2002-03 SEASON OUTLOOK

STARS ELEVATE CAL TO LEVEL OF 2002-03 ELITE

or a team that returns 15 letterwinners from a season ago, including six All-Americans, it's little wonder why the University of California women's swimming team is a perennial Top 10 program. The 2002-03 squad is an experienced team, losing only one senior from last year. But for a program that has finished in the Top 10 nationally for the past five seasons, it's time to move into the Top 5.

Golden Bear head coach Teri McKeever, the 2002 American Swimming Coaches Association and Pacific-10 Coach of the Year, believes this season's team has the desire, drive and capability of making that transition.

"Our definite expectations are to remain a Top 10 program, and we will have to be at our best to make that jump into becoming a Top 5 program," McKeever said. "That will take a commitment from all of us."

Junior Natalie Coughlin will lead a Golden Bears' squad primed for success. For the past two seasons, Coughlin has dominated women's swimming, winning two consecutive NCAA Swimmer of the Year awards. At the 2002 NCAA Championships, she won all three titles she competed for—100 butterfly and 100 and 200 backstroke—breaking the NCAA, American and U.S. Open records she set in those events last season. She also helped the Bears to national runnerup finishes in the 200 and 400 medley relays and swam an NCAA, American and U.S. Open best in the first leg of the 400 freestyle relay. Coughlin was also named the 2002 Pac-10

Swimmer of the Year for the second time in a row, after setting new conference records in the 200 free and 100 and 200 back and continuing her unbeaten streak of dual meet league races. During her superb sophomore season, she was honored as one of five finalists for the AAU James E. Sullivan Award as the nation's top amateur athlete.

Coughlin topped her collegiate honors by earning the USA Swimming Athlete of the Year award and the ConocoPhillips Performance of the Year award for her world record-breaking swim in the 100-meter back. At 59.58, she shattered the world record, becoming the first female to ever post a subminute finish. Coughlin recorded that time at the U.S. Summer National Championships, where she became the first swimmer since 1978 to win five titles. At the 2002 Pan Pacific Championships, she became the first U.S. woman and the second female in history to break 54 seconds in the 100-meter free (53.99), and won four gold medals at the meet in Japan, tying Australian Ian Thorpe for most overall medals. Coughlin now holds three world records, 27 American records and nine school records.

Coughlin is not the only Cal swimmer with experience beyond the collegiate confines. Senior Staciana Stitts has been a solid contributor for the Bears for the past three seasons and brings great skill to the pool. The school record holder in the 100 and 200 breaststroke, she was also a part of Cal's school record-setting 200 and 400 medley relays. Stitts, an Olympic gold medallists, earned a gold medal as a member of the United States' 400-meter

medley relay at the 2000 Sydney Olympics, swimming in the morning prelims. She earned All-America honors last season after placing fourth in the 100 breast. Newcomers Ashley Chandler and Flora Kong also bring top level experience with them to Cal. Chandler competed in both the 2001 World Championships and 2001 Goodwill Games, while Kong swam in the 2002 Asian Games, 2001 World Championships and 2000 Sydney Olympics.

Several others will assist in providing leadership for a seasoned Cal team. Seniors Micha Burden and Michelle Harper, junior Danielle Becks, and sophomore Lauren Medina each earned All-America recognition last season. Becks was part of the national runner-up 200 and 400 medley relay teams and also swam on the 200 and 400 free relays that turned in fourth and fifth-place national finishes respectively. Harper was also part of the 200 and 400 free relays at NCAAs. Burden and Medina helped the 800 free relay team to a ninth-place showing.

McKeever is excited about this season's incoming class of seven freshmen and expects them to make significant contributions almost immediately. The newcomers—Cheryl Anne Bingaman, Ashley Chandler, Flora Kong, Gina

Merlone, Whitney Rockwell, Helen Silver and Kate Tiedeman—are a versatile bunch that will add to the depth and diversity this season's team embodies.

"I think that for the first time in two or three years, this is one of the more seasoned teams we have had at Cal," McKeever said. "There will be good leadership in the pool with people like Staciana, Natalie, Michelle and Danielle. And we have a lot of women that can help us in different strokes, while also able to showcase a wide range of ability from a 50-yard event to a 500-yard event.

"I think we need to continue to have each individual athlete strive to reach their potential and do all of the things that will help them excel," McKeever said. "If we do that, this team is going to continue to succeed."

The following is an event-by-event look at the 2002-03 California Golden Bears:

FREESTYLE

Juniors **Natalie Coughlin**, **Danielle Becks** and senior **Michelle Harper** will be the Bears' top freestylers. Coughlin held Cal's best times in the 50, 100, 200 and 500 free last season, setting school records in the 50 free (22.21), 100 free (47.47) and 200 free (1:43.30). Her time in the 100 free was also an NCAA, U.S. Open and American record.

Becks held Cal's second-best times in the 50 free (23.04), 100 free (49.96) and 200 free (1:47.22). She swam the freestyle legs on the national runner-up 200 and 400 medley relay teams last season, while Harper helped the 200 and 400 free relay teams to Top 5 finishes at the 2002 NCAA Championships.

Other freestylers include sophomores **Emma Palsson** and **Keiko Amano**, and incoming freshmen **Cheryl Anne Bingaman** and **Whitney Rockwell**. Palsson finished 13th in the 50 free (23.61) at last season's Pac-10 Championships, and Amano will provide depth in the sprint events. Bingaman was a three-time high school All-American and set records in the 50 and 100 free during high school. Rockwell went undefeated in dual meet races during her prep years and set several Maine state records, including top times in the 50 and 100 free.

McKeever believes that the Bears are improved in the middle and long distance freestyle. Returning honorable mention All-Americans, senior **Micha Burden** and junior **Lauren Medina**, and sophomore **Lisa Morelli** will provide depth in the middle distance events. Both swimmers were part of Cal's 800 free relay team that placed ninth at the 2002 NCAA Championships. Burden held the Bears' third-best times in the 500 free (4:51.38) and 1650 free (17:05.33), and she and Medina scored points for the Bears in the 200, 500 and 1650 free at the 2002 Pac-10 Championships. Last season, Morelli had Cal's second-best time in the 1000 free (10:04.26).

Morelli has really stepped up in the distance events and owns Cal's top returning time from last year in the 1650 free (16:59.77). Newcomers **Ashley Chandler** and **Kate Tiedeman** are also expected to add to the Bears' distance corps. Chandler, who should help Cal with the middle and distance free, joins the Bears after a remarkable high school career. As a prep, she was a national champion in the 400 free and Arizona state champion in the 500 free. Chandler was a 2001 U.S. National team member and competed in the 2001 World Championships and 2001 Goodwill Games. Tiedeman was a four-time high school MVP and a school and league record holder in the 500 free.

BREASTSTROKE

In the breaststroke events, Olympic gold medallist Staciana Stitts will lead the Bears. Several swimmers will be looked upon to help Stitts in the breaststroke, including sophomores Erin Calder, Marcelle Miller, Leah Monroe and Jenna Rais, and freshman Gina Merlone.

Stitts is the school record holder in the 100 breast (1:00.31) and 200 breast (2:11.34), and was part of last season's school record-setting 200 and 400 medley relays. At the NCAA Championships, she placed fourth in the 100 breast (1:00.40) and also notched fourth place finishes in the 100 and 200 breast at the Pac-10s.





Calder posted Cal's third-best time in the 100 breast (1:05.60), while Miller had the Bears' second-best time in the 100 breast (1:05.11) and third-best time in the 200 breast (2:18.70). Monroe owned Cal's second-best time in the 200 breast (2:18.51) and Rais set a personal best time in the 200 breast (2:20.21) at the 2002 Pac-10 Championships. Merlone set her high school's record in the 100 breast, as well as club records in the 100 and 200 breast.

BACKSTROKE

Natalie Coughlin lays claim to the title as best female backstroker in the world. Coughlin capped winning three national titles at last season's NCAA Championships by setting her third world record this past August at the U.S. Summer Nationals. At the summer nationals, she swam the 100-meter back in 59.58 to set the world record and become the first female to ever procure a sub-minute finish in that event. At the NCAA Championships, Coughlin won the 100 back (49.97) and 200 back (1:49.52), resetting the national records she broke in those events just a year ago. She also established new Pac-10 Championships records in those events as well.

Sophomore **Amy Ng** and freshman **Helen Silver** will also compete in the backstroke events for Cal. Ng held the Bears' fourth-best time in the 200 back (2:00.89) last season as a freshman. Silver is expected to make an immediate impact in backstroke events, as she was a four-time high school All-American and three-time Washington state champion in the 100 back.

RELAYS

Last season, Cal was exceptional in the relay events. This year should be no different as the core of those relay teams return. Cal loses only one swimmer (Alice Henriques) from last year's national runner-up and school record setting 200 medley (1:37.88) and 400 medley (3:32.55) relay teams, comprised of Natalie Coughlin, Staciana Stitts and Danielle Becks. With a spot available on those teams, Natalie Griffith or Flora Kong, could possibility fill Henriques role.

The 200 free (1:30.13) and 400 free (3:17.52) relays return in tact with

Coughlin, Stitts, Becks and **Michelle Harper**, but could be bolstered by newcomers in the sprints, **Cheryl Anne Bingaman** and **Whitney Rockwell**. Last season's 800 free relay placed ninth at the NCAA Championships and returns the majority of that group in Becks, Burden and Medina. **Ashley Chandler** should be a top contender for the open spot on the 800 free relay.

DIVING

Senior **Christina Flynn** is Cal's top diving returnee, qualifying for the 2002 Zone E Championships, and turning in a Top 20 finish in the three-meter diving competition (20th, 241.95). Flynn also notched an 11th-place finish in the one-meter event (225.90) at the 2002 Pac-10 Championships. She also placed 17th in the platform (292.00) and 18th in the three-meter (403.05) competitions at the league championships.

Joining Flynn is sophomore **Alyson Borawski** and redshirt freshman **Caitlin Shreve**. Last season, Borawski provided depth to the diving squad, while Shreve was injured and redshirted. Newcomer **Lauren Smith**, a local product from the North Bay, graduated from Redwood High School in Larkspur, Calif. and competed for the North Bay Diving Club.

BUTTERFLY

Natalie Coughlin is also tops among the nation's butterfliers, as she returns to defend her two-time NCAA record setting 100 fly (50.01). Junior Natalie Griffith, and sophomores Lisa Morelli and Emma Palsson, also contributed in the butterfly events last year. Newcomer Flora Kong will also provide depth in the butterfly.

Griffith is another Cal swimmer with great versatility as she can also swim freestyle and individual medley events as well. Morelli had Cal's third-fastest time in the 200 fly (2:02.72), while Palsson placed 11th in the 100 fly at the Pac-10 Championships and held the Bears' third-fastest time in that event (55.80). Kong set her high school's record in the 100 fly and has international experience, participating in the 2002 Asian Games, 2001 World Championships and 2000 Sydney Olympics.

INDIVIDUAL MEDLEY

The individual medley events will be one of Cal's strengths this season.

Natalie Coughlin, Staciana Stitts and Amy Ng will anchor a talented group of individual medley swimmers. Natalie Griffith, Leah Monroe and Kate Tiedeman should also provide the Bears with depth in the IM events.

Last season, Coughlin held Cal's top time in the 200 IM at 1:57.54, which also stands as the third best time in school history. Stitts also did well in the 200 IM last year, posting Cal's sixth all-time best time at 2:00.42. Ng also etched her name into Cal's best times list as her mark of 4:18.18 in the 400 IM places her eighth all-time.

Junior Danielle Becks, one of Cal's top freestylers, helped the Bears to national runner-up finishes in the 200 and 400 medley relays last season.



CALIFORNIA HEAD COACH

TERI McKEEVER



11th Year at California

In just 10 years at the helm of the University of California's women's swimming program, Teri McKeever has set the Golden Bears apart as one of the most elite programs in the nation.

Coming into her 11th year at Cal, McKeever sports an impressive 85-37 dual meet record (.697). Eight out of the 10 years she has coached

in Berkeley, the Bears have encompassed winning seasons. With 15 years experience as a head coach, McKeever boasts a 139-59 overall record, good for a .702 winning percentage.

Perhaps even more impressive than her win-loss record, is McKeever's ability to motivate her teams into reaching high goals. In each of the past six seasons she has led the Bears to Top 10 national finishes.

Under McKeever's tutelage, eight different national champions emerged, while 31 different swimmers have earned All-American honors, and 38 different swimmers have inked their names on Cal's all-time Top 10 list. Among the most prominent swimmers to blossom under McKeever's guidance are the last four Pac-10 Swimmers of the Year—current Cal swimmer Natalie Coughlin (2001-02) and former Bear standouts, Haley Cope (2000) and Marylyn Chiang (1999). McKeever also coaches Staciana Stitts, who became the first Cal woman swimmer to earn an Olympic gold medal since Mary T. Meagher in 1984, when Stitts was a member of USA's gold medal winning 400 medley relay at the 2000 Sydney Olympics.

While swimming for McKeever at Cal, Chiang won a national title in the 100 back, becoming the first Cal swimmer to win a NCAA title since 1988. During Cope's time in Berkeley, McKeever placed her in the lead-off spot of the 200-meter medley relay and 200-meter free relay that won national titles in 2000. Cope set a short course world record for her 50-meter back leg of the medley relay. This past August, McKeever coached Cope and Coughlin to victories at the U.S. National Championships, where Coughlin became the first swimmer to win five national titles since 1978. Coughlin,

the 2001 and 2002 NCAA Swimmer of the Year, has racked up numerous records and awards under McKeever's guidance, posting three world records and 27 American records. She has notched six NCAA titles in her two years at Cal and holds nine school records.

McKeever's hands-on style of coaching provides the foundation on which swimmer's can build upon toward reaching their potential. McKeever's great coaching capability has been well noted by her peers as the American Swimming Coaches Association awarded her the 2002 Coach of the Year honor. She also won her second Pac-10 Coach of the Year award (2002 and

1999), and earned the George Haines Coach of the meet at the U.S. National Championships this past summer. She served as an assistant on the USA coaching staff at the 2002 Pan Pacific Games in Yokohama, Japan and was also an assistant U.S. coach at the 2001 Goodwill Games in Brisbane, Australia.

In May 2002, McKeever was awarded the National Collegiate and Scholastic Swimming Trophy for her outstanding contributions to swimming as a competitive sport and healthful recreational

activity. Along with Cal's accomplishments in the pool, the Bears consistently have one of the highest team GPA's in the nation. She has coached 11 different Academic All-Americans and numerous Pac-10 All-

Academic selections. McKeever strives to create a complete experience for swimmers at Cal, helping her student-athletes succeed both in and out of the water.

"For someone that comes to swim here, their Cal experience is to be part of a team and an extended family that is going to support and encourage them," McKeever said. "We are looking for athletes who are striving for a balance between excellence in the classroom and excellence in the pool."

McKeever, 40, came to Cal after spending five years at Fresno State where she also developed an outstanding program. She started at Fresno State in 1987 and spent two seasons in charge of the women's program before assuming the dual role of

men's and women's head coach from 1990-92.

In 1992, she was named the Big West Conference Women's Coach of the Year after leading the women's team to a 12-3 dual meet record and finishing fourth in the conference championships, the highest conference finish in Fresno State history.

McKeever has strong ties to the Pac-10 Conference, both as an athlete and as a coach. She worked as an assistant coach at USC from 1984 to '87, helping develop several All-Americans. McKeever is a former USC All-America herself, competing in the NCAA Championship meet all four years while at USC and helping the Trojans to four consecutive NCAA Top-10 finishes. She earned All-America honors in both 1980 and '81. As a senior in 1983, McKeever was named USC's Outstanding Student-Athlete.

McKeever graduated from USC in 1983 with a B.S. in education with two teaching credentials (multiple subject, secondary life science). In 1987, she also earned a Masters degree in athletic administration from USC. McKeever's father, Mike, was an All-American lineman for the Trojans' football team in 1959. McKeever comes from a family of 10 children, all with varied athletic backgrounds. Sisters Kristi and Kelli Gannon are both members of the U.S. National Field Hockey Team.

McKeever resides in Berkeley.

ASSISTANT COACHES

ADAM CROSSEN



Assistant Coach • 3rd year at California

The University of California women's swimming assistant coach, Adam Crossen, has accomplished a great deal with the Golden Bears' squad in the past two years.

Entering into his third season at Cal, Crossen has been instrumental in helping create one of the top women's swimming programs in the country.

During his two season's at Cal, the Bears have notched consecutive Top 10 national finishes, placing seventh at the 2001 NCAA Championships and eighth at the 2002 NCAA Championships. Crossen is involved in all facets of the program, including recruiting, compliance, training design and dry land preparation for the student-athletes.

Under Crossen's guidance, 12 swimmers have qualified for the NCAA Championships, setting seven American records, six NCAA records and winning six individual NCAA titles. All 12 of those swimmers earned All-America honors and 11 different swimmers have earned Pac-10 All-Academic honors in the past two years.

Crossen, 27, came to Cal after serving as a graduate assistant for both the men's and women's swimming programs at Auburn from 1997-2000. After helping the Tiger men to a national runner-up finish at the 1998 NCAA Championships, he helped coach the Tigers to a National Championship in 1999. Crossen also was involved in helping the Tiger women to strong national performances, as the Tiger women notched a fifth-place national finish during the 1999-2000 season, placed sixth in the nation in 1998 and 11th in 1999. Crossen was the head coach of the Auburn Master Team and worked as a coach and head counselor at the Auburn Swim Camp as well.

A four-year letterwinner in swimming at USC, Crossen competed for the Trojans from 1993-97 and graduated with a degree in exercise science. While a student-athlete at USC, he was a member of the Pac-10 Conference Student Athlete Committee. Crossen earned a master's in exercise physiology from Auburn in the summer of 2000.

"Adam is a good people person with strong communication skills. He is enthusiastic, and is great for our program," said head coach Teri McKeever.

PHIL TONNE



Diving Coach • 19th year at California

Tutoring both Cal's men and women divers for the 19th consecutive year is Phil Tonne, a former All-American diver at San Diego State.

In 1991, Melissa Graviss became the first Cal diver to qualify for the NCAA meet, earning All-American honors on the three-meter board. Graviss qualified for the NCAAs in both the one-meter and

three-meter competition in 1992.

Prior to coming to Cal in 1984, Tonne served in the same capacity at San Diego State from 1979 to 1984. Other coaching stints included a four-year stay at Palomar Junior College and Diablo Valley College in Concord. He is currently coaching a U.S. Diving Club Team (Diablo Divers) in Walnut Creek, CA, as well as his duties at Cal.

Before enrolling at San Diego State, Tonne attended Chabot Junior College where he was a two-time All-American diver. While at Chabot, he was awarded the William A. Tunney Award for outstanding leadership in athletics. Tonne prepped at Granada High School in Livermore, CA where he was a four-year letterman in soccer and diving.

Tonne, 47, has produced nine All-Americans and one state champion during his coaching career. He and his wife, Teresa, live in Antioch with their son, Matthew, 10.
