BERKELEY – Tournament play just does not stop for the No. 10/11 California softball team. This weekend has the Bears heading south but not that as far as last weekend – making the trip to Fullerton for the DeMarini Invitational. In Fullerton on March 4, the Bears will play Northwestern (7-5) at 9 a.m.) and IPFW (4-0-1) at 11:15 a.m. Things wrap up Saturday with a 9 a.m. game versus Iowa (7-5) and an 11:15 a.m. match versus Murray State (2-4).

Cal looks to extend its seven-game winning steak, which was bolstered by a fantastic 4-0 outing at the Cathedral City Classic from Feb. 25-27. The Bears head to Fullerton fresh off their second-biggest win of the young season – an 11-3 win over then-No. 20 LSU on Feb. 26.

Offensively, freshman shortstop Britt Vonk paces the Bears with her .536 batting average and .639 on-base percentage, which rank her second and third in the Pac-10, respectively. Junior left fielder Jamia Reid had a fantastic outing in the desert last weekend, batting a team high .571 and slugging .857.

Sophomore pitcher Jolene Henderson paced Cal at the Cathedral City Classic with five RBI, three of which came off a home run against LSU. Jordan Wallace stepped up to the plate literally and metaphorically with three RBI of her own.

Jamia Reid leads the Bears on the base paths with eight steals, five of which came last weekend.

Jubilant Jolene

With her 28.2 innings of work in Cathedral City, Calif., Jolene Henderson bettered her stats across the board. She nearly doubled her innings pitched from the previous weekend, upping her total to 63.2 and improving her and Cal's overall record to 9-1. Henderson dropped her opposing batter's average by .03, bringing it to .163. She also enhanced her ERA by three-hundredths to a season-low 0.77.

The Bears in the No. 1 Conference

- **Pitching:** Cal is tops in the Pac-10 with a 0.94 team ERA and boasts the lowest opposing batting average at .167
- **Fielding:** The Bears are second in the conference with a .971 fielding percentage. Playing errorless ball is something Cal prides itself on and has the laurels to prove it
- **Britt Vonk:** The freshman is second of all student-athletes in the Pac-10 with a .536 batting average and third with her

.639 on-base percentage

- **Jamia Reid:** She ranks fourth with eight steals
- **Jolene Henderson:** The pitcher is first with 63.2 innings pitched and tied for first with 22 batters struck out looking, second with a 0.77 ERA and nine wins, and third with a .163 opposing batter's average

wins over Indiana, UMass, then-No. 20 LSU and Cal Poly. Jolene Henderson got all four wins to improve her personal record as well as that of the Bears to 9-1.

- **Inside Indiana:** After almost nine complete innings of play against the Hoosiers on Feb. 25, it came down to a single pitch – a wild pitch that is – for Cal to get a 4-3 win over Indiana. After the Bears had matched the Hoosiers' two runs in the eighth to continue the extra-innings battle, an errant throw from Hoosier pitcher Morgan Melloh allowed Frani Echavarria to score the run in the bottom of the ninth and end the game
- **Unfolding UMass:** After playing nine innings against Indiana immediately before taking on UMass, the Bears outshined the Minutewomen, 4-0. Cal carried offensive powers from the first game right into the second, scoring two runs in the first and second to overpower UMass with junior left fielder Jamia Reid pacing both sides with two hits, two runs and an RBI. Sophomore hurler Jolene Henderson pitched a two-hitter, striking out 10 after she fanned 11 in the game prior
- **Illuminating LSU:** In the second game of the season against a ranked opponent, Cal trounced then-No. 20 LSU, 11-3, in no small part due to Henderson pitching the complete-game win, giving up just three runs against a potent Tiger offense, but she also hit a three-run homer in the top of the seventh to push Cal (8-1) past LSU (10-5). The Bears scored at least one run in all but two innings, establishing a five-run lead before the Tigers could even get on the board with three runs in the bottom of the third. Jordan Wallace played an instrumental role in getting past LSU with a three-run home run in the top of the third, and Lindsey Ziegenhirt also drove in two RBI of her own.
- **Capping Cal Poly:** The Bears ended their weekend with a 2-0 over Cal Poly on Feb. 27. Cal scored once in the first and the sixth to top the Mustangs. Jace Williams had the first RBI and Frani Echavarria had a high fly ball to center that fell for a hit to score Williams in the sixth. Jolene Henderson earned her fourth win of the weekend and ninth of the year in the circle.

Jamia Reid continues to put herself in the company of the best in Cal history, catching records and then surpassing them. Midway through the 2010 season, Reid became the all-time steals leader. By the end of her sophomore season, she had 95. With eight more to her credit thus far into 2011, she holds steady at No. 1 with 103. Britt Vonk looks to join her ranks, going six for eight through 10 games this season.

Circle Watch

In Tempe, Ariz. and last weekend in Palm Springs, head coach Diane Ninemire utilized two pitchers – Jolene Henderson and Arianna Erceg. In all, Henderson owns a 0.77 ERA with 63.2 innings pitched. She's 9-1 on the season and has given up just seven earned runs while striking out 63. She has regulated her batters faced to a .163 overall batting average. Since her first year in the dugout in 1988, Diane Ninemire has continually taken the Bears to new heights as one of the winningest and most successful softball programs in the nation.

From 1999-2005, Cal made seven straight trips to the College World Series. With a national championship, nine Women's College World Series trips, and 22 straight NCAA Regional appearances to her credit, it is no wonder that Cal enters every season as a national contender. In addition to posting their 37th consecutive winning record in 2010, the Bears finished 10-11 in the Pac-10 Conference to tie for fourth. During Ninemire's tenure at Cal, 36 All-America, 90 all-region, and 156 all-conference certificates have been issued to Golden Bear athletes.

Thanks to a 6-0 victory over Sacramento State on April 7, Ninemire became the ninth coach in the history of Division I softball to notch 1,000 wins. Already the winningest coach - male or female - in all of Cal history for any sport, she has accumulated the second-most wins in Pac-10 history. History was made in 2002 when Ninemire helped direct Cal to its first NCAA Championship at the WCWS with a 6-0 win over the Arizona Wildcats, the first women's title in Cal athletic program history.

Prior to the 2009 season, Ninemire was announced as one of three members to be inducted into the National Fastpitch Coaches Association's 2009 Hall of Fame class. Ninemire, who joined Frank Cheek of Humboldt State and Bill Edwards of Hofstra, was inducted into the NFCA Hall of Fame on Friday, Dec. 11 2009, at the Renaissance Hotel in Nashville, Tenn.

Ninemire began her collegiate playing career at Midland Lutheran College leading the team to a state championship as a freshman. After one season, she transferred to Nebraska-Omaha, where she played on both the softball and basketball teams for three years. A shortstop and left fielder, Ninemire helped UNO to the 1978 championship and three appearances in the College World Series.

Ninemire graduated from UNO in 1980 and completed her master's degree in physical education at Texas Woman's University in 1987. She began her coaching career at TWU in 1980 as Donna Terry's assistant before heading west to assist Terry and the Golden Bear program in 1983.

Though speedster Shannon Thomas, who trailed Jamia Reid ever so slightly in steals last season, graduated, the Bears are still racking up the steals on the base paths. In the first weekend of play, Cal went 11-14 in steals with nine different Bears attempting one or more steals and with Britt Vonk going a team high 3-for-3. Vonk upped her total to six and Reid now has eight.

Coming back for her junior season is Jamia Reid, who bested her own steals record last year with 48 and landed on the All-Pacific First Team. Also returning to the field are six of Cal's 10 All-Pac-10 teamers, including junior outfielder Frani Echavarria, junior utility Jace Williams and sophomore catcher Lindsey Ziegenhirt. A talented crop of eight freshmen will join the returners. Ready for her 24th season at the helm of the Bears is head coach Diane Ninemire, who won her 1,000th game last season.

The Bears began their season very close to where they ended the 2010 campaign - as the No. 12 team in the country. The nation's leading authority on rankings - the USA Today/NFCA Division I Top-25 and ESPN.com/USA Softball Collegiate Top 25 polls - both heralded the Golden Bears as the No. 12 team in the country.

Opening Day

With its 14-1 smoldering of Cal State Bakersfield on Feb. 11 to start the season, Cal returned to successful opening day history after dropping the season opener last season, 3-2, to Texas A&M for the first time since 1997. In four of the past six season lid lifters, the Bears have scored 10+ runs.

Pac-10 Coaches Envisage Cal Finishing Fourth

If the predictions of the Pac-10 Conference's softball coaches come true, Cal will tie for fourth with Washington, according to the annual preseason coaches' poll. The Golden Bears, along with the Huskies, earned 26 votes for the possible fourth-place finish. Defending national champion UCLA and runner-up Arizona tied for first place,

each amassing 46 points and four first-place votes. Arizona State holds sole possession of third with 30 points. Stanford came in behind archrival Cal in sixth place, earning four points less than the Bears. Oregon (21 points) and Oregon State (seven points) round out the poll in seventh and eighth place, respectively.

Remembering Last Season

The 2010 Bears chalked up yet another winning year and a successful run into the postseason to which the Bears are accustomed – advancing to Super Regional play after demolishing the Columbus Regional. In addition to posting their 37th consecutive winning record in 2010, the Bears finished 10-11 in the Pac-10 Conference to tie for fourth. The Bears were one of the seven Pac-10 teams to earn an at-large bid to the postseason, marking their 25th consecutive trip to NCAA tournament, which is the second-longest streak in the nation. Cal earned rankings in the top 25 of both polls for the entirety of this season, with ESPN.Com/USA Softball poll tagging the Bears as high as 11 (preseason-Feb. 23) and USA Today/NFCA's highest ranking was 12th, which occurred several times (preseason-Feb. 16, May 11). The Bears never dipped lower than 19 according to ESPN.com/USA Softball or 16th in the USA Today/NFCA poll.

Arioto, Reid Named to ASA Top-50 Watch List

Valerie Arioto and Jamia Reid were selected to the Amateur Softball Association of America (ASA)'s initial watch list for the 10th annual USA Softball National Collegiate Player of the Year Award. With her, she will bring international experience from her time playing with the U.S. junior national team, winning a gold medal this past summer in Columbia. Kostreba comes to Berkeley by way of Aptos, Calif., where she has already accumulated multiple accolades in just three years, including a league championship, and has national team and ASA experience as well.

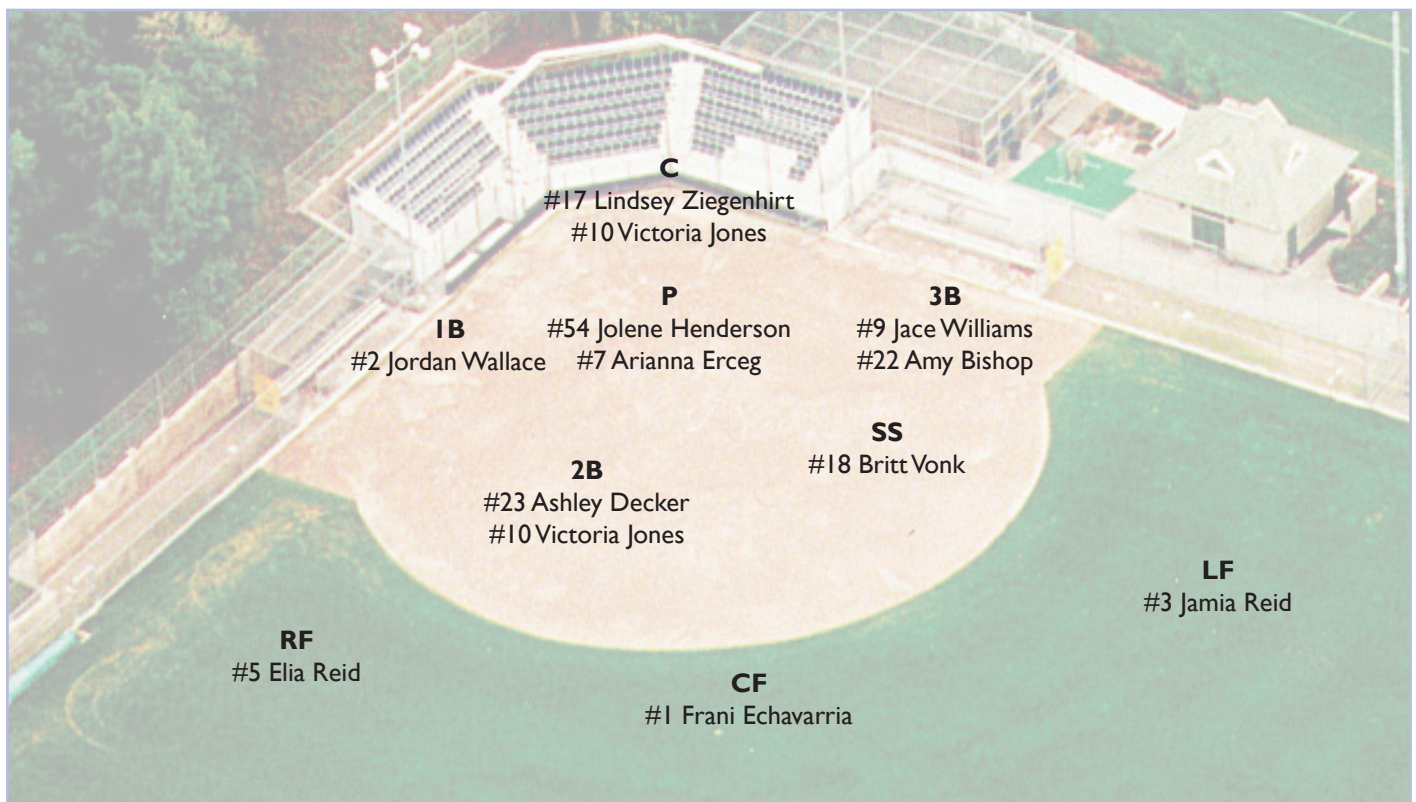
