TOP CAL STARS



NATALIE COUGHLIN

In her first two years as a Golden Bear, junior Natalie Coughlin has already established herself as one of the finest athletes to ever compete at the University of California.

As a sophomore, Coughlin continued to outdo herself, as Cal's star swimmer broke three world records and earned a slew of honors.

In 2001-02, Coughlin was a three-time USA Swimmer of the Month honoree, culminating in earning the USA Swimming Athlete of the Year award. She also won the ConocoPhilips

Performance of the Year award for her world record breaking swim in the 100-meter backstroke. At 58.59, Coughlin shattered the record, becoming the first female to ever post a sub-minute finish. She won five events at the championships and became the first swimmer since 1978 to win five national titles at one meet. She also broke the American record in the 200m back (2:08.53), the oldest U.S. mark on the books at nationals. At the 2002 Pan Pacific Championships in Yokohama, Japan she won six medals and set the American record in the 100-meter freestyle (53.99), becoming the first U.S. woman and the second female in history to break 54 seconds in the event. Coughlin won four gold medals at the championships, one for each of her individual events, tying Australian Ian Thorpe with the most overall medals. She now holds three world records, 27 American records and nine school records.

Named the NCAA Swimmer of the Year for the second consecutive season, Coughlin also repeated as the Pac-10 Swimmer of the Year. At the NCAA Championships, she won national titles in the 100-yard butterfly (50.01), and 100 back (49.97) and 200 back (1:49.52). Coughlin set NCAA records in all three events, breaking the old NCAA records she had set just the previous year. Coughlin also swam a NCAA, American and U.S. Open best in the 100 free (47.47) in the first leg of the 400 free relay. She helped her teammates to two national runner-up finishes in the 200 and 400 medley relays as well.

At the Pac-10 Championships Coughlin set new conference records in the 200 free (1:43.30), and 100 back (50.71) and 200 back (1:50.90). She was also a finalist for the AAU James E. Sullivan Award as the nation's top amateur athlete and was one of five nominees for an ESPY awards as Best Female Collegiate Athlete.

As a freshman in 2001, Coughlin was named NCAA Swimmer of the Year, Pac-10 Swimmer of the Year and Pac-10 Newcomer of the Year. It was the first time in Pac-10 history someone has been named both Conference Newcomer of the Year and Swimmer of the Year. Coughlin was also the third consecutive Cal swimmer to earn Pac-10 Swimmer of the Year.

Coughlin had what was arguably the greatest freshman campaign of any collegiate swimmer in NCAA history. She won the national title in the 100 fly and the 100 and 200 back, while breaking NCAA records in all three events. Coughlin also helped the Bears to three second-place NCAA finishes in the 200 and 400 medley and 200 free relays.

Coughlin won U.S. National titles Mar. 27-Apr. 1, 2001 in Austin, TX in both in the 100-meter fly (59.38) and the 100-meter back (1:01.32). Coughlin represented the United States at the 2001 World Championship, July 22-29 in Fukuoka, Japan, winning the world title in the 100-meter back.

Coughlin is the Cal school record holder in the 50, 100 and 200 free, 100 and 200 back, and the 100 fly. She is also a member of school record-setting 200 medley, 400 medley and 200 free relays. Coughlin holds Cal's all-time top times in the 50, 100 and 200 free (1st), 100 and 200 back (1st), 100 fly (1st), 200 and 400 medley relays (1st), 400 free relay (1st), 200 fly (2nd) and 500 free (4th).

HALL OF FAMER

MARY T. MEAGHER

Olympic gold medallist Mary T. Meagher, world record holder and a six-time NCAA champion for California, is a member of both the International Swimming Hall of Fame (inducted May 7, 1993 in Fort Lauderdale, FL) and the Cal Athletic Hall of Fame (inducted January 8, 1992).

Meagher, known at Madame Butterfly during her competitive years, was a member of the 1980, 1984 and 1988 U.S. Olympic teams. At the 1984 Games in Los Angeles, she captured gold medals in the 100-meter butterfly, the 200-meter



butterfly and as a member of the 400-meter medley relay team. Her $100\,\mathrm{and}$ 200 fly times were both Olympic records.

In 1981, Meagher established world marks in the 200 fly (2:05.96) and the 100 fly (57.93). Her 200 fly time was rated the fifth-greatest single event performance by Sports Illustrated. She owns several of the top times in history in the 200 fly and was the first woman to swim under 2:07.

Meagher enrolled at Cal in the fall of 1982 and won NCAA championships each of her four years with the Golden Bears (She took 1984 off from school to concentrate on the Olympics.). In 1983, Meagher earned her first NCAA title in the 200-yard fly. She later won the 100 and 200 fly in 1985, the 200 fly in 1986, and the 100 and 200 fly in 1987. Meagher, who graduated in December 1987, currently holds the Cal school record in the 200 fly (1:54.52).

Meagher received the Olympia Award and was named the Kentucky Sportswoman of the Year in 1984. She also won the Honda Sports Award for swimming in 1985 and 1987 and was selected the winner of the 1987 Honda Broderick Cup, given annually to the nation's top female collegiate athlete.

Meagher was the 16th woman to be inducted into the Cal Hall of Fame.

MARYLYN CHIANG

Marylyn Chiang, the 1999 Pacific-10 Conference Swimmer of the Year, wrapped upone of the most spectacular careers in California women's swimming history in 1999 when she helped the Golden Bears to a fifthplace national finish at the NCAA Championships in Athens, GA.



Chiang captured the NCAA title in the 100 back, breaking the then NCAA

and U.S. Open record with a time of 52.36 (since topped by Natalie Coughlin's 51.23 in 2001). She became the first Cal women's swimmer to win an NCAA title since Hiroko Nagasaki won the 200 breast in 1988, and was the first Cal Pac-10 Swimmer of the Year since Sarah Anderson in 1989.

Chiang also placed second nationally in the 200 IM with a time of 1:57.83 and placed third in the 100 fly with a time of 52.40. She helped the Bears to a second-place finish in the 400 free relay (lead-offleg) with a school record 3:16.56 as well.

In all, Chiang is a member of the Bears all-time Top 10 list in eight events (first in 400 free relay, second in 100 back, second in 100 fly, third in 200 back, fourth in 100 free, fifth in 200 IM, ninth in 200 free and 10th in 50 free) and is a member of the school record-setting 400 free relay. She was also the 1999 Pac-10 Champion in the 200 IM and 100 back, and helped lead the Bears to conference relay titles in the 200 and 400 free relays.

HALEY COPE

Haley Cope was named the 2000 Pacific-10 Conference Swimmer of the Yearas a junior after leading Cal to NCAA titles in the 200-meter medley relay (then world-best 1:49.23) and 200-meter free relay (then U.S. Open record 1:40.18). She also set a short course world record in the 50-meter back (27.25) as a lead-off on the Bears 200-meter medley relay. Cope placed second in the nation in the 100-meter back (59.17) and sixth in the 100-meter butterfly (59.70) as well. She



was a member of the Pac-10 champion 200-yard free relay (Pac-10 meet record 1:30.98), 400-yard medley relay (Pac-10 meet record 3:35.71) and 200-yard medley relay (Pac-10 meet record 1:39.27).

Cope concluded her collegiate swimming career in 2001, placing second at the NCAA Championships in the 50 free (22.34), third in the 100 back (53.06) and seventh in the 100 free (49.34). She also helped lead the Bears to national runner-up finishes in the 200 free relay (school record 1:30.05), 200 medley relay (backstroke leg, American record 1:38.44) and the 400 medley relay (backstroke leg, American record 3:34.83). At the 2001 Pac-10 Championships, Cope placed first in both the 50 (Pac-10 record 22.32) and 100 free (49.27) and helped the Bears to the conference title in the 200 free relay.

At the 2001 World Championships in Fukouka, Japan, Cope was the world champion in the 50-meter back (28.51). At the 2001 U.S. National Championships she won the 100-meter back (1:01.89) and at the 2002 U.S. National Championships she was victorious in the 50-meter free (25.48), edging out 10-time Olympic medallist Jenny Thompson (25.55). At the 2002 Pan Pacific Games, Cope turned in a personal best 1:01.74 performance in the 100-meter back to earn a bronze medal.

he home of the University of California women's swimming team is the Spieker Aquatics Complex, one of the finest outdoor facilities in the United States.

Completed in the fall of 1982, the \$1 million dollar facility was made possible through the Cal Sports '80s project and was dedicated to the former California water polo

letterman Warren "Ned" Spieker Jr., who provided the major portion of the funding for the project.

The facility replaced the old Harmon pool, which had stood on the same site since the early '30s. Included in the extensive remodeling project was the joining of the two existing tanks into one 50-meter by 25-yard pool of deep water, suitable for national and international


swimming and water polo competition. Also included in the reconstruction was the installation of new piping and filtration systems, lighting modifications and increased spectator seating.

The Spieker Aquatics Complex is located adjacent to Haas Pavilion at the corner of Bancroft and Dana streets on the Berkeley campus.

THE UNIVERSITY



The University of California is one of the world's leading academic institutions. The school, known throughout the world as "Cal," is truly a prototype of a contemporary university. It attracts what many consider the finest applicant pool in the country, generates an ethnically and culturally diverse student population on campus, and provides one of the finest learning experiences in the world today.

WORLD-CLASS FACULTY AND STUDENTS

The Berkeley campus is renowned for the size and quality of its libraries and laboratories, the scope of its research and publications, and the distinction of its faculty and students. National rankings consistently place Cal's undergraduate and graduate programs among the very best. The faculty includes eight Nobel Laureates, 122 members of the National Academy of Sciences, 19 MacArthur Fellows, 81 Fulbright Scholars, three Pulitzer Prize winners and more Guggenheim Fellows (137) than any other university in the country.

The quality of Cal's diverse and independent student body complements the stature of the faculty. More than 31,000 students annually enroll at Cal. Of these, about 22,000 are undergraduates. Students come to Berkeley from all over California, in addition to every state in the union and more than 2,000 students from 75 countries around the world.

The undergraduate student body can best be characterized by its diversity; there is no one racial or ethnic majority. Students reflect all age groups, and economic, cultural and geographic backgrounds. This dynamic mix produces the wide range of opinion and perspective essential to a great university.

THE BAY ARFA

Overlooking San Francisco Bay, the campus is a lush and tranquil 1,232-acre oasis in an urban setting. The grounds have retained much of the beauty of their rural beginnings. Spacious lawns, hiking and running trails, as well as groves of oak, redwood and eucalyptus blend with the Neo-classical architecture of John Galen Howard. The University is bordered by the wooded rolling hills of Tilden Regional Park and the City of Berkeley, one of America's most lively, culturally diverse and politically adventurous municipalities.

ACADEMIC SUCCESS

By any standard, Cal offers its students one of the best educations available. Since its birth it has earned a reputation unmatched by any public university in America. According to a recent study by the National Research Council, Cal ranks first nationally in both the number of graduate programs in the Top 10 in their fields (97 percent) and the number of "distinguished" programs for the scholarship of the faculty (32 programs).

Although Cal is well known for its stellar graduate programs, undergraduate teaching is a campus priority. Nearly half of all courses offered at the undergraduate level have 25 students or fewer, and many lecture courses include smaller laboratory or study group sections which allow close interaction with professors and other instructors.
