied for fourth in all-time WCWS Appearances. Coach Tarr has an impressive 40-16 postseason record.

Scouting No. 1/1 Cal

Cal is ranked No. 1 in both polls and the No. 1 overall seed in the 2012 NCAA Tournament with a 54-5 record. This is the first time since 1993 that Cal has hosted postseason, when Sacramento State and Long

Beach State traveled to Berkeley. In that Cal Regional, Long Beach State beat Cal 2-1 to advance to the WCWS. The year before, the Bears hosted San Jose State and beat the Spartans 6-1 to earn a trip to Oklahoma City. The first and only other time the Bears have hosted postseason play was in 1990, when San Jose State and UNLV made the trek to Berkeley with the Running Rebels winning it all by beating Cal 2-1. This year, Cal hosted Iona, Arkansas and Boston U, defeating Iona, falling to Arkansas, beating BU in the losers bracket and Arkansas twice in the championship to advance. Cal is 16-3 at home this season. They are led by Jamia Reid with 47 stolen bases and a .395 average. Valerie Arioto has been one of the top pitchers/hitters all year in the country. She is batting .387 with 22 home runs, a .968 slugging percentage and 87 walks. In the circle, she is 20-3 with a 1.32 ERA. Jolene Henderson is the other ace in the circle with a 34-2 record, 1.16 ERA and 284 strikeouts.

### Pac-12 Teams In The NCAA Tournament

Pac-12 schools have been dominant in the tournament. In the last six consecutive years, a Pac-12 school was crowned national champions. Since the inaugural NCAA tournament season in 1982, the Pac-12 has sent a team to the final series 28 of 30 years with a combined 23 national championship titles (UCLA-11, Arizona-8, Arizona State-2, Washington-1, Cal-1). The only other teams that have won the title came from the Big 10 (Michigan), the Big 12 (Oklahoma, Texas A&M), the WAC (Fresno State), and the Big West Conference (Cal State Fullerton). This year, five Pac-12 schools made Super Regionals: UW, Cal, Arizona, Arizona State and Oregon as UCLA, Stanford and Oregon State lost in Regional play.

### Huskies Win Seattle Regional

The Huskies had a week off between the end of Pac-12 play and NCAA Regionals. On Selection Sunday the UW found out it would be the No. 16 overall seed and host NCAA Regionals for the third-straight season. Also in the Seattle Regional would be Harvard, Maryland and Texas Tech. Harvard would advance to the championship game to face the Huskies for the second time but the UW finished a 3-0 sweep with three shutouts to take the Regional Championship. Shawna Wright, Nikia Williams and Kimberlee Souza were the big hitters on the weekend. All three UW pitchers, Kasey Stanchek, Bryana Walker and Kaitlin Inglesby combined for 21 shutout innings.

### Three Huskies Named To All-Pacific Region

The National Fastpitch Coaches Association announced their All-Region team and three Huskies were included in the Pacific Region selections. Senior Nikia Williams represents UW on the first-team, while senior Kimi Pohlman and sophomore Kaitlin Inglesby were awarded second-team honors. A two-time All-American selection, Williams (Mission Viejo, Calif.) has earned All-Region honors for the fourth consecutive year. Pohlman (Sammamish, Wash.) has earned All-Region honors for the third time in her Husky career while this is Inglesby's (Portland, Ore.) first All-Region selection. A total of 263 players representing 129 different institutions comprise this season's regional teams, including first and second teams for each region. The all-region teams were chosen by NFCA member coaches from each region, and all the honorees will now be eligible for selection to one of three 2012 NFCA Division I All-American teams. In addition, conference pitchers and players of the year not selected to the regional teams were added for All-America consideration. Just five of the 129 teams that received an award this season had each of their six nominees selected to an all-region team. No. 2 Arizona State, No. 3 Alabama, No. 7 Louisiana-Lafayette, No. 12 Oregon and No. 15 UCLA all placed six student-athletes on one of their respective region's two teams. Alabama was the only team this year to place all six of its nominees on its respective region's first team. Louisiana-Lafayette and No. 5 Tennessee followed closely behind the Tide with five first-team choices each. The 2012 NFCA Division I All-America teams will be announced at 4 p.m. CDT on Wednesday, May 30, on NFCA.org.

and sophomore Kaitlin Inglesby were named to the first team, senior Nikia Williams earned second-team honors and sophomore Victoria Hayward and freshmen Kylee Lahners and Kimberlee Souza earned honorable mention. Pohlman (Sammamish, Wash.) was also a first-team selection last year, a second-team honoree in 2010 and earned all-freshman honors in 2009. She was one of 25 finalists for the USA Softball Player of the Year this season and in Pac-12 play had 13 runs, 23 hits, four doubles, a triple and seven stolen bases. The sophomore pitcher, Inglesby (Portland, Ore.), earned first-team honors this year after being named second-team and all-freshman team a year ago. She was also one of the 25 finalists for the USA Softball Player of the Year and named national player/pitcher of the week and earned Pac-12 weekly honors. She led the team in conference play in batting (.379), doubles (five), home runs (five), RBI (24), total bases (45) and slugging percentage (.682). Williams, along with Pohlman, has earned all-conference honors all four seasons. The Mission Viejo, Calif., native earned first-team honors last year, second-team in 2010 and all-freshman honors in 2009. Williams was one of the top 50 Preseason Selections for USA Player of the Year this season. In the Pac-12, Williams was tied for second on the team batting .333 with three home runs and 19 walks. This is the first all-conference honor for Hayward (Mountain View, Calif.) who tied with Williams for a .333 batting average in Pac-12 play. She also had 26 hits, eight stolen bases and a perfect fielding percentage. Lahners earned honorable mention and all-freshmen honorable mention. The Laguna Hills, Calif., native was solid for UW at second base, leading a young group of infielders. She had two doubles and a home run in conference play. Souza was named to honorable mention on the all-freshmen team. Starting at shortstop for UW in all 23 conference games, the Waialua, Hawai'i, native had 12 hits, two doubles, a triple and a home run.

College Sports Madness Pac-12 Teams

UCLA Takes Two Games, Series From UW

The Huskiesl lost a heartbreaker in game one of the series vs. UCLA. On Friday, the Huskies were up 5-0 heading into the sixth inning before allowing seven runs with two outs to fall 7-5. UW was shutout 5-0 in game two but came back on Sunday for a 5-2 victory for the game three win.

Huskies And Ducks Split, Game Three Rained Out

After two days and multiple rain delays, the No. 7/8 Huskies and No. 19/15 Ducks finally got two Pac-12 games in in Eugene, Ore. Oregon won game one, 5-3 and UW took game two, 6-3 in nine innings. Kaitlin Inglesby hit a three-win game-winning home run in the ninth of game two for the win.

Huskies Break Five-Game Losing Streak

Arizona came to Seattle and took the first two games and the series from UW but the Huskies won the final game to snap a five-game losing streak. Kaitlin Inglesby went 0-2 in the circle but got a save in the final game as Bryana Walker got the win. Inglesby was the leading hitter at the plate on the weekend.

No. 1/1 Cal Takes Series From UW

UW's first Pac-12 road trip to No. 1/1 Cal didn't quite go the way UW had planned, being swept by the Golden Bears. The Huskies had a 1-0 lead in game one on Friday entering the seventh and needing just one out, Cal hit a two-RBI single to left to take the game. Saturday's game was rained out so the two played a doubleheader on Sunday and UW rallied in the seventh in both games but it wasn't enough. Kaitlin Inglesby led the Huskies at the plate on the weekend and Bryana Walker pitched 3.0 scoreless innings in relief.

In the first-ever Pac-12 series, UW swept newcomer Utah, 3-0, with wins of 5-1, 6-1 and 3-1. Kaitlin Inglesby led the team at the plate batting .667 with six hits, one double, two home runs, eight RBI and a 1.444 slugging percentage. In the circle, Kasey Stanchek went 2-0 with a 0.64 ERA and nine strikeouts in 11.0 innings, allowing just one earned run.

**Inglesby Named Pac-12/National Player Of The Week**  
Husky sophomore p/dp, Kaitlin Inglesby, earned her first Pac-12 and ESPN Softball Collegiate Player of the Week honor for her play in the Judi Garman Classic in Fullerton, Calif. She helped the Huskies to a 4-0 record and a five-inning run rule victory over then-No. 24/25 DePaul. She led the team with a .692 average, four runs, nine hits, three doubles, a home run, nine RBI, a 1.154 slugging percentage, no strikeouts, a .692 on base percentage and a perfect fielding percentage. She also went 2-0 in the circle with a save.

**Huskies Sweep DH At CSUB**  
UW improved to 29-1 on the year with a doubleheader sweep at Cal State Bakersfield on Monday. UW won by games in five-innings, 12-0 and 15-4. Sophomore Bryana Walker got the win in game one while Inglesby got the win in game two. Freshman Kylee Lahners led UW in the series hitting .800 with three runs, four hits, two doubls, four RBI and a 1.200 slugging percentage. Freshman Kasey Stanchek pitched 3.0 scoreless innings in relief, allowing just one hit.

**UW Goes 4-0 at Judi Garman Classic**  
UW went a perfect 4-0 in the final pre-season tournament in Fullerton, Calif. Saturday's game vs. No. 7/7 Oklahoma got rained out, but UW had two wins on Thursday vs. UC Davis and Iowa then dropped Notre Dame and No. 24/25 DePaul on Friday.

**Coach Tarr Milestones**  
Head coach Heather Tarr picked up her 200th career victory with a win over San Diego State in 2010 and picked up win No. 250 at the Aztecs' home field over Northwestern in 2011. In the first game of the Husky Softball Classic this season with a win over Seattle U, Tarr picked up her 300th career victory.

**Fagaly Has Huge Weekend In Husky Softball Classic**  
UW won its season-opening tournament, going 4-0 against Seattle U and North Dakota. Sophomore Hooch Fagaly had her biggest weekend after coming back from tearing her ACL last season. She hit over .700 and led the team in RBI and hit her first home run of the season.

**Pohlman & Williams Selected In NPF Senior Draft**  
Kimi Pohlman and Nikia Williams became the sixth and seventh players in UW history to be selected in the NPF Senior Draft on March 7. Pohlman became the highest-ever Husky selected with the No. 2 overall pick by the Chicago Bandits. Williams (Mission Viejo, Calif.) was the 16th overall pick and the fourth pick of the fourth round by the USSSA Florida Pride. Both Pohlman and Williams were members of the 2009 UW national championship team and have earned numerous all-conference, all-region and All-American honors. Both players were named to the Top 50 Pre-Season Player of the Watch list twice and to the WCWS All-Tournament team as freshmen in 2009. The senior outfielder, Pohlman has been the leadoff batter the past two years and a starting outfielder for UW all four seasons. She ranks in the top 10 all-time in school history in stolen bases, on base percentage, batting average and hit by pitch. Williams, a utility player for the Huskies, ranks in the top 10 all-time in home runs, RBI, slugging percentage and on base percentage. She was also a Lowe's Senior CLASS Award nominee this season. UW's Jenn Salling was the highest-ever player selected from UW before this year, being drafted No. 3 overall by the USSSA Pride last season. Salling along with former Huskies Ashley Charters and Danielle Lawrie all play for the USSSA Florida Pride. Charters was drafted in 2009 by the Rockford Thunder as the 11th overall pick and the first pick of the third round. Aimee Minor was the second pick of the third round in 2006 to Connecticut. Kristen Rivera was the sixth overall pick in the first round to the Texas Thunder in 2005. Tia Bollinger was the 32nd overall pick in the fifth round to the Akron Racers in 2004. The 2012 NPF College Draft was dominated by seven selections from the PAC-12 Conference. Of the seven choices there were two each at the University of Washington, UCLA, and Cal. Arizona State was represented with one selection. The SEC, which dominated the 2011 Draft fell into a not-so-close second place with four players selected. Brittany Mack was the No. 1 overall pick by the Pride out of LSU. Re-broadcast information on the 2012 Draft can be found at [www.profastpitch.com](http://www.profastpitch.com). Due to NCAA regulations, an active college senior-athlete is not eligible to sign with her respective franchise until her 2011 season is complete.

**Walker Throws No-Hitter In Louisville Slugger Classic**  
UW went 5-0 for the third tournament this season, winning its second pre-season tournament, the Louisville Slugger Invitational hosted by Pacific in Stockton, Calif. UW defeated Pacific twice, Sacramento State once and Delaware twice on the way to the championship. In the first-ever game between UW and Delaware, sophomore pitcher Bryana Walker threw her first career no-hitter. Walker allowed just three base runners, one that was walked, one that got hit by a pitch and another on a Husky error in 5.0 innings. It was the 27th no-hitter in UW history and the first by a pitcher on the current Husky roster. The last UW no-hitter came from Danielle Lawrie who threw an 8-0 no-hitter vs. Stanford on May 7, 2012. It is the first non-conference no-hitter since Lawrie took out Auburn 5-0 on March 11, 2010. Senior Nikia Williams also had a huge weekend, being named one of the top performers of the week by the NFCA after batting .533 with six runs, eight hits, two doubles, a triple, a home run, 10 RBI, a 1.000 slugging percentage and a .611 on base percentage.

**Huskies Take Down Four Top 25 Teams In Cathedral City**  
UW went to the Cathedral City Classic undefeated and ready to face five Top 25 teams. The Huskies were impressive on the week, handing No. 1 Florida its first loss of the season in the 5-2 victory. UW also defeated No. 16 Texas A&M (8-2), No. 13 Georgia (7-5) and No. 22 Nebraska (6-3). UW's only loss was a 2-0 game to No. 11 Missouri.

**GoHuskies.com Honors Inglesby**  
For her performance in the Cathedral City Classic, Kaitlin Inglesby was named the GoHuskies.com Student-Athlete of the Week for the week of Feb. 20-26. Inglesby went 3-0 in the circle, picking up wins over No. 1 Florida, No. 16 Texas A&M and No. 22 Nebraska. At the plate, she led UW in RBI and was one of the top overall hitters on the weekend. She also was named Pitcher of the Week and Pac-12 Player of the Week by College Softball Madness.

**UW Improves To 10-0 With Wins In San Diego**  
The Huskies spent the second weekend of the season at the Campbell/Cartier Classic in San Diego, hosted by USD and SDSU. UW went a perfect 5-0 with wins over UCF, UCSB, Boise State, USD and UC Davis. Freshman Kasey Stanchek was impressive in the circle, going 3-0 with a 1.17 ERA in three starts with one complete game shutout. Kaitlin Inglesby went 2-0 with a 1.40 ERA and Bryana Walker had two saves in the five games. At the plate, Jerrin

Huskies Named Co-Champs Of Kajikawa Classic

UW opened the 2012 season as co-champs of the Kajikawa Classic hosted by Arizona State in Tempe, Ariz., Feb. 9-12. UW, along with New Mexico, was one of two teams out of the 28 in attendance to go 5-0. The Huskies were led by junior catcher Shawna Wright on the weekend. Wright hit .545 with six hits, one double, two RBIs and five walks, getting all five starts behind the plate. Junior Kimi Pohlman, freshman Courtney Gano and senior Taylor Smith all hit .500. Freshman Kylee Lahners hit .429 with three home runs. In the circle, sophomore Kaitlin Inglesby went 3-0 with a save and a 1.50 ERA. UW defeated No. 21 Nebraska in game one with a 4-0 shutout. The Huskies also defeated San Jose State (9-4), Idaho State (10-2, 5 innings), Northwestern (10-3) and Texas State (12-3, 6 innings).

Inglesby Named Pac-12 Pitcher Of The Week/NFCA POW

Sophomore pitcher Kaitlin Inglesby was named Pac-12 Softball Pitcher of the Week for February 6-12, Commissioner Larry Scott announced. Just hours after she earned Pac-12 honors, the NFCA announced that Inglesby was the National Player of the Week. Inglesby picked up where she left off her freshman year, leading the Huskies to a perfect 5-0 record and the co-championship of the Kajikawa Classic. Inglesby went 3-0 in the circle with two complete games, one save and a 1.17 ERA. She allowed just three earned runs in 18.0 innings, struck out 14 and held opponents to a .169 average. In the season opener against No. 21 Nebraska, Inglesby had a complete game shutout with five strikeouts as the Huskies won 4-0. Not only was Inglesby impressive in the circle but at the plate she hit .400 with four runs, six hits, three home runs, six RBIs, a 1.000 slugging percentage, three walks and no strikeouts. This is Inglesby's second career Pitcher of the Week honor and Washington's 83rd award.

Pohlman And Williams Named To Top 50 Player Of The Year Watch List

Washington seniors Kimi Pohlman and Nikia Williams were among 50 players named to the "Watch List" for the 2012 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year award, announced Wednesday by the Amateur Softball Association (ASA) of America. Pohlman, a two-time First-Team All-Pac-10 and three-time All-Pacific Region, was previously named to the Watch List in her sophomore season. The Sammamish, Wash., native started in 52 of 53 games in 2011 and had the team highest overall at-bats (183), runs scored (57), hits (79) and batting average (.432), which ranks sixth in the Husky single-season record book. She owned a .536 slugging percentage and hit three home runs, two in a single game and one of which was an inside the park home run. The left-handed outfielder continued her success in stealing bases, swiping 25 of 29 bases last season, which put her in the Husky all-time record book ranked eighth in career stolen bases (67-75), not to mention she is tied for fourth in batting average (.379) and 10th in on-base percentage (.424). She also had a 10-game hitting streak and broke a 9.0 consecutive scoreless innings for Missouri pitcher Chelsea Thomas in the NCAA Super Regional. Williams, a First-Team All-Pac-10 and All-Pacific Region last year, was a top 25 finalist for this very award last season. In 2011, she was a Second-Team NFCA All-American, named to the Seattle Regional All-Tournament team and invited to the National Team training camp. She was also a member of the USA Softball Futures team in 2010. The Mission Viejo, Calif., native started in all 53 games and batted .364 with 56 hits in 154 at-bats, recording 42 runs, 12 doubles, one triple. She led the team in home runs (14) and RBIs (56) with a .727 slugging percentage, which ranks her in the top 10 in the Husky career records for those categories. In game one of a doubleheader against Cal State Bakersfield (3/22), she hit a two-out solo home run and was a triple shy of the cycle. She also had 327 putouts, the most on the team. The USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year award recognizes outstanding athletic achievement by female collegiate softball players across the country. The only Husky to win this prestigious individual honor was All-American pitcher Danielle Lawrie, winning it twice in 2009 and 2010. The pre-season "Watch List" includes 23 seniors, 20 juniors and seven sophomores, with freshman ineligible for consideration. (Freshman can be considered for the USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year award once they have competed at the collegiate level). Athletes named to the "Watch List" represent 31 NCAA Division I universities and 13 athletic conferences. The Pac-12 has six member schools represented.

The Top 25 Finalists for the 2012 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year award will be announced April 11. While an athlete does not have to be on the "Watch List" to be considered for the Top 25, the eventual USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year will come from the Top 25 Finalists. The Top 10 Finalists will be announced May 9 and the Top 3 Finalists will be announced May 23. On May 29 prior to the start of the 2012 NCAA Women's College World Series (WCWS) in Oklahoma City, the 2012 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year will be revealed.

Huskies Picked Sixth In Pre-Season Pac-12 Poll

The first-ever Pac-12 Pre-Season Coaches Poll has been announced and the defending champion Arizona State was nearly the unanimous No. 1 pick. Cal came in second, followed by Arizona, UCLA, Stanford, Washington, Oregon, Oregon State and Pac-12 newcomer Utah. Colorado does not sponsor a softball team. UW was picked sixth with 30 total points, just eight points behind No. 5 Stanford. The Pac-12 has kept records of the coaches poll dating back to 2001. Last season, UW was picked to tie for fourth with Cal and was picked first in 2010 after winning the 2009 national championship. In 2011, UW posted a 37-16 overall record and a 9-12 Pac-10 record. UW won conference series' last year against Oregon, Oregon State and Cal. The last time the Huskies faced Utah was in 2010 with decisive 8-0 victory.

Season Debuts

With their win in their season-opening game against No. 21 Northwestern on Feb. 9, the Huskies have won six-consecutive season openers. UW has opened each of its 20 seasons with a multiple-team tournament, accruing a 79-17-1 record. The Huskies have gone undefeated in eight of those tournaments (1996, 2000, '02, '03, '09, '10, '11, '12), including a 5-0 mark in this year's Kajikawa Classic. UW is 16-4 in season openers all-time.

Huskies Win Sixth Regional In Seven Years

The Huskies swept all three games in the Seattle Regional, with a 6-2 win over Portland State on May 19 and wins over BYU on May 20 and 21 (4-1 and 7-5, respectively). Inglesby was named tournament MVP and Salling, Wagner and Williams were named to the Seattle Regional NCAA Tournament Team. Also named to the tournament team were Auburn's Kelsey Cartwright and BYU's Caschjen Atagi and Paige Affleck.

The Last To Fall In 2011

Washington was the last undefeated team remaining in Division I softball in 2011 heading into the Judi Garman Classic in Fullerton, Calif. UW defeated Fresno State 10 (5) in the first game before suffering its first loss to No. 12 Texas. The Huskies also lost to nationally ranked Oklahoma in extra innings. Also on the weekend the Huskies defeated Notre Dame, Illinois and Boise State. Inglesby led the team on the week in the circle and earned Pac-10 Pitcher of the Week honors, the first such honor for a Husky this year. Inglesby led the team on the week with a 1.31 ERA in the tough Judi Garman Classic. She posted a 3-1 record in five appearances, two starts, two complete games, a shutout and a save in 26.2 innings pitched with 20 strikeouts and just five earned runs and four walks.

2011 Record Breakers

The Huskies had an offensive explosion on opening weekend of 2011, scoring 88 runs in just 27 innings. With nine home runs in game one vs. UCR, the Huskies set a new school record and it is the second-most in a single game in NCAA history. Taylor Smith herself had three, tying a school record in a game. Smith and Morgan Stuart both hit home runs in back-to-back at bats in the game, tying an NCAA record. Stuart had two in one inning. Against Mississippi State, the Huskies set a new school record for drawing 14 walks.
